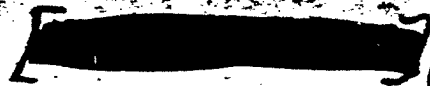

On November 27, 1945, a Mrs. Steinberg phoned Mrs. Gregory Silvermaster and inquired if the latter had Garas! (phonetic) address handy as she thought Mr. Steinberg would like to say hello to him when he went to New York the following week. Mrs. Silvermaster stated that this address was in the address book which Gregory Silvermaster carried on his person. It was indicated that Steinberg was employed in the Justice Department.

It is believed that Steinberg has been identified now as Morton Haskell Steinberg, 5335 32nd Street, Washington, D. C. He was the subject of a Departmental Applicant, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Antitrust Division Investigation in June of 1944.

Steinberg was born in St. Ignace, Michigan, November 17, 1900. His legal residence is Muskegon, Michigan. He received an A.B. degree at the University of Wisconsin; an LL.B. degree from the University of Detroit in 1926; and attended the Georgetown School of Foreign Service, Washington, D. C. in 1934 and 1935.

He was employed by the National Recovery Administration, Washington, D. C., as Assistant Counsel, February through August, 1934. He was Attorney for General Claims Arbitration between the United States and Mexico from September, 1934 through December, 1936. From January, 1937 through September, 1937 he was Special Counsel for the Special Mexican Claims Commission. From January, 1938 through April, 1943, he was Regional Counsel of the Federal Public Housing Authority. From May, 1943, to September, 1944, he was Division Counsel of the Textile Division for the War Production Board. On September 11, 1944, he was appointed Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Antitrust Division, Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. His salary since July 1, 1945, has been \$6,650.00 per annum.

Steinberg's wife's name is Elizabeth. They have two children, Judith age 13 and Daniel age 9.

During a conversation in a hotel room in Washington, D. C., between Philip Jaffe, John Service, and Andrew Roth, an informant advised that a discussion was held concerning some written material and that Jaffe and Roth were requested by Service not to mention that they had seen it because Sol (believed to be Sol Adler) would get his neck wrung pretty badly. Service further advised that he did not believe @ (possibly Joseph Gregg) had collaborated with Sol on this material. No information is available as to the exact nature of this material. (100-267370-189 pp 1,2)

Information was received from Whittaker Chambers in May of 1945 that Schlomer Adler is definitely a Communist and was employed by the United States Treasury Department. This informant further advised that he knows Adler to have been in close contact with Peter and to have made reports of a financial nature to Peter. He stated that he suspected the Communist Party was playing the stock market and that they utilized Adler's financial information in this connection. It is to be noted that Peter referred to above relates to Alexander Stevens. (100-25824-36, p. 21)

Information was received from Mr. A. A. Berle, Assistant Secretary of State, relative to Sol Adler which he had received from Whittaker Chambers in 1939. This information is to the effect that Schlomer Adler is employed by the U. S. Treasury Department and that he sent weekly reports to the Communist Party (General Counsel's Office). (100-25824-27)

Solomon Adler, United States Treasury Department, was questioned by Bureau Agents in connection with the Philip Jaffe case at which time he admitted that he was acquainted with John Service, having first met him in the Fall of 1941 in Chungking, China. He advised he considered Service to be a loyal, capable and honest person and one who would not obtain confidential information for the use of anyone. He also admitted that he was acquainted with Andrew Roth and denied having ever furnished any confidential information to him.

From a review of the Bureau files pertaining to the above individuals, it would appear that they are all in Mexico City, Mexico, at the present time and inasmuch as they are all inter-related, the information is being summarized in one memorandum.

By way of general information, as will be brought out by the references hereafter, it would seem that Luis Arrenal and his brother Leopoldo Arrenal have been active in Mexico in Communist Party affairs and that they, along with David Alfaro Siqueiros, were believed to be guilty of plotting the assassination of Leon Amalita Trejales in 1944. As a result of the attempted assassination, a guard, Robert Sheldon Marks an American citizen, was killed by the assassin. It is thought that Siqueiros and the Arrenal brothers were thought to be involved in this assassination, and that they were ever prosecuted by the Mexican government.

Rose Arrenal nee Rose Beigel met Luis Arrenal in Mexico City in 1938 and later returned to Brooklyn, New York, where she was employed as a school teacher at Public School 67, Brooklyn, New York. It is further noted that David Siqueiros was the recipient of letter number 8, postmarked January 31, 1943, in Mexico City in the Altschuler series and due to the close association between Siqueiros and the Arrenal brothers, considerable investigation has been conducted in this case in connection with the Altschuler case.

On October 9, 1943, Luis Arrenal, with alias L. A. Bastar, arrived in New Orleans aboard the MS COPIAPO at which time he was interviewed in connection with the Foreign Travel Control Program. In the report of Special Agent Harold J. Fleming, New York City, dated October 17, 1943, in the case entitled "L. A. Bastar with aliases, Internal Security," it is noted that Rose Beigel Arrenal is a naturalized citizen of the United States and was employed as a teacher at Public School 67, St. Edwards Street, Brooklyn, New York. She was believed to reside at 998 Carrol Street in that city. The files reveal that Luis Arrenal was on his way to visit his wife and their two small children at the time he arrived in New Orleans. Rose Beigel had two close relatives, Sam Beigel a brother and Max Seberer a brother-in-law believed to be living in Brooklyn. In a New Orleans report dated October 21, 1943, in the case involving Luis Arrenal, it is indicated that Rose Beigel Arrenal had listed - Major Samuel Feinson, CO, Jackson Barracks, New Orleans Port of Embarkation, as a reference. Feinson advised the New Orleans Field Division that he was well acquainted with Rose Arrenal and her mother but could not vouch for Luis Arrenal. Previous addresses listed for Rose Arrenal are 912 - 44th Street, Brooklyn, New York; 240 East 11th Street, New York City; 210 East 15th Street, New York City, and 187 Jerusalem Street, Brooklyn, New York. Her father is listed as residing at 240 East 18th Street, New York City as of the year 1938. On October 1, 1943, she took leave from the school system in Brooklyn and indicated she would be gone until September 7, 1944. Her address was listed as J. Vicens, Paris Y, Mexico, D. F. (65-43302-1345)

Regarding Luis Arrenal, the files indicate that he was born January 2,

1908 in Mexico City. It is noted that several references in [redacted] dates of birth and one lists January 2, 1907 in Mexico City. It appears that he was educated in Mexico and in California and that his occupation was a painter and artist, although for a short time he was employed by an insurance company. He married Rosa Arzanal August 22, 1938 in Mexico City and they have two children, Ricardo and Julia, both minors. Luis has indicated that he was in the United States during parts of 1938, 1939 and 1940 and that in connection with his occupation as a painter, he has been attached to the Secretariat of Public Education in Mexico City. In 1938, he was an assistant to David Alfaro Siqueiros at the Chevinard School of Art. In 1938, he was a delegate to the First Congress of American Artists in New York City as a representative of the Revolutionary Writers and Artists of Mexico. He has stated that he was a member of the National Revolutionary Party and the League of Revolutionary Artists in Mexico and the CEN Workers Party and was a member of the Communist Party. During his interview at the time of arrival in New Orleans, he presented a temporary visa issued at the American Consulate in Santiago, Chile, dated September 11, 1942. He advised that he had previously been in Santiago, Chile, Argentina and Cuba doing art work. He denied that he was involved in the killing of Robert Sheldon Harte and, in fact, stated that he was in New York City at that time. He was not recommended for entry into the United States. (100-36477) U

Concerning Leopoldo Arzanal, the Bureau's files reflect that he was alleged to be involved, along with Luis and David Siqueiros, in the killing of Harte on May 24, 1940, at the time an attempted assassination was made of Leon Tretsky. Luis Arzanal has stated that at the time of the attempted assassination of Tretsky, that Leopoldo was in Veracruz. Other information would indicate that in Mexico Leopoldo was engaged in fomenting strikes and labor troubles among employees of Mexican railroads. He is an alleged Communist. (u)

There is no record in the Bureau files concerning Rosa Arzanal, other than the fact that she is the wife of Leopoldo. U

In the case entitled "Jacques Bernard Via Desfréché, with aliases et al., Espionage - R," it is noted that in the report of Special Agent E. S. Gannon, New York City, dated March 2, 1941, that investigation was conducted in the vicinity of 398 Carroll Street, Brooklyn, New York, in an effort to locate Rosa Arzanal. It was determined that Mrs. Rosa B. Arzanal was not residing at that address but had moved to 261 Washington Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and was occupying Apartment 22. Inquiry at this address indicated that Mrs. Arzanal had moved in with her two daughters and a colored maid. There was no record of a man living at this address, but the investigation showed that Mrs. Arzanal went out frequently in the evening and on one occasion had received a visitor described as a short, dark man with a Spanish accent. A maid overheard the following letters: U

At that time, Anita Brenner, 182 Caryl Street, Yonkers, New York, was interviewed and stated that she had spent several years in Mexico City where she resided in the Liberal Section of the City and she said that she had become acquainted with the Arenal brothers and later saw Luis Arenal at the Mexican exhibit at the World's Fair in New York City. She said she had not seen him since. U

The Office of Censorship advised that on March 28, 1945, Rose Arenal, address Lisbon 14, Apartment 7, Mexico, D. F., had written a letter to Mrs. Bessie Baigel, 15 Crown Street, Brooklyn 25, New York, at which time she acknowledged receipt of Bessie's letter and advised that she and the children were well. She mentioned Joe Baigel in an innocuous way and also said that she was glad to hear Rita looked so well and that she was excited about Rita's coming. It would appear, therefore, that Rose Arenal, as of March, 1945, was still residing in Mexico City. U

There are numerous references in the Altschuler case and the following is taken from a review of that file: U

A Laboratory report dated March 15, 1944, concerning Rose Arenal's correspondence intercepted by Censorship reflected that she had written and received letters from E. F. Auerbach, Wayne Avenue, Bronx, New York, and also from Mrs. Anna Bankstein, 1025 St. John's Place, Brooklyn, New York; Mrs. Hanna Leroi, 61 West 83rd Street, New York City, and Pfc Max Seborer, San Marcus, Texas. She also wrote on February 12, 1944 a letter to Miss Ann Hook of 59 West 12th Street, New York City.

On February 15, 1944, Louis Slevits, 822 Lexington Avenue, New York City sent three American Express Company traveler's checks for \$50 each to Rose Arenal, Paris 7, Mexico, D. F. The money apparently paid for curies which Rose Arenal obtained for Slevits. Inquiry concerning Slevits by the New York Field Division reflected that he owns and operates a "Pan-American" shop at 822 Lexington Avenue, New York City. He was born April 5, 1907, in Brooklyn, New York, and is registered at Local Board 262, Jamaica, Long Island. His occupation consists of arranging all details of importing of various articles from South America, including correspondence, negotiation, import, etc. A Laboratory examination of the three traveler's checks was negative. U (65-43302-2303-pg.57) U

With further reference to information concerning Rose Arenal contained

in the Alto case, it is mentioned that my Laboratory report of April 27, 1944, the Bureau furnished photographs of an Office of Censorship intercepted letter from Rose Arenal to Mildred Constantine, Library of Congress, Reference Department, Hispanic Foundation, Washington, D. C. This letter was personal in nature, but mentioned that a Mrs. Ross wrote Rose that Mildred would receive \$30 for the work she had done in the Coordinator's Office. It was believed this was for making posters. U (65-43302-2595 pg. 7) U

In a Laboratory report of June 9, 1944, dealing with a letter from Rose Arenal to her brother Joe Baigel, 35 Crown Street, Brooklyn, New York, she mentioned that Leo Matiss was in Mexico and that when Matiss returned to New York he would call Joe. In a Laboratory report of June 10, 1944, a letter was mentioned from Lou Slevits to Rose in which there was information concerning the purchase of Mexican articles by Slevits through Rose Arenal. He mentioned that he was going to hold a showing of Luis's works along with other artists. In a Laboratory report of June 22, 1944, there was a letter from Joe Baigel to Rose in which appeared the following: "I received the packages from Kurt and visited Slevits. My friends the Fallers are going to Mexico via Cook's Tour. I recommended them to you for buying purposes only." In a Laboratory report of June 16, 1944, in a letter from Rita Seborer, Rose's sister, to Rose appeared the following: "How is mother's brother? Should I send him \$25.00? You can visit him." It was noted that Mrs. Sarah Baigel, Rose's mother, apparently had a brother in Mexico City whose name, address and occupation were unknown. U

A Laboratory report of June 23, 1944 concerned a letter from Rose to Mr. and Mrs. Lou Auerbach, 3400 Wayne Avenue, Bronx, New York. This letter contained personal conversation. It was noted, however, that in a letter from Rose to Joe and Bess Baigel there appeared the following: "Kurt received your letter and may be I will get some commissions --- Luis is having trouble with his agrarian problem which is o.k. --- Have you met your friends Brecker and Mechtan?" Brecker and Mechtan were previously mentioned in the Alto case as having left New York on a trip to Mexico. They were friends of Wolf Gerstein. In the same Laboratory report was a letter from Rose to her sister, Rita Seborer in Brooklyn, dated May 29, 1944, which contained the following: "Today I told a gentleman flying to New York to call SI and give you all our love." It was believed that this individual was one Shoverer, a Director of the General Tire and Rubber Company, Akron, Ohio, who arrived in New York City, staying at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel. In a postscript, Rose asked: "Why don't you get in touch with Hanna, 61 West 83 Street, Telephone BC 4-9817?" In a Laboratory report of June 23, 1944, it was mentioned that in a letter from Rose to her brother Joe Baigel she stated: "Stavenhagen might attend too. Lillian Balores too." U

A Laboratory report of June 27, 1944 concerned a letter of June 5, 1944 from Mrs. Astle, 257 "A" 5th Street, Santa Monica, California, to Rose Arenal writing rooms for two months. She stated that Dr. Ross of Santa Monica had recommended Paris Number 7 to her. U

A Laboratory report dated July 22, 1944, concerned a letter addressed to Mrs. Rose Arenal, Mexico, D. F., with the return address A. Siskind, Chilmark, Massachusetts. In this letter the writer said "Are you resigning from the system?" U

It was thought that the "system" might have reference to the Soviet Apparatus System. Due to the fact that Rose Arenal was considering resigning from the public school system, it was considered that this resignation was the matter referred to. U (65-43302-3425-pg. 8) U

A Laboratory report of August 21, 1944, concerned a Postal Intercept of August 8, 1944 from Esther Cushman, 262 West 12th Street, New York City, addressed to Rose Arenal. This letter requested Rose to find and send the address of Estella Martin (Mrs. Albert Martin), with whom Esther used to correspond and who used to live in Chile. Cushman stated: "The CTH might know or the Mexican branch of Amkins, if there is such a thing. How has the Left Bank element affected the life of Mexico? I imagine there must be quite a change." The FBI Laboratory report of August 23, 1944 concerned a Postal Intercept letter of August 7, 1944 from Rose Arenal to Mr. and Mrs. Auerbach, 3400 Wayne Avenue, Bronx, New York. This letter was a personal letter, but it was pointed out in the Bureau files that Miles Shorever, while in New York, had contacted a Mrs. Auerbach who might be identical with the one mentioned above. U (65-43302-3620, pg.19) U

A Laboratory report of September 12, 1944 concerned a letter of August 24, 1944 to Rose Arenal from Helen Fuller, 138-30 223 Street, Laurelton 13, Long Island, New York. Fuller mentioned having been in Mexico City where she visited Arenal and also mentioned that Ruth Seff, an old colleague of Rose, was going to Mexico with her husband and would look up Rose. Fuller's husband's name is Bernie. U

A Laboratory report of September 15 concerned a postal card of August 23 from Mrs. Arenal to Mrs. Adolph Suhsdorf, Montclair, New Jersey. This letter advised that Mrs. Suhsdorf and her daughter could have a room at Arenal's residence. U

A Laboratory report of September 18, 1944, concerned a letter of September 5 from Rita Seborer to her sister, Rose Arenal, in which Rita indicated she planned to visit Mexico. U

A Laboratory report of September 20, 1944, concerned a letter of August 29 to Mrs. Essette Arenal from Wyman E. Nelson, Mexican and Indian artist, P. O. Box 377, Summerville, New Jersey. Nelson mentioned that a friend of his, John Arvenio, while in Mexico had bought several pieces of silver from his exporter in Mexico City. Arenal lost the name and address of the firm but told Nelson that Arenal could furnish Nelson with the name of this firm. It later appeared that Mrs. John Arvenio was undertaking a trip to Mexico City in the early part of October, 1944. U

A Laboratory report of September 20, 1944, concerned a letter of August 20 from Rose Arenal to Esther Cushman, 262 West 12th Street, New York City. Rose stated she was teaching in the American school in Mexico City and that could not think of going back to teaching at home. She enclosed an address to Mrs. Cushman of Mrs. Martin, Apdo, 1189, San Jose, Costa Rica. U

In a Laboratory report of the same date a letter was mentioned dated August 30 from Rose Arenal to Max Seborer, in which she stated "As for Luis, that"

A laboratory report of October 17 concerned a letter of September 29, 1944 from Rose to Aaron Siskind, previously mentioned. Benitz was going on to do radio and reporting work in Europe. U

A laboratory report of December 15, 1944, concerned a letter post-marked at New York November 30, 1944, addressed to Mrs. Arenal, Paris 7, Mexico City. This letter was signed Teresa. Teresa indicated that she had seen Slovitz who, she said, was quite vexed with Berta Arenal since he had given Berta money for a pocketbook for his wife and had heard nothing further concerning it. She stated "I realize that you have big debts to pay but still you should not forget the little ones. Will you please tell Louis (probably Luis Arenal) that I expect him to pay up his debt, etc." U

A laboratory report of January 6, 1945, concerned a letter to Mrs. Bettelheim, 1301 Lincoln Place, Brooklyn, New York. This was a personal letter but it will be recalled that Mrs. Bettelheim has been noted in the past as corresponding with Rose Arenal and that she is also a friend of the Arenal brothers in Mexico City. In this letter Rose stated: "As for posters, I am sure Elizabeth is in touch with all that --- I am sort of out of touch. Of course, I see David --- but that is about all." Elizabeth was believed to be Elizabeth Gilman, also a correspondent of Rose Arenal, and David was believed to be Jose David Alfaro Siquieros. U

Jones, San Antonio, Texas, dated May 16, 1945, in the case entitled "Lydia Altschuler, with aliases, et al, Internal Security - R," had advised that he had intercepted a letter from Mythe Henderson, Guernavaca, Mexico, to Robert S. Greenfield, 216 North Clinton Street, Chicago, Illinois. U

Mirah, San Antonio, Texas, dated February 8, 1945, in the case entitled "Harry Aaron Bloom, Security Matter - C," shows that the name "Mrs. Arenal, Calle, Paris 7, near Hotel Reforma" was found in the notebook of this subject who resided at 4500 Broadway, New York City. The Bureau files show that the Office of Censorship furnished a copy of a letter dated May 8, 1944, from Rose Arenal to Victor Bernstein of PM. This letter enclosed articles of interest to Bernstein and Rose stated that she was sending these at the request of Cesar Ortis who is apparently acquainted with both. From the letter it would appear that Rose thought the article would be of interest to Bernstein and that he might possibly pay for any future articles. By letter dated February 1, 1945, to the Office of Censorship the name Rose Beigel Arenal was deleted from the Watch List. U

