## AMERICAN HEROES



THE HEROIC AUTHOR. To millions of American boys of another age, Edward Z. JJudson, better known as Ned Buntline, represented the ultimate in story telling and brought into existence an entire new era in the world of fiction through his creation of the popular dime novels, books that caught the fancy of every red blooded youth of that generation. Few of his readers realized that the popular author's own experiences were just as thrilling as any of the epics he depicted in his hair-raising novels.

At an early age Judson ran away to sea to become a cabin boy aboard a ship. He won a commission as midshipman for heroism when only 15. In years to come Judson fought in the Seminole Indian War, Mexican War and Civil War, finally terminating his military service to become "Chief of the Indian Scouts." He married 4 times, and at the time of his death an autopsy disclosed 20 bullets in his body which he had received during his lifetime, 16 of them in private shooting affairs.

Judson's closest escape from death occurred in 1846 when he fought a pistol duel with a bandit named Robert Porterfield. Although Judson was the winner, he was arrested by the authorities and brought to court on a charge of illegal duelling. During the trial Porterfield's brother seeking revenge, fired a bullet at Judson which luckily missed its mark. In the confusion that followed the prisoner sprang through an open window and ran to a nearby hotel. A pursuing group succeeded in capturing him and returned him to jail. The fury of the crowd was great however, and that very night an angry mob stormed the jail and led Judson to a nearby tree. He'was actually hanged, but suffered only a broken neck when the law arrived on the scene, cut him down and led him back to jail. In the trial which subsequently ensued, a jury failed to indict and Judson was released.

To cap it all Judson found time in later years to write about the old west in an output of more than 200 of the dime novels. It was in these books that Colonel William F. Cody became immortalized under the name of "Buffalo Bill."

ROUGH AND READY TAYLOR. Zachary Taylor, veteran of many military campaigns and 12th president of the United States, was a man of many surprising paradoxes. Due to his active interest in army affairs he never stayed in one place long enough to qualify for voting, and until the age of 62 he had never voted nor interested himself in political affairs. When chosen to run for president by the Whig Party in 1848, Taylor was elected only because of his immense popularity gained in the Mexican War, despite the fact that he did not conduct a vigorous election campaign and had no definite political platform. Furthermore, Taylor did not even learn of his nomination for the Presidency until a month after the convention had adjourned, all due to the
 fact that he had refused to pay the postage due on the notification letter sent him. Taylor's wife never wanted her husband to become president because she felt it would deprive her of his company. While in the White House she never took part in any public functions but preferred to stay in her own room and smoke a corncob pipe.

While assisting in laying the cornerstone of the Washington Monument on a hot summer day in the year 1850, Zachary Taylor was overcome by the intense heat. Later at the White House he drank a quantity of cold milk and ate fresh cherries, an act which helped to hasten his death 5 days later. The deceased president was interred in a family vault near Louisville, Kentucky, without any burial services. A monument was erected there by the Federal Government containing in its inscription the hero's own words, "My only regret is for the friends I leave behind me."

AATURE'S WONDER MAN. The Civil War brought in its wake the wholesale plundering of property and a general reign of terror throughout the states caught in the great conflict. On an autumn night in the year 1864 a band of thieves descended on the plantation owned by Moses Carver, a German farmer of Newton County, Missouri and kidnapped a slave mother and her son. Moses Carver hastily dispatched a neighbor to follow the bandits and attempt to ransom the slaves. The emissary soon discovered that the mother had already been sold, however he traded Carver's race-horse for the baby. Cynical friends believed that the thieves had gotten the best of the bargain but the farmer's wife tenderly nourished the Negro baby and adopted it as her own. He was given the family name, to which was added George Washington "because of his truthfulness." Little did anyone then realize that the infant traded for a race-horse would grow up to becalme one of America's greatest agricultural wizards, one who would bring great wealth to the south through his experiments with nature's plants.

As director of the Department of Agriculture at Tuskeegee University (Alabama) George Washington Carver devised 53 different products from the feathers of domestic birds, provided 100 ways to serve the tomato, and discovered more than 250 medicines which could be derived from plants. When American markets were cut off from Germany's analine dyes during World War I, Carver succeeded in processing more than 500 varieties of vegetable dyes from the roots, stems and fruits of 28 plants. During a wheat shortage the agricultural magician demonstrated how bread and eggs would be made from sweet potatoes. To a start led U. S. Congress in 1921 the Negro scientist exhibited more than 200 products he had been able to make from ordinary peanuts.

Carver never cared for money and when Thomas Edison offered him a salary of $\$ 175,000$ a year to join his research staff he refused, preferting to continue his work at Tuskeegee at an annual salary of $\$ 1,500$. He cashed his salary checks after carrying them around for months, only because the treasurer pleaded for him to do so in order that the books could be cleared. The aged scientist was laid to rest in the warm friendly earth of Alabama in January, 1943, after having contributed his life's savings of little more than $\$ 30,000$ to the George Washington Carver Foundation, a research center for young Negro scientists.

OLD HICKORY. One of the most unique characters the White House had ever known was Andrew Jackson, a man who knew no fear whatsoever and cared nothing for formality. He loved cockfights, fast horses and all types of sports. Another of his pleasures was to lie under the trees on the White House lawn and smoke a pipe, an act which many times seemed to disgust the people of Washington. Jackson had little education and during his lifetime he read only one book of fiction "The Vicar of Wakefield." During his inauguration in 1829 thousands of his pioneer friends with their coon-skin caps and muddy boots climbed over the upholstered furniture of the White House, in order to see their hero. Much china and glassware was broken and the president handled rather roughly.


Jackson's wife Rachel had previously been married to Louis Robards whom she left because of his cruelties. Robards obtained a divorce in a Virginia court after which she and Jackson were married. Two years later Robards again brought suit for divorce in a Kentucky court, claiming they were still married because of a legal technicality. The second suit caused Jackson great mental agony and after Robards had completed the divorce case, Jackson went through a second marriage ceremony with Rachel.

Mrs. Jackson never lived in the White House because her death occurred between the time of husband's election and his inauguration. She was buried in the same white satin dress which she planned to wear at the inauguration.
