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



It was determined from a confidential source known to Special from C. L. BATTEN and FRANK H. STRONG that subject PLENN was current study room on Deck .. of the Library of Congress for the purpose of coing special research work. This source of information advised that some time during the fall of 1945, ABEL REPLENN had submitted a request for medial research facilities in the Library of Congress. This application was made available to the agents and it indicated that subject, PLENN, stated that the purpose of obtaining these facilities was to continue research on a project on anthropology, History, Economics and Political Studies concerning Puerto Rico. In the application he stated that it is his purpose to write two publications dealing first with "The People of Puerto Rico" and second, "The History of Puerto Rico". The application also reflected that these booklets were to be published by the Office of Information of the Puerto Rican Government. In the application subject stated that he was associated with the Office of Information for Puerto Rico and that his immediate superior was MICHGIOFF, Director of Information, La Fortaliza, San Juan, Puerto Rico. As a result of this application, PLENN was assigned a study read, December 5, 1945, but the source of information stated that subject had not used the room regularly until some time during May, 1946.

A source of information made available a list of publications which a spect had stated he had written in 1946. This list included:

a source of information advised that all the reference books which subject was using were concerning Puerto Rico, Latin america and american Foreign Policy. A source of information stated that subject did not keep regular office hours and many times did not appear in the Library for a period of several days.





appeared in the april 7, 1946, edition of the Evening Star. This review stated that the book was a criticism of american Foreign Policy concerning Spain and stated that only a very small percentage of the people in Spain were in favor of the Franco Regime. The article also stated that a large portion of the book was devoted to the mistreatment of the author because of his attempted toward the Spanish Covernment while serving in Madrid as a representative of the Office of Mar Information.

The June 1, 1946, edition of the "Churchman" which is published at 425 Fourth avenue, New York City, was obtained. On page seven of that magazine is an article entitled, "Franco and Our Own Destiny", which was written by subject, PLENN. This article deals entirely with the continuation of the Franco Regime in Spain and severe criticism of the State Department's policy toward FRANCO.

Records of The Credit Bureau reflect that subject has resided at 1511 Park Road, N. W., Washington, D. C., since October 1, 1941, and that this building is owned by WLITER ... BRO N Realty Company. Report also indicated that subject, PLENN, resided at 618 A Street, S. E. Subject listed as references, Lr. and Lrs. EGIOFF, 1660 34th Street, N. W.

Records of the Stone's Percantile Agency indicate that subject's occupation was that of free-lance writer for various local and South American colleges.

The indices of the Lashington Field Division reflect that LLX A. EGLOFF, 1800 Connecticut avenue, N. ..., was one of the names of individuals contained in the index file of students, teachers, maintenance workers, visitors and friends of the Commonwealth College which formerly was located at Liena, arkansas. This college was closed by the arkansas State authorities.

It will be noted that on June 16, 1946, MAURICE HALFERING invited JUST SULVINING to his home for the purpose of meeting J. R. MIELSEN of the University of Oklahoma, who was a guest at the HALPERIN residence.

JUST LUZMING is an official of the U. S. Department of State and is attached to the Office of the Assistant Secretary for administration, DONALD RUSSELL. LUZHING resides at 1851 Columbia Road, Northwest, apartment 202, Washington, D. C., telephone Michigan 2485.

The Mashington Field Office files reveal the following data: toncerning JUST LUNNING:

A brief summary of LUNNING'S background reveals he was born in Denmark on May 14, 1910. He was appointed a Lieutenant (j.g.) in the Mavy on January 3, 1944, and was separated on February 27, 1946. While in the Mavy, he was attached to the Office of Strategic Services in Washington, D. C., England and Germany. His record in this capacity is clear. Previous employment is listed as the New York State Department of Labor from September 1937 to February 1939 as a research investigator; May 1939 to January 1942 as assistant to the president (his father) of George Lensen, Incorporated (silversmiths), 667 Fifth Avenue, New York City. JEMSEN is stated to be the Dean of the Danes in the United States. LUNTING'S father's name is FREDERICK LUNTING whereas his mother is named HEDWIG JUST LUNTING.

JUST LUPNING attained his A.B. Degree in economics at Harvard University from 1930 to 1932. He had previously prepared at the University of Copenhagen. LUPNING studied at the Harvard University Graduate School in Economics from September 1932 until June 1934. He studied at the Harvard University Law School from September 1934 until June 1937, at which time he attained his LL.B. Degree.

LUMPING entered on duty at the Foreign Economics Administration on February 16, 1942, as an Economic Analyst, grade P-3. He advanced to a P-6 grade and was granted military furlough in February 1945. Two of the references listed by LUMPING in his Federal Government application were WILLIAM T. STONE, Amerasia, and FRANK V. COE of Monetary Research.





A highly confidential source advises that JUST LUMNING'S name is listed in the personal telephone directory of MARY JANE KEENEY as follows:

"LUMING State 2914"

During a conversation which took place between LILLIAN DURAWAY, wife of PHILIP DUNAWAY, and MAURICE HALPERIN'S wife, EDITH HALPERIN, on December 17, 1945, Mrs. DUNAWAY mentioned that her husband "stopped off tonight at GUS LUMMING'S - phonetic - (JUST LUMMING'S)." Mrs. HALPERIN remarked that DUNAWAY should have dropped by her home.

On June 7, 1946, an unidentified woman whose first name is ANITA invited Mr. and Mrs. DCMALD WHEELER to a dinner party which she and her husband SVEN, are giving jointly with JOSH LUNING - phonetic - (JUST LUNING) at the latter's apartment at 1851 Columbia Road, Northwest. This dinner was arranged for 6:00 P.M. on the following Vednesday in honor of three Danish journalists who are stated to be friends of ANITA'S husband and JUST LUNNING.

MAURICE HALPERIN invited Mr. and Mrs. PHILIP DUNAWAY to her home on the night of February 8, 1946. Mrs. DULAWAY stated that her husband, Philip, and DAVID WAHL stopped off at JESS LEVILO'S - phonetic - (JUST 100'S) house to talk over some business. She added that in the event FAILIP DUNAWAY is not too late getting home, they will visit the HALPERIUS

On March 21, 1946, an unidentified woman conferred with RESEKAE TITZGERALD for the purpose of advising her that FRANK CAMERON expected to be in town in the near future. Mrs. FITZGERALD also mentioned that she is relaying an invitation from Mrs. HILL of 2335 California Street to attend a party on Saturday night. The unidentified woman stated that the LULLINGS (JUST LULLINGS) will be unable to attend the party inasmuch as the doctor will not permit WINJIE (probably Mrs. LULLING) to leave her home.

ALLAN ROSENBERG conferred with his wife, ERN... on April 9, 1946, at which time he stated that LESTER LEVIN was in town. He added that he, ROSENBERG, had contacted NIPPY SHARFMAN, at which time he ascertained that NIPPY'S father wanted to see certain people who were expected at the ROSENBERGS! for dinner on Saturday night. ERLA COSENBERG then referred to the dinner by stating that she has not heard whether the SASULYS. DUNAWAYS, HILLARDS (phonetic) or LETTINGS - phonetic (LUININGS) will be able to come.



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As a result of information furnished by that the ALLAN ROSENBERGS would attend the party at the home of BOJER SITH, 2818 I Street, N. W., on the night of June 12, 1946, a surveillance was instituted by agents of this office.

At 5:32 P.M., an individual believed to be EMILY CHARFIAN arrived at the office of ALLAN ROSEMERG, 1822 Jefferson Place, N.W., with her young son. Shortly thereafter, WARREN SHARFMAN, his wife and son departed from the office. At 7:15 P.M., ALLAN ROSEMERG, his wife and EDWARD SRECHER left the office and proceeded to the home of BOWEN SMITH. A number of other guests arrived and at 8:25 P.M. they departed from the SMITH residence and proceeded by automobile to the Orient Restaurant on Wisconsin Avenue in Georgetown. One automobile bearing Maryland license plates 141872 is listed to GRACE BRANKELL, 1622 Park Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland. At least one man and woman originally arrived in this automobile. There were six men and six women in this group. The identified men are ALLAN ROSEMBERG, BOWEN SMITH, EDWARD MARRECHER and JUST LUNNING. None of the women were identified with the exception of Mrs. ALLAN ROSEMBERG and Mrs. JUST LUNNING.

At 10:00 P.M., the entire party left the Orient Restaurant, at which time a man and woman later identified as Mr. and Mrs. JUST LUNITIES were surveilled to 1851 Columbia Road, where they were observed to enter apartment 202, which is listed to the LUNNINGS.

On June 13, 1946, Mrs. ROSENBERG conferred with EMILY SHARFMAN relative to the party at the home of BOWEL SHITH on the previous evening. During the course of this conversation, ERNA mentioned that ALLAN ROSENBERG drank too much and passed out. Those mentioned as attending the party were JUST and FREDDY (phonetic) LULLING, the BOWEL SMITHS, the EDWARD TITZGERALDS, the EDWARD BRECHERS, WALTER PLOUT (phonetic) and a women mamed Mrs. COOK. Mrs. ROSENBERG added that the company was a funny make inasmuch as the LULLINGS do not mix with people like the FITZ-STALDS or the BRECHERS. She added that the BRECHERS did not fit in with myone but the ALLAN ROSENBERGS and the BOWEN SMITHS. Mrs. ROSENBERG continued by stating that she found the FITZGERALDS unbearable, as they are almost Republicans. In concluding, Mrs. ROSENBERG stated, "We were about the only Jews there except WALTER PLOUT and I think EDWERECHEF but ALLAN says he is not."

SYLVIA SCHIMEL of the State Department conferred with MARY JANG KEELEY on July 3, 1946. On this occasion, Mrs. KEELEY stated she had just gotten in from a party which was held at the home of DAVID WAHL. SYLVIA related that her family intends to leave for the weekend. She invited Mrs. KEELEY to come out to dinner in the near future. They tentatively made an engagement for Monday night.

MARY JANE KEENEY then inquired of SYLVIA/SCHIMMEL concerning the progress of her work. This resulted in a lengthy dissertation relative to SCHIMMEL'S dissatisfaction with the conditions in the State Department insofar as they affect her. She stated, "They are horrible... perfectly ghastly." She complained that she is being given "the runaround" inasmuch as she has been assigned to work usually done by file clerks. In connection with her filing work, SCHIMMEL says she is in a position to see where employees of the State Department have been reclassified from CAF-4 to CAF-7 who do not even have a permanent status





in the Government. She remarked that they (State Department) do not even have sense enough to know that she would be in a position to notice these discrepancies. SCHIMEL added that she feels very blue and there is nobody to turn to any more. She stated that JEAN (ARCH JEAN, personnel officer), is not too nice, as he is "very short and curt." KEENEY volunteered that this is a "damned sorry business" and she feels badly about leaving the State Department when she did, thus leaving her friends to bear the brunt. SCHIMEL feels like telling them to "go to hell" but hates to play into in that manner. SCHIMEL then advised that she ran into JUST LUNEING on the street the other day and later went up to see him at his office at his invitation. According to SCHIMAL, there is a slight change in LUXTEG'S attitude and upon the occasion of her call, it was obvious that he had been discussing the situation at the State Department with someone else. KEEKEY remarked that the people who have been worshipping him (LUMMING) all along are wondering whether they should have done so. SCHRAMEL states she told LUNMING that due to her Political Action Committee work, she is being given the runaround. According to SCHIMEL, LUNCING turned this remark off by stating, "We were all working for ROOSEVELT weren't we?" SCHIMEL then advised that she told LURING about the treatment the State Department is giving "them" and he inquired if she would like to work with him if arrangements could be made. According to SCHIMIEL, she informed LUNKING that she does not want to do anything to cause him embarrassent. KEENEY thinks SCHICEL let LUNVING off too easily.

It has been ascertained that SYLVIA SCHIMMEL was transferred from the job of which she complained and now is actually working for JUST LULWING.

JUST LUNNING attempted to confer with ALLAN ROSENBERG on June 24, 1946. In this connection, he was informed by ERNA ROSENBERG'S mother that the ROSENBERGS would not be in until late that evening. LUNNING then inquired as to whether ERNA ROSENBERG'S mother is a relative of a Mrs. SALLAM, the reply to which being that she is a first cousin of JOSIE SALLAM and knows WALTER and AARON SALLAM. LUNNING commented that he lived in the same house with WALTER SALLAM in Cambridge, Massachusetts, fifteen years ago.

It will be noted that under postmark of December 18, 1945, Mrs.

