Reference is made to SSC letter dated December 8, 1975, Item III of which pertains to the investigation of Martin Luther King, Jr.

As set forth in this Bureau's memorandum dated November 24, 1975, to the SSC no copy of the "informal memorandum" referred to in the first paragraph of Mr. Sizoo's memorandum to Mr. Sullivan dated December 1, 1964, was located in a search of logical FBI files.

It is also pointed out that both Mr. Sizoo and Mr. Sullivan have left FBI service and consequently there is no way of establishing the facts and circumstances surrounding the lining out of certain portions of the first and fourth paragraphs of the December 1, 1964, memorandum as requested in SSC letter. Additionally, it has been established through prior review of appropriate FBI files and materials located in the personal files of Mr. Sullivan at the time of his departure from the Bureau that no memorandum or other materials exist which pertain to the suggestion or implementation of the suggestions contained in the December 1, 1964, memorandum.

In accordance with request set forth in referenced SSC letter the original copy of the December 1, 1964, memorandum of Mr. Sizoo to Mr. Sullivan is available for review by a representative of the SSC in room 4171 of the J. Edgar Hoover Building.



The enclosure to serial 16 was specifically excluded by the SSC from its November 7, 1975, request and has not been included in the material being delivered. An enclosure to serial 9 which is described as an article appearing in the July 5, 1969, Herald Tribune was apparently detached from serial 9 and could not be located.

Referenced December 8, 1975, memorandum to the SSC noted, inter alia, serial 1 of the Kraft file was not being provided to the SSC in response to its November 7, 1975, request since it had no apparent connection with the Kraft matter. A review of the sealed material to which access has been granted for purposes of responding to this request, now reveals the relevance of serial 1. A copy of this serial is, therefore, included in the material being delivered with this memorandum.

The subject of above SSC inquiry, Joseph Kraft, is a well-known newspaper columnist. A review of the Kraft file reveals that the French Security Service, the DST, conducted a microphone surveillance on Kraft's hotel room for approximately one week during a 1969 visit by Kraft to Paris. Such coverage was effected through the urging of W. C. Sullivan, former FBI Assistant to the Director, who traveled to France at that time, apparently at the direction of deceased FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover. Details of the above coverage have appeared in the media apparently as a result of leaks within the administration of former President Nixon. Kraft himself testified in detail 5/10/74, regarding this matter before the United States Senate Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, the Subcommittee on Constitutional Rights of the Committee on the Judiciary, and the Subcommittee on Surveillance of

the Committee on Foreign Relations. We have previously responded to earlier requests of the SSC in the memoranda of 6/20/75, 9/2/75, 10/7/75, and 12/8/75, wherein we advised that no authorization per se could be located for the 1969 electronic surveillance of Kraft during a visit to France and provided the SSC with delivery and access to serials which provided information regarding the Kraft matter.

We previously reviewed the sealed portion of the Kraft file under authority of the Attorney General, in connection with our 9/2/75, response to the SSC; however, the unsealed material was resealed following review. By memorandum from Jack Fuller, Special Assistant to the Attorney General to John Mintz, FBI, dated 12/5/75, the Attorney General approved re-entry into the sealed portion of the Kraft file to fully comply with the SSC request of 11/7/75. A copy of serial 1, the 11/7/75, SSC request and the 12/5/75, Fuller to Mintz memorandum authorizing entry to the sealed portion of the Kraft file has been attached to the file copy of the enclosed letterhead memorandum. Arrangements have been made for a representative of the Legal Counsel Division to deliver the attached memorandum as well as the materials being provided to the SSC. This note has been classified "~~Secret~~" in order to protect the confidentiality of our relationship with the French Security Service, the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to result in serious damage to national security. ~~Classified by 6283, XGDS 1, Indefinite.~~

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I thought you might be interested in the following information regarding Nicole Salinger, the French wife of Pierre Salinger, the former press secretary to President Kennedy.

[Information has been received from an excellent source, who is in a position to know, that she is the mistress of Abdel Kader Ben Barka, the brother of Mehdi Ben Barka, who, you may recall, was the victim of a kidnaping and assassination which became a major scandal in France.] Mehdi Ben Barka (S) was a communist who was the opposition leader against the Moroccan Government. His kidnaping and assassination were believed to have been politically inspired.

