

Tentative arrangements were made for packing on September 13th and transportation to New York on the 15th or 16th. PRISCILLA commented that September 18th is the deadline for her to move to New York.

Later on the same day PRISCHIA talked to DOROTHI WOODS, who is apparently a real estate agent, telephone number Rockville 3270. PRISCHIA commented that they have obtained an apartment in New York two blocks north of Washington Square, just off Fifth Avenue. The two women then discussed selling the HISS home in Georgetown.

Still later in the day, JEANELLA MORSE was asked by PRISCILLA to assist in the coming moving operations. JEANELLA mentioned that her sister, LENA NIXON, 833 Jefferson Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, will look out for friends who may want to work for HISS in New York City. It was commented that HISS' address (business?) in New York is 22 East 8th Street.

ISHBEN LEE, wife of DUNCAN LEE, and PRISCILLA HISS engaged in a conversation, during which ISHBEL related that she will be doing some of the work at the Potomac School which PRISCILLA did last year. PRISCILLA was most enthusiastic concerning this matter.

9-13-47

On this date the informant advised that HISS and his wife left Washington for New York City by automobile. So far as informant was able to ascertain, ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS do not expect to return to Washington to live, and will only return for an occasional visit.

Miscellaneous

By letter dated October 9, 1947, the New York Office was advised that HISS and his wife had left for New York on September 13, 1947. It was also pointed out that HISS: business address in New York would be apparently 22 East 8th Street.

It should be noted that apparently ALGER and PRISCILIA HISS have located an apartment in the vicinity of Washington Square, just off Fifth Avenue. Attention is directed to the above entry of September 6th, in which Confidential Informant reported that the HISSES "have an apartment in New York two blocks north of Washington Square, just off Fifth Avenue".

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent FRED A. HARVEY at St. Paul, Minnesota in instant case, dated March 1, 1947, which reflects that one of SOL LISCHINSKY's brothers, MONTE, had recently changed his last name to LEWIS. Further that his brother was employed at a chicken hatchery This indicates that the correspondence directed to SOL LISCHINSKY from EMILY LEWIS at the S.A.F. Co-op Hatchery, Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada, is from his brother, MONTEXLEWIS.

Dr. CECIL GEORGE SHEPS is a specialist in Public Health matters and is the individual who has corresponded with LISCHINSKY from the School of Public Health at the University of North Carolina, according to information concerning him which appears in the report of Special Agent JOHN J. BARRETT at New Haven, Connecticut, dated March 14, 1947.

According to the same source, Dr. SHEPS was formerly an expert in public health matters in Canada.

MANDELL, of 1643 Rotary Drive, Los Angeles, California, is a relative of LISCHINSKY through his sister, PEARL MANDELL.

WQQW is the radio station in which LISCHINSKY owns shares of stock.

Identifying information concerning <u>SAMMY NARENS</u>, 5914 Saturn St., Los Angeles, California, appears in the report of Special Agent M. DONALD ELDRICH in instant case, dated September 30, 1946, at Los Angeles, California.

by BEADIE MAGDOFF, wife of HARRY MAGDOFF, a subject in this case. LISCHINSKY by told BEADIE that he could not come over because his wife, MELVA, and his mother were at some Hot Springs resort and he had to stay with the children. BELLE asked LISCHINSKY to try to come over the following night if possible, since her husband's cousins were coming down for the weekend and, in addition, the AXELRODS would be at the MAGDOFFS! home the following night. LISCHINSKY stated he would see what he could do about coming.

Confidential Informant advised that on April 28, 1947, CARL GREEN contacted ERNAPROSENBERG to advise her he was continuing his radio program at Station WQQW until such time as the station was sold or he could find a position at another station. GREEN stated in part that METVALISCHINSKY had contacted him on Sunday to discuss bringing her nursery school group over to the station.

