
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

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

Reference is made to the Newark teletypes of February 28 and March 4, 1946 setting forth information to the effect that one Dr. ABRAHAM WOLFSON was expected to arrive in Chicago on March 2, 1946 via United Airlines and to depart Chicago at 8:05 P.M. on March 5, 1946 via United Airlines. The teletype indicated that WOLFSON's trip to Chicago was apparently for the purpose of getting married.

Agents of the Chicago Field Division ascertained on March 2, 1946 that United Airline flight #211 departing New York at 5 P.W. on that date had been cancelled and Dr. WOLFSON's ticket had also been cancelled. On March 5, 1946 Agents ascertained that Dr. WOLFSON did not depart on flight #8 of United Airlines, Chicago, at 8:05 P.M. inasmuch as the flight had been cancelled, and that he did not depart on a previous flight of Pennsylvania Central Airlines.

A check of the Cook County Bureau of Vital Statistics to ascertain whether or not Dr. WOLFSON had been issued a marriage license certificate during the past thirty days was made with negative results.

Stops have been placed with United, American, and Pennsylvania Central Airlines for any information relative to Dr. WOLFSON's future contact with those airlines.

New York, N. Y. November 8, 1945

I, Elizabeth Bentley, make the following free and voluntary statement to Special Agent Edward W. Buckley who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Also present are Special Agents Francis I. Plante and Donald Jardine. I have been advised that I do not have to make any statement and that whatever I have to say is made of my own free will, and I have been informed that whatever I say may be used against me in a court of law. No threats or promises of any kind have been made to me in order for me to give the following statement.

I was born in Milford, Connecticut January 1, 1908. My family is native born. They are descendants going back to the year 1620. We moved around a great deal due to the fact that grandfather was a minister. We lived in Milford, Ithaca, New York and finally ended up in Rochester, New York. From there I went to Vassar College and graduated in 1930 with an AB degree. The next two years I taught at Foxcroft School in Virginia. The next year I came to New York and studied at Columbia. I taught from 1930 to 1932, studied at Columbia from 1932 to 1933, and in 1933 and 1934 I went to Italy on an exchange fellowship. I studied at the University of Florence in Italy.

I came back in July 1934 and spent the next fall at Columbia University. The Communists I met were people on Columbia campus and they took me to the office of the American League Against War and Fascism. At the time I Joined there was only one unit at Columbia and the two people there were Professor James Mendenhall and Lee Fuhr. She was a nurse studying there then. She subsequently went to Spain and came back here.

Amongst other people were William Hinkley who is now living in Virginia I believe. Also Hal Levine and his wife, and Benjamin Fine who is now writing the educational page for the Times. There was only one job in the League manned by the Communists and I think they called it the executive secretary of the League. At the time I was there in 1935 in the spring I had joined the Columbia unit. This must have been April.

One day when I was there Pauline Rogers asked me if I would be interested in doing Italian Fascist work. She introduced me to ruita Stewart Poynts, She then lived on West 74th Street and the first time I met her she asked me to come to tea and that she wanted very much to learn Italian. So she asked me if I would come evenings to give her lessons. But she always seemed very uninterested in Italian. She asked me if I would like to go to Italy to do underground work. One evening when I was there, there was a man there. I took it for granted

he was an admirer of hers so I excused myself. The second time I made an appointment the same man was still there. They asked me to go out to dinner and I went but finally got thoroughly disgusted. That was about Nay 1936. In June 1936 the Columbia Placement Bureau called me and said they had a job in Amtorg camp and did I want to go. I went and was there for about two months in the summer. I never got to know them well. The camp was at Napanoch, New York. I don't think the camp knew anything about me. When I came back I was looking for a job. I had gone down to the League and met a red-haired lady and she looked at me and pulled me aside and asked me to take a job for a business man to teach him English. He was here on anti-Fascist work. She kept after me and I finally decided to go.

She introduced me to Joseph Eckhart. We is a lithuanian about 35 years old, about 5' 11", broad shoulders, no hair, false teeth, glasses, very natty dresser. I think he was sent here especially to try to buy airplanes and ship them to Spain. I think he want back because the embargo was clamped down. I don't know his business. We lived in the Hotel Marcy on 96th Street. I met him three times in Movember or December 1936. He was having his teeth fixed.

In December he said he had to make a trip abroad and disappeared. He left an address where he could find he. He came back in April 1937. He said then that he didn't think he had a job for he but that I should keep on seeing him just in case. I asked him where he had been and he said he had been to Russia. I asked him about the trials. Tou know, everybody was talking about the trials at that time. He got very peculiar at that point. He said some of his best friends were mixed up in it and he didn't want to talk about it. He talked eddly from then on. First he would say he was a big shot in Russia and then he would alternate by saying that if he went back to Moscow he would be shot.

When he came back he was living at the Barbizon Plaza and then he moved to the Windemere. He kept saying he was going back but he didn't go. Then finally he set sail in January 1938. He said he was going home, presumably Russia. At this time I was working in Consumers Union. During this period I was a party member.

I started out in Unit 1 in Columbia. In April I moved to Amsterdam Avenue and 150th Street and was there until July. Then I was shifted back to Columbia. It was Elizabeth Sherman. I also worked at Macy's in the fall of 1937 until December 1937.

Before Eckhart left he said to me, "In case I ever need you I am leaving behind me a friend of mine and he will keep in contact with you." This was a peculiar individual - a Pole born in Germany. He went under the name Marcel, although I noticed that his auto license says Michael : Endelman. He then went to Florida in the spring and he told me that if a friend called up the Friend was in Florida. He was told me that if a friend called up the Friend was in Florida. He was very peculiar too. He said he was going home. He told me all sorts of very peculiar too. He said this is a crazy organization; that it was like the Catholic Church. He departed in May, and he said that if I ever needed him that I could reach him at an address he gave me in Paris at a case. I don't remember the name.

He would send me postcards from Paris signed *M*. He seemed to be on the Spanish border line so I thought he was working with the Spanish Republicans, although lately I think they were military intelligence.

In June 1938 the Columbia Placement Bureau asked mage if I would like to work for an Italian library. I said yes and they said to make an appointment. The library hadn't been started them. Later on Mr. Clifford McAvoy came to see me. They were working with The Nation at that time. I wrote an article on this situation and the article appeared in the October 1935 issue of the Spectator. Because of that, although I had never had repercussions on it, the dean of Columbia called on Prezzolini and told him to keep his nose out of American called on Prezzolini was an agent. I took the job to see what I sould find out. I kept writing to Marcel.

I finally decided to go downtown to see Pauline Rogers. She sent me to see Mr. F. Brown who then resided on the ninth floor of Communist Party headquarters. He is now down at L'Unita del Popolo. His real name was an Italian name, he is about six feet tall, dark hair, dark eyes, bushy hair, no glasses, a big fellow. F. Brown was not his real name. I read that he was an alien and was mixed up in things he shouldn't be. He had a long beard. A year ago Browder told me he was one of the editors of L'Unita del Popolo. He may have gone back by now. He told me he had been a revolutionary in Italy and that he knew miniment in Italy. Someone told me he once had been a mayor of the town over there.

I went to see him and tried to tell him what I wanted and described Mr. Eckhart to him and he seemed to remember him. A week later he called me up to meet him. I met him at a cafeteria on University Place and 8th Street, and waiting in a car there was Mr. Golos. I was introduced to Golos through Brown around October 15, 1938. I told Golos what I was doing. He said it was very interesting and that the Italian underground would be very glad to keep an eye on these people.

I left the Italian Library than. The Italian Library was mixed up in all sorts of odd things.

In about Movember Hauncic discovered she I was. He called me into his office and showed me a clipping from the spectator and said wis that you?" I said yes. He thought mout it, and later on the atmosphere in the office was very frigid and than people came in they locked at me and said "There sits the Holshevist."

During that period I gave all the material to Golos, copies of letters, things I heard over the phone, etc. I didn't know where Golos was at this time. He called himself Timmy. After that I took another position and during that time he began to talk to me about the McClure syndicate. He said that I know how to work in a place like that. He asked me to go after some Nazis. He said it was my job. He persuaded me to try to get a job there, and said it would be very easy. The man who runs it is Richard Waldo who is a German agent in this country and who has a nasty disposition; that he could get me a job.

So after Labor Day 1939 I went and met Waldo and he hired me. From March 1939 to Labor Day 1939 I had several jobs. Some were translating jobs, French and Italian. I didn't report to Golos. All I did for him in that period was typing work. I was at McClure until February 1940. I used to give Golos copies of letters that hinted, at something that wasn't above-board. I could never find such of anything

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to lay my hands on. He had some strange friends and they came to see him and this fact seemed to be very important to Golos. He also had a man who was writing for his syndicate who was supposed to be anti-Nazi but he always carried a gun and supposedly went to the waterfront for material, but Golos was after this man. There were just little things. Waldo was extremely clever. There was nothing I could get.

I worked there until February 1940. In 1939 came the investigation of World Tourist and at that time he told me where he was. They were then in the Flatiron Building, I think. It came about purely by mistake. He told me he was a publicity man and had opportunities to get free passes to theaters and he promised to bring me some one day. One day he brought them and on the top was written what I thought was "Cold" and I thought they were the wrong ones. He immediately got excited and snatched it and rushed away. Two weeks later he said, "You know my name. Why are you pretending?" I said I didn't know his name and he said his name was Golos. I discovered later he was quite an important figure in the left wing movement but it meant mothing to me.

In 1939 and 1940 the investigation came and he told me was being investigated by the United States. He told me had a great deal of material that he must get rid of. I had a firsplace and he wanted to get rid of it there. It was largely material passports. He got rid of these, and during the discarding of the material I show this very small credential card which he told me people carried around in Russia to get special privileges. I observed on the card. This signature and them on the other side I don't remember what it said. I saw the initials, I think, "NKVD" and he said, "Now you've seen it, I suppose you know."

Then he said be might as well tell me how the thing was organized. He told me anybody going abroad was mut under the foreign division of this NKVD and were responsible to them and that there were three branches. One was military and navel combined. One was general and I think the third was political. He didn't go any further than that. He said they were each independent of the other. When their agents went abroad they were divided into three branches but were all part of the foreign division. I think it's true because I mentioned it to Jack later on and he said yes; that it was correct.

Then he went through that long process of Washington and back and during that period he was staying various places. He had contact with these Mexicans - two of them. Once he went to dinner with them. They were two artists. One is the brother of a Mexican artist who is married to an American girl now living in Brooklyn on either President or Carrol Street. She is Rose Arenal. She used to get letters from them. Golos mentioned to me that when that happened it should never

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have happened; that it was a mistake. He said not to go to Rose Arenal any more. Also during this period he used to get letters from Canada. I think I know now who they were from. Just before Golos died, Fred Rose, who became an MP in Canada, came down and then went back again. He kept sending messages to me asking me to come to see him. As I figure it out, I think what Golos was trying to do was to get material from Canada into this country via Fred Rose because the Russians told me they had no organization in Canada. I think this was in 1939.

At that time Golos had a room with a girl named Caroline Klein who lives on West 13th Street between 6 and 7th Avenues, telephone WA 9-6116. She also is a very ardent Communist. He moved out so she wouldn't be involved. Until that time he had a room in her house. After he died she came to see me. A lot of material that was destroyed I didn't see, but a lot was American passports. I don't know if they were false or real ones. There was lots of other stuff too. That investigation took place through part of 1940.

Then in 1939 he began talking about the fact that he had always had a dream of setting up an organization to handle travel and packages to the USSR and he hoped to make World Tourist that organization. He talked vaguely about it but in the fall of 1940 he decided it should be done and he looked around for somebody to head it. He saked Earl Browder if he knew anyone. I was working in an advertising agency at that time. Browder suggested Colonel John H. Reynolds. He was one of these people who has been on the fringe, a very decent guy. Elektroni by the attention the left wingers had given him. He had been out of business ten years and did not go back. His wife is a Fleischman. He thinks he is a Marrist because he tells me he had been a Socialist. To think so.

He was getting tired of not doing anything and this idea appealed to him. He decided to undertake it. It was to be set up so that Browder would contribute \$15,000 to start and he would put up \$5,000. If it made good they would cash in on their investment. Interest on he had been approached by several of the people on where the party money was. Wiener came to see me. They both drew out money. You won't find any record because it was in several banks.

