

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



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Material from White's unit of the Treasury Department was taken to the Silvermaster residence and there photographed or the substance extracted for delivery to Bentley, who as a Soviet courier delivered it to Jacob M. Golos, New York City. Although Golos died on November 27, 1943, she continued this activity as a courier until the Fall of 1944, when she was released from her duties as such. During the latter period of her courier activities, she passed this material through an unidentified individual to a Russian who has been identified as Anatole Sorisovich Gromov. Gromov was the First Secretary of the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C. until December 7, 1945, when he returned to Russia. An intensive investigation has been made of all the individuals mentioned by Miss Bentley, White and those with whom he was stated to be directly affiliated in these sinister activities.

### CONSIDERATIONS

Although distribution of Miss Bentley's information, plus the results of the investigation to date, has not been distributed in detail to any other



Obviously the persons entitled to this information are the President and the Secretary of State. It is not believed, however, that this Bureau, until after advice to those individuals, can efficially authorize British Intelligence to brief the British and Canadian delegates to the International Monetary Fund on this matter. C. White which came into his possession as a result of his official capacity allegedly was made available through intermediaries to Watham Gregory Silvernaster, his wife, Helen Witte Silvernaster, and William Ludwig Ullmann. Both Silvernaster and Ullmann are employees of the White States Treasury Department, reportedly directly under the supervision of White.

The information and deciments originating in the Treasury Department were either passed on in substance or photographed by Ullmann in a well-equipped laboratory in the basement of the Silvermaster home. Following this step, the material was taken to New York City by courier and made available to Jacob E. Golos, until the time of his death on Hovember 27, 1943. Golos, a known Soviet agent, delivered this material to an individual tentatively identified as Gaik Ovakimian. Ovakimian you will recall was arrested some years ago as an unregistered agent of the Soviet Government and subsequently, by special arrangements with the Department of State, was permitted to return to the USSR.

After the departure of Gaik Ovakimian, Golos delivered his material to an indicidual who has been tentatively identified as Dr. Abraham Benshict Teinstein. Subsequent to the death of Golos, the courier handling material received from the Silvermasters and Ullmann delivered it through an unidentified individual to Anatole Borisovich Gromov, who until December 7, 1915, was assigned as First Secretary of the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D. C., when he returned to the USSR. Gromov had previously been under suspicion as the successor to Vassili Zubilin, reported head of the NKVD in Korth America, who returned to Moscow in the Inte summer of 1914. This whole network has been under intensive investigation since November, 1915, and it is the results of these efforts that I am now able to make available to you.

It is further commented by my Canadian source that if White is placed in either of these positions, he would have the power to influence to a great degree deliberations on all international financial arrangements.

This source, which is apparently sware of at least some of the inharges incorporated in the attached memorandum against White, commented that the Loyalty of white must be assured, particularly in view of the fact that the USSR has not ratified the Bretton Boods agreement. Fear was expressed that facts might come to light in the future throwing some sinister accusations at white and thereby jeopardize the successful operation of these important international financial institutions.


I thought you would be particularly interested in the above comments, which originated with sources high-placed in the Canadian Government, on the subject at hand.

This morning, in response to a request from the Attorney Generally. Surple I visited with him in his office. The purpose of the interview was unknown to me in advance, however, he stated that he desired to discuss with me the matter of N. Gregory Silvermaster, war Assets Corporation with the employee whose background and reputation are known to you. The Attorney General stated that yesterday the President had discussed this matter with him, expressing considerable concern. Mr. Clark desired to discuss this matter with me with a view toward ascertaining whether we were fully informed as to Silvermaster's background and further, as to what action, if any, we contemplated taking in connection therewith. The Attorney General also stated that he did not know whether or not you had discussed this matter with me.

I advised Mr. Clark that I had had the opportunity of discussing this matter with you and that as a result thereof, I was fully apprised as to Silvermaster's background. I also advised him as to the action contemplated by the War Assets Corporation, namely the removal of Silvermaster from his current key position. Mr. Clark, referring to Silvermaster's apparent association with Mr. Morgenthau, inquired as to whether mere removal of Silvermaster from his present prominent status would suffice. I advised that such action was not considered the ideal solution and that if the consideration involved could be confined to our own particular problem in War Assets Corporation, more drastic action might appear to be advisable, but that in taking any action at this time it was necessary that consideration be given to avoid creating a situation which might interfere with the intensive investigation currently being conducted relative to matters of greater national significance.

Mr. Clark agreed that this appeared to represent the best solution at this time. He stated that he was happy to know that we were fully cognizant of this situation and undertaking all advisable steps to correct it.

During the course of my conversation with the Attorney General, I did not make any mention of the fact that confidential memoranda submitted by you to General Wanghan had found their way through unusual channels into our possession.

For your additional information, I have further ascurated this matter with General Gregory and General Gregos poriot, the latter being Deputy Administrator within whose immediate purview falls Silvermaster's current field of War Asset operations. They have accepted completely the recommendation I discussed with you yesterday and are arranging to effectuate that recommendation as soon as possible. They have also agreed that prior to making any definite comments as to a successor for Silvermaster, they will afford us the opportunity of making a background check on him.

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
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#### Memorandum to the Director

Relative to the selection of an economic expert to replace Silvermaster, in response to the Attorney General's inquiry, I advised that it was my understanding that General Gregory felt it would be necessary to obtain the services of someone prominent in that field who was not currently connected with War Assets. In this connection, the Attorney General suggested that we might give consideration to George Comer, currently with the Department of Justice or to Corwin Edwards, currently attached to Northwestern University and who formerly taught at Harvard and Yale Universities after being associated with the Department of Justice. I told Mr. Clark that I had been informed that General Gregory felt that one of only three or four of the outstanding economic experts in this country would qualify for this position and that I would be happy to make mention of Messrs. Comer and Edwards to General Gregory for his consideration.

You will be kept currently advised of all significant developments in connection with this matter.

DETAILS:

All investigation reported in this report was conducted by several different agents assigned to the Newark Office, and these agents will be named in connection with each of the investigations reported herein.

I. DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON, with aliases,
A. STREET, A. WILSON STREET, ABRAM WOLFSON

Referenced telephone call from the New York Office to Newark dated December 6, 1945, was a call from Special Agent EDWARD DOOLEY, of New York, to Special Agent WILLIAM H. McLAUGHLIN, of Newark, wherein it was requested that the listing for a 1945 New Jersey license E/J 20 H be determined, and that a surveillance be instituted in the vicinity of the home of this automobile in order to cover the activities of one HARRY WHITE who had entered the car bearing that license.

It is noted that the records of the Motor Vehicle Department, in Trenton, New Jersey, reflect that this automobile is registered in the name of DR. ARRAHAM WOLFSON, 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. More detailed information concerning the surveillance will be set out hereinafter.

By teletype dated January 8, 1946, the Washington Field Office advised that a highly confidential source had indicated that DR.

ABE MOLESON. Medical Tower Building, Newark, New Jersey, is a brother-in-law of the wife of HARRY DEXTER WHITE, one of the principal subjects in the instant investigation. This teletype stated that indices in the Washington Field Office reflected that one ABE WOLFSON, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey, was in 1940 listed as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. The teletype requested background and identifying information regarding DR. ABE WOLFSON.

#### A. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The files of Local Board #13, 61 North Munn Street, East Orange, New Jersey, as made available by MR. M. P. STEVENS, Chief Clerk, contained the following information:

ABRAHAM WOLFSON registered for Selective Service on April 27, 1942, at which time he resided at 33 Washington Street, East Orange,

New Jersey. He was born on April 28, 1894, in Odessa, Russia. He is a dentist by occupation, having effices in the Medical Towers, Newark, New Jersey.

WOIFSON'S pecupational questionnaire, dated June 25, 1942, reflects that he is a citizen of the United States, having been naturalized. His education was listed as a graduate of grammar and high schools and three years of college. He described his occupation therein as orthodontist dentist. His dental experience was given as 25 years. His business address he furnished as 51 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey. He began his occupation in July, 1917. His next best job for which he is fitted he described as that of personnel training of dentists, at which he has had four years' experience, beginning in 1938. From the Selective Service file the following description was obtained:

Local Board #13, East Orange, New Jersey, at a later date obtained the information that WOLFSON'S petition for naturalization No. 491586 was filed on July 18, 1914, in the special term of the Supreme Court, in New York City. The Selective Service file also reflects that in October of 1944, WOLFSON resided at 27 Elizabeth Avenue, Newark, New Jersey.

The records of the Retail Merchants Credit Bureau, Newark, New Jersey, contained the information that IR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON is approximately 42 years of age, and his wife's name is RUTH, age approximately 45, both in 1940. They have two daughters. At that time, they were residing at 55 Washington Street, East Orange, New Jersey. He is a dentist, having practiced for 18 years in the Medical Towers, 51 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey.

The records at the Newark, New Jersey, Police Department and the East Orange, New Jersey, Police Department were checked with negative results concerning WOLFSON.

Investigation conducted by Special Agent CHARLES M. JOHNSON, of the New York Office, and reported in a report earrying WOLFTON as the subject, dated December 13, 1944, reveals the following:



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At the Office of the Clerk of the Court, Supreme Court, New York City, the naturalization records were examined, and they revealed that Certificate of Naturalization No. 491586 bore the notation "Issued as duplicate of Certificate No. 349771 to JOSEPH WOLFSON as per Departmental letter C 549771, dated June 20, 1914." Certificate of Naturalization No. 349771 reflects that this certificate was issued on March 10, 1913, to JOSEPH WOLFSON pursuant to a petition filed November 27, 1912. Petition for Naturalization No. 24670 filed on November 27, 1912, reflects that the petitioner was JOSEPH WOLFSON, 47 Essex Street, New York City, who was born August 10, 1871, in Odessa, Russia. The petitioner stated he arrived in New York City on July 17, 1904, accompanied by his wife who was also born in Russia. The petitioner listed the following children:

ABRAM, born May 12, 1894 in Russia MARY, born February 14, 1896 in Russia JUNE, born June 14, 1898 in Russia RAY, born March 16, 1902 in Russia FANNY, born December 26, 1906 in New York City

The "Newark Star Ledger," a newspaper of Newark, New Jersey, on Thursday, May 18, 1944, carried the following quoted article concerning IR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON:

### "ALIMONY

"Wife of Doctor Granted \$55. Weekly

Orange, an instructor at Teachers' College, Columbia University, was awarded \$55 a week temporary alimony while she uses the 13-room home and \$75 a week when she leaves to settle in New York, under an order by Advisory Master Dougal Herr in Elizabeth yesterday. The award is effective pending outcome of her divorce suit. She alleges desertion in her suit against Dr. Abraham Wolfson, an orthodontist in the Medical Tower.

