

Reference is made to Bureau letter to Richmond Field Division dated April 15, 1946, in the above matter.

Investigation at Leesburg, Virginia, revealed that although there is a Peoples' National Bank, there is not a Peoples' National Bank Building, in the sense of there being offices in such a building. The bank is a single building and occupies it entirely. Entrance to the bank is gained through large double doors in the center of the building. Anyone going through these doors would have to go into the bank, and any agents observing this person could see that he did enter the bank. There is no other entrance in the front of the bank building. The bank was not open on Thanksgiving Day.

A list of the bank employees was obtained and this list is as follows: BRUCE McINTOSH, President; O. I. THOMAS, Vice-President; W. S. JENKINS, Vice-President; T. FRANK OSBURN, Vice-President; ARTHUR S. JENKINS, Cashier; J. L. McINTOSH, Assistant Cashier; WILLIAM F. PEACH, Assistant Cashier; E. N. BRADFIELD, Trust Officer. Other employees are Mrs. ELIZABETH L. PHILLIPS, Mrs. LEHLA H. GALLEHER, Mrs. HELEN ROBERICK, Mrs. EVA G. McCABE, Miss RUTH ONISON, Mrs. HELEN M. JOHNSTON, ROSHER J. MITCHELL and W. F. AULT Janitor. All employees have a key to the bank and could have been in there on Thanksgiving evening.

On the Northside of the Bank is the John Gill Radio Shop.

Above this shop are two apartments. DAN CHAMBLIN, racehorse trainer and family reside in one apartment and N. B. EVERHART, a railroad worker, resides in the other. These apartments are entered by a door from the main street about thirty feet from the entrance of the bank. It is possible that HELEN TENNEY entered this doorway.

South of the Bank is a one-story building occupied by the Insurance firm of Paxon and Hawthorne. Mrs. CRISELDA FULTZ is employed there and N. B. HAWTHORNE is the only member of the firm.

There is, in Leesburg, a Loudoun National Bank which has offices over it. This building is situated about half a block from the Peoples National Bank, and on the opposite side of the street. In this

building there are two doctors, a Dr. B. A. BRANN, Murse Miss JEAN KIRK-PATRICK, and Dr. FRANK PURDELL SMOOT, Nurse Mrs. KATHLEEN FRY. There is also the office of the Agriculture Conservation Association. This business employs the following persons: ELIZABETH C. THOMAS, Miss DELL BASCUE, and RUBY ELIZABETH FOLMER. All three of these employees worked Thanksgiving Day, but closed the office at 4:00 P.M. There was no register for this building.



There is also included herewith information relative to a check made with the National Lumbermans Bank, Muskegon, Michigan, relative to any record of ALBERT EUGENE KAHN, as requested by the New York Field Office, by letter dated February 4, 1946. The following Agents of the Detroit Field Division participated in the surveillance of CEDRIC HENNING BEIFRAGE during his stay in Detroit, Michigan, from 8:15 A. M. April 2, 1946 to 8:20 A. M. April 6, 1946: Fred G. Cook, Lawrence H. Nichols, Damon W. Pitcher, Bowen April 6, 1946: Fred G. Cook, Lawrence H. Nichols, Damon W. Pitcher, Bowen F. Rose, Norman B. Schmidt, Richard W. Smith, Mortimer C. Watson, Miller R. Weeds, Edward N. Wills and Charles L. Zink.

BEIFRATE arrived at Detroit, Michigan, 8:15 A.M. April 2, 1946 via the New York Central Railroad from New York City, New York. Immediately upon his arrival he proceeded to the residence of Reverend CLAUDE WILLIAMS, 181 McLean Street, Detroit, Michigan.

On this same date, BELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS proceeded to the Offices of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion, remained at this place during the afternoon and evening at which time a meeting was held and it was ascertained that the following individuals were present during this meeting. An unknown man, Reverend G. ARTHUR, CARL HAESSLER, FRANCES PRICE, JAKE SHELBY, MAYNE SHELBY, Reverend CLAUDE WILLIAMS, EDNA JOYCE WILLIAMS and D. HUNT. This meeting was adjourned at 11:30 P.M. and HELFRAGE returned with Mr. and Mrs. Reverend WILLIAMS to their residence at 181 McLean Street, Detroit, Michigan.

