

While it is realized it is important to get any information available regarding the captioned individuals' subversive activities, it is believed that you should not become involved in any controversy over their activities on the campus of Madison College and in any controversy as to whether they should or should not be retained as professors. In order that any action that might be taken by the College should not be attributed to the FBI, you should be most circumspect in contacts with Madison College officials. The Bureau should be kept advised of any current developments in this situation. For your information, Euroan files contain no information identifiable with and available facts do not appear to justify an active investigation at this time.

NOTE: West is on the SI and has been affiliated with the CP and related activities since 1934. There is no indication he is a current CP member. Subjects are teachers at Madison College, Harrisonberg, Virginia. School officials are disturbed over their activities and gave the opinion the subjects are part of a plot of communists infiltration of the school. School officials admit they have no definite information on which to base this opinion. They indicate both subjects have officials asked for opinion regarding the subjects, however, none was given. School officials indicate they intend to make every effort to discontinue the subjects' employment at Madison College.

Students have complained that WEST spends his time in class reading his poetry and leading class discussions wherein he tries to "make fools" of students defending democracy. In classes, WEST does not make statements, but will ask provocative questions and then proceed to "cut down" students defending democracy. WEST also pushes the Southern Students Organizing Committee. He advocates no organization on campus at this time but has stated that liberal students should get into positions of leadership estimates that the weekly or bimonthly meetings are attended by a group of about forty students reiterated that he was not accusing WEST of being a communist, but only that his methods appear similar to what he had read about communist infiltration.
He said that has made statements in class and at meetings that "we are the aggressors in Vietnam"; that "we must have demonstrations or actions even stronger to protest". He has also claimed that our present form of government does not work and he is against religion.





W. Va. Part Of Red Hotbed? Some Say So

By KATHY LALLY

Communism is at work in every facet of American life including here in West Virginia and must be counteracted by everyone "keeping alert to preserve this Christian nation," Mrs. E. Wyatt Payne of Huntington warned Tuesday night in a talk here.

Speaking at American Legion Post 16, Mrs. Payne told the audience of approximately 80 persons that Communism has crept into American schools in the form of progressive education.

"They are rewriting the history books so fast you wouldn't know it if you went back to school," she said. "Communists in this country are really after our children."

Mrs. Payne explained the schools were chosen as the "transmission belt throughout the United States" because there the Communist conspiracy found "a captive audience from kindergarten to college at the taxpayers' expense."

She criticized Marshall University for two speakers chosen for the spring "Impact" program. "There is no reason for Herbert Aptheker (a leader of the Communist Party in America) to be here," she said, as the audience applauded her.

She added she saw no reason for Episcopal Bishop James A. Pike "to be on a program at our university" either.

Mrs. Payne also said Don L. West's Appalachian South Folklife Center at Pipestem between Hinton and Princeton has her worried.

The center, which has been

endorsed by U. S. Sen. Jennings Randolph, former Democratic gubernatorial candidate Paul Kaufman and others, was established as a sich o ol for dropouts and a place "to study mountain culture and the ways of people of different backgrounds and races."

"I won't call it Communist, I will let you decide," she said. Discussing Mr. West's Appalachian South Folk Festival, Mrs. Payne said, "They have the nicest names for the wrong things."

She described the 350-acre farm as being far off the road and added she hoped the FBI would still be able to find it.

Mr. West says the Pipestem project is a universal Christian Center ("Watch them use Christian so no one will bother them," Mrs. Payne commented) and that it is de'd i cated to freedom ("Weren't we free in We's t Virginia before they came?" she demanded).

Mr. West was also involved in the Highland Folk School in Tennessee which was closed because of Communist affiliations, she alleged, saying, "I'm not going to editorialize or call anyone a Communist:" But she added, everyone ought to do something about this right now.

A film produced by the National Education Program at Searcy, Ark., was also known. Entitled "The Revolution Underway in the United States," it depicted riots in the cities during the past few years and blamed them on radical black power advocates.