Golos arranged that the contract would be given to the United States Service and Shipping Corporation and then Reynolds was to send a cable to the Intourist who handle packages through customs, etc. It was a long period of negotiation. Golos' friends were supposed to tell them what to do and they didn't like the idea and there must have been trouble. In the meanwhile he said it sounded like an interesting organization and that he would like to work in it. I didn't realize then what it was. He said he would introduce me to Reynolds and I was hired.

The contract finally came through in April 1941. Reynolds is a person with very respectable friends, etc., and Reynolds didn't know anything about the Russian angle at all. He wanted to run it as a perfectly honest business and do the best he could. He didn't mind paying back the investment to the Communist Party and it was run as a very honest business. As a matter of fact we are still in the red for money we lost. We checked everything.

World Tourist became our receiving agent. World Tourist was originally started by the Communist Party in 1927 and Golos took it over in 1932 and made a go of it. Before that it had been losing money.

The next important thing I think - well, first of all he got a heart attack in early 19/1 and got a second one and didn't realize what it was. I made him go to a doctor and he told him he had hardening of the arteries. This was in April 19/1. Then I think it was in May he began taking on people he got from other people downtown. Starting in 19/1 he began this other type of job whereby he took. Leading contacts he had downtown in the headquarters, Communist Party members who had interesting jobs to the Russians and had them moved to Golos' custody. The first I think was about April 19/1. That was Mary Frice who was then working as Walter Lippmann's secretary. I don't know who referred her. None of this was official. Sertain people were approached. Evidently there were some who didn't like this ari others who cooperated, and he must have made contact with people willing to ecoperate. He knew everyone. What she had that interested him I never could see. I think he was mainly interested in Lippmann's friends.

Golos told me that Lippmann had once been in 12 in world war I. She is the first one I recall knowing about. He was another one - Robert Miller, who was at that time wonning the "Hemisphere". He used to bring copies of the "Hemisphere" to Golos. About that period when he felt his strength failing he asked me if I would meet Bob. There was nothing in it. In May 1941 he came up very agitated in my office and told me the taxi driver had told him that a few days previous two men had shown him credentials. He didn't specify but took it for granted it was the FBI. Then Golos said that in the papers one day there was a notice of this Russian engineer who was arrested for getting material out of Standard Oil. Then he was released and went back home. He said "I expect I'm going to be followed from now on."

Two days later Colonel Reynolds had invited both of us to dinner. We worked very late then. We were going to dinner at 7:30 and he told me two FBI agents were waiting in the street for him. We went down and one was planted on Broadway and one was on the 5th Avenue side. He said for me to go to the place and he was going to get rid

of these guys. I went and later he came back and said he got rid of them. The next night I went to World Tourist. I finished and came out about 7:30 and there were two agents and it was very obvious. I didn't know who they were waiting for. They started after me and I got terrified. I went about two blocks and went into a phone booth and then one of them got into the next booth. Then I got mad so I walked them up to the Pennsylvania Station and got rid of them. From then on about two or three days a week they came after me. This went on until August 1941. I got to know them.

Mr. Golos told me that he believed he was being followed because of his connection with this Russian engineer with the Armenial name who had been recently arrested. He said until then he hadn't know it was the man but that there was a picture of the man. This continued until about July or August 1941 and then they disappeared completely. At that time Golos began getting weaker and weaker. At the same time as he felt his strength failing he decided more and more to build up a reputation. He began getting more and more people. He got them from Browder. Some he gave to me. Most of them he did the talking to. Technically you would call it being a courier. For example, I was to go to Washington once a month and see Mary Price. She would come to New York once a month and see him.

Then in August 1941 be took on this H. Gregory Silvermaster. Also with the group was Captain W. Mindwig Uliman, U. 5. Amay Air Corps, Pentagon Building; also Heler Silvermaster; George Silverman, who at that time was with the Railroad Ratirement Board; and Harry Enite, U. S. Treasury. It was the center of a group of espionage and their function was to get what they could through their can jobs in the government and also collect other people who might be mysticized Communists and to emlarge themselves and gather more and more. It is finitely think joined the party on the West Coast. He was out there during the long-enormen's strike out in Han Francisco and at that time Browder told him never to be active in the party. They would give information to Golos and he would pass it on. Sometimes they would onne up to Few York. It started out on a small basis and by moving people around it got built up. Originally all the information they had same from the Treasury. Golos always wanted political information, nothing olse. all he was interested in was collecting things on anti-Soviet publicity. Originally that is all he collected. If the Treasury had a memo on British and Americans making anti-Soviet remarks he would take it.

Golos told me very little about the group. They were a very frank, open group - talked quite a bit. First they didn't take to me. Most of them were Russians, but after a while they did. In this period he picked up various people one by one. One was Robert Miller, who was head of the "Hemisphere". He had an offer of a job with Rockefeller so Golos persuaded him to give us information on anti-Soviet

activities that he got down in Latin America and Miller did. He used to come up to New York once in a while. I don't think it was particularly secretive. Another person was Helen Tenney. I think it was in 1942 he met her. She was working for some shortwave outfit which is a hiring place for people in the OSS. It was a hiring ground for foreign agents that were sent abroad for the OSS. His interest in her was to find out whether these individuals were anti-Soviet or pro-Soviet. He never told me anything in those days. He talked her into going to Washington. She took a job with the Spanish Division of the OSS in the confidential branch. She went there in the fall of 1943 and I guess is still there. She took over Mary Price's apartment in Washington.

Another person was Maurice Helpern who came from Oklahoma. He was connected with the Oklahoma University and was kicked out for belonging to the teachers' union. He had a job with the Latin American Division of OSS. That was not confidential. Then there was J. Julius Joseph who was working for the Social Security Board in Washington and when the war came Joseph was pulled out of the Army by OSS and put in the Japanese Division of the confidential division. He went in as a private and finally got raised to a second lieutenent. His being raised was after Golos died.

When Mary Price was in Washington in the fall of 1942 she had a friend, Major Duncan Los, who had been working in Bill Donovan's les office, and he was transferred to the GUS in one of these—small groups, and when that happened Mary moved him even'to Golos at that time. He is out now and has been trying to gail out for a long time. He was always unhappy over it. When the war came he hecame a major. Then he moved into the Japanese Division. The last thing I heard he wash't in it. So is Mary Price out of it.

To never called them by their real names. We called them by nick names. Hary Price kept her own names. Duncan her was hown as Pat. Silverman was known as Sam. Ullman was known as helen and Joe kept their own names. Bob kept his name.

There was another person, a Britisher, named Michael Greenberg. He never did very much. I don't think he is terribly important. I don't know too much about him. He worked in the FEA. He also worked with Lechiand Curry. He was a personal friend of the Silvermaster group. He was one of the braintrusters group. I don't know whether Curry suspected. I think he did. He and Silverman were Harvard graduates and they met there. He came to Silverman one day and told him he had information that the American government had broken the Soviet code. I think this was about two years ago. I know the group was never sure of him. Their theory of life was that it was the top

people that were important. They specialized in picking up top people in top government bureaus. Golos was handling all these groups with me as a courier up until the time of his death.

In New York there was Albert Kahm. He thinks he is a born detective. He is always finagling. For instance, he got hold of someone in the British Intelligence and thought he was smarter than they were. What he passed on to us was largely the gossip any newspaperman gets. There was also another Britisher, part of the British Intelligence. His wife wrote a cook book. He lives in the Bronx. His last name begins with a "B". I have never met him. I think his first name is something like Cedric or Cecil. He is a friend of Browder and very much in sympathy with the Communists and has given them information from the British Intelligence files. He had some stuff in a safe. I remember a long copy of a Scotland Yard report on how to train men to be intelligence agents.

Another one was Peter Phodes, hemspaper reporter.

His background is very vague. His mother was British married to a Gryman They lived in this country during World War I. One day the father was found murdered and the mother was suspected. She claimed self-defense. Actually she was a British Intelligence agent and he was a German Intelligence Agent. Anyway she went completely crazy after that. The has been in trouble for some time. He was sent to England and Africa. Them it came time to get his passport there was something Sterihie in that. His wife kept in touch with him after that. The Russian, Bill, whom I believe is an NKVD man is trying still to get in contact with him.

There was another newspaperman named Winston Burdett. I think that's broken up. My friend Al asked me about him because they had lost him. You see, when these people went abroad Golos arranged to have people pick them up on the other side.

Another was Vladimir Kazakovich, former professor at Cornell University. He was very poor. I haven't seen him in a long time. He told me once that his father was an engineer in the Siberian railroad. They were White Russians. He came via China to this country during the Revolution. He met some Reds and they converted him. He is not a member of the Party. He is a man without a country. He is not a Soviet citizen and has never become an American citizen. In 1934 he got out of this country and back into Russia and back here again without a passport. He went out legitimately.

There is a Ukrainian, one of the editors of the Ukrainian Daily News, named Tkach, first name unknown. His function was to dig up for Golos people who would be planted in Ukrainian nationalist movements -

anything going on that was anti-Soviet. Kahn had access to the files of the ADL and they were digging up all sorts of anti-Nazi, anti-Semitic things. Thach introduced Stepankowski to Golos. I don't understand Stepankowski very well. He was very poor and would do investigations for anybody for practically nothing and I think Golos paid him for doing these things and he would get contacts between Ukrainian Nationalists, etc. Then he got very poor and the Russians didn't want to pay him any more. They wanted Albert to get him a job in the ADL and the last I heard of he was still with them.

Another person was Louis Budenz but he never produced many people. He also used to bring in his own information because he came to me with it. He was a personal friend of that Yugoslav, Louis Adamic. I suspected that Louis Adamic was also working with the OSS. Louis was very glad to tell him what was going on. He lived next to smother famous character whose name I can't recall. He was an Americanized Csech. He wrote his memoirs in the Saturday Evening Post in 1937. Obviously this man was being used as an American agent and was stationed in Turkey and Budens suspected it was anti-Soviet activity.

This particular group was in Now North City. Albert Rabal was in Now York City. Thach and Stepankowski were in Hem York City, Thach and Stepankowski were in Hem York City, The Majority were in Hashington. Golos gave this information to paople he was in contact with at that particular time. I suspected it was the political branch but I don't know. If Golos paid envisory I did not know about it, except for special investigators like Spivak and the Stepankowski. The other people, I don't know of Language.

There was another fellow, who lived at Central Park West. He works for a big aircraft company. He did get paid for the reports but I don't think there was anything subversive about it. He was an expert on it. I don't know of Golos paying anyone on it.

There was a second group composed of Victor Perlo who at that time was working in the WPB and then moved to FEA; Donald Wheeler, who was working on the editorial board of OSS; Edward Fitzgerald who worked for WPB and FEA; and Charles Kramer who used to relay gossip. Charles Kramer was the leader of this groups. There was another man a lame man, heavy set. I think his name was Markeff. They had a couple of satellites. One was a Yugoslav who was sent to Yugoslavia at one time. I think he was a naturalized Yugoslav. There were two or three other people. This was the group given board by Browder to size to Golos. Golos lost contact with them. Another one was Tel Bayer, managing again of "Soviet Russia Today". He used to work with Russian military people. He slways used to come over and try to get things from Golos. His name was mentioned once when I was speaking to Al and Al told me he was a very unreliable character. They kicked him out.

headquarters named A. Landy. He was mixed up in something which I think was taking Communist Party members and planting them in Trotskyite organizations. He planted these people in the Trotskyite organizations to keep tabs on what they were doing and he was getting reports on them and giving them to Golos. He always said he was not in sympathy with bribing amyone. He did not believe in it. He said he didn't like what the Russians were doing. He said he would have none of it. I don't believe he paid anyone. He may have but I don't think so. He was a Communist Party man and his value was in getting Communist Party people. The only think I know of he did was the Gelfan business. He was the one who escaped from Europe with \$100,000 and came to this country. He is still here. He tried to come into this country secretly but they found out what boat he was coming on. He found out Golos trailed him in a car, etc.

Another one was Jaffo. He is either a Lithuanian or Estonian who was head of an anti-Soviet ring that was mixed up around there. Golos mentioned him occasionally in 1938. He had some connection with Richard Waldo. Later on Jack asked if I knew anything about Gelfand and he told me this long story. It was about this man who smuggled diamonds into this country. He is supposed to look like Richard Waldo. They never had a picture of him. He is another man of mystery.

Evidently Golos was quite a power. It seems that way. The Russians didn't like him. The Russians told me that he was a praison.