J. M. FERTANDEZ of 815 Jenkins, Norman, Oklahoma, corresponded with Mrs.

HALPERIN. In this connection the Oklahoma Field Division by letter dated

July 19, 1946, entitled, "Gregory, Espionage - R" stated that the individual

in question is probably Mrs. J. N. HERNANDEZ of 815 Jenkins, Norman,

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Department. This individual was born in Puerto Rico and his wife is believed to be a native of the State of Indiana. Mr. and Mrs. HERNANDEZ are well known to Special Agent LOWELL DUNHAM of the Oklahoma Field Division, who has been acquainted with them for approximately eighteen years. Special Agent DUNHAM, as well is several reputable officials and professors of the University of Oklahoma, insist that neither of the HERNANDEZ' have ever expressed any nationalistic tendencies. It is also stated that they are not identified with professors and persons in Norman, Oklahoma, who are considered as "radicals." Professor HERNANDEZ has been very successful in the real estate business and has acquired a fortune of approximately one hundred thousand dollars. Since his retirement from the University of Oklahoma, he and his wife have pursued their business affairs and have not engaged in political or social activities.

F. L. AYAN of 82 Central Avenue, Sausalito, California, corresponded with MAURICE HALPERIN under postmark of January. 15, 1946, as well as on other occasions.

The San Francisco Field Division, by letter of July 13, 1946, entitled, "Gregory, Espionage - R" advised that the files of that office reflect one Dr. FREDERICK LYRAN, 82 Central Avenue, Sansalito, California, who is undoubtedly the correspondent referred to above.

The San Francisco Field Division supplied the following data regarding him:

Information received from the Commercial Credit Bureau, Sam Francisco, reflects that RYAN has resided at Sausalito for about eight and one-half years, is married, his wife's name is VALERIE. He listed former residences as 1263 Lombard Street, San Francisco; 606 %. 116th Street, NewYork City; 2794 Shasta Road, Berkeley, California; 1457 Jones Street, San Francisco; and 418 S. Lee, Alexandria, Virginia. He was employed in 1945 as an economist with the Office of Strategic Services; formerly employed as Field Investigator, U. S. National Labor Relations Board, 1095 Market Street, San Francisco, for about four years. He was previously a teacher at the University of California, having left there in 1930.

Files of this office reflect that in 1941 he subscribed to the Communist Party newspaper, People's World, in the name of his wife, VALERIE TAN, 1095 Market Street. The report of Special Agent WARREN WADSWORTH RICHMOND, dated June 13, 1944, entitled, "California Labor School, Internal Security - C" reflects that Dr. FREDERICK L. RYAN, Assistant Regional Chief, Division of Program shallysis and Review, War Nampower Commission, is listed as an instructor at the California Labor School, Summer term, 1944, for the course "Post War Reconstruction."



On November 22, 1941, Mrs. A. M. MOSSETER, Regional Director, National Labor Relations Board, advised an agent of this office that she knew no association with Communist or subversive activities on the part of RYAN, whom she regarded as a very fine man.

Attention is invited to information supplied by to the effect that one MARTIN SACKMAN (phonetic) of North field, Minnesota, conferred with MAURICE HALPERIN on March 27, 1946.

In answer to inquiry concerning SACKMAN, the St. Paul Field Division, by letter dated July 10, 1946, captioned, "Gregory, Espionage - R" supplied the following information:

Investigation at Northfield, Minnesota, with the Postnaster, rural carriers, city carriers, general delivery, police, and post office stations in the colleges of St. Olaf and Carleton, as well as the records of these institutions and all other sources of information, failed to reflect any individual presently or previously residing in Northfield, Minnesota, by the name of MARTIN SACKMAN or a sir name fitting a phonetic spelling such as SACKMAN.

It was ascertained at Carleton College that a MARTIN STAPLES SHOCKLEY, who was a Professor of English from 1944 until May 1946, at Carleton College, had been asked to resign and that this party had made several trips to the Eastern States in the early part of 1946. The following background information regarding SHOCKLEY is set out for the information of the Washington Field Division in order that they might eliminate this individual as a person who contacted MAURICE HALPERIN on March 27, 1946:

MARTIN STAPLES SHOCKLEY taught English at Carleton College and resided at 107 Nevada Street, Northfield, Minnesota, from September 1944 until June 1946. He was born March 24, 1908, in Stewart, Virginia, where he was apparently raised and finished high school. He graduated with a B. A. Degree from the University of Virginia in 1928, with an M. A. Degree from Duke University in 1932, and with a Ph.D. Degree from the University of North Carolina in 1938. He narried the daughter of Professor GEORGE C. TAYLOR, English Professor at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina. He is reported to have previously (1944) been editor of the Publications Division, Quartermaster Training Service, Camp Lee, Virginia, and resided during that time at 235 Hamilton Avenue, Stewart, Virginia. He has previously worked at the University of North Carolina, the Citadel (1935 and 1938), University of Oklahona and the University of Colorado. He is said to be well known to Dr. RALPH HEMSTEAD, an officer of the American Association of University Professors, 1155 - 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.



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WARTIN STAPLES SHOCKLEY is described as an individual thinker, who becomes very outraged and sullen when his philosophies and ideas are not accepted. He was discharged from Carleton College because of his inability to get along with the traditions and ideas followed by the students and this institution.

A close personal contact of his described him as a Follower of the Bohemian type of life and that SHOCKLEY sympathized with all persons you might call the underdog. He is known to have made a trip to New York City about Jenuary of 1946 and possibly to Washington, D. C., and was to have made a trip to Alabama for the purpose of contacting the University of Alabama about a job. It was definitely established that he entered the Mayo Clinic at Rochester, Minnesota, for a fistula operation on April 1, 1946, and was released from the hospital on May 13, 1946. Dr. LARRY GOULD, President of Carleton College, upon checking his records, was nearly certain that SHOCKLEY was on the campus of Northfield during the week covering March 27, 1946.

It will be further noted that MAURICE HALPERIN has been in contact with Dr. GERTRUDE NIFLSEN, who is stated to be connected with the State Department of Realth in Forman, Oklahona. Specifically, this individual conferred with the HALPERINS on April 11. 1946, according to information supplied by

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The Oklahoma Field Division by letter of July 19, 1946, entitled, "Gregory, Espionage - R" supplied the following data concerning Dr. GESTRUDE NIELSEN and her husband, Dr. JENS RUD NIELSEN, who has been referred to as J. REEL NIELSEN in previous reports of this case.

Doctor GERTRUDE NIELSEN served as Directo the County Health Department in Cleveland County, Mornan, Oklahona, until about October 15, 1945, when Dr. JAMES O. HOOD returned to that position. She is presently employed in the offices of the State Health Department at Oklahona City, Oklahona.

Dr. JAMES O. HOOD, 420 East Keith Street, Norman, Oklahoma, advised that he has been acquainted with Dr. WIELSEN since about 1936 and recalls that she was instrumental in helping to establish the Health Clinic in Mornan, Oklahoma. During the period of about 1938 to 1940, Dr. HOOD acted as Director of the County Health Department and during this time Dr. WINLSEN was in private practice in Oklahona City, Oklahona. He recalled that she had some difficulty with the Oklahoma County Medical Association because of her attitude on birth control. When Dr. HOOD entered the Army 940, several male doctors served as Director of the Health Clinic but in one was called into service and inasmuch as the State Health Depart-Lent was desperate for a director, it was concluded to appoint Dr. NIELSEN who had also been interested in the Health Department's work. Upon Dr. HOOD'S return he found that most of the interested citizens in Norman were objecting to Dr. MIELSEN'S place as Director because of her general reputation of being a "radical". He went on to say that Dr. NIELSEN is a native of Hungary, studied medicine in Europe, probably Austria, and is particularly fond of forms of socialism recognized in the Scandinavian countries.

Dr. HOOD further advised that she is strongly in favor of socialized medicine and is aligned with what is commonly referred to as the
"leftist group" of the First Presbyterian Church at Norman. The minister
of this church, the Reverend JOHN BRATHOMPSON, is the subject of a
separate file in this office and it is known that he has been described
as a "liberal". Most of the persons aligning themselves with his ideas
are identified with the "leftist group" in the church. However, Dr. HOOD
and several other persons interviewed believe that, in the final analysis,
Dr. NIELSEN and many of her close associates would not be considered unAmerican. He believes that because of her foreign birth and her close
study of political circumstances throughout the world, she may appear to
be radical. He advised that he would not consider her dangerous to the
security of the country.



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an examination of the personnel files of the University of Oklahona reflected that Dr. NIELSEN'S husband is JENS AUD NIELSEN, 310 South University Boulevard, Fornam, Oklahona. He is employed as Research Professor of Theoretical Physics and is recognized internationally as one of the six leading infra-red spectroscopists. He has conducted several experiments with Butadine, one of the substances from which synthetic rubber is made. The University officials state that he is his recognized in the field of physics and is not considered subversive nor un-American. He married GERTRUDE/SIERRUND in 1923 and they have three children who are now of age, namely: JOH, THOMAS, and MARY FILESEY.

Professor NIELSEN was first appointed as professor at Oklahoma University in 1924 and gave his birth date as September 22, 1894, in Copenhagen, Dennark. During the war he supervised the making of a spectrograph for the Navy and also for the Phillips Petroleum Company. He attended grade and high school in Dennark and attended the University of Copenhagen from 1913 to 1919. His file shows that he is a member of the Fellow American Physics Society, American Association for Armament of Science, Oklahoma Academy of Science, Signa Chi, and is a member of the American Association of Physics Teachers. He has won several scholarships. He as a secribed by Dr. HOOD, as well as officials of the University as being interested in his chosen profession than in any other activities and not considered subversive.

Inquiry was made at the Police Department, Sheriff's office, post office, retailers association, city and telephone directories, as well as the records and officials of the University of Oklahoma.

In view of information received from the mail cover maintained on MAURICE HALP TAIN to the effect that H. G. MILLIPMAN, 68 Eastern Park Road, East Gloucester, Massachusetts, corresponded with HALPERIN under

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postnark Gloucester, Massachusetts, February 21, 1946, the Boston Field Division was requested to identify this individual.

By report of Special Agent JOHN F. DESMOND dated July 11, 11945; bearing the caption "Gregory, Espionage - R", the Boston Field Div 110n advised that sources of information available to that office failed to itent TILIPHAN or any individual having a similar name. It is also noted that there is no Eastern Park Road, East, located in Gloucester, Massachusetts.

The Miani Field Division by letter dated July 12, 1946, entitled "Gregory, Espionage - R" advised that it was unable to develop any data concerning one H. S. TRIRCE of 932 25th Avenue, North, St. Petersburg, corresponded with MAURICE HALPERIN. In this connection, the letter cartier covering this address advised that an eccentric old lady lived at resided at this address for approximately three months during the winter named TRIRCE.

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JULIUS J. JOSEPH

During a conversation between LILLIAN DUMAWAY and TED FALFERIN on June 28, -46, LILLIAN mentioned they had a friend of MAURICE HALFERIN by the name of JOE JOSEFH staying with them.

On July 7, 1946, this informant further advised LILLIAN DUNAWAY told EDITH MALFERIN that JOE JOSEPH was back in this country for approximately three weeks and was staying with them although at the present time he was in New York for a ten-day vacation.

Ey memorandum dated November 16, 1945, the Bureau furnished the information concerning JULIUS J. JOSEPH.

JOSEPH was born on February 10, 1914, at Northampton, rennsylvania, the son of Jewish parents, both of whom were born in Russia. Re was educated at Allentown, Fennsylvania High School and received an A. B. degree at the University of Michigan in 1936 and an H. A. at the same university in 1938. In 1939 he was employed by Dr. Therefore, who had been a professor at the University of Michigan and who has been frequently reported to be very radical and a leftist in his views. At the time JOSEPH was employed, Dr. HABER directed the National Refugee Service in New York City. From 1940 to 1941, JOSEPH was employed at the National Resources Flanning Board, Washington, D. C., also under Dr. HABER, and in 1941-1942, he worked for the Social Security Board in New York City.

In 1942-1943, he was with the Social Security Board in Washington, D. C., and he was drafted to the Army in the latter part of 1943. Shortly thereafter he was transferred to the Office of Strategic Services. An investigation by the Military Intelligence Service to determine his loyalty and fitness indicated that he was brought to the Office of Strategic Services because his wife BELLA MIRIAN XXOSEFE worked in that organization and he had been recommended for that type of work by Dr. HABER, a high official in the Mar Manpower Commission.

JOSEPH lived at 2321 Lincoln Road, N. E., Washington, D. C., in 1943 and 1944. His present residence is not known but his draft board is No. 4, 918 F Street, N. W., Washington, D. C.

