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INTRODUCTION.

HE "Chriftian Soldiers Penny Bible" is for the moft part the fame as "The Souldiers Pocket Bible," fomewhat altered and enlarged, and having a different title.

The first two pages, and No. 20, on page 16, are here added; fome of the "Heads" and the texts are amplified, and others are varied.

In the "Souldiers Pocket Bible" the Scripture is taken from the Genevan Verfion: in the "Penny Bible" the texts are quoted from the Authorized Verfion; but they are not exactly copied.

The tract from which this edition is taken is in



I. The Christian Soldier's chief aim should be to do his King and Country Service, in procuring, or preferring the Peace of it.

Here is no Peace, faith the Lord, unto the Ifa. 48.22. Wicked.

Shouldft thou help the Ungodly and 2 Cron. 19. hate the Lord?

Do not I hate them that hate thee? Yea, I Pfal. 139hate them with a perfect hatred. 21, 22.

An Ammorite, or Moabite, shall not enter in Deut. 23. to the Congregation of the Lord; even to the 3, 4. tenth Generation, shall they not enter into the Num.22.5. Congregation of the Lord for ever, because they met you not with Bread and with Water, in the way when ye came forth from Ægypt, &c.

Curfe ye Meroz (faid the Angel of the Lord) Judg. 5.23. Curfe ye bitterly the Inhabitants thereof, becaufe they came not to the help of the Lord, to the help of the Lord against the Mighty.

It is he that giveth Salvation and Victory un Pfal. 144. to Kings; who delivereth David his Servant 10. 14from the huriful Sword — That there be no breaking in, nor going out; that there be no complaining in our Streets.

III. A Soldier must not do Wickedly, but Justly, as becomes a Man of Honour.

When thou goeft forth against thine Ene-Deuc, 23.9. mies, then keep thee from every wicked thing.

And the Soldiers likewife demanded of him, Luke 3-14. faying, And what shall we do? And he faid unto them, Do Violence to no Man, (or put no Man in fear) neither accuse any faily, and be content with your Wages (or Allowance.)

And if you will not for all this, hearken unto Lev. 26, me, but walk contrary unto me, ye shall have no 27. 37. power to stand before your Enemics.

The Lord fhall cause there to be Smitten be-Deut. 28. fore thine Enemies; thou shalt come out one way 25. against them, and flee feven ways before them.

-For thou halt trespassed neither, shall it be for 2 Cbr. 26. thine Honour from the Lord God. 18.

IV. The Christian Soldier should be Valiant for the Cause of God.

ONly be thou Valiant (or a Son of Valour) 1 Sam. 18. for me, and fight the Lord's Battles. 17.

Therefore now let your hands be Strengthen- 2 Sam. 2. ed, and be ye Valiant; (or be ye the Sons of 7. Valour.)

Be of good Courage, let us play the Men for 2 Sam. 10. our People, and for the Cities of our God: And the 12. Lord do that which feemeth him good.

Give me Underftanding, and I fhall keep thy P.119.34. Law; yea, I fhall observe it with my whole Heart.

Give ftrength unto thy Servant, and fave the Son Pf. 86. 16. of thine Hand-Maid.

Plead thou my Caufe (O Lord) with them that Pf. 35.1,2. Itrive with me, fight against them that fight against me.

Take hold of Shield and Buckler, and ftand up for mine help.

And the Children of Ifrael faid unto the Lord, Gudg 10. We have Sinned, do thou unto us what feemeth 15. good unto thee: Deliver us only we pray thee this day.

Do not I have them, O Lord, that have thee? and Pfal. 139am not I grieved with those that rife up against 21, 22. thee?

I have them with perfect haved. I account them Rom. 1.30. mine Enemies, Who are havers of God.

They perfecute me wrongfully; help thou me ! Pfal. 119. Because thou hast joined thy felf with Abaziab, 86.