Six months before he died he began complaining to me. I didn't know whether it was his condition that made him that way or what was going on. He began complaining about the hissians; that they were no good, sto. I didn't know whether or not it was true. About a year before he died he told me the hissians tried to bry these people loose from him. He said no. He said these are good American Communists who don't know what they are doing. He didn't want them to meet the Russians. He refused to give them up. He was a pretty tough character and sometimes he would come into the office as if he had his head bashed in. I asked whether Browder would stand by him. He said he didn't know. He went to Washington to see this big Russian in Russian espionage. He came back discouraged. He said he fought for Communism and now he was beginning to wonder. He finally told me he was to see the man on the 26th of November and give a final decision. He said he either had to get out or give up these people. He died on Thanksgiving day.

From then on I wason my own. I thought the first thing to do was to see Browder and see if he could enlighten me. I remember saying to him that I think they killed him. I said "What about these people. Do you want to give them up?" He said no. He never explained anything about it.

The first thing I could think of to do after he died, was to the only hope that I had, the only person to see that I knew at all was Browder. Originally, it was my idea to meet Browder, and so once when he came out of prison, I think in 1941, and he went right away to his summer place in Monroe, New York - Evidently the reason that Browder also was interested in having Golos keep these people was that all the information that Golos got, if it was of any interest at all to Browder, he would make duplicate copies of it, and give it to him, and that - you see where he got an awful lot of his book. That's where he got it from. Golos was anxious to do this to conciliate him. In the summer time, Golos would take trips up to Monroe and one trip he took me along and introduced me to him. Then I met him several other times.

ARTRINO Golos had other contacts, he knew this Mapoli, who runs this larving, and through him he used to arrange special previews of Russian pictures and so forth. Well, on Browder's wedding anniversary one year, I think it was 1933, he arranged a dinner and a preview of a picture, and I went to it.

after Golos died, I thought he was the only person I could go to and I went to see him, and finally came to the question of all these people, and I said, "Do you know that Golos! Russian friends want to take them away from me?" And I said, "Well, how do you feel about it?" He said, "I'll fight it to the last ditch". I said, "Do you want meto stand up and fight?" and he said, "Yes". I said, "All right, I will".

The following Monday, I met the girl, Colos introduced me to this American girl, Catherine. The only clue I have to her identity is - do you remember Don Henderson? Well, in speaking to her one night about Mary Price, I mentioned the fact that Mary Price at one time had been in lave with Don Henderson, and it looked as though there had been some very close connection, she jumped when I mentioned it to her. It looked as though she know him warr well.

She looks either Scotch or Irish. The has one of these feeth out hair bobs. Very blonde. Irish nose, green blue eyes. She's 5' B" or 5' 9", very long and lean. Small bones. I should say about 35, the man I think is her husband told me. I used to see her off and on after Golos died, and she had a child I think in July of 1944.

This night, this Monday night, I had an appointment with her in a movie theatre. I met her in a movie theatre. I said to her, "Did you bring anyone with you?" and she took me out and went through this complicated series of maneuvers to make sure she hadn't been followed. She acted like

an amateur. We picked up her husband in the middle of Park Avenue. She was to meet him at one minute to eight o'clock.

Her husband, Bill, is about 38 years old, about 5' 10" or 11". He is long and lean, not broad shouldered. He is a dandy - suit just so, etc. I remember that I once took a walk with him in Central Park, and before he sat down, he folded his suit neatly, and so on. Straight black hair, flops over one eye. Round dark eyes, nose turns up. He has something wrong with his circulation, because his lips are almost always blue colored purple colored. Very heavy lips. He has a tooth missing. I think he's "Ukrainian Jewish. He doesn't look it. I don't know what nationality he is. He speaks with an accent. I never heard him speak Russian, but once I made some slighting remark about the Ukraine, and he jumped to his feet and howled. He has a tooth missing in the upper front, on the left hand side.

What else I know about him is this. He has a yen for women. You always feel that if any woman came around, and his wife wasn't around, he'd like to make a play for her. When he has too much to drink, he talks about his past and all the women that went around with him. He's good looking. He is not intelligent. His brows are dark, straight, and not too heavy. He always was meticulous about shaving. A surgins he would have a heavy beard. He's always combing his heir back. In summer howers one of those jaunty white Panamas, and seersucker suits, and sport shoes, hereal white, and black and white. He has quite big feet. He's a rather accomplished individual. You get the impression he's all bonos.

Way back in spring, he offered to buy me assure cattle said he was in the garment trade, and could get it the localt. It aid I wasn't interested. Leter on, JACK said to me that he was in tusiness; dack aid said he was a part time worker, not a full time gay. He said, within the of these people who - people like me are full time. The plant is a people that run a business, have the mentality of a letter, and we use them for one or two jobs."

Bill was never communicative. He would say yes or no, if someone told him something he should say to you, or else he said yes or no. He's obviously not a big shot at all. I met Catherine, his wife, and she introduced me to him. She said, "I want to introduce you to your new boss", and that was Bill. His approach was very amusing. He said, "Well, girls, where shall we go now?" in this horrible Russian accent. It was very funny. He said, "I've been told to tell you to hand over all these people". He said, "I want Mary Price first, we need her very badly". I said, "Sorry, no can do.". I said, "It's not up to me, it's up to Browder". So he said he'd

meet me again. Tou see, I used to give him the material, either to him or to his wife, depending. Most of the time it was him, because she wasn't feeling so well. We would make arrangements - 'I'll see you next Thursday at such and such a place". The war went on for a long time. Every time I met him, he'd demand again, and I would go back to BROWDER and say, "Are you going to stand for him?" and he could say, "Yes."

Finally, they decided that they couldn't get MARY, and then they started after this SILVERMASTER gang. I said, "No." Finally they said, "We insist mon meeting them at least once." We took him out to dinner, tried to get him drunk. I said to BILL, "This is the last time you see him". Then he him drunk. I said to BILL, "This is the last time you see him". He said, "We'll go to EROWNER". He must have, because I think it was two months later I met BILL, and he didn't say anything, he just smiled at me like a cat who had swallowed the cream. The next day, BROWNER told me to turn to see then slightly what was going on, I think. There was nothing else to do, I had to turn them over. BILL told me to go, to move to Washington or Baltimore, and from there to take care of them. I took care of them up to Beptember, 1944, and then turned them over. They didn't want to be turned over. They hated it and so did I.

First, before he said "Turn them over", they went to BROWLER was insisted they be allowed to see SILVERMASTER. Then they demanded that they have them. So that arrangements were made direct with SILVERMASTER. They have them. So that arrangements were made direct with SILVERMASTER.

I know that JACK in one of his talking moods said that they had reshuffled the whole thing and broken up the entire group, and that he whought it was all a mess, and I had done better, and so forth.

BILL was to go with this group, and I was to have a new min, and arrangements were made that I was to stand on a certain corner, I believe in October of 1944 and someone was to say something to me. That was the advent of JACK. I don't think he's in this country any more. I know that JACK must be an agent. BILL gave me instructions on how to meet him. I think he called him BOB. Anyway, he later took the name of JACK. BILL said, "He's a very nice guy." I said, "I don't want an American, I want a Russian". He said, "First you see the American".

JACK is about an inch taller than I, possibly, about 5' 9". Very broad shouldered. Looks Jewish, is Lithuanian Jewish. About the color of my hair, kinky. Very heavy eyebrows, like lots of Lithuanians have. His nose is Jewish, not large, but curved over. These extremely bright blue eyes. Very thin narrow mouth. When he smiles he's good looking. Lines

from his nose to his mouth. He has lots of teeth missing. Has teeth that fit in, and when he's tired he takes them out. He looks like anybody who might have grown up on the East Side. Has a Jewish, East Side accent. Dresses in American suits, conservative. Good conservative shoes. Conservative neckties, but insists upon wearing very fancy cuff links and allk shirts. He told me once that he had been given this course of training in Americanizing himself, and was told not to wear silk shirts and cuff links. He always looks as though he's under a strain, hasn't had enough aleep. The color of his face is always very gray, very haggard. At first I thought he was American, but I thought I'd trap him after a while, so I said something in Russian which was funny, and he laughed. Later on he told me he was Lithuanian Jewish, and described his background. He told me strange stories about how during the revolution they had nothing to eat in Lithuania. He said he used, as a kid, to run errands for the Bolsheviks and he worked on up and they sent him over here. I think he has been in this country four five years.

He'd get very sad spells, weeping on my shoulder. He said, "I'll never get anyplace in this life. I can't go any further. This is the end for me." He said, "I'd like to learn more, but there's no further to go". And then, he'd say it was an awful life he was living, and it was a terrible life to have to live that way, but then he said, "I suppose I've a terrible life to have to live that way, but then he said, "I suppose I've lived this way so long, I just couldn't change, probably and then, I lived this way so long, I just couldn't change, probably and then, I have any when the business was right, I might go to home with the Colonel. He's a good photographer, everything. He had been trained over there. He got sicker and sicker, and told me once he had a hemorrhage on the street from a stomach ulcer, and he finally left me in the spring of 1945. I don't know where he is now. He spoke excellent Hebrew, Lithuanian, Russian, Spanish, his English is all right. But what I caught him in, he spean't spell in English. I was sure he wasn't an American.

died, he said, "I think the Russians are putting a new system into effect.

I think they are trying to Americanise their people more. I think they have pulled a lot of people out of the Communist Party and sympathisers,

and have been quietly training themselves, and now are going to turn them loose semetime seen. I think CATHERINE is one of them. What they do to Americans they train is semething you just cannot imagine. They are experts in the art of back-stabbing. They're nasty, arrogant. Part of this scheme was that everyone should be so fixed that he could pass. He should dress like an American. They wanted me to write a long essay on the subway systems in New York - sverything a person landing in this country should have to know - how to smoke a cigarette, everything like that, so that they could get themselves Americanized. He said, "If you over meet any people, they probably will be Lithuanians or something, but you'll think they are Americans". They are trying to move this network away from any organizations that have any connections at all with Russis. This whole system of espionage or whatever you call it. For example, COLOS was connected with an organization that would naturally be suspect. What they are trying to do is to move everybody into organizations that are not connected with - break them up.

Communist Party members. They want to yank them away. That was another bone of contention between them and HROWDER, because they took everybody he dug up to work for him. So far, I don't think they have succeeded very well. They don't trust Americans worth anything. They distrust them completely. They think they can be bribed or seduced. They have absolutely no respect for Americans at all.

Whatever was left of the group, I have the information that came from them to JACK. With the absence of the SILVENMASTER gang, I was handling all the rest. Then, at this point, I said to JACK that I wanted to sepeak to senseous high up who was a Russian. His feelings were hurt and so forth, and he finally said, "Yes, I'll arrange it, but the man isn't arriving in this country until late in October". He finally arranged - this man is probably one of these characterys, roving people, because he said I'd have to go to Eashington and meet him. The usual rigmarole. And this one turned tap, AL. You could tell right away he was different from the rest. In those tays his English was very poor. He has a British accent, by the way. He spoke in these days with a Russian accent combined with the British. It was late in October, 1944, in a drug store at Georgetown, Washington. I set the places He tried to stay away from all government buildings in Washington, because he said he was well known, which leads me to believe he was one of the higher-ups.

He's a furny looking guy. He's short, maybe 5' 3" or 5' 4".
Broad shouldered, stocky, fat. Has blond hair, is near sighted, wears glasses not too thick glasses. Round face. Rimless glasses. He has two extra teeth gutting out, overlapping each other, like tiger teeth, in the upper front.

He has very thick lips. I think it's a Jewish nose, a short nose, but it turns down a little bit. He's one of these people looks older than he actually is. He's probably in his middle or late thirties. His clothes never seem to fit him right. He used to be a pretty sloppy dresser, but he's picking up. But smart. He's the educated type, definitely. He's very cagy. They're never supposed to tell anybody who they are or what they are. He walked up to me, and said, "I bring you greetings from Moscow". It seems they later bawled him out for this.

We walked all over Washington and I talked about the business to him, mainly. And also about these people and what was going to be done with them. He said, "I haven't any power, but I'll listen to you". He is the kind of a person that instinctively makes shivers run up and down your spine. He had learned how to behave in America out of a report written on it. There is something slimy about the guy. I didn't like him.

