

#### CATHERINE

SECALI

Informant Gregory in her statement dated November 30, 1945, furnished the following information concerning CATHERINE:

"Sometime in October, 1943, GOLOS told me that I was to meet

"ARCARET and that she would introduce me to a new person to whom I was
to deliver the material that I obtained from the Silvermaster Group.

"I subsequently met MARCARET and was introduced to an individual I know only as CATHERINE. By way of description, CATHERINE is approximately 3h or 35 years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches in height, weighs 1h0 pounds, and is of slender build. She has dark blonde hair, and at that time wore her hair in a sort of feather cut fashion. She has blue-green eyes, is light complexioned, and has a small turned-up nose. She usually wears suits with ruffled blouses. I recall that she had some trouble with her feet and wears as I recall a size eight shoe and these are usually flat heeled. I have no knowledge of any employment that she was engaged in, but did determine she was at one time a secretary and has a knowledge of shorthand and typing.

WI determined from my conversations with her that she at one time was employed in Washington, D. C., but I never did find out with whom she was employed while she resided in Washington, D. C. I learned from BILL that he used to court her in Washington in 1938 or 1939 and remembered he visited her in the rooming house where she resided.

I am virtually positive that CATHERINE is a native born American and have some faint recollection that she mentioned having come from Kansas or possibly some midwestern state. She talked with a typical midwestern accent and has all the mannerisms of a native born American. Although she and 'BILL' would mention occasionally that they had been married seven years, I am somewhat doubtful that they had in fact been married that long. I do recall, however, that in July or August, 1944, she gave birth to a daughter and at this time she was living on Fifth Avenue near 8th Street in New York City. I subsequently learned probably in September. 1944, both she and her husband 'BILL' moved from New York to either Baltimore or Washington. On the Monday after GOLOS' death on Thanksgiving Day, 1943, I met CATHERINE pursuant to an arrangement in the News Reel. Theater on East 42nd Street, New York City. She and I then took a taxi cab to Park Avenue, some place in the 50's where we left the cab and walked a few minutes on the street. A man then came up to us and CATHERINE introduced him to me as my new boss. CATHERINE did not call this man by name nor did she indicate at this time that he was her husband. We immediately went to Janssen's Restaurant on Lexington Avenue for oysters and sometime



16th Street, N. W., telephone North 4579. The current telephone directory lists a Miss CATHERINE REDMOND, same address and telephone number. The memorandum further states that a Lieutenant WILLIAM M. REDMOND, U. S. Army, resides at 1712 16th Street, N. W., telephone Decatur 8846.

It should be noted the CATHERINE REDMOND and Lieutenant WELLIAM M. REDMOND mentioned above both reside at the same address but they have different telephone numbers.



The description of Lieutenant REDMOND and the description of BILL as furnished by informant CRECORY are noted as follows. Lieutenant REDMOND is 6 feet 2½ inches in height whereas BILL mentioned by CREGORY is five feet ten inches to five feet eleven inches. Lieutenant REDMOND weighs 136 pounds and BILL mentioned by GREGORY weighs 150 to 156 pounds. Lieutenant REDMOND's eyes were blue, and BILL mentioned by GREGORY has brownish-black ayes. It is further noted

that Lieutenant REDMOND's wife's name is MARIE. Therefore, it is not believed they are one and the same individual.

The records of the Credit Bureau, according to a report dated April 20, 1935, reflect that a Miss CATHERINE REDMOND, also known as MARY CATHERINE REDMOND, resides in apartment 602 at 1712 loth Street, N. W. In 1935 she was 27 years of age. Her present age would be 38. In 1935 she was single and had no dependents. She formerly resided at 3151 Mount Pleasant Street, N. W., for sixteen years with her grandmother, Mrs. C. D. REDMOND who Review, 923 15th Street, N. W.

The records of Stone's Mercantile Agency in a report dated 1935 reflect a Miss Catherine A. Redmond, single, was residing at 1506 Varnum Street,
N. W. However, she has since married and is now Mrs. EDWARD M. CARR. She is
employed as a clerk in the U.S. Treasury Department. Her father's name is
BENJAMIN F. REDMOND, and her mother's name is WARGARET A., also employed in
the U.S. Treasury Department as a clerk. She also has a sister named MARGARET
who is reported to be employed by the Evening Star Newspaper. She has a brother
named FRANCIS S. REDMOND employed in the U.S. Commerce Department. This report reflects CATHERINE REDMOND formerly resided in Seat Pleasant; however,

from an occupant of the apartment house at 1712 16th Street, N. W., that the apartment building is presently being handled by JOHN R. PINKETT, real estate Company, with offices at 1302 New Jersey Avenue, N. W.

At the offices of the above company, it was determined Mrs. HILDA CISSEL, who resides at 3625 S Street, N. J., was formerly resident manager of the St. Mihiel apartments at 1712 16th Street, N. W.

of the St. Mihiel Apartments for about fifteen years and had known CATHERINE REDMOND since about 1934. She described CATHERINE REDMOND as follows:

It should be noted the description of the unidentified CATHERINE furnished by informant CREGORY indicates CATHERINE is 5 feet 8 inches or 5 feet 9 inches in height. It is further noted that CATHERINE REDMOND is only 5 feet 3 inches or 5 feet 4 inches in height. CREGORY advised CATHERINE weighs 140 pounds and it is noted CATHERINE REDMOND merely weighs 115 pounds. It should be noted that the color of the hair of these two individuals is different. Informant stated CATHERINE has blue-green eyes and CATHERINE REDMOND, according to the above description, has dark brown eyes.

From a comparison of the above descriptions, it is believed the unidentified CATHERINE could not possibly be identical with CATHERINE REDMOND.

Mrs. CISSEL further stated CATHERINE REDMOND is a writer and to her knowledge has never been married. She said Miss REDMOND is very conservative in her dress and is conservative generally in her views on life. She volunteered that CATHERINE REDMOND has a brother Lieutenant WILLIAM REDMOND residing in the same apartment building in a different apartment. This is apparently Lieutenant WILLIAM MOSS REDMOND mentioned hereinbefore. She stated the REDMONDS were reported to be natives of Kentucky.

A research project is being conducted by the Washington Field Office in an effort to identify CATHERINE and BILL mentioned by the informant.



#### LAUCHLIN CURRIE

Reference report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES dated December 18, 1945, at Washington, D. C., reflects on December 4, 1945, CURRIE proceeded to 1614 I Street, N. W., after his arrival from New York City.

On December 26, 1945, Special Agent POLK L. YOUNG, Jr., through personal observation determined the address 1614 I Street, N. W., is apparently a law firm wherein several lawyers have a common reception room. The following individuals are listed in the various directories available to the Washington Field Office for this address: CAROLYN E. AGGER, lawyer; IDA BLACKWELL; W. C. BLACKWELL; SAMUEL C. CALDWELL; MILTON CARR FERGUSON, lawyer; LORD, DAY and LORD, lawyers; RANDOLPH PAUL, lawyer; JOSEPH W. WYATT.

By teletype dated December 13, 1945, the New York Field Office advised that CURRIE was planning a trip out of the United States, and indications were he was going to visit in Italy.



#### Physical Surveillance

As set out above, LAUCHLIN CURRIE arrived in Washington, D. New York City on December 5, 1945, and stayed at 1614 I Street, N. W.

On December 6, 1945, at 8:50 a.m., CURRIE left 1614 I Street and proceeded to the Willard Hotel where he had breakfast alone. At 9:35 a.m., he left the Willard Hotel and proceeded on foot to the office of the International Development Company, room 101, Medical Science Building, 1029 Vermont Avenue, N. W. He remained there until 12:20 p.m., when he proceeded by cab to the Roosevelt Hotel, and he had lunch with an unknown man described as follows:

After having lunch in the hotel, they parted in the lobby, and CURRIE proceeded to 16th and V Streets, N. W., where he boarded a taxi cab and proceeded to his office. At 4:25 p.m., CURRIE left his office and went to Union Station and poarded the 5 p.m. Pennsylvania train for New York City. He was seated in parlor car 544 and occupied seat 8. CURRIE was accompanied to New York City by Special Agent PATRICK M. RICE. Enroute to New York City CURRIE spent his time reading newspapers, reviewing typewritten papers, and eating his dinner. CURRIE had a small overnight airplane-type bag with him on this trip. At 9:10 p.m., CURRIE arrived in New York City, and the surveillance was turned over to Special Agents W. ROULON PAXMAN, HOWARD KLEBE, and JOSEPH F. McCORRY of the New York Office.

On the might of January 7, 1946, Special Agent M. WURTZ of the New York Field Office advised Special Agent MAURICE A. TAYLOR of the Washington Field Office that LAUCHLIN CURRIE would probably arrive in Washington, D. C., that evening inasmuch as information had been obtained by the New York Office from a confidential source that he had planned to depart from New York City on the 5:30 p.m. Pennsylvania train for Washington, D. C., and while in Washington CURRIE planned to stay with RANDOLPH FAUL.

On January 8, 1946, Special Agents WARREN LOVE and OWEN CHANEY took up the surveillance at the offices of RANDOLPH EXPAUL, lawyer, 1614 I Street, N. W., and at 10 a.m., CURRIE was observed entering this address. He remained there until 10:45 a.m., when he walked to the Medical Science Building at Vermont and I. Streets. N. W. At 11 a.m., he was observed in his office at the International Development Company, room 101, Medical Science Building. At 5:05 p.m., CURRIE left his office and walked to the Statler Hotel and made several telephone calls at the desk and thereafter walked around the lobby as though looking for someone. At 5:25 p.m., he met an unknown man, Jewish in appearance, who is described as follows:

After meeting this unknown man, CURRIE had cocktails with him in the lounge until 6 p.m., at which time they parted. CURRIE left the hotel and pro-



cseded to the Mayflower Hotel where he looked around the lobby, and at 6:50 p.m., he met an unknown man in the lobby described as follows:

at 7 p.m., CURRIE and the unknown man left the Mayflower Hotel and walked to the Cafe Parisienne, 1120 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., where they had dinner. The surveilling agents were seated at a table and were in a position to observe the subject throughout the meal. It was noted at no time were any papers exchanged between these individuals. They remained in the Cafe Parisienne until 10:30 p.m. when they were observed standing outside the restaurant in conversation. At 11 p.m., they walked to a parking lot at 17th and DeSales Street, N. W., where they entered a 1941 gray Plymouth sedan bearing D. C. license 98-305 which, it was subsequently determined, is registered to VIR-CINIUS FRANK COE; 2700 36th Street, N. W. COE has been mentioned previously in other reports in this case.

On January 9, 1945, Special Agents LOVE and CHANEY observed CURRIE in his office at the International Development Company at 10 a.m. At 10:45 a.m., he left his office and boarded a taxi cab and proceeded to the Italian Embassy, 2700 16th Street, N. W., where he arrived at 11 a.m. He remained there until 11:50 a.m., then boarded a taxi cab, and returned to his office. After having lunch, CounTE at 12:25 p.m., walked to the Treasury Department and entered the Post Office in that building. He then returned to his office. He remained in his office building until 5:35 p.m., when he left carrying a large cloth bag and a long roll of brown paper, He boarded a cab and proceeded to Union Station where he boarded the 6 p.m. Pennsylvania railroad train for New York City. The New York Field Office was advised of his departure from Washington by teletype.

Reference is made to RANDOLPH PAUL, 1614 I Street, N. W., with whom it is noted CURRIE visited while in washington on the past several occasions.

The indices of the Washington Field Office reflect in June, 1940, an investigation was conducted an RANDOLPH EVERNGHIM PAUL who had applied for a judicial position with the Department of Justice. According to information developed at that time, PAUL was born at Hackensack, New Jersey, on August 8,

1890, and was residing in New York City. He attended New York Law School, New York University, from 1911 to 1913 when he was awarded an LL. B. degree Since 1914 he has practiced law in New York City being associated with leading New York City law firms. At that time he was associated with Lord, Day and Lord. He is considered an expe. In federal income tax contracts and corporation matters. He was recommended very highly and his political views were considered liberal.

It is noted Lord, Day and Lord also have offices at 1614 I Street, N. W., with PAUL at the present time.

The indices of the Washington Field Office further reflect in the case entitled, "LOUIS EISENSTEIN, Departmental Applicant, Attorney," an investigation conducted by the Bureau in January, 1945, reflects RANDOLPH E. PAUL was interviewed as a reference of EISENSTEIN, and it was determined RANDOLPH PAUL was formerly general counsel in the Treasury Department and is presently in the law firm of Lord, Day and Lord at 1614 I Street, N. W.

The indices of the Washington Field Office further reflect in May, 1941, in the case entitled, "National Lawyers Guild; Internal Security - C," RANDOLPH PAUL of 25 Broadway, and also of 70 Pine Street, New York City, had been a member of the National Lawyers Build having resigned from the Guild on March 23, 1940. It was further determined that PAUL was listed as a member of the Committee on Taxation of the Lawyers Guild.

On December 31, 1945, confidential informant who is presently reporting the activities of IRVING KAPIAN, another subject in instant case, advised on the morning of December 31, 1945, GEORGE PERAZICH, also a subject in instant case, contacted KAPIAN at KAPIAN's residence and advised he had just returned from Yugoslavia. KAPIAN indicated he was going to a New Year's Eve party that night at the home of the FITZGERALDS at 2209 Observatory Place, N. W. PERAZICH stated he knew where the FITZGERALDS lived since he used to live there at one time. KAPIAN invited PERAZICH to accompany the KAPIANS, and PERAZICH accepted stating he would be glad to go inasmuch as he would have an opportunity to see the whole crowd. The same informant later advised FITZGERALD had invited Mr. and Mrs. ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN to the same party.

The current telephone directory for Washington, D. C., reflects ED-WLRD J. FITZGERALD, 2209 Observatory Place, N. W., is listed as having telephone number Emerson 0779.

Reference report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES dated January 11, 1946, reflects FITZCERALD is employed at the Department of Commerce.

On January 1, 1916, Special Agent WILLIAM D. TEMPLE observed EDMARD J. FITZGERALD enter room 3020 of the Department of Commerce Building. Without revealing his identity, the agent was advised by an individual at the information desk that EDMARD J. FITZGERALD is employed in the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, Department of Commerce Building, room 3020. Special Agent TEMPLE observed the following name appears on the door to room 3021 which is next to room 3020: "Gurrent Business, Analysis Unit, HARRY MAGDOFF, Chief." (It will be noted HARRY MAGDOFF is another subject in this case.)

On January 4, 1946, Special agent (A) FREDERIC D. VECHERY determined through telephonic inquiry without revealing his identity that EDMARD JOSEPH FITZCHALD has never been employed in the Foreign Funds Division of the U.S. Treasury Department and further determined on September 26, 1945, he was transferred from the Foreign Economic Administration to the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, U.S. Department of Commerce.

#### Physical Surveillance

Special Agent WILLIAM D. TEMPLE and WARREN L. IDVE conducted a surveillance on January 2, 1946, at 2209 Observatory Place, N. W., the residence of EDWARD J. It was thought he might be a son of FITZGERALD. These license plates were subsequently determined to be registered to EDWARD FITZGERALD, 1205 East 3hth Street, Brooklyn, New York. (This license has previously been observed at the residence of HARRY MAGDOFF on December 1, 1945, at which time a young woman and man were observed entering MAGDOFF's residence. They remained at the MAGDOFF residence from 6:19 p.m., until 11:10 p.m., on that date.)

At 6:55 p.m., a negro woman, apparently a maid of FITZGERALD, left the residence in a 1933 Chevrolet coach bearing Virginia license 117-267 which was driven by a negro man.

On January 3, 1946, the same agents observed this 1933 Chevrolet coach bearing Virginia license 117-267 arrive at the FITZCERAID residence at 8:10 a.m. It was noted the 1935 Plymouth sedan bearing New York license K6184 was parked in front of FITZCERALD's residence from 7:30 a.m. to 9:45 a.m., at which time the surveillance was discontinued.

On January 4, 1946, these same agents observed a man believed to be FITZCERALD leave his residence at 2209 Observatory Place, N. W., at 8:25 a.m. He was in a 1941 Chevrolet coupe bearing D. C. license plates 68-918. This automobile was driven by a man who came out of the residence at 2207 Observatory Place, N. W. A woman from the same address accompanied the driver. The aforementioned license plates were issued to ARTHUR S. X000ZH, 2207 Observatory Place, N. W. The automobile proceeded to the comer of lith Street and Penn-Bylvania Avenue, N. W., where the man believed to be FITZCERALD got out of the car and walked south on lith Street to the lith Street entrance of the U.S. Department of Commerce Building. At 8:45 a.m., this man entered room 3020 of the Commerce Building. On the door of this room were the words, "Entrance -Room 3016. However, there was nothing on either one of these room cards to indicate who the occupants were or what Bureau is located there. It was noted on the door of room 3024 was, a card bearing the words, "Current Business, Analysis Unit, HARRY WACDOFF, Chief. " It should be noted HARRY MACDOFF is another subject in this case. W., Lpartment 401. He was born February 10, 1893, and has no dependents other than his wire. He has resided at the above address since about January, 1945, and rents from McKeever & Whiteford Real Estate agents. He formerly resided at 1709 North Oak Street, Arlington, Virginia, apparently coming to that address about August, 1944, from Dallas, Texas. LOPEZ was employed as a liaison officer with the Foreign Economic Administration as of November 9. 1943, at a salary of \$3,800.00 per annum, and is apparently employed there at the present time. He transferred to the FEA from the Census Bureau. . Mrs. LOPEZ is reported to teach at the John Marshall School in Arlington, Virginia, having begun teaching in irlington in September, 1944. Prior to her marriage she taught at Dallas, Texas, LOPEZ and his wife were evidently married recently as the record indicated that she taught in Dallas from 1942 to 1944 as NON. YHORN.

The records of Stone's Agency were negative on information concerning this individual. The indices of the Washington Field Division have been checked with negative results on the names EUGENE LOPEZ and NON: HORN.



During the period from December 28, 1945 to January 15, 1946 no physical surveillance was conducted on H MOLD GLASSER and no pertinent information was obtained from the mail cover. It was ascertained from Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, that HAROLD GLASSER and his family 2 returned from Harvey, Illinois to Washington, D. C. on December 30, 1945. On January 11, 1946, a postcard was addressed to Mr. and Mrs. B. GOLD signed Mother and Dad. This card stated that they are to arrive in Washington at 1:30 Saturday leaving New York Saturday morning at 9:30 a.m. On January 12, 1946, a letter was addressed to Mr. BELA GOLD from IRVING WISCHER, Post Office Box 1825, New Haven 8, Connecticut. On January 14, 1946, a letter was addressed to Mr. and Mrs. B. GOLD from I. STEINMAN, 847 E 172nd Street, Bronx 60, New York City.