"The court allowed \$1,500 fee to her counsel, David H. Yonneff, and court costs.

"Mrs. Wolfson, who claims the doctor left her in December, 1941, said he nots \$21,000 a year, which he denies. They have been married 27 years and lived at the East Orange address 21 years. They have two daughters, Anne, married and living in New York, and Beatrice, a college student.

"Mrs. Wolfson claimed Dr. Wolfson visited her brothe Leon Terry and the latter's wife, Rose, at 16 Johnson Ave.,

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April 9 and outlined the terms he would be willing to make with his estranged wife. They said, according to her affidavit, he told them he would give her \$4,500 a year alimony; \$10,000 life insurance but she must pay the premiums; \$2,600 for future education for Beatrice and \$2,600 toward her dowery, and \$2,500 counsel fee.

"Wolfson claims his wife can support herself by teaching. She teaches personality analysis and psychology.


"Israel B. Greene, represented Dr. Wolfbon.

It is to be noted in the above quoted article that WOLFSON'S wife is mentioned as being a sister of LEON TERRY. The indices in the Newark Office reflected that LEON TERRY is a member of the Communist Party.

The current City Directories in Newark, New Jersey, list DR. ABRAHAM WOLFBON as being an orthodentist in Room 804, 31 Lincoln Tark, Newark, New Jersey. It indicates that his home is in East Orange, New Jersey.

As was noted in the introduction above the records of the Motor Vehicle Department in Trenton, New Jersey, reflect that WOLFSON in 1945 resided at 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, New Jersey.

B. EVIDENCE OF COMMUNIST PARTY AND COMMUNIST POLITICAL ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP

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#### C. COMMUNIST ACTIVITIES

On December 7, 1943, a physical surveillance was instituted by Special Agent LEROY W. GREEN and the writer at the home of LESTER LAWRENCE, who in the fall of 1943 was a candidate for State Assembly in New Jersey on the Communist Party ticket. At 7:15 p.m., on that day a gray Chrysler sedan, license E/J 304 for 1943, arrived at the scene and the driver entered the home of LESTER LAWRENCE, 307 Norfolk Street, Newark, New Jersey. It was later determined that this automobile was registered in the name of DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON, 33 Washington Street, East Orange, New Jersey. By observation it was determined that the driver of this automobile was approximately 5' 6" tall, weighed 175 pounds, had dark complexion, and a small mustache.

On January 25, 1944, Confidential Informant T-4 reported that a gray 1940 Chrysler sedan, bearing New Jersey license 1945 E/J 304, arrived in the vicinity of the Third Ward Headquarters of the Communist Party, 59 Beacon Street, Newark, New Jersey. It is noted that this auto was registered in the name of DR. ABRAHAM HOLFSON, 33 Washington Street, East Orange, New Jersey. This auto carried two men, both of whom entered the meetingplace of the Third Ward Branch of the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant T-5 reported that the name of A.

STREET appeared on a chart maintained in the Third Ward Branch Headquarters of the Communist Party in September, 1944, at 230 Springfield Avenue,
Newark, New Jersey. This chart was entitled "1944 Campaign Fund for Victory." This chart contained numerous names of persons and the amount of money each person pledged for the drive. The chart indicated that A.

STREET had contributed \$100. in the drive.

# D. AFFILIATIONS WITH COMMUNIST FRONT AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

1. NATIONAL FEDERATION FOR CONSTITUTIONAL LIBERTIES

Confidential Informant T-13 reported that the name of IR.

ABRAHAM WOLFSON, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey, appeared in the indices of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties as of 1941.

## 2. GOUNCIL FOR PAN-AMERICAN DEMOCRACY

The "Daily Worker" under date of July 17, 1943, Page 2, Column 6, carried a story in which it was noted by the Council for Pan-American Democracy that IR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON was one of the signers of a letter addressed to the White House asking that the sentence of DON PEDRO ALBIZO CAMPOS, President of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico be commuted.

# 3. CIVIL LIBERTIES UNION

Confidential Informant T-14 advised that the name of DR.

A. WOIFSON appeared on the letterhead of stationery of the New Jersey
Civil Liberties Union as being a member of the Executive Board of that
erganization. The informant reported that this letter was dated in May,
1940, and bore the netation that the New Jersey organization was affiliated
with the American Civil Liberties Union. The informant also advised that
DR. A. WOIFSON, of the Medical Towers, Newark, New Jersey, was carried
in the indices of this erganization. The informant also indicate that
WOIFSON had made his dues payments both to the State and Mation organizations in 1937, 1938, and 1939.



# 4. POINT ANTI-PASCIST REFUGEE COMMITTEE

Confidential Informant T-15 reported in January, 1944, that IR. A. WOLFSON, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey, was carried on the records of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee as a contributor and supporter to that organization.

5. DEFENSE COMMITTEE FOR CIVIL RIGHTS FOR COMMUNISTS

Confidential Informant T-16 advised that the

### 6. SCHAPPES DEFENSE COMMITTEE

The "New York Times" for October 9, 1944, and the "New York Sun" for September 27, 1944, each carried a three-quarter page paid political advertisement by the Schappes Defense Committee. This advertisement was captioned "An Open Letter to Governor Thomas E. Dewey."

The purpose of the advertisement was to urge that the Governor of New York pardon MCRRIS UNSCHAPPES who was serving a sentence for perjury which was a result of his testimony before the Rapp Coudert Committee which investigated Communism in the New York City School System. This advertisement carried the names of over 250 signers, among whom was DR. ARRAHAM WOLFSON, who was described as President of the Jewish Social Service Bureau, Newark. The explanation was made in the advertisement that the names of organizations were supplied for identification only.

Confidential Informant T-17 advised that DR. A. WOLFSON, Medical Tower, Newark, New Jersey, was one of many individuals who directed letters, postcards, and telegrams to Governor THOMAS E. DEWEY appealing for Executive elemency for MCRRIS U. SCHAPPES.

### 7. OPPOSITION TO THE DIES COMMITTEE

The Newark files centain a photestat of a message directed to the House of Representatives, dated in January, 1943, and captioned "Message to the House of Representatives" which urges that bedy to discentinue the Dies Committee. One of the numerous persons listed as signing this message was DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON, President, Jewish Social Service Bureau, Newark, New Jersey. This statement also set forth that the organizations were listed for identification purposes only.

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## 8. NEW JERSEY LABOR SCHOOL

As was set forth previously in this report DR. WOLFSON was under consideration by the executive efficials of the New Jersey Laber School for the position of trustee for that school.

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9. THE AMERICAN COMMITTEE FOR THE SETTLEMENT OF JEWS IN BIRO-BIDJAN, INC.

The "Newark Evening News" for February 19, 1945, centains a news item concerning a dinner for the purpose of raising funds held by the Newark Ambijan Committee. This dinner was held on February 18, 1945. The article states that the Ambijan Committee is also known as the American Committee for the Settlement of Jews in Biro-Bidjan, Inc. The article continues that DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON was toastmaster. Among the speakers were WILLIAM S. GAILMOR and Soviet Vice Consul General D. H. MIKAILOV. The Russian Consul General EUGEND-KISSELEV was scheduled to speak but he was unable to be in attendance.

A letterhead of the Newark Ambijan Committee contained in the Newark Field Division files lists DR. A. WILSON as one of the sponsors of this committee.

# 10. RUSSIAN WAR RELIEF

As was previously stated in this report. Confidential

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An article appearing in the "Newark Evening News" for March 25, 1944, cencerns a proposed recital to be sponsored by the Russian War Relief in Newark, New Jersey. This article states that IR. ARRAHAM WOLFSON will preside and speak on behalf of the Russian War Relief kit campaign. The article states further that the Essex County Committee of RWR during that week would ship more than 600 filled kits to the New York warehouse from where they will be sent to Russian families retring to recaptured towns.

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## 11 WASHINGTON COMMITTEE FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION

The teletype from Washington Field to Newark dated January 8, 1946, which was referred to at the beginning of this contion concerning WOLFSON, contains the information that the indices of the Washington Field Office reflect that one ABE WOLFSON, 31 Lincoln Park, Newark, New Jersey, was in 1940, listed as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. It is noted that the address 31 Lincoln Park is the same as the Medical Tower Building in Newark.

### 12. WELFARE COUNCIL OF MEWARK

An article appearing in the "Newark Sunday Call" for December 10, 1944, concerns a holiday tea scheduled for December 21st of that year to be held at the Diocesan House, 24 Rector Street, Newark, New Jersey. The article sets forth that the tea is sponsored by the Welfare Council of Newark for the personnel of its 100 member agencies. Among the members of the Executive Committee mentioned in the article is one DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON.

