

The above headings are used for simplicity's sake, as investigation conducted by the Cleveland Field Division regarding this matter has been requested by different field divisions in leads set forth by letters, teletypes, and reports.

ARNOID ENDELMAN

In the above-mentioned referenced report investigation was requested to ascertain all available information at Niles, Ohio concerning ARNOID ENDELMAN.

At Niles, Ohio:

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent WIILIAM BROE:

Miss BETTY CROW, Niles Credit Bureau, made available the record of ARNOLD ENDELMAN, which record was very sketchy in detail. The record reflected that ENDELMAN purchased Lippy's Dress Shop from DANIEL LIPPY and changed the name of the establishment to Bruce's Dress Shop. Mr. A. B. CAMPFIEID, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer of the Niles Banking Company, advised that his bank had started business with ARNOLD ENDEMAN in 1942, at which time he had purchased the Lippy Dress Shop. He extend that the bank had made no effort to obtain any background information stated that the bank had made no effort to obtain any background information in regard to ENDELMAN due to the fact that he opened an account in that bank in reflected that he could adequately conduct his business in a sound which reflected that he could adequately conduct his business in a sound financial manner. He stated that the bank had had no financial difficulties with ENDELLAN, but that he was of a temperament that made business transactions difficult.

CALTFIELD advised that as far as he could personally ascertain, ENDELMAN accompanied by his wife, REUCHA ENDELMAN, and daughter, ANNA MARIE ENDELMAN, had left Poland and journeyed to France and then to the United States. He stated that ENDELMAN had told him that he had a son in a concentration camp in Europe, but he had not stated in what country he was being held. He stated that ENDELMAN on coming to Niles, Ohio had taken up residence at 117 Hyde Avenue and had not associated with any of the town people. He advised that after ENDELMAN had been in Niles a short time he went to California for a period and in 1945 he moved out there permanently.

He stated that ENDELMAN has a checking account with the Niles Banking Company but he has at no time ever transacted any foreign business through that bank. The Bruce Dress Shop is managed at the present time by Mrs. HELEN DAVIS, who was connected with the shop when it was Lippy's Dress Shop.

CAMPFIEID advised that nothing in the records of his bank showed any connection between ARNOLD ENDELMAN and MICHAEL ENDELMAN or M. N. DELMAN.

Mr. DUDIEY SMITH, Postmaster, Niles, Ohio, stated that according to the records of the Niles Post Office, ARNOLD L. ENDELMAN began to receive mail on September 26, 1942, and that the records do not indicate a change of address. He advised that all mail coming for the ENDELMAN family is still delivered to the Bruce Dress Shop. SLITH could only furnish information of a general nature concerning ENDELMAN, all of which has been previously set forth in Bureau reports. He did advise that the ENDELMAN family seemed to associate with no one in Niles and were not well thought of by the merchants or customers of their dress shop. He advised that he has no indication that ENDELMAN has received any foreign mail at any time since he had been receiving mail in Niles.

Mr. DANIEI/AMPPY, 21 Summit Avenue, Niles, Ohio, advised that in 1942 he desired to sell one of his dress shops and that he advertised it in a trade magazine. He stated that AENOLD ENDELMAN contacted him and eventually purchased the store. He stated that he has a low opinion of ENDELMAN because his business dealings with him were very bitter. He stated that ENDELMAN approached him as a refugee desiring to get started in the United States, and for this reason LIPPY made concessions in their original agreement. He advised that ENDELMAN then investigated and determined that LIPPY was being forced to sell the business, as his two brothers were being drafted into the Armed Forces. Then, at the time of final settlement, ENDELMAN ignored the favors done him by LIPPY and, changing from the original agreement, "drove a hard bargain." He stated that ENDELMAN paid him \$9,000 for the business, \$4,000 in cash and the remainder in notes. He stated that ENDELMAN was able to pay off the balance in a short period of time. LIPPY

advised that upon the original contact ENDELMAN had given him to understand that he was not too financially sound, but that he, LIPPY, had subsequently ascertained that ENDELMAN had considerable funds at his disposal. He stated that he learned that ENDELMAN brought a Buick automobile with him from France to the United States. He also stated that he was advised by a jeweler friend of his that Mrs. ENDELMAN was in possession of some very valuable jewelry and that she had brought a string of pearls to this jeweler to be repaired that he valued at several thousand dollars.