BEADIE MAGDOFF contacted MELVA LISCHINSKY on April 29, 1947, according and MELVA told BEADIE that PEARL (MANDELL) had arrived safely and was going to leave by boat on May 5 (1947). MELVA stated PEARL was then in England and was going to France where her husband is buried. Further, she stated that SOL LISCHINSKY was then on the West Coast and was going to Seattle and she expected him home in about a week. Mrs. LISCHINSKY stated she had no plans for the summer and expected to stay around Washington.

On May 5, 1947, according to the same informant, MELVALISCHINSKY told BEADIE MAGDOFF that her husband, SOL LISCHINSKY, might arrive home by May 9, 1947

but no earlier. MELVA stated that her aunt, LOTT (ph) was coming to New York from Chicago on a visit and she had asked her to try to drop down and visit her in Washington, D. C. (0)

SOL LISCHINSKY contacted BEADIE MAGDOFF on May 30, 1947, according to and stated he had just returned from his trip to the West Coast and that EDYSTONE was then at Seattle. Further, that PEARL (MANDELL, his sister) had returned about a week ago from England. (2)

HARRY MAGDOFF then told LISCHINSKY that the WINSTONS (ph) are now visiting them. LISCHINSKY declared that he had to return to work on the following Monday but did not know whether his job still existed. Moreover, he stated that PEARL (MANDELL) had received her dismissal notice (from UNRRA). LISCHINSKY stated he had visited the MANDELLS at Lagura Beach while on his trip to the West Coast.

The same informant advised that on June 3, 1947, LISCHINSKY again contacted BEADIE MAGDOFF, at which time the informant ascertained the MAGDOFFS were to visit the LISCHINSKYS that evening.

IRVING KAPLAN advised on June 11, 1947, that he had contacted SCL LISCHINSKY, who told them he had spent three weeks in Seattle, a few days in San Francisco, and the balance of his time at Los Angeles, San Pedro, and Laguna Beach. Further, he advised that LISCHINSKY told him it was cool there and "if you are born up in Saskatchewan, you like warm weather."

KAPIAN also advised the informant that he and LISCHINSKY agreed to lunch together at Fan & Bill's so that LISCHINSKY could give him the details concerning his trip to the West Coast.

advised that on June 13, 1947, HARRY MAGDOFF advised LISCHINSKY that they had just finished packing and he wanted to say goodby since they were leaving in the morning. LISCHINSKY remarked that he was then listening to FRANK who was giving a dissertation on the Taft-Hartley Bill, and that FRANK thinks he (President TRUMAN) will veto it but will not exert any pressure to sustain the veto.

HARRY MAGDOFF said there was a terrific amount of sentiment building up and this Catholic statement might do the trick. LISCHINSKY responded that the opposition was very widespread. In reply to LISCHINSKY's inquiry, MAGDOFF stated he did not know when he would return, since this depended upon how things turned



turned out at the office. When LISCHINSKY declared that he might have to go to New York in connection with his work, MAGDOFF told him that he would contact him at Murray Hill 5-1743. MAGDOFF assured LISCHINSKY that he felt certain they would see each other during the summer in any event. MAGDOFF inquired concerning MEL (MELVA LISCHINSKY) and PEARL (MANDELL) and asked LISCHINSKY to convey his regards to them. According to informant, MAGDOFF promised to contact LISCHINSKY whenever he should come to Washington, D. C. (9)

The same informant advised that on September 3, 1947, SOL LISCHINSKY advised BEADIE MAGDOFF that he was still employed at UNRRA and that PEARL was still employed there, but that he expected to finish up in October (1947), and had \$6,000 to \$7,000 coming to him which consisted of annual leave, terminal leave, and the provident fund. LISCHINSKY stated that PEARL (MANDELL) would finish up at UNRRA about the end of the year (1947) and had about \$3,000 coming to her. LISCHINSKY then discussed in general his plans to buy a farm in nearby Virginia. MAGDOFF stated that she wanted to confer with LISCHINSKY later in the day. He instructed her to contact him at his office at DE 7300, extension 194 and not leave town without first seeing him.