### E. ASSOCIATION WITH HARRY DEXTER WHITE

The telephone call from the New York Office to the Newark Office on December 6, 1945, mentioned at the beginning of this section concerning WOLFSON, requested that the identity of New Jersey 1945 license E/J 20 H be determined. As was stated, the records at the State Motor Vehicle Department, Trenton, New Jersey, reflect that this auto is registered in the name of DR. ABRAHAM WOLFSON, 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. The auto is a 1940 gray Chrysler sedan. DR. WOLFSON has a 1945 New Jersey license No. 911234, and is described thereon as follows:

A check of the current Newark City Directory reveals that 51 Berkeley Avenue is the home of MAXMELL M. ALBACH, who is a lawyer at 60 Park Place, Newark, New Jersey. This law firm is listed in the name of Ruback and Albach. The directory also indicates that MAXMELL ALBACH'S wife is EMMA S ALBACH.





A check of the Newark Field Division indices contains a reference to MAX AIBACH appearing in a newspaper article in the "New Jersey Herald News," a Megro newspaper in this state. This article concerns a panel forum conducted by the Newark Mational Association for the Advancement of Colored People at the St. Jehn's M. E. Church during September, 1944. The article was dated September 22, 1944. Attorney MAX AIBACH was one of the speakers at this forum. The following is a pertinent quotation from this article concerning the discussion by Attorney AIBACH:

"Attorney ALBACH apparently became angered over revolutions of mental conflicts between the Negroes and Jews over the issue of exploitation, and, taking a cue from Lett's (HARCHDALETT, of the Urban League) misconstruction of the critics' statements, he said the critics were 'suckers,' in the sense that they were allowing themselves to be victimized by Nazi propaganda. Lett had earlier used the word 'suckers' in pointing out the majority groups made 'suckers' out of minority groups by keeping them fighting each ether.

"Albach took issue with Webber's (HARRY B MEBBER of the Herald News) statement that exploitations were long before the war had caused this condition and Hitler propaganda was not the basic cause. Albach insisted foreign propaganda was the cause of clashes between the minerity groups."

MISS MARY ADAMS, a known Communist and active in the American Youth for Democracy, was also a speaker at this forum.

Concerning EMMA S. ALBACH, Newark indices reflect that Confidential Informant T-17 advised that one EMMA S. ALBACH, 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, New Jersey, was one of several individuals who had sent letters, postcards, and telegrams to Governor THOMAS E. DEWEY appealing for Executive clemency for MCRRIS U. SCHAPPES. U

These indices also reveal that according to Confidential Informant T-18 JEMMA AIBACH, 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, is known to PHILIP and HANNAULEVY who are subjects of an Internal Security - R case in the Newark Office.

Confidential Informant T-19 advised that EMMA SCHREIBES

AIBACH, of 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, New Jersey, directed the following letter to PHILIP LEVY mentioned above:

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\*51 Berkeley Avenue Newark, New Jersey

Power Philip: This is a thank you note for the lovely P.M. our families had at your house. It is also an assault upon you for regretable treatness. In all conscience how can you not subscribe to 'In Fact' because Mark tell me you discontinued your subscription. I Recall Hannah complained about the lack of documentation she found in a 2 page leaflet that bucks the whole weight of the regular press. I thought her criticism without foundation or justice. To my mind George Elder and The President are two peerless men. They are both bucking billion dollar interests to get truth to the people and I think they should be helped with all the strength of those who want the truth disseminated.

\*Aside from depriving yourself of information which is admittedly not pointed elsewhere you have a duty to support an organ which goes at facts in an analytical way. I don't care whether you agree or disagree about their method but their interpretation of information by their arrangement of facts is an Educational Preference.

"Phil there isn't any use my scolding and I don't have to give you argument. I am asking Mark to renew your subscription for one year and you will owe me \$1.00. If you feel you don't want to pay for the subscription than that will be a present from us to you happily given. (P.S. Though I wish you weren't so effectively influenced by your liberal friends and relatives)

"We did enjoy yesterday with you.

The referenced telephone call of December 5, 1945, from the New York Office to Newark also requested that a surveillance maintained and investigation conducted in the vicinity of 51 Berniey Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. This requested surveillance and investigation

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was conducted on the evening of December 6, 1945, from 9:15 p.m. to k00 a.m., December 7, 1945, during which time neither DR., WOLFSON nor his car were observed in the vicinity of that address.

The surveillance was conducted by Special Agents FRANK RAISBECK and EVERETT J. ADOLF. On the morning of December 7, 1945, these same two agents again took up the surveillance at 51 Berkeley Avenue, Newark, with negative results.

During the course of the surveillance, the mail carrier covering the district was discreetly contacted by the agents, and it was determined that the AIBACHS had moved about two weeks previously to 14 La Salle Road, Montolair, New Jersey. The mail carrier recalled that from time to time in the past several months DR. WOLFSON had received mail at 51 Berkeley Avenue, but that the mail was usually circulars and advertisements. The carrier also stated that DR. WOLFSON had received only one piece of mail since the AIBACHS had moved, and since it was not a letter or anything of first class matter, he had not forwarded it to the doctor's office at 31 Lincoln Park where he knew the doctor had an office. The carrier stated that as far as he could recall there had not been left a forwarding address for DR. WOLFSON when the AIBACHS moved.

The referenced telephone call from New York also advised that information had been received from the Washington Field Office that HARRY WHITE was expected to visit a house in the vicinity of Newton, New Jersey. In view of this information, a surveillance was instituted at the house on Route 8 on Paulinskill Lake Road by Special Agents RAYMOND J. GCRHAM and BURTON W. TEAGUE. This surveillance was instituted at approximately 9:00 a.m. on December 7, 1945.

At 10:50 a.m., a gray Chrysler 1940 sedan arrived at the house and blew the horn three times. Two men were seen to get out of the car and walk around the house. Special Agent GORHAM observed them remove a black sack about the size of a tire chain sack from the ear and carry it into the house. It was observed that this sack appeared to be very heavy. After this, they were observed by both agents to closely inspect the house and the grounds and other buildings. After this, about 11:15 a.m., they entered their car and drove down Paulinskill Read in the direction of Route 8. The signpost on the property on which the house is situated indicated that the property was owned by J. A. LIVINGSTONE, and that the property immediately in back of the house is leased from MR. LIVINGSTONE by the Fredon Game Preserve, Inc. The surveillance of these two men believed to be WHITE and WOIFSON was lost enrouse to Newark.

At 1:00 p.m., December 7, 1945, the surveillance was picked up by Special Agent K. S. MICHAEL and the writer at the Pennsylvania Station in Newark, New Jersey. At that time these agents observed the two men, believed to be WHITE and WOLFSON, arrive in the gray Chrysler 1940 automobile having license E/J 20 H. The men entered the restaurant at the station where they remained until 1:45 p.m. when they separated, and the individual believed to be WHITE boarded Train No. 129. WHITE was surveilled by Agents MICHAEL and GAHLON to Washington, D. C. At the Union Station in Washington, the surveillance was turned over to Special Agents PHILIP C. LOVRIEN and G. S. MCRRIS. During the trip to Washington, WHITE was observed to have remained in his parlor car seat during the entire trip.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent CHARLES E. KLEINKAUF:

Special Agent KLEINKAUF, accompanied by State Trooper TERENCE GILLAN, of the New Jersey State Police Barracks, at Newton, surveyed the premises of the house visited by WOLFSON and WHITE after their departure therefrom. Agent KLEINKAUF under suitable pretext endeavored to contact the occupants of the house, but was unable to arouse any one therein. However, the agent noted that the house bore every evidence of having been lived in. A light was burning in the caretaker's quarters over the garage. Agent KLEINKAUF picked up from the yard in back of the house the following papers:

OPA Form R-585 - Record of Delivery of bulk gasoline purchases issued to JACOB A.
LIVINGSTON, Route #2, Newton, New Jersey, issued by Ration Board #24-19.4, Newton, New Jersey.

An envelope postmarked Houston, Texas, September 11, 1945, 6:30 p.m., addressed air mail to MRS. IEON MITHERZ, e/o WEINBERGER and WAYNE, 673 Fifth Avenue, New York City. The envelope bore the return address of MURRAY PRESSER, Esperson Building, Houston 2, Texas. The envelope also bore the penciled notation: "dollar bills - envelopes,"

Physical Property of the Party of the Party

It has been ascertained that the property which WHITE visited on December 7, 1945, is owned by one JACOB LIVINGSTON. Trooper

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TERENCE GILLAN, of the New Jersey State Police at Newton, New Jersey, advised that LIVINGSTON is a retired businessman from either New York or the metropolitan area of New Jersey. He uses the above-mentioned place at Paulinskill Lake for a summer home. During 1944 and part of 1945 he employed a caretaker, name unknown, who allegedly came from somewhere in Massachusetts where LIVINGSTON reportedly has another home. From April to October, 1945, a MRS. LYDIA HENDERSON, a native of Sussex County, was caretaker at the LIVINGSTON property. MRS. HENDERSON is now residing at Jacksonburg, RD Blairstown, New Jersey.

Trooper GILLAN further advised that sometime during the summer of 1944 two Bureau agents, accompanied by their wives, came to the State Police station at Newton and stated that they were going to spend their two weeks' vacation at the LIVINGSTON home and they wanted to leave this information at the station in the event their office tried to reach them. GILLAN believed these agents were from the New York Field Division. He could not recall their names, and inquiry among various members of the State Police at Newton and a careful check of the station records failed to disclose the names of the two agents.

WALTER McCRACKEN, Postmaster in Newton, New Jersey, advised that his records reflected that JACOB A. LIVINGSTON, ESTER LIVINGSTON, and ADRIENE LIVINGSTON all reside at the LIVINGSTON place. A forwarding address appeared in the RD carriers' route book for the LIVINGSTON family, requesting that mail be forwarded to them at 180 West 58th Street, New York. The date of this request was not shown.

Under suitable pretext, Special Agent KLEINKAUF interviewed one ADRIAN DANIELS, who is presently caretaker of the LIVINGSTON estate. It was ascertained that DANIELS had received employment from LIVINGSTON through the medium of an advertisement which LIVINGSTON had put in a newspaper for a caretaker.

