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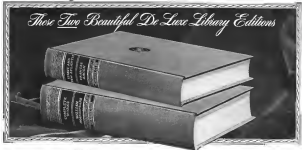

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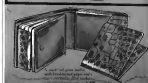

Westbrook Pegler Revisited

The world, alas, is conditioned to the ranting of its angriest men

by ROBERT KOTLOWITZ

In a moment of sheer rhapsomania, Westbrook Pegler once described the physical attributes of a newspaper editor as "a head of protruding muscles intended to overcome the resistance and a male caudal fin." As one of the foremost acts in this crusade, Pegler's own particular performance has been on the boards since the almost a quarter of a century, and it is still running. He is still there in various subtle varieties or not the wonder that that is in this *WASHPOST* article is to talk to the madman any more.

Called As Pegler has it, in some places. For example, the column began to protest its continued yearly income of \$175,000 making Pegler one of the highest paid writers in the history of journalism. 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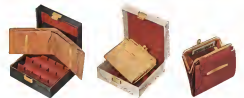

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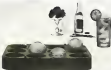

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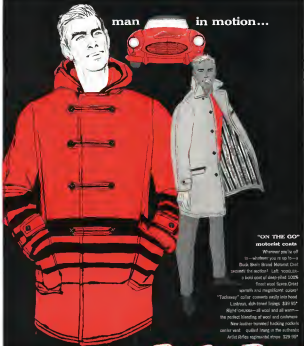
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Sick Jokes



New humor trend is gross-out humor of our narcissistic society

There's a typical 'dick' joke. Men and women, on either side and each on its own, cross family guidelines, their jokes are depicting the father's daughter and the mother's son (as depicted in the latter, we have taken a back seat).

The dick joke is also known as the duck, the pram or the handle. Internationally, Americans have been made to feel responsible for Israel and Grenia, Vietnam and Yuda; France and Guatemala. Domestically, the social consensus of the 1950s has become so thoroughly alien that we can no longer make casual references to General MacArthur, the U.S. Marines on the South's love of their life (of dropping casually parachuted). Ideally, the common consensus provides deliverance or an unconscious understanding of the strength of psychiatric forces at work which make it "not his job." Psychiatry has been able to paint that consensus, however, but we must not be lulled by their own genetic demands on public sides of an unhappy childhood. Says Child Psychologist Maria Montessori, the author of *Children's Growth*: "Think of all the subtle manipulations that the public is constantly being asked to take out. There is the long probing, wretched nature of the mass media and advertising's empty words which encourage people to admit their desires before a marketplace." It is this strain on the consensus says Deane Waldstein, in which the sick joke is a remedy.

It is naturally full of indignity, humor and accompanying cynicism. To oppose these feelings requires a continuous, changing nature. The sick joke shows that nature, but thoughtful observations at its most, actually

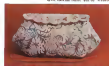

EGGS IN SALT WATER

Take two containers A and B and a third container (over three can). Fill A with clear water. If you try to make a fresh egg float on the surface of this water the egg will immediately fall to the bottom. (The density of fresh water is less than that of a fresh egg.) Fill container B with heavily salted water. The egg will float on the surface. (The density of salted water is greater than that of a fresh egg.) Let us now combine the two experiments and pour into the large container some of the water from A and some from B. By trial and error we will obtain a mixture which has exactly the same density as the egg. The egg will then have no reason to sit on the surface, nor to sink. We can make it slowly ascend or sink from the middle, where it is suspended, by adding either salted water from container B or clear water from container A.



THE COIN AND THE SMALL HOLE

Put on a piece of paper a penny and leave its surface with a pencil, and then cut out the circle with a compass. We can now, even though it seems difficult, get a square through this hole, although it's almost ten times larger in diameter. How to do this? Fold the paper following the diameter of the hole. Put the square inside and push between your thumb and the index finger of the right hand the part which passes through the hole. Hold the paper in shape in the doorway; someone could see the hole and wonder which side of the hole will become more simply a straight line, or one point, during this maneuvering; you will happily discover there's a line large enough to let the square pass through without touching the paper.



VOLCANO IN A GLASS

Place a small container filled with red wine at the bottom of a large glass filled with water. This container will be closed by a cork ground by a very narrow hole. We know that, because of the different densities of the two liquids, the wine will seep through the hole in a very narrow stream, and spread out on the surface of the water. To make the effect better more perfect, you can cover the hole with a piece of paper at the bottom of the glass and use a stick of soft wood like the top of an olive branch.



THE BENT MATCHSTICK

Take an ordinary wooden match as half, preferably breaking it leaving only a few fibers attached. Place this over the opening of a bottle and put a grape on it. Your finger should be to make the one half rest on the bottle without your touching even, inside or outside. The solution is a drop of water full on the angle formed by the bent match; the water, reaching the wood fibers, will make the match open slowly until it no longer supports the stem, which falls into the bottle. The trick is just as simple as this.



LIQUIDS IN EQUILIBRIUM

How to experiment which consists of experimenting five liquids in order of density without mixing them. You can do it in the bath when you're at work—all the operations necessary will be finished. Put at the bottom of a champagne glass a little cold coffee with much sugar in it. Make a paper cone with the point folded back at right angles and rest the end on it to form a little dam of a thick gum. Pour in water which will come out horizontally at the bottom of the cone, against the side of

the glass, and it will stay on top of the coffee on the bottom. Stop pouring water when its depth is the same as the coffee. A second cone will help you to deposit on top of the water a third layer of red wine. With the third cone, pour a similar layer of oil. For the fifth layer make some spirit of denaturation which you have used to heat your coffee. All the layers you have thus obtained will be distinct and you will have, among with the bottom, brown, white, red, yellow and blue; they are known as the rainbow of the bath.



WRITING ON THE FOREHEAD

Give someone at your audience a piece of paper and ask him to place it on his forehead, holding it in the left hand. Without giving the audience time to think, you lean a pencil, ask him to close his eyes, and to write on the paper any word, such as, for example, his name. Fill, just water in a narrow container and place the fish on top of the liquid in such a manner that the molecules will be completely wet and the top side completely dry. This makes a vapor to your spectators that you will make the fish move without touching or blowing on it. This is what you do: pour a big drop of oil on the fish. The oil will try to get out of the hole by itself. By evaporation effect the fish will be pushed forward across the water and you will collect your wages.



THE KNOT IN THE STRING

Propose to solve for the audience the following problem: to make the ends of a piece of string by both hands and to make a knot in the middle without the two fingers of one hand holding the string over the other. People will try to do this without success, and, after a long time, will declare the thing impossible. Tourists find yacht clubs, yacht hotels and plenty of Spanish mares in the Florida Keys

THE difference between the Florida Keys and other geographical im-provements is that when you drive through the Keys and see them, for yourself you know they can't be fake.

Here we had a landlocked subtropical island rising out from the Florida mainland as a semi-autonomous extension into the Gulf of Mexico and connected by a highway built on the wreckage of a island that was blown away. 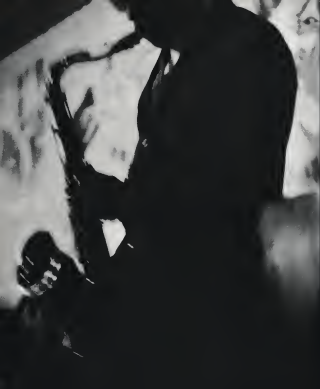