LIPPY stated that in regard to their background he had little specific information. ENDELMAN had advised him that he was forced to leave Poland and he had gone to France, leaving his son in a concentration camp LIPPY stated that he subsequently ascertained that the son had been released from the concentration camp and that ENDELLAN was attempting to have him admitted to the United States. He stated that prior to ENDELMAN's coming to Niles, Ohio, he had been engaged in the pocketbook business in New York. He stated that he only remained in Niles, Ohio approximately one year, when he moved to California, where he subsequently made his permanent residence. LIPPY advised that he has learned through "trade gossip" that ENDELMAN is attempting to sell the dress shop in Niles, Ohio. LIPPY stated that as further evidence that ENDELMAN has substantial funds is the fact he was able to move to California, set himself up in business, and build a home, after being in business in Niles, Ohio such a short time. He stated that he bases this on his knowledge concerning the profits that ENDELMAN could have made from the dress shop he had purchased from LIPPY. He advised that while in Niles, Ohio the ENDELMAN household had been made up of ENDELLIAN and his wife, BRUCHA ENDELMAN, and daughter, ANNA MARIE ENDELMAN, and that he knew of no one who had been with ENDELMAN in Niles, Ohio as MICHAEL ENDELMAN or M. N. DELMAN. He stated that he had ascertained that ENDELMAN's daughter had died after he had moved to California

LIPPY described ENDELMAN as being an "enigma." He stated that he liked to give the impression that he was slow in business matters when actually he was extremely shrewd. He gave the impression of not being well off financially but then does things that reflect he has extensive funds. He allows his wife to act as if she were handling all business matters but in the final analysis he makes all the decisions. He is continually probing into other persons private affairs but covers up his own former action in an air of mystery.

Chief CHARLES NICHOLAS, Niles Police Department, reviewed the records of his Department in regard to ARNOLD ENDELMAN with negative results. Chief NICHOLAS stated that he personally knew nothing whatsoever about the ENDELMAN Family.

Due to the position held by Mrs. HELEN DAVIS, it was not deemed advisable to contact her in connection with her employer, ARNOLD ENDELMAN.

At Cleveland, Ohio

By letter dated June 20, 1946 the Los Angeles Field Division advised this field division that ARNOID ENDELMAN had been operating in business in the United States under general license #42, which license is entitled "Certain Individuals Residing in United States on February 23, 1942 and Certain Corporations and Other Organizations - Generally Licensed Nationals. Filing of Reports on Form TFR-42." This form relates to the licensing of refugees under Treasury Department license in order that they may do business in the United States. The letter continued that from information developed in the investigation conducted by the Los Angeles Field. Division it was believed that the ENDELMANs came to the United States in 19/1. hence would be required to file the above form with an appropriate Federal Reserve Bank; Turther, it was believed that this form was probably filed by ENDELMAN with the Federal Reserve Bank at Cleveland. Ohio: therefore, it was requested that investigation be conducted to ascertain all pertinent information contained in Form TFR-42, if such form was filed by ENDELMAN in Cleveland, Ohio.

By letter dated July 2, 1946 the Cleveland Field Division advised the Washington Field Division (copy of which was sent to the Los Angeles Field Division) that Mr. A. H. LANNING, Vice-Pfesident, Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, advised Special Agent CARL A. HERRING (A) of this office that all forms of TFR-42 and TFR-300 filed by nationals with the Federal Reserve Bank at Cleveland were forwarded to the Foreign Funds Control, U. S. Treasury Department, Washington, D. C., and no record of the individuals filing such forms was maintained by the Federal Reserve Bank in Cleveland, Ohio. In view of the foregoing, it was requested that the Washington Field Division conduct the necessary inquiry at the U. S. Treasury Department, Washington, D. C.

It should be noted that by letter dated August 26, 1946 from the Washington Field Division to the Los Angeles Field Division, a copy of which was made available to this office, the above investigation had been conducted and all pertinent information contained in the Washington Field Division letter of August 26, 1946.

The files of the Cleveland Field Division reflect that one MARY MORENO had signed an election petition circulated on behalf of EDWARD JOSEPH CHAKA, Communist Party member who was a candidate for Councilman of the City of Cleveland in Ward 13 of the Independent Ticket in the Municipal election of September, 1943. It should be noted that there was nothing on the petition to indicate to the signer that CHAKA was connected with the Communist Party.



The Cleveland indices are negative regarding BIRDINE BOWLAN and JANET NAUGLE.

The Gold-Tone Studios also list thirty-four persons as being employed as "coupon personnel." The names of these thirty-four persons are not being set forth in this report inasmuch as ill but two names have been searched with negative results. The two names of "coupon personnel" of the Gold-Tone Studios who have references in this office are J. P. PERNELL and GEORGE NICHOLS.

J. P. PERNELL, Route #5, Massillon, Ohio, appeared on a petition circulated on behalf of ARNOLD SALUEL COHNSON, Chairman, Communist Party of Ohio, who was a candidate for a member of the Board of Education in the City of Cleveland in the municipal elections of November, 1943 on the independent ticket. The nominating petition itself does not in any way indicate to anyone who signs it that JOHNSON is connected with the Communist Party.