DANIELS advised that he was from Franklin, New Jersey, and he worked for a construction company in the Aleutian Islands during the war. At the present time he and his wife are the only ones living at the LIVINGSTON estate. DANIELS furnished information to the effect that LIVINGSTON had left on Tuesday, December 4, 1945, for St. Augustine, Florida, where he plans to reside with his son-in-law. According to DANIEIS, the LIVINGSTON property at Paulinskill Lake is for sale and a man by the name of LOCKWOOD, who operates a real estate agency in Newton, is endeavoring to sell the place for LIVINGSTON.

An attempt was made to ascertain the circums these surrounding the visit of WHITE and DR. WOLFSON on December 7, 1945 at it was not

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possible to ascertain anything in this connection without disclosing the fact that Special Agent KLEINKAUF knew they had visited there, which was deemed inadvisable. 

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It was further deemed inadvisable to contact the Lockwood Real Estate Agency in connection with the instant investigation, in view of the fact that it would be necessary to expose the fact that the Bureau had knowledge of WHITE'S visit to the premises.

# II. FREDERICK C. REMINGTON LILLIAN M. REMINGTON WILLIAM WALKER REMINGTON

Referenced telephone call from the Washington Field Office to Newark on November 19, 1945, was a call from Special Agent CARL HENNRICH, of the Washington Field Division, to Assistant Special Agent in Charge FREDERICK A. FLETCHER, of Newark, requesting the identity of the owner of the car bearing New Jersey license No. B/C 836 for 1945.

Contact with the Motor Vehicle Department in Ridgewood, New Jersey, revealed the information that this automobile is registered to LILLIAN M. REMINGTON, 836 Ridgewood Avenue, Ridgewood, New Jersey. The automobile is a 1939 blue Plymouth sedan. It was also ascertained at the Motor Vehicle Department that LILLIAN M. REMINGTON is the wife of FREDERICK C. REMINGTON, and both are old residents of Ridgewood, New Jersey. This information was telephonically communicated to MR. HENNRICH on November 19, 1945.

Referenced telephone call from New York to Newark on January 11, 1946 was a telephone call from Special Agent F. D. O'BRIEN, of the New York Office, to Special Agent R. H. TAYLOR, of the Newark Office, advising that O'ERIEN and Agent JOE WALSH had conducted a surveillance of WILLIAM WALKER REMINGTON to 560 Upper Boulevard, Upper Ridgewood, New Jersey. Agents O'ERIEN and WALSH were relieved by Special Agents JOHN V. CHAPMAN and FRANCIS X. MoBRIDE, who conducted the surveillance until midnight, at which time all lights were extinguished, indicating that the inhabitants at 560 Upper Boulevard, Upper Ridgewood, New Jersey, had retired. At no time did WILLIAM WALKER REMINGTON leave the house in that period. (14)

During the evening of this surveillance, an dividual in civilian clothes, accompanied by a girl, was observed to give up in front

of the house at approximately 8:45 p.m. in a 1942 tan Plymouth coupe with Georgia license plates. The license number was noted as Georgia X 568\_. The last digit of the license number was not discernible since it was covered by a Fort Houston, Texas, camp tag which bore the number 0-237. The occupants of this car were seen leaving the REMINGTON home at about 10:35 p.m. [4]

The surveillance was re-instituted at 9:00 a.m., January 12, 1946, by Special Agents E. J. KENNEDY and EVERETT J. ADOLF. During the course of the surveillance by these agents WILLIAM WALKER REMINGTON was not observed in the vicinity of this residence. (W)

Thereafter, on that same date, Special Agent JOHN V. CHAPMAN in an effort to ascertain whether or not WILLIAM WALKER REMINGTON was at the home of his parents contacted MRS. ROBERT GARTRELL, 246 Mountain Avenue, Ridgewood, New Jersey. MRS. GARTRELL, a friend of the REMINGTON family, ascertained from MRS. REMINGTON that her son WILLIAM had left on the 9:00 a.m. train on that date for Dartmouth University to take part in a conference as to the furthering of his graduate education in economics. MRS. GARTRELL continued it was her belief young REMINGTON was beginning to lay a foundation for a teaching career following his discharge from the Navy ()

By referenced teletype dated December 17, 1945, the Washington Field Office requested the identity of the subscriber to telephone numbers Ridgewood 6-0097-R and Ridgewood 6-4183-M. From Telephone Information it was ascertained that Ridgewood 6-0097-R had been changed to Ridgewood 6-4183-M, the latter being listed in the name of F. C. REMINGTON, 560 Upper Boulevard, Ridgewood, New Jersey. (4)

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN V. CHAPMAN:

A review of the New Jersey Bell Telephone Book for Bergen County reflected that F. C REMINGTON had formerly resided at 836 East Ridgewood Avenue and had recently moved to their present address, 560 Upper Bouleward, Ridgewood, New Jersey.

At Local Draft Board #3, Ridgewood, Bergen County, New Jersey, no record was available on any person by the mame of REMINGTON. (4)

Chief JOHN F. SOMERROCH, Ridgewood, New Aprsey, advised that the REMINGTON family had resided in Ridgewood, New Aprsey, for the



past 30 to 40 years; that F. C. REMINGTON, although being over 70 years of age, was an active member of the auxiliary police of that city, and also was very active in the Ridgewood Gun Club. He stated at times he had served as an instructor for the Ridgewood Police Department and was more or less instrumental in the formation of this gun club. Informant related that the family as a whole were well thought of and greatly respected and enjoyed a fine reputation. (U)

MRS. ROBERT GARTRELL, 246 Mountain Avenue, Ridgewood, New Jersey, a friend of the REMINGTONS, stated that the family is interested in the cooperative stores, that MR. REMINGTON is retired, is over seventy years of age, that they associate with the best class of people in Ridgewood, New Jersey, apparently of no radical tendencies and are not particularly interested in politics, either local or national. She further advised that they have a son who is a graduate of Dartmouth in the School of Economics, and is presently an Ensign in the United States Nevy. She stated that last spring he had gone to England as an assistant to the American Minister of Economics in England and around Thanksgiving time of 1945 had returned to the States due to the illness of his wife. She stated at the present time he is making his home with his wife and children, in Tauxenont, Alexandria, Virginia.

MRS. GARTREIL also informed that she had information that recently Ensign REMINGTON had been asked to be the assistant to the person in charge of reconstruction and price fixing in Washington; that the individual designated as the head was scheduled to resign in June; and that he would in all probability step into this position. Informant advised that Ensign REMINGTON was a bit wary of accepting such a position due to the fact that being only an Ensign and it being necessary for him to contact high business executives, he probably would not be able because of his rating to do as good a job as he had desired. Consequently, in lieu of this position, on Monday, December, 17, 1945, he journeyed to some college in the Rev England states to see about accepting a teaching position. At the time of the interview with informant, REMINGTON had not made up his pind to the which of the two positions he would take.

A shock of the Newark indices was made against the range of all three of these individuals with negative results with the exception that MRS. F. C. 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#### III. HAROLD GLASSER

Referenced telephone call from Special Agent E. F. EMERICH, of the Washington Field Office to Special Agent E. T. TURNER, of the Newark Office, advised that HAROLD GLASSER, a subject in this case and a resident of Washington, D. C., employed in the Treasury Department, was due to arrive in Trenton, New Jersey, at 11:54 a.m., on that date, December 4, 1945. It was believed that GLASSER would get off the train at Trenton and proceed to Princeton, New Jersey.

The following is a summary of the surveillance of HAROLD GLASSER conducted by Special Agents HARRY L. McCARTHY, VIRGIL W. COOFRIDER, and PAUL V. SMITH on December 8 and 9, 1945:

Extraoillance of GLASSER was taken over by Special Agents
McCARTHY and SMITH from Special Agents HUGH B. McGAHEY and JOHN V. CHAPMAN
at the Pennsylvania Railroad Station, Trenton, New Jersey, at approximately
noon on December 8th.

After placing a request for a seat reservation on a train leaving frenton for Washington at 7:53 p.m. on December 9th, GLASSER proceeded by train alone from Trenton to Princeton. He was obviously unfamiliar with the station and train connections at both Trenton and Princeton. He arrived at Princeton at about 1:15 p.m. and was met at the station by a man later identified as AUGUSTAMAFFRY. They walked about one block to the Princeton Inn and registered there.

WILLIAM H. SUMMERS, Assistant Manager of the Princeton Inn, advised that GIASSER and MAFFRY were both there to attend a conference of business economists, which was held at the Inn on December 8 and 9. He advised that the conference program called for sessions between 2:00 and 5:00 p.m. and again between 8:00 and 10:00 p.m. on December 8th, and between 10:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. and again between 2:00 and 4:15 p.m. on December 9th. He advised that the conference was being attended by 30 or 35 economists, many of whom were connected with the Federal Reserve System.

SUMMERS advised that GLASSER and MAFFRY jointly occupied Room 232 at the Inn, the room reservation having been made by MAFFRY on stationery indicating that he was an economic adviser for the Export-Import Bank. On their registration cards GLASSER gave his address as Import Bank. Washington, D. C., and MAFFRY gave his address 5410 Cathedral, N. W., Washington, D. C., and MAFFRY gave his address as 2229 Bancroft Place, N.W., Washington, D. C.

GIASSER made only two outside telephone calls from the Inn one to the Pennsylvania Railroad Station in Trenton, and the other to Washington No. EM 9283.

Washington No. Em 9200.

No attempt was made to observe the contacts of GIASSER
inside the Princeton Inn, but a constant surveillance of the Inn was made
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At approximately 4:30 p.m. on December 9, 1945, GIASSER and WAFFRY left the Princeton Inn and walked to the railway station. They boarded a car at approximately 4:40 p.m. and were surveilled by Agents COOFRIDER and SMITH from that time until they were turned over to agents of the Washington Field Office in the Washington Union Station at approximately 8:10 p.m.