The next few times I saw JACK and nothing much was accomplised. Then, in Movember, JACK told me, he was so excited, "I said, "What's the matter, JACK?" They were all trying to bribe me with things. They wanted to pay me a salary of \$200.00 a month. Very shortly after BILL ran into tough sledding with me, he began suggesting, "May I buy you a fur coat?" I said, "I'm sorry". He said, "I want to give you \$30.00 a month". I said, "Sorry". The next time, he said, "How about a hundred dollars a month". I said, "No". The next time, it was \$200.00. I said, "I don't like this business one little bit". He said, "Well, I don't like it either, I was told to do this". Then, in the summer time, I had sinus trouble, and he wanted to buy me an air conditioner. We fought about this all summer. He even went to the SILVERMASTER gang and suggested they put pressure on me, and they came to me and asked me what it was about.

When JACK came along, JACK also tried to give me money. I said, "Look, JACK, this is a racket, I want none of it". He looked sort of ashamed of himself. Evidently they must have sat and meditated and finally decided they had the perfect solution, because about the - just before Thanksgiving Day, JACK met me and he was becoming all over, and said, "I know something nice is going to happen. You are to meet AL next Monday, and he'll tell you." I couldn't figure it out. I met AL at the Edison Theatre up on Broadway. He began reciting that I had been awarded the Order of the Red Star for my noble work. It sort of went over my head. Well, that just about finished me. I was physically worn out anyway.

AL lives in Washington, but I think he moves around. I think the material was run right up to the Consulate, because JACK used to meet me right near the Consulate.

I thought the Red Star was the last straw. I thought that was the cheapest thing. He thought I was overcome with joy and pride; he couldn't figure out the other angle, I guess. Well, he also told me that I would have to give up all these people. I said, it was up to BROWDER. He said "BROWDER will tell you to do it", which he did. So I was to give up all these people, which I did. And all of them were turned over by the christmas time of 1944. I was in Washington just before Christmas, and that's them. To got into a fight with AL because I told him when this was through I didn't want anything more of it. He said, "The trouble with you is you need to get married". He said, "Why don't you look around". I think he was implying himself. Anway, I walked out on him.

I took the next train to New York, met JACK, and said, "What's going on here?" He turned on me and said I had no right to behave that way. Apparently AI had talked to him. From them on, we were in constant struggles. I was telling them I didn't like anything about it. All sorts of arguments. Finally, they said, "You shouldn't be in the shipping business anyway. What we would like is to turn it into a simple business of sending packages, and we would like to put another person in there to buy out REYNOLDS." Then mother feud developed. All was in favor of keeping REYNOLDS; JACK was not. I tried to insist they get him out, and put their own person in. But it went on and on and on.

Meanwhile, all the people had been turned over, and they would come back to me occasionally and complain. Finally, along in about April, JACK said, "I have found someone to take over the business". I hadn't seen all this time. They introduced me to MRS. JOSEP! ELSON, and JACK told me she was a Communist Party member, a good loyal soul, but very naive.

Well, she was to go into the business and buy the Colonel out. I was to go on vacation and come back and work for them. The private idea was get me and the Colonel out. It dragged on and on, because there was a great feud being waged. It started in July, 1944. BROWDER got the idea that it was very bad for the Communist Party to be mixed up in an organization also wixed up with the Russians. We thought the people over there would come to the point where they would want to see them separated. He said, "I think they will probably take over U. S. SERVICE". He asked me how I would like to run WORLD TOURIST. I said "No". The Russians made a deal with him — they offered him \$15,000.00 — that they would take over U. S. SERVICE and leave him WORLD TOURIST. But then, the Russians kept haggling. Wouldn't he sell for \$11,000, and then \$8,000. This awful Orchard Street technique. And I would go to MARL and say, "I've been told to tell you this, but I don't like it."

When PRIER I. HELLER appeared in the picture, and they learned that he was around, they seemingly got terribly upset. To me, it was a very phony sort of outburst. They were afraid, they said. And as a result of that JACK suddenly disappeared. I think it was because of that. And AL appeared. I used to go to Washington to see him.

Colonel and KISON to stay in and me to get out. I fought with him on it, and told him all sorts of reasons that might appeal to him. He insisted on meeting the Colonel, and I know that he'd get to him some way. He met Colonel REYNOLDS. He was introduced as a Russian who was in this country and on the side was looking after a tourist business and was interested. He told REYNOLDS that he was a friend of COLOS, and so forth. He tred on REYNOLDS! toes, because he kept asking how much money he had. He was rather abbnoxious. REYNOLDS didn't take to him very kindly. He offered him broad vistas. REYNOLDS was rather impressed. That was about the time I was to go on vacation. I finally went away on June 19th, and intended to stay for a couple of months. And this AL, who to REYNOLDS called himself PAUL, was supposed to see REYNOLDS in three weeks. He didn't turn up. REYNOLDS called me long distance and asked me where was my friend, PAUL, etc. And I came back to New York after two weeks. I had no way to get in touch with him. I had a standing date to meet him. Hobody knew anything. We didn't show what to do.

In the spring, the Communist Party in the person of WEINER started camping on my door step wanting the \$15,000.00. WRINER had been trying to get me to run WORLD TOURIST for him, and I said No. So matters rested. Every two weeks, REYNOLDS would call me up and get excited, and I would come into town. I was supposed to see AL on August 8th in Washington. We missed connections and I didn't see him. About two weeks later on, MISON informed me he wanted me to go back to Washington. A week later, she sent word he would come to New York and see me.

I discussed the business. I said I wanted to have REYNOLDS out of the business, and wanted to settle the \$15,000.00. He said, "Thy do you need to settle it? BROWDER is out now. If anybody comes to see you, tell them to see BROWDER". I said I was going back on vacation. He said, when you come back we can plan to set you up in any business you want. He said, "For six months you'll do nothing, and then come back with me again." I said I didn't like the idea. I want back to the country, and I came back in September.

This time he met me in New York again, and started all over

again. I said, "No, I am not going to do it. I am not interested, and what are you going to do about this business, anyway?" Well, nothing, nothing. I decided the only thing to do was go back into the business again and maybe he'd do something then. I went back into the business. ELSON reported said fact back through her person, evidently, and AL came tearing up to see me. The Colonel had just been made a Colonel, and we had all been celebrating, and I was very high. When I met AL I couldn't even walk straight. I told him what I thought of him and the Russians and everybody else, in no uncertain terms. I met him at Alexanderson's, at Radio City. He was to meet me again in a month.

In two weeks, I received word from ELSON that he would like to meet me again. He said, "You know, you really were drunk the last time, and you said things about the Russians, and my feelings were hurt. We're nice people, we love you so much. We are doing so much. When you go to reach the said, you've done so much we just can't forget about it. You can keep your business, we won't interfere. I will personally see that INTOURIST gives you a personal contract." I thought, "Well, what oh earth is going on here?". He said, "I think you'll regret it". He said, "I still want you to think over going into a business which we will set up", and so forth. He had been trying to give me money, too. He said, "I insist that you take this \$2,000.00. If you don't take it, I'll think you're a traitor". I still have the \$2,000.00. He thought that was "wonderful. I said, "Well, right now I'm just too tired to take on that kind of work." He said, "In a year you'll be back again, doing the same work". That was the last time I saw him.

In the meantime, Mr. LE: HARRIS, a contact man between the Finance Department of the Communist Party and outsiders, came in. He had been running in and out all this time, trying to collect the \$15,000.00. He came in and said he wented the \$15,000.00. I tried to explain I had nothing to do with it, didn't know anything about it. He said, "You're a straitor to the American movement", and he screamed and yelled. He said I must go to see WEINER. He came back the next day and demanded, he not only wanted the \$15,000.00, he wanted to come in and run the business. He said, "You'll hear from me", and then I got rather frightened, so I want to see the Colonel. I had told the Colonel a lot of this story, and had told him several months ago we ought to close the whole thing up. He alternates, one day he thinks he eight to get out. He thinks he's smarter than the Bussians.

I went to him and told him the story. He said, "They can start suing you but they won't get anywhere." I said "Do you think they'll do it?" He said,

"They're a bunch of fools down there anyway, and who knows what a fool's going to do?" I said, "The Colonel says if this is going to happen, he'll sell the business right out, and restore whatever money is coming to you".

I told KLSON, meantime, that if her commrest showed up she should please get in touch with AL immediately and tell him I wanted to see him, because I was going to force a showdown. She came to see me monday and told me about this Friday appointment. I have a date to meet AL on Friday, Movember 9th, at the Guffanti's Restaurant, at 25th and 26th Streets on Seventh Avenue, at 7:00 P.M. He has a complicated system of getting in touch with me. He will call my office, and say that he is Mr. ALLENBERG. He will say he is interested in sending parcels to Sweden. That will mean Fin two hours from his telephone call he will be at Bickford's Restaurant. That's what he arranged with me the last time I saw him. They change signals all the time.

RETNOLDS knows that we were carrying on work that was not legitimate and so on. He said, "If I were you, I'd just forget about it, it's all in the past". His reaction was, we better forget about it and not mention it to anybody. He's a friend of TED BAER, "TOO. He told TED he had lost his Russian contact, and would TED please pick it up.

I have not been handling any people since December, 1944, except for one person in January or February. I think it was KDWARD FITZGERALD, as I recall.

The last two times I saw AL, he has been putting pressure on the sat shold of PETER RHODES again. I said, "I don't see any point in doing anything about it." He said, "Be sure and do it this time". I said, "Well, I'll see."

At the time that I left the SILVERMASTER gang they had mechanised themselves to a considerable degree. At that time, ULIMAN was drafted into the Army as a private, but he is extremely clever and worked himself up to sergeant in about two months, became a second lieutenant, and last heard of he was a captain. They pulled strings all over the place and got him stationed in the Pentagon. I can't think of the name of the general. He did work for ARNOLD, but he worked with a man undermeath ARNOLD. It's a very famous name. He has a propensity for profamity. Through him, ULIMAN got all this air data. I don't think he got it from anyone but himself. Just the material he got there. Before that, he had been in the Treasury. He comes from a very wealthy Jewish family, who like to pretend they are not lewish, I think from St. Louis, Missouri. I think maybe they are in "Who's Who".

He was one of those kids who was very bright, but never thought he was Jewish until he was in his teens, and it hit him very hard.

He developed a terrible inferiority complex. He came to Washington, got a minor clerk's job. Four or five years ago, he had a minor job in the Treasury. Somehow or other, the SILVERMASTERS are always giving parties, and he came to one. They spotted him as somebody who was good material. He learned photography overnight. He's a good mechanic. They got him around to their point of view. He took a room in their house. When I met them he was part of the menage. He doesn't like his family, and they don't like him. The only family he has are the SILVERMASTERS.

He is shorter than I am, about 5' 6", looks Jewish, sort of an ordinary type of Jewish face. Plain brown hair, blue eyes. Very thin face, wery intelligent looking. Thin build, with a bit of a stomach. I think he is about 37 or 38. He at present, I think, is still in the Air Corps. I don't know. His full name is WILLIAM LUDWIG ULIMAN. He's the kind of guy that goes places. He got so he could sass the generals and they loved it.

I think he lived in New York a long long time ago. I think he told me he earned his living by being a professional golfer around New York. He has a sister in New York who married a Communist organizer.

The meets must have had 30 or 40 exposures on each one. I don't know for sure. The roll was about an inch in diameter. He used a Contex camera. He has one Contex of his own that he bought. When they first started in, they didn't photograph, but later they decided to photograph. He built this beautiful outfit in the cellar. He can take it apart and put one piece here and mother there, so that no one looking at it would know what it was. It has a rest where the camera lies, and the lens goes down. One night they showed it to me. He uses a Contex. They gave him a Contex, too. He had two Contex's. GOLOS gave him his first one, and the second one I think SILVEPMASTER picked up from BILL.

He got all types of information. At the beginning, it was mostly political data, which was fished out of the Treasury. In those days, he picked up whatever memos came to Morgenthau, and found out what there was a Things shout the British and Americans ganging up on the Russians, that type of thing. But then, as the war went on and LUD got in where he was and SILVEPMAN moved into the Pentagon Building as a civilian employee of the Air Corps, they began to get all this tremendous amount of data. And then they decided to take up photography. LUD learned how to do it and made it a sort of hobby. Most of the data I did not see. Practically all the Writingers reports. Practically all the Ministry of Information in London's monthly reports. Some FEI reports. A monthly report on Red activities in this country. They used to get shold of Navy Intelligence things,

Army Intelligence things. They evidently get them through trading, the Air Corps used to trade with 0-2, and so forth. They had everything under the sun.