The third annual Appalachian Eccuapment for Citizenship will be held on the former MONTIE VEST farm in Pipester, now owned by Roy. DON WEST's Appalachian South Folklore Center. This article roted that plans for this encompact were discussed at a recent meeting, and speakers at the meeting included Roy. WEST, DOUGLAS KELLY, National Director of the Encampaent for Citizenship, Icc., and NEIL HICKDAN of Forcester, Mass., who will direct the encompacet at Pipestem. The article noted that RELLEY and RIORDAN are former members of the U.S. Peace Corps overscas, as are many of the staff members associated with the Encampment for Citizenship. According to KELLEY, a basic purpose of the encampment is broadening the horizons of young people, helping them to increase their tolerance for and understanding of different groups and ideas and the second purpose is to encourage them to take an active part in community improvement efforts in their own home communities.

The 4/25/68 evening edition of the "Sunset News - Observer," a daily newspaper published at Princeton-Bouofield, W. Va., contained an uncaptioned article which set forth that a news story from Washington, D. C., states that Mrs. VILDOR J. COHEN, a small redbaired firebrand, is backing a proposed folklike center on Lick Creek in the Pipestem District of Lummers County, the center being a dream of Rev. DON VEST, Georgia poet and preacher. The article stated that the purpose is to develop a school for dropouts and to checurage and preserve the arts and heritage of the sountains, and that Mrs. COMEN's husband is Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare. The article noted that Mrs. COMEN has been involved with the Congress for Appalachian Developmont for some time, that the Public Welfare Foundation approved \$5,000 for it last Docember, and Mrs. COMEN was then raising additional funds in Vashington and New York.

The 8/8/G8 issue of the "Princeton Times," a daily newspaper published at Princeton, W. Va., set forth an editorial captioned, "Our Opinion," the context of which is as follows:

"FOLK LIFE CENTER AT PIPESTEN SHOULD BE CAREFULLY STUDIED

"A few months ago, talk began flying around the area concerning a supposed "Hippie" Camp located near Pipestem. Tales of bearded creatures and free love circulated quite in this area.

For the most part, these takes are gross exaggerations. Perhaps we should be a little sorry that they were not true. We can handle hippies a lot easier than idealistic liberal crusaders who promise cures for poverty and the like. Hippies would at least stay to themselves and above all would not send out letters asking for financial assistance in the continuance of their antiAmerican confusion.

"The Camp situated at Pipestem is a direct product of the 'War on Poverty.' It is undentably attached to the federal give-away programs which are so quickly sucking the life blood from this nation.

"Te do not believe that the transportation to West Virginia of high school drop outs, ex-Vista workers, and liberal college professors will result in 'The enrichment of the mountain economy.'

"Furthermore, we oppose the sanctimentous use of religion as a robe to hide the unamerican philosophies to be propounded of such a school. A piece of correspondence from the school describes it as 'A universal Christian Center in the Judeo-Christian tradition.' The writers of such a line must be bowing their heads in shame, for outspoken atheists teach at this school. Nover can we be convinced that an atheist can touch in the Judeo-Christian tradition.

"As long as lon West and his Camp stayed in Pipestem bothering no one, we remained silont. Now, however, letters are being mailed from the Comp asking for financial support. We cannot be silent and thereby allow people to contribute to such a cause.

"It is quite probable that the Camp Will become a headquarters in this area for activism and leftist teachings. It may become the Center for civil disobodience and trouble. With such makes as Sydney Bell and James V. Overdorf on the list of those who contributed, we can see little good coming from the project.

"Such camps and programs as these have been fundamental in the enciting of trouble elsewhere. We have no need forthes around here. Any contribution that is made to this Camp will be a contribution toward the ruination of America.

"One thing is certain. An 'Appalachian South Folk Life Center' cannot succeed in a place where it is not wanted. Derhaps we should let them know this fact.



Mr. Morris. Have you been in charge of the Communist Party in Atlanta, Ga.?

Mr. West. Sir, I would like to say at the beginning that on any questions relative to my past political associations or affiliation, or religious beliefs or political, I will have to respectfully claim the rights of the fifth amendment of our Constitution. I might say further that I am not a member of any political organization. I am only working only on the matter of running a farm, trying to make a living thereby.

Mr. Morris. Well, were you a member of the Communist Party

Mr. Morris. Do you have a sister, Belle, B-e-1-1-e?

Mr. West. I would have to claim the fifth on that.

Mr. Morris. To your direct knowledge, has she been a Communist Party organizer in this particular area?

Mr. West. I take the same position, sir.

Mr. Morris. Have you been the editor of the publication called, the Southerner?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that, sir.

Mr. Morriss All right.