XI. In the very instant of Battle, a Christian Soldier, flould in his heart cry unto the Lord for help.

And Aza cried unto the Lord his God and faid, 2 Chr. 14. Lord, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with 11. many, or with them that have no power: help us O Lord our God for we reft on thee, and in thy Name we go against this Multitude : O Lord thou art our God, let not mortal Man prevail against thee.

And it came to pais when the Captains of the 2 Chr. 18. Chariots faw Jebofaphat, that they faid it is the 31. King King of Ifrael: therefore they compassed about him to fight: but Jebofapbat cried out, and the Lord helped him, and God moved them to depart from him.

XII. A Christian Soldier Should confider, that Sometimes Gods People, as well as Gods Enemies, may be worsted in Battle.

THE Sword devoureth one, as well as an-2 Sam. 11. other.

25. All things come alike to all; there is one Event Ecclef.9.2. to the righteous, and to the wicked, to the good, and to the clean, and to the unclean; to him that facrificeth, and to him that facrificeth not: as is the good, fo is the finner: and he that fweareth, as he that feareth an oath.

> So there went up thither of the People about three thousand Men, and they fled before the Men of Ai.

And the hand of Midian prevailed against Ifrael. And the Philistins fought, and Ifrael was imit-

ten, and they fled every Man into his Fent; and there was a very great Slaughter, for there fell of Ifrael thirty thousand foot men.

And it came to pais, when Moles held up his hand that Ifrael prevailed : and when he let down

his hand Amaleck prevailed. My Children are defolate, becaufe the Enemy

prevailed. XIII. The Christian Soldier should confider, that though Gods People fometimes be worsted, get 'tis by the Lords disposal.

E Ven all Nations shall fay, wherefore hath the Deut. 29. Lord done this unto this Land ? What mean- 24, 25. eth the Heat of this great Anger.

Then Men thall fay, because they have forfaken the Covenant of the Lord God of their Fathers, which he made with them when he brought them up out of *Egypt*.

And the Lord faid unto Johna, get thee up, John 7. Wherefore lieft thou thus upon thy Face?

Ifrael hath finned, and they also transpressed my Covenant, which I commanded them : for they have even taken of the accurfed thing.

And the Captain of the Guard took Jeremiah, Jer. 40. and faid unto him, The Lord thy God hath pro- 2, 3. nounced this Evil upon this Place.

Now the Lord hath brought it, and done according as he hath faid : becaule ye have finned against the Lord, and have not obeyed his Voice, therefore this thing is come upon you.

My People hath been loft Sheep : their Shep-Jer. 50herds have caufed them to go aftray, they have 6_7 turned them away on the Mountains, they have gone from Mountain to Hill, they have gotten their refting place (or place to lie down in.)

All that found them have devoured them, and their Adversaries laid, we offend not because they have finned against the Lord, the Habitation of of Juffice, even the Lord, the hope of their Fathers:

Wherefore doth a living Man complain (or Lam.3.39. murmur) a Man for the punifhment of his Sins? XV. Soldiers (and all of us) upon fuch Occur-

rences, should search out their Sins, and particularly whether they have not put too little trust in the Arm of the Lord, and too much in the Arm of Flesh.

ET us fearch and try our ways, and turn Lam. 3.4. again to the Lord. Up,

- 305. 7. 13. Up, fanctifie the People, and fay, fanctifie your felves against to morrow : for thus faith the Lord God of I/rael, there is an accurled thing in the midft of thee O Ifrael: Thou canft not not ftand before thine Enemies, until ye have taken away the accurled thing from among you.
- Fer. 2. 13. For my People have committed two Evils, they they have forlaken me the Fountain of Living Waters, and hew'd them out Cifterns, broken Cifterns that can hold no Water.
 - Yea, thou shalt go forth from him, and thine 37. hands upon thine head: for the Lord hath rejected thyConfidence, and thou shalt not prosper in them.

Thus faith the Lord, curfeth be the Man, that Fer. 17.5. trusteth in Man, and maketh flesh his Arm, and whole heart departeth from the Lord.

> XVI. Soldiers (and all of us) frould confider, that because of this Sin, and to prevent it, God bath ulually given Victory to a few.