They definitely mentioned the FBI. The rest of it was Army Intelligence stuff. One item was that the Air Corps Intelligence claimed that they had found a Russian some place in this country, high up in the Russian Embassy in this country, who was selling out secrets of Soviet air power, and so on. Something of that sort. They'd go in for production figures of all varieties - how many planes are going here and there and so on. He was in on the whole B-29 business. He was sent out to Day ton Field. LUD UILMAN had all the information on the B-29. I didn't see any plans, but I heard him talking about what was on the films. There was no information about the atomic bomb. I knew that something was going on because I heard somebody in the OSS, but I never heard what it was.

They practically covered the whole range of whatever was around at the time. Marshall's secret directives on this and that - anything. That was LUD's stuff. He had two or three generals who used to tell him things all the time. He'd memorite it, type it out, and photograph it. He used to go home at night with this bulging brief case. They'd photograph it at night, and he'd bring it back in the morning. No one else of that gang knew they photographed things, just ULIMAN, SILVERMASTER, and SILVERMASTER's wife.

JIJMAN liked the work, he fancied himself as an intelligence, agent. LUD, sometimes I think he is sincere, sometimes I think it's a game of wits with him. I don't think he's getting any remuneration. If anybody ever shows any signs of needing money, it somes. It flows around the place.

The SILVERMASTERS, I think she is very definitely pro-Russian. Her father was Baron VITE, and he was one of these strange Polish - Russian Barons, who was not a Czarist, but was waguely in sympathy with the revolution. He was a very famous explorer, and although he never was with the revolutionists, he used to give them money, hide them, and so on, and he brought his daughter up that way. She is fanatically Russian, more so than any of the others. Really, sincerely Russian. SILVERMASTER himself - he is Jewish, she is not. He was in China when the revolution broke out. He came from a Ukrainian village, and he and his family escaped to China. He eventually came to this country, got interested in the Communist movement, and got sucked into it. He is a graduate, I think, of one of those California universities. He has a Ph.D., I think. He taught for ten years in a Catholic college in California. He came to Washington in 1935, with the Department of Agriculture. He is fanatically honest. He really believes that although

America is his country, Russia is his second country, and they should be together. How he feels now, I don't know. SILVEPMASTER never produced any important information himself. His wife was just a housewife, photographer, and courier.

SILVERNASTER didn't do anything in the agricultural field, but in 1942 GOLOS convinced him to go into the BEW. He got into the - he was made Division Head of the African European Division, of the BEW. He had a wonderful chance to pick up all sorts of things, you see. What was being done about Spain, all that type of information. He hadn't been there very long when he was chased. He was told that they would have to let him go, and one of his friends sneaked to him a copy of the letter which had been received by his chief in the HEM. It was signed by the head of G-2, and said they had in their files information from the FBI, ONI, and their own files which tended to prove that CRECORY SILVERMASTER was not a loyal citizen. That was in the summer of 1943. Well, all that summer he fought the case, he was going to get a lawyer, and finally he got disgusted and resigned. Later on, after he had resigned, the HEW wrote and reneged on it, and said the charges were nothing at all and they were sorry he left, but did not invite him back. I believe also some one in the War Department wrote him a letter, apologizing.

Then he moved into the Treasury, into the disposal of surplus goods, and last heard of, he was still there. He went into the Treasury in about the spring of 1944.

NATHAN ORECORY SILVERMASTER is described as follows: About 51 98, broad shouldered; medium weight, has very close cropped iron-gray hair, wears glasses only when he is reading. He has a rather typical face, hard to describe. It doesn't look Jewish, but Russian. Blue eyes. He has bed asthma. Continually goes around with an atomiser. Mustache like BROWDER's - come to think of it, he looks somewhat like BROWDER. He is 44 or 45 years old. His wife is 42 or 43. He himself I don't think got any material from anybody, because everybody in Washington who came from California in 1935 knew that he was a Communist, and no one trusted him, so he never had any contacts with anyone down there. He is not the one who collects the information. The collector of information is SILVERMAN.

SILVERNASTER is the one who keeps the morale up.

Mrs. SILVERMASTER is 5' 5" or 6", Polish looking face, brown whair, very narrow shoulders, very lean and wiry type, always looks as if she is going to fall apart but is very sturdy. She dresses very well - she's a Baroness, She is 42 or 43. She is very well liked by everybody

in Washington. Spends most of her time doing work for the Red Cross and other organizations.

He went to Harvard with Sting or White. He's an American, but he's an old Communist Party member, I believe he has been at least 15 or 20 years in the movement. I don't know how long he has been in Washington. He was a friend of HARRY WHITE and of CHRIS. ICCHTARD LUNCH was one of Roosevelt's Brain Trusters, and MARRY WHITE was an assistant to Norgenthau. HARRY WHITE, incidentally, is Jewish. Most of the people mixed up in this are. RILYRHASTER is, HARRY WHITE is, ULIMAN is. Most of your Communists are. I discovered that.

According to SILVERMANTER, a few years before 1941, HARRY was giving information to the Russians for a brother-in-law of SILVERMAN, who used to come down and pick it up, I think he was in Newark, and the Russians used to give HARRY presents, including a Persian rug. And then, either because the Russian got out of it, or what happened, that connection was somehow broken and was not taken up again until later.

In the spring of 1944, CURRY came rushing to SILVERMAN and told him that someons in the American government was on the verge of breaking the Soviet code, they almost had it, and SILVERMAN rushed to SILVERMASTER and he told me about it. Because I remember telling it to BILL, and BILL saying well, is it a trap or ien't it a trap?" and that's all there was to it.

They've got some other people on the string, but I don't know

The second group used to send a representative, usually PERIO, to New York every couple of weeks. Their reports were usually typewritten or written in pencil. Various types of things. PERIO's was mostly airplane production figures. FITZGERALD's material - he rarely produced anything at all, but it was never anything much. WHEKIER, in the OSS, used to bring all their reports. The SILVERMASTER group was the more important of the two, no doubt. CHARLES KRAMER was on the Kilgore Committee. I gave the information of both groups first to BILL, Kilgore Committee. What would you do if you were mixed up in this, like espionage?" and all that sort of stuff. He said "I'd forget about it, that's my unofficial opinion". I said, "What's your official opinion?" He said "Officially, I don't know you". And the next night he called me on the phone and said, "Are you still suffering from hallucinations?" I said, "What do you mean?" He said, "What you were talking about the other night". I said, "I've forgotten all about that". One thing he did say, he said, "Has it to do with Communist Party "members?" He said, "Stop worrying, the Navy will pick them up".

He is known at the Armory, where he is in Company K of the

New York State Guard. He has nothing in his coat pockets which would give him away. The Armory is at 357 Summer Avenue, in Brooklyn. It drills on Monday and Thursday nights. He wears a combination good conduct medal with 15 years experience as an enlisted man, yet his title, when I called him at

the Armory, is Lieutenant HELLER.

He has an office on Broadway, just north of Canal Street, in a very run-down building. It is listed in the phone book under his name. I called up one day and asked to speak to Lieutenant HELLER. She said, "Does he know you?" and I said "Yes". I told her who I was. She went away and came back and said, "We do have a Mr. HELLER here who has a brother who is a lieutenant, but he hasn't been here for some time". I said, "Can you take a message?" and she said, "I don't know if I'll see him". I said, "Tell him to call me". He says that's a cover address, so people won't know his real address. He has a crazy character who drives him around. He wears the same thing in his buttonhole. He fixed my radio for me. He says he has an office in the Federal Building.

The Washington Field Office advised on December 11, 1945, that on December 9, 1945, Rowens Rommel a State Department employee who had just returned to this country from Mexico, phoned Robert Talbot Miller, III, and asked him if he had seen the Congressional Record in which her name was mentioned along with those of Service and others, Miller stated that he had heard about it but had not read the Record.

Rowens Rommel said that a newspaper reporter from Providence, Rhode Island, her hometown, had invited her to make a statement. She was advised by Miller to make no statement inasmuch as the item appeared in the Congressional Record over a week previously and that she did not know what kind of statements had been made by Alger Hiss or the others named by Curtis.

Attached for your information is the Congressional Record for Movember 28, 1945, in which appears on page A5537 the statements by the Honorable Carl T./Curtis of Nebraska on Wednesday, November 28, 1945.

Curtis stated: "The Secretary of State owes it to his country and to his President, who is responsible for our foreign policy, to have the Federal Bureau of Investigation thoroughly investigate such men of his Department as John Service, Alger Hiss, Rowens Rommel, Emile Despres, John Carter Vincent, Abraham H. Feller, Banjamin Gerig, and others and make that record public."

Curtis also called upon the Secretary of State to discharge from the pay roll of the State Department every Communist and near Communist.

Reference is made to a memorandum from Mr. Munferd to you dated March 13, 1946, concerning the arrival of Informant Gregory in Washington on March 12 and her subsequent contact with the Silvermasters and Helen Tenney.

At 1:20 p.m. teday Special Agent Maurice A. Taylor of the Washington Field Office telephonically advised Supervisor Fleyd L. Jones that en the evening of March 13 Gregory had dinner with Helem Tenney at which time they conversed for approximately two hours. During this dinner, Miss Tenney teld the informant that she had lost her Bussian centact; that attempts have been made to centact her by several persons, both men and women. She said the last attempted contact was about two weeks before Christmas, 1945; that these attempted contacts were made telephonically to Helen Tenney at her apartment and the person calling would invite her to come down to a nearby drug store for a coco cola; however, she never was able to make a contact Tenney also told the informant that she knows she was followed during her recent trips to New York City where she visited her mother. However, she said that she had no one to report this matter to and apparently when she mentioned it to the informant it was the first time that she had ever told it to anyone. She asked the informant to assist her in regaining her contact, and the informant stated that she would get in touch with her later.

Concerning the visit by Gregory to the Silvermaster home, Special Agent Taylor said that Gregory was at the Silvermaster residence from about 8:45 p.m. wntill shortly past midnight on March 13; that while she was there Richard and Elizabeth Samily were also visitors at the Silvernaster home. The Paforment said that she is of the opinion that Mrs. Silvermaster was very apprehensive about her being there. She said that William Ludwig Illmann was also there, and that he took Richard Sasuly into the basement of the Silvermaster home where they conversed for a considerable amount of time. The informant gathered that the substance of their conversation was something that they desired to keep from her. She said that finally at approximately midnight, seeing that the Sasulys had made no move towards leaving the Silvermaster home, she finally suggested that they would leave. Thereafter the informant and the Sasulys were driven home by Mr. Silvermaster. The informant said that in view of the Sasulys being at the Silvermaster residence she did not have an epportunity to converse freely with them; however, upon leaving she was invited to stop to see the Silvermasters should she be in Washington in the future. 5-56402-

Special Agent Taylor Stated that Gregory departed from Washington for New York City on the 4:00 p.m. train today.

I want to call your attention to the MI Summary dated March 4, 1946, concerning a conversation between Maurice Halperin and a Mr. Lou Bhean (phonetic) at 8:10 P.M. on March 4, 1946. It will be recalled that Halperin is presently employed as Chief of the Latin American Section of OSS with offices in the Dorchester House. According to information received from the Washington Field Office, Louis Rean is presently employed by the American Red Cross and has offices on the first floor of the Red Cross Building on 18th Street, Worthwest.

It appears that Halperin had requested Rean to make some inquiries concerning Halperin's status at OSS, and in view of this the following conversation transpired:

Halperin asked Lou if anybody could find out anything or would they decline to talk. Lou said, "They just said there was enough of a case, and I guess after they announced the story that they didn't want to go beyond it. Of course I could go beyond ...telling them what had happened before." Lou asked Halperin if he had talked to McCormack. Halperin said that he had talked to McCormack earlier in the day; that they settled up and parted as friends. Halperin then stated that he was going on leave at the end of the week, adding that he was going on sick leave which would carry him along until the end of May. He said after that he will be on annual leave which will run until October. Halperin then added, "I ain't done so bad (laughter)."

Halperin then said, "I am sure I know what it was Gon A Town one of those things, but I couldn't get it out of them. I talked to Ben Cohen who was most sympathetic, and so forth and so on, but he said he didn't like the preceding and what not and he had long advocated that they have some sort of a board whit! Congress might trust, and what not. I think basically what it comes down to it my guess is that they are just scared of someone in Congress or somewhere else rattling some skeletons in people's closets, you know." Halperin said that his guess is "that the...It is the old Oklahoma background and general fear, you know." Lou said he thought the whole thing over there is probably pretty upset and pratty uncertain. He then referred to the article in the evening newspaper indicating that there is a strong possibility that General Marshall will succeed Secretary Byrnes as Secretary of State. Halperin said that he was talking to Colonel McCormack, and McCormack just as much as told him that he was quitting. Halperin said there is just one chance in ten that McCormack is going to stay on.