Senator Jenner, Mr. West-

Mr. West. Yes, sir.

Senator Jenner, Do you honestly believe the truthful answer to questions propounded to you by Mr. Morris concerning your wife and your sister would tend to incriminate you?

Mr. West. I would take the fifth on that, sir-have to.

Mr. Morris. Mr. Chairman, in view of the responses of the witness, I would rather not prolong this too much. "Mr. Mandel. (Did you ever meet) Don West?

"Mr. Crouch. I knew him very well, for many years, as Don West and as Jim Weaver. He was district director of the Communist Party of North Carolina while I was district organizer in the fall of 1934 or early 1935. He then left the Carolinas and went to Kentucky as district organizer of the Communist Party through most of 1935, and then was released from that post and returned to the South, where he has spent most of his time as a writer. The latest news I had was that he was a professor at Oglethorpe University in Georgia and recently published a book of poems" (testimony of Paul Crouch before the House Un-American Activities Committee, p. 191, May 6, 1949).

One of the organizers of the Highlander Folk School at Monteagle, Tenn. (p. 193, ibid.).

"Mr. Russell. Will you tell the committee what you know about Don West?

"Mr. Crouch. Yes. I first met Don West in North Carolina in July or August 1934 when he was sent by the central committee to act as central director. He acted in that capacity I year, using the name Jim Weaver. During this time he headed the Burlington defense committee. He was released from North Carolina to go to Kentucky as district organizer of the Communist Party. After leaving Kentucky he went to his old home in Georgia, where he engaged in literary pursuits for some time, and I understand at present he is a professor at Oglethorpe University, and the author of a recently published book of poems. He is a brother-in-law of Nat Ross, southern representative of the central committee of the Communist Party, and a brother-in-law of Bart Logan, a former district organizer in North Carolina; and a sister of Don West, Jeannette Weaver, has been Daily Worker correspondent at Moscow over a number of years" (p. 209, ibid.).

Pointers on work in the South. 1. Correspondence: Any person or persons handling mail or correspondence with farmers, sharecroppers, tenants, comrades or organizers in the South should remember the following elementary rules:

(a) Envelopes should never be addressed by typewriter, handwriting is better, and should not be too flashy-better if somewhat poor. Always use title (Mr., Mrs., Miss, etc.). Never use

business envelopes.

(b) Don't use return address of our offices, use some innocent address, better if a house address. If writing to a Negro, use address from Negro section of city. If name of a company or business house is used, use one that corresponds to the kind of package or envelope sent.

(c) Packages must always be well wrapped (so they don't fall apart in transit) and must look innocent. Don't send papers openly, but if a bundle, put in a box, so that it looks like a gift or something personal. In addressing, abide by rules given for letters.

Single copies of paper should be sent first class.

(Page 30 of Record)

(d) Time: Don't send packages or letter to any given address too often. Alternate, have at least 2 or 3 addresses in each locality, if possible. Don't continue sending bundles for too long a time to one address. Three months' limit.

(e) By all means, do not send any circular letters as third class. Send first class, following directions for letters. They expose at once. If the organization is known, on rare occasions,

such can be done. But don't make this a practice.

(f) Content of letters; When writing letters, always, although writing business matters, make letter appear as personal. Address person as "Dear Friend," etc. Avoid mentioning names, do so only when absolutely necessary. Always use very s imple language. Experience shows that letters from our office have not been understood by sharecroppers, and necessitated a "learned" person to transcribe same.

Some general suggestions:

- (a) Always avoid too much mail. Try to get along with as little as possible.
- (b) Have all southern mail and addresses handled by one responsible person, who has been assigned to do it.

(c) Build up a definite machinery to handle contacts, addresses,

etc. Use past experience of our organizations.

- (d) Do not mail letters and packages to the South with other office mail. This practice should be followed all the time.
 - (e) Always remember the following:

1. One otter, wrongly handled, can subject receiver to terror, discrimination, etc.

2. The mailing apparatus is part of the United States spy system.

3. Farmers, sharecroppers, tenants, etc., always live in localities where "local inquisitiveness" is rampant.

To editors: Some things to remember.

(a) Always use very simple picturesque language. Avoid all long words. Don't try to prove your intelligence by high language. It usually brings the opposite result.

(b) Avoid using names of people. (This does not apply to

our enemies).