The following information regarding BELA GOLD and his contacts was received from Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau:

On Tecember 28, 1945, BELL GOLD contacted a man name ACAX and another man named RUGGLES in his office, discussing a reshuffle mentioned in KLUTZ! column (apparently referring to JERRY KLUTZ, columnist with the Washington Post.) 
Also on Jamuary 1, 1946, a man named CAPL, who said he was an advisor on commodity problems in the Pepartment of Commerce, contacted BILL BOLD asking him what his impression is of the Science Foundation Bill. Background information reflects that FIEID came to Washington, D. C., from New York City about May, 1939,

The records of the Gredit Bureau reflected that FIEID's wife, BEATRILE Hamilton National Bank of Washington, D. C.

A check of the indices of the Washington Field Division in the pase of, "Robert Tamiller, 3rd, Hatch Act, File 100-16641, serial 26," reflected that Mrs. MILLER is acquainted with HANNAH COLDMAN, and that HANNAH COLDMAN was working for the Russian Purchasing Commission.

Reference is made to the surveillance log for December 14, 1945, which contains the description of an unknown man with whom GREGG left the Walker Johnson Building, 1734 New York Avenue, Northwest. It was noted that this unknown man had a decided limp. Reference is also made to a letter to the Bureau dated January 3, 1946, in the case entitled, "Geraldine Shandros, WA, Internal Security - C. the Washington Field Office file 100-14006, wherein it is stated that Confidential Informant has advised that JERRY KRAMER, of room 712, Walker Johnson Building, was in touch with the CIO Maritime Committee Office and had inquired for GERAID INFASHANDROS. Informant advised that Captain JERRY KRAMER intended to return to New York City on December 29, 1945. Bureau letter dated January 30, 1945, in the same case sets forth background information on JEROME DAVIDOKRAMER, of the United States irmy, including the fact that he had been given a temporary assignment as a courier for the State Department. In July, 1943, one of his legs was amputated just above the knee, On January 15, 1946, a pretext telephone call to the State Department, Courier Section, was made and it was ascertained that KRAMER is no longer with that Department but has been returned to the Courier Section of the State Department. Further investigation reflects that KRAMER has his office in the Pentagon Building, Further attempts will be made to obtain a photograph and complete description of KR.MER.

# PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

On January 10, 1946, a physical surveillance was conducted by Special Agents OWEN CHANEY and WARREN L. LOVE on the above subject.

At 9:15 A.M. subject was observed at his desk in room 337 at the main State Department Building, 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue.

It 12:35 P.M. GREGG left his office and proceeded to the State Department exit on Pennsylvania Avenue where he was joined by ROBERT T. MILLER, a subject in this case. They proceeded east on Pennsylvania Avenue through Lafayette Park to 16th Street, and into the lobby of the Statler Hotel. They were observed at the Statler Hotel Cashier Window where it appeared that MILLER was attempting to cash a check.

At 12:55 P.M. they left the Statler Hotel, proceeded east on K Street, Northwest, made a left-hand turn on Vermont Avenue and entered the BONAT

At 2:10 P.M. they were observed leaving the Restaurant and proceeded Southwest on Vermont Avenue diagonally through Lafayette Park and thence to 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest. They talked on the corner of 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue for about five minutes, and then parted.

Special Agent LOVE followed MILLER west on Pennsylvania Avenue to 810 18th Street, entered the Otis Building where he took an elevator to the sixth floor.

At 6:25 P.M. GREGG was observed leaving his office and proceeding to the drug store on the southwest corner of 17th and Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest, where he made a telephone call. Agent LOVE secured an adjoining telephone booth and overheard the subject in the following conversation apparently to his wife:

Babe, will be in New York tonight about 12:00, "

At 6.40 P.H. GREGG left the telephone booth and boarded a Union Station Streetcar at Jackson Place and Pennsylvania avenue. 1t 6:55 he arrived at Union Station where he was observed by the meents purchasing a newspaper and he then ran into the concourse, through the Pennsylvania gate, and caught the Pennsylvania 7:00 0'clock train to New York City. He obtained a coach seat and had in his possession at that time a saddle bacon brief case.

At 11:25 P.M. the train arrived at the Pennsylvania Station in New York City. GREGG proceeded through the railway station to 7th Avenue, north on 7th Avenue to BICAFORD's CAFETERIA, 7th Avenue and 34th Street, At 11:50 he left Bickford's Cafeteria and proceeded to the Pennsylvania Hotel, and the reservation desk he apparently attempted to obtain a reservation.

At 12:10 A.M. January 11, 1946, GREGG was observed walking north of the Avenue to 34th Street and west on 34th Street to 8th Street where he entered the Hotel New Yorker. He again attempted to secure reservations but without success.

The Bureau files also reflect that when JOSE ANTONIO TRZE, head of the Pir Revolutionary Party (party of the revolutionary left) in Brazil, visited the United States in 1944, he held a conference of an unknown nature one evening at a residence in Washington, D. C. Twenty-one people attended this conference and it was noted that an unidentified individual left the conference in an automobile later determined to be registered in the name of MAURICE HALPERIN.

terephone is listed to the office of MAURICE HALPERIN Office of Strategic Services.

It will be noted that according to information previously set out in reports of this case, EDITE HALPERIN, wife of MAURICE HALPERIN, was believed to be employed at the Montgomery Hill Junior High School, Silver Spring, Maryland. In this connection the Baltimore Field Division advised by teletype of January 18, 1946, that EDITH EVELYN HALPERIN, nee FRISCHE, resided at 9956 Georgia Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland, from February, 1945 to date and previously at 254 Maple Avenue, Takoma Park, from September, 1942, to February, 1945, as well as at 5600 Taylor Road, Riverdale, Maryland, from September, 1941, to September, 1942. She may have been a substitute teacher in Prince George County, Maryland, in 1942. However, the Board of Education records contain no information in this connection. It has been determined that Mrs. HALPERIN is now a full-time teacher at the Montgomery Hill Junior High School, Silver Spring, Maryland, but did not fill out an application form as she was a substitute teacher approximately two and one-half years ago, No pertinent information could be obtained from the Montgomery County Board of Education with reference to her present employment,

As regards WOODROW WILSON BORAH, 1929 16th Street, N. W., who has been mentioned on several occasions in previous reports of this case, it should be pointed out that this individual is probably Acting Chief of the Latin American Division of OSS. MAURICE HALFERIN was Chief of this section until a recent date and apparently still retains his office in the Dorchester House, 16th and Juclid Streets, N. W., although his present status is not known at this time.

An examination of the mail boxes of the apartment house known as 1929 16th Street, N. W., reveals that BORAH resides at Apartment No. 32. It would appear that this apartment was formerly occupied by Captain TERRENCE MAPLES inasmuch as this individual's name has been crossed off the mail box placard for apartment 32.

It has been previously reported that the person known as TERRY who is an associate of WOODROW WILSON BORAH was believed to be identical with Captain TERRENCE MAPLES. However, as it has been ascertained that TERRY is undoubtedly a woman, it is now believed this individual is employed as a secretary in the OSS office in the Dorchester House. It is also believed that she dates BORAH on frequent occasions.

An examination of the records of the Credit Bureau with reference to WOODROW WILSON BORAH reveals that according to their report of August 1, 1945, he resided in Apartment No. 713, 1112 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. The report also indicates he was born in 1912, is white, single, has no dependents, and at the time of the report had resided at the above address for three weeks. He recently returned from Europe where he had been for

several months. He formerly resided at 20kl Fort Davis Street, S. E., Apartment 302, Fairfax Village, for two years. He also lived at 1233 B Street, S. E., Arbor M, in Princeton, New Jersey. He is employed as Assistant Chief of the Latin American Division of the Office of Strategic Services, 2480 l6th Street, N. W., to which position he was appointed on February 16, 1943. This was a war service appointment and he was formerly employed as an instructor at Princeton University from September, 1941, to April, 1942. He is a graduate of the University of California at Los Angeles, California. He maintains a savings and checking account at the Riggs National Bank. A foreign report from Trenton, New Jersey, dated May 5, 1942, with reference to BORAH indicates that he was at one time employed in the Division of Special Information by the Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., for a period.

Reference report revealed that on December 19, 1945, HALPERIN conferred with a Mrs.XGROSSMAN. On the basis of the information furnished, it has been impossible to identify Mrs. GROSSMAN in the indices of the Washington Field Office or by referring to the telephone directories.

Reference report also contained information supplied by Confidential Informant concerning a conversation between KAREL W.XDEUTSCH on December 19, 1945, during the course of which they referred to CARLASPAETH.

A telephone directory of the U. S. Department of State indicates a CARL SPAETH in the Office of Special Political Affairs is assigned to Room 165-S, State Department, Extension 2532.

The indices of the Washington Field Office reveal a case entitled "CARL BY SPAETH, Special Inquiry, Advisory Commission Council of National Defense." According to this file, Staeth was appointed assistant coordinator and general counsel by the Advisory Commission on August 16, 1940. His personnel file reflects he was born on May 3, 1907, in Cleveland, Ohio, and has received the following education:

His residence was listed as 2500 Foxhall Road, N. W., Washington, D. C., and he indicated he supported a wife, two children, his wife's mother, and two British refugees.

He was appointed Assistant Coordinator and General Counsel in the Office of the Coordinator of Commercial and Cultural Relations between the American Republics, on August 16, 1940, at \$8000, and on August 14, 1940, was promoted to \$9000 per year. (This latter promotion is probably a typographical error.)

According to this file, investigation failed to reveal any un-American tendencies, and he was reported to be a member of no un-American groups. No criminal record was located on SPARTH.

1945, Mrs. HALPERIN conferred with Mrs. GRACE S. LOWRY of 2410 Wyoming Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. An examination of Mrs. LOWRY's residence reveals she resides in a house of the high-priced class. The Washington Field Office indices contain considerable information with reference to this individual.

Mrs. LOWRY was a passenger aboard the SS "DROTTMINCHOIM" June 30, 1942, and contemplated returning to her previous employment at the International Student House, Washington, D. C. Investigation in this connection revealed Mrs. LOWRY is a Quaker by religion and at the time of her return to the United States had been on leave of absence from the International Student House as director of this organization to fill the position as head of the Friends Center in Paris, France.

Attention is further invited to reference report wherein it is stated that on December 20, 1945, it became apparent that PAUL 3, ROLLER, an alleged professor at the University of Maryland, and his wife, ETTA ROLLER, of 6209 Kilmer Street, Cheverly, Maryland, are social contacts of the HALPERINS. There is no information in the Washington Field Office indices regarding PAUL S, ROLLER. However, according to a report of Special Agent NED P. HOLMAN dated June 19, 1942, at Washington, D. C., entitled United American Spanish Aid Committee, Internal Security - C", one ELIA J. ROLLER is a recipient of mail from this organization.

A Stone's Mercantile Agency report dated June 14, 1939, reveals that Dr. PAUL S. ROLLER, then of Daniels Avenue, Berwyn, Maryland, between 45 and 47 years of age, and married, was employed by the U. S. Bureau of Mines since about 1922. ROLLER was detailed to New Brunswick, New Jersey, and since approximately April, 1937, has been located at College Park, Maryland, as a scientist at the salary of approximately \$4,000 per year. He is married and has two children, At the time of the report he was banking at the Citizens Bank of Riverdale, Maryland.

Additional information contained in a Gredit Bureau report of January 21, 1942, reflects ROLLER resided at 121 Stoddard Road, Cheverly, Maryland, and has lived there since October, 1941. He is stated to have a bank account at Hyattsville, Maryland.

Continuing with information developed by Confidential Informant during the period of reference report, it will be noted that informant supplied information on December 24, 1945, concerning Lieutenant RAYMOND XDESTON, U.S.N.R., 4822 30th Street, Fairlington, Virginia, telephone number Temple 4293. The Washington Field Office files were reviewed to divulge information concerning DESTON with negative results.

A report of December 21, 1943, on file at the Credit Bureau reveals Lieutenant RAYMOND (DORRANCE) DESTON resided at 4535 30th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. Lieutenant DESTON is married, has two children, and was



formerly with the John Hancock Insurance Company as an agent for nine years at a salary of \$3000 per year. He formerly resided at 12 Ware Road, Auburndale, Massachusetts, and was born in 1907. He has also resided at 11 Autumn Street, 2 Bremmer Street, both Boston; 59 Carey Road, Brookline, and 22 Ballard Street, Fall River, all Massachusetts. He was connected with the John Hancock Insurance Company in Boston, Massachusetts.

A summarization of the information supplied by Confidential Informant during the period of December 28, 1945, to January 15, 1946 inclusive, regarding a ctivities of the HALPERIN family is being set out below.

On December 28, 1945, LILLIAN BUNAWAY and EDITH HALPERIN engaged in a social conversation, during which time a Mrs LE BOY (phonetic) was mentioned. Later in the day a Mrs PASAMAN (phonetic) of 1221 Noyes Drive discussed matters pertaining to the A.U.W. Club with EDITH HALPERIN.

Also on December 28, 1945, MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with WOODROW WILSON BORAH and congratulated him for having been appointed Acting Chief. It is believed that BORAH is now Acting Chief of the Latin American Section of OSS.

employee in his office, on December 28, 1945. He suggested that BOB contact BORAH and congratulate him, stating that BORAH has been "elected". HALPERIN also advised that the selection of BORAH (as Acting Chief) was made by BILL KIANGER.

Subsequent to the foregoing, MAURICE HALPERIN invited DAVID WAHL and PHILIP BUNAWAY to his home that night. WAHL could not make it so it was finally agreed that the HALPERINS would call on the DUNAWAYS. On December 29, 1945, Mrs. HALPERIN and Mrs. PHILIP DUNAWAY agreed to go to the movies.

December 29, 1945. During the course of this conference, HALPERIN mentioned that he and Mrs. HALPERIN intended to call on WOODROW BORAH that night

daughter of MAURICE HAIPERIN, told unidentified individuals that she has been invited to a cocktail party to be given by DAVIDERIAS istant Chief in her father's office. She stated that the party is on Monday and the purpose of inviting her is so that she can meet ROLLER's son who is a senior at Eastern High School.

On December 30, 1945, MAURICE HAIFERIN conferred with PHILIP DUNAWAY concerning internal matters in OSS. HALPERIN asked if the orders had been issued as yet and who would know about this. DUNAWAY answered that LANGER (WILLIAMLANGER) might; however, JUST (phonetic) or PAUL WARD (phonetic) are not aware of the situation. HALPERIN believes the delay is significant but theorders may come through on Monday. DUNAWAY replied that the whole thing has been placed before the "big boss" and there is a choice of five schemes ranging from utter centralization to utter decentralization. MAURICE HALPERIN later contacted DAVID WAHL whom he advised they will call on tonight. They both regretted that the DUNAWAYS could not also be present

MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with BOB ROGERS on December 31, 1945, and invited him to come to his home that night. ROGERS regretted inasmuch as he had an engagement to take TERRY (a woman) to the theater. Informant advised TERRY's last name is SIROCCO (phonetic). Almost immediately after the above, HALPERIN contacted WOODROW BORAH and invited him to bring TERRY to his home that night. BORAH accepted the invitation for both of them. 21 km

Also on December 31, 1945, MAURICE HALPERIN conferred with PHILIP DUNAWAY. They discussed various matters with reference to OSS and in particular to various proposals for what appears to be reorganization. DUNAWAY stated that the compromise will probably be something "which would leave the geographical boys with enough - certain authority to meet their wishes and at the same time provide for some kind of a control staff - perhaps with considerable emphasis on the collection of information." He said these ideas are purely speculative and neither he nor JUST (phonetic) know anything definite about it. HALPERIN, PHILIP DUNAWAY, and possibly DAVID WAHL will get together

On January 1, 1946, CARL (probably KAREL W. DEUTSCH) advised MAURICE HALPERIN that he has just returned from New York City and wants to know whether "we have an office." They discussed official business in general and HAIPERIN stated, "The only thing I know is we're on the payroll - that's the important thing." Adding, "Well, we're on Uncle Sam's payroll." HAIPERIN advised he has not heard from CARL SPAETH or anybody else about what they may expect in the future. DEUTSCH stated he saw by the newspaper that PERON had gotten "Critica" (a newspaper in Argentina). HAIPERIN stated. "He's doing very well, We should only do so well, CARL," HAIPERIN and DEUTSCH agreed to get together and talk matters over at an early date The same of th

Mrs. HAIPERIN, temporarily stopping at Silver Springs 0133, contacted the maid at her home on January 3, 1946. (74)

1946. No information of value was obtained from informant on January 4,

On January 5, 1946, a Dr. LIETIAND (phonetic) left word that he wants HAIPERIN to dine with him at the Cosmos Club on the following Tuesday. Later in the day MAEXFRANKS (phonetic) invited the HAIPERINS to an "Oklahoma tea" to be held on instant afternoon. MAE mentioned that her husband JOEXFRANKS is now working at the Department of Commerce and is very happy. JOE was employed by the temporary National Economic Committee under NEISON MILLER in 1939. MAE also advised that NEISON MILLER has now become chief of a division at the Department of Commerce and consequently asked JOE to come work with him and do the statistical work. MAE mentioned that the tea is at 1733 I Street at 5:00 PM. PAUL WALKER will make a talk on "Oklahoma and Oklahomans."

On January 6, 1946, WOODROW BORAH engaged in a social Econversation with HALPERIN.

Subsequent to the above, EDITH HALPERIN conferred with JOSEPH GREGG, subject of instant case, whom she advised that she and her husband would be over in a few minutes.

MAURICE HALPERIN then told ROBERT MILLER (subject of instant case) that he and Mrs. HALPERIN would be over to see them later in the afternoon. Mrs. MILLER remarked that they would be delighted to see the HALPERINS and an old friend, a lady who has just gotten lack from Europe where she has been with UNRRA, is stopping over with them.

On January 7, 1946, HALPERIN told PHILIP DUNAWAY that by March 1, 1946, they will be working in the same building, namely the Lend-Lease Building at 22nd and Virginia Avenue, N. W. DUNAWAY explained that this is only a temporary move as they will move into the Surgeon General's Office as soon as the War Department vacates it. DUNAWAY also mentioned that the Secretary of State had left town and it has been decided not to settle anything about their organization until March 1st. In this connection DUNAWAY advised that the Secretary has asked "the Colonel" to build up an organization but to go no further. DUNAWAY also advised that the Colonel" is finding it hard to do this since very few people want to go anywhere for only sixty days (2)

Informant advises that HAIPERIN, shortly after the above, contacted WOODROW BORAH at Adams 1286 and gave him a summary of the above discussion with DUNAWAY. He added, however, that the Secretary has told McCORMACK (possibly the individual referred to above as the colonel) to build up an organization pending final decision on March 1st. BORAH stated that looks like a stalemate and may cause the other side to win. He also maintained the fight will probably continue until July 1st. HAIPERIN stated they will probably drop the "I" from the name of the organization. BORAH concluded by advising that he has been reading "a certain quarterly - an old issue but interesting" (possibly the F.B.I. Quarterly Intelligence Report).