By letter dated July 17, 1946 the Washington Field Office requested the Cleveland Field Office to ascertain the identity of and furnish avail background information on J. F. LINCOLN, Post Office Box 5758, Cleveland, Ohio, reporting that this individual is a correspondent of HARRY MACDOFF, a subject in this case.

The Post Office Inspector's cirice, New Post Office Building, Cleveland, Ohio, advised that Post Office Box 5758 was listed to the Lincoln Electric Company of Cleveland, Ohio. The writer examined the application of this particular post office box which was dated December 4, 1923, and was a continuance of post office box 683 of the Old Post Office Building, Cleveland, Ohio. This application was signed by J. W. ERIAN, Secretary, Lincoln Electric Company and as references there were set forth the Union Trust Company and wholesale hardware dealers. The Lincoln Electric Company was listed as manufacturers of electric motors and welders,

A search of the City Directory of Cleveland, Chiro for 1943-1944, reflected JAMES FXLINCOLN, 19715 North Park Boulevard, Shaker Heights, Chio, as being President and General Manager of the Lincoln Electric Company. The "Who's Who in America, Volume 23, 1944-1945", published by the A. N. MARQUIS Company, 919 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago 11, Illinois, reflects that JAMES FINNEY DINCOLN is a manufacturer, being born in Painesville, Ohio May 14, 1883, the son of WILLIAM ELLEBY and LOUISE (MARSHALL) L. He was a student at Ohio State University, 1902-1907, honorary E.E. 1926. He married ALICE PATTERSON April 29, 1908 and has the following children: ALICE MOSEPHINE (Mrs. JOSEPH H. CORRIS). FRANCES PATTERSON (Mrs. KENNETH STEINGASS), MARY MARAORIE (Mrs. ROBERT A. VILSON) and JAMES FINNEY LINCOLN. Mr. 'LINCOLN was disted as sales engineer for the Idncoln Electric Company, Cleveland, Ohio from 1907 to 1911; Vice President 1911 to 1928 and President since 1928; Vice President of the Lincoln Electric Company of Canada, member Governor's Committee on Unemployment Insurance, 1932. Member Republican National Finance Committee (Chairman for Ohio 1936, Vice Chairman 1940). President Cheveland Chamber of Commerce, May 1, 1942 to May 1, 1943; appointed to Board of Trustees, Ohio State University, February, 1943; Fellow of American Institute, E.E; American Society, M.E.; Ohio State University Alumni Association (President, 1927-1929); Sigma Alpha Epsilon; member of the Presbyterian Clubs, University, Mayfield Country, Pepper Pike Country (Club), Engineers (New York). Author of Political and Social brochures, and "Industrialist Looks at the New Deal", "Tell and truth and Keep out of the Way", "Ignorance of the Lew is No Defense", "You Can Employ the Idle", "Intelligent Selfishness and Manufacturing". Mr. LINCOLN's home was listed as 19715 North Park Boulevard, office The Idncoln Electric Company, Cleveland, Chio.

The Business Executives and Corporation Encyclopedia, 1944, published by the Institute for Research, Inc., 296 Broadway, New York, 7, New York, set forth, in addition to the above, that JAMES FINNEY LINCOLN, was also Vice President and Director of the Lincoln Electric Company of Canada, Itd., Managing Director of the Lincoln Electric Company, Itd. of England and Director of the Lincoln Electric (Australia) Pty. Itd. Further, that during the first World War he was a member of the Emergency Fleet Corporation, also he is trustee of the Onlo Manufacturing Association and Director of the National Association of Manufacturers.

Mr. LINCOLN has had more than 20 patents issued to him covering charging systems for storage batteries, electric switch, end frame ring for motors and welding apparatus and other patents. He is a member of the Executive Committee of the American Welding Society and a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, Cleveland and also of the Engineering Society; a Fellow of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers; Director of the Cleveland Chamber of Commerce and Director — Member of the City Club, Cleveland.

It should be noted that Lincoln Electric Company, Cleveland, Chio, is presently the subject of a renegotiation act case which is pending in this office (46-517). A history of the company, as set forth in the report of Special Agent CAML A. HERRING, dated November 21, 1944 at Cleveland, Ohio, reflects that originally the company was engaged primarily in the manufacture of electric motors but in more recent years its principal business has been the manufacture and sale of electric arc welding equipment and electrodes. The company manufactures the following products:

- 1 Arc welding motor generators powered by electric gasoline and diesel motors.
- 2 Arc welding generators without motive power.
- 3 Welding electrodes of various types.
- 4 Arc welding accessories.

In addition to the foregoing items, which it manufacturers, the company, to a limited extent, sells are welding accessories manufactured by others. The company's market covers the entire United States and it maintains approximately 35 branch sales offices located in principal cities. 