(c) Names of places, if connected with definite events, often give away our friends. Be careful how such is used.

(d) Often a detailed account of an event will expose those connected with it. Such material should not be used.

(e) Don't write long articles.

(f) Use letters from friends.

1. Try and save the southern language, terms and names of things; changing such will greatly lessen value of article or letter.

2. By all means, use such correspondence. Our papers contain

too little from the South.

3. When in doubt, as to facts, data, etc., of letter or article, get in touch with the nearest organizer.

Mr. West. May I say just a word, please, sir, Mr. Morris?

Mr. Morris. Yes, Mr. West.

Mr. West. I know that—see, in the first place, I only received the subpena late Friday afternoon. I haven't consulted any attorney or anybody else, and I know that in a case like that I could say that I did not author it and there might be someone who might swear that I did, but I am going to take a chance and give a frank answer. I have never seen nor heard that reading in my life, as far as I can recall, and I certainly did not author it. Now, that is the plain answer to that.

Mr. Morris. Is your testimony, Mr. West, that---

Mr. West. My testimony is that I did not write the piece of paper, and as far as I can recall I have never seen it or heard it read in my life.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write the original of which this is a copy?

Mr. West. Sir, I said I did not author that piece of paper.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write the original of which this is a copy, Mr. West?

Mr. West. That is what I am trying to say.

(Page 31 of Record).

Mr. Sourwine. You did not?

Mr. West. No, sir, I did not.

Mr. Sourwine. Did you write a -- or send in information to be set in a memorandum of this general nature and content at any time?

Mr. West. Not that I recall, sir. As I say, I have never recalled having ever seen or heard this particular paper or writing.

Mr. Morris. Did you know Carl Braden?

Mr. West. Beg your pardon?

Mr. Morris. Do you know Carl Braden?

Mr. West. I would have to take my former position, sir, that I claim the fifth.

Senator Mer. You might identify him. That is it, Carl Braden, worked formerly for the Courier-Journal and was---Mr. Morris. Former newspaperman, who was a defendant in a criminal case.

I would have to take the fifth.

Mr. West, as I understand, you are claiming the fifth amendment on all matters concerning Communist activities or affiliations?

Mr. West. As I say, any questions concerning affiliations and association in the past, I claim the fifth amendment, sir.

Mr. Sourwine. When were you last in Monteagle, Tenn.?

Mr. West. I can't remember, sir, when I was last in Monteagle, Tenn.

Mr. Sourwine. ere you there over the past Labor Day weekend?
Mr. West. You would know that better than I. I was not. That
I will answer you flatly, that I was not.

Mr. Sourwine. You were not there?

Mr. West. No, sir.

Senator Jenner. No further questions.

Mr. Morris. I have no questions.

Senator Jenner. Then you may be excused, Mr. West.

Mr. West. May I return home, sir? Senator Jenner. That is all right.



Take Warning

A large "social welfare organization" is to convene at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina on April 24, 25, and 26 of 1970.

Films scheduled to be shown to young people at this gathering are designated as SCEF films, NEWSREEL films, and APPALACHIAN VOLUNTEERS films.

Workshops are scheduled to kick off a drive for "Appalachian Studies" in Appalachian schools to complement the "Black Studies" agitation already repugnantly familiar to other areas.

SCEF stands for "Southern Conference Educational Fund", perhaps the most widely exposed communist front in America. Under the name of "Southern Conference for Human Welfare" as well as its present name it has been cited as "conceived, financed, and set up by the Communist Party to promote communism in South". (See House Committee on Un-American Activities [HUAC] and House Committee on Internal Security [HCIS] reports write your Congressman.)

NEWSREEL is, in its own words, a "political propaganda organization". It has been "politically active" in practically every riot staged by the "movement" in recent years. NEWSREEL films depict the Viet Cong Castro, the Black Panthers, etc. as heroes; and the U. S. "Imperialist" government and its "fascist" police a the enemy. (See Move-Speak, Official Catalog of the Movement Speakers' Bureau.)

APPALACHIAN VOLUNTEERS, although nominally a separate group charged with "training and recruit ing workers" in Appalachia, is the organizing arm of the convening body. Both AV and SCEF personne were indicted by the Pike County, Kentucky grand jury in 1967 for attempting to violently overthrow the government, seize federal funds, and place communist organizers in local schools to "promote their ideology among school children." (See Pike County Grand Jury report. Also see Kentucky Joint Legislative Committee on Un-American Activities [KUAC] reports, same subject.)