Additional information developed on January 7, 1946, reveals HAIPERIN contacted BOB ROGERS at Adams 3729. HAIPERIN told ROGERS about the above matters, stating "We are on ice until March 1st." ROGERS made the remark that McCORMACK would be a fool to stay on. HALPERIN, during the course of a discussion with reference to his new office building, advised they will first go to the "slaughter house" (Lend-Lease Building) and then have offices in the Surgeon General's Building. It was stated that this information with reference to the new organization is not generally known as yet and should not be bandied about.

No information of value was obtained from informant on January 8, and 10, 1946.

On January 11, 1946, TERRY (secretary) conferred with MAURICE HAIPERIN with reference to routine office matters,

On January 12, 1946, MAURICE HAIPERIN and PHILIP DUNAWAY engaged in a social conversation. Later in the day DAVID WAHL and MAURICE HALPERIN agreed to call off the get together that night due to illness in both families.

It was ascertained from informant on January 13, 1946, that the HALPERIN's intend to go to Frederick, Maryland, on the coming Saturday.

Mrs. HALPERIN contacted an individual name DENZIL (phonetic) on January 14, 1946. DENZIL remarked that PARKES (phonetic) had arrived in Cairo, Egypt, and that the Ethiopian delegation was small (2)

On January 15, 1946, a Mrs. ANN SNODGRASS and Mrs. HALPERIN discussed their mutual trip to Frederick, Maryland, on Saturday

In view of the information supplied by Confidential Informant to the effect that the HALPERINS intended to Visit JOSEPH GREGG, ROBERT MILIER, and attend an Oklahoma State Society tea on January 6, 1946, 10 a physical surveillance was instituted by Special Agents M. A. TAYLOR and L. G. ZANDER

At 3:05 PM HALPERIN, his wife and son drove to the home of JOSEPH GREGG at 6829 Piney Branch Road, N. W., where they remained until 4:45 PM. At this time they drove to 1733 I Street, N. W., and entered the White Birch Inn. They attended a gathering of approximately 30 individuals which was later determined to be a meeting of the Okoahoma State Society. They left this meeting at 7:00 PM and drove to 3223 Northampton Street, N. W., which is the residence of subject ROBERT T. MILLER. At 8:50 PM the HALPERINS left the MILLER residence and proceeded to their home at 9956 Georgia Avenue,

Silver Spring, Maryland. At the same time Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT T. MILLER, as well as one unidentified woman, also drove to HALPERIN'S residence whell they remained until 12:40 PM on January 8, 1946. Upon leaving the HALPERIN's residence, the MILLERS and the unidentified woman returned to the MILLER home at 3223 Northampton Street, N. W.

### ALGER HISS

SECRET

On January 2, 1946, a thirty day mail cover was placed on the residence of ALGER HISS, 3210 P Street, N. W. To date this mail cover has proved negative.

The following information was obtained from confidential informant by relative to the activities of LGER HISS.

At 8:20 p.m., on December 26, 1945, a man named DUNNEY (phonetic) contacted ALGER HISS at which time HISS told him he HISS is going to start packing some things in his suitcase because he is planning to take the 7:30 a.m. Sunday train (to New York City) because they said they can't hold the boat. HISS then asked DUNNEY if he has any news from Baltimore today. DUNNEY said no. (HISS is referring to his trip to New York City with the UNO Delegation who are leaving the country from New York for London.)

On December 27, 1945, at 9:12 p.m., Mrs. HISS contacted one DON, believed to be DON.LD HISS. She welcomed him back to Washington. DON said he arrived back via plane at noon on Christmas day. It appears DON has just returned from London as Mrs. HISS requested his opinion as to what clothing she should pack for her husband.

On December 28, 1945, at 7 p.m., ELIZABETR MAY contacted ALGER HISS and asked him if he is still accepting invitations. HISS said he is leaving at 7:30 a.m. on Sunday. She asked him if PRISCILLA, his wife, would like to come over for New Year's Eve. HISS said she is tied up that night since "Mrs. BIDDLE is having a reception for some of the cast of the play about OLIVER WENDELL HOLMES and PRISCILLA is going to that." ELIZABETH asked HISS how long he would be gone, and he said "longer than I want."

At 11:30 a.m., on December 29, 1945, ALGER HISS contacted his wife and advised her the boat doesn't leave New York until Sunday night on December 30, 1945, so that he will not have to take the train so early on Sunday morning. The informant advised later that HISS stated he would leave Washington at about noon on Sunday, December 30, 1945, for New York City.

At 10:05 p.m., on December 30, 1945, ALGER HISS from New York City contacted his wife and told her he got off the boat for an official call and took the opportunity to contact her. He said the boat would sail at 3 a.m. on December 31, 1945.

# Physical Surveillance

The following is the result of a physical spot surveillance maintained on ALGER HISS.

SECA

On December 13, 1945, Special Agents HAROLD A. BONEY and PAUL RAINES took up the surveillance at the residence of ALGER HISS at 7:15 a.m. At 9 a.m., HISS and his wife left their residence and entered their automobile which was driven by Mrs. HISS. They proceeded to the State Department Building at 17th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., where ALGER HISS got out of the car and purchased a newspaper for Mrs. HISS and then entered the State Department building. Mrs. HISS drove away in her car.

At 1:38 p.m., HISS was observed walking down the front steps of the State Department Building. He walked to the Evans Building at 1420 New York Avenue, N. W., and proceeded to room 714 which is the office of the American Association for the United Nations. HISS was next observed by Special Agents J. J. McKENNA and J. F. BUTLER at 7:37 p.m. leaving the State Department with an unidentified man. They proceeded to a parking lot adjacent to the Metropolitan Club where they entered a late model car bearing 1945 Virginia license 459-769. This car was driven by the unknown man. They drove to HISS' residence where HISS left the car and entered his residence.

At 10:20 p.m., HISS left his home and walked to 31st Street where he entered his car and drove it to 32nd Street where he parked it on a hill. He immediately returned home.

With reference to Virginia license plates 159-769 mentioned above, these plates were determined to be issued to ELWOOD LATHOMPSON, 3306 Valley Drive, Alexandria, Virginia.

On December 15, 1945, Special Agent H. A. BONEY at 9:37 a.m. observed HISS leave his residence and walk to the corner of Wisconsin Avenue and P Street, N. W., where he boarded a streetcar and proceeded to the State Department.

On December 17, 1945, Special Agent JAMES K. HOEFLING observed HISS leave his residence at 8:50 a.m. and board a streetcar on Wisconsin Avenue. He proceeded to the corner of 18th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue where he left the streetcar and visited a jewelry store at 17th Pennsylvania Avenue. He also visited a jewelry store at 1720 Pennsylvania Avenue. He then entered Henry J. Goodman & Company, men's furnishings, at 1707 Pennsylvania Avenue, where he made a purchase. HISS then entered the north entrance of the State Department on 18th Street at 9:15 a.m.

The following description of HISS was obtained from observation by Agent HOEFLING:

On December 21, 1945, Special Agent E. HYATT MOSSBURG observed HISS's automobile was parked on 32nd Street between P and Q Streets, N. W., from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and obviously had not been moved since a recent heavy snow storm. Through an inquiry at the State Department it was determined that HISS was at his office in the State Department. The surveillance was discontinued at 2 p.m. when it was determined from confidential informant that HISS had changed his plans for leaving town to go to Baltimore, Maryland. No surveillance was conducted on ALGER HISS on December 22 and 23, 1945, since there was no indication he was engaged in any unusual activity.

By teletype dated December 31, 1945, the New York Field Office advised that ALGER HISS had sailed for London on the SS Queen Elizabeth as a member of the United Nations Delegation to attend the United Nations Conference in London.

According to confidential informant on December 30, 1945, DOROTHY BLAISDELL (phonetic) contacted Mrs. HISS and they discussed the departure of LIGER HISS and others who are waiting to sail for London. DOROTHY said she was through at FEA and was glad to stop working.

Special Agent WILLIAM D. TE PIE through inquiry at FEA personnel office determined DOROTHE BLAISDELL was formerly employed there but when FEA was liquidated her complete personnel record was transferred to the Department of State.

The indices of the Washington Field Office reflect in July, 1941, in the case entitled, "Washington Committee for Aid to China; Internal Security - C," DOROTHEA HLAISDELL, 3901 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., was on the membership list of that organization. The indices further reflect in May, 1941, during an investigation in the case entitled, "Capital City Forum; Internal Security - C," it was determined DOROTHEA BLAISDELL, 2934 Newark Street, N. W., was on the membership list of the Capital City Forum, an alleged radical lecture group in the District of Columbia, and also that she was a member of the D. C. Cooperative League.

During the course of an investigation conducted in March, 1941, by the Washington Field Office in the case entitled, "League of Women Shoppers, Washington, D. C.; Internal Security - C," it was determined Mrs. DONALD C. BLAISDELL, 2934 Newark Street, N. W., was on the list of the active members of that organization as of January 1, 1941. This organization was an active backer of CIO labor disputes.

The Washington Field Office indices further reflect DONALD CHRISTY BLAISDELL was the subject of a hatch act investigation by the Bureau and as of February, 1942, he was employed in the Department of State and resided at 3901 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. He formerly resided at 2934 Newark Street, N. W. DONALD BLAISDELL was interviewed and signed a statement denying his membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

The following information concerning the activities of IRVING KAPLAN was obtained from confidential informant from December 28, 1915, to January 15, 1946

On December 31, 1945, at 3:17 p.m., the informant advised ŒORŒ PERAZICH, another subject in instant case, contacted IRVING KAPIAN at KAPIAN's residence. PERAZICH said he was in Washington for a few days, and he was staying at the Lee Sheraton Hotel. He said he was planning to go to California in order to pick up his family and bring them to Washington. PERAZICH remarked he was in Frankfurt, Germany, about the same time as KAPIAN was there. KAPIAN told PERAZICH he and his wife were going to a party that evening (New Year's Eve) at the home of the FITZŒRAIDS at 2209 Observatory Place, N. W. PERAZICH said he knew where the FITZŒRAIDS lived since he used to live there at one time. (It was subsequently determined this is the residence of EUMARD JOSEPH FITZŒRAID employed in the Commerce Department who is also another subject in this case.) PERAZICH appeared to be very happy at being invited since he stated, "Now I can see the whole bunch." KAPIAN said the FUCHS (phonetic) are stopping at the KAPIANS' home and that they are here from Denver.

Subsequently on the same date IRVING KAPLAN contacted Mr. FITZGETALD at 2209 Observatory Place, N. W., and asked him if it would be all right for the FUCHS and GEORGE PERAZICH to "crash the party" on New Year's Eve. FITZ-GERALD indicated the SILVERMANS, Mr. and Mrs. ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN, had been invited to the party. FITZGERALD indicated it would be o.k. for PERAZICH to come.

At 1:30 p.m., on the same date IRVING KAPLAN contacted VANTE SSEL and asked him to come right over. KAPLAN indicated the MAGDOFFS had just arrived. VAN TASSELL said he would be over in about thirty minutes.

On January 1, 1946, Mrs. RUSSELLYNIXON contacted IRVING KAPLAN and wanted to know when RUSS would be able to leave Berlin. KAPLAN said evidently he can't leave until CLAY o.k.'s it. They discussed the mechanics of RUSS's leaving, obtaining travel reservations, etc. KAPLAN said when RUSS reaves he would be in this country a couple of days after his departure.

Lt 10:01 p.m. on January 1, 1946, ELIZ.BETH SASULY contacted IRVING KAPLAN and told him she was talking to NIERENBERG who said KAPLAN might know if DICK's transportation was being changed from a boat to a plane. KAPLAN said he had already left but that KAPLAN was trying to get him here for the KILGORE Hearing. KAPLAN said he had talked to BERNSTEIN about the matter. (ELIZ.BETH SASULY was apparently referring to her husband RICHARD SASULY.)

On January 3, 1945, at 11-24 a.m., IRVING KAPLAN attempted to contact HARRY MAGDOFF at the Commerce Department on extension 2252. He was advised that MAGDOFF was at the Labor Department for the day. He therefore the most a Mr. Matthews on extension 1607 with negative results.

On the same date at 8:20 p.m., DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted a man named CHARLIE (phonetic). Mrs. KAPLAN said she and her husband will meet CHARLIE and MILDRED KRAMER for dinner at the Good Earth Restaurant on K Street at 6:15 p.m. the following night. She said they would arrange to meet at VAN's (the VAN TASSELLS) at the theater after dinner 71

On the same date at 8:35 p.m., Mrs. DOROTHY KAPIAN contacted GEORGE (probably GEORGE SILVERMAN) to see if the KAPIANS could take them to dinner the following Saturday night. They agreed that they would accept and it was decided they would probably go to Olmstead's Grill.

On January 5, 1946, at 8:27 p.m., HERBERT FUCHS who was staying with the K.PL.NS attempted to contact someone at the residence of ST.NLEY NDELBLUM, 266 Linwood Avenue, Cedar Hurst, Long Island, New York, telephone Cedar Hurst, 2186, with negative results.

DOROTHY K.PL.N and asked for Mr. FUCHS. She stated HERBERT FUCHS was staying with them but on that date he was at the STONES! She indicated FUCHS has an application for an apartment at Fairlington and at Park Fairfax.

On the same date at 7:34 p.m. Mrs. DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted MIPL.M (phonetic) and stated her husband K.PPY was free on the following Thursday so they would come to MIRIAN's for dinner. She said they will drive out from

On January 7, 1946, at 8:10 a.m., HERBERT FUCHS centacoed his wife at Cedar Hurst, New York, telephone Cedar Hurst 2186, and they engaged in talk mainly about finding a place to live in Washington. Mention was made of the fact they may stay at the STONES' and go fifty fifty on the house until they find a place.

On January 12, 1946, at 9:21 a.m., RUSSKNIXON (phonetic) contacted IRVING KAPIAN at which time NIXON stated he arrived on the previous day by plane from Paris and Berlin. NIXON said he believed a "hornet's nest" had been stirred up on the business of external assets. KAPIAN said the Treasury is out of it but the Kilgore Committee is very much interested. He said the committee wants to expand the hearings beyond the question of I. G. FARBEN, and that NIXON will probably be a star witness. KAPIAN suggested that NIXON get together with HERB SCHIMMEL, FRITZI MANUEL (phonetic), a woman, and BELLENMAYER (phonetic). He said MAYER works for JOE FRIEDMAN (phonetic) and wrote the BERNSTEIN testimony, (probably referring to Colonel BERNARI SERNSTEIN, a contact of HARRY DEXTER WHITE)

KAPIAN said the Kilgore Committee will probably go into the whole question of external assets and cartels and that NIXON will probably testify on or about January 30, 1946. KAPIAN said JOE FRIEDMAN is the man in the Treasury Department who knows about external assets. NIXON said the State Department is opposed to his ideas, and KAPLAN said that Secretary of the Treasury VINSON is disturbed about NIXON's report. KAPLAN said MIXON's story was carried only by the newspaper "PM" and that denials were carried by many other papers. KAPIAN urged NIXON to wait until the Kilgore Hearings so that his story will be given in response to questions while the latter is a witness. KAPLAN suggested that RICHARD SASULY be put on the stand to introduce the Dodge Report and that JOHN DERKES (phonetic) is drumming the newspaper interest. KAPLAN said one of DREW PEARSON's guys got in touch with him yesterday and that CLAYTON CIATO (phonetic), and CYNQUBEN (phonetic) are responsible for all this. KAPLAN said the State Department in its news releases will probably refer to RUSSELL NIXON as that "CIO guy, a temporary guy." NIXON indicated he would see KAPIAN t the Treasury Department 17





# Re: LT. COL. DUNCAN C. LEE

No information of value to this investigation was obtained from the mail cover on subject a residence during the period of this report.

# BACKGROUND

Background information with reference to DUNCAN C. IEE as correlated from data submitted by the New Haven Field Division, Richmond Field Division, and that contained in his file at the War Department is hereinafter set forth.

Mr. H. B. FISHER, Liaison Officer of Yale University, made available the personnel record of Colonel LEE, which reflects that his full name is DUNCAN CHAPLIN LEE. His nick-name is DUNC, and his permanent mailing address is Chatham Hall, Chatham, Virginia. LEE was born in Anking, China on December 19, 1913, where he resided until 1926. From 1926 to 1931, he lived at Chatham Hall, Chatham, Virginia, where his father, Rev. EDMUND JENNINGS/LEE, Episcopalian minister, is rector of the Girls' Preparatory School known as Chatham Hall, LEE's father, EDMUND JENNINGS LEE, was born in Shepardstown, West Virginia, and is a graduate of the University of Virginia, having attained his BA and MA degrees in 1889.

LEE's mother, LUCY MITCHELL CHAPLIN, was born in New York City. IEE's brother, ARMISTEAD M. LEE, graduated from Yale University in 1938, and married ELEANORE RUGGLES CORB in Westford, Vermont on June 20, 1942. At this time, ARMISTEAD LEE was Vice Consul at the U. S. Consulate in Toronto, Canada. His sister is named PRISCHIA A XIEE.

DUNCAN IEE attended St. Alban's Preparatory School in Washington, D. C. from 1927 to 1928, and Woodbury Forest Preparatory School, Woodbury Forest, Virginia, 1928 to 1931. IEE entered Yale University in the fall of 1931 and was graduated with a BA degree in June, 1935. In his Freshman year, he held a Southern Alumni Association Scholarship. During his college career at Yale, he was awarded Phi Beta Kappa and received several awards in oratory. In his first two years at Yale, he ranked second as a scholar; whereas, in his Junior year, he attained No. 1 ranking. He was a member of the football squad and wrestling squad, as well as the debating team. In his Senior year, in 1935, he was awarded a Rhodes Scholarship from Virginia, and attended Oxford University from 1935 to 1938, from which institution he received a B. C. L. degree On June 18, 1938, LEE married ISARELLA (ISHBEL) SCOTT GIBB at Oxford, England.

In October, 1938, LEE re-registered at Yale University on a Research Fellowship in Law and graduated in June, 1939. The Yale University records reflect that as of June 16, 1939, LEE was employed as a law clerk in the law firm of DONOVAN, LEISURE, NE TON, and LUMBARD, 2 Wall Street, New York City.





He resided at 531 East 84th Street, New York City. The file also reflect the he left the DONOVAN firm June 30, 1942 to become Assistant General Counsel of the Office of Strategic Services in Washington, D. C., which position he held from All 1, 1942 techniques 4, 1942. On August 4, 1942, while still retaining the same position, he was awarded the commission of First Lieutenant in the U. S. Army. He was promoted to a Captain on March 3, 1943, and to Major on December 15, 1943.

