





On December 2, 1946, the Washington Field Office received the following quoted information from the Philadelphia Field Division concerning SUSAN BROWN LL-COLLING, JR.

"SUSAN BEOLIELF/ANTHONY, II - writer, specialist womanpower problems. Born Easton, Pennsylvania, July 26, 1916, daughter of LUTHER BUT and CHARLOTTE AGES (SUTHERLAND) ANTHONY. B.A. degree (distinction and nigh honors) in field of cencentration, political science, College for omen, University of Acchester, 1938; H.A. degree (political science) American Univ. Mashington, D.C., 1941.

"Married HEMMY HILL COLLINS, JR., June 25, 1940. One step-son, JOHN LNDICOTT. Feature writer and college correspondent, mochester 'DHOCRAT' AND CHROHICLE,' 1935-1936; feature writer, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. 'DLILY NEWS,' 1937; Press Dept. Asst. National Youth dministration, 1938-1939; Research Project Director, momens Centennial Congress, September-October-Nov., 1940. General assignment reporter and Special riter on Mursery Schools for mashington, D.C., 'IVENING STALL' from May, 1942 until June, 1943.

"Morked in womens organizations, unions, and auxiliaries to unions for reforms such as nursery schools and other facilities to care for children of working mothers. Active speaker and writer against so-called "Equal Rights Amendment"; specialized in studying and writing about the status of American women and what can be done to carry forward the fight started by her late great-aunu, SUSAN P. LITHONY.

"Lectured to youth and peace groups on a three-month trip to Europe in 1936. Awarded the DUS/K B. ANTHONY Scholarship; Townsend Fellowship for graduate work. (tuition scholarship at Rochester University). Member of American Newspaper Guild - CLU. Clubs: Social Register; Democrat. uthor of 'Out of the Kitchen Into the War' and contributing author and writer on women to journals and magazines. Home: White Plains, Lanham, Ed."

"A news article and photograph of SUSIN B. THONY, II, which appeared in the September 1, 1944, issue of the 'Philadelphia Record' is maintained in her file. The article states that she learned at first hand that women can do a man's work when she took a job for several months as a grinder in the all women machine shop at the ashington Navy Yard, working on all three shifts. The gist of the article is that the collins (SUSAN 3. ANTHONY, II) feels that the end of the war will also mark a turning point in women's road to full equality. In addition, this article refers to her mother, i.rs. CHALOTTE ANTHONY HETFORD, who worked in a war plant manufacturing racar in Easton, Pennsylvania, and learned that life began all over again at fifty six.



Through inquiry, it was ascertained that SUSAN 3. ANTHONY II of hite Pines, Lanham, Haryland was registered in Room 837 of the Bellevue Stratford Hotel. It was further ascertained that reservation was made for hiss ANTHONY by secretary for IILIA THEFEY. Therew was employed in the office of James P. Clark, Democratic City Committeeman for the City of Philadelphia.

"In connection with the investigation entitled 'Display of Russian Film, Philadelphia Field Division - Registration Act' It was ascertained that ACT-KINO, the Russian film distributing agency in New York City, distributes its films in Pennsylvania through one J. ACELOW of Philadelphia. It was also ascertained that J. J.SLCW obtained the approval of the Pennsylvania State Board of Censors for all Russian film through the ACELAPK FILM AGENCY, 1225 Vine Street, Philadelphia, which agency at the time was owned and operated by JAMES T. CLARK. It was further learned that CLARK also owns. HIGHMAY EXPRESS CO., INC., which transports the Russian film from New York to Philadelphia and other points in Pennsylvania. In addition, it was determined that JASLOW maintained desk space in CLARK'S agency.

"In view of the foregoing, inquiries were made concerning the activities of liss ANTHONY in May, 1945, at which time it was believed that she was employed by the N. M. AYAR & SONS, IMC., an advertising concern in Philadelphia.

"GEORGE CECIL, head of the Copy Department in the AYEP COMPANY, advised that Hiss ANTHONY had not been in the employ of the H. J. AYER COMPANY but that she had used the office space there during June and July, 1944, while working on a project for Bryn Lawr College relating to women's problems in war time. According to Er. CLCIL, her task was to consolidate data which had appeared in numerous magazine articles and to make it available to the college for a proposed article on women in war time to be featured in the 'Ladies Home Journal' magazine. He recalled that subject college. Mr. CLCIL did not know anything concerning Hiss ANTHONY'S outside Democratic Lomen's Committee and that she was vitally interested in the care of children during the national emergency.