It is to be noted that HEIFRAGE remained at the residence of Reverend WIILIAMS on all nights during his stay in Detroit with the exception of the night of April 5, 1946 when he slept in the Offices of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion, 420 Transportation Building, Detroit.

On April 3, 1946 BELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave 181 McLean Street and proceed to 420 Transportation Building where they remained from 2:30 P.M. to 6 P.M. when they returned to 181 McLean Street. It is to be noted that no contacts were made by BELFRAGE on this date other than with Reverend G. ARTHUR, who has an office at 420 Transportation. Building and FRANCES PRICE, who also works at this effice.

On April 4, 1946 HELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave 181 McLean Street and arrived at 420 Transportation Building at 8:45 A.M. where they remained until 5:15 P.M., at which time they returned to 181 McLean Street. On this same date at 8 P.M. HELFRAGE accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave 181 McLean Street and walk to the address of 39 Massachusetts Avenue where they remained until 10:30 P.M. It is to be noted that CARL HAESSLER resides at 39 Massachusetts Avenue, Detroit, Michigan.

Under date of April 5, 1946 EELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave 181 McLean Street and proceed to 420 Transportation Building, arriving there at 8:35 A.M. At 2:30 P.M. BELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave the Transportation Building and walk to the Offices of the Visual Training Company, also known as the Forbes Company, located at 815 Bates Street, Detroit, Michigan. They were observed to remain in these offices for approximately one and a half hours when they returned to 420 Transportation Building. At 7:15 P.M. BELFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS were observed to leave the Transporation Building and Reverend WILLIAMS was observed to enter a cab presumably to return to his home and that BELFRAGE, after a brief walk was observed to return to the Transportation Building where he remained over night in the Offices of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion, sleeping on a cot that was located in the effice of Reverend CLAUDE WILLIAMS.

On the date of April 6, 1946 BELFRAGE departed from Detroit, Michigan, via the New York Central Railroad, Train 50, Empire State Express, occupying seat #3 in pullman car W, holding ticker for Harmon, New York, scheduled to arrive Harmon, New York 8:58 P.M. April 6, 1946. It is to be noted that the activities of BELFRAGE while in Detroit, Michigan, were reported daily to the Bureau, Washington Field Office and the New York Field Office.

The files of the Detroit Field Division reflect the following information relative to persons contacted by BELFRAGE during his stay in Detroit:

Reverend G. ARTHUR

Reverend ARTHUR has been very active in the organization of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion and he is to be placed in charge of the Detroit area for this organization when Reverend WILLIAMS moves the Headquarters of this organization to Birmingham, Alabama, during June, 1946. On February 25, 1945 a man identified as G. ARTHUR was listed as a member of the Communist Party and had pledged himself to recruit three new members.

CARL HAESSLER

On Hovember 30, 1945 he was listed as a member of the Steering Committee of the Civil Rights Federation. He was incarcarated as a Conscientious Objector during the first World War and was imprisoned at Alcatras. He is assigned FBT #75511. He is reported to have directed the Communist Party Workers School in Chicago and having managed the Federal Press in Chicago during 1924. He was listed as a Rhodes scholar and a professor of the University of Illinois during 1914 and affiliated with numerous Communist Party front organisations and active in Communist Party functions of the UAW during 1914.

1917-18 articles in the Milwaukee Journal Newspaper reflect that he was a Socialist connected with the Milwaukee Socialist Paper. He is listed as being active in numerous front organisations from 1932 to 1943 in Detroit, Michigan, and was also associated with the Civil Rights Federation during the race riots in Detroit, Michigan in 1943. Informants advise that during 1944 he was an Executive Board member of the Detroit Council for American-Soviet Friendship and that he handled publicity for State Senator STANLEY NOVAK, Communist collaborator during recent elections. He is also listed as having taught classes in labor journalism at the Highlander Folk School, Montigo, Tennessee, from August 21 to 26, 1941.