According to the source, the contacts between Mrs. Salinger and Ben Barka are not difficult since Salinger has his business headquarters in London and is in practically a constant travel status in Europe. He is the president of a rather recently formed international finance operation known as Gramco, which has its headquarters in Nassau, Bahama Islands. Our source advised that Nicole Salinger recently arranged a rendezvous with Ben Barka, stating that her husband was leaving that afternoon for London and would be gone for a couple of days. (S)

Also, during the recent visit of President Nixon, Ben Barka attempted to learn minutes of secret conversations between Nixon and President De Gaulle through Nicole Salinger, who said she would "do her best." (S)

The source of the above information is one Joseph Mansfield, a former Army Counterintelligence Corps agent, who has been a contact of this office for many years. He is presently retired from the military service, has settled down in the Paris area, and operates a private investigative

service. One of his part-time investigators is an agent of the Direction de la Surveillance du Territoire (French domestic counterespionage service), [whose official assignment is to monitor a technical surveillance on Arab establishments. It appears that this individual is the source of the above information and that it comes from an official technical surveillance on Ben Barka.] (S)

Of course, it is very unlikely that Nicole Salinger would be in a position to obtain any confidential information regarding conversations between De Gaulle and Nixon. (S)

Mansfield requested that we be particularly careful in handling this information and that neither he nor his source be identified. In view of the delicate nature of the source, it is being furnished only for your information since I thought this may be of interest to you.

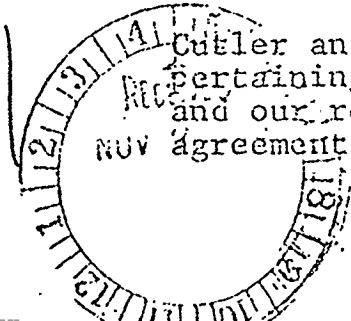
Dear Mike:

By letter of July 23, 1975, the Senate Select Committee requested delivery of "materials pertaining to the reported investigation of columnist Joseph Kraft in 1969, other than the 'logs' of any surveillance" (Part III-A).

On October 22, 1975, the SSC received a portion of these materials. Numerous serials in the FBI file on surveillance of Mr. Kraft were not included in the materials received, however, apparently because of a difference in interpretation of the term "logs." Request for delivery is specifically made, therefore, for the following serials (with enclosures and attachments) in FBI file 65-75629: Serials #1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24.

Excluded from this request are the logs of any surveillance, by which the SSC means transcripts of overhears. A memorandum from A. B. Fulton to W. R. Wannall, "Subject: Lloyd N. Cutler, Attorney for Joseph Kraft," dated June 10, 1975, which was provided to the SSC on October 22, 1975, notes that "the only transcripts of the overhears which were located are contained as an enclosure to 65-75629-16." Our request, therefore, does not encompass this enclosure. Summaries of information obtained from any surveillance of Mr. Kraft, however, are specifically included in our request.

We are cognizant of the agreement between Mr. Cutler and the Attorney General with regard to materials pertaining to the reported investigation of Joseph Kraft, and our request is made subject to the conditions of this agreement.



Mr. Cartha D. DeLoach, former Assistant to the Director, was deposed by and furnished information to the SSC on November 25 and 26, 1975. He was represented by personal counsel during these interviews. He has advised this Bureau that his busy personal schedule precludes his furnishing us the details of the interviews, either in written or oral form. In this regard, he indicated that he has found annoying the considerable demands placed on his time by the SSC resulting from the interviews as well as his appearance at public hearings of the SSC. DeLoach did, however, voluntarily furnish this Bureau the following observations about the interviews which I thought would be of interest to you.

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DeLoach described the interview of him on November 26, 1975, as a "star chamber proceeding." A total of eight SSC Staff personnel plus one senator participated in the questioning of him. DeLoach particularly found Staff Member Michael Epstein to be "extremely vicious" in his questioning and DeLoach also used the terms "accusatory" and "denunciatory" in describing Epstein's manner. As an example, DeLoach advised that Epstein told him that the FBI disclosed, by way of reference, the one-time existence of a particular memorandum from DeLoach to Mr. J. P. Mohr, another former FBI official. Epstein told DeLoach that the SSC had been trying to obtain a copy of the memorandum from the FBI but that the FBI had been unable to locate it although exhaustive efforts had been made to find it.

Epstein then alleged that DeLoach had taken the memorandum with him on his retirement and destroyed it. This accusation led to a heated exchange between DeLoach and Epstein which finally ended with Epstein admitting that he had no facts to support such an allegation.

As you are aware, we normally furnish the Department memoranda reporting the results of SSC interviews of current and former FBI employees. However, because DeLoach was unable to more fully apprise us, we are limiting our advice to you in this instance to this communication.