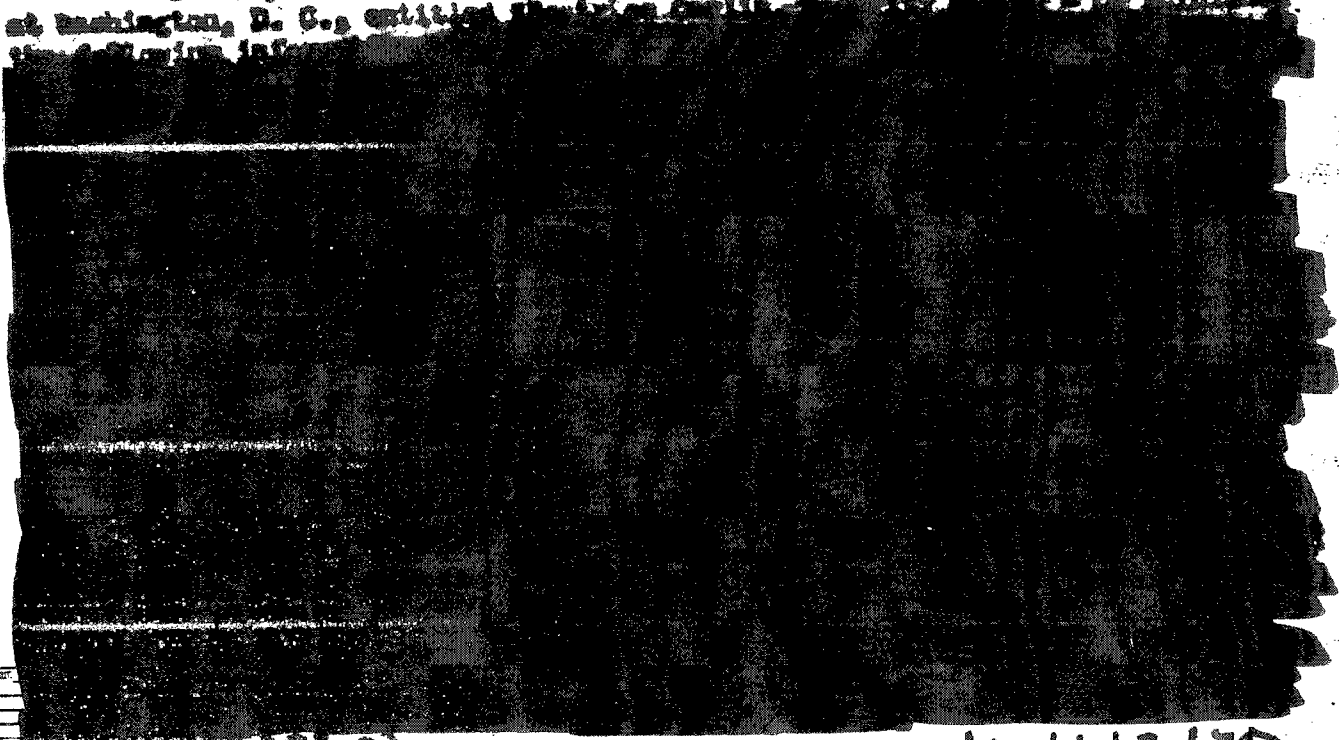
INTRODUCTION

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley advised that sometime in the spring of 1936 she was approached by Beatrice Carlin who was at that time employed in the city office of the American League Against War and Fascism. Beatrice Carlin told her that she was desirous of securing her services to assist a foreigner who was coming to the United States in the near future in speaking English and taking care of some of his business affairs. Beatrice Carlin approached Elizabeth Bentley several times thereafter concerning this matter and eventually in November of 1936 Elizabeth Bentley was introduced to Joseph Eckhart by Beatrice Carlin. The report of Special Agent Oscar J. Hays, dated March 24, 1946, Washington, D. C., in the case entitled Beatrice Carlin, Security Matter, revealed that [redacted] had advised that Beatrice Carlin left Washington, D. C. around the first part of January, 1946, but the local Communist Political Association did not have her address or know to what city she had gone. This informant further stated that this individual was being considered transferred out by the local association, although no actual transfer could be issued until Beatrice Carlin had communicated with them. An investigation at the residence at 1945 - 28th Street, N. W., at which address Beatrice Carlin resided while in Washington, D. C., disclosed this to be a residence occupied by two families in the Georgetown section. Under an appropriate pretext, inquiry was made of Mrs. Nathaniel Wajl and it was learned from her that she was the daughter of Beatrice Carlin and that Beatrice Carlin had returned permanently to New York City where she had taken a house. INTRODUCTION

Klimbeth Terrill Bentley in her statement, advised that in about May of 1940 Jacob Golos introduced her to one Abe Brothman who at that time resided in Nassau County, New York, and who was employed at the Republic Steel Company in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania as an engineer. After she met this individual he told her that he wanted to have some blue prints copied and give the copies to Golos. Klimbeth Bentley stated that she recalled that from early summer of 1940 until sometime in the fall of 1940 she met Abe Brothman approximately ten times, and that sometimes Golos would meet Abe Brothman to obtain his blue prints but whenever Golos could not make these appointments she would do it. Most of these meetings took place in front of the Heuler Safe Company at 3rd Street and 5th Avenue, New York City. Abe Brothman would meet her and they would usually go to dinner and during the course of the meal or later in the evening he would turn over these blue prints. Klimbeth Bentley was unable to recall how many separate prints there were, as they would come in an envelope. She remembered that on a great number of occasions the prints that Abe Brothman gave her were copies they had made. However, on several occasions it would be necessary for her to take the originals and have copies made which she would give to Golos and would return the originals to Abe Brothman at some future date. U

Abe Brothman never told her that it was imperative that she have these blue prints copied and the originals returned to him in the immediate future. Sometime during these happenings Klimbeth Bentley learned from either Abe Brothman or Jacob Golos that these blue prints were of commercial bottles which she understood to be some kind of commercial vat. However, she was not sure of this deduction. Whenever she had to have copies made she would take them to the numerous stores that do this work on Portland Street, New York City. She could not recall the names of any of these shops. Toward the fall of 1940 Golos told Klimbeth Bentley that he was becoming somewhat discouraged in his dealings with Abe Brothman and told her that he was going to turn him over to someone else. She never learned from Golos or anyone else to whom Golos directed Abe Brothman. U

A complete check of the Bureau files has been made in the name Abe Brothman and Abraham Brothman and the following information was obtained. However it is not known whether this individual is identical with the individual referred to by Klimbeth Bentley or not.

The report of Special Agent James W. Brown, dated New York, New York, June 11, 1945, in the case entitled "Julius Karchian, with aliases, Internal Security - C" reveals that Julius Karchian is considered a key figure of the Communist Party in the New York Field Division. Julius Karchian is International Vice President of the IWOOP and 1945 delegate to the Greater New York CIO Industrial Union Council and a member of the Architect Committee of the National Council for American Soviet Friendship, and was architect in June, 1944, for the American-Russian Institute, remodeling this. The report further reveals that on August 15, 1944, Abraham Brothman organized a consulting engineering firm known as Abe Brothman and Associates, a partnership with offices in room 1606 at 114 East 32nd Street, New York City. The partnership consisted of the following: Abraham Brothman, age 31; Earl S. Barish, age 29; Gerhart Wollan, age 34; Oscar J. Vago, age 47; Julius Karchian, age 40. The partnership began operations on August 15, 1944, and the style of business name was taken by the partnership on August 29, 1944. U

According to the above mentioned report, Abraham Brothman was a native-born citizen of Russian extraction and held a 2-B classification under Selective Service. He graduated from Columbia University in 1933 with a Commercial Engineering Degree and was employed by the Hendrick Manufacturing Company of Pennsylvania, but in July, 1942, became Vice President of the Chemistry Design Corporation. U

Abraham Brothman is known to the Bureau as a signer of the Communist Party nominating petition at New York City in 1943, in which petition he gave his address as 4108 - 42nd Street, Long Island City. U

According to an informant, Abraham Brothman interested himself in such reading matter as the April 1945 issue of "Political Affairs," text book of Dialectical Materialism; "Economics of Barbarism" by J. Kuczynsky and M. Witt; "Three Hundred Million Slaves and Serfs" by Kuczynsky; and the May, 1945 issue of the "American Review of the Soviet Union", a quarterly published by the American-Russian Institute, New York City. U

Information was received that Abe Brothman and Associates were engaged as Consulting Engineers and Architects, doing work principally for two accounts, namely the Bridgeport Brass Company at Bridgeport, Connecticut, and Craver Tank and Manufacturing Company, Chicago, on a contract basis. All expenses incurred in work done for these two concerns were paid by those concerns according to the contract arrangements. The work performed includes development work, plant design, process engineering and automatic equipment designing. U

The informant who furnished the above information understood that operations of the enterprise had been on a satisfactory basis since the creation of the partnership and that the firm had no occasion to seek general commercial credit. Abe Brothman and Associates maintains an account at the National City Bank, 12nd Street Branch, New York City. Prior to organizing the firm of Abe Brothman and Associates, Abraham Brothman was connected with the Chemistry Design Corporation which was located at 420 Lexington Avenue, as of January 8, 1945. The officers of this corporation were named as Henry A. Calyans, President; Abraham Brothman, Vice President; Arthur T. Webber, Secretary. This corporation was incorporated on July 7, 1942, in Connecticut and operates as a Chemical Engineering and Manufacturing Concern producing processed chemicals and equipment, the principal products being feed and synthetic rubber materials. The corporation, in June, 1944, was erecting a chemical plant designed by its engineers in Connecticut. Brothman resigned on August 15, 1944, at which time he organized a consulting engineering firm of Abe Brothman and Associates. U 100-10589-22 U

INTRODUCTION

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley in her statement advised that Helen Tenney was supplying certain material in 1942 to Jacob Golos which she had access to in the course of her duties with a Short-Wave Unit of the Office of Strategic Services in New York City. Elizabeth Bentley stated that she was not exactly sure of the nature of this outfit except that if it was not actually an Office of Strategic Services division it, at least, was sponsored by the Office of Strategic Services and had to do with procurement of persons to be employed outside the United States by OSS. This concern was interested in persons of almost every nationality, and Helen Tenney's work apparently consisted in the most part of compiling biographical data concerning persons whom OSS was considering employing. Such data were turned over to Jacob Golos by Helen Tenney and Elizabeth Bentley further stated that she recalled having seen some of this type of material. Elizabeth Bentley further stated that one Marya Blaw was in charge of this Unit in New York City. U

A complete check of the files of this Bureau was instituted in the name of the above captioned individual which reflected the following information. U

In the case entitled "Passengers PAI NS 18612, Trip 12-020, Arrived, New York City, September 23, 1945; Foreign Travel Control," Mrs. Marya Hansen Blaw, with alias Marya Hansen, furnished the following information concerning herself. She advised that she was born on November 14, 1904, at New York City and that her home address and destination was 228 East 61st Street, New York, New York. She presented United States Passport Number 784424, which was issued September 29, 1943, at Washington, D. C. She advised that her occupation is that of a journalist and that she was employed by the "New Yorker" Magazine. She was returning from Portugal and Spain after having been on assignment by that magazine. She left the United States on May 30, 1944, and proceeded to Lisbon where she remained for approximately six weeks. She subsequently visited Madrid, Barcelona, and San Sebastian, all in Spain, and then returned to Lisbon where she obtained passage on the clipper. Mrs. Blaw had in her possession two letters from Mrs. Eren, wife of a British Passport Control officer in Madrid. These letters were addressed to Viscount Simon De Vaulchierve, 580 Fifth Avenue, New York City, in care of Raymond Lowy, and to Mr. and Mrs. Leiferheld, 1175 Park Avenue, New York, New York. It is noted that the interviewing Agent read the letters in the possession of Mrs. Blaw and labeled them as appearing to have no consequence. Mrs. Blaw had in her possession a third letter which was described as written in Danish. She stated that this letter was for Mr. Hans Bendix, employed in the Danish Section of the Office of War Information, 224 West 57th Street, New York City. The letter was from Leisvan Wilhelm Hansen to H. Claus Damback, Lisbon, and was dated July 23, 1944, at Hoeslegaard. 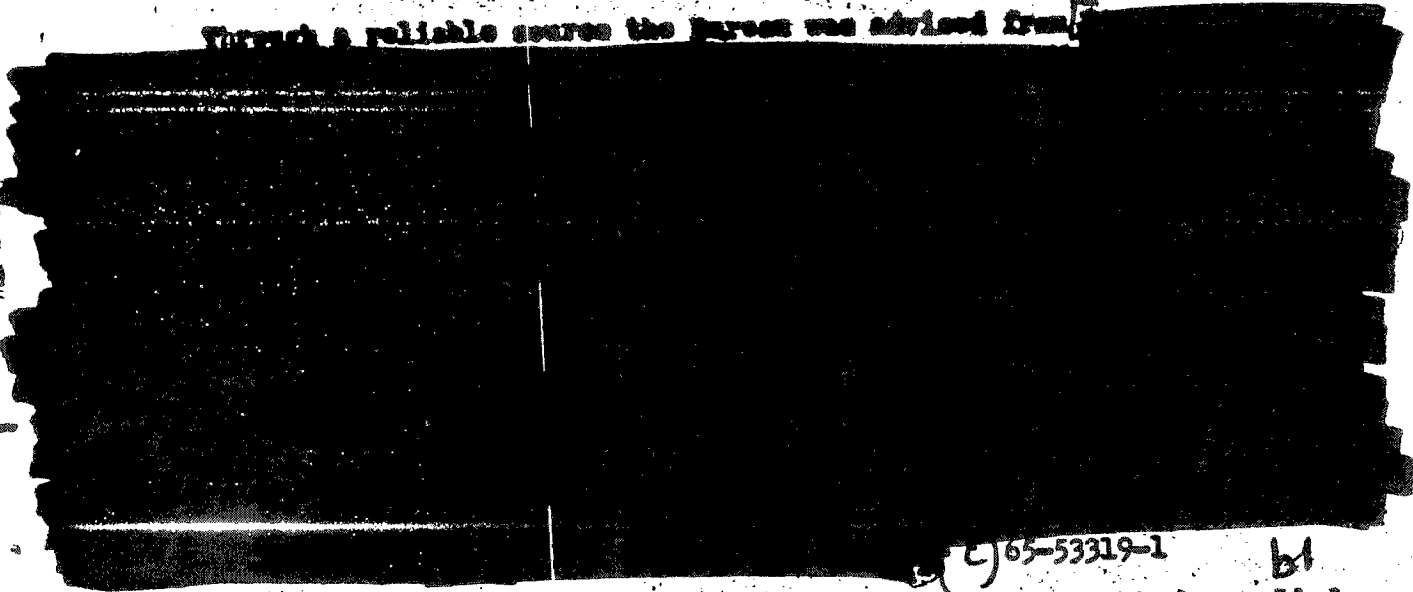

Paul Hagen, according to this report, claimed that he was advised by the State Department he would not have to register as a foreign agent and his group, "The New Beginning" was not a part of any political party, although he had corresponded state that "The New Beginning" is a section of the German Social Democratic Party. The above report further reveals that a 28 page memorandum had been prepared, evidently by one Guenther Reichardt, concerning Paul Hagen's activities and his influence in the German branch of the overseas division of the Office of War Information. In reply to that 28 page memorandum, Paul Hagen prepared a memorandum. It was alleged in the 28 page memorandum a radio group (of the International Coordination Council) was formed to create a basis for obtaining American Government radio jobs for Paul Hagen's friends. In answer to the allegation, Paul Hagen stated as follows: "Before the war, in 1940 and 1941, an International Coordination Council existed. It was a group of liberal Americans and Europeans from different countries. Its purpose was to create a European contact center in the United States to have better cooperation in the fight against Hitler and in post-Hitler Europe. The group set up a radio committee with Mrs. Marya Blaw as a secretary of this committee. That happened long before the entrance of the United States into the war. It was neither a coordination of information nor an office of war information and there was no Government jobs available. The radio committee studied broadcast techniques with particular emphasis on underground movements and democratic forces in Europe and tried to get time on WEHL and NEC. Its purpose was not to get anybody a job but to make the voice of the people who could furnish a liaison to European groups audible in Europe. The Council was practically dissolved by the time the war agencies began operating. Most of the Europeans from victimized nations joined their own united organizations and centers. None of the former members were placed by me (Paul Hagen) or any other member of the Council in a Government job. Mrs. Marya Blaw formed a new organization 'Short-Wave Research' U

Incorporated, which served as a kind of a temporary try-out and part-time hiring agency under Government contract for hiring foreign language personnel for the Office of War Information, but by that time I had no contact with Short-Wave Research, Incorporated, any more." U 100-91015-41 U

The report of Special Agent Edmund S. Sanford, dated September 11, 1944, New York City, entitled "American Friends of German Freedom, Internal Security - C", furnishes the following information. Marya Hanes Elow was carried on the Executive Committee of the American Friends of German Freedom. The investigation revealed that Marya Hanes Elow was one of the temporary directors of Short-Wave Research, Incorporated. The articles of incorporation, New York County, of Short-Wave Research, Incorporated, reflect that this organization was created to obtain material "for transmission by radio, cable, etc. to receivers beyond the continental limits of the USA for the purpose of protecting and safeguarding from attack the continued existence of the USA as an independent and sovereign power." In the report of Special Agent Edward F. Sumner, dated June 23, 1944, New York, New York, entitled "Karl Hermann Josef Frank, with aliases, Internal Security - R", it was reported that Marya H. Elow was on the Executive Committee of the American Friends of German Freedom, which organization possessed, in the most part, members of left-wing organizations in New York City and vicinity. Paul Hagen was the research director of this organization. U 100-91015-35, page 50 U

The report of Special Agent Leonard F. McAlpin, dated July 14, 1943, at New York, New York, in the case entitled "Communist Infiltration of the Radiation Laboratory, University of California, Berkeley, California, Internal Security - C", reveals that Marya Elow of Short-Wave Research, Incorporated, was a reference to Gunnar Leistiky who was employed by the Office of War Information as an assistant language editor. Leistiky was, in turn, a reference for M. Hinkle, a subject in the Glavin case, who was seeking employment in a company at Camas, Washington. U 100-190625-220, page 13 U