Informants advise further that during 1945 he was considered an old-time Communist who was well thought of, but not carried as an open member.

On April 22, 1945 he appeared as a sponsor for the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion, which is a well-known Communist front organization. On February 26, 1946 he is known to have edited and contributed articles to various small union papers. He is also listed as a member of the Publicity Committee for the Labor Press of the Detroit Council of Applied Religion.

FRANCES PRICE

Miss PRICE is listed as Field Secretary for the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion and is known to be very active in the affairs of this organization and is present daily at their Headquarters, 420 Transportation Building, Detroit, Michigan, where she does clerical and stemographic work for Reverend WILLIAMS and Reverend ARTHUR.

The files of the Detroit Field Division failed to reflect any information relative to an individual known as D. HUNT, who was observed at the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion Headquarters on April 2, 1946.

JAKE SHELBY

SHEIBY is employed by the U. S. Rubber Company where he serves as President of Local 223 of the United Rubber Workers of America - CIO. Wr. SHEIBY is also listed as a shop preacher for the Detroit Council of Applied Religion.

MAYNE SHELBY

MAYNE SHEIBY, wife of JAKE SHEIBY, believed to be identical with one M. SHEIBY who is listed as a Communist suspect in the Detroit area on October 23, 1940.

Reverend CLAUDE CLOSSIE WILLIAMS

Reverend WILLIAMS, alias JOHN GALEY, resided in Paris, Arkansas, for five years, beginning 1931, as a Presbyterian minister and it is alleged that he was active as a labor agitator and to have had charge of the Commonwealth College in Mena, Arkansas. He has also lectured and preached in Negro settlements, urging equality of Negroes and in 1935 he was run out of Paris, Arkansas, going to Fort Smith, Arkansas where he was involved in erganizing of WPA workers on a strike. Organizers of this strike, including WHLIAMS, were arrested for barratry and convicted. However, an appeal was made and the case was dismissed. The Sheriff in Fort Smith, Arkansas, advised he raided WHLIAMS! home in 1935 and found numerous Communist books and a membership card reflecting that WHLIAMS was a member in the Socialist Party. On July 26, 1941 at Little Rock, Arkansas, through the Institute of Applied Religion, actively preached Communism and Negro agitation in Tennessee, Arkansas and Mississippi.

During 1940 WILLIAMS became organizer for the United Cannery, Organization, Packing and Allied Workers of America and also became Director of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion. It is to be noted that WILLIAMS at one time admitted membership in the Communist Party under the name of JOHN GALEY, but claims to have severed all connection with this Party in 1938. The Institute of Applied Religion held a series of five meetings in Wilson, Arkansas, July 25, to 29, 1944 and WILLIAMS conducted meetings in which AYC organizers participated. WILLIAMS was arrested by the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department August 8, 1944 for investigation, but was released the next day. At this time he gave a voluntary statement concerning his activities and denied any association with the Communist Party.

Attention is directed to a book entitled "South of God" written by SIEGFRIED BEIFRAGE that purportedly outlines the life and work of Reverend WILLIAMS in the southern states.

The files further reflect that Reverend WILLIAMS signed an open letter to the President of the United States on March 5, 1941, urging that the constitutional rights of the Communist Party be maintained. Reverend WILLIAMS was assigned FBI #2399632. He is registered for Selective Service with Local Draft Board 2, Court House Annex, Evansville, Indiana, assigned serial #U-1168.

Reverend WILLIAMS also spoke at a Michigan CPA State Conference on April 26, 1945 and was given a testimonial dinner on May 4, 1945 by the Civil Rights Federation of Detroit. He was also observed to be in frequent centact with JACK RASKIN, Executive Secretary of the Civil Rights Federation and a Michigan CP officer.