Association under date of June 2, 1942, LEE stated that he held the position as thief Secretariat at the OSS in Washington, D. C. At this time, LEE was residing at 3014 Dent Place, N. W., Washington, D. C.

The indices of the New Haven Field Division reflect that copies of a memorandum to the Agent in Charge were sent to the New York Office under date of October 10, 1940, concerning "Attorney and Mrs. DUNCAN LEE, Communist." This memorandum reveals that Mrs. B. C. MANGIE of 23 Livingston Street, New Haven, Connecticut advised the New Haven Field Division that she became acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. LEE while he attended the Yale University Law School. As a result of this acquaintance, Mrs. MANGIE became convinced that both LEE and his wife were decidedly Communistic. She also related that a good portion of their home library was devoted to Communistic writings.



It is noted that according to the report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES in captioned matter, dated December 18, LEE conferred with an individual named BURTE, temporarily residing in the General Scott Apartment House, 1 Scott Circle, Washington, D. C.

Through the cooperation of Mrs. V. HOPE KAISER, Manager of the General Scott Apartment House, BURTE was identified as Lt. BEURETYSERVASS, USNR-special detail for the OSS.

Mrs. KAISER informed Special Agent JEROME M. GARLAND that SERVASS temporarily occupied Col. and Mrs. WALKER's apartment during a short period in December, 1945 when these individuals were moving out of the city. She stated that she knows nothing about SERVASS but understands he did some very important secret work abroad for OSS. The indices of the Washington Field Office were negative with reference to this individual.

It will be noted that according to referenced report, RICHARD BXBAKER visited the home of DUNCAN C. LEE on December 14, 1945. A check of the indices of the Washington Field Division reflected that a letter was received from the Bureau under date of May 19, 1942 in the matter entitled "RICHARD BRO"N BAKER, Office of Coordinator of Information, Employee Investigation", requesting the Washington Field Office to conduct an investigation with reference to BAKER, who resided at 2120 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

A report of Special Agent CHARLES J. HONETOR, dated at Washington, D. C., June 11, 1942, in this matter, revealed BAKER was born on November 5, 1912 at Providence, Rhode Island, and was employed at the Federal Communications Commission from July 22, 1941 to September 23, 1941, at which time he resigned without prejudice.

It is further noted from referenced report that in addition to BAKER tified man and woman visited TERIS home on the land addition to BAKER an unidentified man and woman visited IEE's home on the night of December 14, 1945. These individuals were occupants of an automobile bearing Virginia tags No. 474-269. This automobile is registered to PHILIP MAKAISER, 2101 South Lynn Street, Arlington, Virginia. No information is contained in the Washington Field Office concerning this individual.

It was also reflected in referenced report that on December 26 1945, LEE contacted one WHITING SHEPARDSON. A check of the indices of the Washington Field Office reveals that an individual by the name of WHITNEY HASHEPARDSON, Vice President of the Bates Bag Company, appears in a Times—Herald newspaper article of August 22, 1945, entitled "OSS Survival Plan Attacked as Plot for U. S. Super Gestapo—Congress Prepares to Unearth Secrets of DONOVAN's Mix of Bankers and Reds." This article states the OSS is under heavy fire because of its curious fusion of international bankers of Wall Street and Economists of Union Square. The name of WHITNEY H. SHEPARDSON is among a list of persons connected with the Wall Street bankers. It is not known whether this person is identical with the above-referred to WHITING SHEPARDSON.

There is being set out below a summarization of information supplied by confidential Informant during the period of December 28, 1945 to Janu- by 15, 1946, inclusive.

On December 28, 1945, IEE informed his wife that there is a possibility of "working something out" with DAVE—in the next year or so, but he believes he best count on going back to the law firm (DONOVAN, LEISURE, NEWTON, and LUMBARD). Col. LEE inquired of the Service Unit, U. S. Department of State concerning the home phone number of WHITNEY SHEPARDSON, He was told that this number is CO 2088. He informed Mrs. SHEPARDSON that he is bringing his sister, PRISCILLA, along with him when he calls on them.

DUNCAN LEE and his wife discussed plans for attending a party to be held at 1673 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W. at 5:30 p. m. on January 2, 1946. IEE also

On the third of January, 1946, a BESSYMATES (phonetic) informed Mrs. IEE that she is looking for a home for a friend of hers and understands that the IEES intend to leave Washington, D. C. Mrs. IEE stated that her husband will they will not leave before April or June. (2)

On the same day, Mrs. IEE attempted to contact a Captain JOHN BRETTSMITH at extension 72409 in the Jar Department.

On January 4, 1946, DUNCAN LEE and his wife discussed inviting JOHN REETT-SMITH to dinner. A subsequent invitation issued to Captain BRETT-SMITH

It was also ascertained on this day that DUNCAN IEE has a reservation at the Hotel Pennsylvania, New York City, for January 6, 1946. IEE further attempted to obtain reservations at this hotel for January 7th and 8th for two officers, PAUL and BICK (unidentified) who will accompany him. IEE further made reservations for General DONOVAN and OSWALD 6 DOERING at the Shoreham Hotel in Washington, D. C. for January 5 and 6, 1945



New York City. Mrs. LEE was questioned concerning the chances of DUNCAN IEE obtaining a job with "that firm." She replied that there are one or two people in the firm who might not be agreeable to his employment. Later in the day, Mrs. LEE obtained a suite at the Roosevelt Hotel for January 9, 1946, in the name of Mr. DUNCAN CHAPLIN (DUNCAN LEE's uncle) and son 2010.

No information of value was received on January 9, 10 and 11th, 1946. MERCEMET (Mrs. BUS) MENRY informed Mrs. LEE that her brother, XRUSSELL, would be in bown and would like a date with PRISCHLA LEE. They discussed the imminent discharge of LEE from the Army; whereupon, Mrs. LEE stated she believed it is a good thing inasmuch as the "whole thing is slowing down and is getting in bogs and sand and is bad for the general morale." On January 13, a HENRY PUTSEL advised Mrs. LEE that his wife, NORY CALLES

No information of value was received on January 14, 1946.21

On January 15, an individual named all conferred with DUNCAN IEE. LEE informed AL that DRIBER (phonetic) is in Thomasville, Georgia; whereupon AL stated that he was speaking to DRIBER the other day and was quite sure that he is around Washington. LEE gave AL the following telephone numbers at which DRIBER might be reached: Hallqwell's, phone EX 1560, and MERGE KENNEDY (pho.)

A short time subsequent to the above, DRIBER (phonetic) conferred with DUNCAN IEE. IEE told DRIBER that ALCOX has been trying to get in touch with him. He stated that AL can probably be reached at EX 1560. DRIBER informed IEE that he thinks he will get back in the army because he can't find anyone who will pay him \$50,000 a year to work. DRIBER stated he can now be reached at North 3152 and will try to see IEE before he leaves.

Mrs. DUNCAN IEE and one MARIAN edited to forego the picture show on January 15, 1946.





C. around September, 1937 and has also resided at 1921 K Street, N. W. The Washington Post in an article dated August 15, 1941 reflects that Private JOHN B. OAKES, former Capitol Hill reporter, is at Ft. George Meade, Maryland.

JOHN BERTRAM OAKES, of Camp Richie, Maryland, is around twenty-six years of age, white, single, and reported to have been at Camp-Richie since October 14, 1941. He formerly resided at 2301 North Uhle Street, Arlington, Virginia from October 1, 1939 to October 15, 1941, renting a house with a number of other young men. Prior to this, he resided at 1913 S Street, N. W. in the home of Mrs. DUBANE SHELDON, as well as at 1700 Rhode Island Avenue, N. W., renting from a Mrs. PALMER. The report indicates OAKES came from 145 Central Park, N. W., New City, and holds a rank of Lieutenant in the U. S. Army.

Foreign information received from the Credit Bureau in New York City reveals that, according to a report of January 17, 1938, JOHN B. OAKES, reside at 145 Central Park West, New York City, with his aunt, Miss NANNIE OCHS

resided there since October, 1932. His brother, GEORGE W. OAKES, is also living at this Central Park address. His wife is the daughter of Colonel and Mrs. ERNEST ALBERTYROSE of London, England, She is reported to have means of her own. is the son of the late GEORGE WASHINGTON OCHS, of New York. The records indicate the family name was changed legally in 1917 from OCHS to OAKES. The father of GEORGE and JOHN OAKES was a well-known journalist and publisher. He was an official of the New York Times. GEORGE OAKES! aunt, Miss NANNIE OCHS, resided at 145 Central Park, N. W. for a number of years. GEORGE OAKES is now residing at 1316 35th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. GEORGE and his wife also resided at the Hampton House. 28 East 70th St., New York City, for about a month in August, 1943. From February, 1940, they rented an apartment at 14 East 75th Street, New York City. Around September, 1939, they resided at the Hotel Volney, 23 East 74th Street, New York City.

A report dated November 18, 1944, appearing in the files of the Credit Bureau reveals that Mrs. CEORGE 7. (JOANNA) OAKES of 1518 26th St., N. W., is approximately twenty-eight years of age, white, married, and dependent. She and her husband have resided at this address for a short time and formerly lived at 1316 35th Street, where they rented a house from Mrs. HUME HULL. A OAKES! husband is a Captain in the U. S. Army, and on duty at the Pentagon Building, Arlington, Virginia.

The Stone's Mercantile Agency report of October 20, 1945, reflects that Miss CLAUDE FRANCOISE VAMES of 1673 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W., is approximately twenty-seven years of age, and single.

This report also indicates that since December, 1944, she and Mrs. MARIAN WELLS FITTS have conducted an antique and decorating business at 1324 Wisconsin Avenue under the trade name of The White Poodle. Miss JAMES! father is reported to be a Managing Editor for the New York Times newspaper, New York City. Miss JAMES came to Washington, D. C. from New York City, and since March, 1945, has been residing at 1673 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W.

The Credit Bureau report dated September 2, 1943, with reference to Miss CLAUDE FRANCOIS JAMES, reveals that at the time of the report, she resided at 1606 20th Street, N. W., first floor. W., which has an assessed value of \$9171, was acquired by MARIAN WELLS and ELEANOR WELLS on July 8, 1943. MARIAN WELLS also owns 1419 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W. and 1673 Misconsin Avenue, N. W., the latter in partnership with CLAUDE FORMES. She also holds title to 1677-1679 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W., which she is now remodeling. The whereabouts of Mrs. FITTS' estranged husband is unknown. Her father, Dr. WALTER A. WELLS, resides at 1673 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W. He is a retired physician. The has a sister named ELEANOR WELLS, who resides at the same address. Prior to 1943, she resided at 3213 P Street, N. W. She banks at the Hamilton National Bank, 619 14th Street, N. W.

A report dated June 21, 1944 in the Credit Bureau reveals that GORDON B. (M.RIAN) FITTS of 3059 Q Street, N. W. is young, white, and married, He and his wife have resided at this address, which is the home of her father, WALTER WELLS, for approximately six months. GORDON B. FITTS is employed by the American Red Cross where he was first appointed on December 22, 1941. He was formerly employed by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation as an Assistant Clerk at \$1800 a year—War Service Appointment. It is stated that GORDON FITTS intends to move to an apartment at 1654 Avon Place, N. W. in June, 1944,

The only credit information with regard to Captain WILLI/M L. C/RY is contained in the files of the Stone's Mercantile Agency. This merely states that WILLIAM L. C/RY resided at 2301 North Uhle St., Arlington, Virginia. (Note: JOHN OAKES formerly resided at this address.).





Washington Nu-Grape Corporation of Washington, D. C. His mother-in-Law, IDA RAINE, was unemployed.

NACK came to Washington, D. C. from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and has resided at 3010 Wisconsin Avenue, N. W., Apartment 205, 1028 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., 3121 16th Street, N. W., 1526 Ogden Street, N. W., and since July, 1933, to 1936 at 624 Emerson Street, N. W., all Washington, D. C.

Additional information concerning the NACKS, as reflected in the files of the Credit Bureau, indicates in a report of November 15, 1941 that Mrs. THLER. NACK (HERERT C.), 3200 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., was born in 1907. There is a notation to the effect that Mrs. THLER. NACK is divorced at the time of this credit report. According to the report, she was formerly employed by the Department of Agriculture as a Senior Typist from September, 1927 to May, 1941, at which time she resigned. HERBERT C. NACK reported that Mrs. THLER. NACK was his first wife. He has since remarried, The name of his present wife is unknown.

The same report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES reveals that on December 9, 1945, one MALVIN G. HOFFMAN of 3821 W Street, S. E. visited LISCHINSKY's residence. There is no information concerning this individual in the files of the Washington Field Office.

The records of the Credit Bureau reveal that according to a report of September 20, 1943, MALVIN GAMOFFMAN, wife, MIIDRED MOFFMAN, who resides at 3821 W Street, S. E., Apartment 102 (Fairfax Village), is approximately forty-five years old, is married, and has two children. HOFFMAN came from 1603 South Knoxville Street. Tulsa. Oklahoma in 1941. At the time of this report, HOFFMAN was employed by the Department of Interior, Office of Petroleum Administration for War, as a geologist at \$3800 per year, having received this appointment on August 1, 1941. HOFFMAN maintains a checking account at the Washington Loan and Trust Company, Washington, D. G.

Foreign credit information received from Tulsa, Oklahoma on August 5, 1943 reveals that HOFFMAN and his wife, MILDRED LIEBERMAN HOFFMAN, resided at Tulsa, Oklahoma for approximately five years. HOFFMAN was employed as Chief Geologist by the MIDCO Oil Company of Tulsa, Oklahoma, and prior to this, by the GEOCHEMICAL Service for approximately six months. His residences in Tulsa were listed as 1603 South Knoxville Street, 1321 South Quaker Street, and 706 South Cheyenne Street. His marriage license was issued in Tulsa, Oklahoma, March 27, 1939.

During the period of this report the mail cover maintained on this individual has shown that the subject and his wife received a communication from It. SAMUEL MAGDOFF, 30th Medical Depot Company, APO 758, c/o Postmaster, New York, New York. The date of mailing of this communication was not shown. MAGDOFF also received a communication from the Special Agent in Charge of the Internal Revenue Service, Treasury Department, P. O. Box 1017, Philadelphia, 5, Pennsylvania. This communication was postmarked January 9, 1946, at Philadelphia. It was noted that the mail cover on the subject was renewed on January 2, 1946, for an additional thirty days.

The following background information concerning the subject was obtained from a confidential source:

According to an undated application probably filled out in 1940, HARRY S. MAGDOFF resided at 4862 Conduit Road, NW, Washington, D. C. He was born August 21, 1913, in New York City, with legal residence in Pennsylvania. He attended the City College of New York from September, 1930 to February, 1953; New York University from September, 1933 to May, 1935; the University of Pennsylvania from September, 1939 to May, 1940. He obtained a BS Degree in 1935 from the University of New York.

He was employed from September, 1932 to August, 1934 by the PREMIER PAINT COMPANY, 125 West 101st Street, New York City as Office Manager and auditor at a salary of \$2,000.00 per annum; from October, 1934 to sometime later the same year he was employed by the SIIK TEXTILE CODE AUTHORITY, 110 East 40th Street, New York City, at \$2,000.00 per annum. There was also some indication that the subject was employed by the SIIK TEXTILE CODE AUTHORITY for nine months as assistant to the Vice President, HOWARD HEYDON From April, 1936, to an undesignated time the subject was employed by the WPA, National Research Project, 1015 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as principal statistician. His salary ranged from \$2900.00 to \$4,000.00 per annum.

The same confidential source indicated that the subject formerly resided at 49 East Chiveden Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The subject entered on any October 1, 1940, as Senior Economist with "The Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense," at \$4600.00 per annum. On September 1, 1941, he was promoted to Chief of the Civilian Requirements Section at a salary of \$5600 00 per annum. On March 1, 1942, he was promoted to Head Production Program Analyst at \$6500.00 per annum. On November 18,1943, his title was changed to Economist (Chief Program and Control Records Branch) at the same salary On July 3, 1944, MAGDOFF resigned to transfer to the Department of Commerce and gave the following as his mailing address:

According to the same confidential source on July 28, 1943, permission to issue credentials to MAGDOFF was permanently withheld. These credentials would have allowed him to enter various war plants throughout the country. It is believed that permission was withheld probably as a result of a previous livil Service investigation of the subject.

OLLIE KIIPATRICK contacted MAGDOFF and during a conversation the name MIL GILLERT. Was mentioned. It is possible that this reference is to one MIL

are identical with the MILTON CILVERT mentioned in the conversation between MAGDOFF and KILPATRICK.

On December 27, 1945, Confidential Informant advised that MAGDOFF told CHARLES KRAMER of MAGDOFF's appointment on the Staff of the General Motors Fact Finding Committee. The same informant advised that the MAGDOFF's accepted the invitation to spend the evening of December 28, 1945, with Mr. and Mrs. IRVING KAPLAN.

On December 27, 1945, the same informant advised that MAGDOFF contacted HAROLD WEIN, 1300 Tuckshoe Street, Falls Church, Virginia, phone Number 2343W. MAGDOFF told WEIN of his appointment to the staff of the General Motors Fact Finding Jommittee. The two discussed the submission of WEIN's report to the Committee. It appeared that WEIN was also a member of that staff. In the conversation WEIN stated that MOZAK (ph) is a pedantic hairsplitter who leans over backward too much." In the conversation WEIN mentioned the fact that he knew ROY N FREED, who is employed in the Antitrust Section of the Department of Justice.

Mrs. MAGDOFF then said that KISH's telephone number was Michigan 3920 or that he could be reached at the Department of Agriculture It is noted that a check of the current telephone directory does not list anyone by the name of GRAZE, however, there is a GERALD GACRAY, 2845 Monroe Street, NE, Hobart 3673 listed, who may be identical with the individuals mentioned above

At 8:00 P. M. on December 29, 1945, according to the Informant one JOE contacted Mrs. MAGDOFF who invited JOE and WILLIE to the MAGDOFFS that evening. JOE stated that they could not come. Mrs. MAGDOFF indicated that CAL and LAWRENJE would be over that evening also

The same informant advised that on January 1, 1946, Mrs. MAGDOFF contacted SOL LESCHINSKY and invited LESCHINSKY and MELVA and PEARL over for dinner at the MAGDOFF'S residence on Wednesday, January 9, 1946. It is believed that MELVA is their wife of SOL LESCHINSKY and that PEARL is possibly LESCHINSKY'S sister.



On January 6, 1946, Mrs. MAGDOFF contacted SOT DIMOND at which time Mrs. MAGDOFF told DIMOND that she expected to see him that evening. Mrs. MAGDOFF then spoke with one TRUDY who indicated that she had arrived from New York late the preceding evening. TRUDY indicated that she was leaving town again on January 7, 1946. It is noted that the current telephone directory lists one ALFRED FRIENDLY, 1645 31st Street, NW, North 1030 who may be identical with the person contacting the subject at this time.