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
The military investigation did not establish that JOSTFE was a member of the Communist Party, but numerous acquaintances stated be vas decidedly radical in his views. Typical of these is a statement by one acquaintance that JOSEPH did not believe parents should be saddled with the responsibility of alldren and stated that a child should be removed from tality.

Among JOSEPH's close associates were BERNARD ROBERT DANCHIK and his wife LILLIAN KEREKAS DANCHIK. DANCHIK is an army private who admits having been a member of the Communist Party and is believed subversive.

The Dr. WILLIAM HABER referred to above was born in Roumania, and he is indicated by the Army investigation to be very radical as stated above.

The Bureau files reveal on November 28, 1942, one J. JOSEFH of the Planning Division of the War Manpower Commission was a speaker at the first session of a forum sponsored by the "Science and Society" magazine. Among other speakers at this session was MARL BROWDER. The winter issue of "Science and Society," said to be a Marxian quarterly, contained the speech by JOSEPH at the forum. This speech received favorable comment "Daily Worker" of February 1. 1943.

By memorandum to New York, copy to the Washington Field Office, the Bureau advised that information had been received to the effect that JULIUS J. JOSEPH had arrived in England from Paris on March 21, 1946, at










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A review of the subject's application dated June, 1945, at UNRRA reflected the following additional information.

Physical Surveillance

On July 1, 1946, surveillance conducted by Special Agents EDGAR CARTER and H. DUDLEY PAYNE reflected at 10:30 a.m., JOSEFH was at his desk in room 1205, UNRRA Building, located in the Dupont Circle Apartments. At 1:15 p.m., he proceeded alone on foot to Fan and Bill's Restaurant, 1136 Connecticut Avenue, where he had lunch. At 2:20 p.m., he returned to his office and remained until 6:10 p.m., when he left the building with an unknown individual and proceeded to Rector's Restaurant across the street on Connecticut Avenue where he had a cocktail with this unknown man.

At 6:30 p.m., the subject left the unknown man outside of this restaurant and proceeded by taxi to the Graystone Restaurant, 730 17th Street, N. W. At 8:15 p.m., subject came out of the restaurant with four unknown individuals, two men and two women. All of these individuals entered a 1946 blue four-passenger Ford coupe bearing 1946 Massachusetts license 598-340 which was parked on H Street near 17th. They then proceeded to the vicinity of 2531 2 Street, N. A., where the automobile was parked and all individuals were observed to enter the apartment building at 2531 2 Street and proceed to apartment 305 in this building.

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At 10 p.m., subject and one individual who had been the driver of this automobile and who was dressed in an army sergeant's uniform emerged from this apartment building and subject was driven this army sergeant to 2321 Lincoln Road, N. E., where subject entered the building and returned to the car within a few moments and proceeded to the home of PHILIP and LILLIAN DUNAWAY at Forest Glen, Maryland, where the subject got out of the car and was seen to enter the DUNAWAY residence.

The surveillance reflected that MARY JAME KEENEY drove ALPHER and the woman to 561 Orange Street, S. E., Washington, D. C. At that time ALPHER was a Major in the U. S. Army. Subsequently it was determined that ALPHER was discharged and moved to 567 Lebaum Street. The name plate on the Apartment No. 4 reflects that it is occupied by BENEDICT S. ALPHER and ETHEL MACHANIC. It is to be noted that MARY JAME KEENEY received correspondence from ETHEL MACHANIC during this period.

Concerning LOUISE ROSSKAN, to whom MARY JANE KEENEY issued a check in the amount of \$20.00, it is to be noted that they are old friends as reflected by subsequent investigation. LOUISE and EDITINGOSSKAN are known contacts of URSULA WASSERMAN and JULESPKORCHIEN. The ROSSKANS reside at 10 Downing Street, New York City, having recently returned to the United States from Puerto Rico.

The same informant has advised that R.YMOND RUSSELL CH/GNON who apparently is connected with the United Scamen's Service, Incorporated, San Pedro, California, corresponded with N/RY J/NE KEENEY on June 9, 1946. In this letter, the pertinent portions of which are being quoted hereafter, CH/GNON makes frequent reference to the "church" and "church members". It is believed that he is referring to the Communist Party. The letter is set forth as follows:

He admitted that those things were small but added to the general Soviet discomfort. I hope to become better acquainted with this chap. We seemed to hit it off from the first rattle out of the box. He is in a position to hear many things and I'm sure he is a keen observer.

"It looks as if Byrnes' return to Paris may spread things wide open. What Lasky can accomplish in Moscow seems like mighty small spuds and what EB (Earl Browder) has been doing is questionable. The whole picture is befogged and most difficult to understand in Tokyo."

NARY JANE KEENEY contacted one PHILIP on June 13, 1946 and stated that she is very happy concerning the license which the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company recently received and that she is tempted to secure a position with them and give up her trip to Japan. NARY JANE said further that she is going to see some friends in a few minutes at Hogate's Sea Food Restaurant, Washington, D. C., and that she is going to make these friends purchase some stock in this radio station.

On the same date one IIILIAN conversed with MARY JANE KEENEY and expressed considerable interest in the news that the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company had been issued a radio license. MARY JANE stated that she would like to meet IILLIAN in the near future and to discuss some new ideas that she has. MARY JANE said that after having dinner with some friends at Hogate's Sea Food Restaurant she expected to attend the Water Gate concert. (This concert was sponsored by the "Lend the Peace Movement" and featured PAUL ROBESON and JOSE GIRAL, the Spanish Republic leader.)

Miss CARLYLE said further that after the CIO meeting she desired to attend a labor rally at which Senator CLAUDE PEPPER was speaking. (LOIS CARLYLE is the individual who occupied MARY JANE KEENEY's apartment while she was overseas in 1945. There is no indication that she is affiliated with the Communist Party or engaged in espionage activities.)

On the same date FARY JANE KEENEY contacted one STAN and stated that she, MARY JANE, was driving to Park Fairfax, Alexandria, Virginia, and that she would like to drop by STAN's apartment to see him.

STAN indicated that he resides in Apartment 678 The identity STAN is not known.)

has further advised that on June 22, 1946 MARY JANE contacted an individual identified as DAVID (possibly DAVID WAHL) and inquired of him as to the directions to drive to Park Fairfax, Alexandria, Virginia. DAVID agreed to meet MARY JANE at the Shirlington Drug Store located at the Shirlington Shopping Center.

On the same date MANY JINE conversed with BEA and BOB who are believed to be BEATRICE and ROBERT J. SCHWARTZ of 1905 B Street, N. E., Washington, D. C. MARY JINE stated that she is definitely not going to Japan to join her husband and that in all probability her husband will return to the United States in September, 1946. BOB stated that he had just returned from the American Veterans Committee in Iowa and that he was very much satisfied with the results of this meeting. BOB said that he was very favorably impressed by BOB MATHAN who was also attending the American Veterans Committee. MARY JINE related that she is going to resign from her position from the State Department very soon and that in view of that she is taking as much sick leave as possible.

On June 24, 1946 MARY JINE was contacted by one BERNIE who apparently works with the Department of State in an office where MARY JINE is ostensibly employed. BERNIE stated that MITASCHINDELL (phonetic), who is in the personnel office on the first floor of the Walter Johnson Building, desires to see MARY JINE. She indicated that she would see him at her earliest convenience.

On the same date one DAVID, believed to be the DAVID contacted by MARY JANE KEENEY on June 22, 1946, conversed with MARY JANE KEENEY and sister RUTH FREE AN who was visiting MARY JANE at that time. RUTH FREE AN stated that she was to meet MARY RUTH at 11:00 A.M. on June 25, 1946 in the lobby of the Raleigh Hotel for lunch. DAVID stated that he would attend the luncheon if he possibly could. It is to be noted that Mars. EDMUND FREEMAN received a letter dated June 20, 1946 in care of MARY JANE KEENEY. This letter was mailed by EDMUND FREEMAN of Missoula, Montana,



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On June 25, 1946 MARY JANE KEFNEY conversed with BENEDICT ALPHER. ALPHER invited her to dinner at his home that evening and MARY JANE accepted the invitation. She stated that she would pic' mup at his office shortly before 5:30 P.M. and that she had a great number of things she desired to talk over with him.

On the same date DAVID WAHL contacted MARY JANE and stated that he had just received a communication from the Unitarian Church Committee. MARY JANE stated that she and her husband might be interested in going to Europe to direct food relief for the anti-Fascists for the Unitarian Church. She made application with the Unitarian Church Committee at the suggestion of Colonel DEUTSCH (phonetic) and DAVID's name was given as a reference.

On June 26, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY conversed with EDMARD BRECHER at the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company, 1822 Jefferson Place, N. W. They discussed the new radio station and MARY JANE expressed a desire to meet with BRECHER to look for material on voice placement. BRECHER said that he plans to have approximately thirty programs on the air for the benefit of women and that he desired that she audition these programs to "see if they have what we need". BRECHER also stated that his company could use a few more stockholders and MARY JANE offered to contact/BREEK-HOFF (phonetic) and see if he is interested.

On the same date HELEN SILVERY STER and NARY JANE KEENEY had several conversations and HELEN stated that her husband, NATHAN GREGORY SILVERYASTER, has not yet returned home. HELEN SILVERY STER stated that her son, ANATOLE, has returned home.

On June 27, 1946 URSULA WASSERMAN from New York City contacted MARY JAME KEENEY and stated that she planned to arrive in Washington on the following Monday. MARY JANE KEENEY invited her to spend her stay in Washington at her apartment and URSULA accepted. URSULA stated that she returned to the United States about a week previous and that she desires to contact DANIELAMELCHER in Washington, D. C. MARY JANE related that she had seen him earlier during that day. URSULA WASSERMAN stated that she would wire MARY JANE as to her date of arrival in Washington, D. C. and MARY JANE expressed her intention of meeting her at Union Station.

On June 28, 1946 OLIVE CHUB! of Tas's News Agency contacted MARY JANE KEENEY stating that "they suggested that I get in touch with you". OLIVE and MARY JANE made tentative arrangements to lunch together at 12:45

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P.H. the following day.

MARY JANE KEENEY conversed with AIICE, last name unknown, on June 29, 1946 at which time ALICE invited her to a wedding reception to be held at DAVE's house on July 3. MARY JANE stated that she expected to be away for the week-end and would be unable to attend.

On the same date MARY JANE KEENEY conversed with HELEN SIL-VERMASTER who stated that her husband, NATHAN CREGORY SILVERMASTER, was expected to return the following day and she invited MARY JANE to come over for a visit. MARY JANE stated that she had made a previous engagement but that she would come over for a visit if possible.

MY.RY JANE KEENEY also conversed with BOB and BEA (SCHWARTZ) on the same date at which time BOB invited her over to his home for the evening. NYRY JANE accepted.

On July 1, 1946 M/RY J/NE KEENEY contacted Mrs. D/NIEM MELCHER and stated that UKSUL. WASSERMAN was expected to arrive in Washington on that day and that she desired to see D/NIEL MELCHER. MARY J/NE invited the MELCHERS over for dinner but Mrs. MELCHER declined stating that she had a meeting to attend. MARY JANE stated that she had secured a position with the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company effective September 1 and that she expected to remain on sick leave until July 15, 1946 at which time she would resign from the Department of State. MARY JANE asked Miss REUTHER how the United Nations meeting was coming along and ALIX REUTHER stated that she had no news inasmuch as she could not afford a trip to New York at that time. MARY JANE also asked who GEORGE BARNES is and Miss REUTHER stated that he is the director of liaison and was formerly connected with EINER DAVIS. MARY JANE stated that a friend of her in New York is interested in the United Nations and that was the reason for her inquiry.

On the same date MICHAEL GREENBERG conversed with MARY JANE KEENEY and asked her if she had attended the dinner at which A. MAXIMITNEY spoke. MARY JANE replied that she was unable to attend.

On July 2, 1946 MARY JANE KEENEY converged with EDWARD



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BRECHER at the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company and stated that he should send some stock application blanks to WILLIAN LOWINAN, Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, and also to ROBERT SCHWARTZ, 1905 B Street, N. E., Washington, D. C. PARY JAME stated that UHIMAN would subscribe to five shares and that NATHAM GREGORY SILVER MASTER would subscribe to from two to five shares.