Among the contributors to this book are the World Jewish Congress; Jewish Anti-Fascist Committee, USSR; Vaad Leumi, Palestine; and the American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists, and Scientists. It is known that URSULA WASSERMAN, a subject of the Gregory case, has been interested in this publication, and according to a letter written by PHILIP FENEY to his wife MARY JANE (also sub jects), PHILIP KEINEY after a visit with URSULA WASSERMAN wrote the P Drain following on November 14, 1945: "Black Book is being held up by Moscow; i.e., no green light to publish. HAPPEP MUCHES, Superintendent of Mails, Phoemix, Arisona, advised that the American Institute for Foreign Trade had recently rented Post Office Box 191 at the Phoenix Post Office. Mr. HUGHES was requested to furnished to the Phoenix Field Division a record of all mail passing through the office for INES ESPERANZA KUNDZ.

At the American Institute for Foreign Trade, Thunderbird Field, the writer interviewed BARTON K. YOUNT, President of the school. He advised that during World War II he was in charge of all aircorps training for the U. S. army; that he is presently retired. He was discreetly questioned concerning MUNOZ and stated that Dr. MARJORIE C. JOHNSTON, Professor of Spanish Language for this school, was previously employed as a consultant in Latin-American Languages in the U. S. Office of Education; that Miss JOHNSTON was looking around for a well grounded instructor in Spanish and MUNOZ was recommended to her by someone in Washington. It was through Miss JOHNSTON that MUNOZ was employed, and she arrived at the school during the latter part of September, 1946. General YOUNT through casual inquiry among the students had learned that MUNOZ is well educated and a good instructor in Spanish. He expressed the opinion that she is doing a very fine job as a Spanish instructor. General YOUNG further stated that MUNOZ resides at the school, which is located at Thunderbird Field, a former aircorps training field located about twelve miles north of Phoenix. MUNOZ has a room and adjoining In so far as known to General YOUNT bath with the librarian, Mrs. BURGER. at the time of the interview, MUNOZ's associates had been confined to personnel of the school, no more definite information being available due to the shortness of the time that MUNOZ has been connected with the school. General YOUNT advised that in connection with his work, he will make discreet inquiries in an endeavor to determine with whom MUNOZ is most closely associated He also promised to advise the Phoenix Division concerning any telephone or telegram communications received at the school for MUNOZ, as well as information concerning any strangers who may ettempt to contact MUNOZ at that place.

Although General YOUNT was not informed of the nature of the inquiry, he advised during the interview that Dr. WILLIAM L. SCHURZ, Director of the Division of Language and Area Studies at the school, is well acquainted with and has written a book on Communistic trends in Latin-America; that the school will teach a course showing the strong communistic trend and will study the politics, history and religion of the people of Latin-America.

General YOUNT furnished a list of the faculty members which contains the following information concerning INES MUNOZ:

"Instructor in Spanish. Certificate from private Autors (Province of Matanzas, Cuba, 1898); Tutor in Spanish, Cuba, Philadelphia, Washington, D. C., 1898-1907, 1938-46; Importer from Spain, 1919-28; Directorof Peasant Industries in Spain, 1928-36; Translator for Spanish Republican Committees in New York, 1936-40; Translator for "The Hemisphere" Corporation, 1940-41; Information Analyst. Office of Inter-American Affairs, 1942-46.

ESPIONAGE -(Nathan Gregory Silvermaster)

I thought you would be interested in the following items which appeared in the log covering the technical surveillance on the Silvermaster sidence on December 9, and 11, 1946.

On December 9, 1946, Sam Moment was in contact with Silvermester and Moment wanted to know if Silvermaster would be in town for a little while longer, to which Silvermaster replied that he would be and that he expects to remain in Washington. Moment stated that he and others, names not mentioned, are getting up two reports within the next week or so and they planned to make some very strong statements about incompetence in the War Assets Administration and one comment will deal with the loss by resignation or dismissal of men who have demonstrated their competence. Moment said that he wanted to check with Silvermaster to find out what names should be used. Moment said he wanted to mention that those persons have demonstrated their competence and their dismissal or resignation was the result of arbitrary action by the Administrator.

The two men then discussed a few names. One of them was Scott Donaldson. Mr. Silvermaster said that he was fired because of an arbitrary thing, meaning Donaldson. Silvermaster said that the "General", probably referring to General Little john, came in and he wanted someone else to head up the "Veterans". Silvermaster said it was a surprise to Donaldson and everyone else.

Moment said that they were going to mention Silvermaster and also Frank Creeden. Silvermaster said that Creeden was fired because he fought the "site" sales. Silvermaster said that Bill Lahman (Lehman) was forced out. He had been fired once for a minor issue and then was reinstated and thereafter resigned. Silvermaster said he couldn't think of any other names off hand but that he would furnish Moment with some names later on as he was going down ! the office at that time.

