Due to its lovable characteristics, it is protected from harm by the Australian Commonwealth and sanctuaries have been provided for its safety. Recently, in 1938, the Koala Bear was picked to be put on the design, of the 4d stamps of Australia.

Recently the United States offered a prize to the artist who would present the best design for a new issue of Philippine stamps, showing the likeness of the Philip-pine patriot, Jose P. Rizal. Early in 1941, the prize winning design appeared on a new issue of centavos Philippine stemps. And How It Did Appear, for lo and behold, the heir on Rizal's head instead of being parted on the left side, was parted on the right.

As soon as the new stamps appeared on sale, complaints and letters calling attention to the error were received by the postal authorities. Many patriotic societies and stamp clubs sent in photographs of Mr. Rizal to show how he combed his hair and some requested that the new issue be recalled. "APPROVALS"

with ruffians!"