"Mrs. IARCELIA SCH IDT of the above Copy Department stated that

"Hiss ANTHONY was working on the project at the company for Eryn Mawr College under the supervision of HILDRED ANTHONY except that hiss ANTHONY was politically active for the Democratic Lomen's Committee while at the company.

"EDWARD GANES, assistant postmaster, Bryn Lawr, Pennsylvania, advised that Riss ANTHONY had resided in Bryn Hawr during the summer of 1944 at the home of HENRY HILL COLLIES, SR. He stated that in September 1944 she moved to the St. James Hotel in Philadelphia.

"ROBERT J. CHAPIN of the St. James Hotel, Fennsylvania, advised that subject had resided at the hotel from September 24, 1944 to December 7, and that she had then moved to 343 South 16th Street in Philadelphia.

"FELIX TURNER, Office of the Superintendent of Hails, 30th Street Post Office, Philadelphia, advised that Hiss ANTHONY had resided at 343 South 18th Street, until February 23, 1945, at which time she moved and furnished a forwarding address of 15 East 12th Street, New York City.

"During the Fall of 1945, Mrs. FR. NILTH DILANO ROOSLVELT made an arrangement with the National Citizens! Political Action Committee to make a series of eight speeches throughout the various cities in the United States at dinners to be sponsored by the State P.C's. —uch a dinner was scheduled in Philadelphia for October 25, 1945. EUGE E POLLICK of the National Citizens! PAC was sent to Philadelphia to handle the arrangements for this dinner. In the middle of September 1945, POLLICK contacted MADELINE PLITZSTEIN, a well known Communist in Philadelphia, to secure her assistance in arranging the dinner.



On December 3, 1946, EDITH MAIL contacted MARY JAME INJUST stating that her husband, DAVD, was free Saturday night. They will arrive for dinner about 9:00 and will pick up the PHIL DUMMAIS and bring them along. MARY JAME mentioned that the BET ALVILLS were also coming in time for dinner.

On December 5, 1946, LARY JANE HELPEN contacted LILLIAN CONTACTAL, to-inquire whether PHILLIP was back. LILLIAN replied that he had returned this morning. MANN JANE advised that she was having the AMES and the ALPIRS in for Saturday evening and would like to have them also. This invitation was accepted.

On December 6, 1946, MARY JAME MINITY contacted PHILIP DUMANAY to advise that ETHER-ALTER and JUDY VALL are ill and suggested that it may be better for MARY JAME and AMBUS to come by and pick up the LUMANAYS and then go to the MAMIS.

Cn December 7, 1946, AMGUS MILIEM contacted MINITH MANIE to state that he would be out tonight at 8:30. He advised that they will pick up the DUMANAS

Cn December 8, 1945, FART JANE MILLIET contacted BITTER and said that the more she thinks about it the more overjoyed she is over his levelopments. She said further that she spoke with the DUMAMAYS last night and that they are going to have an apartment but it will be on the third floor. LIN said he thinks

it is out for that reason. HARY JAME advised BEN that she knows of a house for sale on Horatio Street for about \$16,000. She referred to FHILIP DUNAMAY for further information.

Cn Pecember 9, 1946, MARY JAME KINEY in a conversation with DAVE MANL, said that she called BEN ALPER yesterday and told him about the third floor apartment of the DUNAWAYS. She said that she asked PHIL about it previously and he said "Mell, if the DICES don't take it it would be available". She stated further that she told BEN about the place on Moratio Street that PHIL had been touting the other night and that when she hung up he was all set to call PHIL and find out the details of the house. DAVE asked MARY JAME when the DUNAWAYS were going to New York and MANY JAME replied that it begins the first.





A check of the Louisville Credit Bureau revealed that DAVID NEWTON in October, 1944, resided at 1615 Hobart Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and previously at 120 Leridian and 130 North Height, Louisville, Kentucky. He was previously amployed by the N.Y.A. in Louisville and attended the University of Louisville. The credit report dated 1944 indicated that he was single. There was no record of RUTF JEWTON. Neither party has a criminal record with the Louisville Police Department.



PEARL FCWLER, Assistant Registrar, University of Louisville, advised that DAVID D. NEVTON attended the university of Louisville the first time was 272 Clare Avenue. He graduated from Male High School, Louisville, Louisville in January 1935 and received her AB degree in June 1941. Her date of birth was given as December 1, 1915, and the place not indicated but apparently Kentucky. Her mother's name was given as Frs. H. C. WALL.