EDNA JOYCE WILLIAMS

EDNA WILLIAMS, wife of Reverend CLAUDE WILLIAMS, is listed as an Associate Director of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion. It is to be noted that Mrs. WILLIAMS was present with REIFRAGE and Reverend WILLIAMS during their contact with CARL HAESSIER April 4, 1946.

Under the Visual Training Corporation, also known as the Forbes Company, a report of the U. S. Naval Intelligence Service, Ninth Naval District dated March 30, 1943 states that said Company is incorporated to make motion pictures, slide films and other media of training, educational and advertising products. Officers of said Company are listed as G. A. FIOREZ, President; D. S. MENEDICT, Vice-President; A. G. RIPPET, Jr., Treasurer. This Company had several contracts for material to be used for educational purposes and to be used in explanation of materials used by the United States Government. The standing of this Company is listed as satisfactory and no derogatory information was listed.

Mr. PIERRE 1 DOSTONG, Manager of the Transportation Building, who has previously been contacted by this office relative to the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion, advised that on April 5, 1946 while in the offices of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion in the presence of Miss PRICE, BELFRACE and Reverend ARTHUR, Reverend WILLIAMS stated that the main office of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion was to be moved to Birmingham, Alabama, during June (1946). Reverend WILLIAMS further stated that he was going there to take charge and that Reverend ARTHUR would remain in Detroit to take care of the Institute's business in the Detroit area. In Discount also stated that Reverend WILLIAMS was also interested in a smaller and less expensive office for Reverend ARTHUR to enter the first of June (1946). The People advised that he explained he was unable to promise them new office space on such short notice, but he would consider them for a smaller office.

The New York Field Division by letter dated February 4, 1946 requested the Detroit Field Division to check the records of the Lumbermans National Bank at Muskegon, Michigan, for all information regarding financial transactions of ALBERT EUGENE KAHN, in which Bank KAHN was purportedly to have maintained an account during 1940 and 1941. On April 1, 1946, Mr. GEORGE W. HANSEN, Assistant Cashier, Lumbermans National Bank, Muskegon, Wichigan, was contacted at which time a complete search of all records of this Bank under the name of AIBERT EUGENE KAHN was made with negative results, a check was also made at the Merchants Credit Service, Muskegon, Michigan, as well as the Identification Division of the Muskegon Police Department with negative results.

It is to be noted that there was no record of ALBERT EUGENE KAHN carried in the City Directory of Muskegon, Michigan, for the years 1940 or 1941.

Copies of this report are being submitted to the Birmingham Field Office for informational purposes, inasmuch as it is believed that Reverend WILLIAMS will move the Headquarters of the Peoples Institute of Applied Religion to Birmingham, Alabama, in June, 1946.

Reference is made to the Bureau's letter of April 10, 1946, bearing the above-mentioned caption and a copy of which was directed to the Boston and Washington Field Offices. This letter requested an investigation in the Washington and New York Field Offices relative to the activities of HAZEN-SISE while he resided in the United States.

In view of the fact that HAZEN SISE resided in Washington during the time he was in the United States as a representative of the Canadian National Film Board, it is believed that a great deal of information concerning his activities will be uncovered by the Washington Field Office. The investigation by the Washington Field Office will undoubtedly uncover certain connections of SISE in New York City, and therefore it is not contemplated that any investigation will be conducted by the New York Field Office until the Washington Field Office has completed their investigation of SISE's activities.

DETAILS !

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent ERLING H. KLCSTER at Crosi, California:

Constable JOHN SHADDEN and Lrs. E. D. LONCRIEF, Assistant Lanager, First National Bank of Crosi, were both found to be acquainted with CIRIS VUKCVICH. Both furnished substantially the same information concerning him which is as follows:

VUKCVICH is the owner of a small orange ranch three miles east, and one-half mile south of Crosi. He has lived in the area for a number of years and has the reputation of being a reliable citizen. He is unmarried and lives as a bachelor on his ranch property. He is either a Slovene or a Czech by nationality, but it was not known whether he is of native or foreign birth. Both Constable SHADDEN and the Bank have had business dealings with VUKCVICH and have a high regard for him. He is believed to be a cousin of Lrs. LARKO RADICH of Dinuba and Sultana. No details were known concerning the RADICH family other than that they owned the ranch on which they are living and have a good reputation in the community. VUKCVICH was stated to be about fifty-five years of age, while Lir. and Lrs. RADICH are both over 60.