Later the same day Mrs. MAGDOFF contacted FEROL CORNELISON and invited her to the MAGDOFF's home on Sunday, January 20th. Mrs. MAGDOFF then inquired of FEROL concerning LESLIE KISH, stating that she hadn't heard from him in a long time. It is noted that the phone directory lists

On January 10, 1946, advised that MAGDOFF contacted one SANET of and mentioned to her that he had received an invitation from LESTER KELLOG, becretary-Treasurer of the MAJHINE TOOL BUILDERS, to give a talk before the group in the near future.

On January 11, 1946, the same informant advised that Mrs. MAGDOFF contacted one JANEYSTONE and advised her that the subject was going to be in Cleveland about January 25th to attend a meeting of the Economic Association

On January 13, 1946, Mrs. MAGDOFF contacted FRANCE FUCHS at which time Mrs. MAGDOFF told FUCHS about a house for rent which is about seven miles below Alexandria. FUCHS asked Mrs. MAGDOFF who the lawyer was who handled the Russian property. Mrs. MAGDOFF stated that the lawyer was IRVIN COLDSTEIN, who has an office in the National Press Building. On January 14, 1946, one EDYSTONE contacted the subject regarding a meeting both were to attend on January 24, 1946. The subject indicated he would be on his way to Cleveland at that time, but would return to Washington, D. C. on January 25, 1946.

Confidential Informant has also provided a great deal of information during the period of this report which shows that Mrs. MAGDOFF continues to be very active in the af airs of the League of Women Voters.

### PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

January 4, 1946: Surveillance was begun at 6:30 P. M. at the residence of the subject, 3226 Ravensworth Place, Alexandria, Virginia At 7:20 P. M. a man in a Navy officer's uniform and a woman drove up in a 1940 green Ford Coupe bearing D. C. Plates 119,340. They entered the MAGDOFF residence. The man was a Lieutenant described as about 32, 5' 11", 155 pounds, slender build. The woman was described as about 30, 5' 6", 130 pounds, brunette complexion. She wore a fur ccat. No other visitors came to the MAGDOFF residence up to 8:00 P. M., at which time the surveillance was discontinued. The car was observed to contain a driver's license Number 512963 issued to WILLIAM R. PABST. JR. 1963 39th Street, N. W. He was described as being 31 years of age in 1942 and as having blue eyes and red hair. The car registration card was also observed and it was noted that it was made out in the name of WILLIAM RICHARD RABST, JR. of the same address as mentioned above.

January 5, 1946: Syrveillance conducted this date on EDWARD JOSEPH FITZGERALD reflected that subject MAGDOFF was seen in the former's company for about one half hour between 5:00 and 6:00 P. M.

January 9, 1946: Surveillance was begun at 11:30 A. M. in the University Club, 16th and M Streets, N. W. At 12:30 P. M. two men were observed in the lobby of the University Club who were believed to be waiting for the subject. At 12:23 P. M. MAGDOFF entered the lobby of the University Club and joined these two men. At 12:26 P. M. MAGDOFF and his two companions entered the dining room of the University Club. The first unidentified man, believed to be WYLIE KILPATRICK, is described as follows: Age 50 to 55, height 5: 11",

weight 160 to 165 pounds, build slender, hair sandy colored, straight, partly bald, wears glasses. He was observed to wear a brown single-breasted suit, brown necktie, black shoes and a black or dark gray overcoat.

The second unidentified man with MAGDOFF was believed to be OLIVER HOYEM and is described as follows: Age 58 to 65, height 5' il", weight 175; Hair gray, almost white, bald on top. This individual wore a blue suit

At 2:08 P. M. MAGDOFF and the man believed to be KILPATRICK, the man believed to be HOYEM and a third unidentified man, believed to be a Mr. HAGEN, as mentioned earlier in this report, left the University Club. KILPATRICK entered a taxicab at 16th between L and M Streets and proceeded to the Darby Building, 905 E Street, NW. He entered this building through an entrance bearing the sign "Department of Commerce, Bureau of Census"

Information was subsequently developed that WYLIE KILPATRICK has two offices, one at 905 E Street, NW, and the other at the Governmental Section of the Department of Commerce, Suitland, Maryland

MAGDOFF and the man believed to be Mr. HAGEN walked south on 16th Street and proceeded on foot to the Federal Loan Agency Building on Vermont Avenue between H and I Streets, NW. The two stood at the entrance and talked for about ten minutes until 2:25 P. M. at which time the man believed to be Mr. HAGEN entered that building.

MAGDOFF proceeded on foot and entered the 15th and E Street entrance of the Department of Commerce Building.

The man believed to be HAGEN is described as follows: Age 28, height 5' 10", weight 150 to 155 pounds, build medium, wears glasses, dressed in a dark blue overcoat and a medium gray suit.

No other information of significance was developed to date.

The information set forth hereafter was obtained from confidential by informant during the period of this report from December 28, 1945, to 17 January 15, 1946.71

On December 28, 1945, HARRY LEVY (apparently brother of JENNY and FLO LEVY referred to as Uncle HARRY previously) contacted one ANNE in New York City at Underhill 3-3088, indicating he would be home that evening. ANNE sent her regards to FLO and the MILLERS.

On the same date subject MILIER contacted JENNY CILLER at which time they mentioned visiting the BOJMANS, presumably the HEATH BOJMANS. No date was mentioned. 71

Later on this date AND FELTUS contacted JENNY MILLER at which time they discussed Christmas. Mrs. MILLER indicated her brother HARRY had been down from New York and had just left.

TENNY MILLER also contacted OLYA MARGOLIN on this date. OLYA was trying to locate a house or room for a friend. She expressed thanks to Mrs. MILLER for a nice dinner, apparently having been a dinner guest at the MILLER home very recently. Mrs. MARGOLIN indicated about February 22, 1946, she may go to New York to see HEN (her husband?).

At 7 p.m., on December 28, 1945, ROBERT MILLER contacted Mrs. MORSE inquiring for Dr. MORSE. MILLER stated he could not make it in the morning and desired to make other arrangements. Subsequently MILLER talked with Dr. MORSE at which time he made an appointment for Wednesday. It is presumed this is Dr. ROBERT MORSE, 3106 N Street, N. W., which address was visited by

MILLER on November 28, 1945, and again on December 12, 1945.

At 10 p.m. on December 28, 1945, MILLER endeavored to contact Kr. and Mrs. HEATH BOWMAN unsuccessfully. He left word the MILLERS are expecting describe HEATH BOYMAN. Further effort will be made to identify and

On December 29, 1945, JENNY MILLER contacted an unknown woman engaging in social conversation. Mention was made of the address of DORIS as 314 South Walnut Street, Crawfordsville, Indiana,

At 1:05 p.m. on this date, Mrs. MILLER contacted PEGGR GREENFIELD, previously mentioned in this case, and invited her over for dinner that night. PEGGY said she was too tired. In response to Mrs. MILLER's inquiry, PEGGY said she saw a couple of French movies on her trip to New York. Mrs. MILLER suggested that BOB MILLER would call for PEGGY who then agreed to come over about six p.m. and MILLER would take her home by 11 p.m.

On December 31, 1945, an unknown woman contacted MILLER briefly advising that the colonel won't be there tonight. No further information is available concerning this contact.

On January 1, 1946, Mrs. MILLER and subject MILLER were contacted by Mrs. SPAULDING, presumably the wife of E. WILDER SPAULDING, MILLER's superior at the State Department, and were invited over to the SPAULDING home at 8:15

On January 3, 1946, Mrs. SHURA LETTS conversed socially with Mrs. MILLER. During the conversation, she inquired as to why the MILLERS had not visited her on New Year's Eve.

One JIM ERGUSON contacted Mrs. MILLER on January 4, 1946, advising he had just come into town on business and would remain until Tuesday. He indicated he was staying at United Nations, and they agreed to have dinner together on Sunday.

The Washington Field files contain a number of individuals by the name FERGUSON having the first letter "J" or the name "JAMES." However, none could be positively identified with the above individual.

On January 5, 1946, JENNY MILLER contacted some adjustment department or bureau speaking with the secretary of a Mr. DESBAR (phonetic) to make inquiry him. It was explained he should sign a statement of proof which they had sent to was set forth.

On January 7, 1946, Mrs. MILLER was contacted by a woman who stated Dr. HALFERIN was calling. At the time subject MILLER was in the bath, and it was indicated he was to call North 8827. This contact was made at 9:36 a.m.

On this date JENNY MILLER contacted a doctor who spoke with a foreign accent. They conversed about a woman named ETHEL (phonetic) who was supposed to visit JENNY all day. However, the woman had not arrived until 5:45 p.m. and they had very little time to talk. It was indicated ETHEL had grown stout because of a starch diet. The doctor inquired if ETHEL was going to work here, and JENNY MILLER stated ETHEL did not know whether they want her to back but probably would if she was urged, and she wants to be urged.

On January 7, 1946, JENNY MILLER contacted her sister FIO LEVY to inquire "That was that address?" FIO stated it is 2137 Wallace Avenue. The city in which this address is located was not indicated. No such street appears in the Washington City Directory.

On January 7, 1946, JENNY MILLER contacted OLYA MARGOLIN inquiring if she had seen the column of DRET PEARSON, and JENNY requested her to read it, explaining it dealt with why the State Department is not issuing visas to immigrants and why the department is understaffed. OLYA read the column of FEARSON and stated he is all mixed up. JENNY admitted he's not ever entirely one hundred per cent reliable. Mrs. MILLER indicated she is not interested in bringing wives to this country because they will get here by hook or crook. OLYA said the State Department has nothing to do with issuing visas and repeated handled largely by the Army, and they have been trying to get more help from the Budget Bureau. Also the State Department is trying to get a larger staff.

At 8:40 p.m. on January 7, 1946, the MILLERS were contacted by Mrs. BILL WILE nee JANE CORDON who was enroute south with her husband and stopping off at the Washington Hotel in room 240. Mrs. WILE invited the MILLERS down to the hotel which invitation was accepted. She indicated she lives in Flushing. Mrs. MILLER stated she would get in touch with BOB who had gone out to play chess and would also ask FIO LEVY to come down.

On January 8, 1916, Mrs. HILDA KOHN contacted Mrs. MILLER inviting her and BOB over Wednesday; January 23, 1946, in honor of her son JERRY who is home on furlough. Mrs. KOHN mentioned EVA/DEX FON will be there. Mrs. MILLER in turn invited the KOHNS over a week from Bunday at 2 p.m. so that JERRY could see the MILLER children. JERRY is going to New York on Friday returning the following Thursday. Mrs. MILLER inquired about PAUL and Mrs. KOHN stated he still had not received his notice. Mrs. KOHN stated JERRY is to report to Camp Pickett, Virginia, for overseas assignment after his furlough 7/1 Mrs.

EVELYN and ADELE, apparently relatives of theirs, are coming on Friday. ADELE has had pneumonia and the doctor has told her to go to Lakewood. However, they could not afford it and are coming to Washington for a few days.

On January 9, 1946, BOB MILLER was contacted by a Mr. KOOSTER (phonetic) who has a strong Polish accent. This individual apparently was seeking a position with FFA and had encountered delay and asked for MILLER's advice. The matter had been presented by FFA to the personnel division at the State Department. KOOSHER is not an American citizen but had filed his first papers. He had received a call from one BECKNER (phonetic), acting chief of requirements and supply division, who referred him to ROBERT KYAN, personnel man in the State Department. KOOSHER indicated BECKNER advised him Congress stipulated in appropriating money for Polish relief that Americans should see how the money was used, the number of people who received aid, etc. MILLER advised the delay in securing the position is normal, particularly in view of the merger of FEA, OTI, and OSS with the State Department. KOOSHER mentioned Mrs. GREEN had spoken with RYAN who told her the same thing. 11

where the application stood. KOOSHER said BECKNER talked with GEORGE TARREN who KOOSHER thinks is well disposed toward him. MILLER said KOOSHER should not contact TARREN but that BECKNER should call RYAN first and also enlist the aid of those in the State Department with when BECKNER collaborates and BECKNER should press RYAN insisting that all those people in Poland need food and delay is not to be permitted. KOOSHER indicated he would tell BECKNER this and call MILLER later. KOOSHER asked what sort of a person RYAN is, and MILLER said he looks at things from a personal point of view. MILLER inquired as to the health of Mrs. KOOSHER and KOOSHER said everything was fine and he had received good news from his daughter. KOOSHER apparently has been connected with OSS. (It is possible this individual may be one KULISHER who is a known contact of MILLER.)

At 10:30 p.m. on January 9, 1946, EVELYN, apparently a sister-in-law to Mrs. MILLER, advised Mrs. MILLER from New York they would not come to Washington until Saturday afternoon since ADELE has a date on Friday night.

On January 11, 1946, FIO LEVY and JENNY MILLER engaged in conversation. JENNY indicated the MILLERS would go to the BOTMANS on Sunday.

On the evening of this date, POLYA HABICHI contacted JENNY MILIER stating she is preparing her speech for the following Thursday. She indicated she wanted BOB MILLER to come also and stated she likes criticism. JENNY inquired as to the location of the place where the speech was to be given, and POLYA did not know, 71

On January 12, 1946, OLYA MARGOLIN contacted Mrs. MILIER as requested and was invited over to the MILIERS on the following afternoon as EVELYN and ADELE are coming. OLYA stated she had a tentative engagement on the following day having invited two servicemen from Walter Reed Hospital over for dimer OLYA agreed to come Monday evening if she could not make it Sunday.

On the same date an unidentified woman contacted JENNY MILLS asking her to go to hear MARTHA speak at the Library of Congress that afternoon.

JENNY MILLER stated she could not because her sister-in-law was coming. JENNY MILLER asked them to drop by and the woman stated SHURA (LEVIS), FILADA

LEVIS' husband had been offered a job in the State Department which he had not yet accepted.

At noon on January 12, 1946, one MARGARET contacted BOB MILLER and inquired, "What happened about that?" MILLER stated JOHNWYERGUSON and Mr. MACHESON seemed a little concerned about the whole lean situation and particularly in view of ACHESON's discussions with DONALDWOUSSELL on the subject. MILLER stated "JOHN and I do not feel we can decide and be sure since it has to be taken up again." A lengthy conversation ensued concerning the issuance of literature and the preparation of radio broadcast dealing with monetary matters and the British loan, (apparently matters coming under the Division of Research and Publication, State Department, where MILLER is employed).

On January 12, 1946, JENNY MILLER and an unknown woman discussed the theater and current movies, and they agreed to go to see a play by TENNYSON WILLIAMS a week from Saturday at the National Theater. The woman stated they would try and get over to the MILLERS that night 71.

On January 12, 1946, ELIZABETH HALPERN contacted JENNY MILLER and invited JENNY and BOB MILLER over to her home at 1515 20th Street to a late party. She stated they were having the King Cole Trio sometime after 11 p.m. JENNY indicated her sister-in-law and daughter were coming in from New York in half ar hour but thought she could get away since it was a late party.

On January 15, 1946, one WAROLD contacted an unidentified woman, apparently one of the relatives visiting the MILLERS. She inquired when HAROLD got in, and he stated last night. The woman said she had been on a number of sightseeing trips but still preferred New York. HAROLD stated he would stop over and see the woman at 8:30 the next evening.

At noon on January 15, 1946, OLYA MARGOLIN contacted JENTY MILLER and they discussed Jewish problems. JENNY stated she had gotten away from religion somewhat and in the past the wealthy Jews had been very odious. OLYA stated she would probably visit JENNY Thursday or Friday. JENNY stated she was going to hear a woman lecture who had been quite a success in New York and if


going to give a talk here at 8 p.m. OLYA inquired as to the topic, and JENNY said the woman always talks on the Soviet Union. She stated her subject the the woman speaker as fearless and said she speaks freely and steps on people's

With reference to the address to be given by POLYA HABICHT on Thursday, January 17, 1945, Special Agents JEROME CARLAND and MADRICE A. TAYLOR conducted a physical surveillance covering this meeting. The place where the address was to be given was unknown, and surveillance was initiated at the residence of subject MILLER. However, observation disclosed the MILLERS were not home, and surveillance was taken up at the residence of POLYA MASICHT on Chestnut Street. At 7:15 p.m., January 17, 1946, a maroon sedan, Maryland license HABICHT bearing a man and three women. This car was followed and it proceeded to the Friends Meeting House of Washington, 2111 Florida Avenue, N. J., where a lecture was being given by the East-West Society. 71 YM

POLYA HABICHT was unknown to the agents; however, a short time after she and her party entered the Friends Meeting House, subject ROBERT MILLER and JENNY MILLER were observed to enter. After securing the license number of numerous automobiles parked in the vicinity, Agent TAYLOR entered the meeting and remained until it broke up. Apparently POLYA HABICHT was the sole scheduled speaker and was talking when the agent entered. 2

The address of POLYA HABICHT concerned Russia and to some extent Russian-American relations. It was delivered in an ugly high-pitched voice and badly broken English. However, the speaker exhibited great zeal and present her remarks in a very serious vein. After her prepared speech was completed, she conducted a question and answer session for perhaps twenty-five minutes. Her talk could be properly described as a propaganda lecture.

Throughout the lecture she referred to the communist theory and philosophy as a natural one following the laws of life and nature and made the same remarks in connection with the Soviet program in the field of economics. She described the great progress that had been made in Russia in science, medicine, and particularly education. She frequently referred to the efforts in Russia by stating whe are doing so and so and that we are right in our beliefs on government. She discussed atomic power at some length, and her Russian friendship on a number of occasions and pointedly remarked that there were some people in Great Britain and the United States who feared and distrusted Russia. However, these people were entirely wrong and very bad people. She mentioned a great many people in Russia today are learning English and inadvertently perhaps insulted her audience by stating before the war everybody was learning German but of course they expected war with Germany at that time.




During her talk and during the question-answer session, POLYA
HABICHT illustrated her remarks with a number of incidents. On several occasions she referred to Mrs. LEWIS (SHURA LEWIS) who was present in the audience, and she also mentioned the father of ROBERT MILLER as having studied Russian and as speaking it quite fluently. She nodded to MILLER who advised his father had only been in Russia two months but had studied the language considerably here in the United States. In further illustrating the interest in the Russian language, Mrs. HABICHT replied to a question concerning exchange students that there were already a number of persons studying Russian, and she stated individuals had been to Russia in the past. She particularly recalled one JOHN HAZARD who had spent five years in Russia and was now back in the United States and stated his experience in Russia had been a wonderful one.

She also mentioned there are 26 Russian students in Columbia University at the present time. Mrs. HABICHT apparently stressed the visiting of individuals to Russia rather than groups.