The two men then discussed General Little john and Sam Mohent commented that he understood that the General gave orders like a top sergeant and that he was pretty rough at times. Silvermaster agreed. Moment said that he issues orders without securing adequate information for basing decisions. Silvermaster said that all of the General's behavior was characterized by extreme arbitrarines and reckless abuse of administrative power. Moment said that they would use that language in their statement.

COPIES DESTROYED 1//3/

On December 11, 1946, Mrs. Silvermaster in a conversation with her friend Willie McAvoy stated that now that Mr. Silvermaster has left the War Assets Administration they are "burning the wires" trying to get him back on a consultant basis at \$40.00 a day. She said that Silvermaster said he thought maybe he had better go back but she told him not to. She said that she kept it a secret from her husband that War Assets had called him three times the previous day while Silvermaster was downtown seeing someone. She said that she would hate to see her husband go back to WarrAssets at even a hundred dollars a day and that they ought to "just stew in their own juice". She said that she told her husband that should have resigned the first of June when he knew that it was a hopeless situation. She said that Silvermaster stated that he had to help them because after all he had 60 of his own people down there and they are suffering.

ACTION:

It is suggested that you may desire to furnish the above information to either Mr. Carroll or Mr. Laughlin at the War Assets Administration for their information and any action they desire necessary. The technical logs covering this conversation are attached hereto.

You directed that informant GREGORY be interviewed for all details regarding this funeral and the persons who attended it. Informant GREGORY has previously been interviewed concerning this funeral and the attendance of RISLER at the funeral. She was also shown a photograph of Eisler. In this connection she stated that she had never heard of Eisler or Hans Gerger before the current publicity and was not able to recognize a photograph of him. Further, she was not able to recall specifically the persons who were in attendance stating that it was a Jewish funeral and that she sat in the back of the hall. However, she will be reinterviewed regarding this matter in the immediate future at which time another photograph of EISLER will be exhibited to her and she will be pressed for possible further details. If she is able to recall anything further an effort will be made to refresh Budenz' memory regarding the funeral. Relative to the above, attention is drawn to the letter to the Director dated November 26, 1943 in the case entitled JACOB N. GOLOS, Internal Security-C which sets forth the following. 

On December 26th, Mr. Yanech advised me that the ttorney General had instructed him, Vanech, to furnish to Mr. Ed Foley, General Counsel of the Treasury Department, the facts in the Gregory Case with reference to Subject Perlo. by the Treasury Department. I told Mr. Vanech that the Director had addressed to the Attorney General a memorandum protesting against the release of any information in this case unless and until the Department had reached a decision as to the possibility of criminal prosecution. I told Mr. Vanech that the Bureau believed, as outlined in its memorandum to the Attorney General, that the dissemination of information concerning the subjects in this case to the employing departments would result in publicity and leaks of information on such a scale that further investigation of the case would be impossible. I told Mr. Vanech that I thought he should have this information concerning the Bureau's position in the case in the light of the Attorney General's instructions. Mr. Vanech stated that he, of course, would have to carry out the Attorney General's instructions but in order to safeguard the Bureau's interests, he would appreciate having Mr. Ladd participate in his conference with Mr. Foley. I'told Mr. Vanech that the Bureau would absolutely not authorize Mr. Ladd, or any other Bureau representative, to participate in a meeting of this kind. Mr. NO. HO Vanech indicated that he would probably have Mr Camar Caudle DES some other representative of the Criminal Diviston, participate with him in his conference with Mr. Foley. 1.5- 56402-1

On December 27th Mr. Vanech advised me that he had conferred on that day with Mr. Foley and had furnished him generally with?? the facts with reference to Perlo and other employees of the Treasury Department mentioned in the summary report prepared on the Gregory Case. Kr. Vanech stated that just prior to the time he undertook his conference with Mr. Foley, the Attorney General contacted him telephonically to advise him that he had received a memorandum from the Director protesting against the furnishing of any information concerning the subjects in the Gregory Case to the employing departments. The Attorney General told Mr. Vanech that in the light of the Director's protest, the Department would not give out any more copies of the summary report in the Gregory Case but that Mr. Vanech should erally furnish to Mr. Foley the facts with reference to Perlo and the other employees of the Treasury Department. Mr. Vanech, having Mr. Caudle with him at the conference, furnished Foley in the course of a two-hour conference with the facts relative to the activities of Perlo and other Treasury Department employees named in the Gregory summary. Foley gave no indication as to what action the Treasury Department would want on since on January 1st noted that Perle is due to resign from the Treasury on January 1st action the Treasury Department would take in this situation, it being





Mr. Lamar Caudle telephoned with reference to the Gregory Case. He stated that he had sent Mr. McInerney of his department to New York on another matter and in connection therewith he desired to be advised whether it would be possible for MoInerney to interview the original informant. You will recall that we have gone to great steps to protect the identity of the original informant in this case. I told Mr. Caudle that the Bureau was very apprehensive as to the life of this informant since the informant would probably be killed if his identity were inadvertently disclosed. I inquired of Mr. Caudle since the Bureau had furnished a copy of the informant's statement and a summary of all of the facts in this case as to why it was necessary to interview the informant. Mr. Caudle, at some length, explained that the facts in the case were such that it was merely the informant's word against the word of the potential defendants and that it would be necessary, before reaching a decision, to "evaluate" the informant as to his impressiveness, his ability to testify clearly, concisely, accurately, etc. I told Mr. Caudle that I did not know how you would react to this request but that it would be brought to your st BTX DESK attention.

