





Worker run a correction article with regard to the statements made by Petersen, in which correction article it was stated that Petersen did not agree to the following formulation submitted by the Veterans' delegation: "The Var Department does not ber men from Officer Cambidate School or sensitive positions in the Army because they are members of the Communist Party. Non-Communists and Communists will be berred if they are subversive or dismiffected." The correction article further stated that Petersen did agree to the following fermulation of War Department policy: "The War Department does not ber men from Officer Candidate School or sensitive positions in the Army because of their political affiliations. Non-Communists and Communists will be barred if they are subversive or disaffected." The Daily Worker stated in addition in the article on March 21, 1966, that despite the above statement, Petersen made it plain that in practice Communists would be discriminated against in the Army.

In addition to the above information it is of interest to note that apparently former Assistant Secretary of War John J. WoClay, who is now with the Department of State, and Colonel Alfred WoCorniek, formerly with the Military Intelligence Service and now with the Department of State, were apparently both sonnected at one time with the same law firm with which Petersen was sonnected prior to his employment by the War Department.

For your further information in connection with Petersen, there is set out below a summary of the information contained in the Bureau's files concerning him.

Howard C. Petersen was born in 1910, received his B. A. Degree from DePass University, Greencastle, Indiana, in 1933, and received his J. D. Degree 1975 from the University of Michigan later, as reflected in the 1945 edition of the Martindale and Habbell Lawyers Directory.

Howard C. Petersen was formerly connected with the law firm of Creveth, DeGeredorff, Swaine and Wood, 15 Broad Street, New York City, and resigned from that firm in January, 1941. He is presently residing at 402 Worth St. Asaph, Alexandria, Virginia. (62-22665-453)

The name of Howard C. retereen, according to information meet ved from a highly confidential source in October, 1944, was Surpished as a possible contact in the War Department to Boyl Haddock, Mational Legislative Mapresentative for the Mational Maritime Union, CIO, attached to the CIO Maritime Commission in Washington, D. C. Maddock has been reported to have close Communist affiliations but no information is available reflecting the purpose of designating Petersen as a contact men in connection with the above information. On March 19, 1946, the Daily Forcer, East Coast organ of the Commist Party, USA, stated that a delegation of Commist veterans of World War II called on Howard C. Petersen, Assistant Secretary of War, to protest the ruling of the War Department hearing Communists from sensitive positions and commissions in the Army. The Earth 20, 1946, issue of the Daily Worker stated that Howard C. Petersen teld the delegation of Communist veterans that he would not repudiate a Mar Department spokeseen's statement that membership in the Communist Party would have a man from a soundssion or from a sensitive position in the Army. Mr. FRANK ROSS, Assistant Manager of the hotel, after checking his records, advised that subject LISCHINSKY had registered at the Olympic Hotel on January 23, 1946 and had left February 3, 1946. 

A newspaper article appeared in the Vancouver B.C. Daily Province for February 13, 1946. This newspaper article, under a large photograph of the subject, was captioned "UNRRA Agents Here to Buy Fishing Boats for China". Immediately under the photograph of subject appears the following:

"Buying Fishing Boats—A former Canadian, S.A. LISCHINSKY, once a resident of Estevan, Sask., is in Vancouver as one of a two-man survey and purchasing mission for UNRR/A. They are seeking fishing boats to rebuild China's fishing fleet and help that nation avert starvation. Mr. LISCHINSKY, now a resident of Washington, D.C., is here with H. K. MURPHY. Registered at the Hotel Vancouver, they are receiving many callers who want to sell their fishing craft".

Mr. EVERETT NELSON, manager of the Roosevelt Hotel, Seattle, Washington, advised after checking his records, that subject as S. A. HASHINSKY registered at the Roosevelt Hotel, Seattle, at 9:20 p.m. on February 19, 1946. He was given Room 607 and on the following day transferred to Room 409. Mr. NELSON also advised that subject had given his home address as 2002 Fort Davis Street, Washington, D.C. No record was noted of H. K. MORPHY having registered at the Roosevelt Hotel.

A spot-check surveillance conducted on the subject over a period of several days reflected that he followed a routine procedure of leaving the hotel at approximately 9:00 to 9:30 a.m. and proceeding directly to the 0'Shea Building, 1524 Fifth Avenue. At this building subject would go to the Third floor, offices of the U.S. Treasury Procurement Division and he was observed on several occasions using a desk made available to him. Subject had frequent persons at his desk whom he appeared to be interviewing. He was observed there at various times through the day and it was ascertained that he generally left the building at approximately 5:00 p.m., when he returned to the Roosevelt Hotel.