VUKCVICH has carried a commercial account with the First Mational Bank of Crosi for a number of years, Its normal balance is in the low four figures and its activity is normal. No outside business interests on the part of VUKCVICH have been noted other than that he has financed several Filipino farmers occasionally. He is presently receiving forty dollars a month from relatives to whom he made a loan, the names of whom were not known. He has bought war Bonds regularly. VUKCVICH has a safety deposit box in the Crosi Bank but seldom uses it.

VUKOVICH is not known to have engaged in political activities of any sort nor is he known in his home community to be closely affiliated with any political group.

A search of the San Pedro directory, 1946 edition, reflects that FRANICHEVICH resides at 969 west Ninth Street. No occupation is given for this individual who rents his home. A spot check of these premises reflected the address is a bungalow court. In front of the court was FRANICHEVICH's car, a Buick, bearing California license 60-T-673. This was the same car in which individuals presumed to be FRANICHEVICH and his wife attended the farewell of GEORGE N. PERAZICH at Fresno, California, on January 14, 1946. Usually reliable sources in San Pedro and Wilmington were checked for information regarding FRANICHEVICH with negative results.

The records of the Retril Lerchants Credit Association, Los Angeles, were also negatively checked.

Mr. H. I.CLIVER, manager, Credit and Adjustment Bureau, 1008 Scuth Pacific avenue, checked his records and made available information regarding FRANICHEVICH. These files showed an entry on recember 21, 1943, of a notice of application for permit to conduct a public dance hall cafe at 209 west Sixth Street, San Fedro, in the name of GECRCE L. FRANICHEVICH and MARKO MAFRANKOVICH with mintention to sell alcoholicbeverages.

The next entry on this file was September 12, 1944, at which time FRANICHEVICH sold his half interest in the Waldorf Inn, 209 west. Sixth Street, to MARKO FRANKOVICH under bank of America's Tenth and Pacific Eranch escrow number 25-4957. The last entry on this file reflected FRANICHEVICH is presently employed at the Alaska Inn, residing at 969 West winth Street.

The records of the Captain of the Port, wilmington, were checked for a harbor pass for FRAITCHEVICH with negative results. The records of the Los Angeles Folice Department, San Pedro Division, were checked negatively and Captain H. L. EVAIS and Detective THI HARGET were interviewed for information regarding FRAITCHEVICH with negative results.

The files of the Sheriff's Office, Los Angeles, were checked also with negative results. However, a card on file at the Los Angeles Police Department, Central Division, reflected ŒCRGE L. FRANICHEVICH, 969 West Winth Street, San Pedro, made application for a license to operate a public dance hall and cafe on December 16, 1943. This card reflects that FRANICHEVICH was born in Petrovac, Yugoslavia. His nationality was given as American.

Hest Sixth Street, checked his records with negative results; however, these records reflected that one GEORGE FRANICHEVICH in February, 1938, succeeded John Mirkovich as manages of the Fishersen's Cooperative Association. Further investigation disclosed, however, that this FRANICHEVICH is probably not identical with CECRGE L. FRANICHEVICH,

The gas turn-on records of Southern Counties Cas Company, San Pedro, were checked by O. R. C. CRC. who advised that the order turning on service for FRANICHEVICH at 969 West Minth Street, was effective October 1, 1943. No previous address and no references were shown on the application for service.

It was ascertained that ARNOLD and BRUCE ENDELMAN reside at 470 South Almont Drive, which property they purchased in July, 1945, The application for gas service was checked by Lr. WILLIAM MCKEE, Southern California Cas Company, which reflects that the service was commenced on July 5, 1945, giving a mailing address for bills, 416 North Beverly Drive, which is the business address of this family. The account was in the name of ARNOLD ENDELMAN who was listed as the owner of the property. Previous address was stated to be "out of city" and no other information was shown.