Mr. Caudle also inquired as to the status of the case, that is, as to whether the Bureau's investigation was complete. I told Mr. Caudle that no decision could be made as to whether the investigation was complete until the Department decided what action was going to be taken upon it.

I think the Criminal Division is trying to squirm put of making a decision as to prosecution. It is essential that some decision be made in the Department about the base because we cannot go on and on in the present manner. If the Bureau refuses to permit an interview with the original informant, this will probably be the basis for the Criminal Division's declining to make any positive finding. While we can argue against this, I think within the family we have to concede that there is some merit to a prosecutor's desiring to evaluate the impressiveness, etc., of a witness, particularly in a case of this kind where this witness is, in reality, the entire government's case. I recommend, consequently, that we first contact the informant in New York, explain the official capacity and identity of the Criminal Division representative and determine from the informant whether an interview is satisfactory. If the informant, declines to be interviewed, our statement to the Department







The University of Michigan Directory for 1946-1947 discloses that IRVING A. LEONARD is Professor of Spanish-American literature and Chairman of the Department of Romance Languages and Literatures. His Office is 112 Romance Language Building, University of Michigan and his residence address is 1328 Forest Court, Ann Arbor, Michigan. His residence telephone is listed as Ann Arbor 2-6379.

A review of the Michigan Alumni Volume 19, Page 87, for October 31, 1942 set out in an article that one of the hewest additions to the University faculty staff is Dr. IRVING A. LEONARD, Professor of Spanish, who came to the University of Michigan during the first term of 1942 from Brown University. This article fruther disclosed that LEONARD is a graduate of Yale University with an AB degree and holds a Master of Arts degree and Dr. of Philosophy degree from the University of California; LEONARD served as assistant director of humanities at the Rockefeller Foundation from 1937-1940 and was chairman of activities in the Latin-American field. He traveled extensively through Latin-America, Mexico and the Caribbean area and he took an active part at the Lims Conference in 1938-1939. Upon leaving the Foundation Dr. LEONARD joined the faculty of Brown University as Professor of Hispanic Civilization and served there from the fall of 1940 until January, 1942 when he took a leave of absence.


A review of the Michigan Alumni Volume 45, Page 294 for February 6, 1943 disclosed that Professor LEONARD was on the University Committee on Latin-American relations, an organization set up by the President of the University, ALEXANDER G. RUTHVEN, for the promoting and operating of the University of Michigan Program for Closer Cultural and Educational contacts with the countries and territories to the south of the United States.

a review of the Directory of American scholars, a biographical directory for 1942 discloses that Professor IRVING ALBERT LEONARD was born December 1, 1896 at New Haven, Connecticut. He received his Master of Philosophy degree from Yale University in 1918, his Master of Arts degree from the University of California in 1925 and Doctor of Philosophy in 1928 from the University of California. This directory further sets out that LEONARD was a professor in the Philippine Islands from 1921-1922; a teacher in the High School at Petaluma, California, teaching Spanish, for the school year 1922-1923. IEONARD was an assistant professor from 1923-1937 at the University of California and from 1937-1940 he was assistant director of humanities at the Rockefeller Foundation. IEONARD was made a professor of Hispanic Civilization at Brown University in 1940.







Reference is made to the report of Special Agent BYRON E. McFALL dated November 15, 1946 at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Reference is also made to the report of Special Agent FRANK J. NOLAN dated October 17, 1946 at New York City.

In the latter report in the last paragraph on page twenty-four, attention is called to the fact that one NICK, probably a good friend of MAURICE TALFERIN, was now ready to resign as Dean of the School of Religion. It is noted that the first referenced report did not clarify the identity of NICK but it-should be noted that that individual indentical with E. NICHOLAS COMFORT, commonly known as REV. NICK COMFORT, former Dean the School of Religion at Morman, Oklahoma. This school is not Pert of the University of Oklahoma but credit is given to University students for courses taken in the School of Religion. A separate file is maintained in the Oklahoma City Field Office on E. NICHOLAS COMFORT which shows that he is not a member of the Communist Party but is considered a good friend of the Party and an old standby in Norman, Oklahoma. He was a pacifist prior to the last World War and is vitally interested in work concerning racial discrimination. He is known to have attended only one Communist Party meeting at Tulsa, Oklahoma but did considerable work to formulate public opinion against the criminal syndicalism trials held in Oklahoma City.