The report of Special Agent James H. Merritt, dated November 18, 1942, at New York, New York, in the case entitled "VTV - French Language Magazine, Internal Security - C", reveals that Marya Elow, who was described as assistant secretary of Short-Wave Research, Incorporated, Room 1106, 730 Fifth Avenue, New York City, was interviewed in connection with furnishing information concerning Andre Breton who was an editorial adviser of the VTV - French Language Magazine. This report reveals that Andre Breton was employed as a staff announcer for the Office of War Information; that Marya Elow advised she was acquainted with Andre Breton; that she thought that he had gone to Mexico prior to coming U

to the United States; and that he probably lived with a group of artists and writers there. Marya Elow further stated that Andre Breton was known to be a left-wing and was head of the Surrealist Movement in France in writing and in poetry. She also stated that Breton was employed by the Short-Wave Research, Incorporated of 730 Fifth Avenue, which organization supplied aliens for Government employment from March, 1942, to July, 1942, at which time Breton was under Civil Service, and that during this entire time he was staff announcer for the Office of War Information. The report of Special Agent Joseph T. Jones, dated January 21, 1943, at New York City, entitled "Luigi Giovanni Baldescari, with aliases, Italian Security - X, alias, alias, alias," reveals that Mrs. Marya Elow, Short-Wave Research, Incorporated, 730 Fifth Avenue, was interviewed for information concerning the subject of that investigation. Marya Elow advised that she had met Baldescari about two years previously and that he hated the Nazis. She further stated that he had worked with the British in some undercover movement concerning Italy but she could not state what it was. She stated that she suspected him because he appeared to be too smooth and further because he had denounced some Fascists and anti-Fascists for a Government agency and that he had listed a number of suspicious persons and had listed anti-Fascist names with Fascist names. Marya Elow furnished additional information concerning the subject of the above investigation. U 100-39415-4 U

On October 13, 1944, the New Orleans Field Division advised that when John Y., a double agent in the COCASE case, Espionage - G, arrived in New Orleans on the SS Magallanes, October 12, 1944, he had in his possession a brief case in which there were a number of miscellaneous papers. Contained in this brief case was a small note book or diary in which appeared many references. One of these references was as follows; Maria (Mary) Hannes -- c/o New Yorker, 25 West 43rd Street, New York City; Barnard College, Vocational Bureau, New York City (together with following, secretary, knowledge French, typing, some business experience, preferably American). The report of Special Agent Wendell R. Steaps, New York, New York, November 3, 1944, entitled "Herman Sennet, with aliases, Espionage - G," on page 57, reveals that in the daily activities of John Y. (double agent in that investigation), he had met Maria Hannes on October 24, 1944, at the Hotel Pierre Bar, New York City, where she had a few drinks with him. U 64-20026-1304, p. 2

The report of Special Agent S. Michael Prosen, dated April 13, 1944, New York, New York, in the case entitled "Anatole Alin de Montmarquet, with aliases, alias, alias, alias," reveals the subject of that investigation had been in contact with several individuals, including Mrs. Mary Elow -- Helen Tenny. 730 Fifth Avenue, New York City. This investigation revealed that the subject was reported to have made statements of an anti-American and British character U

and to have endeavored to elicit from French sailors information regarding French war ships and personnel while visiting a canteen in New York city. In an interview he admitted having discussed various military engagements with French sailors in which they had participated for the purpose of obtaining material for a book which he intends to publish in the near future. He denied having made statements of similar character and declared that his primary interest is for France. He also asserted that the American and French Governments have falsified reports of the military situation regarding France and had succeeded in placing her in an unfavorable position. Informants consider Montgomery slightly mentally unbalanced and that no evidence was developed indicating that he was engaged in activities inimical to the welfare of the United States. U

The Bureau files reflect the following information concerning the above individual: u

In the report of Special Agent A. J. Andrews, Miami, Florida, dated July 18, 1942, entitled "Edward Rudolph F. Van Maltsahn, with aliases, Espionage C," it is noted that among the household effects in the subject's possession in his room at the Dusoto Hotel at Tampa, Florida, was found a letter addressed to Mrs. Van Maltsahn. This letter was from Ben Whitman, 75 Riverside Drive, New York City, and dated July 8, 1942. In this letter Whitman states: u

"Dear Mrs. Van Maltsahn: u

"Your letter reached me yesterday afternoon. Its contents were not exactly a surprise (with the exception of the details, of course). For when I read meagre published reports during the week-end of 'L's affairs Gaugh' I realized that the lid was off down there and was prepared to hear almost anything. u

"Your suggestion to get in touch with either STEPHEN WISE, DOROTHY THOMPSON, or MORGENTHAU would be simply grasping out for possible straws. It so happens that, as far as STEPHEN WISE is concerned, it would almost have the opposite effect desired. That I happen to know. Pontifically, he would put your righteous indignation to slumber. As far as DOROTHY THOMPSON or MORGENTHAU are concerned, I could do nothing more than write them a letter. He both know what results we would get through that method. u

"However, a close friend of mine, a Mr. LOUIS BERDANSKY, is one of the field men of the Joint Distribution Committee (for Jewish refugees). He has been with that organization since its inception, which was about the period when the Nazis came into power. Should you not be familiar with the organization in all countries where representation is possible, they assist refugees to arrive in the States (or other countries) and find ways and means to settle them and get them started, if at all possible to support themselves. u

"Mr. BERDANSKY travels the length and breadth of the United States organizing small Jewish communities to accept and absorb these refugees with the least possible commotion or publicity (during the early years of this work, the Committee was confronted with the obstacles of opposition from other racial groups of a given community on the basis that a job given to refugees was one taken away from an American). He is rarely in New York, but I immediately get in touch with his wife (who is the director of the Everwald School for Girls) which is a school for subnormal children who are either orphans or come from broken homes. It is connected with the Jewish Orphanage. She would know where I could reach Mr. u

BORDANKY. Luck was with me. He was in town, having only just returned the day before from Oklahoma for a strained ligament in his back. U

"He went up to see him last night. I gave him the background of the situation and your letter. He told me at once that the situation was difficult. The same thing happened in Panama, he said, the day after Pearl Harbor. They got a spy scare down there and rounded up over 100 Jewish refugees, including women and children, and put them in a concentration camp. Panama claimed that they were dangerous and did not want them loose. Representations to the State Department from the Joint Committee only succeeded in getting them released in the custody of the Federal Government (which means the FBI) for transshipment to the U.S. They were distributed in different camps throughout the West and Southwest until each case is investigated separately. The plan was to release each case when satisfactorily investigated, into the custody of the Joint Distribution Committee for their resettlement. LOUIS said that so far (it is over five months) there has not been one person released by the Federal Government. They (the Committee) are working at present to at least have the women and children released, but up to the present moment without success. U

LOUIS said that he will present the whole matter to the Committee this morning and will get in touch with me within a day or so to let me know the results. He said that any refugees in E.H. had been settled there through the Committee and that they would know the names you have mentioned. Also, he said that in every country the Committee has representatives (which probably were the very ones you named). U

"He knows of the whole matter you also mentioned regarding the finances of the projected settlement of the 400 refugees. Although he did not recall the name of WISE as the person in charge of the negotiations, he knew well the person in charge of the whole matter at the office (this gentleman by the way arrived in Shanghai before Pearl Harbor to take charge of the Shanghai Office. He is now under Japanese 'protective custody'). U

"E.H., LOUIS said, was the most difficult country in the whole Western World to settle any refugees. A capital of at least \$2,000 was required before permission to enter was granted. U

"One thing at least you can rely on is that the Committee here will know of the condition and of the status of those mentioned in your letter in particular. They are known to be efficient and especially make a point of keeping any such situation alive and brewing until some sort of adjudication is arrived at. The possibility that your friends will be swallowed up, lost or disappear, is courted out. U

"As soon as I hear anything definite I will write you at once." U

In addition, information appears to the effect that the name Louis Berdansky is listed as being on the board of the publication Social Work Today. It is noted that Social Work Today groups were formed throughout the United States of America, having a Communist background, and a large part of the personnel was composed of Communists and fellow travelers. As of 1941, Social Work Today was published monthly by Social Work Today, Incorporated, 112 East 19 Street, New York City. It was entered as second class matter December 19, 1934 at the Post Office, New York, New York. U

A letter was received by the Bureau postmarked August 23, 1940, which states: U

"I should like to call to your attention neglect of investigative the un-American, Subversive Activities in the Social Service Employees Union - and the State, County and Municipal Workers of America, both CIO and 100% Communist controlled. The Communist members are not only using the Unions as fronts, but are planning independent subversive acts because of their large numbers and ideas. U

"Copy of list to Dies Committee and N. Y. Police Red Squad to follow. I trust that your investigation and measures will be sincere and thoroughgoing. Activity of this Union in National Refugee Service in N.Y.C. and elsewhere in particular is overwhelmingly in cooperation with German Gestapo and agents and Communist Agents. The functions of SCNWA is among relief agents, unemployed and CCC Camps as well as in the Government Departments in which they function. U

"(No signature - anonymous)" U

Among the names listed was "Louis Berdansky - travelling in S.W. for National Refugee Service." U

Further reference to the name Louis Berdansky is contained in the case entitled, "Alexis Prohor Gaidash, Espionage - R." U

On March 15, 1942, Alexis Prohor Gaidash addressed a letter to Pierre Debdoxolsky, 5 Club Street, City of Armair, North Caucasus, USSR, Russia, enclosing a photographic copy of a letter from Brown University Alumni Fund and a University News letter from that institution on which many words were underscribed and overscribed. The Laboratory at that time advised that the possibility existed that this material might contain a system of codes used by Communists, and it was thought that it was possible that information concerning industrial establishments could be transmitted in this fashion. U

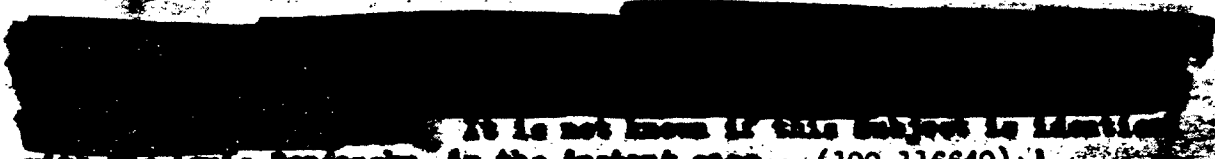

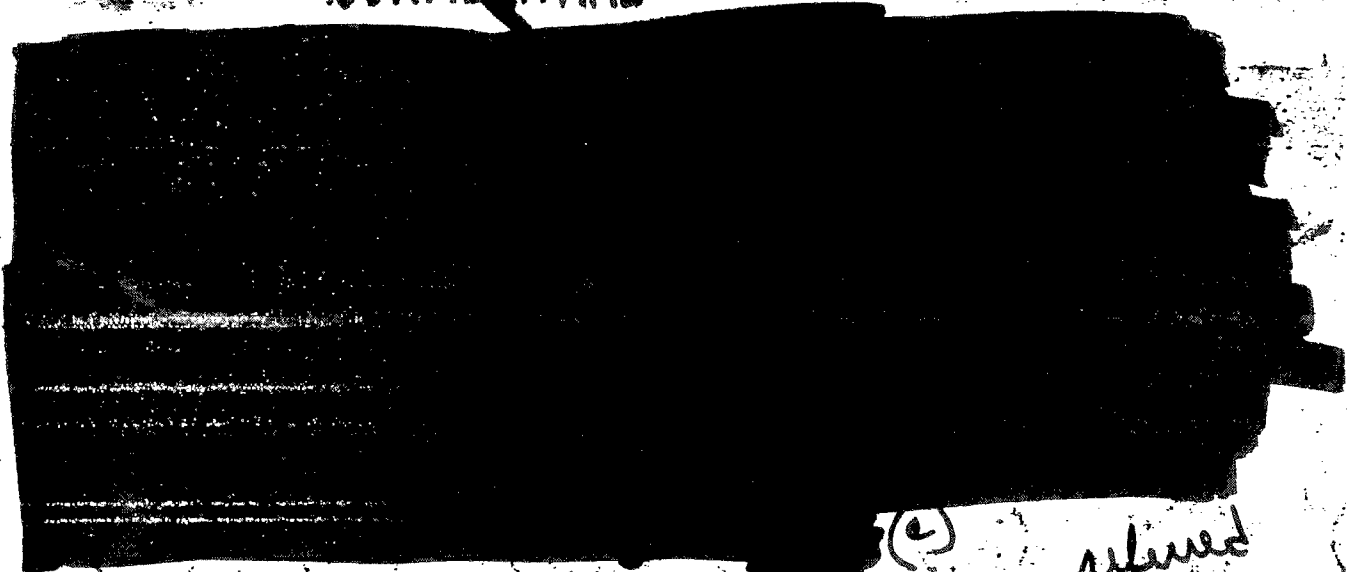

Associations and Activities

On December 28, 1937, in the "New Masses" magazine, page 6, appeared an article written by Cedric Belfrage entitled "Politics Catches Up with the Writer." U (61-9182-11, 21) U

On April 9, 1938, an article appeared in the "Daily Worker" under title "Appeal for Lifting of Arms Embargo on Spanish Government. American friends of Spanish Democracy send President petition signed by 92 leading clergymen, editors, union leaders." The article then carried a complete text of the statement and the name Cedric Belfrage appeared in the list of individuals signing the statement. (61-7561-208X) U

The December 13, 1938, issue of the "Peoples' World", a West Coast Communist Party newspaper, carried an article concerning a meeting in the Russ Auditorium in San Diego, California, which was sponsored for the Defense of Democracy and the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League. This article revealed that Cedric Belfrage, an English author, was one of the speakers and that he told the audience that the English government no longer represents the people of Great Britain who let slip away their freedom of speech, press and radio. He warned "democracy died before our eyes in England without our knowing until it was too late. The same thing is beginning to happen here." (61-7561-251X9) U

A New York "Journal American" article dated October 18, 1938, under the caption "Red Activities Face Boston Jury Inquiry" reveals that Edward F. Sullivan was an investigator for the Dies Congressional Committee probing un-American activities and had named more than two score Hollywood celebrities as having contributed to the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy during a drive by the Spanish government to raise money for medical facilities.

He stated that the names appeared on the side of an ambulance pictured on a circular which Sullivan said he had turned over to the Dies Committee. Cedric Belfrage was one of the names mentioned. (61-7582-9X) U

In April, 1940, an alleged list of Communists and direct sympathizers in California was furnished to the Bureau. This material was obtained from an outside unknown source and included the name of Cedric Belfrage, 30708, Roosevelt Highway, Pacific Palisades. (61-8890-1X) U

[REDACTED] was forwarded to the Bureau an article written by Cedric Belfrage in "The Clipper, magazine of August, 1940. In furnishing this article the informant described Belfrage as "a money mad English Ned who frequently sneers at the United States." The article by Belfrage was entitled "We Don't Like Your Face." Therein he ridicules the Dies Committee and there is a statement attributed to Representative Hamilton Fish that "Congress has the power to deport aliens even if we don't like the color of their eyes." This article was described as being definitely Communist in tenor. (100-34463-01,2) U

In the report of Special Agent W. M. Hawkins dated May 15, 1942, Los Angeles, California, in the case entitled "George Louis George, was; Internal Security - R" page 6 reveals that the subject of that investigation had made the statement that he considered several individuals as his good friends, one of these listed was Cedric Belfrage, who was employed by the British Embassy in New York City and engaged in propaganda work. This report further reveals that Cedric Belfrage in 1941 was an instructor in the School for Writers and that he was formerly on the editorial board of "The Clipper" which was definitely a radical magazine. In 1938 Belfrage was listed as a member of the National Committee for Defense of Political Prisoners which was the outgrowth of the Communist Committee for the Defense of the Southern Political Prisoners. The report of Special Agent Joseph G. Findley dated December 5, 1942, at Los Angeles, California, entitled "Mackil M. Gleichman, was; Internal Security - C" reveals that the subject of this investigation was reported to the Los Angeles Office by Source A as having attended a convention of the Northern California Civil Rights Council and the Southern California Branch of the Federation for Constitutional Liberties which was held at San Francisco California, on August 27-28, 1941, as a delegate from Southern California along with several other individuals who were stated to be well-known Communists and Communist Party line followers. The report of Special Agent James G. Findley dated July 17, 1942, entitled "League of American Writers" carries a list of the most active members of a Hollywood chapter of the League of American Writers. The name Cedric Belfrage appeared in this group of names and he was identified as follows, "long record of floundering, associate editor of "Black and White," member of the editorial board of "The Clipper," contributor of articles along Communist Party line, signed call for California Conference for Civil Rights August 27-28, 1941, a Communist Front teacher in Writers' School." (100-7322-37) U

During 1941 it was reported that the name of Cedric Belfrage appeared among the editors of "The Clipper," official organ of the Hollywood chapter of the League of American Writers. This organization according to reliable reports was established at the Congress of American Revolutionary Writers in New York City during April, 1935. The signers of the call for the initial Congress included such well-known Communists as Earl Browder, Clarence Hathaway and Alexander Trachtenberg. The organization reportedly has been Communist influenced since organization and has changed its program with the Communist Party change in line. (100-5377-23) U

On February 6, 1941, an article appeared in the "Daily Worker" under the heading "Spain Rescue Mission Signs Contract for Refugee Ship." This article carried a list of names of individuals who were sponsors of the Rescue Ship Mission. The name Cedric Belfrage was listed. (100-7061-Sub A) U

In the report of Special Agent L. O. Pryor dated February 19, 1941, Atlanta, Georgia, entitled "National Committee for Defense of Political Prisoners, aka the National Committee for Peoples' Rights; Internal Security - C" reveals that the name Cedric Belfrage was listed as a member of the National Committee for Peoples' Rights. The report of Special Agent James G. Findley dated March 12, 1941, Los Angeles, California, entitled "North American Spanish Aid Committee" reveals that the name Cedric Belfrage was listed as a supporter of the Medical Bureau to Aid Spanish Democracy, 381 4th Avenue, New York City. (100-7058-50) U

On May 15, 1941, an article appeared in the "Daily Worker" entitled "Film Committee Active in Planning Writers Congress." This article revealed that prominent Hollywood writers who will comprise the film committee of the 4th American Writers Congress to be held in New York City June 6-8, 1941, will include many individuals among whom was listed Cedric Belfrage. The article further stated that a feature of the Congress will be the presentation of the Randolph Burnes memorial award to the American writer who has performed "the most distinguished service for culture and peace." Elisabeth Terrill Bentley in her statement advised that in the Spring of 1936 she was approached by Beatrice Garlin, who was desirous of securing her services to assist a foreigner who was coming to the United States in the near future in speaking English and taking care of some of his business affairs. Beatrice Garlin approached Elisabeth Bentley several times thereafter concerning this matter, and eventually in November, 1936, she was introduced to Joseph Eckhart by Beatrice Garlin. Eckhart was the individual she had in mind. Eckhart was a Lithuanian about 55 years of age, 5'11" in height, broad shoulders, bald head, wears glasses, was a very natty dresser, and had a striking resemblance to Louis Beckalter, alias Lepke. Elisabeth Bentley stated that during the time she knew him, Eckhart resided at the Hotel Marcy on 96th Street in New York City. She saw Eckhart on two occasions and it was her belief that in December of 1936 he returned to Russia. However, he again appeared in New York in March or April of 1937 at which time he took up his residence first at the Barbison Plaza and subsequently at the Windermere Hotel. Elisabeth Bentley last saw Eckhart in January of 1938 at which time he indicated he was again leaving the United States. He did not mention to which country he was destined. Elisabeth Bentley stated further that at the time she knew Eckhart, he appeared to be a legitimate individual, registered in hotels under his proper name, and engaged in some purchasing mission. However, she had learned from Jacob Golos that Eckhart was in fact an NKVD agent and that one of his purposes for coming to this country was to purchase airplanes that were to be shipped to Spain via Mexico. U

A complete review of the Bureau files was made in the name of Joseph Eckhart. Several references to a Joseph Eckhart or Joseph Eckert or other phonetic spellings were found. However, it is not known whether any of these individuals are identical with the above described individual or not.