On the same date MARY JAME conversed with one and invited him and RUTH to drop by her home that evening. They accepted the invitation and stated that they would be there between 7:00 and 8:00 P.M.

further advised that MIKE CREENBERG conversed with MIRY JANE on the same date and they made plans for a trip on the Fourth of July. MARY JANE stated that on July 3, 1946 she was going to visit BERNARD NORTHAN in order to meet his sister—in—law.

contacted MARY JANE KEENEY. MARY JANE stated that she had just attended a party given for ALICE at DAVID WAHL'S and that ALICE is going to New York that same day. MARY JANE and SYLVIA engaged in a lengthy conversation concerning the "run around" that the State Department was giving SYLVIA. SYLVIA said that she had been given a job of filing and that she was actually doing Grade CAF-2 work. SYLVIA continued that she had discussed her work with JUST LUMBING and that she had gone to his office at his invitation. SYLVIA related that she told JUST that she is being given the "run around" at the State Department due to her work on the Political Action Committee. JUST LUMBING told SYLVIA, however, that if she did not like the treatment that she was getting at her work he would try to arrange for her to work for him.

On July 4, 1946 MARY JANE conversed with DOROTHY NORTHAN and stated that she was going over to see them that afternoon. (BERNARD NORTHAN has appeared in instant investigation previously and is known to have been in the office of Dr. A. B. WEINSTEIN, 202 53rd Street, New York City, on April 11, 1946. WEINSTEIN is also a contact of VICTOR PERLO. Background data pertaining to NORTHAN appears in the report of Special Agent FLOYD L. JOHES of instant investigation dated December 18, 1945.)

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On this same date MICHAEL GREENBERG contacted MARY JANE KEEN-EY and they made plans to take a trip with MIKE's wife, MARIAN, the following day and stated that they would in all probability drive out to Annapolis, Maryland.

On July 8, 1946 MARY JAME KEENEY attempted to converse with Mr. HENRY BXCOLLINS at the Smithsonian Institute, however, Mr. COLLINS was not available. A review of the 1943 city directory reflects that H. B. XCOLLINS is a research man in the ethnology section and that he resided at 2557, 36th Street, M. W., Washington, D. C. There is no information in the files of the Washington Field Office of a derogatory nature regarding this person.

On the same date DOROTHEA BOYD conversed with MARY JANE KEEN-EY. They made a date to have lunch together at 1:45 P.M. at the Tally Ho Restaurant.

On July 10, 1946 MARY JANE KEEPEY conversed with DAVID WAHL at which time MARY JANE stated that she was leaving for Chicago the following day and would drive in her automobile. She furnished him the following address of her mother with whom she will stay:

Mrs. F. A. DINIELS, 348 South Madison Street, Woodstock, Illinois.

MARY JANE said that she would see BETTY PURDIS (phonetic) in Cleveland for about two days and that she would also see BERTHANGEHUTAN (phonetic) in Chicago.

On the same date MARY JANE KEENEY contacted one ERIC BREKROFF at Extension 4736, United States Department of Interior. They discussed an enterprise that HENRY KAISER is backing called the Cabot Institute for Neuro-Muscular Rehabilitation. MARY JANE asked ERIC how he was getting along at the Department of Interior and he stated that he had an interview with the four topmost men at the Department and that they were very anxious for him to remain in the Department of Interior. He also said that he expected to be appointed as head of the Pacific Branch which had just been created by Congress. MARY JANE and ERIC discussed BOB PA SHFORT (phonetic) who is employed at the Department of Interior on a temporary basis.

On the same date MARY JANE KEENEY contacted <u>BOB SCHWARTZ</u> and asked him if he had been able to locate a job. BOB said that he has has not been successful and MARY JANE stated that she felt like the "whole"



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government is going to be difficult, frustrating for at least two years".

Concerning the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company with whom NIARY JANE KEENEY has indicated that she will secure a position, it has been ascertained that it was granted an FM license on June 13, 1946 by the Federal Communications Commission. MORRIS RODMAN is the president of the corporation.

A review of the indices of the Washington Field thace reflects that MORRIS RODAN and his wife, GERTRUDE, of 1736 Holly Street are live members of the Washington Bookshop and that their names appeared in the active indices of the American Peace Mobilization as well as the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. RODAN is also known to be a contributor of the Spanish Refugee Relief Campaign and his name also appeared in the indices of Commonwealth College in Arkansas which organization was investigated by the Arkansas State legislature for failure to display the American flag.



July 1, 1946, Special Azent WILLIAM DONOVIN, a resident of Parkfairfax Azertments, Alexandria, Virginia, advised he had received a circular distributed to residents of that development, advising that a rally to save price control would be held Monday night, July 1st at 8:30 PM at Parkfairfax Playground. Among the speakers listed on this program was "Mr. HARRY MAGDOFF, Economist". At 8:30 PM, the "Rally to save Price Control" commenced at the Parkfairfax Playground. This rally was sponsored by the Parkfairfax Community Association and the League of Women Voters. The master of ceremonies was WILLIAM BOURNE, Chairman of the Parkfairfax Community Association. In an opening statement he spoke regarding the OPA crisis and the disastrous results to follow if OPA was not restored. The following speakers were introduced by BOURNE.

- 1 JANEPYSTICK (phonetic). Mrs. STACK was introduced as a housewife. She spoke of rising prices and the necessity of rearranging her household budget.
- 2 HARRY MAGDOFF. He was introduced as an economist and Special Assistant to the Secretary of Commerce, and also editor of the publication "Business Survey", published by the Department of Commerce. HARRY MAGDOFF spoke of a great disturbance regarding the end of OPA and it was his opinion that if OPA was not restored there would likely be a depression in 10 or 20 years.
- 3 Congressman CHARLES S.VAGE, from Washington State. Congressman SAVAGE explained to the audience how the OPA bill vetoed by the President was passed through Congress. He stated that 85% of



members of Congress represent about 5% of financiers and Wall Street men that run 2/3 of the United States. He urged all present at the rally to phone, wire, visit and write their Congressmen and members of the Senate and House Banking and Currency Committees, urging a new OPA bill and the passage of a 20-day extension bill. He attacked capitalist control of Congressmen and stated we should "win peace as well as the war". .

4 - CATHERINE STONE (also known as Mrs HAROLD A. STONE). introduced as past president of the rlington and Alexandria League of Women Voters and the present vice-president of the same group. Mrs. STONE attacked the capitalists and urged the audience to vote against the Congressmen who vote against OPA. She urged that some resolutions come out of a meeting of this size and at this point CHAPLES HAGUE, 3240 Martha Custis Drive, made a motion that a wire be sent to the President and Congress urging support of OPA. This motion, after being seconded, was t passed unanimously by voice vote. WILLIAM BOUPNE then appointed H.GUE, M.GDOFF, STACK and STONE to a committee to draft and send the wire to the President and members of Congress.

HEROLD HELLIEN, President of the Mayne Title and Trust Bank, Mayne, Pennsylvania, advised that KILSCHE BEHERY IRLIN, MERGRET IRLIN MERREN'S father, was a consultant engineer with UNITED GLS INPROVEDENT, a large utility company located in Philadelphia, and during the late war, served in an advisory capacity as an engineer for the Government at Mashington, D. C. Mr. HELLIEN was not personally acquainted with MERGERET TRULY TREEN, but that her family was well-to-do, entirely respectable and Highly patriotic. Mr. HELLIEN also advised that MESLEY GIMEN operated an advertising agency in Philadelphia in partnership with PAUL MEDIS. Although Mr. HELLIEN was not acquainted with MESLEY GIMEN or REDOLFH GIMEN, he stated that PAUL M. LEMIS of Stratford, Pennsylvania, was a very reputable citizen and that GILMEN must be 1-1 in background and business standing to have such a partner.

Mrs. ED. LAD LOUGHREY, Issistant Postmistress, St. Davids, Pennsylvania, on July 10, 1946, advised that she had known MARGIRET IRLIN MIRREM for the past ten years, and during that period had never heard anything derogatory regarding




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this individual. MERGERET was said to have attended the ignes Irwin School, Lynnewood, Pennsylvania, a conservative private school for girls, having graduated from that school about 1941. Following graduation, she married JOHN MERKEN, who was said to be from Baltimore, and she and JOHN MERKEN resided with her parents at Cambria Court, st. Davids, Pennsylvania. JOHN MERKEN was said by Mrs. LOUGHREY to have been killed while serving overseas, leaving his wife and a child, now aged two. MERGERET IN IN MERKEN was said to be presently married to REMDOLPH GILMAN, a friend of LANGERET MERGERET'S late husband, and MERGERET MERGERET THOMAS IN THE PROBLEM OF THOMAS IN THE ABOUTH GILMAN presently reside with MERGERET'S parents. MERGERET has a brother, THOMAS IR IN, who is presently a student at Yale University, according to Mrs. LOUGHREY.

Pennsylvania, on July 13, 1946, made available the school file for RIMDOLPH GILMIN. This file reflected that GILMIN attended Haverford School from September, 1935, to June, 1937, when he was graduated. He was below average as a student, having a standing of ferty in a class of fifty-eight. Mr. BLICK advised that RIMDOLPH GILMIN was not a scholar, but was a gentlemanly, friendly boy, pleasant and courteous in his manner. Mr. BLICK had no derogatory information regarding GILMIN. He advised that MESLEY 1. GILMIN, RIMDOLPH'S father, was fermerly connected with N. ... LYER & SON, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, described by him as one of the largest, oldest and most conservative advertising company in Philadelphia, with headquarters in Philadelphia.

The indices of the Philadelphia Field Division were checked as to the isons named in this inquiry and the following reference was found:



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The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater Philadelphia, Dun and Bradstreet, as well as the records of the Radnor Township Folice, Layne, Pennsylvania, were checked for any record of the individuals on whom this inquiry is based, with negative results.

Reference is made to the report in this case dated June 17, 1946, in which information is set forth that

Inquiry revealed that H_RVET NO.E is assistant Vice-President of the Lockjeint Pipe Company, Newark, New Jersey. Inquiry at the Motor Vehicle Department, State House, Trenton, New Jersey, reflected that there is a driver's license issued to one H_RVEY S. HOLE, 23 Collamore Terrace, Mest Orange, New Jersey. In his application for a license which was filed in March of 1946, it was stated that this individual is forty-five years of age and was born at "Lagon Mount, New Mexico." Also, according to the application, he is employed as the Assistant Vice-President of the Lock Joint Pipe Company, 150 Rutledge Avenue, East Orange, New Jersey. He is described as weighing 145 pounds, five feet eight inches tall, and having brown eyes and brown hair.

At this same motor vehicle department it was ascertained that HIRVEY S. HOLE is the owner of a 1937 tan Oldsmobile Sedan, having 1946 New Jersey License ET61F, the serial number for this car being 182645, and the motor number being L291779. According to these records, this car was first registered in New Jersey in March of 1945 and that it had been transferred from Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania certificate on file with the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Department reflects that HOLE'S home address in that state was 722 Philadelphia Street, Indiana, Indiana County, Pennsylvania. There is a lien in the amount of \$858.78 against this car held by the Seaboard Commercial Corporation, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

In an effort to obtain additional background information concerning this person, Mr. THOMAS BEIRRE, mail carrier of the Orange, New Jersey Post Office, which also covers lest Orange, was contacted, and he advised that to the best of his recollection the HOLES had moved to 23 Callamore Terrace, West Orange, sometime in the early summer of 1945. He stated he believed that he had moved to this address from out of state, but he was unable to weall, nor did his records reflect the place from which they had come. He advised that Mr. HOLE had only recently returned from an extended trip to South America. He had no further information concerning these individuals other than to advise that they had a son whom he believed to be attending the Roesevelt Junior High School in Lest Orange, New Jersey.

Mr. BRENDER, principal at the Roosevelt Junier High School, West Orange,

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New Jersey, advised that Sheldon Hole of 23 Collabora Terrace, Most Orange, was a student at his school. He advised that Sheldon Hole was born March 19, 1933 (?), in Pittsburgh, Fennsylvania. His father's name is Harvey S. Hole, who is employed as a civil engineer and his mother's name is Leona 10.E. Both parents were born in the United States. Mr. BRENDER advised from his records that Sheldon Hole had been transferred to his school from the Gregory School, where he began on March 15, 1945. His records had no information as to the place from which these persons had been transferred but Mr. BRENDER made inquiry of the principal of the Gregory School who stated he believed that he had come from Maryland.