Confidential Informant T-1 advised on March 5, 1946 that subject had prepared a lengthy telegram, which was sent as a night letter on March 4, 1946 to Mr. C. H. TILLSON, Room 918, Agricultural Office Rehabilitation, UNRRA, 1344 Connecticht Avenue Northwest, Washington D.C. The informant advised that the telegram dealt with the progress made by subject to recruit crews and obtain fishing boats for China, and indicated that the subject requested authority to make agreements with shippers, chief engineers and fishermen to handle this work. It was indicated that a fish convoy for China must be ready within two weeks from March 4, 1946.

Confidential informant T-2 advised that a letter addressed to the subject at 3821 West Street South, Mashington, D.C. had been forwarded to the Olympic Hotel, Seattle to be held for him. A return address on the letter indicated that it was from the University of Toronto, Toronto, Canada. Confidential Informant T-2 also advised that the letter contained an invitation to the subject to attend a memorial service for the late GEORGE SIDNEY PARTT, Mr. FRSC, University of Toronto, Toronto, Canada, the memorial to be held in the first week of March, 1946.

In addition to the above, portions of material made available by a very highly confidential source reflected that there were references to many small boats, including figures for tormage, length, engine capacity, and various other specifications. It is believed that the above pertains to the contacts made by subject to obtain small fishing boats for China.

On February 28, 1946, Mr. BL/IR, Assistant Manager of the Roosevelt Hotel, advised that subject paid his bill by a check drawn on the National Capital Bank of Washington, D.C.

With reference to THOR HOFSTLD, who was known to be called by the subject on 2-28-46, the indices of the Seattle Office reflect the following information:

In 1943 THOR BURRENT MOFSTAD submitted an application for permission to travel to Llaska. He indicated on the application that he was born March 18, 1897 at Wrangel, Llaska. He had been the operator of a light plane at Seldovia, Alaska, and likewise had been employed as an Assistant Marine Superintendent at the port of Embarkation, Seattle, Washington. His application for a commission in the United States Navy Reserve was refused in the Thirteenth Naval District because various allegations were reported which were unverified that HOFSTAD advocated in the United States form of Government to make it conform to the Bussian type. He was reported to be both pro-nazi and communistic in 1941 , and he is married to JEAN HOFSTAD, who likewise was reported to be a radical influence in the community where she had previously lived. THOR HOFSTAD and his wife had been the subject of investigation by the Los Angeles Field Division. HOFSTAD's wife, Mrs. JEAN HOFSTAD, submitted application on January 19, 1943 for permission to travel to Alaska. On this application form she indicated she had been born July 31, 1893 at Carey Owen, Iowa. Numerous reports were received by the Lnchorage Field Division indicating that Mrs. HOFSTAD was radical in her views and in

sympathy with the democratic form of Communism.

In November, 1940 it was reported that she had urged the preparation of certain typewritten notices which were posted on several store fronts at Seldovia, Alaska urging a current attempt by other individuals to form a Red Cross to aid England. These notices contained the worlds "Heil Hitler" or "Hurrah for Germany". It was alleged that while a former principal in the public school at Seldovia, she had submitted therein subversive ideas among school children. Reportedly, she was among certain individuals adduded from Anchorage and Seward when President HOOVER visited there in 1923. It was also reported that she was an associate of wellknown radicals of her community and forced her husband and others to join her Communistic beliefs. She was formerly married to one J. KEITH McCULLOCH, of Homer, Alaska, who was described as a known radical. It was also reported that patriotic literature sent to her school was destroyed on receipt.

Both THOR and JEAN HOFSTAD had been critical of the U.S. Army and Navy for their failure to disledge the Japs from the Aleutian Islands.

Dear Sir:

As the Bureau is aware, Confidential Informant GREGORY advised that in approximately November of 1936 she was introduced by one BEATRICE CARLIN to an individual known as JOSEPH ECKHART. BEATRICE CARLIN, who was at that time connected with the American League against war and Fascism, asked GREGORY to be of service to JOSEPH ECKHART when ECKHART came to the United States. Apparently GREGORY was to function in a capacity similar to that of a private secretary. As above noted, BEATRICE CARLIN did introduce GREGORY to ECKHART, but actually GREGORY had little contact with ECKHART and saw him for the last time in January of 1938, when ECKHART stated he was leaving the United States. GREGORY can furnish no additional minformation concerning ECKHART'S activities or present whereabouts., However, it will be recalled that JACOB GOLOS, who was engaged in Russian espionage and who was GREGORY'S principal at that time, told GREGORY that ECKHART was an NKVD agent and that he was active in the United States securing airplanes for use in Spain.