The report of Special Agent Peter F. Geinski dated September 21, 1944, at Detroit, Michigan, entitled "American Slav Congress, Internal Security - C", reveals that one Joseph Eckert was a membership delegate in the Flint Committee of the American Slav Congress. No further identifying data were given. 100-56674-230, pg 37 U

The New Orleans Field Division advised on April 21, 1945, that one Joseph Eckert and Marie Eckert would arrive at New Orleans, Louisiana, on April 25, 1945, by airplane and requested that Bureau indices be checked in connection with the foreign travel control program. 100-161920-13171 U

On January 7, 1949, Joseph B. Gregg, residing at 6829 Pines Branch Road, Northwest, Washington, D. C., was shown as a director on the staff of the Hemisphere Corporation at which time the "Hemisphere" was known as a confidential news weekly of the Americas. The address given for this organization was 7876, Department of Commerce Building, Washington, D. C.

WILLIAM AMERLE HINCKLEY

The following is a summary of the information pertaining to this individual in the Bureau's files. It is to be noted that he is the subject of a closed case for the Washington, D.C. office, entitled "William Amersler Hinckley; Internal Security, Custodial Detention," with the report dated February 4, 1943. U

Hinckley was born on March 20, 1910, at Yankton, South Dakota. From 1915 to 1929 he resided in St. Joseph, Missouri, and there received his high school training, following which he attended junior college in the same city from 1927 to 1929. He received an A.A. degree and in the Fall of 1929 went to Rollins College, Winter Park, Florida, where he majored in psychology and was graduated in 1931 with a B.A. degree. The following year he attended Columbia University and took an M.A. degree there in 1932. He is married to Margaret Cummings Hinckley and they have two children, Charles C. Hinckley and Jill Hinckley, as well as an unadopted charge, Millie McLab. It is reported that both Hinckley and his wife are American born. U

From September 1933, to January 1935, he was employed as an instructor of psychology at Black Mountain College, Black Mountain, North Carolina. From January 1935, to July 1936, he was self-employed and engaged in research on American Youth problems involving tests of aptitude towards the Chinese in America. This research was made for the China Institute. U

Hinckley was the Executive Secretary of the American Youth Congress, a Communist front organization, from July 1935, to January 1936, and from that time to July 4, 1939, he was Chairman of the American Youth Congress with an office at 80 West 40th Street, New York City. His work was mainly organizational and, according to his own statement, his responsibilities included the coordination of policy and activities of an ever-expanding movement of youth organizations through the American Youth Congress. U

From September 1936, to July 1939, he was a Secretary of the American Union for Concerted Peace Efforts and his employer was Clark M. Michelberger, 8 West 40th Street, New York City. His work included the preparation of Peace study outlines, the organization of dramatic radio programs, directing the organizing of local peace committees, organization of Peace and Security Week in April 1939, and he also organized a national conference of 100 leaders of public opinion held at the Sheraton Hotel, Washington, D. C., to bring the peace attitudes of organized public opinion to the attention of those in charge of formulating the nation's foreign policy. U

From July 1939, to February 1940, he was engaged in preparing a book about American Youth problems. In February 1940, he was appointed Administrative Assistant of the Federal Forum Project, United States Office of Education, Federal Security Agency but, according to his statement, upon the expiration of the appropriation his employment was terminated July 30, 1941. U

On October 6, 1941, he received a temporary appointment as Economic Statistician, Railroad Retirement Board and resigned from that position February 1, 1942. On February 9, 1942, he was appointed Senior Promotion Specialist, Defense Securities, Defense Savings Staff, Treasury Department, but following an investigation of his background and activities, he was not retained by the Treasury Department. As of February 1943, Hinckley was employed as Assistant Director of Employment Personnel, American Red Cross, Washington, D. C. U

In October of 1935 Hinckley, as a member of the National Council of the American Youth Congress, met with the Assistant Secretary of State, Salton Moore, and the NYA Administrator, Aubrey Williams, in the District of Columbia to ask that this country make more drastic regulations for peace in view of the Italo-Ethiopian War and to protest against the inadequacy of the NYA program. U

In February 1937, Hinckley, as the Chairman of the convention of the National Council, American Youth Congress, at the Masonic Temple, Thirteenth and New York Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C., opened the convention and introduced seven members of the United Auto Workers Union who participated in the sit-down strike at Flint, Michigan. He also introduced John Davis, colored, representing the National Negroes Council and, on February 20, 1937, led approximately 1600 alleged students in a parade to the White House to present a petition containing the signatures of some two million persons in favor of the "American Youth Week." Among the banners carried were "Scholarships not Battleships," "Youth, Our First Concern," "We want Jobs—That's the American Youth Act," "Young Communist League," et cetera. When informed the parade could not go on the White House grounds, a sit-down strike occurred which was dispersed after the arrest of the two leaders, William S. Hinckley and Abbott Simon, the Legislative Director of the American Youth Congress. It is to be noted that the police records do not show that Hinckley was arrested. Later the two were received by President Roosevelt. U

The information indicates that Hinckley was also connected with the American Peace Mobilization, the American League for Peace and Democracy and it is noted that his picture as head of the Communist controlled American Youth Congress appeared in the Young Communist League yearbook for 1937, the Young Communist League being reportedly a section of the American Youth Congress. U

It is further noted that he was made an Administrative Assistant to the Commissioner of Education, John W. Studebaker, and was named by witnesses before the Dies Committee as a Communist, according to the Chicago Herald American of May 27, 1940. According to the Daily Worker of February 4, 1939, he endorsed the lifting of the embargo in behalf of Red Spain and later signed a petition to President Roosevelt against the suppression of Communist "civil liberties," the Communist New Masses and the Communist Abraham Lincoln Brigade as well as signing the petition against the Dies Committee investigation of Communism. The Daily Worker of December 2, 1939, indicated that William Hinchley, former Chairman of the American Youth Congress, strongly criticized the Dies Committee when testifying before it at that time. U

It is noted that [redacted] talked with Hinchley late in 1940 or 1941 at which time Hinchley stated plainly that he couldn't agree with President Roosevelt's foreign policy because he felt there was much to be said for the Russian position at that time, that is, the non-aggression pact with Germany and the war with Finland. U b7D

It is further noted that [redacted] said that Hinchley, while working for the American Red Cross, was a good friend of Craig Vincent and other Communist Party members. The informant said that Hinchley had recently been instrumental in placing Leo Schwartz in an overseas position with the Red Cross and that the informant considered Schwartz to be a Communist. It is further noted that information is available showing that at the time Hinchley was being considered for employment by the Treasury Department and that one of his strongest advocates was Eleanor Nelson, Executive Secretary of the United Federal Workers of America. U b7D

It should be noted that on April 27, 1942, Hinchley was invited to call at the Washington, D. C., Field Office of the FBI for an interview in connection with an investigation of him under the Hatch Act, but at the time he declined to do so for the reason that he was not then employed by the United States Government. U

Further information from [redacted] indicates that Hinchley has admitted being a member of the "Peace Through World Cooperation Committee" in 1938 and was Secretary of the American Union for Coordinated Peace Efforts. He also admitted attending two anti-conscription meetings at Turner's Arena in Washington, D. C., on September 4, 1940, and September 6, 1940. He said that he may have joined the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. He also admitted signing a New Masses letter to the President which was published in New Masses April 2, 1940. U b7D

In addition, the Bureau's files indicate that Hinkley was a delegate to the World Youth Congress in Geneva in 1936. Also in 1936 Hinkley authorized Howard Bushmore, a known Communist to speak before the American Youth Congress and according to Bushmore, Hinkley should have known that he was a Communist member. In 1935 Hinkley published a pamphlet entitled "Youth Speaks for Itself" which was published to promote the passage of the American Youth Act. U
(Daily Worker 8-12-36, 61-7567-142) U

An excerpt from the Daily Worker dated March 16, 1939, indicated that William Hinkley was the Secretary for the American Union for Concerted Peace which was launching a drive for unity and peace at that time. In a letter to the Bureau from New York City dated September 25, 1941, the Bureau is advised that William Hinkley's name was listed in the files of the New Leader as being connected with the National Youth Administration. U

In connection with the investigation of Samuel Bernard [redacted], with [redacted] Information - C the report of Special Agent Douglas F. Mendel ([redacted]) dated July 13, 1943, at Newark, New Jersey, indicated that Katrin was a Communist Party member in Newark, New Jersey. Inquiry at Local Board #40 of Newark reflected that William W. Hinkley, the Assistant Director of Employment for the American Red Cross in Washington, D. C., had asked permission for Katrin to leave the United States for foreign duty from February 1, 1943, to August 1, 1943. It is noted that Katrin was made the subject of a departmental applicant case—junior organizations analyst—Special War Policies Unit, War Division. On August 11, 1942, investigation reflected that Katrin was a member of the West Side Branch of the Communist Party, Essex County, New Jersey, in that year and was not employed. As of April 1, 1943, the files indicate Katrin was assigned as Assistant Field Director, American Red Cross and stationed in North Africa. U

The report of Special Agent Frederick H. Green, Washington, D. C., dated August 12, 1943, in the case entitled, [redacted] Information Specialist [redacted] it is noted that

Regarding his wife, Mary Pond, an article in the New Leader "Capital Comment" of March 20, 1943, on the Communist infiltration of the Red Cross says "William Hinkley, the personnel official of the Red Cross, has a long record of Stalinist activity. One of his first acts was to hire Janet Gaines Stern and Mary Pond, both notorious Stalinists. Since then he has been hiring Red Cross workers who accompany the American armed forces." U67D
(100-55666) U

An excerpt from a Los Angeles paper dated May 23, 1940, entitled, "Officials Aid Fifth Column" it is indicated that a Miss [redacted] told the New Deal to "clean up" as Hinkley was revealed in a Federal job. The article indicates that the source followed disclosure that William W. Hinkley, former American Youth Congress head and avowed Communist, had been given an executive job in the government. Hinkley's case was cited by Representative Hugh Mason U

of Illinois, member of the Dies Committee, and it was pointed out that Hinkley was the new Administrative Assistant to the Commissioner of Education. The article states "it is my understanding he obtained his position through the recommendation of Mrs. Franklin Roosevelt." U

William Hinkley is further mentioned in the case entitled, **United States v. Haddock, Postal Worker, Alternate (Labor), War Shipping Control Administration, National War Labor Board, Internal Security—Watch Act** and it is to be noted that Haddock, an alleged Communist was frequently seen with Craig Vincent of the War Shipping Administration (mentioned previously) and William Hinkley of the American Red Cross. U

Further information appears from a quotation in the New Leader dated March 20, 1943, stating "Communist infiltration into the Red Cross is not wishful thinking—it's an already accomplished fact. It was revealed here this week that one of the personnel officials who selects Red Cross personnel for overseas duty is William Hinkley. Hinkley was a member of the Young Communist League on the sworn testimony of Kenneth Gaff, a former member of the ECL National Committee. The record of Hinkley's Stalinist activities is as long as a baboon's arm. He has faithfully followed every twist and turning of the Party line since 1934. After the Hitler-Stalin pact ended 'collective security' Hinkley switched with the Party line and in 1940 publicly supported the platform of the American Youth Congress, then anti-war. He was a signer of the New Masses letter to the President in April 1940, in defense of the isolationist activities of the C.P. In June 1941 when the Soviet Union was attacked, Hinkley again switched with the Party line and joined warmongers who demanded a second front to save the Soviet Union. Hinkley is a member of the 'Washington Committee for Democratic Action' which Attorney General Middle designated as a Communist front organization. Hinkley's first act on his Red Cross job was to open the door to Red Cross jobs for Janet Gaines Stern from the C.P.—designated United Federal Workers of America and Mary Ford both notorious Stalinists." U

INTRODUCTION

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley in her statement, advised that Marian House and Mr. and Mrs. Hinkley were members of the Communist Party in Unit 1, Harlem Section. She further stated that it was her recollection that Juliet Glaser approached the Hinkleys and Marian House, during the time that she was earning herself with the Italian Movement. Mrs. Bentley stated that Mrs. House and Mr. and Mrs. William Hinkley have no connection as far as she knew with Jacob Golos or any of the other individuals whom she suspected to have been involved in Russian espionage matters. U

A complete check of the Bureau files was made for the name of Marian House. However, no identifiable record could be located concerning the name Marian House. The Bureau files reveal that an individual by the name of Marian Francis House of 4509 Calvert Road, College Park, Maryland, who was born Washington, D. C. on November 22, 1904, made an application for employment with the Bureau as a clerk on November 17, 1941. The files of the Bureau reflect that during the years 1940 and 1941 at the request of Sidney Sherwood, Assistant Secretary to the Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense, Washington, D. C., an investigation was conducted of Harry Magdoff, an employee of this Commission. The facts ascertained during this investigation were reported under the title, "Harry Magdoff; Special Inquiry - The Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense." The information set forth below is a summary of this investigation. U

The personnel files of the office of the Advisory Commission, Potomac Park Apartments, 21st and C Streets, N.W., reflected that as of November 8, 1940, Harry Magdoff resided at 4862 Conduit Road, N.W., Washington, D. C., that he was born on August 21, 1913 at New York City. U

The file further reflected that Magdoff attended grammar school from September, 1920 to June, 1926 in New York City, and attended Evander Childs High School, Bronx, New York, from September, 1926 through June, 1930. Magdoff attended the City College of New York from September, 1930 to February, 1933. Thereafter, he attended New York University through May, 1935, at which time he obtained a B.S. Degree in Economics. From September, 1939 through May, 1940, Magdoff attended the University of Pennsylvania, continuing his studies in economics. U

The personnel files of the Advisory Commission disclosed that Harry Magdoff was employed from September, 1932 through August, 1934 by the Premier Paint Company, 125 West 101st Street, New York City, as an Office Manager and Auditor. The files reflected that he was employed beginning October 30, 1934 for a period of nine months by the Silk Textile Code Authority, 110 East 40th Street, New York City, as Assistant to the Vice President of the Code Authority, Mr. Howard Hayden. From July, 1935 through March, 1936, Magdoff was unemployed due to a serious operation and a lengthy convalescent period. U

From April, 1936 until October 1, 1940, Magdoff was employed by the Park Projects Administration, National Research Project, 1015 Chestnut Street Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as a Principal Statistician. U

The personnel file reflected that Magdoff had previously resided at 49 East Cliveden Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, that effective October 1, 1940 he was appointed by the Advisory Commission to the Council of National

Defense as Senior Economic Statistician at a salary of \$4600 per year at the Department of Research and Statistics Department. Magdoff, according to his personnel file, was married. U (62-60508-2)

The records of the Evander Childs High School, Bronxwood Avenue and Conhill Road, Bronx, New York, disclose that Harry S. Magdoff had entered that high school on September 14, 1928 from a high school in Trenton, New Jersey. At the time of his registration he indicated that he was born on August 21, 1913, that his father's name was Max Magdoff and he resided at 2095 Creston Avenue, New York City. U

The records further disclose that Magdoff graduated from Evander Childs High School on June 27, 1930. (62-60508-10) U

The records of the Registrar's Office of the City College of New York disclosed that Magdoff had been admitted to the college during September, 1930 and had left the college in February of 1933, transferring to the New York University. While Harry Magdoff was in attendance at the City College of New York he listed his residence address as: 2095 Creston Avenue and 2295 Grand Concourse, Bronx, New York. U

The above file contained a notation that Harry Magdoff had been suspended by the Board of Higher Education for a period of four weeks as a disciplinary measure. With respect to this, Dean M. Gottschall stated that the suspension of Magdoff had occurred because of his activities in a mock trial of President Robinson and Director Linehan held on October 30, 1932 at the Central Opera House in New York City. Twenty-one students of the City College of New York were suspended because of their participation in this trial. U

Dean Gottschall stated that he recalled Harry Magdoff and his brother, Sam Magdoff, very well and that at the time of their attendance at the City College of New York they were both definitely inclined toward Communism. Dean Gottschall stated that the Magdoffs ran around with individuals known to be Communists and that Harry Magdoff was very active in the Social Problems Club of the City College of New York, which club the informant characterized as a Communistic organization. U

The proceedings of the Board of Higher Education for the year 1933 were reviewed by agents of the New York Office and the names of the students who were suspended because of their participation were checked through the indices of the New York Office. It was revealed that 12 of the 21 individuals U

were identified in the files of the New York Field Division as being members of the Communist Party or that complaints as to their activities had been received. It was noted that several individuals who participated in the trial were members of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in the Spanish Civil War. With respect to the mock trial, the primary purpose for it was the reinstatement of one Professor Oakley Johnson, and the principal speaker was Donald Henderson. (62-60508-10) U

The records of the New York University School of Commerce, Washington Square, New York City, reflected that Magdoff had attended New York University from September, 1933 to June, 1935, at which latter time he received a B.S. Degree in economics. At the time of his attendance at New York University, Magdoff gave his residence address as: 2704 Wallace Avenue, Bronx, New York. U

The records of the University of Pennsylvania, disclosed that Harry Magdoff was enrolled in the Graduate School of that institute taking a course in Economic Theory from September, 1939 to May, 1940, which course was never completed by him. At the time Magdoff attended the University of Pennsylvania, he indicated that he was married. (62-60508-4) U

With reference to the information set forth above by Magdoff that he had been employed by the Premier Paint Company, it was ascertained by investigation that the Premier Paint Company, 125 West 101st Street, New York City, was owned by Max Magdoff, the father of Harry Magdoff. (62-60508-10) U

Records of the WPA, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, which were examined during the course of the investigation disclosed that Magdoff alleged he was employed during the period from February, 1931 to January, 1933, by one J. Sabinstein, 3451 Giles Place, New York City, as a Real Estate Manager. U

Efforts were made to verify this employment with negative results, but it was ascertained from Charles Fine, a member of the firm of Schuster, Fine and Mayless, 264 West 40th Street, New York City, that the premises at 3451 Giles Place were "a nest of Communists." Fine, who was connected with the management of these premises, explained that 3451 Giles Place was organized on a model communal basis and that on the occasion of each visit to that address the various tenants would openly extoll the virtues of Communism to him. U

Robert H. Johnson, who as a representative of the New York State Mortgage Commission, had personally managed the premises at 3451 Giles Place, described the tenants of this address as "a bunch of Communists." (62-60508-14) U

Miss I. L. Hunt, Secretary of the National Federation of Textiles, Incorporated, 15 West 97th Street, New York City, advised that during the period of the NRA she had been Secretary to the Silk ~~Authority~~ and that Harry Magdoff had been employed by this Authority as an investigator of code violations from October 11, 1934, to May 11, 1935, at a salary of \$16 per week. U (62-60508-14)U