Later that same day, according to the same informant, LISCHINSKY arranged to transport READIE MAGDOFF to the railroad station in his car so she could make the 4 PM (New York) train. LISCHINSKY advised the informant that he expected to put down a deposit on a farm that afternoon.

Spot surveillances conducted by the writer during this period have verified that LISCHINSKY is still employed at UNRRA. On a spot surveillance conducted by the writer September 10, 1947, LISCHINSKY was observed to leave his home at 2002 B Fort Davis Street, S. E., at 8:58 AM. He was carrying a black leather brief case. LISCHINSKY was accompanied by an older man, slightly shorter than LISCHINSKY, and a young woman with brown hair. They drove off in LISCHINSKY's car which bears 1947 D. C. license plate #215-350, and proceeded to the vicinity of 29th and Erie Streets, S. E. He and the woman left the car and entered the apartment building at 2716 29th Street, S. E. at 9:04 AM. He returned alone to the car at 9:11 AM.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent LAMBERT G. ZANDER in instant case dated September 17, 1946, at Washington, D. C., which contains information concerning the identity of the woman residing at this address whom LISCHINSKY drives to work each morning, probably being PEARL MANDELL, his sister. It should be noted that the above address is an apartment building in Naylor Gardens.

LISCHINSKY then drove his car to the Union Railway Station where the writer observed his unknown male passenger leave the car and enter the railroad station where he purchased a ticket on the 9 AM (EST) train to New York City.

He is described as follows: 41 - 44 years of age, 5'7", 140 pounds, Jewish nationality, wore rimless glasses, black hair which is noticeably graying and is bald in front and half-way back, has a brisk walk and is of slender build. He smoked cigarettes and was wearing a blue summer suit, a light blue shirt, brown shoes, no hat, and he had on a colorful tie. The writer discontinued the surveillance of this man following his departure on the 10 AM train to New York City. A spot check surveillance near the UNRRA building at DuPont Circle later in the day failed to reyeal the presence of his car.

Again on September 18, 1947, LISCHINSKY was observed driving his car down Pennsylvania Avenue, S. E., at 8:59 AM. He proceeded to the intersection of Connecticut Avenue and L Streets, N. W., where a male passenger alighted from the car and stood on the street car platform facing west. This individual is described as 38 = 40 years old, 5'9", dark wavy hair, dark moustache, slender build, dressed in blue suit, no hat, no glasses, and was carrying a small manila envelope. LISCHINSKY was observed to continue on to the intersection at 20th and DuPont Circle and N Street, N. W., where he parked his car near the southwest corner at 9:18 AM. Due to traffic conditions it was not possible for the writer to actually observe that LISCHINSKY and a woman companion entered the UNRRA building at DuPont Circle.

WILLIAM H. DOWNING, Security Officer at UMRRA, advised that LISCHINSKY is buying a farm near Chain Bridge on the Virginia side of the river and contemplates resigning from UNRRA effective October 31, 1947. It is DOWNING understanding that LISCHINSKY intends to run a dairy farm.

RE: ROBERT TALBOTT MILLER, III) SE RE

The following investigative information is being reported by Special Agent EARL L. FUOSS for the period September 1 to 30, 1947. This information was obtained from Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau.

September 1, 1947:

ROBERT MILLER sent the following telegram via Western Union to JOSEPH SLOAN, c/o ALBERT MOLFE, 128 Brattle Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts: "Could you wire me collect 126 East 56th Street, New York, address of NORRIS HAUGHTON. Regards to you and MOLFES." Signed BOB MILLER.