607 West Kentucky Street, Louisville. Miss FOWLER advised that she recalled RUTH WALL as a student and indicated that she was well regarded at the University, and that she had never associated with radicals or Communist groups there.

CARROLL TRISIGER, War Assets Administration, 429 South Fifth Street, Louisville, Kentucky, advised that he worked with DAVID D. NEWTON, at the N.Y.A. in Louisville from 1939 to 1940 and knew him as a fellow employee. He indicated that NEWTON was very talkative and disliked taking orders from other people, but he knew nothing whatsoever that would reflect upon his loyalty to the U. S. WEISIGER indicated that BOB K. SALYERS, formerly State Administrator for N.Y.A. in Kentucky and presently with the Department of Labor working on Veterans' Rehabilitation, and ED DAXTER, war in Kentucky, were well acquainted with DAVID NEWTON and were very reliable. Both SALYERS and BAXTER are presently in Washington, D. C.

A check of the 1940 and 1942 City Directories reveal that NEWTON previously resided in Apartment 8, 120 Meridian Street, with one J. I. EIDER, and at the same apartment building WILLIAM DETHERTON and E. D. DETHERTON were is given as one of NEWTON'S previous addresses. She introduced herself by saying that she had met him at ALEX REUTHER'S and invited him for dinner on December 3, 1946 at 6:30 P.M. MARY JAME commented that she was inviting ALEX also and that she desired that BERKOV meet ANGUS KEENEY (PHILIP OLIN KEENEY). MARY JAME also contacted ALEX REUTHER and advised her that she had invited BERKOV for dinner and ALEX stated that she would be able to accept the invitation for

Would like for ETHEL and BEN ALPER to get together with DAVID WAHL. It was tentatively decided that they would get together at MARY JANE KEENEY's apartment the following Saturday night, December 7, 1946. MARY JANE commented that she was going out on the evening of December 2, that she was having a couple in on Tuesday, December 3, that she was going out on Wednesday, December 4, and that she and a number of other individuals were going to have a Chinese dinner either Thursday or Friday, i.e. December 5 or 6.



MARY JANE next contacted the Pennsylvania Railroad and secured reservations for Section 8, Car 597, Train No. 59, from Washington, D. C. to Chicago; Illinois for December 23, 1946.

ANGUS KEINEY then had a conversation with SANGEVINE and stated that he and MARY JANE would like to lunch with him some day soon. It was decided that ANGUS and MARY JANE should go to SAM's office on Thursday, December 5, sometime after 12:30 P.M.

REMEE, SITHIAN of the Institute of Pacific Relations contacted MIRY JAME KEENEY on the same date and invited them to listen to a speech to be given by ERIC BEECROFT at 5:15 P.M. on Thrusday, De-

EDITH WANT was next in contact with MARY JAME and she said that she and DAVE WHL would be free to attend a gathering at MARY JANE KEENEY's on Saturday, December 7, 1946. EDITH said that they would not be able to have dinner with the KEENEYS but would arrive about 9:00 P.M. and bring the PHIL DUMNIMYS with them. MARY JAME said that ETHEL and BEN LPER were coming for dinner on Saturday night.

DOROTHY/TODD, wife of LIRRY TODD of the Tass News Agency had a conversation with A'GUS KEENEY on the same day and said it would be O.K. to invite two men for dinner. She commented that one couple

On December 4, 1946, according to MARY JAME had a conversation with SARAH at the Washington Cooperative Bookshop and asked if the Bookshop still had its mimeographing work done by CLITHIN-SON. SARAH answered in the affirmative and said his telephone number is Executive 6002 and his office is located on K Street at 11th. 2

Following this conversation MARY JANE contacted Mr. NATHANSON at 1103 K Street and asked him to lend her a stylus and some stencils as she desired to have some mimcographed Christmas letters made. He finally consented to allow her to use a stylus which she promised to return the following day.

MARY JANE KEEKEY next contacted ALEX REUTIER on Extension 74321, war Department, and stated that she had fixed the button-hole for ALEX and would leave the coat at her apartment about 6:00 P.M. ALEX said that MARY JANE could leave the coat with the elevator boy or at the manager's office.

On December 5, 1946, according to MARY JANE contacted LUCY CONKLIN inviting her and GROFF CONKLIN over that evening about 8:30 P.M. LUCY also said that MARY JANE could hire JESSE/TRUEHART (ph) to do house work one day a week if she liked and that JESSE could be reached at Trinidad 5477 which is the telephone of a neighbor. \*\*

MARY JANE next contacted LILLIAN DUNAWAY and invited them to her home on Saturday, December 7 saying that DAVE and EDITH WALL would pick the DUNAWAYS up if they were able to come. The invitation was accepted.