As noted above, Harry Magdoff claimed employment by the Work Projects Administration, National Research Project, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This employment was verified and it was determined that he was appointed Assistant Statistician to the National Research Project, 1015 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia Pennsylvania, on April 8, 1936 at a salary of \$2900. Thereafter, he received successive appointments as Statistician, Senior Statistician, and Principal Statistician at \$4000 per annum with the WPA, which position he held until September 30, 1940. At this latter date he resigned to accept an appointment with the National Defense Commission as Senior Economic Statistician. U

A review of the personnel file of Harry Magdoff maintained by the National Research Project disclosed several letters of recommendation by the Director of the Project, David Weintraub. A personal interview with Weintraub advised that he had first met Magdoff in Washington, D. C. some time during 1935. Weintraub stated that he was impressed with Magdoff's background and personality, and that his services with the National Research Project were highly satisfactory. U

Weintraub further stated that he and Magdoff visited each other frequently, that Magdoff belonged to no club or organization and that he had exhibited no radical tendencies nor engaged in any subversive activities. With respect to David Weintraub, the files of the Bureau disclose that

A confidential source in October, 1943, advised that a known Communist named David Weintraub headed the committee on "Scope, Power and Organization" of the WERA. U b7D

It is further observed that during the period from 1935 to 1938, Irving Kaplan was Associate Director of the National Research Project in Philadelphia, under the direct supervision of David Weintraub. Irving Kaplan has been identified in the testimony of Elisabeth Terrill Bentley as being a member of the same Communist group as Harry Magdoff engaged in furnishing confidential United States Government information to the Soviet Union. It will be noted that during the time Kaplan was Associate Director of the National Research Project Magdoff was employed by the Project. U

The personnel file of Harry Magdoff at the National Research Project disclosed that as of May 14, 1936, he resided at 6633 Blakemore Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, that on August 31, 1939, he moved to 48 East Cliveden Street and on September 26, 1939, he resided at 49 East Cliveden Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. U

Investigation conducted by Agents of the Philadelphia Office disclosed that there was no such address as 48 East Cliveden Street, Philadelphia, and that Magdoff did not reside in Philadelphia during the period from August 1, 1937 to December 31, 1938. U

David Weintraub, who has been identified above, explained that during this period Magdoff's wife, Beatrice Magdoff, was offered a teaching position in New York City, that during this period the Magdoffs resided at 455 West 34th Street in New York and Harry Magdoff commuted daily from New York to Philadelphia. (62-60508-4) U

It will be noted that a neighborhood investigation was conducted in the vicinity of 6633 Blakemore Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where Harry Magdoff and his wife resided from May 1, 1936 to July 31, 1937. During this investigation several tenants of the apartment located at the above address were interviewed and all advised that the Magdoffs were undesirable tenants. U

Mrs. Elizabeth McQuade, 49 East Cliveden Street, Apartment 204, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, informed that she had heard from other tenants of this apartment where the Magdoffs resided from January 1, 1939 to September 30, 1940, that Harry Magdoff was a subscriber to the Daily Worker and that he regularly read Russian books. U

Matilda J. Douglas, the wife of the Superintendent of the apartment at 49 East Cliveden Street, informed that she had many violent arguments with Mrs. Magdoff while the Magdoffs resided at this address, that these arguments were occasioned by a rule of the apartment that servants were to use the back entrance to the apartment building. According to Mrs. Douglas, Mrs. Beatrice Magdoff insisted that her colored maids be permitted to use the front door to the apartment building. Mrs. Douglas stated that on many occasions Beatrice Magdoff had told her that colored people were just as good as any other folks and entitled to all the rights and privileges other people have. U

In the report of Special Agent Richard N. Franke, dated November 5, 1942, at New York City, captioned, "Antorg Trading Corporation; Espionage - R," there are set forth the names of seventeen publications, together with the cities and the names of the persons who are either editors or members of the publication to whose support the Antorg Trading Corporation allegedly contributed heavily. U

These names and the list of publications were obtained by Walker G. Matheson from Ruth Rubin and in turn were obtained by the Bureau from among the personal effects of Matheson when he was arrested in Washington, D. C. Included in the list of publications was that of the "National Student Review - New York," which was followed by the name Harry Magdoff. U

According to the referenced report, the files of the New York Field Division contained no reference to the Student National Review and the possibility that Harry Magdoff who was allegedly connected with the Student Review, was identical with Harry Magdoff who was employed by the Advisory Commission to the Council of National Defense, was pointed out. U

The report of Special Agent Robert J. Sheran made at Chicago, Illinois, dated June 4, 1945, in the case entitled "Eugene Victor Jasinski," with aliases; Internal Security - C," disclosed that while Jasinski was in Washington, D. C., from January 20 to January 27, 1945, he was known to have been in contact with Harry S. Magdoff, residing at 3226 Ravensworth Place, Alexandria, Virginia, whose telephone number was TEAple 5642. U

Eugene Victor Jasinski, as of November 7, 1945, was reported to be living at 1607 - 16th Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., and he temporarily employed as an official of the Polish Supply Mission under Doctor Ludwik Witold Rajchman, Polish delegate to the UNRRA Council. Jasinski, who allegedly was a member of the Communist Political Association in May of 1945, was for some period of time active with the American Polish Labor Council as an Executive Director of the Council and as Business Manager of the Council's publication, "The Outlook." INTRODUCTION

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley, in her statement, advised that during the fall of 1934, Miss Lee Fuhr invited Elizabeth Bentley to make a talk to the members of the American League Against War and Fascism at Teachers College in New York City. Elizabeth Bentley made a speech before this group and at this time outlined to them some experiences that she had while studying in Italy. It was at that time that she met Professor James Mendenhall whom she believed to be a member of the League Against War and Fascism. Elizabeth Bentley subsequently determined that both Lee Fuhr and Professor James Mendenhall were members of the Communist Party and were active in the Communist movement in the United States at this time (1934). Elizabeth Bentley stated that she recalled that sometime in March, 1935, she, Elizabeth Bentley, became a regular member of the Communist Party and was sponsored by Professor James Mendenhall and Miss Lee Fuhr.

A complete review of the Bureau files was made in the name James Mendenhall and it was ascertained that a complete Internal Security, Hatch Act investigation was conducted of one Dr. James Edgar Mendenhall, who was employed as principal education specialist, Office of Price Administration, Washington, D. C., and it is believed that this individual may possibly be identical with the above described professor, James Mendenhall.

The report of Special Agent William H. Green, dated August 13, 1943, at Washington, D. C., entitled "Dr. James Edgar Mendenhall, also known as Dr. James E. Mendenhall, Principal Education Specialist, Office of Price Administration - Internal Security - Hatch Act" reveals the following background information and activities of Dr. Mendenhall.

Activities and Associates

The above mentioned report of Special Agent Frederick J. Green reveals that Confidential Informant T-2 advised that he had been acquainted with Dr. Mandeshall for more than ten years; that he had a high regard for his ability, character and reputation. However, he was presently confident that Mandeshall was loyal to this Government but he still pointed out that during the first two or three years of his acquaintanceship with Mandeshall some evidence came to his attention that Dr. Mandeshall was "intensely interested in some of the less desirable political philosophies which were being widely studied at that time. This interest on his part may have led him to question his loyalty." Informant T-2 went on to state "that Dr. Mandeshall has since been thoroughly convinced of the undesirability of the theories in which he was interested at that time." Confidential Informant T-2 advised that he therefore had no hesitation in recommending Dr. Mandeshall for a Government position.

This same informant was subsequently interviewed by a Special Agent of the Washington Field Office, and he advised that he had heard rumors about eight or nine years ago that Dr. Mandeshall was a member of the Communist Party. However, he understood from discussions with Mandeshall that the latter had never been a member of the Party, but that he knew certain members of the Party and associated with them. However, Dr. Mandeshall never indicated any disapproval of the Communist Party, and as a matter of fact gave no indication at all of his attitude toward it. Confidential Informant T-2 further advised that he had ascertained from another source of information that Dr. Mandeshall's wife had made the statement that she had insisted to her husband that they leave New York City because Dr. Mandeshall's Communist friends harried him and annoyed him by coming to his home on occasions and insisting he come to meetings with them and contribute to their cause. Confidential Informant T-2 further stated that he understood that Dr. Mandeshall had followed the leadership of his Communist Party friends and had gone to meetings and had contributed in a financial way to the Communist Party in New York City. This informant also stated that Mrs. Mandeshall was successful in her efforts to wean Dr. Mandeshall away from the influence of his Communist associates in New York City.

Confidential Informant T-3, who resides in Washington, D.C., advised that she had known Dr. Mandeshall and his wife for the past year and she considered them "very liberal in their political feelings." In explanation, she stated that "Dr. Mandeshall has the attitude held by some Americans now-a-days that whatever organized labor does is all right, regardless of its affect on the rest of the country, and that he has extreme sympathy for the so-called down-trodden masses. They have the extreme liberal view toward Negroes, believing they are held down and should be treated as equals with the white people." This informant further stated that the Mandeshalls read the PW newspaper every day but she had never seen the Daily Worker or other Communist books or magazines in the Mandeshall home.

Confidential Informant T-5, who in the past, was seen a neighbor of the Mendenhalls, advised that the Mendenhalls are very favorable to the Russians and that Mrs. Mendenhall had recently busied herself in collecting clothing to be shipped to the Russian people.

Confidential Informant T-6, who was in class contact with Dr. Mendenhall during the period of about one year when he was connected with the [redacted] in [redacted], New Jersey, stated "Dr. Mendenhall is a nephew of Dr. Harold Rugg, who is intensely interested in socialized study in the schools of the United States and has written many books projecting his views. Due to his relationship to Dr. Rugg, Dr. Mendenhall was classed as a Leftist."

Confidential Informant T-7, who was also acquainted with Dr. Mendenhall during the year he taught in Maplewood, New Jersey, stated "That Dr. Mendenhall was well known in connection with the George Counts Group who have attempted to organize labor unions among the school teachers. Dr. Mendenhall is exceedingly progressive and was classed at the time of his residence in Maplewood as a Leftist." Confidential Informant T-8 stated that he had become only slightly acquainted with Dr. Mendenhall, but stated that Dr. Mendenhall, as well as his two brothers, were all intellectually brilliant but all seemed to have Communistic inclinations and were generally considered as erratic reformists. However, the informant made it plain that his opinion of Dr. Mendenhall was based on his general reputation rather than on any specific knowledge of his activities or affiliations.

Confidential Informant T-9 advised that his only contact with Dr. Mendenhall in recent years has been at [redacted] College in Missouri, where Dr. Mendenhall, until his affiliation with the [redacted] of State Administration, had been Director of Consumer Research. In this connection, Informant T-9 stated that President James H. Wood and Dean Sheffield, both of [redacted] College, had recently indicated to the informant that they were looking for someone with no Leftist views to replace Dr. Mendenhall as Director of Consumer Research.

On August 7, 1943, Dr. James Mendenhall appeared at the Washington Field Office and furnished a statement under oath, at which time he stated that he was residing at 5 West Emil Road, Kensington, Maryland. At the time of this interview, Dr. Mendenhall denied that he was now or had ever been a member of the Communist Party of the United States of America. He stated that he had never attended any meetings, contributed any money or services or engaged in any activities of the Communist Party; that he had never received any literature from the Communist Party, and that he had never made any statements against the Government of the United States. Dr. Mendenhall further made the statement that he had never made any statements in which he indicated that he favored the Communist form of Government to that which we have in the United

States, and that he had never been a member of any organization that he had reason to believe was dominated by the Communist Party of the United States of America or controlled or its policies dictated by any foreign government. He further stated that he had never advocated the overthrow of the Government of the United States. 101-5230-8

The report of Special Agent ~~Edward R. Ayers~~, dated July 22, 1943, at Kansas City, Missouri, entitled "Dr. James K. Mendenhall, ~~University, March 1943~~" reveals the following information:

~~Dr. James K. Wood~~, President of Stephens College for Women, Columbia, Missouri, advised that Dr. Mendenhall came to his college on April 1, 1939, to teach in the Consumers Economic Field under Charles Castle, Director. In 1940, Dr. Mendenhall succeeded John Castle as Director of Consumers Research until February, 1942, when he too left Stephens College for a Government position. ~~Dr. Wood~~ advised that two incidents happened while Mendenhall was in charge of the Consumers Research Department. One was that he allowed a student editor to write an article which was subsequently published in a consumer publication praising the books of Harold Rugg, a Sociology Professor of Columbia University, New York City, with whom Mendenhall formerly lived. ~~Dr. Wood~~ stated that he believed that Mendenhall had edited some of the material for the above mentioned books and he felt that it was connected with the college should undertake to endorse any books in the educational field.

The other instance was that Dr. Mendenhall was elected Chairman of a group in Columbia, Missouri to organize a "cooperative store." This movement was opposed by local businessmen to a large extent and ~~Dr. Wood~~ requested Mendenhall to resign his position with the cooperative, which he did.

~~Dr. Wood~~ stated that he, at no time, referred to Mendenhall as a "leftist" and that he was most decidedly of the opinion that Mendenhall was neither a Communist nor engaged in Communist activities or teaching while at Stephens College. He said that Stephens College is very conservative in its policies and that Mendenhall was "more liberal" than the average teacher. By liberal, ~~Dr. Wood~~ said he meant that Mendenhall had more of a leaning toward the "New Deal" policies of the Administration, but that he did not favor the views of what ~~Dr. Wood~~ terms "the extreme New Dealers" and even while head of the cooperative, he was not antagonistic toward local businessmen nor toward "big business." He stated it was his belief that Mendenhall is patriotic and loyal to the existing form of government in the United States.

~~Dr. Wood~~, ~~Stephens College~~, advised that he was well acquainted with Mendenhall while the latter was connected with Stephens College. ~~Dr. Wood~~ stated that the Consumers Research program had "caused the college a headache" because it aroused the antagonism of many ~~factories, businessmen and advertisers~~, and that after continuing the program

for about two years, the college decided they would be better off without the program and they abandoned the research project when Mendenhall left Stephens College but did continue a course in Consumer Economics based purely on an educational approach without any attempt at research. Mr. Deering stated that Mendenhall was loyal to the United States although in his briefs he favored the under privileged and under-dogs and for that reason could be termed as a liberal. Mr. Lamar Johnson, Dean of the Faculty in Charge of Personnel, Stephens College, advised that he had a high regard for Mendenhall and that he did not consider him radical or possessed of Communistic ideals. He stated that there was nothing about Mendenhall's actions or statements while at Stephens College which would indicate that he was anything but patriotic and loyal to the United States. 101-5230-

The report of Special Agent (SAs) Frank Lindsey, dated June 28, 1943, at New York, New York, in the case entitled "Dr. James E. Mendenhall, Office of Price Administration, Internal Security - Hatch Act" reveals the following information:

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the Guardians of American Education, Inc., was an organization which was independent, non-political, non-sectarian, composed of men and women interested in protecting public school education against the current inroads of propaganda, designed to discredit patriotic Americanism and bring about radical changes in our form of society.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the Guardians of American Education had been fighting Harold O. Rugg, who was Professor of Education, Teachers College, Columbia University, New York City, and that Harold O. Rugg had written a series of six Social Science books for use in the 7th and 8th grades in the public school system, and that Dr. Mendenhall had collaborated with Harold Rugg in writing these "Teachers Guide and Key" for instant books and further, that it was the opinion of Informant T-1 that Dr. Mendenhall was largely responsible for many of the thoughts set forth in the "Teachers Guide and Key." It was noted that in one of the work books used by the students the question was asked "Is the United States a land of opportunity for all our people? Why?" and the following answer is set forth which the children should give according to the "Teachers Guide": "The United States is not a land of opportunity for all our people; for one-fifth of the people do not earn any money at all. There are great differences in the standards of living of the different classes of people, the majority do not have financial security. It was also noted that the authors of the "Teachers Guide and Key" point out a description of Russia's Five Year Plan as follows:

"The daily press of Europe and America is full of reports of this gigantic attempt to plan the life of a nation. The amount of coal to be mined each year in various regions of Russia is planned. So is the amount of oil to be drilled, the amount of wheat, corn, oats and other farm products to be

"The number and size of new factories, power stations, railroads, telegraphs, telephone lines, and radio stations to be constructed are planned. So are the number and kind of schools, colleges, social centers and public buildings to be erected. In fact even as the people of the economic, social and political life of a country of 140,000,000 is being carefully planned."

Confidential Informant T-1 advised that the above paragraph followed an extremely discouraging description of conditions in America, and it stands out as a proposed remedy providing that we follow the example of Soviet Russia.

Confidential Informant T-1 further stated, in speaking of the Teachers Guides written by Dr. Mandeshall and Professor Hugg, pointed out the following excerpt from the Teachers Guide and Key for "America's March Toward Democracy" and stated that in his opinion this remark is definitely Communistic: "Of the 315 pupils, 80% said that the following statement was true. 'My country is unquestionably the best country in the world'. . . . Now the attitude thus expressed is one that we decidedly do not want to develop in our classes."

Confidential Informant T-1 related that he did not know how long Dr. Mandeshall had been associated with Professor Hugg, but he believed that their association had dated back at least ten years and that in his opinion Dr. Mandeshall had been indoctrinated with Hugg's ideologies for that period of time.

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that she had known Dr. James E. Mandeshall for at least ten years and that he was formerly an editor of "Building America", whose offices were located at 2 West 15th Street, New York City, which organization was the recipient of funds from the Rockefeller Foundation to carry on their work of publishing pamphlets designed for the use of schools and teaching background information on current events in our country.

Confidential Informant T-2 further advised that she recalled hearing that Dr. Mandeshall left New York City to avoid Communist friends who had influenced him to attend Party meetings and donate money to the Communist Party, but that she did not believe that it was Dr. Mandeshall's wife who had told her this, stating that Dr. Mandeshall's wife had never been very friendly to her but that she was unable to recall who had furnished this information. She stated that Dr. Mandeshall is a free thinker and possibly a left winger, but stated that she had no knowledge of any Communistic activities on his part.

The Washington Office, by letter dated May 15, 1942, advised the Bureau that Dr. Robert Erwin, Washington correspondent for the Washington Journal and Sentinel, Room 1045 Earle Building, had advised a Special Agent of the Bureau on April 21, 1942, that this was related to Dr. James E.

Mendenhall, who is employed in the Office of Price Administration and who is a Communist. Dr. Kravis stated that he has known Dr. Mendenhall since Dr. Mendenhall was in the office of the War Relocation Authority and that Dr. Mendenhall and his friends had "assaulted" Roosevelt and had made all kinds of attacks against our Government. Dr. Mendenhall's wife is also a Communist and in March, 1940, Dr. Kravis was passing through New York City he called Mrs. Mendenhall. During the course of the conversation Dr. Kravis remarked that the country would get rid of all the "Reds" Kennedy and Mrs. Mendenhall would be in line for the Governor. Dr. James Mendenhall's father, Dr. Edgar Mendenhall, has also been a Communist and has voted for Norman Thomas in every election. 101-5230-1

The report of Special Agent L. Byron Lockhart, dated March 17, 1943, at Detroit, Michigan, in the case entitled "Civil Rights Federation, Internal Security - C" reveals that a twenty page radio script entitled "Give Me Liberty", which was said to have been presented by the Municipal Broadcasting System, Station WTK, on June 5, 1939, under the sponsorship of the American Committee for Democracy and Intellectual Freedom was written by James Mendenhall of Stephens College, Missouri, and Joseph E. Cole. The general theme of the lengthy script is an attack on various regulations preventing teachers from teaching Communism in the public schools.