GLASSER, MAFFRY, and two other men who apparently had also attended the conference, went by train from Princeton to North Philadelphia. They waited for about twenty minutes on the platform at the North Philadelphia Station and then took the "Congressional" to Washington. The four men spent most of the trip from Philadelphia to Washington eating in the diner. One of the two unidentified men was about 35 years eld. As far as was observed GLASSER made no contacts with other than those attending the conference.

It may be noted that DR. ALBERD EINSTEIN, the famous scientist, was in the lobby of the Princeton Inn when GLASSER arrived there on December 8th, but MR. SUMMERS advised that EINSTEIN had no connection with the Conference of Business Economists. He said that EINSTEIN and four other individuals had dinner and a private conference at the Inn on that day.

## IV. CHARLES MANGOLD

Reference teletype from New York to Newark dated December 4, 1945, requested that the Newark Office obtain the registration on the automobile bearing New Jersey license B/J 366 for 1945.

The records at the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Department reflect that 1945 New Jersey license No. B/J 366 is registered to one CHARLES MANGOLD, 167 Summit Circle, Little Ferry, New Jersey, for a 1940 Pontiac sedan. MANGOLD'S description from his New Jersey operator's license is as follows:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent EDMOND J. KENNEDY:

Special Agent EMOND J. KENNEDY checked all City Directories from the year 1940 to the present for the name of ABE SMALL with negative results. All telephone books for the same period were checked with negative results.

WILLIAM J. DONAGAN, Coordinator for all Local Boards in Essex County, caused a search to be made of the files and all were checked for the name of ABE SMALL with negative results.

The American Medical Directory for 1945 was also checked with negative results. The only ABE SMALL listed in instant directory is located at 485 Beacon Street, Boston, Massachusetts.

The records of Who's Who in New Jersey, Who's Who in America, the official list of Fellows and Members of the Medical Society in New Jersey, and the 1945 Directory of American Scholars were also searched with negative results.

By teletype dated December 27, 1945, the Washington Field Division was notified of the above information.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent HARRY E. WEICH:

ROBITZEK, 78th and Boulevard, Harvey Cedars, New Jersey, a small town on an island six miles from the New Jersey mainland, approximately ten miles north of Beach Haven, New Jersey. Personal observation disclosed the address of ROBITZEK is a general grocery store advertised as "Sam Lears." It contains a Western is a general grocery store advertised as "Sam Lears." It contains a Western Union telegraph office, the United States Post Office for Harvey Cedars, and two public telephone numbers, Beach Haven 4-8861 and 4-8851.

CARL BINGAMAN, Medford, New Jersey, a half sister of ROBITZEK. MRS. BINGAMAN is the wife of CARL BINGAMAN, who operates the Bingaman and Gick Bus Line between Medford and Camden, New Jersey. She has been a resident of Harvey Cedars for over 20 years and has a good reputation there.

Pennsylvania, or vicinity. His mother and father, whose first names are unknown, are believed to have operated a bakery shop in Duquesne, Pennsylvania. ROBITZEK was employed in a steel mill in Duquesne where he lost his right leg below the knee, and about two months ago received a back pay check from a below the knee, and about two months ago received a back pay check from a steel mill believed to be the United States Steel Company in Duquesne. The steel mill believed to be the United States Steel Company in the outskirts married a MRS. LILLIAN MATTERN from Duquesne or a township on the outskirts of Duquesne. MRS. ROBITZEK has a son from her first marriage who is in the Seabees. His name is JACK MATTERN.

ROBITZEK is a newcomer to Harvey Cedars, and the above information was obtained from SAMUEL IEARS, who said he would vouch for his reliability and loyalty. He is intelligent, but uneducated, and has never made any derogatory statements in the presence of IEARS who sees him every day. ROBITZEK is also known to the Acting Chief of Police HARRY HAINES, also Commander of the VFW Post of Harvey Gedars, who states that he is a grouch and on one occasion expressed a resentful remark about a young veteran who is a competitor of ROBITZEK'S and who started in business young veteran who is a competitor of ROBITZEK'S and who started in business as a result of funds received under the GI Bill of Rights. On another occasion, however, ROBITZEK remarked that unions were going too far in their demands, and that their net gain would be nothing.

From Telephone Information, it was ascertained that this number was listed to J. H. IEVIN, 681 East 25th Street, Paterson, New Jersey.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JOHN V. CHAPMAN:

The Paterson City Directory for 1939 listed ULA E. LEVIN as a teacher, East Side High School, Paterson, New Jersey; HERBERT & LEVIN, physician, in Denora, Pennsylvania; LESTER M. LEVIN, lawyer, Government Service; and PAULING LEVIN, a widow of JACOB H. LEVIN.

The 1944 Directory was identical with that of 1939 with the exception that LESTER M. LEVIN was shown as having moved to Washington, D. C.

The 1941, 1942, and 1943 Directories show no changes. However, the 1944 Directory lists HERBERT J. as being in the United States Army.

The 1945 Directory also lists him in the United States Army, and lists the other occupants of 681 East 25th Street as PAULINE

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent EDMOND J. KENNEDY:

The 1943 City Directory for Rahway, New Jersey, lists CARSON as a power operator and a home owner at 263 West Lake Avenue, Rahway, New Jersey.

J. E. TOMPKINS, Clerk of Local Board No. 15, Union County, produced CARSON'S file which reflects that his full name is EDWARD WINSLOW CARSON and that he registered for Selective Service en October 16, 1940, his Order No. being 138. He is working for the Pennsylvania Railroad as a power operator and was placed in Class 3-A on March 11, 1942. Since that time he has been classified as follows:

> 3-B - October 9, 1942 3-A - September 15, 1943

1-A - March 17, 1944

2-A - March 29, 1944, May 5, 1944, August 9, 1944, September 20, 1944, and February 23, 1945

On October 3, 1945, he was placed in Class 4-A, which he presently holds.

In a questionnaire dated November 6, 1940, CARSON advised and that he attended Pratt that his Social Security Number is Institute in Brooklyn during the evening in addition to a high school education. He is employed as a power operator maintaining the switchboard and rotary converters for supplying overhead and third rail power for the Pennsylvania Railroad, and has been so employed since 1927. He is married and has two children and says he owns his own home on which he places a value of \$2,200. MR. TOMPKINS said he knew CARSON in a casual way, but did not know anything derogatory relative to him.

The files of the Rahway Police Department were searched with negative results relative to CARSON.

MARTIN F. GETTING, Postmaster, Rahway, advised he did not know GARSON, and through ARTHUR L. BOULTON, letter carrier, learned that very little mail is received by the family, and they are not subscribers to any newspapers.

I telephonically contacted Mr. Tamm with reference to the information Father-tronin had mentioned concerning his knowledge of the Bentley case. Mr. Tamm stated that he had not discussed this case with Father Cronin and in fact had not mentioned anything specific to Father Cronin; that rather he had been extremely general in all of his discussions with the Father.

I also telephonically contacted Leo Laughlin of War Assets Corporation and asked him if he had at any time mentioned this matter to Father Cronin. Mr. Laughlin stated he had never discussed this matter with Father Cronin and in fact did not even know of this case until Tuesday night, March 12th, when the copy of the report which had been sent to the White House was turned over to him and Joe Carroll by Mr. Gregory.

You will note from the attached memorandum that the only other persons in the Security Division who have talked to Father Cronin were Agents Britson and Harvey, both of whom were questioned by me and both of whom stated that they had not at any time discussed this case with Father Cronin or in any way given him any indication that there was such a case.

My only contact with Father Cronin was yesterday afternoon, March 13th and I did not discuss any Bureau cases or information with him.



I want to call your attention to a conversation which transpired between Harry S Magdoff, a subject in the instant case, and Norton Long, of the National Housing Administration, which agency you may recall is headed by Mr. Wilson Fr. Wyatt. This conversation transpired on March 11, 1946, at 7:30 P.M.

As you may recall, Long has been attempting to persuade Magdoff to leave the Commerce Department and transfer over to the National Housing Administration during the past week or so. Harry Wagdoff indicated that he would probably stay with the Commerce Department. However, he suggested the names of two candidates for Long. Long said, "Don't tell me it's Harold Deming Kube?", and Magdoff said that he had reference to Al Butler who was in the War Production : Board. Long stated that Butler was Bunker's assistant, a prime reactionary and did no good. He said he heard that from at least four good sources. Magdoff indicated that Butler was a "competent guy." Magdoff further indicated that Butler is now over at the War Assets Corporation. Long told Magdoff that he wanted "somebody in your class, not a second-string reactionary." Later Magdoff suggested the name of Al Waterston and Long did not agree, stating, "Fifty million people will turn over in their graves at the mention of his name." Long said that he was not interested in "seconds"; that he was just interested in "guys like you or reasonable facsimiles thereof." THE BA

Long further stated, "You guys will be sorry when Wallace goes to PAC." probably referring to Secretary of Commerce Wallace and the Political Action Committee. Magdoff said that he would go with Wallace and he wished that they would offer him a job. Long indicated that that could be arranged but not at the present figure. Magdoff said that he would not expect it; that he would be satisfied with half the salary. To this fong stated, "You really have got stated, "You really have got KED 165-56402-646 religion." INDEXED



Secretary Byrnes went over the matter which you previously discussed with Secretary Byrnes that as a result of this he, Hiss, was desirous of talking to you personally or in your absence with one of your assistants concerning the matter which Secretary Byrnes had discussed with him. I advised him you were out of the city and I did not know the time of your return. He then requested that I, when next in telephonic contact with you, relay his request to you which I assured him I would do and I would call him advising of your decision.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

In the event a representative of the Bureau does talk to Alger Hiss I believe that we should be careful not to question him about his activities as disclosed through the Bureau's investigation but that we should permit him to make any statement he might desire to make and furnish any information which he desires to volunteer concerning his activities. To do otherwise would, in effect, be putting him on notice as to exactly what information we possess and there is no way to know how far he might pass this information among his Communist friends with the resultant harm to further investigation. Likewise, of course, it is not known how much Secretary Byrnes has already disclosed to him.