POLYA HABICHT related a little anecrete concerning one PEGGY STEVENS (phonetic) who had gone to Russia and had married a Russian man. She stated the girl was a Catholic, and he was a communist, and after six or seven years their marriage was still unsuccessful and the husband was near desperation. She stated finally a couple of Red Army men had gotten hold of PEGGY and had persuaded her to teach English at the Red Army College, and within six months she had become completely converted and the marriage has been very happy ever since. She related another incident to point out the kindness of the Russians where the Red Army had found a young girl poorly clothed in freezing weather in Poland. The girl told them she was a well known violinist and they very considerately placed her in a room alone for three days until she lost her fear and nervousness and was found playing beautiful music on a violin they furnished her for several hundred Red Army soldiers.

At the conclusion of the talk and questions and answers, a lady in the audience suggested that Mrs. LEVIS arise and identify herself and make a few remarks. This appealed to the people present, and SHURA LEVIS arose and gave considerable background concerning herself. This woman is a very attractive blonde and made an excellent appearance. She spoke quietly and exhibited no great fervor in her remarks. She stated she was born in 1916 in a small town in the Ural Mountains some 200 miles from a railroad and laughingly remarked she had not seen a railroad engine until she was 19 years of age. She stated she had received a good education free in the Russian schools. She stated after receiving lower education, she went to Moscow to take a competitive examination for entrance into a worker's school, apparently comparable to our colleges, and was accepted as one of a hundred girls picked from one thousand competing.

She stated she received an excellent grade for Russian shorthand which she described as quite difficult. She advised she spent two years in the worker's school and thereafter received a scholarship to the university where she



went for four years. She advised while in Moscow she taught English although not highly proficient in this language, and explained the need for teachers was so great this accounted for her selection for this work.

SHURA LETIS related while in Moscow she had met and rarried her husband who was an American and employed as a clerk in the American Embassy. She said she departed from Russia in June, 1943, and arrived in the United ates in October, 1943. She indicated whereas she taught English in Moscow she was now engaged in teaching Russian in the United States. In this connection POLYA HABICHT had earlier mentioned that Hrs. LETIS conducted Russian classes and stated a number of officials and employees from the State Department were among her students.

SHURA LETIS referred further to her family stating she was the youngest child and had three brothers. She stated the oldest had been missing for three years during the war but finally appeared having received five "orders" for gallantry as a guerrilla fighter. She stated her second brother was an engineer; however, she made no reference to the third,

The gathering of the East-West Society was composed principally of women most of whom appeared to be average citizens of no extreme views. At no time did anyone clap or indicate more than respectful interest. There were a few persons who appeared to be Jewish and there was one individual who spoke Russian endeavoring to translate for POLYA HABICHT questions or points which she did not understand clearly. An inquiry disclosed the East-Test Society was founded by PEARLOBUCK, and the leader in Washington is a Mrs. TAUKEY (phonetic), sister of PEARL BUCK.


When the gathering broke up, it was noted only a few persons remained to converse with the speaker, and that FOLYA HABICHT was among the last to leave the hall in company with SHURA LEWIS and ROBERT and JENNY MILLER. The agents decided to surveil the man who had spoken Russian during the meeting. This man is described as follows:

In addition to the above, Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT T. MILLER, as well as Mrs. SHURA LEWIS, were observed to occupy the MILLER automobile.

The maroon automobile, bearing Maryland tags 466-625, hereinbefore referred to as having conveyed POLYA HABICHT to the meeting, is registered to ALBERT G. TIMES, 5208 Western Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

The indices of the various Field Offices covering the foreign automobile registrations and the indices of the Washington Field Office failed to reflect any information concerning LAPISH, CLARKE, WAUKEY, WOODRUFF, EUTCHINSON, EMBURY, BROWN, and TIMMS.

Silver.

The indices of the Washington Field Office revealed according to a report of Special Agent T. W. DAWSEY dated Washington, D. C., February 17, 1941, entitled, "American Peace Mobilization, Washington Peace Mobilization; Internal Security - C," FRANK C KRACEK of Hall Elm Street, Chevy Chase, Karyland, telephone Wisconsin 2872, was an active member of the Washington Peace Mobilization of the American Peace Mobilization.

It is also noted from a report of Special Agent DA SEY dated Washington, D. C., May 26, 1941, in the matter "Capital City Forum; Internal Security - C," that Mrs. F. C. PACEK of the D. C. Cooperative League, her address being 4411 Elm Street, Chevy Chase, Haryland, was a member of the Capital City Forum.

Regarding the physical surveillance of the gray-haired white-mustached man hereinbefore referred to, it was noted at the conclusion of the meeting he and an unidentified couple entered an automobile bearing D. C. tags 115-300. This individual drove to the corner of 16th and Irving Streets, N. W., where the unidentified couple alighted and took a bus to the Georgia and Alaska Avenue bus terminal. At this point the couple took a southbound Georgia Avenue street-car and upon departing therefrom walked to the apartment house located at 7019. Georgia Avenue, N. W.

Agent GARLAND followed these individuals and observed them to enter apartment 105 at this address. The apartment house mail box reveals that Mr. and Mrs. PAUL T. VOLOSHIN occupy this apartment. VOLOSHIN does not have a telephone nor is there any reference in the Washington Field Office files concerning this man.

The automobile bearing D. C. tags 115-300 is registered to NICHOLS PASETCHKIN of 1909 Kenyon Street, N. W., Jashington, D. C. The crosstown telephone directory for Washington, D. C., has a dual listing for telephone number Columbia 2059 located at 1909 Kenyon Street, N. W., the names being NICHOIAS BASETCHKIN and VIADIMIR BARRINIOFF. The Washington Field Office indices were checked for references on these individuals with negative results.

The only reference to the East-West Society or Association in the Washington Field Office is a newspaper article which appeared in the April 5, 1945, issue of the Washington Post. This article indicates that Russian born NILA MAGNIDOFF, wife of the American NBC Moscow correspondent ROBERT MAGNIOFF, will speak to the East-West Association on April 11, 1945, and be interviewed on the radio by ELEANOR MOWARD on April 12, 1945.



The article stated:

"Although a Soviet citizen, NILA MAGIDOFF was forced to leave Russia in 1941 because of the Soviet decree demanding the evacuation of wives and children of foreign correspondents. When she first arrived in this country, she spoke little English but nevertheless she had made two coast to coast tours of the country speaking for Russian war relief.. In the course of the tours, she has christened a ship named in honor or a Russian woman soldier and was awarded an honorary defense worker pin.

e transfer de la company de la \*Born in Minsk, Madame HAGIDOFF when still a young girl went to the new republic of Kirghiz as an educator. Then for a while she worked on a collective farm. For eight months she sailed the high seas as a merchant sea woman. Later, in Moscow, she was Moscow correspondent for a French language newspaper. At present she makes her home in New York."

Reference is made to the conversation on November 25, 1945; between ROBERT MILLER and PEGGY CREENFIELD in which the latter quarreled with MILLER over his failure to attend a mixed party given by PEGGY and accused MILLER of not wanting to associate with colored people. In the conversation mention was made to Dr. and MYRA CALLIS, referred to phonetically as KALLIS in the previous report. The indices of the Washington Field Office reflect that confidential informant advised the MILLERS and MARCARET CREENFIELD had attended a party on November 7, 19hh, given in the home of MRA and Dr. CALLIS, believed to be Dr. HENRY ARTHUR CALLIS, and his wife who resided at 2306 E Street, N. 1 Dr. CALLIS is a colored physician who formerly resided at Tuskegee, Alabama.

According to the informant, at that time there were two other couples at the party, the FRAZIERS and the YOUNGS. YOUNG was described as a teacher at Howard University Medical School (colored) and a practicing physician, and his wife, a teacher in the history of arts. The informant indicated neither MARGARET CORPUNETED nor Mrs. MILIER liked Mrs. FRAZIER too well because she was a little too much on the other side of the color line and the same was true with reference to Mrs. CALLIS. However, Mrs. MILLER thought Mr. FRAZIER was wonderful and was going to have the FRAZIERS over to her home. 1

The indices further disclose that Dr. CALLIS was listed as a sponsor on the Committee on Jobs for Negroes in Public Utilities, and he and Mrs. CALLIS were sponsors of the National Negro Congress.

It also appeared that Dr. HENRY ARTHUR CALLIS and MYRA CALLIS were listed as members of the American Peace Mobilization and Mashington Committee for Democratic Action.

It further appeared that EDWARD FRANKLIN FRAZIER is employed as head of the Department of Sociology at Howard University, and his name was listed in the active indices of the American Peace Mobilization, Washington Committee



for Democratic Action, the Marian Anderson Citizens Committee, and contributed to the magazine "New Masses." He was considered a racialist who would follow any movement or organization having strong racial interest. He was one of negroes who signed a petition urging the President to free EARL BROWDER from Atlanta Penitentiary.

Reference is made to the numerous contacts between the MILLERS and OLYA MARCOLIN. The indices of the Washington Field Office indicate this woman 15 the wife of BEN MARCOLIN who was employed in the Office of Inter-American iffairs where subject HILLER worked before entering the State Department. In August, 1945, OLYA MARCOLIN spent a week's vacation in Tennessee, her address being in card of T. J. GREEN, 901 Anderson Street, Bristol, Tennessee. At the present time it appears BEN MARGOLIN is in New York City.

In October, 1944, informant reported subject MILLER had sharply criticized BEN MARGOLIN of CLas for questioning him over the telephone and told him to bear in mind the place from which MaRGOLIN was talking. The informant indicated MARCOLIN had asked MILLER if he had gotten any information regarding a certain matter, and MILLER had brushed him off in fear that the conversation might be overheard. The informant stated it seemed that MRCOLIN was after some other position and was going to see an individual referred to a TRD, but M.ROOLIN felt-it was a hopeless proposition because his mother, father, and wife had been born in Russia. 20

Reference is made to the conversation on December 15, 1945, previously reported, between one JACK (possibly JACKYHEATH, phonetic) and MILLER in which reference was made to JOHN H.Z.RD. Reference is also made to the statements of POLY, HABICHT in her speech to the East-West Society reported herein concerning one JOHN H. Z. RO who had gone to Moscow and learned the Russian language. It is believed this individual is identical with JOHN NYH.Z.RD, wife SUS.N, who in 1944 resided at 3410 30th Street, N. W., and who came to Washington in 1941 from New York City and was employed by the Foreign Economic administration, room 2602, Temporary Building T, Washington, D. C. 7

As indicated it is not definitely established that the above included with the HAZARD referred to by MILIER.

It is recalled several references have been made by the MILLERS to EATH BOTTAN and to visiting with the HEATH BOTTANS.

The records of Stone's Mercantile Agency contain a report on one HEATH BOTIAN, wife JEFFERSON BROTHAN, 2309 Calvert Street, N. W., white, age about 29, who came to Washington from Evanston, Illinois, about 1942. He was formerly employed by Pure Oil Products Company, 35 East Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois, as special writer for the news publication "Pure Oil News," having worked for this company a number of years. He resigned in October, 1934; returned in February, 1939; and discontinued to go to Washington, D. C.

HEATH BOWMAN formerly resided with his parents, FREDERICK HEATH BOW-MANS, 1319 Church Street, Evanston, Illinois. In Washington he was employed from March 17, 1942, by OEM, Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs, 14th and Constitution Avenue, as business associate specialist at \$3200.

A news clipping of the Post dated June 18, 1942, reflects Mr. and Mrs. HEATH BOWMAN were occupying the home of Mrs. PERRY HEATH, 2100 S Street, for the summer. Mrs. HEATH is the aunt of Mr. BOWMAN. The clipping mentioned one of his well known books "The Hoosier" was about the late PERRY HEATH, a well known journalist. HEATH BOWMAN was described as an author who had written several books on Latin America, the best known being "Westward from Rio," and had written a book with his wife entitled "Crusoe's Island."

The Credit Bureau contained a report dated January 7, 1943, on HEATH ROWAN X DEFFERSON), 3051 Idaho Avenue, N. W., where they had been living for about two months renting an apartment at \$52 per month. Previously they resided at 2100 S Street, N. W., from Hay 1, 1942, and 2309 Calvert Street.

Reference is made to the conversation between one ELIZ.BETH HALPERN, 1515 20th Street, N. W., and JENNY MILIER at which time the MILLERS were invited to her home that night.

Confidential informant reported in November, 1944, the MILLERS 1 maintained contact with PAUL and HILDA KOHN whom they referred to as refugee friends they had met in Paris.

Reference is also made to the case entitle "PAUL KOHN with aliases; Peter Cohen and Peter Anders; Internal Security, Hatch act, in which New York is effice of origin, who is identical with the PAUL KOHN referred to herein.



### RE: CEORCE N. PERAZICH

Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, furnished information that GEORGE SPERAZICH advised IRVING KAPLAN that he is now in Washington and was enroute to California. This informant also advised that on the night of December 31, 1945, PERAZICH, KAPLAN, GEORGE SILVERMAN and others attended a party at the residence of EDWARD J. FITZGERALD, 2209.

The above is the first information that was received that PW ZICH had returned to the United States from Yugoslavia.

On January 4, 1946, Mr. C. T. Deveaux, Manager of the Hotel Sheraton, 15th and L Streets, N. W., produced hotel records reflecting that on December 30, 1945, GEORGE PERAZICH and DOUSHAND LOKAS signed the register there for Room 728. Special Agent D. J. ATWATER hoted that two other UNRRA people signed the register for Room 718 on the same date, all four giving "Belgrade" as their address. PERAZICH left the hotel on January 1, 1946. The two men in Room 718, 10:30 A.M., January 3, 1946, FLOKAS was still registered as in Room 728.

Confidential Informant T-1 ascertained that PERAZICH had leased an apartment No. 131, at 3700 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W., which are the Alban Towers Apartments. This informant's information was that PERAZICH would be in Dupont Circle offices of UNRRA.

It was ascertained from RANDALL H. HACNER and Company, Inc., Managers of Alban Towers, 3700 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W., that Apartment 131 was leased on May 1, 1945, to MCRRIS HUBERMAN, who at that time worked for the U. S. Forest Service. He has left for Japan, and his wife has gone to Florida. It has been ascertained that they are subleasing this apartment to GEORGE PERAZICH.

Stops were placed at all railroad and airplane offices in Washington, since PERAZICH was expected to go to California.





At noon on January 5, 1946, Mr. BROWN, of United Airlines, advised that PERAZICH was leaving for Fresno, California, on Flight No. 301, which departs from Washington at 5:00 P.M., January 5, 1946. PERAZICH was scheduled to arrive at Fresno, California, at 4:09 A.M., on January 7, 1946. PERAZICH—was observed by Special Agent D. J. ATWATER to depart from the Washington National Airport on United Airlines Flight No. 301 at 5:00 P.M., on January 5, 1946.

In two teletypes to the Los Angeles Field Division dated January 5, 1946, Los Angeles was advised of the expected arrival of PERAZICH at Fresno, on January 7, 1946. His description was furnished, and it was requested that he be placed under surveillance. Los Angeles was also requested to conduct a discreet inquiry relative to his wife, Mrs. AMELIA PERAZICH, residing at Route No. 2, Box 162, Dinuba, California, to develop her activities and associations.

By teletype dated January 15, 1946, the Los Angeles Field Division advised the Washington Field Division that subject GEORGE PERAZICH, with his wife and two sons, aged three and five, departed from Fresno, California, at 2:05 P.M., January 14, 1946, for Washington, D. C., and was scheduled to arrive at Chicago at 1:45 P.M., January 17, 1946, on Pennsylvania Railroad Train No. 54, The Gotham, Ltd., Car No. 542, Drawing Room "A", arriving Washington, D.C., at 5:00 P.M., January 18, 1946.

By teletype dated January 16, 1946, the Chicago Field Division was furnished that information along with the description of the subject, and was requested to discreetly determine the activities of PERAZICH during the interval of his train connections in Chicago and to advise the Washington Field Office of his departure for Washington.

By teletype dated January 18, 1946, the Chicago Field Division advised that GEORGE PERAZICH, his wife and two sons departed Chicago at 10:00 P.M., that date on Pennsylvania Train No. 54, occupying Drawing Room "A", of Car No. 542, scheduled to arrive in Washington at 5:00 P.M., on January 18, 1946.

### PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

On January 18, 1946, Special Agents E. HYATT MOSSBURG and WILLIAM D. TEMPLE observed subject PERAZICH, his wife and two small sons arrive at Union Station at 5:55 P.M., on Pennsylvania Train No. 54, "The Gothem, Ltd.". After





SPURCEON BELL - This man is listed as a member of the Capital City Forum in 1941, at which time his address was 2013 Klingle Road, N. W., telephone ADams 7316, Washington, D. C.

The Washington Police Department, in 1940, reported that an automobile registered in the name of SPURGEON BELL, Glen Echo Heights, Maryland, discharged passengers in front of Turner's Arena for participation in an anti-conscription meeting being held there by the American Peace Mobilization. At that time, SPURGEON RELL was listed as being a Molder in the Navy Yard.

RICHARD V. GILBERT - One RICHARD VINCENT GILBERT, Director of Defense Economics at the Office of Price Administration, was the subject of a Hatch Act investigation in 1942. He had been listed by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. His sister and brother-in-law, ANNA and NATHAN VUSEM, were signers of a Communist Party petition in Pennsylvania. GILBERT was formerly Professor at Harvard University, where an informant described him as having



extremely leftist views, but did not believe he was ever officially affiliated with the Communist Party. In a sworn statement, GILBERT denied membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, the American Peace Mobilization and the Communist Party.

confidential Informant has reported the following information:

On January 2, 1946, PERLO told his wife that his telephone extension at the Treasury Department is 2093, although he did not know how long he would be in that office.

On January 3, 1946, one ERNA (believed to be Mrs. ERNA ROSENBERG wife of a subject in this case) was a visitor at the PERIO home.

On January 4, 1946, Mrs. PERLO told her husband he had received his Chess card, reading "Fry Rook to Queen Bishop one and Stephen Jacob's Bishop takes Knight". The files of this office contain no information concerning STEPHEN JACOB. 7

Also, on January 4, 1946, Mrs. PERIO invited one ALICE and FRED, who have not been identified, to their home that evening.

On January 5, 1946, Mrs. PERIO advised that her husband was going to see STAN and MILDRED the next day. STAN and MILDRED are undoubtedly STANLEY and MILDRED GRAZE, who have been described in previous reports. GRAZE is employed by OSS.

On January 7, 1946, PERIO advised that his extension at the Treasury Department is now 2552. Mrs. FERIO told him he had received a card from CHARLES A. BROWN relative to chess. Information in this office is insufficient to identify this CHARLES A BROWN.