The group staging this gathering was formerly known as "Conference of Southern Mountain Workers' Under its newest alias of "COUNCIL OF THE SOUTHERN MOUNTAINS", and utilizing the commizational capabilities of their Appalachian Volunteers working as "Vistas", CSM has penetrated and taken control of virtually every poverty program in West Virginia. It is probably best known as the sole administrator of the federally funded anti-poverty program in McDowell County, operating from its office on McDowell Street in Welch. (See Encyclopedia of Associations; Section 6.)

Although it is no secret that the Communist conspiracy has been operating through a system of "Folly Schools" for many years and that several have been closed down by courts and legislatures of different states it is not widely known that representatives of such schools make up a large percentage of the CSM board of directors. Of necessary interest to citizens of West Virginia and McDowell County are the "Appalachian South Folklife Center" at Pipestem, W. Va., and "Highlander Center" in Knoxville, Tenn. Myles Horton and Don West, Communists and SCEF pioneers, direct these two. The staff of Highlander Center are all Appalachian Volunteers and the Appalachian South school was built by "Vistas". (See BECKLEY POST HERALD 11/23/69 and PRINCETON TIMES, 9/26/68.)

SCEF has just completed work on a textbook on "Appalachian History" that will be introduced into West Virginia schools if the CSM-SCEF drive is successful. It will "prove" the Don West thesis that Appalachia is and has always been a "colony" of the capitalist industrialists and that poverty can only be relieved by "a complete restructuring of the system of ownership, production, and the distribution of wealth", in other words . . . COMMUNISM:

With control of Headstart, Follow-Through, and their involvement in Adult Education programs, Council of the Southern Mountains already has ample opportunity to work this into the McDowell County school curriculum. Will you let it happen?

Your Attention Please

For this mailer to have ANY IMPACT AT ALL on SCEF-CSM activities it must be read by everyone in McDowell County who can read and write, and read aloud to every person who can't.

It must be sent to every elected or appointed public servant in West Virginia and throughout the nation. It must be sent to all newspapers in West Virginia and every major newspaper throughout all the United States. It must receive the widest possible distribution in the widest possible area. Be warned that even then only a miracle would ensure its making the high test facent in the programmed planning of the communist conspiracy.

If you are willing to pray to Almighty God for a miracle; and if you believe that wide distribution of this leaflet should be attempted and accomplished, this much you can do:

After reading it yourself, don't put it away. Pass it along to someone else who can then pass it to someone else. If this copy is not so worn and bedraggled that you can hardly read it, it has not been read by enough people. Rass it on!

If you have a mailing list or can distribute up to 100 copies in any way, write for them. Your friends or club members can help but you need derend on no one but yourself. Alone, you

He reportedly became a member of the CPUSA in 1934 and was a member of the CPUSA throughout the 1940's.

During the 1940's and 1950's, subject, a writer of potry, newspaper, and magazine articles, had reportedly followed the CPUSA line in his writings.

Subject in appearing before a Senate Investigating Committee in Memphis, Tenn., during 10/57, relied upon the Fifth Amendment for the basis of refusing to answer any pertinent questions asked of him by this committee.

Although subject had not been reported to have been active in the CPUSA and front organizations from the 1960's to present, he has reportedly been associated with members of the CPUSA as late as 1964.

In 1934, he served as Trade Union Organizer for the COMMUNIST PARTY in North Carolina and was District Organizer for the COMMUNIST PARTY in Sentucky during 1935-16. WEST is a yest and writer and has contributed numerous articles and poems to the "Daily Worker" and other communist periodicals. The above mentioned informant listed numerous COMMUNIST PARTY front activities in which WEST was involved. Among these, he stated that WEST belied to organize the Highlander Polk School at Monteagle, Tennessee.

To 1955, WEST was a Minister of the Church of Ged of the Union Assembly, Dalton, Georgia, and was publishing a monthly new paper, 'The Southerner.' In October, 1955, he invoked the Fifth Asendment when questioned regarding his past COMMUNIST of PARTY connections before a County Grand Jury in Dalton, Georgia. According to a local daily newspaper, WEST was expelled from the Church in January, 1956, after refusing to take an cath at a public meeting that he was not a communist.