Lt the Rotail Credit Company, Federal Trust Zuilding, Mowark, New Jersey, Mr. MCEL HULL, manager, was contacted, and he advised that his office had on May 2, 1946, made an insurance investigation for the Eastern Department of the Fidelity and Casualty Company of Mew York, 80 Maiden Lane, New York 8, New York. This investigation concerned an insurance policy on a 1937 Oldsmobile automobile. It was stated in this report that HERVEY 8. HO Z was forty—two years of age and of Ingle-Samon origin. His net worth was given as 98,000 and his annual income 96,500. He is married and has two children, ages 1k and 16. His wife's name is HERY, age thirty—six, a housewife, according to these records. The file number for the insurance company was furnished as H291,779.

Inquiry was made at the office of Dun & Bradstreet, 744 Broad Street, Newark, for information concerning the Lock Joint Pipe Company, 150 Rutledge Lyunue, East Orange, New Jersey. From these records it was ascertained that the following individuals are officers in that company:

It is noted in the above that nowhere is the name of HIRVEY S. HO.E listed as an officer. Ill of the names mentioned above were checked through the Newark Field Division indices and no identifiable information was obtained concerning anyone of these persons.

The Newark indices contain the following information concerning the

Lock Joint Pipe Company, 150 Rutledge Lvenue, East Orange, New Jersey. There are two items of correspondence received from this company requesting plant protection manuals and plant protection information. On the letterheads of these items of correspondence, it is stated that the Lock Joint Pipe Company was established in 1905 and has its general offices in East Orange, New Jersey. It also has branch offices in Chicago, Illinois; Cleveland, Ohio; Denver, Colorado; Hartford, Connecticut; Kansas City, Missouri; and hite Plains, New York. The business of this company is described in these letterheads as follows:

"Reinforced concrete pipe; pressure, water sower, Culve subaqueous."

These letters were both signed by J. E. LONGLEY, Secretary.

In view of the alleged position of H.RVEY HOLE with this company, it was decided inadvisable to make any contact with them for information concerning

Contact was made with the following listed agencies for information person. concerning this person with negative results:

Retail Merchants Credit Bureau, 200 Mashington Street, Newark, K.J. Local Board #3, 14 Northfield Road, .est Orange, N. J. Local Boards #12, #13, and #14, all located on Harrison Street, Newark Clearing House, 24 Connerce Street, Newark, N. J.

The Newark Field Division indices were checked for information concerning H.RVEY HO.E, LEON'S HOWE, MERY HOWE and SHELDON HOWE with negative results.

Reference is made to the report dated July 19, 1946, in which information was secured from a confidential informant known to Special agent E. H. NOSS-BURG of this office that the subject had received a Christmas card in 1944 from MORRIS LLE ELLY COOKE, St. Georges Road, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. In a lette: dated July 12, 1946, the Philadelphia Field Division furnished the following information in regard to COOKE:

COOKE was born May 11, 1872, at Carlisle, Pennsylvania, and is a graduate mechanical engineer, having graduated from Lehigh University, in 1895. Early in his life, he worked on several newspapers in Philadelphia and New York City and also served apprenticeship as a machinist in Cramp's Shipyard in Philadelphia later working as a journeyman-machinist in this vicinity. He was an assistant engineer in the U. S. Navy during the Spanish-American ... ar and was Director of Public works, Philadelphia, from 1911 to 1915. He served as Chairman of the Storage Section, War Industries Board of the Council of National Defense and ass a member of the Depot Board, U. S. army during 1917. He was also Executive Assistant to the Chairman of the U. S. Shipping Board in 1918.

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COOKE was Director of the Giant Power Survey conducted in Philadelphia in 1923, Chairman of the Mississippi Valley Commission of the Public Works idninistration in 1933, and administrator of the Rural Electrification in inistration from 1935 to 1937. He also acted as technical consultant for the Labor Division of the Office of Production Management during 1940 and 1941. COOKE was the Same time. He was head of the imerican Technical Mission to Brazil in 1949.

and clubs of the higher strata. He is the author of several books on production management and electrification. One book he wrote in conjunction with PHILLIP published in 1940. COOKE presently resides at St. Georges Read, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and also has a residence at Newhope, Pennsylvania.

The Philadelphia files indicate that on June 13, 1940, Mr. HUGH CLEGG of the Bureau contacted the Philadelphia Office and informed that the Solicitor General of the United States was in receipt of a letter from MORPIS L. COOK, a Flectrification authority, to the effect that he had told Solicitor BIDDLE that Bureau agents had been conducting investigations of the Newhope Geoperative Society or the Salisbury Consumers Cooperative Society and that this investigation had shaken the confidence of the community. No such investigation had been conducted by the Philadelphia Field Division.

The files also revealed that CCOKE is permanent Philadelphia Chairman of the Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Sciences, and Professions and is in frequent contact with MADELINE CLITZSTEIN, who is correspondent for the Tess News Agency and for the Federated Press. She is in frequent contact with highly the Professional Section of the Communist Farty in Philadelphia.

Physical Surveillance

On July 16, 1946, it was ascertained through a pretext call to the subject's office at the State Department that he was to arrive at the National airport on the morning of that date. From 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. a surveillance was conducted at the airport to determine the arrival of the subject with negative day. It was later determined that the subject had arrived on the previous the State Department. At 1:10 p.m. the subject was observed leaving the southwest Trust Company, 17th and G Streets, N. ... and entered, where he made a deposit and secured some cash. At 1:15 p.m. he was out of the bank and walked to a nearby Club at 1520 H Street, N. ... and entered there at 1:28 p.m. At 1:30 p.m. he met



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an unidentified man in the lobby of the Cosmos Club. They both entered the basement dining room and ordered lunch. The unidentified man was six feet in height, 165 pounds in weight, brown hair - thin in front, about 30 to 35 years of age, were plastic rimmed bifocal glasses, tan suit, no hat, dark brown shoes, blue shirt, blue and white checked tie, and is noted for his fast walk. He says square brown leather briefcase.

Lt 2:22 p.m. the subject and this unidentified man, later identified as CLRROLL LX IISON, walked to Pennsylvania avenue and TYSON entered a cab. The subject walked to the State Department. ...IISON proceeded to Room 3341, Office of Research and Inventions, U. S. Navy Department, on Constitution avenue. It was observed that ...IISON apparently is not employed in the Navy Department inasmuch as he did not appear to knew how to reach Room 3341, Lt 2:55 p.m. ...IISON left the Navy Department, entered a cab and proceeded to the National airport, where he boarded Flight #306, American Airlines, to Boston, Hassachusetts. It was ascertained that ...IISON had purchased a return ticket from Mashington to Boston in Boston. Through the steward at the American Lirlines, it was ascertained that this man was CARROLL L. ...IISON, 2230 Cathedral Livenue, N. ...

From 3:30 to 6 p.m. a surveillance was conducted inside and outside the State Department. It 4:50 p.m. the subject was observed in the hall opposite his office at the water fountain. He walked back into his office. At 5:52 p.m. the subject left his office, hurried out the exit to a waiting Government car, U.S. License #130, parked between the State Department Building and the Lhite House. He entered this car and at this point the surveillance was discentinued.

On July 17, 1946, spot checks were conducted from 1 to 3 p.m. and 4 to 10 p.m. at the State Department to determine the subject's whereabouts with agative results.

is protext call was made to the subject's former residence to determine subject's whereabouts, and it was learned that he was staying at the Mayflower Hotel, Lashington, D. C.

On July 18, 1946, the following surveillance was conducted:

at 1 p.m. the Assistant Manager of the Mayflower Hetel was interviewed and advised that the subject had registered at the Mayflower on July 15, 1946, and had checked out at 10 a.m. on the morning of July 18, 1946. It was determined that the subject's room was already occupied and no search was made of this room. MARKS made the following longdistance calls while staying at the Mayflower:

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in the hallway outside the subject's office. At 5:55 p.m. the subject was observed leaving his office. He walked from the State Department to 2020 Florida Avenue, entered a tailor shop there at 6:15 p.m. At 6:18 p.m. the subject left the tailor shop and hailed Premier Cab #388 at the intersection of Florida and Connecticut Avenues. Eventually the subject was driven to 3405 0 Street, N. ... He left the cab, took a key out of his pocket and entered this address at 6:35 p.m. The surveillance was discentinued briefly and begun again at 7:40 p.m., and at 9:00 p.m. it was discentinued as no activity was observed on the part of the subject.

On July 19, 1946, a surveillance was begun at the subject's residence at 3405 0 Street, N. ... at 8:45 a.m. 4t 9:01 a.m. the subject residence house and entered a Union Station streetcar and rode to 17th and Pennsylvania avenue, N..., where he alighted and entered the State Department. The surveillance was discentinued at 9:15 a.m. at 10:30 a.m. the surveillance was begun at the 17th Street entrance of the State Department. No activity was observed on the part of the subject until 2:15 p.m., at which time the surveillance was discentinued

i surveillance was begun again at the State Department at 5 p.m. on this The subject came out of the northwest entrance of the State Department building carrying a small olive drab canvas overnight bag. He walked down 17th Street to the Mayflower Hotel and entered the lobby. In the lebby he was observed in conversation with an unidentified white male described as fellows: 5'10" in height; 180 pounds in weight; 45 to 50 years of ago, straw hat, gray suit, steel-rimmed eyeglasses. He concluded this conversation in a few minutes and went through the lobby and stood on the side exit on DeSales Street. At 6 p.m. the subject was approached by two young girls, aged 16 and 19, and a middle-aged woman with gray hair, approximately 50 years of age. They greeted the subject and walked with him to an automobile parked on 17th Street behind the Mayflower. When they reached the automobile, a 1940 or 1941 gray Plymouth sedan, Maryland license #53-751, with a doctor's insignia on the tag, they were greeted by three nore women. The group stood for a few minutes by the car and engaged in conversation. The subject entered the above-mentioned car with the two girls and the middle-aged woman. The unknown woman advised JENTE that JOE GILMAN, with whom she had had lunch, invited her to go to Rehoboth Beach for the weekend. She also told JENTE that the CALLIS! are in town and that she will contact them. The CALLIS! referred to are probably Dr. HERRY RITHER CALLIS and his wife LYRA, who reside at 2306 P Street, N. E. and are colored. The unknown woman is probably MARGARET GREENFIELD!

On July 3, 1945, JERNIE MILLER contacted FLO LEVY, her sister, and advised her that PERRL FLED was probably going to New York to see her "kid" and that she would like to ride to New York with FLO. FLO advised JETTE that she was leaving early Friday morning and she does not want to wait for anyone. JETMIN as being a very rich Italian who had lived in Genoa and had several steamships and when they passed the Eurenburg laws he got out and is now living at a country place in New York.

On July 6, 1946, JEHIE HILLER contacted FLO LEVY from Duxbury, Massachusetts, and FLO advised her that CARCLE CHIEVEY was arriving in Mashington Tuesday night with a friend and that they were going to stay at the MILLER residence. JEHIE advised FLO that JANEMAY was a friend of PEARLIS. (A physical surveillance failed to reflect that CARRIE JANEMAY arrived in Mashington, D. C. and stayed at the MILLER residence.

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the State Department, who resides at 3335 Dent Place, N.W. He has a sister, Ass DOROTHE VILLED, who resides at 2920 N Street, N. W. VILLED is reported to have come to Washington from New York City.

The files of The Credit Bureau reflect the additional information that VILLED lived at 79 East 79th Street, New York City, and is a son of Mr. and Mrs. OSULID G.VILLED, who still reside at the above address. The credit record reflects that while in the foreign service for the State Department he was stationed in Algiers and received a salary of \$500 per year. He was formerly imployed by OPM as a technician's assistant, to which he was appointed January 1, 1942. It also lists VILLED as having been employed by the Treasury Department as a senior economic analyst, where he was appointed in February, 1941.

The files of the mashington Field Office reflect that Mrs. HEMRY VILLARD, mother of CSMLID GERRISON VILLARD, and the grandmother of HEMRY VILLARD, is a member of the Emerican Peace Federation, Fellowship of Reconciliation, Momen's Peace Party, and as favoring recognition of the Soviet government of Russia. OSMLID GERRISON VILLARD, who is the father of HEMRY VILLARD, is a journalist and editor of The Nation, whose slogen seems to be may country, alwaymrong. He is also a member of the Emerican League to Limit Ermaments, Fellowship of Reconciliation, Civil Liberties Bureau, Emerican Civil Liberties Union, Commission on Militarism in Education, the People's Lobby, Peace Patriots, League of Independent Political Letion, and as favoring recognition of the Soviet Government.





He had his personal mail forwarded to Dr. MORSE at 3106 N Street, N. W., when he was being returned to this country and demobilized. It is believed he is a close friend of Dr. MORSE and his wife. There appears to be no connection between Dr. HALPERIN and any of the subjects or references in this case.

