

Know all men by these Presents That I William F. Gardner
of Salem in the County of Essex merchant, in consideration of one thousand
and thirty five dollars paid me by William Sutton of Danvers in
said County Gentleman, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge,
do hereby give, grant, sell and convey unto the said William Sutton
and his heirs and assigns, a certain piece of land consisting of marsh
and upland situate in Danvers near Pools Hill, so called, bounded
and described as follows, viz. Beginning at a point at the Northeast corner
of the dwelling house of Fitch Pool, then running north twenty three degrees
thirty minutes east two hundred and seventy seven feet by land of said
Pool, thence north twenty two degrees west two hundred and ninety four
feet by land of said Pool and Sutton to the brook, thence by the brook in
various directions until it meets the stone abutment on land of
Thomas Robbins, thence by said Robbins land as the wall runs one
hundred and sixty two feet, then by burying ground one hundred
and ninety one feet, thence by said Burying ground south twelve de-
grees thirty minutes west seventy five feet to the street or highway, thence
by said street or highway one hundred and seventy four feet three in-
ches or there abouts to point began at; said lot containing about three
acres and one hundred and eleven rods more or less. It being the same
lot I inherited from my late father Jon: Gardner deceased, and the
same which he received by deeds from Samuel Barnard, William Brown
and Dant. Purington recorded in the Registry of Deeds Book 121 Leaf 147.
Book 102 Leaf 138&17 subject however to the use of a way of seventeen feet six
inches on the street above named, extending one hundred and
sixty one feet northerly and of twenty seven feet six inches in the
rear, by William Pool and his heirs as will appear by deed recorded in

said Registry Book 110 Leaf 34. reference to them being had, To have
and to hold the granted premises with the appurtenances to
the said William Sutton Heirs and assigns, to his- their use
and benefit forever. And I the said William F. Gardner for my-
self my heirs, executors and administrators do hereby covenant
with the said William Sutton His heirs and assigns that I am
lawfully seized in fee of the premises; that they are free of all in-
cumbrances except as aforesaid; that I have good right to sell and
convey the same to the said William Sutton and that I will and
my heirs, executors and administrators shall Warrant and Defend
the same to the said William Sutton Heirs and assigns forever, a-
gainst the lawful claims and demands of all persons. In witness
whereof I the said William F. Gardner have hereunto set my hand
and seal this second day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty two.