More pertinent information concerning COMFORT is available in the files of the Bureau.



I advised Mr. Scheidt that as the interviews with the informant have been previously held in the New York Office, that it would be agreeable to make a conference room available to Mr. McInerney for the purpose of interviewing the informant. I further advised him, however, that no Agent should be present during the interview. I instructed him to notify the Bureau of developments as soon as he had contacted the informant and obtained her answer. He stated that Mr. McInerney had telephoned from New York and had talked to Peyton Ford who had talked to The Attorney General who had talked to Mr. Vanech about the desire of the Criminal Division to interview the original informant. I told Mr. Vanech that Mr. Caudle had called about this situation and that I would advise him as soon as possible if arrangements could be made for such an interview with the informant. Upon your indication of your approval of the proposal that the decision fundamentally be made by the informant, I contacted Mr. Vanech and told him that you had instructed that the informant be contacted and, if the informant agreed, arrangements be made for an interview by McInerney with McInerney definitely understanding that he and the Department accepted full responsibility for any possible leak resulting from this interview. I also called Mr. Lamar Caudle and advised him that you had instructed the New York Office to contact the informant, determine if the informant would agree to an interview and, if so, to make it possible for Mr. McInerney to interview the informant with the strict understanding that Mr. McInerney and the Department accepted the full responsibility for any leak or other difficulty resulting from this interview. For the information and assistance of the Mashington and New York Field Divisions a copy of the summary in this case dated October 21, 1966, has been made available to the Criminal Division of the Department and as a result the Department has requested that certain information be developed in summertion with this case to assist in determining if procedution is warranted.

In connection therewith the Criminal Division has proposeded numerous questions which will be set out bereinsfer in numbered paragraphs. The New York and Washington Field Divisions in replying to this communication should relate specifically to the paragraphs of this letter by number in order to facilitate the making available to the Department the answers to its inquiries.

It is realized that it will be mecessary for the Washington Field Division to cause a review to be made of personnel files in certain governmental agencies where subjects are presently employed or where they have been employed in the past. If it is felt impossible to discreetly obtain the desired information from the files where the employee is now employed this fact should be brought to the Eureau's attention and no further effort should be made. It is believed that the New York Field Division can obtain the desired information through a reinterview with informant Gregory.

- (1) The Department has pointed out that a criminal prosecution would, as a practical matter, be out of the question without the testimony of informant Gregory. Oregory should be interviewed in order to determine if she is willing to be available as a witness in connection with a possible prosecution of the persons involved in this case.

- (2) The New York Field Division should advise whether Oregory would be a willing or reluctant witness; whether there are any known factors which would adversely effect her usofulness or reliability as a witness; such as a known criminal record, her general appearance, social and seral background, addiction to alcohol or marcotice, mental and nervous stability or lack of it, etc., and, in particular, whether she bases a williamers to testify on any condition to be performed by the government, keeping in mind that she will have to be made as a defendant or seconspirator in the indistance.
- (3) In the event that prosecution is decided upon, the Department will, within a reasonable time, request an opportunity to interview Gregory so that a final judgment can be made as to her usefulness as a key witness. This 19

- (h) The Department desires to know what investigative possibilities still remain in this case (except swidence and statements obtained incident to an arrest) which would serve to furnish evidence in substantiation of the informant's marrative. The Mew York and Washington Field Divisions should seriously consider any outstanding investigative possibilities and subsit any suggestions concerning future investigations.
- (5) Gregory should be questioned relative to any notes that she may have in her possession concerning the reported activities of subjects and also if she has any documents in her possession or if such documents are available any where else which can be used as exhibits.
- (6) It should be determined from Oregory if there is in existence to her knowledge any relative, friend or other person (other than subjects) with whom Oolog or Gregory may have shared the trust imposed in them which might furnish even incidental corroboration of an evidenciary character concerning the reported meetings, travel and other activities of subjects.
- Jacob Color when he was secretary of World Tourists, Inc., in New York City and furnish the names of any Bureau agents who participated in surveillances of Golos in 1941, particularly if those agents observed anything of significance to the investigation in the Gregory case. Hence of Agents who participated in surveillances of Gregory during the same period and who observed anything participated likewise be made available to the Bureau.
- (8) In connection with the same file review, the New York Field Division should review any mail covers which were placed on Goles for possible proof of a corroborative nature as to the activities reported by the informant.
- (9) The Department has pointed out that the summary in this case contains numerous references to travel performed by subjects to New York for the purpose of attending meetings. It is suggested that an examination be made at the earliest practical moment of the leave and travel records of the particular employees in question at the agencies where they were employed during the pertiperiod. This examination will substantiate their absence from their employment on the dates mentioned by Gregory. The Eashington Field Division should review its copy of the Gregory summary dated October 21, 1966, and in such instances where it was specifically mentioned that individuals traveled to New York City for meetings the leave records of the agencies where they were then employed should be checked to substantiate their absences from work.