On January 9, 1946, one HANK (HENRY) FRIGAN of FAGAN, phonetic, contacted PERIO, stating he had been in the Navy for a couple of years and was running around trying to be discharged, that he had recently been in Japan, and that he was now in Washington for a couple of days, although he might be here for some time. PERIO invited him to dinner the next evening. He instructed FAGAN to come to Room 3205 in the Treasury Department, and that he would take

him home to dinner. FAGAN stated he was living at the home of a Mrs. O'BRIEN

On January 10, 1946, a Mrs. SHAPIRO contacted Mrs. PERLO and said it would be all right to transfer CATHY, PERLO'S daughter by his first wife, to Mrs. SHAPIRO'S troop in No. 38.

On January 11, 1946, Mrs. PERLO told her mother that her husband was going to be Tertiary (phonetic) representative on some very big committees, and that he might have to work a lot of time on them. She also said PERLO recently won a chess tournament.

On the same day, Mrs. PERLO'S father, N. C. MENAKER, said he was looking forward to seeing "AL" that day. Later in the same day, Mrs. PERLO said that her cousin, "AL" was coming to visit her mother. On the same day, Mrs. SHAPIRO gave her telephone number as ORdway 5083. This number is listed to SAMUEN SHAPIRO, 4317 Brandywine Street, N. W., which is but two blocks away from the PERLO home.

On January 14, 1946, HENRY FAGAN told Mrs. PERIO that he was leaving on Wednesday, and on the following day, Mrs. PERIO told her mother that "this guy", apparently FAGAN, was coming to see the PERIOS that evening.

Also, on this date, MILDRED GRAZE attempted to contact Mrs. PERLO, stating she could be reached at Red Cross Extension 936. Later in the day, Mrs. PERLO told her mother that the GRAZES wanted them to go to a movie with them over the weekend.

A check of the indices of this office reflects no information concerning a HENRY or HANK FAGAN or FRIGAN, as mentioned above.

Spot surveillances in the vicinity of the PERLO residence on January 8 and 10, 1946, were negative in results.

New York Field Division teletype dated December 29, 1945, contained information reflecting that PERLO'S father, SAM PERLO, was born October 16, 1882, at Lonza, Russia, that he is registered with Local Board No. 253, Long Island, New York, where he is described as being 5' 11", 190 pounds, brown eyes, gray hair and light complexioned. SAM PERLO and his wife have resided



at 72-15 - 37th Avenue, Jackson Heights, since November 2, 1937, where they are well regarded. He retains law offices at 81-11 Roosevelt Avenue, Long Island. Credit and criminal checks on both SAM PERLO and his wife were negative.

New York Field Division teletype dated January 2, 1946, contained information on STANLEY and MILDRED GRAZE reflecting that they formerly resided at 1304 Franklin Avenue, Bronx, New York; with JOSEFH and ESTHER ESBIN, both Russian born naturalized citizens, believed to be the parents of MILDRED GRAZE. STANLEY GRAZE graduated from City College in New York in 1939 as a member of the Honor Society. He was co-captain of the wrestling team, and an officer in the dramatic society. A photograph of GRAZE is available in the College Yearbook.

It has previously been reported that on December 4, 1945, one JANE, telephone EMerson 6773, attempted to contact the PERLOS. It has been ascertained that this number is listed to RALPH E. FISHER, 4524 Burlington Place, N. W. This residence is located almost immediately in back of the PERLO residence. A check of the indices of the Washington Field Division reflects no information on the FISHERS.

A check of the credit bureaus-in Washington reflected a report dated in 1934 on RALHE E. and HELEN TISHER, who then resided at 53 Rhode Island Avenue, N. W. Mr. FISHER, aged fifty-two at that time, was described as being employed by JUDD and DETWEILER, Printers and Engravers in Washington. He purchased his present home in 1938. One daughter, name not given, was stated as residing with him at that address.

DON said they accept her invitation to the New Year's Eve party. JOAN said TALEY, HELEN SCOTT, SHIRLEY ELLINGBAUGH (phonetic) and some others from the office will be there. (It appears ALEY is a woman working in BERNARD's office.) JOAN mentioned she was going to tell DON a secret—"The Chile deal is off since the Ambassador wants to pick his own man, some man that is now in the Pacific." JOAN said BERNIE isn't offered anything in the new set-up but they are trying to fix him up in Europe and she doesn't care too much to go to Europe.

W. (The current telephone directory reflects the Croydon Apartments are located at 1815 17th Street, N. W.)

On the same date at 5 p.m., JOAN REDMONT attempted to contact Mrs. FRIEDMAN in New York City at telephone Navarre 8-1826, with negative results.

On December 30, 1945, at 3:12 p.m., one LICE or ALEX (female, phonetic) contacted JOAN REIMONT and said the party is being held at 2700 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., owned by a bachelor named WALTEN MURROW. The apartment number thange. JOAN said she will tell her brother and MILLIE ALICE said she could be reached at her home phone number, Michigan 2480.

The confidential source advised JOAN REDMONT's sister-in-law's first name is PURCELLE, and that she resides in New York City.

and said FLLIOT (phonetic) had just arrived and they were going to lunch. ELLIOT then contacted JOAN and said he had taken the Pennsylvania Railroad from New York at 8:30 a.m. JOAN asked if PURCELLE had arrived in New York all right, and she was advised she had. JOAN said she would see ELLIOT for REDMONT has mentioned she was expecting her brother-in-law and therefore it is bossible ELLIOT is BERNARD REDMONT's brother.

On January 5, 1946, at 4:10/p.m., ARTHUR CCMPTON (phonetic) contacted with him because of and BC meeting. (This has subsequently been determined to be VC meeting.) JOAN advised her brother was out of town since he got married on the previous day but would be back in town at the end of the week. CCMPTON on the list that he CCMPTON inherited from HOFFMAN. JOAN then gave COMPTON the Executive 3752, address 916 19th Street, N. W. COMPTON said they have some month with some pretty good people who are coming down at the end of the month.

JOAN said she is holding some ABC mail for her brother now and there said he is to be a student for the next two years and will be around for that long.

On January 8, 1946, at 4:40 p.m., BERNARD REDMONT contacted his wife and said LARRY LEHBROS, the proposed manager of DAVID LAWRENCE's new business, was having trouble getting his papers through the Army. He said CHARLIE KLINE of World Report had talked to DAVID LAWRENCE who had mentioned BERNIE and seemed favorably impressed with BERNIE's record, but he understood BERNIE was insisting on \$7,000 and a living allowance and thought that was too much for the "B. A. office." BERNIE said this wasn't true; because of his interest in the position, he would be willing to take a lower wage. 7/ 1

The informant advised on January 10, 1946, at 6 p.m., BERNARD RED-MONT contacted his wife and told her he had gotten the job. He said he starts on February 4, 1946, and leaves about a month later. He said he can take his wife with him and for the first three months he will be doing a lot of traveling and it may be better that she come down later. He said he will be the only man in South America; that they already have a man for Central America named BILL COURDAY (phonetic). He said they want to base him in Buenos Aires but they want him to go over for a few stories to Montevideo, Rio, and Santiago. He said his salary will be \$6500 per year and in six months they will reopen it for \$7,000. He said the David Lawrence organization gives all employees a free \$10,000 life insurance policy.

On January 11, 1946, JOAN REDWONT contacted one DICKIE, and she told him about BERNIE REDWONT's job which he is going to take with World Report. She said he will be a correspondent in South America for Buenos Aires, Santiago, Rio, and Uruguay. She said he will travel around for about three months and will decide where he will set up an office depending upon what happens in Argentina, and then she and her son DENNY will go down there. She said her husband will leave the government at the end of January: that he will be in the office for another month and then will leave permanently.

On January 11, 1946, DON ROTHENBERG contacted JOAN REDMONT, and they discussed the fact that BERNIE had gotten something from the AVC. She also mentioned what a lucky break it was for BERNIE getting this thing (referring probably to his new job in South America) and that there were only two of them in South America; the other one was in Central America and covered the northern part. DON mentioned he is attending school at George Washington University.

At 2:50 p.m. on January 11, 1946, BERNARD REDFONT contacted his wife and told her he had tendered his resignation in the office on that date.

At 9:35 p.m. on January 11, 1946, HELEN SCOTT contacted JOAN REDIONT and mentioned she HELEN was being investigated by the State Department. She said all her friends have been asking her why she is being investigated again, and HELEN said she is sure it is because of her job with the State Department.

On January 11, 1946, at 12:25 p.m., JOAN REDMONT contacted her hus band and BERNIE advised JOAN he gets a lump sum payment about two weeks after he leaves but the retirement fund may take three to nine months. He said he will get approximately \$628.48. BERNIE said he does not know when he will leave the government job but may take a week off after the following week-end.

Reference is made to the information furnished by the above informant on January 5, 1946, wherein mention was made of the ABC meeting to be held on the evening of January 9, 1946. It was subsequently determined from the informant and also from the mail cover in effect on REDMONT that this meeting was in connection with the AVC or American Veterans Committee rather than the Atomic Bomb Comittee which name was suggested by the initials ABC. On January 9, 1946, Assistant SAC CARL E, HENNRICH called this discrepancy to the attention of Assistant Director D. M. LaDD of the Bureau.

Reference is made to information furnished by the informant on December 19, 1945, as reflected in the reference report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JONES dated January 11, 1946, wherein a conversation was reported between JOAN REDMONT and a woman named DICKIE. These individuals discussed a New Year's

On the basis of information furnished, no record could be located of the STRAUSSERS in the indices of the Washington Field Office or in the city or telephone directory which could be identified with the STRAUSSERS mentioned by JOAN REDMONT.

Reference is made to information furnished by confidential informant of December 30, 1945, to the effect that a party was to be held at the apartment of WALTER MURROW at 2700 Connecticut avenue, N. W., telephone North 610

The current Washington telephone directory lists a LALTEN ORROW at 1124 Connecticut Avenue, N. M., telephone Executive 1338. The indices of the Washington Field Office reflect that in a report on the Washington Bookshop Association; Internal Security - C, dated April 18, 1944, there is set forth the membership list of the organization as of February 18, 1944, which list included WALTER MORROW, 1627 F Street, N. W., telephone Republic 3664. It is not known whether these individuals are identical with the one in question.



It was reported in an earlier report that on December 13, 1945, confidential Informant advised this office that JOE, an acquaintance of the subject, was known to have a Catholic law partner named JOE FREEHILL. JOE is believed to be JOSEPH A FANELLI, a member of the law firm of SCHOENE, FREEHILL, KRAMER and FANELLI, 1744 K Street, N. W., also referred to in an earlier report. The indices of the Washington Field Division reflect that one JOSEPH H. FREEHILL, 412 South Wakefield Street, Arlington, Virginia, is listed as a member of the National Lawyers Guild. It is not known if he is identical with the JOE FREEHILL mentioned above.

The files of the Washington Field Office also reflect that in a Departmental Applicant Investigation of one SAMUEL KARP reference is made to one JOSEPH H. FREEHILL, one of KARP'S references. FREEHILL at the time of the investigation had a private law practice at 1755 N Street, NW, Washington, D. J. It is known that the law firm mentioned above formerly had its offices at 1755 N Street, NW, and that they are now at 1744 K Street, NW

On December 28, 1945, Jonfidential Informant stated that GEORGE SILVERMAN told his wife that JERRY called him from New York and wanted him to go to New York at that time. According to the informant the subject's wife asked him why JERRY wanted him to come to New York and SILVERMAN replied, "Well, this outfit of LARK's (ph), this old combination, they wanted him to put in a half million dollars "The subject's wife according to the informant, asked how "they" happened to approve him, to which the subject replied, "I guess Jerry knows Fox I do not know how they happed to approach him Don't ask me questions." It is thought that the individual referred to as "JERRY" is JERRY OHRBAJK, who has been mentioned in earlier reports, and who is known to be a contact of SILVERMAN's

According to the subject later that same day advised his wife that he would have to go to New York the morning of December 29, 1945

On December 29, 1945, stated that an unidentified boy contacted DICK SILVERMAN, who apparently was a Harvard student home for the Christmas Holidays. In the conversation subject's son stated that he recently had lunch at the Harvard Club where there were a bunch of "old fogies" who wanted him to make a short speech when he was introduced.

According to the informant the subject's son did not make a speech at that time Later in the conversation the subject's son told the caller that he was going to become a complete social anarchist as a result of his trip to the Harvard Club.

The same informant advised that on December 29, 1945, CHRISTOFFER, the husband of Miss O'Dell, contacted the SILVERMAN residence but was told that the subject was out of town. It is noted that, as set out in ref. nced report, FLORENCE O'DELL resides at 2100 Connecticut Avenue, NW, Apartment 601. By observation it was ascertained that the name appearing on the door of the Apartment 601 is that of Mrs. CHRISTOFFER JAMES WAGNER

At Local Board No. 8 Special Agent ANKER B. HARBO reviewed the file on CHRISTOPHER JAMES WAGNER, Order No. 11238, and ascertained that he had registered on February 16, 1942, at which time he resided at Apartment 601, 2100 Connecticut Avenue, Nw. WAGNER listed his date of birth as February 7, 1901, in Brooklyn, New York, and named Mrs. C. J. WAGNER, 2100 Connecticut Avenue, Nw, as the person who would always know his address. He indicated that he was employed by the Washington Refrigeration Company, 1733 14th Street, Nw. He was described as white, 5' 11", 180 pounds, having blue eyes, blond hair and a light complexion.

The questionnaire appearing in the file was undated but apparently was completed in August, 1942, when WAGNER was a Captain in the AUS--Ordnance Department--Field Service. He entered on duty May 8, 1942 The questionnaire indicated that WAGNER has had only one and one half years high school work and no college work. He was in the New York National Guard from about 1918 to 1921. There was also contained in the file a letter dated August 6, 1942, from the War Department stating that WAGNER was then serving in the Ordnance Department and that his Army Serial Number was 0904300. Another letter was also found in the file dated October 10, 1944, addressed to local Board 8 by WAGNER in which WAGNER advised that he was assigned to inactive duty as of October 6, 1944. He gave his residence address at that time as 2100 Jonnecticut Avenue, NW.

WAGNER's occupational questionnaire was completed sometime in April, 1942. This form indicated that his Social Security Number was and that he was employed by the Washington Refrigeration Company as a salesman and that he had been in that type of work for the past eighteen years.

The files of the Washington Field Division in the case entitled "IRVING FRANK HERMAN, was, MISJELLANEOUS INFORMATION CONCERNING" reflects that FRANK BY JOHNOLLY of the War Production Board was presently forming a company to deal in Surplus Johnolly chained to have offices in New York and Washington, D. C. JONNOLLY claimed to have worked for the

conversation JOE told SILVERMAN that he hoped he could be employed as an assistant to WARING "to handle China." JOE indicated that WARING would be "in charge of the whole Far East." In this conversation according to informant an individual named MELASKI (ph) was also mentioned as an individual employed at the Export Import Bank. JOE and the subject in this conversation spoke of the method by which JOE could possibly secure a position at the Export Import Bank.

On January 8, 1946 the same informant advised that at 6:01 P. M. SILVERMAN contacted his wife stating that he would be at the Statler Hotel with MAT MURRAY and that he had been busy all day.

Later the same day, according to the informant, a Mry BIBEROW contacted Mrs. SILVERMAN and gave her the following address for her to give

BITEROW, according to the informant, told Mrs SILVERMAN that the subject wanted to get this address at home instead of at his, SILVERMAN'S office.

On January 9, 1946, according to the informant, SILVERMAN asked his wife if General MEYERS had wanted to see JERRY OHRBACK, to which touch with OHRBACK and that General MEYERS had wanted to know how to get in the Statler Hotel.

On January 10, 1946, SUE (ph) invited the SILVERMANS to dinner on January 11th. In the conversation SUE mentioned that CLEM had been quite busy and that he was teaching that evening of January 10, 1946. It is thought that SUE and CLEM are identical with Mr. and Mrs. CLEMENT WINSTON, 1420 Tuckerman Street, N. W., who were known to have contacted the SILVERMANS on November 22, 1945, as set out in earlier reports

on January 11, 1946

subject at which time they discussed business matters that both were interested in. At the close of the conversation the subject indicated that the next time he is at the Treasury Building he will see JOE.

On January 12, 1946, the same informant advised that OSJAR ALTMAN contacted the subject and stated that MINARD (ph) was in the office and that he was interested in discussing matters that SILVERMAN was interested in.

the Treasury Department Both CONNOLLY and Mrs. WAGNER expected appointments by O'DWYER as did GEORGE SILVERMAN — All are now reported to be
antagonistic toward O'DWYER

The files in this case further reflect that FLORENCE WAGNER is friendly with IRVING SHERMAN, the subject of that case, and with the above mentioned FRANK CONNOLLY, who is one of the contacts of SHERMAN. It is reported that on November 21, 1945, she told FRANK CONNOLLY that one of the men in her Department hated her because she was not a Communist. On December 29, 1945, CHRISTOPHER WAGNER advised FRANK CONNOLLY that he was going to South Africa soon to sell a line of clothing. Ho wanted CONNOLLY to meet a friend of his from South Africa who could help CONNOLLY get rid of surplus clothing in that area. Various references in the file on SHERMAN make it clear that the WAGNERS and the GEORGE SILVERMANS mentioned as contacts of CONNOLLY are identical with the above mentioned individuals who are described as contacts of the subject of instant investigation.

On December 30, 1945, advised that SILVERMAN contacted his wife from New York City at which time he told her that he had moved from the Aberdeen Botel to the Savoy-Plaza. The subject mentioned that JERRY (possibly JERRY OHRBACK) gave him \$200 00 for expenses but that he found h mself with insufficient cash. Mrs. SILVERMAN suggested that he get money from (O.K (ph) (possibly LACHLIN JURRIE), but SILVERMAN is reported to have said that he wanted nothing from LOCK. SILVERMAN stated that he was warning JERRY against LOCK and that he was sutting lock "out of this half a million dollars." SILVERMAN told his wife that he would be home on New Year's Eve and no later than New Year's day. Later in the conversation SILVERMAN indicated that he and JERRY and LOCK were up at MATTY FOX'S tolding. SILVERMAN stated that LOCK was to put in all the money and would get a cut of only 10%, while the others contributed the plans and would get 90%. He further stated that LOCK was to put up half a million dollars and that FOX was to put up \$100,000, but intended to take that sum out again right away. Mrs. SILVERMAN remarked that the return was small for so big an investment.

wife saying that he was coming home. He asked who had called for him and she indicated that EDWARD FITZGERALD and IRVING KAPLAN had tried to get in touch with him.

On January 2, 1946, the same informant advised that the subject contacted FLORENCE WAGNER and told her that he did not see CHRIS that day but spoke to him and was supposed to join him and FRANK at the Mayflower but didn't do so. SILVERNAN asked her to come to his home and she indicated that she would contact him after CHRIS came in and would indicate then whether or not she would be able to do so. She indicated that CHRIS was in town for only a couple of days. FLORENCE WAGNER subsequently contacted the subject, according to the informant, and told him that she still didn't know whether she could come to his house and stated that CHRIS was at that time with the man from South Africa, who was in the Olympics. SILVERMAN asked WAGNER whether or not CHRIS was discussing the CHRYSLER proposition with that man

On January 3, 1946, according to the informant JOE contacted the subject and stated that he wanted to see the subject on January 4th regarding some financial venture.