September 7, 1947:

BLAIR BOILES contacted ROBERT TILLER and stated that he had been having some conversations with the International Bank. They have an intelligence unit and it has just been started. The man who runs it, named WOOLEY (phonetic) is an Englishman who has become a naturalized American citizen and he told BOLLES a few days ago that he has been looking for an assistant. It would be mainly an editorial preparation of information coming in from all kinds of sources, an intelligence to digest and to be read by officials of the bank, and preparation of special reports to assist the officials in determining policy and action. BOLLES said he took the liberty of calling WOOLEY and telling him he thought MILLER was the natural person for the job. BOLLES said the only hitch is that WOOLEY does not know how soon the bank will want him to fill the position because he is proceeding slowly as he develops this intelligencebusiness. BOLLES said the job would probably pay about \$8000 or \$8200 tax free. BOLLES asks if BOB speaks French and BOB stated he could speak it fairly well. BOB said that MOOLEY thinks he has a job in Paris also. He needs an assistant here and a deputy in Europe. BOB said as far as anything goes, his situation is complicated at the moment and he has some things cooking in New York "but the more pots you have on the fire the better off you are." BOLLES said WOOLEY is a former Naval officer. HOB said the situation sounds interesting and worth looking into,

September 9, 1947:

BOB MILLER contacted DUNCAN ALTMAN. DUNCAN has evidently been to a Dutch meeting of some sort and he gives BOB some of the highlights of it.

DUNCAN stated MOORE was there and JULIE LYNCH could not make the meeting.

DUNCAN said it was a good thing she did not as it gave him (DUNCAN) more of a chance to do his stuff. DUNCAN said he dragged RANDY FELTUS into the conversation and told MOORE about RANDY's work in the government and for Bretton-Woods, etc. DUNCAN stated he went into length on this old Fhilmspine situation back

in 1900 as to whether we should fortify the Philippine Islands to keep the Japs out and our ideas go back to Revolutionary days when America broke from England. DUNCAN said during the Boer war most American people were anti-British. DUNCAN remarked that MOORE then brought up the question of RANDY's Polish actions. DUNCAN stated: "RANDY had done some work with the Poles and I laid out a bunch of manure for them." DUNCAN remarked that MOORE has troubles like ELLIOTT ROOSEVELT and he has to get himself out of a lot of trouble. MOORE asked how the American people felt about taking on an American agent for this thing and if they would think that was too wicked or subversive. DUNCAN told MOORE that RANDY would not be put out in front of it as he would have to register as a foreign agent. DUNCAN stated he ran into an old friend, VINCE NAHONERY.

BOB MILLER contacted BELA RODIAN and left a message that he (BOB) would contact SHORAN next weakend.

September 15, 1947:

JENNY WILLER contacted GEORGE HAEICHT to discuss the condition of POLIA HABICHT who was injured by an automobile the day before. JENNY said she had learned about POLIA's accident from HELEN PRICE. GEORGE said that his mother, POLIA, SHURA LEWIS and ICLA had gone to HELEN FELLY s the previous evening and were returning when the accident happened. GEORGE said Miss KELLY lives opposite the Kennedy-Warren apartments.

JENNY MILLER contacted SHURA LEWIS to discuss the accident. They discussed POLIA's financial status in relation to paying for hospital expenses. SHURA said she had given POLIA a hundred dollars a week ago to pay for GEORGE at Catholic University but SHURA does not know whether or not POLIA has paid it.

An unidentified woman contacted JENNY MILLER stating she wondered whether JENNY wanted her daughter Jacqueline, to come over to the KILLERS. JENNY commented that it was a lovely party the unidentified woman gave and it was mentioned that the Harrises had been at the party and that ED Harris had been there. JENNY and the woman discussed a girl that attended the party and the woman stated the girl had made her first speech on Saturday. She had made the speech at Mrs. SHINKMAN's (phonetic) library in bethesda and she spoke about "the book." JENNY said that Mrs. SHINKMAN is very nice as she had had a conversation with her. The unidentified woman said that SHINKMAN used to be her boss at the Foreign Broadcast Intelligence Service.

BELA RODMAN contacted JENNY MILLER to confirm that JENNY had heard about POLIA, HABICHT's accident.



September 16, 1947:



Imagmich as ABEL PLENN spent a major portion of his time away from Washington during this period, no surveillances were conducted. It is known, however, that during the periods he was in Washington, he spent a good portion of practically every day at the Library of Congress completing his book.

Her specialty involves racial discrimination—negro, Jewish and Mexican. She is a former feature writer for Peoples Daily World.