Halperin indicated that he felt a great deal of relief being out of the mess, and said he is going to get down to work. Halperin then concluded by

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thanking Rean for his last efforts, and Rean said he was glad to be of some assistance.

Subsequently, at 8:20 P.M., Halperin contacted a man, referred to as "Doc." and he told Doc that he was leaving his job at the close of work on Triday; that he was going to Boston on Wednesday on his last official job. He also indicated that he was going to see the United Food Company man. This conversation of Halperin indicated that he was "comfortable" when he spoke of leaving his job. He said that he wouldn't be back after his leave, stating that there is no point in going back since there is nothing to do. Halperin also said that he has a lot of things that he wants to do for the next few menths, and also mentioned that he would be on "their pay roll for quite a while."


With respect to OSS, Halperin said that he was "just getting out with dignity."

Halperin also said that he has been trying to get some promotions for a couple of people, and he wants to clear up some odds and ends before he leaves. He said he had a meeting of all his Section Chiefs this afternoon and broke the news and that they were all a little disturbed. Halperin said that there has been no official decision as to what is going to happen, but that it is quite clear that it will not continue on as it is. He said they are going to distribute the whole business, break it up and put it under geographical desks. Dock then said, "In other words, OSS may come and OSS may go, but the old State Department goes on forever." Halperin said, "That is right. That is it, my friend. That is exactly it. And it will take on some of the people and it will cut them down a few grades here and there, but it will take whom it wants as it wants them, and people have to measure up to their standards - standards not only of scholarship and point of view, but also of proper conduct." Later he also said that they have to measure up to points of demerits and social background.





Director FEILIN MATHAN GREGORY SILVERNASTER, SPIONAGE Iou will recall that you were advised by memorandum dated March 6. , that information was received through a technical source that an individual named Sam Miller contacted Ann White, wife of Harry Dexter White, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, on March'5, 1946, at which time Mr. Willer inquired whether Harry White would sever his connections with the Treasury Department before leaving for the Monetary Conference at Savannah, Georgia, and Mrs. White said that he would not; that he would wait until he returned. Further reference is made to White's status in a conversation obtained through a technical source on March 12, 1946, between Ann Feltus, wife of J. H. Bandolph Feltus, and Amn White. According to the 1946 edition of the Congressional Directory, Feltus is assistant to Harry Dexter White in the Monetary Research and Foreign Funds Division of the Treasury Department. During this conversation, Ann Feltus inquired of Mrs. White if she had seen the morning papers about the Monetary Conference. She said that Vinson, referring to the Secretary of the Treasury, wis chairman of both boards which isn't unexpected. He thinks we, the Americans, shouldn't take both top positions." Mrs. White then said: "That is well known - we knew that beforehand." Then Mrs. Feltus said: "I thought it was understood Harry would get the ____. Wrs. White stated: "No. It was understood he wouldn't. have He went without any expectation of it because that was determined beforehand. Will won't Mrs. Feltus inquired whether or not it was determined very recently and Mrs. White said that it had been determined in a matter of a few weeks. Mrs. thite stated that they apparently feel that just one officer should be an American officer. She said that she was just as well pleased; that she didn't want him to have a job that "hard"; that it takes a lot out of him and he isn't in condition to have it taken out of him. She stated that she would rather that he had a less-taxing job but there is some frustration naturally. She said that a few months ago, she would have been furious but right now whatever we hoped it would accomplish seems to be diminishing anyhow. Later in this conversation, Mrs. White said that she isn't making Cany plans at all - that she was just waiting. She said she was pretty certain of what the outcome would be down there. Mrs. Feltus asked if Harry was going I to stay in there. Mrs. White said: "Oh! As Executive Director?" Mrs. Feltus stated: "That's determined in any case?" Mrs. White replied: "Yes, in any case." Tou will recall from previous memoranda in the above case

that Claymer Schluter first came up in this investigation on December 6, hr. Nease
1945, as a contact of the subject Peter Christopher Rhodes who,
according to the informant Gregory, was an acquaintance of the Soviet
agent Jacob M. Golos, Gregory's superior, and furnished, according to Gregory's
knowledge, information to Golos in which Golos was definitely interested. It
will be recalled further that in 1945, the unknown Soviet agent Jack" and Anatoli
B. Gromov were attempting to locate Rhodes and mentioned him to Gregory.

On December 6, 1945, when Schluter first came into this investigation, it was noted through surveillances that Peter Christopher Rhodes left the Aux Troix Mousquetaires Restaurant, 818 Connecticut Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C., at 2:30 p.m., accompanied by an unidentified man, later identified as Claymer Schluter. After walking several blocks, Rhodes reached in his rear pocket, withdrew a small package or paper, and surreptitiously handed it to Claymer Schluter.

Claymer Schluter was born July 20, 1911, at Freeport. Long Island.

Investigation of him in Washington, D. C., has reflected that Schluter has been in contact with Peter Christopher Rhodes and that he has made a number of visits to the Strategic Services Unit, War Department (formerly OSS) at Temporary Building Q. Schluter was inducted into the U. S. Army on February 19, 1941, and his military record reflects that he was attached to CIC in various parts of the United States as well as in Europe. He was separated from the U. S. Army on November 30, 1945, with the temporary rank of captain. It appears that in the recent past Schluter has been residing at his home in Freeport, Long Island. Since December 20, 1945, investigation has failed to reflect that Schluter has been in contact with the other subjects in the above case.

The State Department has now advised that the Strategic Services Unit. War Department, which is, as you will of course recall, a partial successor to the Office of Strategic Services, has requested a passport for Claymer Schluter for travel to Bucharest, Rumania, for the purpose of serving as an agent of the Strategic Services Unit. The State Department advised further that if Schluter's passport is granted he apparently will be leaving within approximately a week. The passport has not yet been issued to him and will not be issued to him without the State Department's first advising the Bureau; however, it should be noted that unless some action is taken considerable pressure may, of course, be brought to bear by the War Department to force the issuence of a passport to Schluter.

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Memorandum for the Director

Although Schluter has not been deeply involved in the above case, he is known to have been in contact with Rhodes, and while, since he left Washington and moved to his home in Freeport, New York, his activities are not known to have been particularly significant it appears that Schluter is at least to an extent involved in the above matter. In view of this, it is believed highly inadvisable that Schluter be granted a passport for the purpose of serving as an agent of the Strategic Services Unit in Bucharest, Rumania. Rumania, of course, at the present time, is occupied by Red Army troops, and the Rumanian Political Police are known to be strongly infiltrated by the NKVD. The opportunity for Schluter to effect damage in this position is incalculable, but certainly great.

ACTION:

For your approval, there is attached a personal and confidential memorandum to Lieutenant General Hoyt S. Vandenberg of the Military Intelligence Service referring him to the information concerning Schluter. There is also attached a personal and confidential memorandum to Mr. Fred Lyon of the State Department concerning this matter suggesting that Schluter should not be granted a passport, and suggesting, further, that Mr. Lyon might desire to call this matter to the attention of the Secretary of State.

In connection with the dissemination of information concerning the above case it should be noted that the CORBY Case is primarily a Canadian investigation and consequently complete unabridged summaries have not been disseminated by the Bureau, particularly in view of the express request of RMP that the information received from that Agency in this case be treated in the utmost confidence. However, summary information concerning the United States angles of the CORBY Case has been transmitted to a number of agencies noted below.

September 24, 1945: On this date memoranda briefly summarising the CORBI Case with particular reference to the American angles were sent to Eatthew Connelly at the White House, the Attorney Ceneral and Fred Lyon of the State Department.

October 19, 19h5: On this date memoranda summarizing the American angles and appropriate identifying information in connection with the COREY Case were sent to Honorabke James V. Forrestal, Secretary of the Mayy, Commodore Themas B. Inglis, Acting Director of Mayal Intelligence and Mr. Dean Acheson, Under-Secretary of State.

February 7, 1946: On this date the last summary information concerning the Cusenko case was disseminated to outside agencies by the Bureau, summary memoranda being sent under this date to Brigadier General Harry Hawkins Vaughan at the White House, Attorney General Tom C. Clark and Secretary of State, James F. Byrnes.

Andrei Ivanovich Schevchenko

A series of summary memoranda to the Attorney Queral on the Schevchenko case were transmitted on the following dates: August 31, 1945, September 6, 1945, November 2, 1945, December 15, 1945, October 30, 1945. In addition to these memoranda, several additional memoranda concerning possible proscuction of Schevchenko and other factors involved in the case were also sent to the Attorney General, but did not contain summary information and consequently are not being itemised herein.

In addition, the following memorands of a summary nature were sent to Mr. Deen Acheson, Under-Secretary of State on the following dates: Movember 2, 1945, December 17, 1945, January 4, 1946.

On September 6, 1945, a summary memorandum was transmitted to the White House setting forth pertinent facts concerning the Schevchenko Case and advising that those facts had been referred to the Attorney General for a secision regarding possible prosecution of Schevchenko.

Arthur Alexandrovich Adams

In connection with the above case it should be noted that copies of all pertinent reports were made available currently during the investigation of Arthur Alexandrovich Adams to the Manhattan Engineer District in view of the fact that Adams' principal activity was apparently directed at espionage simed at securing data concerning the atomic bomb and related matters. In addition, pertinent information concerning the Adams' case was made available in summary form at various times to the Department of Justice as set out below.

Hovember 27, 19th: On this date a menorendum summarising information concerning Adams was transmitted to the Attorney General. This memorandum particularly referred to the meeting of Adams in Chicago, Illinois, on September 25, 19th, with a scientist employed in connection with the Chicago University Research employment fission.

February 19, 1945: On this date a summary report in the Adams case dated February 12, 1945, was personally delivered to Mr. James M. McInerney of the Criminal Division of the Department, which summary report was later returned by McInerney.

December 5, 1945: On this date the summary report of February 12, 1945, was transmitted by memorandum to the Attorney General.

December 6, 1945: On this date a summary memorandum bringing the Adams case up to date was transmitted to the Attorney General.

December 10, 1945: On this date a memorandum furnishing further information on the Adams case and indicating that he might leave the United States was furnished to the Attorney Ceneral.

Reference is made to my memorandum dated March 4, 1946, concerning a conversation between Henry Morgenthau, Jr. and Silvermaster, wherein mention was made by Morgenthau that the only person who opens his, Morgenthau's, mail is Silvermaster's friend, Henrietta Klotz.

Information contained in the Bureau files reveals that Henrietta Klotz is the former personal secretary to Morgenthau when he was Secretary of the Treasury.

The Washington Field Office advised in the Silvermaster case on December 13, 1945, that on that date Henrietta Klotz contacted Helen Silvermaster, wife of Nathan Gregory Silvermaster, and advised that she was leaving the Treasury Department and was going to work for Morgenthau again at the request of Mrs.

Morgenthau. She indicated that she would move to New York City. Henrietta Klotz also contacted William Ludwig Ullmann and Ullmann advised her that he would contact Jack Field in an effort to obtain an apartment for her in New York City. During this conversation it was mentioned that Henrietta had previously worked for Mr.

Morgenthau. Henrietta Klotz is also a known contact of Harry Dexter White and was invited to be a guest at White's residence on December 14, 1945.

On December 10, 1945, information was received from the Washington Field Office in the Silvermaster case that during the course of a surveillance on the night of December 8, 1945, it was noted that an automobile bearing a license plate registered to Henrietta S. Klotz, Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Treasury, was parked in front of the Silvermaster residence. Herman Klotz, husband of Henrietta, is listed as Section Chief at the Treasury Department. While in Washington the Klotzes resided at the Westchester Apartments. A further review of the files reflects that there is no other indication that Miss Klotz has any Communistic connections or has been reported to be a Communi ACTION:

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

The informant said that Coe also sent information to Harry White, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury while he, Coe, was in South America. It was the informant's opinion that information supplied to White eventually was furnished by him to the Silvermasters. The Frank Coe mentioned above is undoubtedly Virginius Frank Coe, whe resides at 3700 - 36th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and who is presently planed to him Treasury Department. Investigation in this case has revealed that Coe is a contact of Harry White, Irving Kaplan, William Ludwig Ullmann, Abraham George Silverman and LauchlineCurrie, all subjects in instant case. 