ANGUS KEENEY conversed with DANIEH HEICHER on December 5, 1946 and asked what day would be the most convenient for him and MARY JANE to call upon the MEICHERS. It was decided that the KEENEYS

MARY JANE next had a conversation with SYLVIA BICHER (ph) and MARY JANE said that she would be unable to attend the meeting at 1212 18th Street on December 6 due to a prior engagement. SYLVIA asked MARY JANE to encourage other people to attend the meeting and MARY JANE commented that she would remind ANNA BERENSON of the meeting when she saw her that evening.

Dr. EDMARD, FOR next had a conversation with ANGUS KEENEY about his dental work and said that Dr. IRVING POTHSTEIN, 1722 I Street, could do the dental work for KEENEY.

On December 6, 1946, according to MIGUS KIENEY had a conversation with Dr. DOTES (ph) at the War Department who advised that KEENEY's extension of leave would be arranged.

MARY JAME KEENEY had a conversation with BEMEDICT IPPE and he advised that both he and ETHEL JIPER were ill and asked if MRY JAME could bring the MAMIS and DUMINANS over to his home. MARY JAME said that she was not sure whether they would be able to go over to the AIPERS but they would try to make it. The conversation then returned and AIPER asked if ANGUS KEENEY had looked into that "Civil Service thing" and MARY JAME replied that he had but that it did not look too good. AIPER asked when radio station MOGN would open and MARY JAME said that it would open sometime during the middle of December but that she was not going into it on the basis that she had talked to AIPER about. She said that she may do a fifteen-minute program three times a week, however.

ANN. BEREMSON next had a conversation with MARY JANE and advised that on the way home LUCY CONKLIN asked ANNA what she, ANNA, and MARY JAME were cooking up. ANNA said that LUCY'S husband, GROFF, was going to contact DANNY JISLAN (ph) and she if DANNY would put \$10,000 in the project. going to speak but that she would not be allowed to attend because she was not a member. MIRY JINE commented that she had been a member of the Institute of Pacific Relations for some time and that she believed that Mrs. BENNETT would be welcome at the meetings.

MIRY JAME KEENEY next had a conversation with EDITH and ALMATERSTON. She furnished to AL the details of the low cost housing development that ANNA BERENSON was promoting and AL remarked that he thought the plan was worthwhile because of its tie-up with labor. MARK JANE told him that NATHAN WAYER, who is a manufacturer of these prefabricated houses, would be in Mashington soon and would explain the set-up to the individuals who invested their money. AL asked about MARTIN TABENNETT and MARY JANE said she had not seen him for weeks. House on "the mission", told her that MARTIN TENNETT had been devoting all his time to "the mission". MARY JANE commented that ALICE is no longer at the White House.

MARY JANE KEENEY next contacted Dr. THISTLE SICKEE who





is actually Mrs. MARTIN T. BENNETT and said that she desired to see THISTLE the following evening at the meeting of the Institute of Pacific Relations. THISTLE replied that she had not been invited and MARY JANE said that she would arrange it. Following this conversation MARY JANE contacted Miss HAMKINS at the Institute of Pacific Relations and said that Dr. THISTLE MCKEE should be invited to the meeting and Miss HAMKINS said that she would see that that happened.

The next conversation of any interest that happened on December 10 was between MARCUS GOLDMAN and MARY JANE KEENEY who informed her that a farewell party was being arranged for MARIONYGAR-RUTHERS (ph) and MARY JAME said that she and ANGUS would attend. TARY JAME made an appointment with MARCUS GOLDMAN at 8:30 P.M. Thursday, December 12, 1946 to discuss the low cost pre-fabricated housing project.

MATHAN GREGORY SILVERNASTER next contacted MARY JAME KEENEY and said that he was going to New York City that evening and asked if she would pick up his tickets at the Union Station. She agreed to do so and he said that his reservations were Upper 12, Pennsylvania Railroad, Car 1083.

that she would like to see HAROLD and his wife if convenient. It was decided that they would get in touch sometime Saturday and decide on a definite time.