The New York Field Office, in a letter dated March 6, 1937, to the Bureau, entitled "Re: Subversive Activities, General" furnished a four page printed circular headed "Teachers Guide for the Communication Issues of Building America". The publication "Building America", with editorial office at 425 West 12th Street, New York City, is published by the Society for Curriculum Study, the editor being James E. Mendenhall, and the Business Manager Paul E. Brest. From copies of it examined by Special Agent George Starr of the New York Field Office, it would appear to be somewhat of a copy of the more elaborate publication "Fortune." It is noted that this magazine is sold, among other places, through the Rand School Book Store. 61-10149-18A

On July 2, 1940, at Columbia, Missouri, a group of individuals wrote the President of the United States as follows: "We hereby express our unqualified opposition to any and all attempts to involve the American people in foreign wars. 1. We oppose the proposed conscription measures as being un-American and a step toward war. Testimony of Military experts and the Senate Naval Affairs Committee shows that we need mechanization of a small efficient force for our defense. Seven million conscripted and regimented men point to another shipment of American boys to Europe. 2. We urge maintenance of civil liberties for all as the only guarantee of a forward moving democracy. 3. We urge more attempts to continued problems of unemployment and insecurity as being the greatest threats to American democracy. The weight of the tax burden should not be placed on the lowest income groups. 4. We urge that a non-partisan committee of experts plan our home defense, rather than having politicians spend our money recklessly." The second individual who signed the above letter to the President was James E. Mendenhall. 61-7559-1118 P.3

The following information was obtained from a review of the Bureau files concerning this individual:

The personnel file on William Walter Remington maintained by the Office for Emergency Management reveals that he was born in New York City on October 25, 1917 and attended Kenilworth Elementary School, Ridgewood School, Benjamin Franklin Junior High School, and Ridgewood High School, all located at Ridgewood, New Jersey. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in June, 1939, from Dartmouth College, Hanover, New Hampshire and in June, 1940, attained his Master of Arts degree from Columbia University. He has completed most of his requirements for a Doctor of Philosophy degree at Columbia University, New York City and he was a member of the Phi Beta Kappa fraternity.

Remington was employed as Assistant Industrial Economist in the Consumers Division of the Office for Emergency Management at \$3,200 per year. The file further reflects that from September, 1936 to May, 1937, he was employed on the Tennessee Valley Authority Project, Knoxville, Tennessee; from April, 1937 until August, 1937, Workers Education Committee, Knoxville, Tennessee; and from May, 1940 to July, 1941 as Junior Economist, National Resources Planning Board, Washington, D. C.

Remington is believed to have been an active member of the American People's Mobilization and regular meetings of this organization were held at the apartment of Anna Goodman, where Remington and his wife, Ann Remington, were regularly in attendance. Remington was one of several individuals who solicited funds for the housing of the American Youth Congress delegates during their convention in Washington, D. C., which was held from February 7 to February 9, 1941. Remington and his wife were members of the Cooperative League and Rochdale Stores, including the Cooperative Book Shop.

From June, 1937 to August, 1937, Marvin Todd, head organizer of the CIO, engaged an apartment at 933 Broadway, Knoxville, Tennessee and this apartment was also used as a residence for William Remington, Morace Bryan and others. Todd, during this period, rented Post Office Box 1698 in conjunction with Paul Crouch, State Secretary of the Communist Party. On May 26, 1937, Remington and Todd resided at 1310 Oak Avenue, Knoxville, Tennessee, in company with Henry Hart. During a subsequent investigation conducted by a Congressional committee, Henry Hart admitted he was a member of the Communist Party. (101-1185)

Investigation conducted by Army intelligence relative to Private [redacted] Thomas Hamilton reflects that William P. Remington, formerly resident at 2225 N Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., was listed as an acquaintance of Hamilton. The investigation conducted further reflects that Hamilton was definitely believed to have Communist sympathies and was actively engaged in Communist activity.

A review of the Bureau's files reflects that this individual is the subject of a Washington Field Office investigation by the same title, Security Matter - G, with the last report dated October 30, 1945. #91,121

She was born February 1, 1912, at Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. Her father was born in Moscow, Russia, and, according to her statement, her father was brought to the United States at the age of five and is presently a naturalized citizen. Ruth attended the Coughlin High School in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, from 1926 to 1928, and attended a private preparatory school and business school at Yoming Seminary, Kingston, Pennsylvania, from 1928 to 1931. At that time she enrolled in the University Extension of Columbia University and from 1936 to 1938 studied English composition and special feature writing at New York University. She has stated that she studied French for three years and visited England on a vacation from May 23 to June 21, 1936.

From February, 1935, to November, 1937, she was Secretary and Book-keeper for the Planned Publicity Service, 103 Park Avenue, New York City, at a salary of \$15 to \$20 per week. From November, 1937, to August, 1938, she held temporary positions as a public stenographer. She listed as her employer Lena Rosen, 1440 Broadway, New York City. From June, 1927, to August 25, 1938, she was employed by the Employment News, 55 West 45th Street, New York City, and from August, 1938, at the time of her application, she was employed at the Foreign Policy Association, 22 East 38th Street, New York City. At this place of employment, she was Secretary to Raymond L. Buell, William T. Stone, Marguerite Ann Stewart, Anne Hartwell Johnston, William P. Kaddox, and Sherman S. Hayden. Her salary ranged from \$2400 to \$2700 per year, and according to her statement, her duties consisted of acting in the capacity of an assistant and a secretary.

At the time of her application for Government service, she stated that she wanted to leave her previous employment because there was no opportunity for advancement and she desired to make a contribution towards the war effort.

She entered on duty May 3, 1943, as a clerk-stenographer in the State Department and was transferred to the Foreign Economic Administration when the entire function was transferred to that organization. At present, she is employed by the FEAC as a secretary at a salary of \$3150 per annum in the Displaced Person Division.

At present she resides at Hancock Hall, 3665 38th Street, New York City. She made application for this residence July 5, 1943, and stated she resided at that time at 2825 Naylor Road, S. E., and that her home address was 19 East 98th Street, New York City, where her father, V. N. Rifkin, resided. She listed as a

Surveillance by the Washington Field Office reflected that Elizabeth Searis, on May 24, 1945, had lunch with a woman at 12:30 P.M., at the Palais Royal and it was believed that this woman was identical to the contact woman in the government group. It is to be noted, however, that the signature of Ruth V. Reed appearing in connection with this application, is dissimilar to the one on the application of Dr. Jakob Reed.

In the case entitled, "Helen Gelia Wirtzman, with aliases, Senior Auditor, Federal Accounting Office; Internal Security; Hatch Act," the report of Special Agent J. Wayne Parrish, Washington, D. C., dated June 9, 1944, reflects that Ruth Rifkin, McLean Gardens, Washington, D. C., was interviewed concerning her knowledge of Miss Wirtzman, at which time she advised that she had been acquainted with her approximately one year but had had no political discussions with her. Rifkin stated that there was nothing radical in her expressed views or nothing which would indicate that she was possibly affiliated with the Communist Party.

The name of Ruth Rifkin is also listed in the Bureau's files showing that she was a candidate as a member-at-large in an election on October 18, apparently 1939, in connection with the Book and Magazine Guild. 61-7559-4113X5

Other references concerning Ruth Rifkin, with alias Ruth Reid, reflect that a Mrs. Ruth Reid, Dauphin County, was connected with the Harrisburg Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of the Colored People. 100-69464-12

A review of the Bureau's files reflects the following information regarding the above captioned subject. U

Allan R. Rosenberg, who on February 20, 1940 was the Legal Assistant to the Secretary of the National Labor Relations Board, was called as a witness before a Special Committee of the House of Representatives to investigate the National Labor Relations Board. Representative Howard W. Smith was Chairman of this Committee. On this occasion, Rosenberg testified that he was born in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, in 1900; that he graduated from the Boston Latin School in 1926, Harvard College in 1930, and Harvard Law School in 1934. Following his graduation, he stated he came to Washington, D. C., and was employed by the Railroad Retirement Board. His services were loaned by this Board to the Senate Civil Liberties Committee as an attorney and investigator, and in April, 1937 he was appointed a Review Attorney by the NLRB in Washington, D. C. According to his testimony, in October, 1937 he was appointed Legal Assistant to Benedict Wolf, at that time Secretary of the Board, and he continued in that position under Nathan Witt, Secretary at the time of the hearing. In this capacity as Legal Assistant to Nathan Witt, Rosenberg stated he received \$5,600 per annum. U

All of the above information was set forth in the report of Special Agent R. L. Chapman dated March 8, 1940, at Washington, D. C., in the case entitled "National Labor Relations Board, House of Congressional Appropriations." U

It will be noted that the Bureau's interest in this investigation arose by reason of the fact that the record of testimony and exhibits which were introduced during the hearings before the Special Committee of the House of Representatives reflected that the appropriations of the NLRB were used to seek outside support to oppose legislation affecting the National Labor Relations Act and to oppose reduction of appropriations of the Board in violation of Section 201, Title 18, USC. (62-57219-8) U

Subsequently in this investigation, as reflected in the report of Special Agent Chapman, dated March 28, 1940, at Washington, D. C., Allan R. Rosenberg was interviewed and furnished a signed statement under oath. Information furnished by Rosenberg in this statement generally confirmed all the information previously given by him before the Special Committee of the House of Representatives, and in addition, it was ascertained that following his graduation from Harvard Law School in June, 1934, he was admitted to practice law in the District of Columbia in October, 1934. Speaking of his association with the NLRB, Rosenberg stated that during August, 1938, he was placed in charge of the "Order Section" of the NLRB under the direct supervision of the Secretary of the Board; that about the first of February, 1939, he was transferred to a legislative committee established by the Board to prepare a report which was to be presented before the Senate and House Committees, proposed U

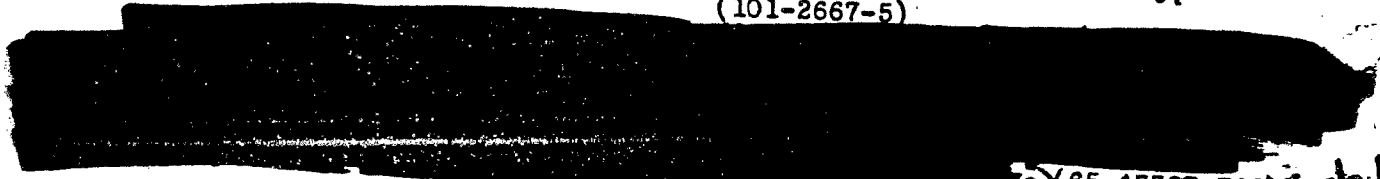
According to his statements in April, 1938, a staff of about six or eight attorneys were assigned to work under his supervision and they were charged with the gathering of evidence and the preparing of statements to be used before the Committee answering criticisms which had been leveled at the NLRB. Rosenberg said that his appointment as supervisor of this staff was made by Nathan Witt, Secretary of the NLRB. (62-57219-51 pages 2,3) U

The Bureau's investigation, with particular reference to Rosenberg, ascertained that he was placed in charge of a number of attorneys, as set out above, and that one by the name of Robert L. Condon working under him was placed in charge of correspondence; that a great deal of correspondence on Government stationery and using franked envelopes was directed to persons suggested by the various regional directors of the NLRB, soliciting them to write to Senator Thoms stating their views in opposition to the proposed amendments to the Act. (62-57219-95, page 16) U

It will be noted that Nathan Witt, Secretary of the NLRB and the person responsible for the appointment and service of Rosenberg, has been identified by Whittaker Chambers, a former high ranking Communist, as being a leader in the Communist underground group in Washington, D. C. Chambers has furnished information that Nathan Witt succeeded leadership of the Communist underground in Washington following Harold Ware and in turn was succeeded by John Abt as Head of the Communist underground. A letter from the New York Field Division to the Bureau dated September 26, 1942, captioned "Investigation of Government Employees, Internal Security. Hatch Act." advises that among the notations in the file at the office of the New Leader, a liberal publication located at 7 East 15th Street, New York City, was one to the effect that Allan Rosenberg who, it was believed, was employed by the NLRB was responsible for the "knife-in-the-back stab" on the report of David J. Sapses. (101-2667-1) U

On December 8, 1944, Colonel J. W. Keller of the War Department who was Security Officer for the Foreign Economic Administration identified Allan R. Rosenberg as Chief of the Economic Instruction Staff, FEA. Colonel Keller made known that Rosenberg had requested material classified "top secret." U

In the report of Special Agent [redacted], dated May 25, 1944, at Washington, D. C., in the case entitled "National Lawyers Guild, Internal Security - C," it was noted that a highly confidential source had furnished a roster of the active members of the Lawyers Guild in the Washington, D. C., area. It was noted that the name of Allan Rosenberg appeared thereon with the address 1929 R Street, N.W. and the further notation, dues had [redacted] March 9, 1940. (100-7231-8) U

On January 8, 1942, the active indices of the Special Committee on un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Martin Dies, Chairman, were checked by an Agent of the Washington Field Office and the following notations appeared after the names Allan R. Rosenberg and Allen Rosenberg: "Marian Anderson's Citizens Committee Member - Committee File." Following the name Allan Rosenberg is the notation, "National Lawyers Guild Member - Committee File - 2929 Ontario Road, Washington, D. C." (100-9867-3) U

Dr. Robert H. W. Kemper, a special employee of the Philadelphia Field Division, on January 19, 1945, advised that when the employment of one Miss Hedwig Wachenheim, a former Social Democratic Deputy in the Prussian Legislative Assembly, was not extended with the FEA, it was generally known that her immediate superior Allen Rosenberg indicated that he was anti-sympathetic to employee Wachenheim's anti-Communist stand. In addition to the above references, the report of Special Agent Lionel L. Mounier of New Haven, Connecticut, dated January 10, 1944, in the case entitled "Anastase A. Vonsiatsky, with aliases, Espionage - G, J," contains information that a translation of Russian material taken from the files maintained by Vonsiatsky included considerable correspondence with one K. Kasinsky during the period from December, 1935 to December, 1937. According to this material, Kasinsky furnished Vonsiatsky with a list of five persons who were alleged to be Communist agents. Included was the name of "A. Rosenberg" and the notation "Went to America (South) in 1934; worked with I. Fine in the American-Scandinavian Section of the Comintern at Danzig; returned to Europe." Kasinsky claimed to be in contact with various trustworthy persons in the USSR. It will be noted that Vonsiatsky in the summer of 1942 at Hartford, Connecticut, pleaded guilty to charges of conspiring to commit espionage. U (65-1675-657)

Bernard Schuster is the subject of a New York investigation entitled, "Bernard Schuster, was; Security Matter - C," last report dated October 31, 1945 (closed). At that time he was residing at 306 East 15th Street, New York City, and was the co-owner of a small import-export firm known as the National Mercantile and Trading Company, formerly Bernader Sales Company, 33 West 42nd Street, New York City. U

He was born October 14, 1904, at Warsaw, Russia (Poland). He was married in Jersey City, New Jersey, June 16, 1929, to Dorothy Schuster, born June 8, 1911, at Jersey City, New Jersey. His father is Leon Schuster, 64 years of age, residing at 162 East 7th Street, New York City. His mother is Cecelia Schuster. He has two brothers, Mitchells Schuster, 75 West Koshula Parkway, Bronx, New York, and Saul Schuster, 416 East 15th Street, New York City. His education consisted of eight years elementary schooling, four years high school, followed by attendance at New York University. The records there indicate that he was admitted in February, 1925. He was a graduate of Morris High School, Bronx, New York, and entered the New York University as a premedical student, majoring in chemistry. Upon graduation, he received a B. S. Degree in 1928, but was not accepted to the medical school reportedly due to mediocre records. Since 1934 he has been an accountant. He is registered for Selective Service with Local Board #9, 230 Second Avenue, New York City. He registered February 16, 1942, giving an address of 416 East 15th Street. Inquiry reflected that he had moved from that address following his registration to 226 East 36th Street, and then moved to 306 East 15th Street. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED] U

Regarding his previous business employment, it is noted that from about 1935 to March, 1939, he was Treasurer of the Wholesale Book Company, 50 East 13th Street, New York City, which company was a distributing organization for the CP, USA. Following this, he was Director of the Commonwealth Minupress Company, Incorporated, which was organized March, 1939, for the purpose of printing and distributing literature. William E. Browder and Bernard Chester are listed among the Directors of this corporation. He has also been an officer of the Rotograph Company, and his last employment has been in connection with the National Mercantile and Trading Company, formerly the Bernader Sales Company, and it is noted that his wife was also interested in this company. The files also show that he occasionally worked for Joseph W. Fanger of 1450 Broadway. Investigation reflected this was probably Joseph Finger, an accountant for the Wholesale Book Company, who resided at 39-71 44th Street, Sunnyside, Long Island, New York. U

Regarding his naturalization, inquiry has reflected a file on one Bernard Schuster of 1837 Clinton Avenue, Bronx, New York (Old address). This individual was admitted to citizenship on January 28, 1928, in the Supreme Court of Bronx County, U

This individual's date of birth was also October 14, 1904, at Warsaw, Poland, and is undoubtedly identical with the subject of this memorandum. He was destined at the time of his arrival in the United States to Louis Schutte, who was living in New York City, and the records show he was travelling with his father, Leon Smaster. Witnesses to his naturalization were Louis Schutte, jeweler, 2145 70th Street, Brooklyn, New York, and Rudolph Schuster, a furrier living at 2372 Valentine Avenue, Bronx, New York. Regarding the Workers Library Publishers, Incorporated, it has been ascertained that their distribution was handled by the Wholesale Book Corporation. The Wholesale Book Corporation was organized in 1935 and from the Certificate of Registration filed December 23, 1935, by Joseph R. Brodsky, attorney, it is noted that the Directors listed until the first meeting of the stockholders were Sam Siegel, 1686 Ryan Avenue, Bronx, New York; Bernard Schuster, 35 East 12th Street, New York City, and David Anrville, also of 35 East 12th Street, New York City. A Bernard Schuster, accountant-auditor, 202 West 104th Street, New York City, on July 25, 1935, addressed a letter to the Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., stating that he understood there were openings for experienced and competent accountants. He requested an application. Although an application was forwarded to Mr. Schuster, no further action was taken by him. U 61-7590-76

The Daily Worker for June 7, 1938, referred to E. Chester as Acting New York State Membership Director of the Communist Party. In 1939, E. Schuster was President of the Fifth A. D. Club of the Communist Party, Bronx, New York. His address at the time was 1336 Wilkins Avenue, telephone Dayton 37290. U

In March, 1939, Bernard Schuster resigned his position as Treasurer of the Wholesale Book Corporation. 100-331681-5 U 61-7559-5247

The Bureau's files reflect that one Chester Head arrived in New Haven, Connecticut, on February 15, 1944, for the purpose of conducting three days' investigation into the Weis Vindication Committee. It is noted that it has been a practice of the Communist Party, USSR, to send political instructors or travelling organizers to assist in the direction of the activities of Communist Parties in other countries. One of the duties of these individuals is to assist the control commission in disciplinary matters. It was stated that these travelling organizers were never of the same nationality as that of the country where they were assigned to work. The Bureau has previously pointed out regarding the Chester in connection with the Weis investigation that possibly this individual was one of these political instructors. Information appeared that Chester was in some way connected with the office of Charles Krumboltz in New York City. Investigation reflected that this Chester is probably identical to the subject of this memorandum.