In accordance with your instructions, I will contact Hiss, arrange an appointment and handle it as above.

An admitted Seviet agent who was active for many years in connection with Seviet espienage operations aimed at procuring information from employees of the United States Government has advised that since 1940, John Hazard Raymolds has been the President of the United States Service and Employing Corporation, a firm in New York City organized by Seviet and Communist elements and constantly used since its organization as a front and cover for Seviet espienage operations. In addition, this schoitted Seviet agent has advised that for a number of years, Lieutement Colonel John Hazard Raymolds has been in frequent contact not only with preminent American Communists, but also with prepareus individuals known to be Seviet agents, American Communists, but also with prepareus individuals known

According to an admitted Seviet agent who was active in Seviet espionage eperations aimed at penetrating the United States Covernment, Edward Joseph Fitegerald was a member of the Soviet espienage parallel in Washington, D. C., composed of captayous of the United States Covernment and headed at least in part by Victor Perle, on employee of the United States Treasury Department. In 1944 this Soviet agent was placed in contact with this espiceage parallel and for a period of time collected information from its members for trans-mittel to the Soviet Smion through other Soviet agents acting as his separture, Among these individuals was Nevert Societ Pitagerald, then apparently an employee of the Mir Production Board, This Soviet agent has advised that Pitegorald was noticely engaged in collecting and furnishing information through this passillel to Soviet Intelligence representatives and was apparently active in this work, at locat until April, 1945.

An edulated Seviet agent active for many years in Seviet aspicance sperations has advised that Marry Skinnig Hagfoff was a member of the Seviet espienage parallel headed at least in part by Vieter Perle, an employee of the United States Treasury Department and engaged in furmisking information in the files of the United States Covernment to the Soviet Intelligence Service through various Soviet agents, including Jucob E. Onles, now descused, the Soviet superior for a number of years of the agent who furnished the shove information concerning Magdoff. The Bevist agent reported that Magdeff is a member of the Communist Party - DSA and was very active in the Seviet espienage operations,


> Bels Gold is presently employed by the Fereign Economic Administration. Geld was previously employed by the United States Department of Agriculture. According to an admitted Seviet agent who was extremely active for a number of yours in Soviet Intelligence operations aimed at securing information through employees of the United States Government, he met Bela Sold in the Spring of 1944 and that late in 1944, Gold estained a position with FRA. Shortly thereafter, this Soviet agent learned that Gold had been supplying information regarding the activities of the Fereign Recognic Administration to Mathan Gregory Silvermatter and his wife, it being meted in this connection that Silvermaster, presently employed by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, was an extremely important and active Soviet agent in the Soviet Intelligence parallel above referred to. According to this Soviet agent, upon one occasion he was advised that either Silvermaster or William Ludwig Ullminp, one of the alleged agents in this group had remarked that Gold "has done such a good job" that they were thinking of supplying him with a camera so that he could do his own photographing of Government documents.

> It should be noted that Silvermaster and Ullmann have apparently been extremely active in recent years in photographing large quantities of documents from the files of various agencies of the United States Covernment for transmittal to Soviet Intelligence representatives.

# MORMAN CHANDLER BURSLER



An admitted Soviet agent who was extremely active in connection with Soviet Intelligence operations aimed at the penetration of the United States Covernment has advised that in 1942 and 1943 he ascertained that Bursler was furnishing reports on German cartels from the files of the Department of Justice to Mathan Gregory and Helen Silvernaster, who have been identified by this source as Soviet agents of considerable importants, it being noted that Nathan Gregory Silvernaster is presently employed by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation. According to this source, Helen Silvernaster, Gregory Silvernaster's wife, admitted to him that the cartel reports which were picked up by this Soviet agent from the Silvernasters for forwarding to the Soviet Union through other Soviet agents were furnished by Bursler.

## VILLIAN WALTER REMIFETOR

It appears that William Walter Memington is presently serving in the United States Mavy, having been commissioned as an Ensign on August 19, 1944, and assigned to duty with the Office of Maval Intelligence and is presently stationed in Washington, D. C. It has been reported that he of September 10, 1945, Remington was assigned to work with the Office of War Mobilisation and Reconversion. (4)

An admitted Soviet agent of considerable importance who was active for a number of years in Seviet Intelligence operations directed at securing information from employees of the United States Government has advised that in 1942 he became acquainted with William Walter Remington through a Soviet superior, Jacob M. Gelos, now deceased, an important Seviet agent for many years. Shortly thereafter, the Soviet agent who furnished the above information began:contacting William Walter Remington, who was then employed by the War Production Board at regular intervals and during this period, Remington furnished this Soviet agent with considerable information related to the aircraft production field which he secured in connection with his employment at WPB. In addition, it is known that Remington is closely affiliated with a number of other individuals, many of whom are presently employed with the United States Government and are reliably reported to be active in cellecting and furnishing information for transmittal to the Soviet Union, (U)

#### OFFICE OF PRICE ADMINISTRATION

Charles Kriver, with alias

Charles Bramer is employed at the present time by the Ciffor of Price Administration and is reportedly on lean to the Martime Health and Education Subcommittee headed by Senater Claude Pepper.

An important, admitted Seviet agent active for a considerable period of time in Soviet Intelligence operations designed to procure information from the files and employees of the United States Government has advised that in 1943, Jacob M. Coles, now deceased, a preminent Soviet espionage agent who was his superior at that time, advised of his connections with the Soviet espionage parallel active in Washington, D. C., in furnishing information to Soviet Intelligence procured as a result of the employment of these individuals by the United States Government. The Soviet agent who furnished the above information, in 1944 began contacting this group which was then headed by Victor Perls, an employee of the United States Treasury Department and procuring information from the individuals composing this group for transmittal through his superiors to the Soviet Union. One of the individual active in this group who furnished considerable information to this Soviet agent was Charles Kramer. According to this Soviet agent also, Charles Braner is a known member of the Communist Party who has been active for a considerable time in underground operations. It is known also that Kramer is in close and frequent contact with other individuals who are reliably reported to be involved in Soviet Intelligence operations, many of whom are employees of the United States Covernment.

### RECORPTRACTION PINANCE CORPORATION

MATHAN GREGORY SILVERNASTED, with aliance, S. S. Hilvernaster, B. P. Bilvernaster, Mathan Gregory Masters, Nathan Masters and Sorge Remov





At the present time Nathan Gregory Silvernaster is employed as Chief of the Division of Kosmanie Analysis, Bar Assets Corporation, a subsection of the Reconstruction Pinance Corporation. Since August, 1935, and prior to his present employment, Silvernaster has been employed by the Recettlement Administration, the Maritime Labor Board, the Form Security Administration, the United States Treasury Department and the Mound of Reconsile Marfare.

Asserding to an edmitted Soviet agent who for a member of years was extremely active in Seviet Intelligence operations aimed at precuring information of intelligence value from employees and records in the United States Government, Silvermaster tegether with a number of his associates has been extremely active from 1941 until at least 1945, and probably according to this source, until the present time, in securing efficial records of the United States Gevernment and other information procured through Government employment and propering them for transmittal to Seviet Intelligence, eventually to the Soviet Union. From 1941 until 1944, this Seviet agent who furnished the above information, regularly contacted Mathem Gregory Silvermester and his associates and procured from him entremely voluminous espionage material which was in turn ferwarded by this Soviet agent to his superiors for transmittel to the Soviet Union. According to this admitted Soviet agent, some of this information was procured personally by Silvermenter and much of it was precured by Silvermenter from his associated who were also active as Government exployees in this Seviet espionage parallel.

According to this source, one of the primary sources of Silvernaster's data was Milliam Ludwig Milman, for some time a major in the Buited States Army Air Forces assigned to the Pentagen Building. Milman, who has lived at the Silvernaster home for many years, was glosely associated with Milvernaster in photographing large numbers of extremely confidential documents secured from the Filws at time keep hir Furces by Milmann and also by another associate of Milvernaster's and Milmann's, Abraham George Milvernas, the at that time was a civilian ampliques of the Army Air Furces. The information preserved by this admitted feviet agent from Milvernaster, Milvernas and Milmann in this connection consisted of practically every type of secret information concerning Air Force operations including data concerning production, deployment, technological developments, official directives and practically an unlimited range of related information.

In addition, it has been established that Mathan Gregory Silversaster is in close exchart with a large number of other individuals, many of whom are still WKH:rol



This admitted Seviet agent has been extremely active in Seviet copionage operations and regularly gave the information furnished him by Grogg to his Seviet superiore in Seviet Intelligence for

Robert Talbett Miller III is presently employed by the United States Department of State reportedly being assigned to the Near Eastern Division handling confidential matters pertaining to relations between the United States and the Seviet Union. From 1941 to 1944, Miller was employed by the Office of the Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs.

Golog, a Soviet agent who was his superior and who died on Nevember 27, 1943. Prior to that time he was employed by the Senate Banking Committee and by the United States Treasury Department under the ismediate supervision of Marry Dexter White, who is more fully described elsewhere in this memorandum.

An addited Seviet agent of considerable importance has adviced that Donald Wheeler, while employed by the Office of Strategie Services, was an important and integral part of a Seviet copionage parallel operating in the United States Covernment for the purpose of furnishing espionage information from Government files to the coviet Union through memorous Seviet Intelligence representatives. This admitted Seviet agent was first placed in contact with this copionage parallel of which Whoeler was a number, by his superior in the Seviet Intelligence Service, Jacob H. Colos, an important Seviet agent, who died on Sevenber 27, 1943.