\_Investigation by this office has developed that one JOSEPH WITOUT ECKHART (his picture has been identified by GREGORY as the individual Nintroduced to her by BEATRICE CARLIN) filed a Declaration of Intention for DUnited States citizenship in the District Court, Southern District of New Nork, on June 5, 1936. He claimed to have been born in Kovno, Lithuania, February 2, 1895, and to have entered the United States illegally via ferry co ofrom Windsor, Canada, March 2, 1921. Years later, in 1935, he legalized mohis presence in the United States by securing a Certificate of Registry. Mowever, investigation locally and in Philadelphia has failed to develop that ECKHART ever pursued his Declaration of Intention with a view to becoming a citizen.

EX - 26 DOEXED ECKHART'S activities from 1921 to December of 1934 Tre fairly well accounted for. However, in January of 1935, according to information from Immigration and Naturalization sources, he became employed by one JOSEPH A. DE WYCKOFF, of Ramsey, New Jersey. ECKHART stated that his occupation was that of a chemist, but he did not further define his employment activities with DE WYCKOFF nor further identify this individual.

On December 18, 1935, ECKHART filed an application for a reentry-permit at New York City and stated that at that time he was employed as a chemist by JOSEPH DE WYCKOFF, Ramsey, New Jersey.

Investigation by this office tends to substantiate information furnished by GREGORY to the effect that ECKHART left the country in 1938, probably in the early part of the year. Checks of all known sources have failed to establish that he reentered this country, at least under his true name, his last known entry having occurred on February 24, 1937. It is also interesting to note that ECKHART'S last application for a reentry permit was filed October 31, 1936.

Little is known about ECKHART'S employment in this country after December of 1934. For some years prior to that time he was regularly employed in the transportation field in New York City, but according to his own statements in January of 1935 he became employed by JOSEPH A. DE WYCKOFF of Ramsey, New Jersey.

The Newark Office was requested to ascertain the identity and background of this JOSEPH LE WICKOFF and to consider the advisability of contacting him, either directly or under a suitable pretext, for further information concerning ECKHART'S present whereabouts and activities. From what information is available, it would appear that ECKHART changed his residence and place of employment from the United States to England, presumably around 1938. The Newark Office has now advised that the Postmaster at Ramsey, New Jersey, knew of JOSEPH IE WICKOFF, who formerly resided on Franklin Turnpike in Ramsey but who as of June 30, 1944, changed his address to 1608 Tiger Tail Avenue, Miami, Florida. The Postmaster said that JOSEPH IE WICKOFF formerly owned one of the large estates in the vicinity of Ramsey, New Jersey, and that he was considered one of the wealthier men in that area. About two years ago, according to this source, DE WICKOFF sold his property for sub-divisions. It was stated that DE WICKOFF was of Russian Jewish extraction, but the Postmaster knew little about his business activities.

The Newark Office subsequently interviewed HARRY VOSS, Chief of Police in Ramsey, and VOSS stated that he was well acquainted with JOSEPH DE WYCKOFF. VOSS described DE WYCKOFF as being a thoroughly reliable individual with plenty of money. Mr. VOSS recalled that DE WYCKOFF had a variety of business interests in New York City, at one time having been associated with the late CHARLES M. SCHWAB and with the Vanadium Steel Corporation. According to VOSS, DE WYCKOFF is separated from his wife, MINERVA, and Mrs. DE WYCKOFF resides in New York City at the present time.

The Miami Office, which is being furnished a copy of this letter, is requested to check their indices for information concerning DE WYCKOFF,

and if no adverse information is found, to interview DE WYCKOFF under a suitable pretext for further information concerning ECKHART'S present whereabouts and activities. It should be noted that JACOB GOLOS, who was unquestionably active in Russian espionage, described ECKHART as an NKVD agent. However, extensive investigation has failed to indicate that ECKHART is still in the United States, and consequently the secondary purpose of this inquiry will be to attempt to fix definitely the time and place of ECKHART'S last departure from this country so that this information may be verified from official sources.

It is noted that the captioned case is of an extremely confidential nature and that the investigation here referred to is to be conducted on a most discreet and circumspect basis. If there are any indications advisable at this time, this information should be brought to the attention of the Bureau and office of origin before any action is taken.





Reference is made to the teletypes from the New York Field Division dated April 8 and 10, 1946, and from the Washington Field Division dated April 9, 1946, concerning the results of the contact between the informant Gregory and Helen Tenney in New York City on April 6, 1946, and the possibility that the latest contact of Helen Tenney is key Elson, and further identifying Joseph Gregg with Helen Tenney. In an effort to definitely identify the unknown woman contact of Helen Tenney, the following investigative procedures should be undertaken by the New York and Washington Field Divisions.