INTRODUCTION

This subject, the wife of Nathan Gregory Silvermaster, was usually present when Elizabeth Terrill Bentley made her visits to the Silvermaster home to obtain the information gathered by the Silvermaster espionage group. On occasion the subject would obtain copies of United States Treasury documents made by Sonya Gold in the office of Harry D. White and deliver them to the informant on the latter's visits to the Silvermaster home.

The following is a summary of available information on Helen Silvermaster obtained from a review of Bureau files:

BACKGROUND

She was born in White Russia, the daughter of a Baltic Baron, known as Baron Peter Witte, and, according to the informant, she is about 42 or 43 years old. Her father was a counselor to the Czar and once headed a large Russian scientific expedition to Mongolia. He also acted as an adviser to the Mongolian Government and after the October Revolution he was arrested and subsequently released, thereafter becoming the head of Rice Institute in the South Ukraine where he engaged in scientific work.

After the revolution the subject went to China where she married a White Russian whose last name was Volkov. About 1923, he came to California as an adviser to the Manchurian Prince and presumably the subject accompanied him. He was allegedly sent here by the Russian Government and it is said that he finally became an O.G.P.V. agent, according to Charles Malamuth, who is a teacher of Russian at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, and formerly with Military Intelligence. Will Allen, a Labor writer for the Washington Daily News, stated that the subject was supposed to have been the common-law wife of one Wolkoff, who was an O.G.P.V. agent. He was stricken with tuberculosis and asked Silvermaster to look after his wife. As a result of this marriage a son, Anatole Boris Volkov, was born in San Francisco, October 29, 1924. Shortly thereafter, the subject separated from her husband and lived with Silvermaster whom she married three or four years later, after securing a divorce from Volkov. Her marriage to Silvermaster is believed to have

occurred in 1928 or 1929. (101-786-17,19,20,23, - 66-7155-53-10)

Since August of 1935, she and her husband have lived in Washington, D. C., their address since 1939 being 5515 30th Street, N. W., and prior to that, 2620 Jocelyn Street, N. W. She is not known to have been gainfully employed in Washington but according to the informant she has done considerable voluntary work such as engaging in Red Cross activities. She is said to still have relatives in Russia and, according to Benjamin Mandel, 3101 Pennsylvania Avenue, S.E., Washington, D. C., she has a brother-in-law by the name of Shcherbackoff, a Soviet agricultural expert, who was in the United States for a while.

According to the records of the Registrar's Office of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, North Carolina, the subject's son, Anatole Boris Valkev, was admitted to the university in June, 1942, after having attended Woodrow Wilson High School in Washington, D. C. He withdrew from the university May 10, 1944, to be inducted into the United States Navy. These records listed his mother as Helen P. Silvermaster, a graduate of the University of Moscow, Russia, and his step-father as H. Gregory Silvermaster. According to the informant, Anatole sometimes went to New York to deliver material to the informant for the Silvermasters. A picture of Anatole, obtained from the university records, is available in the file of the Charlotte, North Carolina Field Division. Another photograph of him taken as he was leaving the convention hall of Communist Party District #15 on April 30, 1944, at Richmond, Virginia, is available in Bureau files. According to the informant, he was assigned to a naval training station near Chicago, Illinois, probably the Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

The name, Helen Silvermaster, appeared on a list of members of the Washington Committee for Aid to China. This list was furnished by [REDACTED] an employee of the General Accounting Office, who described the subject as being one of the most outspoken and radical members of this organization. The names of Mr. and Mrs. Silvermaster appeared in the indices of the United American Spanish Aid Committee, according to Worthington E. Moughton, the Secretary for the E. According to an article in the Washington Post, March 18, 1938, the subject and her husband attended a reception given in honor of Dr. Gustav Regler by the Women's Committee of the Friends of Spanish Democracy. Dr. Regler, for many years, was a leading Communist writer in Germany and later became a political commissar in one of the International Brigades in the Spanish Revolution. He is presently residing in Mexico where he has ostensibly departed from the Communist Party line.

Elizabeth Terrill Bentley in her statement advised that about April, 1941, the United States Service and Shipping Corporation started business with offices at 212 Fifth Avenue, New York City. At this time Reynolds was President and Treasurer; Elizabeth Bentley was the Vice President; and Max Spector was Assistant Treasurer. Spector, according to Elizabeth Bentley, was formerly associated with the Amtorg Trading Corporation and although she knew he was a Communist, she had no information that would indicate that Max Spector was involved in any other activities.

A complete review of the Bureau files was made in the name of Max Spector which reflected little background information concerning this individual as follows:

On July 24, 1942, the Bureau received a copy of Censorship Daily Reports which reflected the following information: "U. S. Service Shipping Corporation, 212 Fifth Avenue, New York City. Subject, New York corporation, is engaged as a packing-shipping agency, arranging for shipments of packages from individuals in this country to Soviet Russia. Subject is also the sole agency for In-Tourist Agency of the Soviet Government and in this connection, collects duties and fees for the Government of Soviet Russia and arranges for the shipping and insurance. It is also the agent for the transfer of money from this country to Soviet Russia. Officers are: John H. Reynolds, President; Elizabeth Bentley, Vice President; Max L. Spector, Assistant Treasurer." 62-62736-1152

According to the Bureau files, Max L. Spector is the subject of an investigation entitled "World Tourist, Incorporated; Jacob Raisin, was; United States Service and Shipping Corporation; John Hazard Reynolds, was; Elizabeth Terrill Bentley, was; Max L. Spector, was; Registration Act, Espionage - R." A review of this investigation reveals little background information concerning Max L. Spector. The report of Special Agent J. E. Spector dated February 19, 1942, at New York, New York, in this investigation, reveals that a credit report on the United States Service and Shipping Corporation reflects that John Hazard Reynolds had made the statement to the credit bureau that Max L. Spector was an accountant and was previously employed as such until becoming associated with the United States Service and Shipping Corporation as Assistant Treasurer. Investigation further revealed that Max L. Spector was formerly a junior official of the Amtorg Trading Corporation. 61-6328-12

In May, 1943, she received a Bachelor of Science degree in public nursing.

At the Marriage License Bureau, New York City, Volume #2, Record #783, it was indicated that on January 10, 1944, Lini Weerkirk Fuhr married Louis Clyde Stouman of the United States Army. It was further indicated that her former husband, William Fuhr, had died in 1931. Stouman's birthplace was given as Springtown, Pennsylvania.

As of August 1942, Lini Fuhr was residing at 1911 Eye Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C. As of April, 1943, she was residing at 404 West 115th Street, New York City, c/o Taylor. On October 1, 1943, she was residing at 4342 Drexel Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois. As of December 11, 1944, Lini Stouman was residing at 1073 West Kensington Road, Los Angeles, California. Lini Stouman resided at 1418 1/2 Edgecliff Drive, Los Angeles, California, telephone 14403 as of July, 1945.

The "Daily Worker" for May 20, 1937, carried a picture of Lini Fuhr on page two under the caption, "Lini Fuhr is Back from Spain Where Fascists Bomb Hospitals." The paper in this article gave her activities stating that she had gone to Spain on January 16 (1937) with the First Medical Bureau to Aid Spanish Democracy, Medical Unit, and that she had returned to the United States to lecture during the Spanish Aid Week of May 30 to June 9. According to this article, Lini Fuhr was born in New Jersey of Dutch parents and as a small child worked as a bobbin girl in a New Jersey factory. At the age of sixteen, she became a telephone operator and at eighteen, began training at New Rochelle Hospital as a nurse.

She was married but her husband died a year after their child, Mary Lee, was born. This article also indicated that she had worked in Fort Chester, New York, as a visiting nurse and in 1934, she secured her Bachelor of Science degree in public health. In 1935 and 1936, she did social work in various hospitals. According to the article, when she heard of the hospital unit going to Spain, she joined up and went along with them.

The above background information was obtained from the case file on the above-captioned individual in the following reports: Report of Special Agent Oscar H. Sells dated April 16, 1943, at Washington, D. C.; Report of Special Agent Robert L. Smeltzer dated March 29, 1944, at New York City; Report of Special Agent Louis D. Nalla dated May 24, 1944, at Chicago, Illinois; and the Report of Special Agent Michael L. Keane, Sr., dated October 29, 1945, at Los Angeles, California. (101-4782-2, 3, 4 and 6)

The report of Special Agent Thomas E. Bryant dated December 21, 1944, at Los Angeles, California, in the case entitled "Dr. Deborah Vivian Gauber, with alias; Internal Security - R," reveals that as of November 1944, Mrs. Stouman was employed at the Venereal Disease Clinic for the City of Los Angeles. The records of the City Service Department, City of Los Angeles, were checked and they reflected that Mrs. Lini Moerkirk Stouman was employed in July, 1944, by the City of Los Angeles in the capacity of a medical-social worker at a salary of \$175.00 per month. These records reflected further that she had been employed since 1931 as a medical-social worker in Fort Chester, New York; San Juan, Puerto Rico; Las Vegas, New Mexico and Chicago, Illinois, where, according to the records, she worked from 1933 to June, 1944, as Director of Epidemiology for the Chicago Venereal Disease Control Clinics. Mrs. Stouman stated in her application for employment that the reason for her coming to California was the ill health of her daughter who had rheumatic fever. (100-335595-10)

ASSOCIATES AND ACTIVITIES

The Report of Special Agent Oscar H. Sells dated April 16, 1943, at Washington, D. C., in the case entitled "Lini Moerkirk Fuhr," reveals that Lini Moerkirk Fuhr was interviewed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation inasmuch as she was a complainant in the case entitled "Herman Meyer; Internal Security - C." This interview took place in August, 1942, at which time she was residing at 1911 Eye Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C. Lini Fuhr advised that she was employed as a health consultant on venereal disease by the United States Public Health Service, 1734 New York Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C. Investigation disclosed, however, that the personnel office of the U. S. Public Health Service had no record of ever having employed Lini Fuhr in any capacity.

The "Daily Worker" for January 19, 1938, listed Lini Fuhr as one of the speakers at a meeting of the East Bronx Division of the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy. This article stated that Lini Fuhr, "who had recently returned from Spain after serving as head nurse in one of the American hospitals behind the Loyalist lines," would be one of the speakers.

The report of Special Agent Robert L. Smeltzer dated March 29, 1944, at New York City in the case entitled "Mrs. Lini Moerkirk Stouman, also known as Lini Moerkirk Fuhr, Lee Moerkirk Fuhr; Security Matter - C" reflects that Confidential Informant F-1 made available the June, 1937, issue of "The Trained Nurse and Hospital Review," in which an article appeared on page 602 entitled "With the American Unit in War-torn Spain," submitted by Lini Fuhr, R. N., New York City. This article stated: "The First American Medical Unit left for Spain on January 16, 1937. The personnel consisted of Dr. Ed Baraky, chief surgeon; Frederica Martin, chief nurse; Mildred Backley, clerk and interpreter; Pierre Quignac and Carl Ruhman, ambulance drivers.....and myself (Mrs. Fuhr) as nurses. We were sent by the Medical Bureau to Aid Spanish Democracy, 244 Fourth Avenue, New York City....."

Miss Anita Jones, Room 303, Maternity Center Association, 654 Madison Avenue, New York City, advised that Lini Fuhr had at one time pursued an obstetrics course at the Maternity Center. Miss Jones stated that her impression of Lini Fuhr was that she was pseudo-intellect and not too intelligent but motivated by a desire to help the unfortunate and needy. She stated that Lini Fuhr had remarked to her that the Russian social system was preferable to that of the United States.

Miss Martha Mitchell, 200 West 37th Street, who joined the second expedition to Spain in 1937, not knowing it to be Communist-inspired, was acquainted with Lini Fuhr while in Spain. Miss Mitchell stated that Lini Fuhr was a strong Communist sympathizer if not actually a Communist. She stated that Lini Fuhr's nursing activities in Spain had appeared to be secondary to her spreading Communist propaganda. Lini Fuhr was thought to be thoroughly imbued with the idea that the Russian social and political system was preferable to that of any democracy including the United States.

Mrs. Lini Moerkerk Stoman was a correspondent of subject, Dr. Deborah Vivian Damber. At the time of correspondence with Dr. Damber, she was residing at 1418 1/2 Edgecliff Drive, Los Angeles, with her sixteen year old daughter and her husband Lou, who was at that time in the United States Army and was writing for the publication "Yank."

The report of Special Agent John E. Weiman dated August 20, 1942, at Washington, D. C., in the case entitled "Norman Meyer; Internal Security - C" reveals that Mrs. Lini Moerkerk Fahr, 1911 Rye Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., had made a complaint to the Bureau stating that her sister, Elisabeth Moerkerk had married one Norman Meyer in 1936 and that Norman Meyer, residing at 357 North Seventh Street, Prospect Park, Paterson, New Jersey, had entered the United States illegally in 1937 when he jumped his ship. Later in 1937, he went to Canada and re-entered the United States legally. He was subsequently naturalized in 1939. According to the complaint, Norman Meyer was pro-Nazi. During the course of the interview, it was ascertained that the complainant's parents, Mrs. Elisabeth De Vries Moerkerk and Leonard Moerkerk resided at 366 North Eighth Street, Prospect Park, Paterson, New Jersey, and that Mrs. Moerkerk speaks only Dutch. Frealey dated October 5, 1942, at Newark, New Jersey, in the case entitled "Ernest Norman Meyer; Internal Security - S; Alien Enemy Control" reflects that the residence of Ernest Norman Meyer, 365 North Seventh Street, Prospect Park, Paterson, New Jersey, was searched on September 3, 1942, in connection with the multiple spot searches conducted by the Newark Field Division. During the course of the resulting interview, Mrs. Moerkerk stated that the Communist material and the essay on "The German Revolution of 1918" by Lini Moerkerk Fahr had been left at their home by her sister, Lini Moerkerk Fahr, for her husband Ernest Norman Meyer to read and that she had never called for the material. Meyer denied that he had ever read the material and said at the time Lini Fahr left the material, she was a radical and had just returned from Spain, where she had served in the revolution as a nurse. 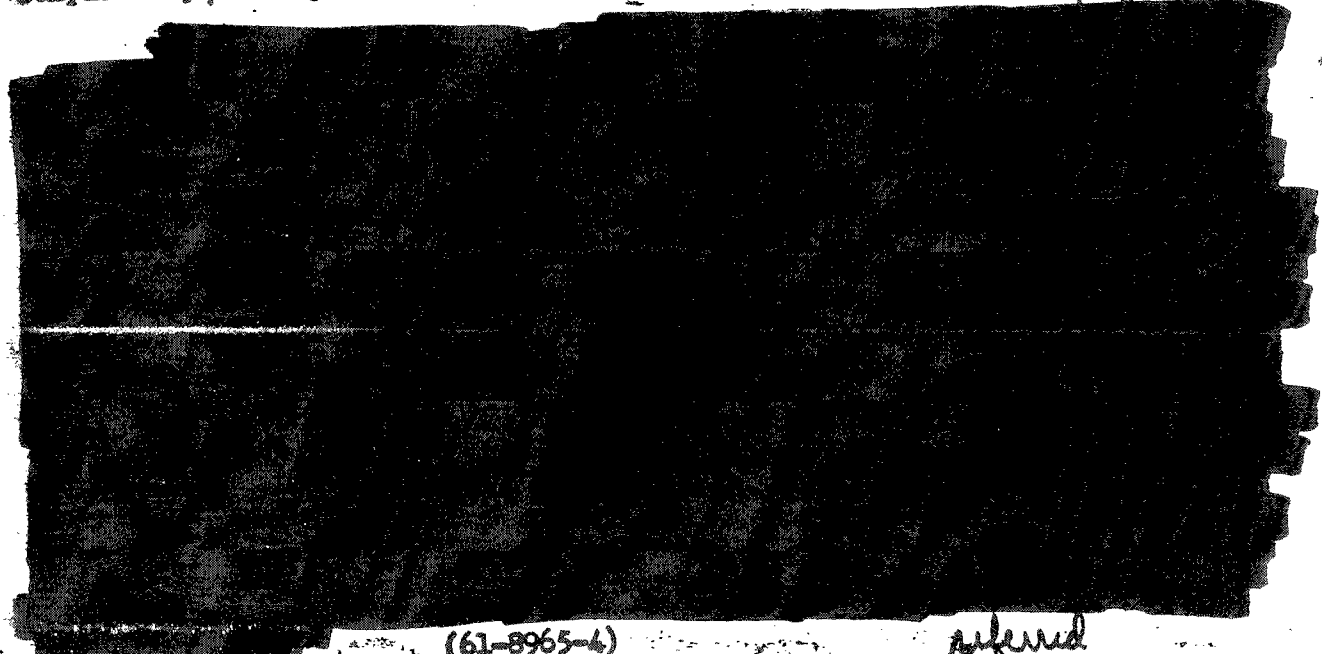

The Bureau files reflect the following information concerning
William Henry Taylor:

Records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reveal that Taylor was born at Revelstoke, British Columbia, on March 30, 1906. He was employed as a university professor and arrived at Honolulu, Hawaii on September 4, 1936 on the S. S. "Empress of Japan," residing there until December 12, 1939. His file further reflects that he married Dorothy Gray Taylor who was born at New York City on September 17, 1906. Taylor made his petition for naturalization on December 12, 1939 and Certificate of Naturalization #4721376 was issued to him in the United States District Court for the Territory of Hawaii at Honolulu on March 30, 1940. His description was set forth as follows: Five feet eight inches tall; fair complexion; blue eyes; brown hair.

E. M. Bernstein, Assistant Director, Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, advised that he had known Taylor from the time he commenced working at the Treasury Department in 1931. He stated that Taylor was first employed under his jurisdiction and that he now holds an equal position in the same Division. He further advised that he knew nothing that would indicate that Taylor was disloyal to the United States but did state that Taylor is pro-Russian in that he has a great deal of admiration for the Soviet Government, both prior to and since the outbreak of the war between Russia and Germany. The Office of Censorship furnished information, dated December 1, 1943, concerning material found in the possession of Anstole Alec De Montmorency, described as a French author returning from a repatriation trip aboard the SS Gripsholm. Censorship listed information carried by this person reflecting his anti-British and anti-American sentiments, also information on the following matters: Account of fall of Hongkong and Japanese atrocities; observations concerning Japanese repatriates aboard Gripsholm; account of Lansen incident, September, 1940, between French and Japanese in Indo-China; arrangement for correspondence with France through intermediaries in Mexico and Sweden and a list of names in Montmorency's possession.

