Asphyxia due to strangulation.

OPINION

It is our opinion that the decedent, Raymond Stanley Blackburn, came to his death as a result of asphyxia due to strangulation - Homicide.

It is our further opinion that death occurred on or about June 15, 1973.

COMMENT: The decedent was identified by his father, Robert Blackburn, Sr., of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, by the notch on the tooth and also hypoplastic area of another tooth at 6:30 p.m. on August 15, 1973.

POSTMORTEM EXAMINATION ON THE BODY OF

Raymond Stanley Blackburn 4700 Blount Road Cypress Nook Trailer Park Baton Rouge, Louisiana

HISTORY: This unidentified white male body was found at approximately the same time that three other bodies were uncovered during the evening of August 9, 1973, near Lake Sam Rayburn in San Augustine County, Texas. One was identified as William Ray Lawrence. His body was not sent to the Harris County Morgue. The remaining three were sent to this morgue. (73-3376, 73-3377, and 73-3378.) The three bodies arrived at the Harris County Moruge at 1:00 p.m. on August 11, 1973.

AUTOPSY: The autopsy was performed by Chief Medical Examiner Joseph A. Jachimczyk, M.D., assisted by Assistant Medical Examiners Ethel E. Erickson, M.D., and G. Sheldon Green, M.D., and assisted by Dr. Paul G. Stimson, beginning at 4:30 p.m. on August 14, 1973, in the Harris County Morgue.

SPECIMEN: The body was submitted in a black crash bag and covered with abundant white embalmer's preservative powder. weighed 115 pounds and measured 67 inches in overall length. The head was symmetrical and covered with dark brown hair, measuring up to 5 inches in length at the crown. Most of the hair was slipping. Postmortem X-rays of the entire body did not reveal the presence of any radio-opaque objects, such as bullets, or any other bony abnormalities. The facial features were no longer recognizable. Completely encircling the neck, there was a depression groove. There was a pre-existing Y-shaped autopsy incision which was extended. The thoracic and abdominal organs were in situ. There were no abdominal scars. There was postmortem shrinkage of the penis and testes. There was a small amount of pubic hair present. The apex of the heart was previously incised. The remaining portion weighed 100 grams. Most of the skin of the hands and fingers had postmortem sloughing. The lower extremities were intact. There were rope imprint marks over each of the knees. There were rope marks around each of the wrists. The back was intact. There was no perianal injury. The anal sphincter was dilated, but there was no discoloration or tearing present.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION: <u>Section</u>: Both the thoracic and abdominal viscera were in a moderately advanced stage of putrifaction. There were no other abnormalities. The appendix was long, thin, and stringy, and was attached to the tip of the cecum. All of the body surfaces and cavities emitted a very unpleasant aroma.

NECK ORGANS: The V-flap was reflected cephalad. The neck organs were removed en bloc. The hyoid bone was intact.

HEAD: The scalp was reflected in the usual coronal fashion. The calvarium was intact. The brain was semimush and weighed a total of 750 grams. There were no skull abnormalities.

DENTAL EXAMINATION

The teeth are charted according to the universal system. All four third molars are in their crypts. There is a notch in the incisal surface of the upper right central (#8). There is a hypoplastic defect on the buccal cusp of the lower right second bicuspid (#29). There are caries of the entire occlusal surface on the lower left second molar (#18). There is a mesial occlusal pit caries on the lower left first molar (#19). The lower right second molar (#31) has an occlusal caries over the entire crown. The jaw relationships are normal. The calculus deposits are moderate.

On August 15, 1973, Robert R. Blackburn, Sr., the father, stated that his son had polio at age 3 years. He identified the hypoplastic defect in the lower right second bicuspid. He also identified the notch in the upper right central incisor. This notch was due to a toothpick habit which his son had and was the result of many years wear due to this habit.

The identification occurred at 6:10 p.m. on August 15, 1973, at the Harris County Morgue. Raymond Stanley Blackburn was a white male, 20 years of age, who disappeared on or about June 15, 1973. Identification was made in the presence of Dr. Paul G. Stimson, Dr. Jachimczyk, Dr. Green, Detective Gamino, Homicide Division, Houston Police Department, and Mr. E. G. Knowles. Location, Position, and Surroundings of Body:

The decedent was lying face upward in a grave.

Clothing:

The decedent was nude.

Information:

St. Augustine County Sheriff's Department, St. Augustine County, Texas, Deputy Sheriff Richard Davis furnished the following information on August 11, 1973, at the Harris County Morgue, Houston, Texas. The decedent identified as Unknown #20 was found about 8:30 p.m. on August 9, 1973, when Elmer Wayne Henley (suspect in this case) led St. Augustine County Sheriff John Hoyt to a gravesite located about 300-350 yards south of the gravesite of William Ray Lawrence, near the above location. Henley identified the gravesite by several crossed sticks on top of the ground. Beneath the sticks was a thin layer of earth, under which there was a plyboard. Beneath the plyboard was a substance similar to lime, beneath which was a plastic covering into which the decedent had been rolled. The plastic bag was taped around with silver colored air conditioning tape. No lime was within the plastic bag. The decedent's wrists were bound with the air conditioning tape behind his back; a cord was around his neck tied in a hangman's noose; air conditioning tape was across the decedent's mouth and the ankles were taped together with the silver air conditioning tape. Scene photographs were taken by Department of Public Safety, Austin, Texas. The cord which was around the decedent's neck was tagged at the Harris County Morgue under "Unknown #20, Case 73-3376". Deputy Davis stated that Henley made the statement that one of the Unknowns #20, #21, or #22, could be a boy named "Garcia". (Over)