- (10) The Washington Field Mivision should determine when Schloser Adler entered the government service and where he has served, except in China, since his entry upon duty.
- (11) The Washington Field Division should ascertain the exact dates that Virginius Frank Cos commenced his government service subsequent to 1540, also when he became secretary of the International Mometary Fund.


the following observation made by the Department concerning statements made by her as set out in the summary memorandum, "It has 'm noticed in your memorandum of October 21, 1966, that in some instances Oregory is indefinite as to time and place of meetings, and in some cases in description of information furnished. Examples of this will be found in the allegations concerning Allan Robert Donald Miven wheeler, Joseph B. Orego, Maurice Halperin, J. Julius Joseph, Personal Bidney Product and others. While it is realized that in many instances it will be difficult or impossible for Gregory to remember such details when the transaction occurred several years ago, it is believed that even approximate dates and allegations would facilitate corroboration. In describing the information furnished by early the exact information or documents furnished as nearly as possible rather than describing the type of information furnished."

It is desired that the above observation be brought to the attention of Gregory and that an effort be made to further elaborate on her statements concerning various events as contained in her original signed statement.

The numerous questions set out hereinbefore were made by the Department through a review of the survery dated October 21, 1946, and the Mashington and New York Field Divisions can refer to its copy of the survery in order to locate the questionable data referred to above.

In view of the Department's extreme interest in the possible prosecution of this case I cannot too strongly impress upon you the desirability of this matter receiving prompt attention.

In the event that information is readily available or obtainable, it is desired that the Bureau be furnished with this information by letter immediately referring to specific paragraphs by number in this communication and other information, which will be forth coming, can be reported in subsequent letters. It is further desired that this project be completed and made available to the Bureau within fifteen days after receipt of this letter in your respective Field Divisions.

Investigation in the Gregory Case has reflected that Wood is a known contact of Robert Talbott Miller, III, Joseph B. Gregg, and possibly others. Photographs of Minter Wood and Julia Dorn Heiman are in the possession of the New York Office as set out in the report of Special Agent John A. Morrison dated March 16, 1945, at New York. The State Department has requested the Bureau to establish whether Gregory knows Minter Wood and if so what the relationship of Gregory was with him. Also, what information can Gregory relate relative to Communist Party or Soviet espionage activity connections with Minter Wood. Gregory should be shown the photograph of Julia Dorn Heiman, former wife of Minter Wood, for the purpose of possible identification. Any information which the informant has concerning her should be made available to the Bureau. If either or both of these individuals are known to Gregory, it should be established whether Gregory ever attended Communist Party meetings, study groups, or other meetings concerned with Communist Party activities with them. It is desired to be known if Gregory knew of, participated in, or helped organize any methods or techniques for the collection of material or information of any type from the Department of State. It is also desired to be known if Gregory can furnish details of the types of information desired, instruction issued for obtaining same, and any information concerning the distribution or dissemination of material obtained to Soviet agents.

Gregory should be questioned concerning her knowledge of individuals within the State Department (other than those mentioned hereinbefore) who were regarded as being "Sympathetic," "reasonable," or "favorable" to Soviet activities or the Soviet viewpoint.

Gregory should be asked if she knew of any individuals within the State Department who were regarded by the Party or the directors of Soviet espionage activities as persons, who in the event of trouble could be relied upon to furnish protection to or assist individuals acting in Soviet espionage interests. It is desired that you ascertain whether, in the general collection of material or information from persons within the Department of State, there was an established procedure of collection or transmission described as an organized system, or was this conducted on an individual basis. Details of any system in existence should be farmished. The Attorney General stated that he recalled your suggestion that if this case was to be prosecuted, the services of a very capable lawyer be obtained and he wondered whether you had any further observations about Mr. McInerney's recommendation. I told Mr. Clark you had talked to me about this case this morning and that you believed that before prosecution was undertaken, all of the factors should be very carefully-weighed to insure that the case did not collapse and become another Jaffe case. I told the Attorney General that you were of the opinion that the Department could not afford to lose this case and should not go into it unless the Department was convinced beyond perchance of a reasonable doubt that the prosecution would be successful. Ur. Clark stated that he agreed with your viewpoint and I pointed out fundamentally the entire case hangs by the thread of the testimony of a single witness. I told Mr. Clark that you had suggested that if the Department was inclined to initiate prosent cution of the case at this time, a conference be held at which the Bureau might be represented, in order that all possibilities in the case might be explored. The Attorney General indicated he thought this was an excellent idea and that he would instruct Mr. Caudle to call such a conference. 