In the Censorship Examination Montmorency stated himself to be a free-lance newspaperman and the author of "The Enigma of Admiral Darlan."

Among the list of names, apparently contacts of De Montmorency, was the following: Mrs. Mary A. Elov-Helen Tenney (on memo sheet of short-wave research MC.), 730 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York. It is not known whether the Helen Tenney listed here is identical with the subject.

In an examiner's note the Office of Censorship advised that previous records revealed De Montmorency as connected with an attempted evasion of Foreign Funds Control through an attempt to communicate with him through persons in enemy occupied territory. It was also stated that previous correspondence from a ship's officer of the Gripsholm revealed that the writer had the following impression of De Montmorency — "On our last trip, we had a sailor with us who was French but who spoke Swedish. His name was Anstole De Montmorency. We nicknamed him 'Doc-Elov-All'. He told us—that Montmorency is one of the finest families in France and that they became famous in France's history many years ago."

There is no other identifying information available concerning Helen Tenney or De Montmorency.

The Bureau files reflect the following information relative to Anatole Boris Volkov. Volkov was born on October 29, 1924, at San Francisco, California and entered the University of North Carolina in June, 1942, having previously attended Woodrow Wilson High School, Washington, D. C. He is the stepson of N. Gregory Silvermaster, Director, Labor Division, Farm Security Administration, Washington, D. C., residing at 5513 30th Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C.

While attending the University of North Carolina, Volkov rented Post Office Box #481 and during the period he rented this box, received regularly copies of the Communist publication, the "Daily Worker." He is reported to have attended the District Convention of the Communist Party in Richmond, Virginia, during the year 1944. A photograph of Volkov is available in the files of the Charlotte Field Office.

Volkov was mentioned by Charles Sanbow, President of the Student Council, University of California, as possibly being the individual among several other Jewish students who might have written an anti-Semitic letter to another Jewish student. Sanbow stated at the time of this interview that this may have been done for any number of reasons but principally to arouse sympathy on behalf of the Jewish students.

As a matter of record, this is to advise that ASAC Hennrich of the Washington Field Office contacted my office at 10 AM this date for the purpose of requesting the installation of a portable radio station in a plant located in northwest Washington. He advised that the radio station was to be used to control the operations of several two-way cars presently conducting a surveillance in the area. He pointed out that a coverage of six blocks would be adequate for the purpose intended. Hennrich was advised that a 60 watt disguised portable FM station and a radio engineer would be made available immediately it being pointed out as a matter of information that the FM equipment of high frequency would provide greater security from outside listening sources than would operations on a frequency closely adjacent to those utilized by police. Accordingly, at 11:15 AM, Special Agents L. J. Zander and M. J. Hawkins called at my office and in company with R. L. Millen and B. L. Sutton proceeded to the plant located at [redacted]. I am advised that this is the [redacted]

[redacted] has been provided for the technical equipment and Agent Hawkins, who is to operate the plant. U BYC 67D

The 60 watt FM disguised trunk equipment was established in the room and tests conducted between this unit and a two-way FM car (Ford Coupe) of the Washington Field Office operated by Speical Agent Zander. U

Upon the conclusion of the tests which were conducted from points comparable to those being taken up by the surveilling two-way cars, Agent Zander stated that the results were entirely satisfactory allowing two-way cars to operate with the fixed station in excess of ten blocks. At these fairly remote locations, they can be alerted when the occasion arises by the observing Agent on duty at the radio station. The equipment was turned over to the above-mentioned Agents at 1 PM and Mr. Hennrich was so advised. U

Speical Agent Hawkins was thoroughly briefed in the operation of the FM station equipment and cautioned not to move the equipment from the point in which it was originally tuned up. Upon conclusion of this review, he stated that he had no questions concerning the equipment or the operation thereof and expressed confidence in his ability to operate the station without any difficulty. It is pointed out that the disguised 60 watt equipment, completely self-contained in a standard foot locker, established its practicability on the first case to which it was assigned in that a standard size suitcase was easily carried into the surveillance point whereas equipment otherwise constructed would have attracted undue attention. The simplicity of assembling and tuning placed the equipment on the air within a few minutes. Standardization of controls necessitated only the shortest briefing on the equipment inasmuch as Agent Hawkins was already familiar with the older type 60 watt equipment controls.

You will recall that the chief informant in the captioned case, Elizabeth Bentley, made reference to Louis F. Budenz as being an associate of Jacob Golos during the period when he was reputedly engaged in espionage activities in behalf of the Soviet Union. With respect to Budenz, Informant Bentley related that in about June, 1943, Golos took Bentley to Budenz; requested her to begin seeing Budenz; and informally arranged that Budenz would in the future supply information to Bentley in the same manner in which he, Budenz, had formerly supplied it to Golos directly. Continuing, the informant advised that occasionally Budenz would phone Golos indicating that he had information for him whereupon Bentley would contact Budenz for that information. Elaborating on the foregoing, Informant Bentley expressed the belief that Budenz was getting a good deal of his information from Louis Adamic. She indicated that to the best of her recollection the information related to such matters as the following: internal troubles in Yugoslavia; Yugoslav groups in the United States; and information about certain United States Government officials or employees who might be sent to Europe or Turkey.

In line with the foregoing the writer and Special Agent Winterrowd, in their recent interview with Budenz, made certain inquiries for the purpose of determining the nature of his relationship with Golos and Bentley. When this subject was initially mentioned Budenz furnished little information of value, although he did state that to the best of his recollection he, Budenz, initiated the original contact with Golos in New York City, at which time Budenz was affiliated with the Chicago Communist "Midwest Record." He stated that, to the best of his recollection at the time, he travelled to New York City to obtain advertising for his newspaper since it was in financial arrears at which time someone suggested to him that he might obtain advertising from Jacob Golos who Budenz believes was affiliated with World Tourists. Budenz stated further at the time of our original inquiry that he would contact Golos; that he would receive advertising commitments for his paper from Golos; and that as far as he could recall then he saw Golos between six and twelve times from the time of his initial contact until the latter part of 1943. (Golos died in November, 1943.)

When interviewed by the writer and Special Agent Winterrowd on a subsequent date, Mr. Budenz stated that during the intervening period he had given much thought to our earlier discussions and that in connection with the instant matter he had additional information to offer. He related that he now recalled having met and having been acquainted with Golos for a much longer period of time than he had previously stated. He advised that to the best of his recollection he has known Golos since 1925 and possibly even since 1922. In an endeavor to accurately place his original contact in point of time he stated that he more than likely made his

initial acquaintance with Golos when Sidney Hillman was the head of the Russian-American Corporation, and during which period Golos was an official in another organization (name not recalled) which was Communist in its political orientation. U

At this point Budenz stated that in addition to knowing Golos he also knew Bentley "but he knew her by the name of Helen Johns." Immediately thereafter he stated that even though Bentley utilized the name of Helen Johns in her associations with Budenz he knew at the same time that her name was actually Elizabeth Bentley. U

At this point in the interview, Budenz digressed temporarily by stating that one thing which recalls to his mind his relationship with Golos and Bentley was an incident which arose in connection with a United States citizen of Czech descent, who was interviewed by many in the United States as an authority on Czech matters. This individual's last name was Rubes (phonetic). According to Budenz, Rubes had a daughter named Laura Rubes (phonetic) who lived in ~~ASTORIA~~ who was considered by some of Budenz' Communist Party associates as an individual who was friendly to the Soviet Union and to the Communist cause in America. U

From the manner in which Laura Rubes acted, Budenz was not entirely convinced of her sincerity; in fact he had the impression for a time that she might have been "watching" or spying on Budenz' activities. Accordingly, Budenz discussed the Rubes woman with Elizabeth Johnstone, the wife of Jack Johnstone and an individual who was formerly married to a Czech and who knew the background of the Czechs very well. Elizabeth Johnstone furnished general information to Budenz concerning Laura Rubes, which information apparently satisfied him as to her reliability. (The latter deduction is one of inference only since Budenz did not actually state this to the interviewing Agents.) In any event, at about this time Laura Rubes advised Budenz that she had a letter from her father who was then in Cairo and who, according to Budenz, was representing United States interests and may even have been a representative of the United States Government in Egypt. At this point Budenz advised Golos of the receipt of the Rubes letter and of the fact that Laura Rubes' father was in Cairo whereupon, according to Budenz, Golos "seemed interested." Elucidating upon this interest of Golos, Budenz stated that he got the definite impression from Golos that he seemed interested in knowing what Mr. Rubes' attitude might be toward Tito and in knowing whether Rubes might be getting in touch with King Peter. U

Next Budenz advised that he and Golos occasionally discussed Adamic and his attitude at that time concerning a Federated Yugoslavia. He stated that he, Budenz, would make reports on what people such as Adamic said concerning problems such as the Yugoslavian one; that these reports would be made to Browder or Landy "as a regular thing;" and that "he may also have furnished them to Golos but he didn't recall." U

Budenz asserted that from his contacts with Golos it would appear that the latter was more interested in Yugoslav subjects than in anything else. U

Inasmuch as Adamic's attitude at that time concerning a Federated Yugoslavia was in conflict with the policies expressed by the Soviet Union concerning the Slavic peoples, and in view of Budenz' very friendly relationship with Adamic, the following question was put to Budenz: "Would Golos try to get you to bring pressure to bear upon Adamic in order that he might change his policy regarding a Federated Yugoslavia," whereupon Budenz replied that Golos, Browder and Landy all tried to get Budenz to have Adamic change his policy. (It may be considered noteworthy that subsequently Adamic did substantially alter his expressions on the question of a Federated Yugoslavia, and altered them in such a fashion as to bring his ideas in line with those expressed by Soviet officials.) U

Continuing, Budenz expressed the conviction that Golos was a "runner" between the Soviets and interested groups in the United States. U

Getting back to the subject of Helen Johns alias Bentley, Budenz advised that Golos told him that he, Golos, had heart trouble; that accordingly he wanted Budenz to furnish any information he received in the future concerning such matters as the foregoing to Helen Johns inasmuch as she was trustworthy and because she would in turn make the information available to Golos. At this point in discussing Helen Johns, Budenz inferred that she was a behind-the-scene operator since he would see her occasionally in the building occupied by Communist Party headquarters at which time she would obviously indicate to Budenz that she did not want him to recognize her while in the building. U

In recalling the peculiar nature of the activities engaged in by both Golos and Johns, Budenz stated that he got the distinct impression that both Golos and Johns were working for the Control Commission, and that Golos was actually a member of that Commission (which entity Budenz described as being one which is supposed to regulate the conduct of Communist Party members.) Budenz stated that from their activities he got the impression that they may have been engaged in some defensive measures for protective purposes with respect to certain of the activities in which some of the Communist Party members were engaged. U

At this point, Budenz launched into a discussion of the Control Commission and he made certain comments which are of such a nature that they are worthy of quoting herein: U

"What is the Control Commission? I've been a responsible official (of the Party)—dealt with personnel—had to do things about firing people and all that—for ten years—but never have I. U

"seen the Control Commission. Never has anyone in the name of the Control Commission said anyone was good, bad or indifferent My memory is as a matter of fact that Golos is a member of the Control Commission. Now I understand that the Control Commission in the Communist Party is supposed to regulate the conduct of Party members. The regulation of the conduct may be in regard to political matters, personnel or anything else. I've never seen this Control Commission. If you ask me today who is the Control Commission I won't know." U

At this point, in order to emphasize the importance of the Control Commission, Budenz recalled an incident which obviously relates to the activities of that Commission. He stated that when Casey was affiliated with the "Daily Worker" there was a lot of eruption in Party and "Daily Worker" headquarters; that Casey was so afraid of the ninth floor (the officials of the Communist Party) that he did things on his own without conferring with or soliciting the advice of Communist Party officials; that on one occasion Budenz himself wrote a ten page editorial on the Chinese question; that Casey apparently disagreed with the policy of the editorial and, therefore, without conferring with the hierarchy of the Party tore up the editorial and as a result, when the "Daily Worker" of that date was ready to appear on the streets, it contained ten pages of blank space. As a result there was a tremendous eruption in Communist Party and "Daily Worker" headquarters and "everyone was considered suspect." At this point, Bittleman discussed the matter with Budenz; Budenz advised him that Casey tore up the editorial; whereupon Bittleman stated that "he would call Golos on the Control Commission." When Budenz indicated that he would bring the matter to the attention of Golos on the Control Commission, Harry Gannis begged him not to do it and, according to Budenz, Bittleman did not refer the matter to Golos on the Control Commission. U

Continuing, Budenz stated: "I think the question of the Control Commission is a very important one--all through the years we've heard the Control Commission spoken of from time to time, sometimes even at National Committee meetings"--but apparently spoken of in a surreptitious fashion. U

Additional inquiries were made of Budenz of the Control Commission and he did furnish information of value which will be set out in subsequent memoranda under suitable captions. U

The only additional statements furnished by Budenz relative to the captioned case were statements to the effect that recently when the Department of U

Justice sought or solicited Budenz to register as an agent of a foreign principal, he discussed the matter with Joe Brodsky at which time Brodsky referred to past Registration Act cases involving Communists and specifically to the Golos case (who you will recall was convicted for violating the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act in March, 1940.) Brodsky stated at the time that Golos was purposely made a "fall man" and that it was prearranged by high ranking functionaries here that Golos would submit to prosecution. U

OBSERVATION:

It will be observed that Budenz has confirmed in its entirety that portion of the Bentley statement which relates to the association existing between them and the activities engaged in by Golos, Bentley and Budenz. It is further observed that an Agent having a thorough knowledge of the Silvermaster case might well be able to elicit from Budenz additional information concerning other principals in the case. Accordingly, it is suggested that consideration might be given the advisability of a subsequent interview with Budenz by the qualified Agent relative to certain additional details of the Silvermaster matter. U

In this regard it will be recalled that Budenz has indicated to the writer that he hopes to be in Washington the first of the year at which time he will make contact with the writer. If such contact is made you will be immediately advised, at which time you may desire considering the advisability of having Budenz interviewed in greater detail with respect to the angles of the Silvermaster case by Special Agent Lish Whitson. I had myself photographed just the same, but it came out terribly. I was ready to trim down that large picture on all sides, but it looked so strange then - the face alone. When I came home yesterday I was very pleasantly surprised to receive your letter. Once again many thanks to you and Lada. It was awfully nice of him to do the printing. If you had sent the films, I could have done it here quite quickly by asking one of Vilmin's acquaintances, who is in the photography business, or rather he develops his favorite photographs himself. Now I can send off my application without further delay, thanks to your 'kindness'.

"Yesterday we had such terrible weather that it took me an hour and a half to get home from work - the snowdrifts were so high and there was such a traffic tie-up. My legs got numb while I was waiting for a bus. It's no fun poking along on the busses, but it is not so bad as driving a car in such weather. I quite understand how you felt sliding along Washington's mountainous (sic) streets.

As you know, there are presently being maintained by the New York and Washington Divisions approximately 25 technical surveillances in connection with the N. Gregory Silvermaster case. These technical surveillances are being operated in connection with the case as a special and at the present time letters of justification are becoming due at the Bureau.

According to previous instructions issued by the Bureau, letters of justification must be submitted monthly at least, on all technical and microphone surveillances. In view of the nature of the Silvermaster case, however, it is felt that this requirement may be dispensed with as each technical surveillance is being given special attention and its productivity being carefully determined.

Recommendation:

It is suggested, therefore, that the required monthly letter of justification for technical surveillances be dispensed with in connection with the technical surveillances placed on various individuals in the Silvermaster case.

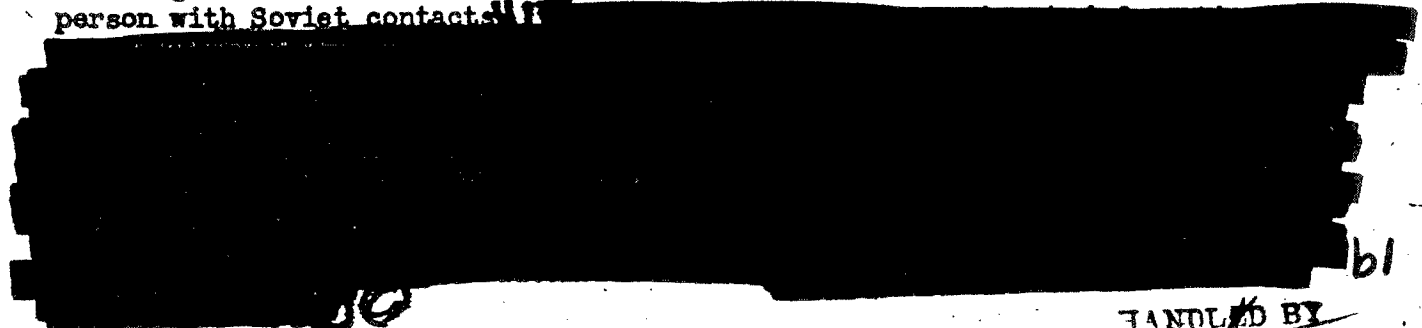

The informant in this case, Elizabeth Terrill Bentley, has advised that one of her previous Russian contacts known to her only as "Jack" had indicated that the NKVD had code designations for the various agencies of the United States Government. It is her recollection that the code designation for the FBI was "hotel".

Jack also cautioned Bentley to stay away from the Soviet Consulate General in New York City inasmuch as he believed the FBI had the Consulate General building under observation and that he did not want her to be identified as a person with Soviet contacts.

Another item of interest furnished by informant Bentley was in regard to the attempt by OSS to establish an office in Moscow in December of 1943 with a corresponding office for the NKVD to be set up in Washington, D. C. Bentley found out about this from Duncan Lee of OSS who was associated with William Donovan's law firm in New York. According to Bentley, Lee said that President Roosevelt and Admiral Leahy were not in favor of the plan but that you had stated that it would not make much difference because the NKVD had been operating in the United States since the Amtorg Trading Corporation was established in New York City. She also said that Major Lee was frightened about the prospects of an official NKVD mission coming to the United States because he had visions of NKVD visiting him at his home and thanking him for his cooperation.

On Page 6 of this report it is reflected that EDITH SCHREIBER is not known to the Boston Field Office. It is noted that a telephone call was placed to EDITH SCHREIBER at Trowbridge 6552 on June 8, 1945, by one of the Subjects of instant case.

In reviewing a list of Communist Party members in Cambridge, Mass., it was noted that the name [redacted], to which address the telephone number indicated is listed.

A review of the Boston Office indices reflects that EDITH SCHREIBER's true name is EDITH SCHREIBER ZAP and that she has been the Subject of investigation in Washington, D.C., as well as in Boston, Mass.

She is the Subject of a report entitled EDITH SCHREIBER ZAP nee EDITH SCHREIBER, INTERNAL SECURITY, HATCH ACT, by Special Agent S. W. REYNOLDS at Washington, D.C., dated April 1, 1942. She is also the Subject of a report by Special Agent C. B. HOWARD at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, dated March 14, 1942. Copies of these reports are in the possession of the Washington Field Division and the Bureau.