On July 13, 1945, LEON LURRLY (ph) contacted LNN RETINGTON and asked her if it was true that the RETINGTONS were going to move to New York. AND replied she was not certain and they would not know until the end of September. She added that BILL does not like the job set up very much. The following information was obtained through period July 1 to 15, 1946.

On July 1, 1946, FAYE GLASSER told ERNA ROSENBERG she was waiting until she saw what happened to her husband HAROLD GLASSER, that the UNRA conference was to take place in August in Paris, and HAROLD has gone to every one of these conferences. If HAROLD should go to this next conference, FAYE said she would leave Washington but she would not go to Chicago again as she did last year. (HAROLD GLASSER is a subject of instant case.)

On July 2, 1946, EDITH WAHL, wife of DAVID WAHL, subject of instant case, contacted ERNA ROSENBERG and invited the ROSENBERGS to a picnic on July 4 at 3 o'clock. ERNA promised to come but said ALIAN would have to attend a Lawyers Guild convention in Cleveland for four days.

On July 5, 1946, ERNA ROSENBERG told ETLY SSWARFMAN on July 4 she standed a picnic given by the DAVE WAHLS. ERNA said there were about people present including WARRIET SINONS and the PHIL DUNA LAYS.

On July 8, 1946, ALLAN ROSEFFERG told his wife ERNA he had just returned (from Cleveland where he attended the National Lawyers Guild convention). ALIAN said he was on the Resolutions Committee. RUFFANORAN (phonetic) was chairman of this committee and ALLAN said, We adopted a resolution vigorously condemning TOM CLARK (Attorney General) and asking for his removal unless he changes his policy." The Assistant Attorney General WENDELD CERCE promptly joined the Guild and so did Senator PEPPER. ERNA gave ALIAN the following message from CHARLES FIATO: that he was taking an engineer from Marshall (phonetic) Company up to Boston. They would be there on Tuesday and would like to talk to Fisher and also to Mr. THITE. ALLAN should get hold of them and let CHARLES FLATO know the time and place. ALIAN could get hold of CHARLES FLATO in New York at Worth (?) 3145; on Tuesday morning at Boston at Stadium 2351 or by contacting CHARLES FIATO's Washington office. ERNA said HAROLD and FAYE GLASSER and CARL (probably CARLYCREEN) visited her on Sunday. On Saturday MANA visited the SCHARFIANS to\say good-bye to them. ERNA said a letter arrived from the people in England acknowledging the package which the ROSENBERGS had sent.

On this same day FIKE ____, hose wife's name is MARION asked ALIAN ROSENBERG whether he knew TALTER PLOUT (phonetic), and PLOUT's address in New York City. MIKE said he was going to New York and wanted to see him. ALIAN said it might be in care of PLES (phonetic) Brothers or perhaps DAVE TEVITAN could tell him. DAVE LEVITAN could be reached at United Nations. MIKE said DAVE was one of the people he intended to see in New York City.

MIKE asked whether WALTER FLOUT was in business yet and ALLAN replied he had not been up to the time he last saw him about a month ago.

On July 10, 1946, JANIE (EVIN?) told ERNA ROSENBERG she had been away and had returned late Sunday might. After a discussion of local politics, ERNA remarked ALIAN had gone to Cleveland over the hith with the Lawyers Guild convention and had quite a good time; that it was different now that he wasn't working for the government. Anything went and he had such a free feeling and the resolutions passed were so satisfactory to him. JANIE said in the government you never could do anything. She said the JAMES NEWANS had a palace they walked into in Connecticut north of New Haven which they rented from some friends of theirs. JIE NEWAN had ulcers and was getting along splendidly on the shore. ERNA and JANIE made a tentative engagement for ERNA to come over to the LEVINS a week from Friday for dinner.



LIZLETH S.SULT, R.W. BERENSON, and VRID. B.RMES were hostesses at this party.

Information has been received from the Pittsburgh Field Division indicating that license #25 for the state of West Virginia is issued to Sonator WHIM HAMILGORD for a 1941 Buick Sedan. It will be noted that at 7:12 p.m. on April 17, 1946 this automobile bearing these license plates arrived at the premises bearing an unidentified man and two unidentified words.

Berrington Evenue, Los Engeles, California. From July 1 to 15, 1945 furnished the following information concerning the subject's activities.

On July 1, 1946, SARAH SILVERMAN was in contact with Dr. ISADORE LATTMAN whose offices are in the Alban Towers and received instructions from him as to the type of medicine to give ŒORŒ who was ill


On July 2, 1946, FIORENOW MAGNER was in contact with GLORGE SILVER-MAN during which time they discussed various deals for surplus property.

FIORENCE advised her husband CHRIS was in Chicago dealing with the Austin Cook Company in an attempt to sell parachutes. FLORENCE advised that CHRIS could be reached in Chicago at Harrison 4300, room 406.

On the same date GEORGE SILVERIAN was in contact with CHARLOTTE SLAVITT at 2000 F Street, N. W., and wanted to know if Miss SLAVITT could furnish him with samples of the materials used in the parachutes. Miss SLAVITT apparently has access to the parachutes which WAGNER is attempting to sell in Chicago

On July 2, 1946, GEORGE SILVERIAN was in contact with CHRIS TAGER who advised him he was in contact with FAUL R SIMONS, a prominent Chicago lawyer who he thinks will buy the parachutes.

On the same date IAUCHLIN CURRIE was in contact with GEORGE SILVER-IMAN and advised, GEORGE he had seen the minister (believed to be the Brazilian minister) who is very interested. They discussed surplus property, and CURRIE told GEORGE he could tell his people that CURRIE had talked to the very top people and mentioned that the people in the official/Brazilian mission were working on the deal. CURRIE wanted to know if Miss SIAVITT was in on the deal and when advised she was, he told GEORGE he should tell her that they were dealing with cabinet members. CURRIE also mentioned he had some Turkish contacts who wanted to know if it could be converted to standard railroad stock; also that he had inquiries from Turkey for practically



all surplus goods, and it would take two weeks for the prospective buyer to get his letter of credit from Turkey.

On July 2, 1946, FRANK COE was in conversation with GLORGE SILVER-MAN and advised SILVERIAN he had some snarls in the administrative field, and he needed some outside help. They made arrangements for GEORGE to visit FRANK at his home over the following week-end

On July 3, 1946, JOE SILVER AN attempted to contact his brother GEORCE and when advised he was not at home he then conversed with SARAH SILVERIAN. After discussing family affairs, JOE SILVERIAN said that HAROLD GLASSER had obtained FRANK COE's job at the Treasury although it was not permanent. He is at present the acting director of the Monetary Research. SARAH asked if GLASSER would not prefer to be with the Fund, apparently referring to the International Bank, but JOE did not think GLASSER had the necessary training and thought perhaps HARRY THITE did not want him. According to JOE BURNSTEIN is now assistant director. JOE and SARAH discussed the sale of HARRY THITE's house.

On July 4, 1946, MURRAY LATIMER contacted GEORGE SILVERIAN at which time they had a lengthy discussion concerning the possibility of MURRAY LATIMER's becoming the commissioner of labor statistics at the Labor Department. They were very much concerned about the story in the paper the preceding day dealing with the resignation of A. F. HINEICHS who had been acting commissioner since the resignation of LUBIN. LATIMER said he had seen SCHTELLENBACH who was petrified and extremely angry over the story in the paper concerning HINRICHS' resignation.

According to LATINER, HINRICHS had become angry because SCHIELLEN-BACH would not appoint him commissioner and resigned on the condition that Secretary SCHIELLENBACH would not appoint LATINER to the job. LATINER told SILVERIAN he was under the impression that the Secretary would like to appoint him but was afraid that LUBIN and HINRICHS had gotten all of the statisticians and economists in the country down on him and for that reason he could not be confirmed. They then discussed the ways and means by which SILVERMAN could assist in obtaining a position. SILVERMAN promised LATINER he would go to work and do everything he could through his friends to have SCHIELLENBACH appoint LATINER

On July 4, 1946, GEORGE SILVERIAN contacted DAVIDY TINTRAUB. CLORGE discussed with him the appointment of PURRAY LATIMER to the Bureau of Labor Statistics and was very upset over the adverse publicity. They also discussed the American Statistical Society in which LUBIN, HARRY WHITE, HARRY MAGDOFF, and IRVING KAPIAN were members.

GEORGE SILVERNAN was also in contact with FRANK COE on the same date concerning MURRAY LATIMER's appointment to the Bureau of Labor Statistics

On July 7, 1946, CHARLOTTE SLAVITT conversed with GEORGE SILVERMAN and advised him she was ready to go ahead on electric motors. Also she was getting contacts for wire and motors. She also mentioned she was suing Western Union for \$40,000 for negligence in delivering a telegram which was two days late.

On July 9, 1946, JOE GOULD contacted GEORGE SILVERMAN and obtained from him AXELROD's number which was Republic 5600, extension 2979

on July 10, 1946, JOE SILVERIAN contacted his brother GEORGE and advised him HAROLD GLASSER was still acting director. He then wanted to know if GEORGE was still interested in the offices. However, GEORGE did not know for certain.

On July 11, 1946, DAVID ANTEQUE attempted to contact GEORGE but was advised he was out for the evening. He asked SARAH why they never accepted any of his numerous invitations to visit the AEINTRAUB home. They then made a tentative date to go to the ball game on the following evening. TEINTRAUB then told SARAH he had been fired and he expected to stay fired and since it happened he had been relaxing and vacationing

On July 12, 1946, GEORGE SILVERMAN was in contact with FLORENCE MAGNER at which time they mentioned a CAVIS who was in room 244 at the Hay Acams House. FLORENCE agreed she would go down and talk to DAVIS until GEORGE could get there a short time later. It is believed they were attempting to make a deal with DAVIS for some sugar.

On July 12, 1946, JOE SILVERIAN was in contact with his brother GEORGE at which time they discussed DAVID JEINTRAUB'S being fired from UNRRA where he was a deputy general director. They also mentioned the resignation of FRAPK COE, and JOE SILVERIAN, who is an employee of the Treasury, said they were hiring a lot of "furny people." GEORGE mentioned he and SARAH thought they would go over to the embassy for a while

On July 13, 1946, JOE SILVERMAN was in contact with SARAH and JOE mentioned his recent plane trip to Boston. SARAH said that GEORGE may go to the embassy on the following day. It is believed she was referring to the French Embassy inasmuch as GEORGE works with the French Supply Council and the French Embassy was having a small celebration on July 14. in honor of Bastille Day.

On July 14, 1946, SOL ADIER contacted GEORGE SILVENCAN and advised, him he had just potten in that morning from China and mentioned he had left

his wife in Nanking. GLORGE invited SOL out for dinner.

On the same date HARRY THITE contacted ŒORŒ SILVERNAN and was advised by ŒORŒ that SOL ADLER had just returned from China. HARRY mentioned he had been in touch with SAMPTILLER and wanted to know when they all could get together. ŒORŒ invited HARRY for dinner but he declined the invitation. However, they did decide to get together the following day. GEORŒ told HARRY THAT "IOCH," apparently LAUCHLIN CURRIE, was coming down on the following Tuesday and he would have to spend a lot of time with him


Informant further advised FARRY WHITE met with GEORGE SILVENIAN again later the same day.

advised on July 11, 1946, SARAH SILVERMAN was in contact with DOROTHY MAFLAN at which time they made arrangements to have dinner at Napoleons on Connecticut Avenue the following evening and then attend a night baseball game. SARAH also told DOROTHY that HARRY MAGDOFF had been over to their home the preceding evening at which time they discussed DAVE LINTRAUB's being fired from UNRRA and also MURRAY IATIMER who was "dying" to become commissioner of the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and that GEORGE had promised LATIMER he could sound out a few people to help in obtaining the job. However, HINRICHS, the former commissioner, had conferred with SCHNELLENBACH prior to his resignation and resigned only on the condition that LATIMER would not be given the post.

Physical Surveillance

On July 12, 1946, at approximately 11:35 a.m., GEORGE SILVERIAN was observed to enter room 244 at the Hay Adams House and was subsequently overheard discussing with several other individuals the possibility of buying sugar.