It will be recalled that Tenney stated that she definitely saw the unknown woman on the evening of Thanksgiving Day (November 22, 1945) in Washington, D. C., and thereafter she had no contact with her except a telephone call which Tenney received from this woman about December 12, 1945. A review of the Tenney technical logs fails to reflect a contact or attempted contact on or about December 12, 1945, and therefore it is believed that the attempted contact previously referre to by Tenney to Gregory when they met in Washington on March 13, 1946, was in fact the contact on November 28, 1945, described as follows. The report of Special Agent Floyd L. Jones dated December 13, 1945, at Washington, D. C., reflect sthat at 3:35 P. M. on November 28, 1945, a telephone call was received by Helen Tenney From Mr. unidentified woman who asked her where she could get an electric stove and Danke replied that they could be obtained at the People's Drug Store. Tenney them Rayed that she would meet this woman shortly. The physical surveillance on that sales date reflected that at 9:00 P. M. Helen Tenney left her apartment and pregressed in the People's Drug Store at the corner of 19th and Pennsylvania Avenue, 13.,3 where she was observed to have a cup of coffee and wait for approximately methy minutes after which she made a telephone call and then returned to her apartment. It is possible that the telephone call made at 6:35 P. M. was made by the unknown woman contact believed to be Ray Klson

The report of Special Agent Floyd L. Jones dated Hovember 29, 1945, at Washington, D. C., also reflects that on Thanksgiving Day (Hovember 22, 1945) Helen Tenney and an unknown soldier left Tenney's apartment at 4:10 P. M. and drove to Leesburg, Virginia, where they arrived at 7:00 P. M. They entered the People's National Bank Building and remained therein until 8:00 P. M., after which they returned to Washington. In accordance with the suggestion contained in New York teletype dated April 10, 1946, the Richmond Field Division is being instructed to 84 endeavor to determine the identity of the persons contacted by Tenney and the 56.46 soldier on the occasion of this trip.



The tashington Field Office should also display a photograph of Ray Elson to agents of the tashington Field Office who participated in the physical surveillance of Helen Tenney at any time during the course of this investigation in an effort to identify Elson as the unknown woman contact.

The Washington Field Office should also display a photograph of Helen Tenney and Ray Elson to agents of the Washington Field Office who worked on the physical surveillance of Joseph Gregg in an effort to identify Tenney or Elson as a contact of Gregg.

The Eashington Field Office should also review the physical surveillance logs on Helen Tenney and Joseph Gregg in an effort to identify any previously unknown woman contacts of either of these subjects and should also furnish the New York Field Division with the descriptions and circumstances surrounding the contacts of any unknown woman contacts of Tenney and Gregg so that the New York Office can make these descriptions available to the informant Gregory.

The Washington Field Office should also immediately forward to the New York Office the technical surveillance recordings covering the Helen Tenney technical surveillance in order that the New York Office can attempt to identify the voice of the unknown woman who telephonically contacted Tenney at 6:35 P. M. on November 23, 1946, with the voice of Ray Elson.



The Washington Field Office should check its technical log on Helen Tenney to determine if she called her apartment from the drug store at 9:00 P. M. on November 28, 1945, since it is possible that she may have contacted her apartment concerning the individual that she expected to meet on that occasion (1) W.

The Washington Field Office should review its recordings on the technical surveillance of Joseph Gregg in order to compare the known voice of Helen Tenney with any unidentified female voice who may have contacted Gregg during the course of this investigation

In the event a photograph of Helen Tenney is not available to the Washington Field Office, those agents who handled the physical surveillance of Joseph Gregg should be afforded an epportunity to physically observe Helen Tenney in order to determine if Helen Tenney is identical with any unknown woman who contacted Gregg in the past.

The New York Field Division, upon receipt of the recordings from the Washington Field Office, should make a comparison of the known voice of Ray Elson with the unknown woman's voice who contacted Helen Tenney on the night of Hovember 28, 1945. It should also make such comparisons of other female voices contained in the recordings of the Helen Tenney technical surveillance


The New York Office should, through Gregory, attempt to obtain from a casual inquiry of Ray Elson the hotel where Elson generally stays when she comes to Washington, it being noted that she was given two days off from work in May of 1945 when it is believed that she came to Washington, D. C.

The New York Office should increase its present spot surveillance on the activities of Ray Elson and renew its efforts to fully develop the identity of all of her contacts. A survey should be made of Elson's residence in order to determine if it is possible at a future date to develop a confidential source who will have access to her personal effects.

With respect to certain suggestions made by the New York Field Office in its teletype dated April 10, 1946, it is not believed feasible at this time to have those agents who worked on the physical surveillance of Helen Tenney in Washington travel to New York in order to make a visual observation of Eay Elson. Those agents who worked on the Tenney surveillance were temporarily assigned to lashington during the pertinent period and the majority of them are no longer in Tashington, D. C. However, should it be necessary in the future to have these agents further identify Ray Elson, it is suggested that a photograph of Elson could be forwarded to them for the purpose of identification.