Inquiry of the Postmaster, Los Angeles indicated that IALLA ROCERS was receiving mail at the Merritt Safe Deposit Company until a change of address February 3, 1947, at which time she moved to 142 North Parkview, Los Angeles. A further change of address was dated June 22, 1947, changing ROCERS address to Cuernavaca, Morelas, Mexico, D. F., 5 Avenida Morelas.

The files of the Los Angeles Office reflect a subscription to The Worker in 1943 in the name of LALLA ROGERS, 15192 Sargent Place.

In a report of Special Agent ROBERT H. EGAN, dated February 1, 1943 at Los. Angeles, in the case entitled "PEOPLES WORLD; INTERNAL SECURITY - R", it is


reflected that in the December 20, 1938 issue of the Peoples World, LALLA ROGERS wrote a letter as follows:

"I am sending you my last dollar, for which please extend my subscription. I may be able to do without other things, but not the 'Peoples World'".

This letter was written in connection with the 1938-39 Peoples World Sustaining Fund Drive.

The records of the Registrar of Voters at Los Angeles contain a registration for this individual in which Mrs. ROBBINS gives her Party affiliation as Socialist, stating she was born in Russia and naturalized through her father, whose name was JACOB ROBINOWITZ.

A further change of address was subsequently found by Mr. MOOBERRY at the Los Angeles Post Office for LALLA ROGERS from 15192 Sargent Place to 416 South Grand Avenue, dated September, 1943.

Confidential Informant has advised that on various occasions in the last two months, he has had occasion to see various correspondence which PIENN when two months, he have had over a period of several months. Informant reports by the following information in connection with this correspondence.

By letter dated May 1, 1947, one DOROTHY LEE, 129 Jackson Avenue, Schenectady, New York, wrote AHEL PLENN, c/o Boni & Gaer, New York City, indicating she was writing him on behalf of a small liberal group which had been formed in Schenectady. She indicated this group had been very much disturbed by the Knights of Columbus broadcast and their propagandizing for the Catholic Church by their anti-communist, anti-atheist, anti-liberal programs. LEE indicated that her group was anxious to reply to the Knights of Columbus and had succeeded in obtaining free time on the radio. She further indicated the New York City PCA Radio Division was going to supply transcripts or transcriptions for the reply. LEE then went on to comment that they had found PLENN's book "Wind in the Olive Trees" very impressive and full of material, which would be effective for preparing devastating replies to the Knights of Columbus. She also added that there seemed to be some good material in the book to use along with the discrimination against the negroes in this country, the antisemitism which is rapidly becoming more prevalent, and the anti-liberal antilabor bills being pushed through by Congress.

By letter dated May 2, 1947, MORLEY AYEARST of New York University wrote to DORIS PLENN concerning her daughter EMILY. It was pointed out that although EMILY gave every indication of being a girl of superior intelligence, her behavior in college reflected that she is apparently suffering from social frustrations and immer conflicts which materially affect her work. It was further pointed out that she lacks the balance and maturity needed to organize her own time and social activities.

By letter postmarked June 5, 1947, JOSEF CARMASSI, 9 Minetta Street, New York City, communicated with ABEL PLENN. The letter was of a social nature and indicated that apparently the two men had known each other for some time. This individual is a heretofore unknown social acquaintance of PLENN.

By letter dated July 7, 1947, <u>DORIS PLENN</u> wrote to AREL from a summer resort, Woodside Cottage, Newcomb, Maryland. 


The following investigation is reported by Special Agent ROBERT E. LEONARD.



Spot check surveillances have been made on RIFKIN by the writer during this period verifying her continued employment with the National Lawyers' Guild, 902 20th Stre N.W. During a spot check on September 8, 1947, the writer observed RIFKIN report for work at 10:04 A.M. and depart at 1:30 P.M. when she proceeded to the branch of the Hamilton National Bank located at 20th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., where she contracte business at the teller's cage.