On December 11, 1946 DANIEL/THORNER had a conversation with MARY JAME KEENEY and advised that he understood that there would be a good attendance at the meeting of the Institute of Pacific Relations among the guests being ex-imbassador GREV and ex-imbassador IEL-SON JOHNSON as well as a number of the Far Eastern Commission. DANIEL said that he would not be able to attend but that he believes that a number of the members of the Department will be there inasmuch as they could get no information from General MacARTHUR and that this is the only way they could find out what was happening in Japan.

Following this conversation MARY JANE KEENEY made an appointment with LUCIEN HILL'ER for 11:30 A.M. on December 11, 1946.

NARY JAME next contacted Mrs. H. BOJEN SITH and told her about the Institute of Pacific Relations luncheon that was held that day at the Y.M.C.A. MARY JAME told CLAYTON SHITH that ANGUS KEENEY and MARTIN BENNETT were the speakers. She delightedly mentioned the fact that ex-Ambassador GREM sat next to ANGUS KEENEY and that ex-Ambassador NEISCH JOHNSON as well as a number of individuals from the Far Eastern Advisory Commission were there. MARY JAME said that she believed that the people from the Department of State attended the meeting in order to hear MARTIN BENNETT but that she later found out that the only reason for their presence was to hear ANGUS KEENEY speak inasmuch as the Department of State did not have the remotest idea of what the War Department was doing and wanted to get the dirt from ANGUS.

BERNARD NORTHAN and an unidentified woman believed to be his wife entered car with 1946 Virginic tags 478-937.

On December 3, 1946 Special Agents WILLIAM R. CORNELL-SON and GEORGE VAN MOY instituted a surveillance at the residence of MARY JAME KEENEY at 4:00 P.M. At 6:55 P.M. ROBERT REPROV was observed to arrive at 215 B Street in a cab and to go directly to Apartment 511 by Special Agent CORNELISON and was observed to enter the KEENEY apartment. At 7:00 P.M. Special Agent CORNELISON observed PHILIP KEENEY to board a bus and proceed to 11th and K Streets, N. W. where he entered a printing shop at 1103 K Street, N. W. MARY JAME KEEMEY remained at the Capitol Weaving Company for a few minutes and thereafter was observed to depart and proceed to Room 820 in the Press Club Building. Special Agent CORNELISON surveilled PMILIP KEENEY from 11th and K Streets,  $\bar{N}_{\bullet}$  W. to the same office. This office is occupied by SAH At 1:50 P.H. 




### December 9, 1946

On this date HILDRED TARCY, wife of CARL/TARCY, 2600 South Hayes, Arlington, Virginia, telephone Jackson 2592-J, was in contact with DEADED TAGDOFF. CARL MARCY is employed at the State Department and is now in New York working with the United Mations Assembly.

Later on this date MARRY MACDOFF contacted LEO LENDIN in New York advising that there had been a big mix-up in their business relations which he finally could trace to LEC. HARRY said "I understood in the end of our big meeting up in New York at the Swiss Restaurant that you guys would get hold of me. Apparently you fellows understood just the opposite. I was anxious to get things settled with respect to my cum decisions. I have been dealing directly with JAY since he was the one who approached me first. Now JAY told me that I should be getting hold of you directly." IDO said that at that meeting at the S.MSS RESTAURANT MARRY had given all of them the impression that he would not be interested unless he became the Acting Head of the organization, and second, that he probably would not want to work on the level which would involve giving the fund raiser immediate gimmicks (phonetic) for the fund raising job they have to do. LEC further stated that "Because of what seemed to be your diffidence about it we came to the conclusion you probably were not interested. Te then expected you to let us know if you had revised your opinion or if you were ready to go forward." HARRY advised LEC that there had been a misunderstanding, that he did not want to be acting head of the organization and that he understood he was to write up a program and then they would get together and discuss the thing. IDO advised LAGDOFF that "in the meantime, assuming that you were out of this, we asked VICTOR PERIO that day after the long meeting we had, Seminar meeting, in which you put on a wonderful show, very, very competent job of guiding and leading the discussion. All of us feltathat way too. After that discussion VICTOR PERIO stayed on. Le asked him whether he would be willing to do a job of program directing on this level; first, to work directly with the fund raiser and to provide suggestions and ideas to the fund raiser in connection with the program. No idea that the Program Director should develop fund raising devices at all or to be directly concerned with the carrying on of the fund raising activities, rather that the Program Director should say to the fund raiser, 'Now it seems to me that what you ought to do with a particular industry is to form something problematical which that, can do for that industry. Here are some leading suggestions as to the kind of program that would be sound for such an industry!. Then let the fund raiser work on the detail, the technique of it. Again, if the Program Director would say, 'Now the most important thing for the