At approximately 5:25 p.m., on the same date IRVING KAFIAN and his wife DOROTHY, together with GEORGE and SARAH SILVEREAN, were observed to enter Napoleon's Restaurant at 2549 Connecticut Avenue where they had dinner, and at 8:15 p.m., they were observed to emerge from this restaurant and proceed to apartment 311 at 2325 15th Street which is the residence of the SILVEMANS. The above individuals entered the automobile owned by the KAFIANS bearing Virginia license clates 480-847.

further advised a communication was addressed from A. SILVER ASTER, 1334 East 105th Street, Los Angeles, California, on May 31, 1946, to HELEN SILVER ASTER, and this communication was in the Russian language. The informant made available a copy of this communication, and it was translated by Special Agents JCHN MINNO and CURT LAFRANCE. A translated copy of the communication is set out as follows:

"ly dears, & W

"May 28, 1946 & (U)

"I have been expecting a letter from you, but I couldn't wait any longer so I decided to write. We have some news. We've found some new SILVERMASTER relatives. Perhaps you or CREG remember that Papa had an older brother SHIMON who came to America with his wife and four children? We talked about him in the family. Well, before I left, Papa asked me to look up someone from the family. Several times ARMAOY and I have looked through the directories of many large cities, but we never found anyone. A week ago someone called on the telephone, asked who was speaking. I answered, Frs. SILVERIASTER, and from the other end of the line came a voice: Ty name is also SILVEN ASTER. At first I thought it was HELEN, and then everything was explained. His name is BEN SILVERIASTER. He is the only one left of all the brothers. He is 61 years old. He has three children; his wife is a teacher, an American. He was a teacher in the field of electricity and radio. Very nice and looks like an old man. He and his wife came down from Tacoma, Washington, for a couple of weeks! vacation and havealready gone back. In a month he is coming down with his whole family to stay for a month. This cousin BEN (his wife's name is MARIA) was so happy that he found a cousin; for twenty-five years he has been looking for his brothers and now he has found a cousin. If you go to Tacoma, get acquainted with them. They are fine people. They have two daughters and one son.

When are all well. SIMA (?) has registered at the university again. She wants to get a master's degree. (?) will also study this summer. We are all buzzing around like bees. In the evenings we gather around and everyone gives an account of himself to the others. SIMA (?) is very enthusiastic. She has received a contract from the school for forty-one years (?). Mama was here, and I gave her some money for you because it is difficult for her to make the trip. She is so far from us. You probably forgot again to send some for May (?).

*By the way, our cousin BEN has very interesting patents on tele-phones and in the field of electricity.

o also. I don't understand them. No one can give them any advice. I don't know what they want.

Where are you going on vacation? Are you coming to see us or are you going somewhere else? With us? What university is ANATOLI attending? How are you all? Greetings from everybody.

The following information was obtained from rewarding the activities of the subject from July 1 to 15, 1946.

Confidential informant advised on July 1, 1946, LUDITGUILLAND contacted MILEN SILVERMASTER and advised he had talked to JOHN and CHITHIA DIERKES about their contemplated visit to the SILVERMASTER-ULLIAM beach home at Harvey Cedars, New Jersey. It was not definitely ascertained whether the DIERKES would spend the present week-end with them but if not, contemplated doing so in the near future.

It was the SILVER! ASTERS! intent to leave that day for the beach, and ULLEANN indicated he would be down by train on the fourth of July weekend.


On July 8, 1946, an individual identified only as Mrs. M. IN SON contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER, and the informant was under the impression they were old acquaintances. Mrs. THESON indicated she had been in Rochester for the past two years.

On the same date ANNA BERENSON contacted HELEN SILVERMASTER and advised her she would be over to the SILVERMASTER residence on that evening to talk with CREGORY SILVERMASTER.

On July 9, 1946, informant advised HELEN SILVER'ASTER contacted ELIZABETH SASULY and discussed the number of guests they had been having during the summer at their beach home. ANATOLE, her son, has been visiting a lot of his friends along the coast. ELIZABETH SASULY indicated she and her husband RICHARD intend to visit the EMENSTEINS in Connecticut and some other friends in New Hampshire later on in the summer.

On July 10, 1946, informant advised Madame CHARLES LUCTIT, a house guest of the SILVERIASTERS, would be leaving for France by boat on August 25, 1946. She had originally contemplated leaving on July 25, 1945, but trans-

portation facilities were not immediately available. Madame LUCUET is the widow of CHAPLES LUCUET, former French military attache at the French Embassy.

On the same date LUDWIG ULLMANN contacted HELWN SILVERMASTER and advised HERRIETTA KIOTZ had called him and expressed appreciation for the pleasant week-end she had at their beach cottage. He advised HELEN that HENRISTTA's home address is now 19 East 38th Street, New York 18, New York

Confidential informant advised information reached him to the effect that JOHN and CYNTHIA DIERKES were presently staying at the beach home of the SILVERNASTERS at Harvey Cedars, and that CYNTHIA DIERKES was planning on spending sometime there.

On July 15, 1946, LUDTIG ULLMANN advised HELEN SILVERLASTER he agrees with her that the idea of Madame LUGUET's staying longer as their house guest was not too pleasant. HELEN mentioned Madame LUGUET had a different philosophy than theirs.







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Reference is made to the report of Special Agent ZANDER in this mater, dated July 19, 1946, which reflects that

OLIVE SUTTON CHUBA

Confidential Informant advised that on June 28, 1946, OLIVE CHUBA contacted MARY JANE MEENEY, a subject in this case, and stated, "they suggested that I get in touch with you". KEENEY informed OLIVE CHUBA that after tomorrow she would be out of town quite a bit of the time for a few weeks. They arranged to lunch together the next day at 12:45 PM, at "that place on F Street just past Garfinkels".

Reference is made to the information pertaining to the Tass News Agency, in particular to the above captioned individual, in the report of Special Agent ZANDER in this matter, dated key 17, 1946 at Mashington, D. C.

The following information was obtained through over the period July 1st to July 15th inclusive:

On July 9, 1946, JIM DUM ER attempted to contact Kiss EVELYN PARAMELL (phonetic) - possibly PERPENELL. He was not successful but he left word that she should get in touch with HELEN TENNEY

on July 10th JACQUELINE got in touch with HELEN TENERY who told her that she had seen SCOTT LOCK OOD and that SCOTT wanted to see JACQUELINE today or tomorrow. (JACQUELINE is believed to be identical with EVELYN PARANELL). A Tashington report in instant case dated May 12, 1946 indicates that HELEN TENERY on April 30, 1946 got in touch with EVELYN PARANELL whom she later addressed as JACQUELINE. This EVELYN PARANELL is believed to be employed at the French Purchasing Commission. The Tashington report in instant case dated May 2, 1946 indicates that JIM DUMER introduced EVELYN to HELEN TEMEY and on April 14th she and HELEN, JIM DUMER, one PETER and one PETKOV went picnicing

On July 10th, one NILL (phonetic) of New York told HELEN TENNEY that she, JILL, had a guest named Miss EISIE SALAMON (phonetic, may be SULLIVAL) from India who is on a world tour and desires to come to Washington. JILL had suggested that she see HELEN TENNEY. HELEN told JILL that she was finishing her job on the 19th of July and planned to leave town early the following week. A friend of hers (SCOTT)LOCKWOOD) was in town from Paris and said HELEN and he expected to leave in the middle of next week. It was agreed that HELEN should come to Washington on the 19th, get in touch with HELEN at her office and see her on the 20th. JILL stated that EISIE was connected with the Ministry of Education at Ceylon and was a fascinating person. She would be in town only a few days. HELEN said she might go back to New York with her.

On July 11th, HELEM TENNEY was in touch with INES MUNOZ and asked her if hr APRATT had called her. INES said, "No." HELEN explained that Mr. PRATT "wanted a speed-up method." HELEN recalled that INES had helped, someone else out quickly, the person who was going to South America. (It is of interest to note that INES MUNOZ, a very close friend of HELEN TENNEY'S, is also associated with subject JOSEPH GREGG of this case. At the present time, GREGG is in Canada and has made arrangements for the receipt of his mail at INES MUNOZ'S address).

On July 14th, HELEN TENNEY was in conversation with an unramed woman, possibly BEATRICE HOWELL. HELEN said she believed Thursday night was the best night for the party. The woman stated it would be a very simple affair. They would have just three kinds of liquor. The woman

observed that HELEN was an authority on rum drinks

On the following day, July 15th, HELEN TENNEY called Mrs. NESLEY, a fellow worker at HELEN TENNEYS office. HELEN explained that she was caught on a pressing matter and would be delayed until 3:45 PM. Mrs. NESLEY asked HELEN if she had seen Mr. IOCK OOD. HELEN answered affirmatively, adding that he was packing in great haste as he was due to leave on the following day.

On this same day, HELEN TENNEY told her mother that SCOTT had to fly out of New York City, at 9 AM, on Wednesday, July 17th. He would leave Tashington for New York at noon on July 16th. HELEN'S mother said it would be permissable for SCOTT LOCK TOOD to spend the night at her home in New York City. HELEN said sho would leave for New York City on either Sunday or Monday, July 21-22. HELEN'S mother said that she and EDITH would be in New York on Honday. HELEN explained that she had a lot of problems mas you can see by my letters. HELEN'S mother observed that GRAHAM expected to be in Detroit on the 12th.

No physical surveillances were conducted in connection with this subject during the period of this report.

In a previous report in this case dated July 19, 1946 at ashington, D. C., it was indicated that HELEN TENNEY was rather intimately associated with RUTH CHERIN and WILLIAM CHERIN. There is herewith set forth information regarding the background of WILLIAM BURTON CHERIN obtained by Special Agent JAMES M. SAPP who examined an application submitted by CHERIN dated December 15, 1942 when he sought a position with the United States Government. This application reflected that WILLIAM BURTON CHERIN was born on October 1, 1907 in Maumasterista. His father is HARRY CHERIN, a Russian National, born in Russia. His mother's maden name was given as SARA WAHN, a Russian National, also born in Russia. WILLIAM CHERIN claimed his wife as dependent and stated she was unemployed. CHERIN attended San Mate

Junior College, San Mateo, California, for the first six months of 1925: He received an A.B. degree from the University of California in 1928, and an M.A. degree in 1930. He attended the Universities of Berlin and Munich in Germany from May 1930 to 1931. He was awarded a Ph. D. Degree from the University of California, Berkley, California, in 1933. He attended the University of California, Graduate School of Librarianship, from August to December 1933. His principal subjects of study were Economics and social institutions. In December, 1942, he was Social Director in the Office of Special Services, employed by the Commonwealth of the Philippines, located at 1617 Massachusetts Avenue, Mashington, D. C. His salary was \$8000 per annum and his immediate Supervisor was MANUEL QUEZON. From December, 1941 to December, 1942, he was employed by the Department of Justice, Washington, D. C., as a Consultant at a salary of \$6500 per annum and his immediate supervisor was L. M. C. SHITH, Chief of the Special War Policies Unit.

Additional information indicated that on February 6, 1944, CHRIN was employed by the Army Service Forces, Meral Service Division, Information Branch, as an information expert at a remuneration of \$25 per diem. He denied any police record. He denied membership in the Communist Party. He claimed no military service. He was registered at Local Board 9, Washington, D. C., and was classified 3A for SS.





ULLIAM received a communication from an individual identified as LARRY LEONARD, Crillon Hotel, Paris, France. In this communication, he advised he had taken an extended automobile pleasure trip through France and Smitzerland, that he had called on OSTRO. and his wife in Bern. This individual is apparently FALTER WASTROW, a correspondent of subject ULLIANN in this case. He also mentioned that Captain ZAV and his wife recently enjoyed a cycling trip through the Provence. LEONARD indicated he has received information recently that tourists will be permitted to enter the Soviet Union at an early date and exclaimed that would be quite exciting.

He also advised that Captain ZAP informed him that MARY JANE KEENEY is working for "his" radio station and indicated he was one of the initiating stockholders who met and decided to organize that station. They had been in a position to send them information about France if they wanted it. LEONARD is apparently engaged in writing a book since he indicated he was forwarding to ULLEANN under separate cover "his chapter outline."

Inasmuch as the activities of subject ULLMANN are closely associated with those of NATMAN CRECORY SILVERIASTER and his wife HELEN SILVERIASTER, his activities, as well as the information furnished by during the period of this report, have been set out in instant report, under the caption of NATHAN CRECORY SILVERIASTER.






By letter dated July 2, 1946 the Pittsburgh Field Division set of the following background information on HENRY HOLDSHIP WARE, which was obtained from Allegheny College, Meadville, Pennsylvania, where HENRY WARE allegedly was an instructor previous to 1942.

Dean C. C. HURD advised that they maintained no personnel file for WARE, however, it was noted in the Allegheny College Bulletin for 1941 that WARE received an AB degree from Pomona in 1932 and attended the Plekhanov Institute of National Economy, Moscow, USSR, 1935 to 1936 and that WARE received an Allegree from Columbia in 1939. WARE was employed as an instructor in Economics for the one school year only 1940 to 1941. DEAN HURD stated that the only Instructor now at Allegheny College who could furnish any information concerning WARE would be Dr. LONG of the Economics Department.