At 1:40 P.M. she left this bank and proceeded to 19th and Eye Streets, N.W., where she waited for two women who were proceeding south across the intersection towards her. Woman #1 introduced RUTH RIFKIN to her companion whom she identified as EVELYN JARGO (PH). The three women engaged in friendly conversation for approximately five minutes and then separated. EVELYN JARGO boarded a street car at 20th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., proceeded to 14th and New York Avenue, and then walked to the Colorado

Building near 14th and G Streets, N.W. Just prior to this she spoke to the street car conductor who advised her she should get off the street car at 14th and New York Avenue and take a #40 (Lincoln Park) or #42 (13th and S Streets, N.E.) street car in order to get to her destination.

At 1:57 P.M. EVELYN JARGO proceeded to the sixth floor of the Colorado Building and as believed to have entered room 611 with a man whom she met and recognized on the elevator on her way up.

JARGO told this man that she was on her way up to his office to get certain papers for her father and that she was going to Baltimore (Maryland). He responded that he did not know any more about it than she did but he would look into the matter for her. This man is described as being from 38 to 40 years of age, about 5: 9%, stocky build, 180 pounds, full and round face, and black wavy hair.

EVELYN JARGO left the Colorado Building at 2:10 P.M. and had considerable difficulty in locating the street car platform at 14th and G Streets, N.W., where she finally boarded a #42 street car. The surveillance was discontinued at this point. EVELYN JARGO is described as being 5' 4", 135 pounds, brown curly hair, about 32 years of age, large hims, speaks with accent, possibly of Jewish descent, and has a small mole about two inches away from the left corner of her mouth. She wore an open-crown white hat with long white veil in the back and a vari-colored pastel dress. She wore white shoes with brown flat heels and carried a white pocketbook. She also wore a double strand of pearls. It will be noted that JARGO walks with a determined and rather quick pace.

The indices of this office were searched with negative results concerning EVELYN JARGO.

The unknown woman who introduced EVELYN JARGO to RUTH RIFKIN is described as being 5' 3½", stout build, black hair turning gray at the temples, approximately 44 years of age, and about 145 pounds. This woman is apparently well acquainted with RIFKIN.

It will be noted that room #611 in the Colorado Building bears no name on the door and is not listed in the building directory on the ground floor.







The following covers the period from April 1 to May 16, 194?, on which date WHITE departed from Washington, D. C.

Spondence to WHITE. Confidential informant furnished the following concerning correspondence to WHITE.

Letter postmarked New York March/6/1947, from apartment 54, 465 Central Park West, signed VERNON, to ANNEXTHIE containing personal data.

VERNON mentioned he has not seen PHILLIP (CONASKI:) adding PHILLIP lives on the other side of town.

Letter postmarked Miami, Florida, dated April 1, 1917, from SALD.

XWEISSBUCH, president, Alhambra Hotel, to WHITE offering congratulations following WHITE's resignation from the International Monetary Fund. WEISSPUCH indicated he knew WHITE would not have taken such drastic step without having better position. He suggested WHITE visit him in Miami and offered his apartment and automobile at WHITE's disposal.

Letter postmarked London, England, April 10, 1947, from JOEL A. YFISCHER, assistant director, Inter-Governmental Committee on Refugees, to WHITE concerning resignation which FISCHER had learned about through London Times. FISCHER expressed hope this did not mean WHITE would withdraw from championing causes which he always so ably championed.

Letter postmarked New York April 8, 1947, from EDTARD KY BARSKY, national chairman, Spanish Refugee Appeal, to Miss ANNE WHITE. This letter advised of indictment against HELEM RY BRYAN, executive secretary, and others of executive board and requested largest contribution ever made. The letter referred to ANNE WHITE as one of their most loyal contributors and recited the past efforts on behalf of the heroic Spanish people.

Letter postmarked Boston, Massachusetts, April 9, 1947, from Mrs.

H. H. BLOOK to WHITE signed BESSIE. This letter indicated BESSIE had learned of WHITE's resignation from BOB who sot it from ABE WHITE?). BESSIE indicated WHITE had done fine work and it was too bad he could not continue under favorable circumstances. However, the ideals and principles would not be lost even though there may be temporary obscurity.