The same informant advised on the same day that DOROTHY KAPLAN contacted subject at which time she invited the SILVERMANS to dinner at OLMSTED'S Restaurant on Saturday, January 5, 1946. The invitation was accepted

On January 7, 1946, advised that FIGRENCE WAGNER contacted Mrs SILVERMAN and left word for the subject to get in touch with her as we seen as he could. FIGRENCE WAGNER stated that SILVERMAN had given CHRIS WAGNER some ideas that "have been popping like the devil up in New York and I wanted to report to him." In her conversation Mrs. WAGNER told Mrs. SILVERMAN that they had a good time the other night but were afraid that they stayed too long.

On January 8, 1946, JOE contacted the subject regarding some financial ventures that both were interested in. During the conversation JOE stated that he sandaffrey (ph) at the EXPORT IMPORT BANK, an assistant to TAYLOR. JOE stated that MAFFREY seemed to be interested and remarked that FRANK VARING (ph) was now working at the EXPORT IMPORT BANK also JOE indicated that he would like to work for WARING, who told JOE to supply him with information about himself. JOE remarked to the subject that if he could be employed by a Government Agency that there were many things that he could "dig up" that could not be handled on the "outside." According to the informant JOE also told SILVERMAN that he asked MAFFREY if the later knew FRANK COE for whom JOE worked at one time. Later in the





In the conversation the name GEORGE BARLOWE (ph) was mentioned SILVERMAN indicated that he would see MINARD in a little while.

Later the same day, according to the informant, SILVERMAN contacted his wife stating that one ARTHUR (ph) had been in to see him.

On January 13, 1945, informant advised an unidentified man contacted SILVERMAN at which time the unidentified man asked the subject if he had the card and phone number of the person who advertised 20,000 rain coats for sale. SILVERMAN stated this persons phone number was REctor 2-4553 and that the advertisement was listed in one of the recent issues of the New York Times

On the same day, according to the Informant, MAT MURRAY contacted SILVERMAN and asked if CHRIS WAGNER had come to town. SILVERMAN indicated WAGNER had come to town, whereupon MAT told SILVERMAN that he had ordered 60,000 knives on FRANK MURRAY CORPORATION and that he wanted to know if this would go "on the South African setup." SILVERMAN stated he did not know but would ask WAGNER about it the following day. In the conversation other items such as matches, silk, nylons and batteries were also mentioned, MAT stating, according to the informant that the matches were perfect export tems. SILVERMAN asked MUPRAY if the latter saw LOUIS DYKINS ( ph), who indicated that he had, and who stated that DYKINS could not use cold weather items. Laterain the conversation MURRAY indicated that he had spoken to Colonel FRANK about the Ecuador matter. In this connection MURRAY stated that the knives cost \$10.00 per dozen and "that they could make a profit of \$23,000.00 on 50,000 knives. SILVERMAN indicated that he had the money to buy the knives if they could get a buyer. According to the informant, SILVERMAN and MURRAY wanted to try to sell the knives in South America.

According to the same informant SILVERMAN contacted FLORENCE WAGNER the same day indicating that he had had a conversation with the above mentioned MAT MURRAY. SILVERMAN stated that perhaps JERRY (OHRBACK) would put up the money SILVERMAN and WAGNER discussed getting a buyer for the knives and other items and mentioned that possible the French or the Filipinos would be interested in buying such items. According to the Informant CHRIS WAGNER also joined in the conversation about these matters In the conversation FLORENCE WAGNER mentioned that some Norwegian Relief Organization might be interested in purchasing Jackets.

On January 14, 1946, Informant advised that one Mrs SIMON attempted to contact Mrs. SILVERMAN, who was not at home at the time

Later the same day subject contacted his wife and stated that the only time he could see JOE GOULD (ph) would be at home between 7:00 and 8:50 P. M. In the conversation subject indicated that CHRIS WAGNER would likely join the group at that time

### PHYSICAL SURVEILLANCE

December 28, 1945: Surveillance was begun on SILVERMAN at 12:30 P. M.

At 1:42 P. M. the subject was observed walking east on P Street, NW, near where P Street intersects the east side of Dupont Circle. Subject walked down P Street to 1736 P Street, NW, which building he entered at 1:45 P. M. At 1:58 P. M. the subject left the residence at that address and walked to the Connecticut Avenue Post Office station, 1220 Connecticut Avenue, NW. He was observed to have an envelope in his hand. He entered the Post Office Station at 2:03 P. M. and is presumed to have returned to his office. Nothing else of significance was noted during the surveillance which was discontinued at 7:00 P. M.

It was subsequently ascertained by observation of the mail boxes at 1736 P Street, NW, that SAMUEL F BEDERMAN, LYNN B WHEATER, RICHARD S. DUTTON and G. E. GOODKIND reside in various apartments at that address. The indices of the Washington Field Division have been checked with negative results on each of those individuals.

December 29, 1945: Surveillance was begun at 6:35 A. M. by Special Agents WILLIAM D. TEMPLE and ANKER B. HARBO.

At 9:40 A. M. the subject left his apartment carrying a brown overnight bag. He walked to 14th and Belmont Streets, NW, and from there over to the intersection of 14th and Florida Avenue, NW, where he caught a cab which proceeded to Union Station. The subject arrived at Union Station at 10:03 A. M and was observed to proceed to the information booth where it was subsequently learned he inquired as to the time of the next train for New York. The subject then proceeded to the phone booth and placed a call

At 10:55 A. M. the subject left Washington, D. C on Pennsylvania Train Number Advance 130 He was accompanied by Special Agent TEMPLE.

At 3:45 P. M. SILVERMAN arrived in New York City at the Pennsylvania Station at which point and time the surveillance was taken over by Agents of the New York Field Division.

# January 3, 1946:

As set out elsewhere in this report information was received from Comfidential Informant that on January 3, 1946, subject ULIMAN would have lunch with NEWELL BLAIR (ph). Surveillance was mainta ned on subject builded by Special Agents J. WAYNE PARRISH and M. A. TAYLOR and it was observed that an individual subsequently identified as subject SILVERMAN contacted ULIMAN during the lunch hour on that date.

Jamuary 4, 1946: Surveillance on SILVERMAN was begun at 12:10 P. M.

proceeded on foot to the flower stand at Connecticut and R Streets, N. W. He purchased a bunch of yellow flowers and walked on to the apartment building at 2000 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., which he entered at 12:50 P. M It was subsequently ascertained through anonymous inquiry of the elevator operator that an individual answering the subject's description had earlier in the day entered the apartment building carrying a bunch of yellow flower and had gone to Apartment 708. It is noted that as set out in earlier reports SILVERMAN has been known to enter Apartment 708 before, which of value was ascertained to this date.

January 7, 1946: Surveillance was begun at 11:30 A M. at the French

At 12:27 P. M. SILVERMAN and an unknown man left the French Supply Council and entered a 1942 Theyrolet Sedan bearing Delaware tags 5532. The unknown man drove the car. He is described as about 45, 5' 6", 140 pounds, brown graying hair, receding, light complexion, wears glasses believed to have a metal frame, wearing a red and blue tie, gray gaberdine suit, brown shoes, gray-snap brim hat, gray top coat with a white scarf with black polka-dots. SILVERMAN and this man drove to the 15th Street entrance of the Treasury Building where at 12:34 P. M. SILVERMAN left the unknown man and entered the 15th Street entrance of the Treasury Building. The unknown man drove off and proceeded to the Dodge Hotel, 20 E Street, N. W., which he entered at 12:45 P. M.

At 12:50 P. M. this man was met by a second unknown man and an unknown mount. There were no formal introductions and it appeared that the three had previously known each other. The second unknown man and the unknown woman checked their coats and hats, as the first unknown man had already done, and all three then entered the dining room. The second unknown man is described as about 50, 6'2", 160 pounds, medium dark complexion, mixed gray hair, receding in front with a nearly bald spot in the crown, wears glasses off and on, wearing a dark gray suit with chalk stripes, brown spats, black shoes, dark tie, dark gray hat and a dark gray topcoat

eyes, brown hair, light complexion, wearing a dark suit over a blue sweater, black hat, black shoes and a black coat. She also wore a one umbrella.



their hats and coats and left the Dodge Hotel and walked up E Street toward union station. When at the point where E Street cuts the semi-circle in front of mion station the group stopped and talked for a few minutes. The first unknown man then said goodby to the others and went to his car, which was parked nearby. The second unknown man and the woman proceeded on to union station, which they entered at 2:35 P. M. It was observed that no tickets were purchased by either one. They proceeded to the concourse where leather suitcase and a brown leather briefcase. The second unknown man boarded Pennsylvania Train NO. 170 for New York. He was accompanied by and arrived in New York at 6:55 P. M., at which time the surveillance was Division.

Surveillance was conducted on SILVERMAN at the French Supply Council during the noon hour period with negative results.

# January 9, 1946: Surveillance was begun at 11:45 A. M.

At 12:33 P. M. SILVERMAN left the French Supply Council with an unknown man described as 30, 6' 2", 180 pounds, large build, wearing a gray suit, black or tark blue topcoat, brown shoes and a brown hat, This man did not wear glasses and he was carrying a suit box at the time. SILVERMAN and this man walked through Dupont Circle, out Massachusetts Avenue to

At 12:45 P. M. the unknown man entered the building at 2340 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W. SILVERMAN loitered outside the building for a few minutes, apparently waiting for the unknown man to come outside again.

At 12:56 P. M. SILVERMAN entered the building also. He left the building at 1:05 P. M. and immediately tried to catch a cab. At 1:08 P. M. SILVERMAN caught a cab and proceeded to the Cafe Parisienne, 1120 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., which he entered at 1:12 P. M.

At 2:22 P. M. SILVERMAN and an unknown man described as 45, 5: 8", green hat and a brown topcoat left the Cafe Parisienne and walked toward Dupont Circle When about 60 feet from the entrance to the Dupont Circle Building, which is occupied by UNRRA, the two were overtaken and passed by a second unidentified man who touched the arm of SILVERMAN's companion and greeted him in passing. This second unidentified man was seen in a few

seconds to enter the Dupont Circle Building. SILVERMAN and his companion walked on past the French Supply Council to 1732 Massachusetts Avenue, Massachuse

The surveillance was continued at the French Supply Council until 3:40 P. M. up to which time neither SILVERMAN nor his companion were seen again. It is believed that the person who was seen to enter the French Supply Council with SILVERMAN was possibly SOL LESCHINSKY, who is known to be employed by UNRRA at the Dupont Jircle Building, and who bears some resemblance to the person described above.

A spot check was conducted later in the day in the vicinity of 2340 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W. in an effort to identify the first person seen with the subject. This met with negative results.

January 10, 1946: Surveillance was begun at 10:45 A. M. at the French Supply Council.

At 12:24 P. M. SILVERMAN left the French Supply Jouncil with an unidentified man described as 25, 5' 6", 130 pounds, smooth glossy black hair, medium complexion; wearing a gray suit, black shoes, blue green topcoat, no hat. These two stood in front of the Supply Jouncil and talked for two or three minutes and then parted. The unidentified man walked down 18th Street NW, across Connecticut Avenue and was believed to have entered the LaSalle DuBois Restaurant at 1800 M Street, NW. This individual has subsequently been observed to leave the French Supply Council and is believed to be an employee there.

At 1:15 P. M. a salesman and an unidentified man described as 50, 6', 180 pounds, wears horn rimmed glasses occasionally, wearing blue suit, dark gray hat and topcoat and black shoes, were observed walking on Connecticut Avenue by the Longfellow Building. They proceeded to Fan & Bill's Restaurant. Just before they reached the restaurant a second unidentified man greeted SILVERMAN, shook his hand and spoke with him for a few seconds This man is described as 45, 5' 8", 170, heavy build, slightly ruddy complexion wearing brown suit, brown shoes, brown hat and a light tan camel's heir

After SILVERMAN and his unidentified companion were beeved to enter FAN & BILL'S Restaurant, the second unidentified man who greeted SILVERMAN was observed to enter the building at 1748 M Street, NW, which is occupied by FARNSWORTH-REED, LTD., tailors, and by others.

At 2:12 P. M. SILVERMAN and his companion left FAN & BILL's Restaurant and were subsequently observed to proceed in a 1942 Ford Sedan, bearing

D. C. Tags 86-810, toward Dupont Jircle. At 2:20 P. M. this car was observed parked in the driveway of the French Supply Council and it was subsequently ascertained that D. C. Tags 88-810 were issued to the French Supply Council.

It is believed that the individual who had lunch with SILVERMAN at FAN & BILL'S restaurant is another employee of the French Supply Council.

January 11, 1946: Surveillance was maintained on SILVERMAN at the French Supply Council during the noon hour with negative results.

January 14, 1946: Surveillance was begin at 6:50 P. M.

At 7:02 P. M. an individual answering the description of CHRISTOPHER JAMES WAGNER mentioned above, was observed to enter the SILVERMAN apartment. Shortly before this individual entered the building an unidentified man was also observed to have entered the WILVERMAN apartment

At 8:25 P. M. the unknown person who first entered the SILVERMAN apartment, believed to be JOE GOID, departed from the SILVERMAN apartment and proceeded about half a block north on 15th Street where he entered a car bearing Delaware Tags 5532 This car was followed to the 3600 block of 34th Street, NW, where the driver of the car was observed to get out. This individual entered either 3605 34th Street, NW, or 3607 34th Street, NW, at 8:35 P. M. It is noted, as set out above, that Delaware Tags 5532 are left to J. F. GOID, 623 Academy Street, Newark, Delaware. GOID is described as about 15, 5'8", medium build, gray hair, wearing a gray snap brim hat, gray overcoat and white scarf with dark figures. December 27, 1945 - at 11:03 A,N. GREGORY SILVER LASTER contacted his wife, HELEN SILVERYASTER. HELEN advised that she thought she would have lunch with a friend but that it was cancelled. GREG then inquired who the person was and Mrs. SILVER ASTER indicated, "You know, a friend." The physical surveillance log for December 15, 1945, on WILLII L.
ULIMANN reflected that ULIMANN attended a party during the evening of December 15, 1945, at 2704 36th Place, Northwest, the home of GEORGE BRONZ. The report of Special agent T. W. DAWSEY, Washington, D. C., dated May 15, 1941, entitled, "NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD - INTERNAL SECURITY - C," reflects the following information relative to GEORGE BRONZ:

On November 21, 1939, according to a highly confidential source, GEORGE BRONZ was elected to the Executive Cormittee of the D. C. Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild for 1939-40. He was described as being an attorney for the Consumers Council, Bituminous Coal Division. He was formerly on the legal staff of the NRL, Resettlement administration and the Department of agriculture. At that time he was Managing Editor of the National Lawyers Guild Quarterly. This report further reflected that BRONZ resigned from the organization on June 8, 1940.

The report of Special ngent T. W. Dausey, Washington, D. C., dated May 26, 1941, entitled, "CAPITAL CITY FORUM - INTERNAL SECURITY - C," reflects that a highly confidential source revealed that GEORGE BRONZ, of 3925 Davis Place, N. W., attended the Mational Socialist Workers Laidler Dinner on February 20, 1940, and that he was a member of the "Keep out of War Committee."

the 1943 City Directory lists GEORGE BRONZ, or 2704 36th Place, N. W., as being employed in the Bituminous Coal Division.

The surveillance memorandum on December 15, 1945, further reflects that at 9:55 P.M., the Agents observed several people leaving the BRONZ residence in a car bearing D. C. Tags 136-192, which is registered to TEUNIS F. COLLIER, 3001 Dent Place, N. W.



The following are the activities of WHEELER as reported by Confidential Informant from December 28, 1945 to January 15, 1946:

At 10:10 A.M., on December 28, 1945, Mrs. WHEELER was contacted by the B. and C. Ticket Office and she was advised that she has seats 21 and 22 from New York City. She said she may leave New York on January 2 instead of January 3, 1946. She said she would call at the B. and O. Ticket Office to discuss the situation.

At 3:00 P.M., on the same date, Mrs. WHEELER contacted the B. and O. Railroad, and advised that she has reservations in the name of her mother, Mrs. LUKES, returning from New York on the "Royal Blue" on January 8, 1946.

She was told that they would hold the reservations for her until the following day.

On December 31, 1945, at 11:00 A.M., a woman named PAULA, contacted MARY WHEELER, at which time Mrs. WHEELER said she intended to go to New York the following Thursday, but she may not go because her maid has broken a rib. Mrs. WHEELER mentioned that the LEES (probably Lieutenant Colonel DUNCAN C. LEE ami his wife) are going to New York to live again in a few months.



The following information concerning the activities of H.RRYCOLDEXTER HITE was reported from Confidential Informant and covers period from December 28, 1945 to January 15, 1946 inclusive:

On December 29, 1945 Dr. ABE OLFSON told subject's wife that he was going to the Treasury Department to meet HARRY ("HITE). Dr. ADE OLFSON is a brother-in-law of Mrs. HARRY FITE, subject's wife. The Tashington Field Division file entitled: "ashington Committee for Democratic Actions reveals that Dr. ABRAHAM OLFSON, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey in 1940 was listed as a member of the Tashington Committee for Democratic Action. By Bureau letter dated December 15, 1945 information was furnished concerning Dr. ABRAHAM DIFSON, was. A. STREET, A. TISOM STREET, ABRAM OLFSON. This information indicates that DIFSON was born April 28, 1894 at Odessa, Russia and that his occupation is that of a dentist, at Hedical Towers, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey.

His education consisted of graduation from high school and three years of college. He has had 28 years of dental experience. The Fay 18, 1934 issue of the Newark, New Jersey Star Ledger contained information to the effect that Dr. ABR.HLM TOLFSON had been divorced by his wife, Mrs. RUTH (TERRY) COLFSON, 33 Lashington Street, East Orange, New Jersey. She was described as an instructor at the Teachers College, Columbia University, New York City. The article stated that TOLFSON had been a resident of East Orange since 1921 and had an income of 21,000 a year from his dental practise.



In October, 1944 Dr. 1981.HAT TOLFSON was residing at 27 Tlizabeth ... verue, Newark, New Jersey.

Information furnished by various reports indicates that MOLESON has had frequent and close contact with numerous Communists in the New Jersey area. On January 21, 1944 a highly confidential source advised that Dr. ABRAHM TOLESON was as of January 21, 1944 a member of the Third Mard Branch of the Communist Party in that he had been active in Communist Party affairs for the past seven years and had utilized the name A. TISON STREET. Reports indicate that MOLESON has held Communist Party meetings at his office and that he has contributed financially to the party and to various Communist front organizations.