Judg. 7.2 A N D the Lord faid unto Gideon, the People that are with the are too many for me to give the Midianites into thine Hands, left Ifrel vaunt themfelves against me, faying, Mine own hand hath faved me.

7. . And the Lord faid unto Gideon, By the three hundred Men that lapped, I will fave you, and deliver the Midianites into thine hand :

And the Children of Benjamin were Numbred at that time out of the City, fix and twenty thousand Men that drew the Sword, belides the inhabitants of Gibeab, which were numbred feven hundred chofen Men:

And the Men of Ifrael besides Benjamin, were 17. Numbred four hundred thousand Men, that drew Sword ; all these were Men of War.

Judg. 20. 21.

And the Children of Benjamin came forth out of Gibeah, and deftroyed down to the Ground of the Ifraelites that day, twenty and two thoufand Men.

Judg. 20. 15.

And Benjamin went forth against them out of 25. Gibeab the fecond day, and destroyed down to the Ground of the Children of Ifrael again, eighteen Thousand Men; all these drew the Sword.

And the Children of Ifrael went up against 3°. the Children of Benjamin the third day.

Thus they enclosed the *Benjamites* round about, 43and Chafed them and trod them down with eafe, overagainft *Gibeah* towards the Sun rifing.

And there fell of *Benjamin* eighteen Thou-44. fand Men; all these were Men of Valour.

And they gleaned of them in the High ways 45. five Thouland Men, and perfued hard after them unto Gidom, and flew two Thouland Men of them : So that all which fell that day of Benja-46. min, were twenty and five Thouland Men that drew the Sword. All these were Men of Valour.

And Abijab fet the Battle in Array, with an 2Cbr.13.3. Army of Valiant Men of War, even four hundred thousand chosen Men. Jercboam also set the Battle in Array against him with eight hundred thousand chosen Men, being mighty Men of Valour.

And Abiab flood upon Mount Zemaraim, 4. . which is in Mount Epbraim, and faid, hear me thou Jeroboam and all Ifrael.

And now ye think to withftand the Kingdom 8. of the Lord in the hand of the Sons of *David*, and ye be a great Multitude ; and there be with you Golden Calves, which *Jeroboam* made you for Gods.

But as for us, the Lord is our God, and we 10have not for faken him: And behold, God himfelf is with us for our Captain: O Children of Ifrael, 12. fight yenot against the Lord God of your Fathers, for you shall not prosper.

But Jeroboam cauled an Ambushment to come 13. about behind them :

And when Judab looked back, behold, the Bat- 14tle was before and behind : And they cried unto the Lord.

- 15. Then the Men of Judah gave a Shout ; and as the Men of Judah shouted, it came to pals that God fincte Jerobcham and all Ifrael before Abijab and fudab.
- And Abijab and his People flew them with a great Slaughter: So there fell down of Ifrael five hundred thousand chosen Men.
- Thus the Children of Ifrael were brought un-18. der at that time, and the Children of Judah prevailed because they relied upon the Lord God of their Fathers.

And Afa had an Army of Men that bore Tar-2 Cbr. 14. gets and Spears out of Judab, three hundred Thousand; and out of Benjamin that bear Shields and drew Bows, two hundred and four fcore Thoufand : All thefe were Men of Valour.

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The Lord shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your v. 14. peace.

O our God, wilt thou not judge them? For we have 2 Cbr.20.11. no might against this great Company that cometh against us: neither know we what to do, but our eyes are upon thee.

Ye fhall not need to fight in this battle: Set your v. 17. felves, ftand ye ftill, and fee the Salvation of the Lord, with you, O *Judah* and *Jerufalem*, fear not, nor be diffuayed; to morrow go out against them, for the Lord will be with you.

To me belongeth Vengeance and Recompense; their Deut.32.35. foot shall flide in ductime: for the day of their Calamity is at hand, and the things that shall come upon them make hafte.