Ietter postmarked Taunton, Massachusetts, dated April 15, 1947, from Mrs. ALLAN R. FETLOW, 409 Somerset Avenue, signed BEA to Mrs. HAPRY D. THITE. This letter is social in character, and the writer indicates her parents had often spoken of the WHITES. She also spoke with regret of WHITE's resignation.

Letter postmarked New York April 18, 1947, from HENRY ORGENTHAU, Jr., to WHITE expressing regret over whITE's resignation adding "Certainly when you and I and others worked to create the world Bank and Fund, little did we dream that it would become such an ineffectual instrument toward world reconstruction."

Letter postmarked Washington April 25, 1947, containing an invitation from Hungarian Minister SZECEDYYASZAK to reception in honor of President of Hungarian Republic.

Letter postmarked New York April 26, 1947, from RANDY FELTUS to WHITE advising that ED/FALCH, who is apparently a good guy, will call WHITE regarding a little work in which WHITE may pick up some quick money. FALCH was in charge of power allocation for WHB and is now a consulting engineer overlapping into public relations at times. A big power company has requested him to take on job getting government loan to set up power projects in foreign countries and FELTUS told FALCH that WHITE was man to handle this. FELTUS advised FALCH has good industry connections which may come in handy for WHITE. FELTUS stated he had long favorable talk with ORTONA and thought a push from WHITE or (OSCAR COX would help in closing deal with the Italians, as ORTANA spoke highly of WHITE and COX.

Letter postmarked New York April 29, 1947, from JOAN WHITE to HARRY WHITE containing query concerning international fund and bank. JOAN asked her father why Russia did not join and mentioned Professor SAULTER said sneeringly Russia just doesn't join any organization and it seems JOAN should be able to say something crushing or at least intelligent on the subject. JOAN further inquired concerning the idea behind the key countries proposal in establishing a few stable par values and then bringing other countries into the system and asked why wHITE opposed it and who was behind it. She also asked why voting is apportioned according to contribution rather than the "democratic" way of one vote for everybody without control by a few wealthy powers. She also asked unrelated to the bank thy Russia wants a strong central government in Germany and why we do not.

Letter postmarked New York, date illegible, from JOAN to ANTE WHITE containing query concerning Mexican President ALEMAN. JOAN ask of what he is like politically and what does TONDY CNTEROS (Mexican ambassador) think of him. Also what does ANNE WHITE think of him. She also asked what he is doing in Washington and what does he stand for. JOAN also asked whether ANNE is really fond of the (ZACH) SAADS adding "Ly God, you weren't serious about having to invite them up to B. H."

Letter postmarked Washington Pay 5, 1947, from United Jewish Appeal signed LOUISX SPIEGIER, director, to WHITE and wife acknowledging receipt of check representing contribution in sum of #200.



Letter to HARRY WHITE postmarked Washington May 21, 1917, from Headquarters, Military District of Washington, containing questionnaire regarding MADELINE BERETZ MARR who was being considered for employment by War Department.

Letter postmarked June 19, 1947, American Embassy, Nanking, China, from SOL ADLER to WHITE expressing thanks for WHITE's note with enclosure which were most interesting and well merited. ADLER added the governor of the central bank told him he had also received them. The letter mentioned several Chinese figures including K. P. CHEN, now member of the state council; Y. C. KOO and HSI/TI (?), T. V. KSOONG). ADLER indicated he planned to take a vacation in Peiping and come home in the late summer or early fall although their plans are necessarily vague.

Letter postmarked Princeton June 13, 1947, from ALBERT ETHSTEIN to JHITE soliciting funds at suggestion of friend and indicating that the scientists needed one million dollars for great educational task in helping fellow citizens understand the simple facts of atomic energy and their implications for society.

Letter postmarked May 13, 1217, from Ambassador of Honduras to WHITE and wife containing invitation to reception May 23, 1917, in honor of American Ambassador to Honduras PAUL C. DANTELS.
