

Re New York letter to the Bureau dated 6/8/62 entitled "8TH WORLD YOUTH FESTIVAL, HELSINKI, FINLAND; THE UNITED STATES FESTIVAL COMMITTEE, INC., IS - C".

Enclosed herewith are 13 copies of a letterhead memorandum regarding transfer of \$62.00 by the subject to the savings account of the United States Festival Committee in 5/62.

The pretext mentioned in the letterhead memorandum was conducted telephonically by SA AVERY DACUS on 7/10/62 with an individual who identified himself as DONALD W. THIBEAU. This interview was conducted under the guise of the United States Festival Committee compiling a final list of delegates to attend the 8th World Youth Festival.

Mr. WILLIAM WHARTON, Passport Agency, Department of State, Federal Building, Chicago, Illinois, advised SA ROBERT A. VILLEMURE on 6/28/62 that no record of a passport application or a renewal could be located for DONALD W. THIBEAU.

The indices of the Chicago Office are negative on DONALD W. THIBEAU.

A second source advised on June 28, 1962, that Donald W. Thibeau, 10627 South Harding, Chicago, Illinois, an employee of the Warehouse Union, Local Number 743, 220 South Ashland Avenue, maintains a checking account at the People's National Bank of Chicago, Illinois, 45 North Ogden. Source advised that a check in the amount of \$62.00, drawn against the account of Donald W. Thibeau, was returned to the People's National Bank on May 18, 1962.

DONALD W. THIBEAU

Through a suitable pretext it was ascertained on July 10, 1962, that Donald W. Thibeau, 10627 South Harding, Chicago, Illinois, was born on July 23, 1928, in Chicago. It was also ascertained that he plans to attend the 8th World Youth Festival in Helsinki, Finland, however, he does not plan to take any side trips because he could not spare time from his employment.

Arrest Record

On July 11, 1962, the records of the Bureau of Records and Communications, Chicago Police Department, reviewed by Investigative Clerk Anthony P. Palbicke, Jr. reflected that Donald Thibeau, 10627 South Harding, was arrested on August 31, 1961, by Officer Gorman, Badge Number 4016 of the Labor Bureau and was booked at the 29th District charged with assault with a deadly weapon. This case was discharged on December 6, 1961, before Judge Ryan in Branch 22 of the Municipal Court.

The files of the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation contain no further information concerning Donald W. Thibeau.

Attached is a characterization of the United States Festival Committee. All sources used to characterize the United States Festival Committee have furnished reliable information in the past.

The first two sources utilized in the memorandum are in a position to furnish reliable information.

THE UNITED STATES FESTIVAL COMMITTEE,
INCORPORATED, (EIGHTH WORLD YOUTH FESTIVAL)

On October 26, 1961, a source furnished a copy of the magazine entitled "World Youth," which is described as being published bi-monthly in the English language by the World Federation of Democratic Youth, editorial office at Budapest, Hungary. (The World Federation of Democratic Youth is cited as a communist organization in the House Committee on Un-American Activities, Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, January 2, 1957, page 94.) The magazine "World Youth," the third issue of 1961, contained an article entitled "8th Festival in Helsinki." The article set out that the first meeting of the International Preparatory Committee took place in Helsinki, Finland, from February 20 to 22, 1961, to prepare for the Eighth World Youth Festival, which was to be held in Helsinki in 1962.

The article set out that the International Preparatory Committee elected a permanent commission composed of representatives of a number of countries, including Canada or the USA, as well as representatives from the organizations "World Federation of Democratic Youth" and "International Union of Students." (The International Union of Students has been cited as a communist organization in the House Committee on Un-American Activities Guide above, on page 48) with headquarters in Prague, Czechoslovakia.

A second source advised that in April, 1961, DANNY RUBIN, National Youth Director, Communist Party (CP), USA, advised that CP Districts should concentrate on getting broad groups to sponsor The United States Festival Committee (USFC).

A third source advised that the USFC was established at a conference on October 14-15, 1961, in Chicago, Illinois, to obtain a large and broad group to go to Helsinki, Finland, in July and August, 1962, to attend the Eighth World Youth Festival. This source advised that the headquarters of The USFC would be maintained in New York City, New York.

On November 27, 1961, Mr. ROBERT L. POLLACK, Building Agent for the building at 460 Park Avenue South, New York City, advised that The USFC maintained its headquarters in Room 807 at that address.