For the Lord fhall judge his People and repent him. w. 36. felf for his Servants; when he feeth that their power is gone, and there is none that up, or left.

For my firength is madeperfect in weakness, not by 2 Cor.12.9. Might, (or Army) nor by Power, but by my Spirit, Zach. 4. 6. faith the Lord of Hofts.

For the Oppression of the Poor, for the Sigling of Pfal. 12. 5. the Needy, now will I arise (faith the Lord) I will set him in lafety from him that pulseth at him, (orwould enflave bim.)

Now will I rife, fairh the Lord : now will I be ex- Ifa. 33. 10. alted, now will I lift up my felf.

XVIII. The Christian Soldier (hould confider, if our Forces be weakned, and our Enemies strengthned, there is then a Promife of Divine Help to plead, which we had not, when stronger; whereupon Prayer should be more Earnest.

O Lord be gracious unto us, we have waited for Ifa. 33. 2. thee: be thou their help every Morning, our Salvation also in the time of trouble.

Hear, Lord, the voice of Judah, and bring him un-Deut.33.7. to his People : let his hands be fufficient for him, and be thou an help to him from his Enemies.

Hooked on my right hand, and beheld, but there $P_{fal.143.4}$. was no man that would know me: refuge failed me, no man cared for my Soul.

I cried unto thee, O Lord, I faid, thou art my re-v. 5. fuge, and my Portion in the Land of the living.

Be not far from me, for trouble is near, for there is P[al.22.11]. none to help (or not an helper.)

O remember not against us former Iniquities, (or Pfal.79.8. the Iniquities of them that were before us,) let thy under Mercies speedily prevent us, for we are brought very low.

In War he shall redeem thee from the power of the 306 5. 20. Sword.

Take hold of fhield, and Buckler, and ftand up for Pfal. 35. 2. mine help. Help

- Help us, O God of our Salvation, for the glory of Ffak 79.9. thy name : and deliver us, and purge away our fins for thy mercy fake:

XIX. The Christian Soldier (and all of us) should know, that when Victory is given of God, all the Glory is to be given to bim, as his Servants bave done.

- Exod. 15. 6, THY right hand, O Lord, is become glorious in power ; thy right hand, O Lord, hath dashed in pieces the Enemy.
- And in the greatness of thine Excellency, thou hast 10.7. over-thrown them that role up against thee. P[al.118.2.5.

This is the Lords doing, it is marvellous in our eyes. For the Lord fought for Ifrael.

Therefore I will look unto the Lord : I will wait. for the God of my Salvation . my God will hear me.

- 2 Cor. 1. 10. Who delivered us from fo great a death ; and doth deliver.
 - Now therefore our God we thank thee, and praife thy glorious name.
 - And after all that is come upon us for our evil deeds, and for our great trespals; feeing that our God hath punished us less than our iniquities deferve; and haft given usfuch a deliverance as this.

Shall we again break the Commandments?

I will walk before the Lord in the Land of the living. I have fworn, and I will perform it, that I will keep thy righteous Judgments.

XX. The Christian Soldier Should fo manage all his temporal Warf are (for his King and Country) that he may succeed well in his Spiritual Warfare, and enjoy Peace with God Eternally.

- Rom. 13.12. L E T us call off the Works of Darkness, and put on the Armour of Light.
 - Wherefore take unto you the whole Armor of God, that ye may be able to withft and in the evil day, and having done all (or overcome all) to fland.
 - Stand therefore having your Loins girt about with 2. 14. truth, and having on the breaft place of Righteouinefs.
 - And your Feet flod with the Preparation of the W.15. Gofpel of peace.
- For the Weapons of our Warfare are not Carnal, 2 Cor. 10.4. but miguty, through God, to the pulling down of timing Holds.
- I have wught a good Pight, I have finished my 2 Tille + 7. Course, I have kept the Faith,
 - Hence forth there is laid up for me a Crown of 4.2. Right :suinels; which the Lord the righteous Judge this give me at that day : And not to me only, but wate all them also that love his appearance. FINIS.