An admitted Soviet espionage agent, who for a considerable period of time was active in Soviet espionage operations aimed at penetrating the United States Government, has advised that Adler has been an intrigate part of a Seviet espionage parallel sparating throughout the United States Government and active in furnishing espionage information from the files of various Government departments to numerous Soviet "Intelligence agents for transmittal to the Soviet Spice. According to this admitted Soviet agent, during the latter part of 1942 and the early part of 1943, he was advised by a number of his associates active in Soviet espionage operations that Sol Adler, United States Treasury Department representative in Chungking, China, was making information available to this Soviet espionage parallel for transmittal to the Soviet Union. This admitted Soviet agent saw letters written by Adler from Chungking to the Treasury Department at the home of Mathan Gregory Silvermster, the leader of one of the Soviet espionage parallels in Washington, D. C., which letters from Adler were in the Silvermaster home for copying in order that they could be transmitted through this Soviet agent to the Soviet Union.

This admitted Soviet agent advised also that Adler was a member of the Communist Party, USA, and that his Party dues were collected from him by Mathan Gregory Silvermaster and turned ever to this Soviet agent.

In addition to the above information, it has been reported from collateral sources that Adler has been associated with Communist activities and allegedly at one time sent weekly reports to the Communist Party. In addition it has been reported that Adler has been in centact with a number of suspected Soviet agents. (I)

Harold Glasser is an employee of the United States Treasury Department and reportedly was recently appointed a United States Treasury Department adviser to General Bouglas MacArthur in Tokyo, Japan.

According to an admitted Soviet agent, who was deeply involved for a number of years in the operation of the Soviet espionage parallel composed of members of the United States Government in Manhington, D. C., Harold Glasser was an important member of this espionage parallel engaged in taking information from the files of government departments and making it available to the Soviet Union through various Seviet Intelligence agents. In this semmestion this admitted Soviet agent was advised by a number of his associates that Glasser was closely associated with Marry Dexter White, elsewhere described in this memorandum, and with a number of other individuals involved in this espionage parallel.

According to this Soviet agent, Enrold Classer is a known number of the Communist Party and supplied information to Soviet Intelligence originating in the Treasury Department and the Foreign Economic Administration, particularly information concerning the activities of the Treasury Department on proposed loans by the United States to foreign countries. This admitted Soviet agent advised that Sonie Gold is a member of the Soviet espicance parallel active in the United States Government in furmishing to the Soviet Enion through various Soviet Intelligence agents information from the files of government departments and was placed in her position in the Treasury Department through the cooperation of White by Mathan Gregory Silvermaster and his wife, Melan. It should be noted that Mathan Gregory Silvermater is presently employed by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and he and his wife, Helen, have been reported by this admitted Soviet agent as the leaders of a Soviet espionage parallel of considerable importance in the United States Government. According to this admitted source Somie Gold furnished information to the Silvernasters which she copied from documents in the files of the freesury Department and available to her in connection with her employment there. This admitted Soviet agent stated that it was his belief that the information furnished by Senie Sold which he is turn collected from the Silvernator's home and forestried to the Seviet Tales through his Seviet Intelligence deportors consermed primarily Treasury Department opinions and recommend tions regarding applications made by the Chinese and French governments including certain political information.

Irving Eaplan is presently employed by the Smited States Treatury Department and on Denomber 23, 1945, returned from a Government mission in Europe on behalf of the Treasury Department.

Prior to this employment Explan was employed by a number of other United States Government agencies including the Poreign Economic Administration, Her Production Board and the Department of Justice.

According to information furnished by an admitted Seviet agent, Kaplan was active in Mashington, R. C., as a member of a Soviet espienage parallel furnishing information to the Soviet Union through numerous Soviet Intelligence agents. In 1942 or 1943 this Soviet agent accertained from Mathan Gregory Silvermaster, the head of this Soviet espienage parallel, that Esplan was furnishing information obtained by him from the files of the Mar Production Board, where he was then employed, to Abraham George Silverman who in turn was delivering the information to Silvermaster who made it available to this admitted Soviet agent for transmittal through his Soviet Intelligence superiors to the Soviet Union.

In addition this Soviet agent has advised that Irving Kaplan is a dues paying member of the Communist Party. Further it is known that Kaplan is an associate of a number of other individuals reported by this admitted Soviet agent as active in this Soviet espienage parallel.

### VICTOR PEHLO, with alies Martin Stribling

Victor Perle is presently employed by the United States Treasury Department in the effice of Marold Glasser, mentioned elsewhere in this memorandum, under Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Marry Dexter White, who is also more fully described elsewhere in this memorandum.

An admitted Soviet agent, who was deeply involved in Seviet Intelligence operations encompassing the operation of Soviet espicance agents employed by the United States Government, has advised that in early 1844 through arrangements initiated by his Soviet superior Jacob M. Soles, now deceased, he was placed in contact with a Soviet espicance parallel in Mashington, he was placed by Victor Perlo. This Soviet agent contacted the numbers of this parallel, including Perlo, frequently after that and received from them espicance information for transmittal to the Soviet Union. According to the source, Perlo was then employed by the Mar Production Source and was apparently aware that the information being furnished by

him and the Soviet agents associated with the parallel operated by him was destined for the Soviet Smion. Among the individuals, who according to this source, were involved in this espleance parallel in addition to Perle were Charles Kramer, Marry Magdoff and Edward Fitzgerald, who are described in greater detail elsewhere in this memorahism.

This admitted Seviet agent has definitely reported that Perls was operating in the manner described above as a Soviet agent furnishing considerable information from afficial records of the United States Government to Soviet Intelligence. This admitted Soviet agent points out in connection with this contention that he personally collected much of this information from Perls and his associates.

In addition to the above information it has been reported that Fleter Ferle has been elosely associated with Communists and Communist front activities. It has been reported further that Perle is a member of the Communist Party and has long been active in the Communist Underground in Bashington, D. C. Purther it is known that Fleter Perle is presently an associate of a number of individuals also reported to be involved in the above described Soviet Intelligence operations.

# WILLIAM HENRY PAYLOR

William Menry Taylor is presently employed by the United States Treasury Department and is stationed in London, England, as a Treasury Department representative, e/o The American Embassy,

According to an admitted Soviet agent, William Heary Taylor is a member of the Communist Party and was active in fernishing information procured through his employment with the freezery Department to various Soviet agents for transmittal to the Seviet Union. This admitted Soviet agent has advised that Taylor gave both his Party dues and information he prosured through his employment to either Mr. or Mrs. Mathan Gregory Silvermater from whom this admitted Seviet agent collected this and ether espionage information for transmittal to the Soviet Maion through his Soviet Intelligence superiors. According to this source, Taylor supplied considerable information to the Silvermaters, both written and eral, which was in turn secured by this Seviet agent. One item furnished by Paylor, according to this Seviet agent, was a report prepared by him on conditions in China, which this Seviet agent states he knows was cont to the Seviet Union. This admitted Seviet agent has definitely stated that William Bonry Taylor was on motive member of a Seriet copiesage parallel in the United States Severment active in presering espicings information from the files of the United States Government for transmittal to the Soviet Union through Soviet Intelligence agents.





WILLIAM LUMBIO BLIMANS, also known as William Ludwig Bliman Secret Comp

William Indwig Wilmann is presently employed by the United States Treasury Department having left the Army Air Porces on October 14, 1945, with the rank of Major.

According to an admitted Soviet agent, William Indmig Wilmann is an extremely important Soviet agent operating in connection with the Soviet espionage parallel centered in the United States Government for the purpose of making available to the Soviet Union through Soviet Intelligence operations information abstracted from the files of various United States Government departments.

For a number of years, with the exception of certain time spent in the Enited States Army, Killiam Ludwig Ullmann has resided at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Mathan Gregory Silvermaster, who on the basis of information furnished by this admitted Soviet agent are deeply involved as leaders of this Soviet espionage parallel. This admitted Soviet agent made a large number of trips to the Silvermaster home from 1941 until at least late 1944 for the purpose of collecting espionage information collected by among others Silvermaster and Ullmann for transmittal through his Soviet Intelligence superiors to the Seviet Union. This source was placed in touch with this espionage parallel of which Silvermaster and Ullmann are such extremely important elements by his then Soviet superior, Jacob H. Geles, a very important Soviet agent who died in Movember, 1943.

Ullmann was employed by the Treasury Department prior to his industion into the United States Army in 1943 and has been closely associated with Barry Dexter Haite, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, who is more fully described elsewhere in this memorandum, in the above Soviet espienage activity. In addition to furnishing information of Soviet Intelligence, while Ellmann was in the United States Army he became a commissioned officer eventually attaining the rank of Hajor in the Army Air Forces. He was stationed for a considerable period of time with Army Porces Modquarters at the Pentagen Building, Bashington, B. S. Bering this time he abstracted immunorable and volumineus secret documents from Air Gorpe resorts which were taken to the filtermater home and there photographed, the copies being forwarded to the Soviet Union through the above described Seviet agent and his associates and seperiors. The information in the documents explice by Wilmann was of almost every conceivable type, ineluding data concerning aircraft production, allocation and deployment of eirereft, technological developments, statistics concerning high cotane gasoline, efficial directives, data conserming the 3-29, and inforention descerning tanks, guas and metorised equipment. This admitted Soviet agent also advised that Vilmana is a member of the Communist Party in makington, B. C.

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On January 15, 1946, a passport was issued to Ullmann for travel to Germany for the Treasury Department and the War Bepartment reportedly in connection with work being done concerning German finencial missions. At the present time Ullmann is in Germany in this capacity.

### MARRY DRITER WHITE

At the present time Harry Dexter White is an Assistant Secretary of the United States Treasury Department and has been employed by the Treasury Department in positions of considerable responsibility for a number of years.

According to an admitted Soviet agent of considerable importance who until at least late 1944 was active in the operation of a Soviet espionage . parallel in the United States Government in Washington, D. C., Harry Bexter White has been deeply involved in this Soviet espionage parallel as a Soviet espicance agent of considerable importance engaged in the work of this espionage parallel in furnishing espionage information from the files of various departments of the United States Government to Seviet Intelligence agents for transmittal to the Soviet Union. This admitted Soviet agent advised that the involvement of White in these espionage activities first became clearly apparent in the latter part of 1942 or the early part of 1943. This agent learned that White was supplying considerable infermation consisting of documents from the records of the Freesury Department to Mathan Gregory Silvernaster and William Ludwig Ullmann, referred to in greater detail elsewhere in this memorandum. These documents were copied, picked up at the Silvermaster home by this admitted Soviet agent and transmitted by him to the Soviet Union via his superiors in the Soviet Intelligence service.