In susmootion with the inventigation of the underground Soviet espionage erganisation (MEVO) in agencies in the United States Government, it has been assertained that Ursula Irone Wasserman, Apartment 53, 110 Christopher Street, New York, is apparently deeply implicated in Soviet intelligence operations in the United States.

It is noted that Heserman is presently in Latin America but expects to return to the shows address within the near future and that this operations is presently eccupied by her personur, Jules Korchein, also a suspected Soviet agent who has been already associated with a Soviet agent known to have been, at least as late as the fall of 1940, delivering blue prints to representatives of the MEVD for transmittal to the Soviet Union. Very recently, both Korchein and Wasserman have been in contact with a manber of strongly suspected Soviet agents and are believed to have been involved as intermediaries in the recent delivery of a political testament from France to a Matienal Americancy of the Communist Party - USA.

• UNITED 51 Morman Chandler Bursle Elisabeth Terrill Bentley, a known Soviet espionage agent whose activities included the collection of intelligence information from other agents employed in the United States Government for transmittal to the Soviet Union, has now furnished information regarding Norman Chandler Bursler and his activity in furnishing Department of Sustice reports to the Soviet Government. Morman Chandler Bursler is employed as an Expert in the Antitrust Division of the United States Department of Justice. The following is a summary of the information contained in the Bureau and Department files concerning Norman Bursler. ALLEGATIONS OF ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY On February 1, 1946, Elisabeth Terrill Bentley recalled that Helen vermaster, a principal subject in the case entitled Wathan Gregory Silvermaster, was, et al, Espionage - RM, told her that she was acquainted with Norman Bursler, an attorney in the Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, and indicated to Bentley that Bursler might be a good prospect in intelligence work. Bentley thereupon conferred with Jacob M. Golos, a Soviet agent, concerning the recruitment of Bursler but Golos indicated that he was skeptical and feared that Bursler might be a plant. Subsequently Bentley instructed Helen Silvermaster to handle Norman Bursler and arrangements were apparently made between Helen Silvermaster and Norman Bursler inasmuch as in the gummer of 1944 Bentley saw reports on German cartels among the material turned over to Bentley by the Silvermasters. Bentley also recalled that Helen Silvermaster had stated that Bursler's work in the Antitrust Division principally concerned investigations of the German cartels. Bentley indicated to Helen Silvermaster that she knew the source of the cartel reports and Helen Silvermaster admitted that they had come from Norman Bursler. Bentley recalled that when Bursler first came to her attention he was employed in the Antitrust Division in New York City, but later was inducted into the Armed Forces, served a short period and was released, resuming his employment with the Antitrust Division. Bentley has never seen or met Bursler and has no further information concerning hime BACKGROUND RECORDED

Horman Chandler Bursler was born at Wilmington, Delaware, on February 28

1938 recontacted the original informant and verified the identity of Norman Bursar.


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**Norman Bursler received his preliminary education at an elementary school in Wilmington, Delaware, as well as at Beacon Business School and at Antioch College. He also attended the Undergraduate School at the University

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of California from 1927 to 1933 and graduated with an A.B. Degree. During 1933 to 1934 and 1937 to 1938 he studied economics in the Graduate School at the University of California, receiving no degree. The employment records reflect that Morman Bursler was first employed in 1918 as an effice boy at the E. I. Dupont de Memours Company at Wilmington, Delaware. He obtained his first Government employment in October, 1931, serving as a secretary to the American Commercial Attache, Shanghai, China. He has also been employed by the National Recovery Administration, the Works Progress Administration, the United States Labor and Agriculture Departments. In August, 1938, he obtained a position as expert with the Antitrust Division, United States Department of Justice, which position he has held until this date with the exception of the period, October 22, 1942, to January 25, 1943, at which time he was in the United States Armed Forces. The New York Field Division has confidentially ascertained through the Department of Justice, Antitrust Division, New York City, that Bursler expects to resign on or about March 1, 1946, to return to private practice in Chicago, Illinois.

ALLEGATIONS OF PREVIOUS COMMUNIST PARTY AFFILIATION AND ACTIVITY



Walter Lee, campus officer, University of California, advised that his records reflect that during Bursler's stay at the University he was involved in Communistic and Socialistic activities, resulting in the agitation of students and the organisation of them into the Social Problems Club which was later known as the National Students League. His records also reflect that in an interview in 1934 Bursler stated that he had been in China in 1930 and that while there had been a member of the Communist Party.

Walter Johnson, Captain, Berkeley Police Department, made reports concerning the activities of Norman Bursler while at the University of talifornia, which reports reflect that Bursler was a member of the Berkeley Branch of the Friends of the Soviet Union and in September, 1932, attended one of their mestings and explained pictures which he had taken in the Chinese war sone during the recent Chinese-Japanese hostilities. Walter Johnson further reported that Bursler was active in the Social Problems Club, took part in demonstrations and was active in the organisation of other radical groups.

Lawrence S. Fletcher, Deputy District Attorney, Berkeley, California, advised that on February 22, 1933, members of the Social Problems Club, which included Norman Bursler, were in his office defending various individuals who were attempting to sell an alleged Communist publication known as The

Students Outpost*. According to Fletcher, this had resulted in a tear gas affray and Bursler was one of those individuals who were testifying in defense of the alleged Communists.

The County Prosecutor's Office, Alameda County, California, contains information reflecting that an individual named Norman Bursler was listed as being a Communist Party functionary in 1934. It is not known whether this individual is identical with Norman Bursler but it is noted that Bursler was in attendance at the University at that time.

Mrs. E. R. Allan, 2511 Herst Avenue, Berkeley, California, stated that Norman Bursler and Professor Brady lived in an apartment at that residence during the early portion of 1937. She further stated that Bursler was obsessed with Communistic ideas and that as late as August, 1938, Communist papers still came to that address for Norman Bursler.

Mr. Allen Buchanan, former professor of economics at the University of California and presently Chief of the Economics Section, United States Tariff Commission, and a roommate of Norman Bursler in 1938, advised that Bursler, because of his struggle for a living, had interested himself in uplifting the masses and had become very active in the Social Problems Club. Mr. Buchanan further stated that like himself, Bursler was definitely of the left wing and a great believer in the Karl Marx theory of economics.

The files of the Subversive Detail, Wilshire Station, Los Angeles Police Department, contain a letter dated September 23, 1928, addressed to Louis Schneiderman, a prominent Communist Party functionary in California at that time. The letter was from Meyer Baylie, an active Communist Party member in the Los Angeles area, and contained numerous references to the Young Communist League and other Communist Party activity. Also in the letter was information that there was no Young Communist League in Berkeley, California, was information that there was no Young Communist League in Berkeley, California, and the writer complained that he had to do all organizing work. He went on to state further, "This gives you an idea of the conditions. I find a similar condition existing among other comrades and to an excess in the case of Norman Bursler. He is a problem in himself and is living on past glory." It is not known whether this individual is identical with the Norman Bursler in this case but it is noted that Norman Bursler was in attendance at the Undergraduate School at the University of California at that time.

The files of the Office of Naval Intelligence contain information reflecting Bursler's Communist activity in the Berkeley, California, area and also set out that Bursler claims to have been employed by the American Consulate

in Shanghai and was Communist Party Secretary in Shanghai, China.

advised that the name Morman Bursler appeared on the active indices of the United Spanish Aid Committee. This committee is reported to have been organized by members of the Communist Party and is alleged to have been a Communist front organization.

RELATIONSHIP OF BURSLER WITH SUBJECTS IN THE SILVERMASTER CASE

In a personal history statement executed in Bursler's own handwriting on August 5, 1938, for the Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, Bursler set out that the person to be notified in case of emergency was Dr. Gregory Silvermaster and gave the relationship of this individual as a "friend". Also in the personal history statement Bursler listed as a reference Dr. Gregory N. Silvermaster, as well as Dr. Robert A. Brady, University of California, an individual who is known to have associated with many Communist Party members; Dr. Louis Bloch, Maritime Commission, an individual who is known to have associated with many prominent Communist Party members; Dr. Jessica Piexotto, University of California; and Dr. Gustav Seidler.

Norman Bursler was apprised of the allegations made concerning his Communist affiliation and in a five page memorandum to Mr. Thurman Arnold dated November 30, 1938, gave a general biographical sketch of himself in answer to these allegations. Pertinent portions of this memorandum include, "Here, however, I should like to deal with the few clues which you were good enough to give me concerning these allegations. You asked me to tell you where I was on November 7 (election day) 1936. I was in Washington. I worked all day long at the Consumers Project, Department of Labor, with offices in the Keith-Albee Building, 15th and G Streets, Northwest. I shared an office with Harry Meremus. After work I went for dinner at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster who lived in an apartment at that time at 3217 Connecticut Avenue. Others in the party were Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster, Boris Witte, a member of the Russian aristocracy, and William L. Ullmann. " It is pointed out that Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster are among the principal subjects in a Soviet espionage investigation and that William Ullmann is also one of the principal subjects in this investigation. Bursler also points out in his memorandum that he had read the "Communist Manifesto" as required reading in his political science class at the University of California, and that he had attended lectures and forums by various radical groups in the Bay City.

The Department files also contain a letter dated December 5, 1938, from Nathan Gregory Silvermaster, Senior Economist, Maritime Labor Board, 65-56403-620 Washington, D. C., to Mr. Thurman Arnold. A portion of this letter is quoted as follows:

"I met Mr. Bursler in the office of Professor Robert Brady, University of California, who recommended Mr. Bursler to me as a person of unusual ability and of sterling personal qualities. Since 1935 I have had the opportunity to know Mr. Bursler more intimately as he has been a frequent visitor in my home. I believe, therefore, that I am in a position to express an opinion as to his social-political views."

The files of the Department of Justice reflect that Norman Bursler has been a member of various search teams sent to the European Theater to investigate the German cartels. Included in the reports submitted to the Department by Bursler is a confidential interim report dated September 18, 1943, on "The Iron and Steel Industry: Activities of European Cartel Members in South America." It is noted that Elizabeth Terrill Bentley advised that she had seen reports on German cartels among material turned over to her by the Silvermasters in the Summer of 1944.

SUGGESTED ACTION

As you will recall a complete detailed memorandum relating to the Silvermaster case is being prepared for distribution to the White House, Mr. Fred Lyon of the State Department and the Attorney General. However, since Norman Bursler is the first employee of the Department of Justice figuring in this investigation, it is thought that you might desire to discuss his involvement personally with the Attorney General and there is attached a blind memorandum covering Bursler's activity and Communist background which you may desire to furnish to the Attorney General. There is also attached hereto a memorandum setting out the complete activity and background of Bursler with the sources identified which, if you approve, will be furnished to the New York and Washington Field Divisions with instructions for appropriate investigation of Bursler in connection with the Silvermaster case.

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley further recalled that Helen Silvermaster had advised that Bursler's work in the Antitrust Division principally concerned investigation of German cartels. Bentley indicated to Helen Silvermaster that she knew the source of the cartel reports and Helen Silvermaster admitted that they had come from Norman Bursler.


According to Bentley when Bursler first came to her attention he was employed by the Antitrust Division in New York City but was subsequently inducted into the Armed Forces, served a short time, and was released, resuming his employment with the Antitrust Division, Department of Justice. Elizabeth Terrill Rentlev advised that she has never seen or met Norman Bursler and possesses no further knowledge concerning him.

Personal History



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The files of the Wilmington Police Department and local courts fail to reflect any record relating to Norman Chandler Bursler.




Education

According to information furnished by Norman Chandler Bursler in applications for employment and elsewhere, he received his preliminary education in the elementary schools in Wilmington, Delaware, at Beacon Business School, Wilmington, Delaware, and Antioch College in the year 1929.

The records of the Registrar, University of California, reflect that Bursler attended that University from January, 1927, through May 11, 1933, at


which time he received an A.B. Degree. Bursler also attended the University of California Graduate School during the term 1933 - 1934 and the term 1937 - 1938, at which time he took courses in economics.

The files of the Department of Justice reflect that Bursler has been employed as an expert on a temporary basis and that his employment has been continued at the expiration of each three months period.