Dr. LONG stated that WRE came to allegheny College from Columbia University in the Fall of 1940 immediately after receiving an AM degree and that he taught Economics that school year and upon completion of that year returned to Columbia to work on his Doctor's degree. Dr. LONG stated that he did not know much concerning WARE's background other than the fact that he apparently came from New York City and that his father was deceased. Dr. LONG stated, however, that further background information could be obtained through the Appointment Bureau of Columbia University.

At 1:55 they were observed to leave the cafeteria and to shop at a local grocery store, returning to the KEENEY apartment at 2:00 P.M.

At 6:55 P.M. on the same date an individual later identified as DANIEL MEICHER, Director of the National Committee on Atomic Information, 1749 L Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., was observed to enter the apartment of MARY JANE KEENEY by Special Agents COURTLAND J. JONES and JOSEPH J. KEECH. At 10:00 P.M. MEICHER was observed to leave the apartment building and to proceed by cab to 476 N Street, S. W., Washington, D. C., which is his residence. MEICHER is described as follows:

On July 2, 1946 Special Agents COURTLAND J. JONES, AUBREY S. BRENT, and FRANK STRONG observed at 12:05 P.M. NARY JANE KEENEY and



URSUL! W.SSERMAN to leave the Congressional apartment building and to malk to a near-by thoroughfare. At this time W.SSERMAN bid KEENEY-farewell and entered a taxicab and proceeded to the Villard Hotel located at Permsylvania Avenue and 14th Street, W. W.SSERMAN met an individual, later identified as CAROLYN BERNHARD, and they entered the Willard Room of the Villard Hotel. Information relative to CAROLYN BERNHARD's background has been previously set forth.

At 12:30 P.N. CHERLES BERNHERD, CEROLYN's husband, joined the group and they partook of cocktails. At 12:35 P.N. an individual later identified as JESUS PINERO, delegate to the House of Representatives from Puerto Rico, joined the group. They proceeded to consume numerous cocktails and at 4:00 P.N. an unidentified man joined the group for approximately one half hour. He left the group and was placed under surveillance but it was unsuccessful. He is described as: height, 5 feet, 7 inches; weight, 150; gray hair; receding forehead; was hatless; gray suit; white shoes; about 50 years of age.

At 6:05 P.N. MASSERMAN, Mr. and Mrs. BERNHARD, and JESUS PINERO departed from the Willard Room and proceeded by cab to the Statler Hotel where they entered the office of the Eastern Air Lines. At 6:55 P.N. they departed from the Eastern Air Lines and proceeded by cab to the Washington National Airport where they dined in the coffee shop. WASSERMAN departed on the Eastern Air Lines flight number 520B for New York City at 7:55 P.N. Special Agent CHARLES BEALL of the Washington Field Office telephonically furnished this information to Special Agent L. M. BEST of the New York Office at 7:30 P.N.

Following the departure of WASSERVAN from the National Airport Special Agents ORVILLE TALBURTT, COURTLAND J. JONES, and VINCENT HUGHES surveilled the BERNHARDS and JESUS PINERO. They proceeded by cab to 1901 16th Street, N. W. where PINERO entered Apartment No. 101 which is listed to J. TAPINERO. Mr. and Mrs. BERNHARD walked from the vicinity of 1901 16th Street to the Washington House, 2120 16th Street, N. W. where they were observed to enter Apartment 702 by Special Agent COURTLAND J. JONES.

has made available the following information pertaining to URSULA 'MSSER'MN:

On June 27, 1946 URSULA WASSERIVAN conversed with MARY JANE KEENEY and stated that she was coming to Washington the following Monday and that she desired to contact DANIEL MELCHER of the National Committee on Ltomic Information.

On July 1, 1946 URSUL: WASSERVAN contacted CAROLYN BERNHARD at the Treasury Department. CAROLYN stated that she received URSULA's

postal card about a week ago which probably came by diplomatic pouch. UR-SULY, stated that she had seen FINER in New York and CAROLYN and URSULY, discussed the gossip pertaining to ENTER's daught, her divorce, and her love for a much older man.

CAROLYN stated that she had seen JACK recently and that he called her up at 2:00 A.M. and came up to their apartment for drinks. CAROLYN continued that JACK became inebriated and proceeded to make love to her at which time "CHUCK" BERNHARD walked in from the other room. URSULA stated that JACK flew to Puerto Rico about a week ago to see MARTHA. URSULA stated that she is looking for a job, has had an offer from United Nations, and that she does not desire a position with the PAC. CAROLYN suggested that she contact JESUS PINERO at the Capitol.

WASSERVAN also related to CAROLYN BERNHARD that she recently returned to the United States from South America and that she stopped over at Puerto Rico on her way back. While there she attempted to contact her friends, the DILLANOS, VERNOS, and AMBROSE (phonetic), but was unsuccessful in doing that.

CAROLYN inquired of URSULA WASSERMAN if MARY helped her meet any people in South America and URSULA said "No", that "Mary has a very bad reputation in all anti-Fascist circles down there".

URSUL! WASSERVAN and CAROLYN BERNHARD made arrangements to get together the following afternoon at one and have cocktails in the Willard Room in the Willard Hotel.

On the same date advised that URSULA WASSERMAN contacted JESUS PINERO at the Capitol at Which time she advised him that she had stopped at an "island" en route from South America. She invited him to attend a luncheon at 12:30 Pall. the following day at the Willard Hotel. PINERO accepted the invitation.

CAROLYN BERNHARD and UNSULA MASSERIAN again conversed on the same date at which time CAROLYN invited her over for an hour or so. WASSERIAN declined the invitation and stated that she had seen DANIEL MELCHER but that they had been unable to come to any conclusion. URSULA related that she was very anxious to see "CHUCK" BERNHARD as he was her only hope for a position in Mashington, D. C.

On July 2, 1946 URSULA WASSERMAN attempted to reach PHIMO

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She contacted him at the Office of International Information and Cultural Affairs and asked to see him sometime that afternoon. Not his stated that he would be free at 3:00 P.M. and URSULA advised that she would see him sometime before she returned to New York. URSULA also asked how she could reach MERL COLBY. NASH replied that he is at the Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion. Shortly thereafter URSULA WASSERMAN attempted to reach Mr. COLBY at the Office of War Manpower Reconversion but he was not available. Later COLBY contacted WASSERMAN and stated that he is now working for Mr. STEELMAN. WASSERMAN expressed a desire to contact him before she left town and COLBY related that his office is located in Room 1241, Reconstruction Finance Corporation Building, 15th and I Streets, N. W. COLBY said that he would be free after 2:30 P.M. on that date.

URSULA MASSERMAN also attempted to reach BELLEY AYER at the Treasury Department but she was unavailable.

Concerning PERL COLBY and BELLE PLAYER, information pertaining to the background of these individuals has been set forth in a previous report.

apartment of MARY JANE KEENEY on the night of her arrival in Washington, D. C., was formerly employed by TED GAMBLE in the Treasury Department but resigned in January, 1946 to accept the position as treasurer of the National Committee on Atomic Information. The Washington Field Office is currently conducting an investigation regarding the Communist influence on the National Committee on Atomic Information and while there has been no evidence that MEICHER is a member of the Communist Party he is known to have two members of the Party employed in his office as assistants. Recently he has been under attack by the executive committee of the National Committee on Atomic Information which many observers feel are too far to the left wing. MEICHER is also known to have contacted ARTHUR STEIN, who is believed to be the leading Communist of the Government underground group in Washington, D. C., and to have asked his advice as to how he could best meet the attack that he, MEICHER, leaned toward the Communist Party Line.

PHILIO WASH, whom URSULA WASSERVAN contacted, resides at 1701 Swann Street, N. V., Washington, D. C., telephone Adams 6030. The indices of the Washington Field Division reflect that LOUISEBRANSTEN, who is under investigation in the Conrap case, personally called upon PHILIO NASH in January, 1944 when he was employed in the Social Security Building



and spent his early life in Misconsin Rapids. He attended the University of Misconsin and received an A.B. degree in 1932 having majored in sociology and anthropology. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago in 1937. He was employed as a social science research worker until he received a position in May, 1942 with the Office of Emergency Management. On June 25, 1943 he became a principal information specialist with the Office of War Information, Domestic Branch, Office of the Treasurer. In this position he was responsible for the problem of dealing with minority groups, foreign language groups, propaganda, and related activities in handling all correspondence on racial matters as received by the director of the Office of War Information.

An appropriate pretext determined that DOROTHY TUCK is residing at 4242 39th Street, N. W., and that she spells her name DOROTHY CUCH instead of TUCK. She is unemployed, is married to LAWRENCE C. TUCH, and has two children.

A review of the Washington Field Office files indicates she was a speaker on May 15, 1945, at the MacArthur Boulevard Food Forum sponsored by the Women's Auxiliary of the United Federal Workers of America, CIO. She is acquainted with FRANCES JACOBSON of the CIO Maritime Committee and has contacted EIEANOR DRIESEN of the CIO Maritime Committee. DOROTHY TUCH has been active in the OFA Food Committee and apparently follows the party line. There is no indication she holds a Communist Party membership card.

A Boston Field Office report on June 12, 1946, by Special Agent BRENTON S. GORDON reports the identity of one BERG, that office having been requested by the Washington Field Office to determine the identity of this person at 112 Boston University, Westover Field, Springfield, Massachusetts, who corresponded with Mrs. DONALD THEELER on December 10, 1945. The report indicated this individual is Sergeant KENNETH D. BERG, Army serial 19,145,902, 112th Base Unit, Westover Field, Massachusetts. His home is Lake Bronson, Minnesota. He was discharged on February 18, 1946, at Fort Devens, Massachusetts.

It was noted with regard to subject POPTET TUATCHER MORSE, an individual BERG is mentioned Since he might be identical with KENNETH D. BERG, a read is being set forth to have the St. Faul Office conduct additional background investigation.

A report dated July 11, 1946, by Special Agent H. TAYNE SITNMEY at St. Iouis, Missouri, advised they had identified HUNTER HARTTELLY ORRISON as requested by this office on June 10, 1946. HUNTER CORRISON was discharged from Fort Meade, Maryland, and his permanent address is believed to be 622 Milledge Circle, Athens, Georgia. He is a contact of DONALD THEELER and his family.

On July 12, 1946, a Credit Bureau check on ARMSTEAD COLEMAN, wife MARION a relative of the WHEELERS, disclosed they resided as of June 1,

He has resided at his present address for the past six months (as of June 1) and he is presently buying that property. He came from New York City, formerly residing at 3615 Greystone Avenue. Before moving to Arlington, Virginia, he had previously resided at 1740 Wisconsin Avenue. COLEMAN is a commercial artist and as such has been employed since July 19, 1943, by HENRY J. KAUFMAN and Associates Advertising Firm, Homer Building, Washington, D. C.

The credit check revealed he is highly regarded by his employer and receives a good salary. He was formerly employed at the Army Map Service as an art lithographer from October 2, 1945, until resigning to take his present job. His wife is unemployed. When he resided in New York City, he was connected with Green Brodie, Inc., 485 Madison Avenue, New York City. He left New York City in August, 1941.

Reference is made to a lead for the Washington Field Office to identify JAMES C. and DOROTHY R. VILSON of 1026 16th Street, N. W., or 3726 Connecticut Avenue, N. W., who loaned their car to friends of the WHEELERS when the friends visited the WHEELERS in Washington, D. C. The records of the Credit Bureau showed JAMES C. and DOROTHY R. WILSON as edding at 3726 Connecticut Avenue, Washington, D. C. JAMES C. was born 1915. He is white, married, and has no children. He formerly lived in Massachusetts, on March 15, 1943, and he resided in Boston, Massachusetts, on January 22, 1943. He formerly resided at 3814 T Street, N. W., with his parents Mr. and Mrs. GEORGE B-ROTH; in Cuincy, Massachusetts, he resided at 64 President's Lane.

DOROTHY R. VILSON is a graduate of the University of Michigan; she is unemployed. JAMES C. is employed in the U. S. Department of Justice as a special attorney, Anti-Trust Division, where he has been located since December, 1942. He formerly was employed in the Department of Justice at Boston as secretary to Mr. LAWRENCE PROCTOR. He was a lieutenant (j.g.), USNR, and entered the naval service in August, 1942. He is in an inactive status now.
