Helen Asbury

Helen Asbury was an American translator, who was active from 1940 through 1950. In all she translated more than twenty songs written by the Swedish poets Evert Taube, Birger Sjöberg, Dan Andersson, Carl Michael Bellman and Erik Axel Karlfeldt.

Her Taube translations were published in the 1940 book *Sea Ballads and Other Songs*. Her other translations appeared in a number of books. Her lyrics for "Fritjof In Arcadia" were recorded by the band Scafell Pike in 1977. An adapted version of her "Calle Scheven's Waltz" was recorded by Roger Hinchliffe in 1988.

In 2008 her seven Sjöberg translations were included in *Fridas Nya Kläder* (Frida's New Clothes), which collected most of the known translations of the poet's work. The book was published by the *Birger Sjöberg Sällskap* (Birger Sjöberg Society). The introduction also stated that Asbury had translated Sjöberg's novel *Kvartetten som sprängdes* (The quartet that split up) but was unable to find a publisher.