The records of the Tax Assessor's Office, Los Angeles County, were checked at the Hall of Justice Building, Los Angeles, with negative results except that the previous owners were shown as ALEXALDER A. and VIA TORRH, 470 South Almont Drive.

Source 2 advised that a check of his records reflected that the EMDELLANS formerly resided in Liles, Chio, and carried a joint bank account at the Security First Mational Bank, Beverly Hills, which was opened June 18, 1945. This account was described as a "moderate four figure account" while another account in the name of BRUCS EI DELLIAN was described as having a "small four figure account".

On July 1, 1945, the EIDEILANS were residing at the Ceorgian Hotel, Santa Lonica, California, and stated they had just purchased the property at 470 South Almont and had been operating ERUCE'S DRESS SHOP, 416 North Beverly Lrive, for approxi ately three weeks. This source stated that the ENDEHLANS have been in Miles, Chio, for three years operating a Bruce's Dress Shop there. This source stated that the ENDEIL came to the United States as refugees in 1941 and he did not know thether they were naturalized. He stated that he had heard they had become United States citizens. He further advised that their business reputations good and that they were considered successful merchants, having a net worth of approximately 110,000 and a net income of 18,000 to 110,000.

Source 2 further advised that the E.DELLANS are approximately sixty-five years of ale and have one daughter living at home, age twenty-six. He said the family is Hebren and that their associates are also of the Hebren race.

This source also stated that they were fairly well known in Niles, thio, from their three-year residence in that city.

Source 4 advised that ARNCLD ENDELLIAN was born in Warsaw, Poland, and that his mother's maiden name was RABINCVITZ. He stated that ENDELIAN had advised he was operating under general license number 42 which was not blocked. Thether this referred to an export business, informant did not know.

This source further stated, however, that ENDELLAN had opened an account with the Security First National Bank in Santa Monica on February 2, 1945, having previously had a checking account in Miles, Chio, with the Niles Eank Company, which he used as a business reference.

Source 3 also advised the Agent that ARICLD EIDEIMAN and his wife, BRUCE, had purchased a dress shop which they operated under the firm name of Bruce's Dress Shop from HARRY FINER, 460 South Spalding Drive, on June 23, 1945, through IRVING I. TURKER at 909 South Los Angeles Street, who does business under Dusiness Opportunities License Number 264, for a consideration of \$8,000 cash plus a \$44,200 mortgage.

The records of the Better Business Bureau, 742 South Hill Street, Dun & Bradstreet, Inc., Retail Lerchants Credit Association, Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles Sheriff's Office and Immigration and Naturalization Service were all checked for the rames of ARMCID and BRUCE ENDINANT with negative results.

B. J. FIREHOER, City Clerk, Beverly Hills, advised that under a new city ordinance, all businesses in Beverly Hills must be licensed. He stated that the license for Eruce's Dress Shop reflected gress sales for 1945 of \$18,000, showing ARWALD EMDELLAN as owner. Inspector Flynn advised that he did not know the exact date Bruce's Dress Shop opened but stated that it was since February, 1945, because Eenson's Dress Shop was located at 416 North Beverly Drive at that time.

The Attorney General has received copies of memoranda concerning Hiss in the Gregory case entitled funderground Soviet Espionage Organization (NKVD) in Agencies of the United States Government dated rebruary 21, 1946. This information was made available to the Attorney General on February 25, 1946. The Attorney General was also furnished a summary which contained information about Hiss entitled Soviet Espionage in the United States on December 4, 1945.

Alger Hiss was recently interviewed by an official of the Bureau at his own request, and the results of that interview were made available to the Attorney General on March 25, 1946, the same date upon which the interview occurred.

An up-to-date memorandum concerning the activities of Hissimas BY made available to you on April 16, 1946.