This admitted Soviet agent has advised further that he ascertained from statements made by Silvernaster, Ullmann and others connected with the above operations that Marry Dexter White was considered one of the most valuable assets of this partisular parallel of Soviet Intelligence in view of the fact that he could secure employment in his capacity as Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Department for those individuals whom this group was anxious to have assigned there. In this connection, according to this Soviet agent, Maite secured Treasury Department positions for Milliam Ludwig Wilmann, William Henry Taylor and Sonie Steinman Gold, who are discussed in greater detail elsewhere in this membrandum. Also reportedly closely associated with White has been Mareld Classer, another alleged Soviet agent described in greater detail elsewhere in this memorandum.

It is known that at the present time Harry Dexter White is in close contact with a number of other individuals mentioned in this memorandum as involved in Soviet espienage activity centered in the United States Government.

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#### SELTED RATIOUS RELIEF AND REMABILITATION ANNIHISTRATION

NOTE:

While WHERE is not technically and completely an agency of the Brited States Government, in view of its quasi-Governmental character, there is not out below brief information concerning five American employees of this international organization.

## JULIUS JOSEPH JOSEPH

Julius Joseph Joseph is presently employed by VMRM and is now in Germany with the Bisplaced Persons Bureau. Previously he was employed by the Office of Strategie Services, as was his wife, Bella Muriem Joseph, in admitted Soviet agent of some preminence has advised that Joseph was active to his knowledge from the summer of 1942 until at least late 1944 in furnishing information secured by him through his various Federal employments to Soviet Entelligence agents for transmittal to the Seviet Dries.

According to this source, at the time Joseph was drafted into the United States Army in 1943, he requested assignment to the Office of Strategie Services at the suggestion of Joseph was assigned to the Office of Strategie Services and worked in the Japanese Division. According to this admitted Soviet agent, Joseph furnished certain information from CSS to Soviet Entelligence in connection with the Seviet espicaage parallel operating in the Smited States Government in Mashington, B. G. in which Joseph was active. This admitted Soviet agent has advised that Jalius J. Joseph gave to him copies of original CES reports which this Seviet agent forwarded to the Soviet Enion through his superiors and associates in Soviet Intelligence. This Soviet agent also advised that both Joseph and his wife, Bella, were does-paying members of the Communist Party and upon occasion paid their Party does to him.

## SOLOHOH AARON LIBCHIEST, with alias; Sel Bischinsky

At the present time Solemen Acrem Linchinsky is employed by Mark in Machington, B. G. Information has been received from an admitted Soviet agent of prominence that during 1944 he was placed in touch by Buil Browder with a group of employees of the Builed States Covernment in Bushington which, comparising a Soviet espicancy parallel, engaged in furnishing informations from the files of departments of the Builed States Covernment to the Soviet States, which group included Solemen Lieuthinsky. This group was under at least the mentional leadership of Victor Perio, an employee of the Brownery Department, who is described in greater detail elecutors. This admitted Soviet agent has advised that Rischinsky was definitely a number of this septionage group but that, to his knowledge at least, Rischinsky had not furnished any intelligence information seen by him. It is known then play

Lischinsky has been in contact with a number of other individuals described in this nemerandum who reportedly are involved in Soviet explorage activity in the Smited States Government.

## WILLAND 2. PARK

Willard Z. Park is at the present time employed with NURTA in Addis Ababa, Ethiopa. Information furnished by an important admitted Soviet agent involved for some time in Soviet espionage operations directed at penetrating the W. S. Government advised that Park in 1942 became involved in Soviet espienage activity through Jacob M. Coles, an important Soviet agent who is new deceased. This source, who worked under Soled, stated that Goles placed him in contact with Eulporin in 1942 and that Subsequently Suring a period while Park was employed in the Office of the Goordinator of Inter-American Affairs both Goles and the admitted Soviet agent above-mentioned received information from the files of this agency from Park for transmittal to the Soviet Emisa. Closely associated with Park at this time was Murice Sulperin who is described in greater detail elsewhere in this memorandum. Park is known to have been in contact with other individuals strongly suspected of being Soviet agents.

### GEORGE M. PERALICE

At the present time George M. Perezish is employed by SMRM as Director of Industrial Eshabilitation, Industrial Eshabilitation Division, Yespalay Mission, According to an admitted Soviet agent, Pertaish was active for a considerable period of time, including during 1944, as a member of a Soviet espionage parallel composed of employees of the W. S. Government engaged in furnishing information from the files of Government agencies to Soviet Intelligence for transmittal to the Soviet Union. Information secured through his employment with SMRMA was furnished by Perezish to this admitted Soviet agent who contacted Fernatish on several escenions and was in turn forwarded by him to the Soviet Union through his separious and accordates in Seviet Intelligence, This Soviet agent advised for their that Perezish is a number of the Securist Pertain.

Government the information below is being set out briefly in view of its significance and in view of the fact that a number of the individuals described below were extremely presiment in the Underground Seviet Espionage Organization in agencies of the V. S. Covernment. These individuals are listed below alphabetically and not by the respective agencies proviously employing them.

### LANCHLIN MEMARIN CURRIE

From July of 1939 until senstime in 1945 with interruptions Lauchlin Currie served as an Administrative Assistant to the President of the United States. At the present time he is not explayed by the W. S. Coverment. An admitted Soviet agent has advised that at least from 1942 until 1944 Lauchlin Currie was apparently involved in a Soviet espienage parallel operating in the S. S. Government for the purpose of furnishing espionage information secured from files of W. S. Covernmental agencies to the Soviet Union through representatives of Soviet Intelligence. This admitted Soviet agent was actively engaged in this operation and upon numerous occasions procured voluminous espienage information from Governmental files at the home of Mathem Gregory Silvernaster who is described more fully electhere in this nemorandum. This Soviet agent has advised that Gurrie frequently furnished information which he received as a result of his employment to Abraham George Milvernam, described in greater detail electure in this nearrander, a reported Soviet agent and a flore associate of Bilvernathr. Isocrating to this source, Bilvernam in term furnished the information to Silvernaster who furnished it to the admitted Seviet agent above described. #### MAURICE MALPERIE

Maurice Enlocks was explored by the Department of State to which he had been transferred from the ciliae of Strategie Services until February 12, 1946 when his employment was terminated by order of the Secretary of State. As admitted Seviet agent has advised that from the latter part of 1942 until 1944, Minrice Bilporis, who was amployed by the Office of Strategie Services, during that period was entropoly active in furnishing confidential information from the files of COS to this admitted Soviet agent who, in term, arranged for its transmittel to the Seviet Union through his superiors and associates in Soviet Intelligence. This information consisted among other things of copies of buildtime and reports propered by 865, as well as emergie from State Repartment cobles. This admitted poviet agent has stated that to his knowledge Milporia, at least during this period, was an active number of an important Seviet espionage perallel sperating in the W. S. Government for the purpose of supplying information to the Seviet Intelligence service for transmittel to the Seriet Dates. A

Government and engaged in furnishing Governmental information to the Soviet Union through Soviet Intelligence representatives in the W. S. In this connection, this Soviet agent has advised that he indirectly recruited Redmont for this depictage activity and he frequently contacted Redmont in Washington, R. G. until the Spring of 1943. An admitted Soviet agent of considerable impertance who was active for a number of years in Soviet espionage operations directed toward penetrating the W. S. Government, has now advised that Peter Phodes was apparently involved in a Soviet copionage parallel functioning in the U. S. Coversment and furnishing espionage information to representatives of Soviet Intelligence for transmittal to the Seviet Baien, According to this admitted Seviet agent, Modes was furnishing such information secured through Mis on ent to deceb H. Mr. James Murphy of the Strategic Services Unit of the War Department called me at 6:10 P.M. on March 19, 1946 the Normalist and stated they have received a letter which is causing them considerable concern. They have sort of unofficial information on a siderable concern. They have sort of unofficial information on a case in which a letter has gone from the Bureau to Vandenberg with a copy to State on a man who is employed with SSU. Mr. Murphy wondered if I had any recollection of the case and since it seems to be fairly "hot" they would like to be in on it and start taking some action.

I told him if a full report had gone over to Vandenberg he would most likely be able to get this information from him. Mr. Murphy said they talked with Vandenberg's office about it but they seemed to have some trouble finding the file and Weckerling (phonetic) has been looking for it all day. Apparently they cannot locate it. They just telephoned to say not to stop the transportation, but the problem is what to do now. The man will be in there in the morning having been called back from New York and they do not want him exposed any further since he has been in a rather sensitive spot. If there is any way that they can put a little on the "credit side" they would like to do it. I stated any action they might like to take would have to leave the FBI out of the picture naturally, that is, we may furnish the information to them but whatever action taken would have to be on their own. It could not be stated that whatever action was taken because the FBI has such and such information. He said he understood this, but it seemed that we might confer on what action should be taken. they did not like to play this man at least without some, knowledge RECORDED 65-56402 and a little guidance.

Mr. Murphy was advised I would check into this parter since we had given Vandenberg quite a number of things and I wanted to be more familiar with the matter to which he was referring. He stated the initials of this man were C.S. (Claymer Schluter). I told him it might be possible to get Colonel Forney in touch with the proper file so that Mr. Murphy could work this matter out with him. I advised him I would check to see what information was given to General Vandenberg and I would get in touch with Mr. Murphy the first thing tomorrow morning, March 20, 1946. He stated his telephone number was EX-6100, Extension 635. Mr. Murphy expressed his appreciation.