ALLEGATIONS OF PREVIOUS COMMUNIST PARTY AFFILIATION AND ACTIVITY



Walter Lee, campus officer, University of California, advised that his records reflect that Bursler was involved in Communistic and Socialistic activities during the time he was a student at the University of California. According to Walter Lee, these activities resulted in the agitation of the students, and an attempt to organize them under a Social Problems Club, which club was later known as the National Students League. Walter Lee advised that although Bursler himself was not a firey speaker he was more of the "mousy" type and was active in an underhanded way. Walter Lee also advised that his records reflect an interview in 1934 with Norman Bursler at which time Bursler

stated of his own accord that he, Bursler, had been in China in 1930 and while there had been a member of the Communist Party and "on a few occasions delivered messages from the United States Consulate to the war ships in the bay during the Chinese - Japanese hostilities."

Walter Johnson, Captain, Berkeley Police Department, has stated that his files reflect a report made by him on March 27, 1933, which report contains the following information: "Bursler is definitely reported to be a Communist but not of the outspoken type, being a quiet worker and one of the leaders in the Social Problems Club. He is a member of the Berkeley Branch of the Friends of the Soviet Union and in September, 1932, attended one of their meetings and explained pictures he had taken in the Chinese war sone during the recent Chinese-Japanese hostilities." The report further states, "Bursler is reported to have traveled through Russia at the same time and contacted another Berkeley radical on his trip. He attended the Tom Mooney meeting at San Francisco on November 6, 1932. Although unquestionably a Communist, Bursler is not active in an obvious way, being a quiet worker for the movement."

Also contained in the files of the Berkeley Police Department is a report by J. W. Johnson, dated March 24, 1933, which contains the following information: "Norman Bursler, University of California student who has been active in the Soviet Problems Club for sometime, is very active in the branch of the Friends of the Soviet Union. Bursler is reported to have lived with Professor A. Buchanan of the Economics Department of the University at 2630 Benvenue. He was one of the leaders in the demonstration at Satherd Gate at the time the Japanese training squadron visited Berkeley. In addition Bursler is reported to be organizing another group of radicals independent of the Friends of the Soviet Union and the Social Problems Club. This group is composed of University and Berkeley high school students. Meetings are held regularly but the meeting place is not known at present. Bursler recently told Mrs. Esther Kennedy, 2429 Channing Way, that within three years this club will be working in the grammar schools."

Also contained in the files of the Berkeley Police Department is a memorandum to Chief J. A. Greening, dated September 26, 1933, reflecting that Lawrence S. Fletcher, Deputy District Attorney, advised on February 22, 1933, that a group of members of the Social Problems Club had been in his office concerning a complaint which had been issued regarding Frank M. Freck, Alfred R. Hahn, Veldnirir Kositsin, S. R. Maas and other unknown individuals. Norman Bursler was among the group. According to the memorandum, it appeared that a complaint had been made as a result of a tear gas affray resulting from an effort on the part of Alfred Van Tassell and Julius Ratner to sell an alleged Communist publication known as the "Students Outpost." Norman Bursler appeared and advised that he did not see the altercation but arrived ten minutes later and that a great deal of gaseous substance was in the air. The memorandum stated that Bursler was attempting to defend his friends in this Communist movement.

The records of the County Prosecutor's Office, Alameda County, California, contained a list of individuals who were known to that office as Communist Party functionaries. Included in this list is the name Norman Bursler and beside his name appears the notation #1934*. It is not known whether this person is identical with the subject but it is noted that Bursler was in attendance in the Graduate School of the University of California during the year 1934.


Mrs. E. R. Allan, manager of an apartment house located at 2511. This letter makes numerous references to the Young Communist League and the fact that the writer has spoken at state meetings, and obtained Communist Party signatures on petitions during election campaigns. The letter also mentions that there was at that time no Young Communist League in Berkeley, California, and continues: "I am more or less at large and called on to do work by anyone who needs help. I am willing to do work. This gives you an idea of conditions. I find a similar condition existing among other comrades and to an excess in the case of Norman Bursler. He is a problem by himself and is living on past glory." The letter continues without any further reference to Bursler. It was signed "Comradely yours", and contained the postscript "Regards to all the comrades." It is not known whether the individual mentioned in this letter is identical with Norman Chandler Bursler but it is noted that Bursler was in attendance in the Undergraduate School of

the University of California from January, 1927, to May, 1933.

Spanish Aid Committee contained the name Norman Bursler. This organization by was formed by known Communists and was alleged to be composed primarily of members of the Communist Party.



The Office of Naval Intelligence provided the following information concerning Norman Bursler: "Subject is presently employed in the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice in Washington, D. C. Information in the files of DIO-12ND reveal subject attended the University of California, Berkeley, California, intermittently between January 1, 1927, and 1938, obtaining his A.B. Degree in 1933 and studying economics in the Graduate Department from 1935 to 1938, receiving no degree. The files of the Berkeley Police Department list subject as a suspected Communist; active in the Friends of the Soviet Union and one of the organizers of the Social Problems Club (later a chapter of the National Students League), a suspected Communist Party front. Subject visited China during 1931 and 1932. He claims to have been employed by the American Consulate in Shanghai and Communist Party Secretary in Shanghai."

RELATIONSHIP OF BURSLER WITH SUBJECTS IN THE SILVERMASTER CASE

In a personal history statement prepared by Norman Bursler in his own handwriting for the Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, on August 5, 1938, the person to be notified in case of emergency was listed by Bursler as

Dr. Gregory Silvermaster, 3630 Jocelyn Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C. The relationship of this individual was set out by Bursler as "friend".

Also contained in the same personal history statement was a list of "references to persons well qualified to judge as to your fitness to the position sought." Bursler set out the following references: Dr. Robert A. Brady, Department of Economics, University of California, Berkeley, California; Dr. Gregory N. Silvermaster, Labor Relations Adviser, Federal Security Aministration, Washington, D. C.; Dr. Louis Bloch, Labor Relations Adviser, Maritime Commission, Washington, D. C.; Dr. Jessica Peixotto, Professor of Economics, University of California, Berkeley, California; Dr. Gustav Seidler, Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. Concerning the references above the following information is noted; Dr. Robert A. Brady is a known associate of many prominent Communist Party members. Dr. Gregory N. Silvermaster is a principal subject of the present Soviet espionage investigation and Dr. Louis Bloch is a known associate of many Communist Party members.

The Department of Justice files reflect that Norman Bursler was advised that questions had been raised concerning his Communist affiliation and by a five page memorandum to Mr. Thurman Arnold dated November 30, 1938, Norman Bursler set out a biographical sketch of himself in answer to the allegations. The following pertinent paragraph is quoted:

"Later on I will deal at more length about my genealogical education and my experience. Here, however, I should like to deal with the few clues which you were good enough to give me concerning these allegations. You asked me to tell you where I was on November 7 (election day) 1936. I was in Washington. I worked all day long at the Consumers Project, Department of Labor, with offices in the Keith-Albee Building, 15th and G Streets, North-west. I snared an office with Harry Meremus. After work I went for dinner at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster, who lived in an apartment at that time at 3217 Connecticut Avenue. Others in the party were Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster, Boris Witte, a member of the Russian aristocracy, and William L. Ullmann. After dinner the Silvermasters went to the home of James Newall Blair, son of former Assistant Attorney General Harry Blair. However, I remained in the apartment listening to the radio and playing chess until they returned later in the evening."

It is further noted that members in the party with Bursler were Dr. and Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster, principal subjects in the present Soviet espionage investigation. Boris Witte who Bursler identified as a member of the Bussian aristocracy and William L. Ullmann who is also a subject in the

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Silvermaster investigation. A further pertinent portion of Bursler's memorandum is quoted as follows:

University and went to Shanghai, China, where I secured a position as secretary to the American Commercial Attache. This position I held from October, 1931 until June, 1932 when I returned via Europe to the United States and completed my senior year, graduating as an economics major in May, 1933.

"Later at the University in pursuit of my economics studies, I had assignments in Marx's capital. Many times I tried to read it and found the book so dry I could never get past the first few chapters. At the University we were encouraged to consider all sides of political and social questions. Even Dr. Barrows requested his political science classes to read the 'Communist Manifesto'. The University brought Norman Thomas to the campus and arranged a debate between him and Chester Roll in the men's gymnasium before 5000 students. I attended all such affairs.

*From time to time I attended lectures and forums by as many of the various radical groups in the Bay City as time and opportunity permitted and heard Marx expounded from as many viewpoints as there were groups."

The Department files also reflect a letter written on the stationery of the Maritime Labor Board, Washington, D. C., and dated December 5, 1938, to Mr. Thurman W. Arnold, Assistant Attorney General, from Nathan Gregory Silvermaster. This letter is quoted as follows:

"Dear Mr. Arnold:

I am writing this letter in behalf of Mr. Norman Bursler employed in the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice who apparently has been the victim of slanderous accusations of being a 'Red'.

I met Mr. Bursler at the house of Professor Robert Brady, University of California, who recommended Mr. Bursler to me as a person of unusual ability and of sterling personal qualities. Since 1935 I have had the opportunity to know Mr. Bursler more intimately as he has been a frequent visitor at my home. I believe, therefore, I am in a position to express an opinion as to his social-political views.

I would characterize Mr. Bursler as an ardent New Dealer and only in this sense can he be accused of being a Red. I am convinced Mr. Bursler could be classed as second to none in his devotion and loyalty to our Constitution."

In October, 1938, Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster, 3630 Joselyn Street, was interviewed and at that time she advised that Norman Bursler resided in her home for several weeks early in June of 1938 when he came from California to accept a position with the Government. She stated that she had known Bursler during the past six or seven years dating from his attendance at the University of California where her husband was a professor. She further stated that she knew nothing of a derogatory nature which would be considered against his obtaining employment with the Government. She considered him a most admirable person and deserving of all the assistance she could give him.

The Bureau's files reflect that a confidential interim report dated September 18, 1943, on "The Iron and Steel Industry; Activities of European Cartel Members in South America" was submitted by Norman Bursler, Economic Warfare Section, Department of Justice, New York, New York. It is pointed out that Elizabeth Terrill Bentley advised that in the Summer of 1944 she saw reports on German cartels among material turned ever to her by the Silvermasters. The Bureau's files also reflect that on October 31, 1944, Norman Bursler submitted a confidential report entitled "Restricted Report on Aspects of German Economic Warfare as Prelude to Military Aggression." The files further reflect that Bursler was in April, 1945, a member of the Search Team operating in Germany, and the files further reflect that Norman Bursler has taken part in other search teams investigating German cartels and on at least one of these occasions he was given the simulated rank of Major in the United States Army in order to carry out the assignment.

The New York Field Division has confidentially determined that the Antitrust Division Department of Justice, New York City, advised Norman Bursler is presently employed in that city but expects to resign March 1, 1946, and engage in private business in Chicago, Illinois.

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Gregory, a known Soviet espienage agent operating in the United states, collected intelligence information from other agents who were employees In United States Government Departments. These individuals furnished confidential information from Government files, and this information was in turn given by Bregory to Jacob M. Soles, a Seviet espionage agent who furnished it to the Boviet Government, Morman Chandler Bureler, an employee of the Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, according to Gregory, has furnished confidential Department of Justice reports to this espionage group and the following is a businery of his activity as well as the information contained in the Pederal Bureau of Investigation and the Department of Justice files concerning Norman

Source has indicated that Bursler during his stay at the University of California was involved in Communistic and Socialistic activities resulting in the agitation of students and the attempt to organise them under the Social Problems Club which was later known as the Mational Students League. Bursler also on his sum accord admitted he had been in China in 1930 and while there had been a member of the Communist Party.

Another reliable and confidential source advised that Norman Bursler was a member of the Friends of the Soviet Union and in September, 1932, attended one of their meetings and explained pictures he had taken in the Chinese war some during the Chinese hostilities. This same source indicated that Bursler was one of the leaders in demonstrations on the campus of the University of California and was among those members of the Social Problems Club who same to the defense of two individuals who had been tear gased in an affray resulting from an effort to sell a Communist publication known as The

A further confidential source revealed that Morman Bursler received Communist papers and that as late as August, 1938, these papers came to 2511 Heret Avenue, Berkeley, California, addressed to Morman Bursler.

Also from a confidential source it has been ascertained that a letter written by Mayer Baylie, a Communist Party functionary in the Los Angeles area, to Louis Schneiderman, a Communist Party functionary, dated September 23, 1928, spoke of the activities of the members of the Young Communist League and the unit that no League existed in Berkeley, California. The writer also complained hat he was forced to do the work of others and stated, Wiffind a similar (1)