particular part is to dramatize our relationship with particular Governmental functions — saying surplus property disposal, just as an illustration, then what is the best way we could dramatize that. The Program Director might say. Perhaps the best way to dramatize that would be to put on a show in connection with Geneva Steel and perhaps the thing to do there would be to get people who know the Geneva Steel situation to come to a conference on Geneva Steel at which we would have people from Government present and at which we would have these experts present. In other words, the Program Director would be creatively assisting the fund raiser in fund raising functions. " LEO informed MAGDOFF that after the funds are raised they would be ready to do problematic work without relationship with the fund raiser. HARRY advised that he did not think there was any problem in that and that he did not get the point at all. He then asked LEC if they had made other arrangements. LEC replied that they had not, and that VICTOR PIRLO had expected the job would be working up studies of current economic situations, making recommendations to the Board of Directors as to what program order should be submitted to the members, and other activities to be carried forward. PLRLO appreciated the fact that before he could fight effectivel they had to be organized effectively. PIRLC informed them that he would be perfectly satisfied to work into that situation, however, he also knew that an appointment had to be made by the Foard of Directors and that LEO had asked PERIO to come to New York to work with the fund raiser a week or so before the Board meeting which is set for next Saturday in Chicago. It was agreed that VICTCR PERIC would come to New York on December 11 and work there until the 14th and then go to Chicago to submit to the Board what suggestions he had and then let the Board decide if it likes his suggestions and if it likes him, and make a disposition of the whole matter at that point. It seemed to LEC that if MARRY is interested and agreeable on the same basis as VICTCR PIRIC said he was agreeable to do the kind of task LEC has outlined, compensation of 10,000 a year which is the compensation offered to VICTCR and which he said he would accept, then the fact of HARRY'S availability for that position ought to be something the Board should have before it before it makes a final decision on Saturday. LEO said at the last Board Reeting they decided they ought to hire BLANCHD NAMELONE (phonetic), and they said find a "MARRY NACDOFF" who could work with BLANCHE TARLOTE so they would have an operating team that would effectively put their organization on its feet. They turned to VICTOR because they assumed HARRY was unavailable. HARRY emplained that it puts him in an unfavorable position because he knows VICTCR. The other thing, the financial point, HARTY raised "fully recognizing your own limitations but again it was difficult to talk about it", was that he wanted the job to be a step up from the standpoint of prestige from his job as Assistant to the Secretary. The salary is only part of it. He thinks Program Director of such an organization, if it gets started, would be o.k. IEO asked HARRY to tell him specifically and directly the status of his availability and if he will accept the salary. MARRY advised that he is available and will accept the salary. He only wanted to point out that it must be a step up from the standpoint of prestige. LEC asked when MARRY would be available. On this date HARRY HARDOTT contacted BRADIE, who asked how things were and if HARRY heard from the cuy who called him. HARRY has not heard from him and is beginning to speculate and it is all the doing of the cuy who called him. BEADIE asked if he meant what they spoke about last night. HARRY agreed. BEADIE asked if HARRY thought the cuy who called made it up. HARRY agreed. BEADIE will is not there. HARRY replied "no". BEADIE said she went down to see JOANIE who was petrified and said she joined all kirds of places in her youth. HARRY said he would converse with BEADIE regarding this tonight.

Subsequently BEADIE contacted JCAN/(DE TID?) and advised her that HARRY thinks the guy who called him yesterday is a liar. She told JOAN that they can't find any trace of it being printed. JCAN thought it the weirdest thing she ever heard of. DEADIE said the guy who called said he would look it up and see where it was printed but never called MARRY back. JCAN thought it very peculiar. BEADIE did not, saying it was a sign of the times. BEADIE explained that HARRY did not know the man who called and she, BEADIE remember his name, but is confident HARRY does. BEADIE said if people were rational this would not give you a second thought. She thought she would give

Later on this date JAME (STONE) contacted BEADLE NAGDOFF, who informed JAN that she has something to tell her but can't tell her over the phone.

On this date BEADIN MAGDOFF contacted JIME (STOND ?) and advised that she had not gone over to JAME'S yesterday because she had to pick up FREDDIE, her son. BEADIE then related the following which she wanted to tell JAND yesterday. A man had called MARRY to say that he has a release, an unsigned flimsy, saying that in 1932 HARRY wrote an article on something or other for a student magazine; he wrote the stuff for MALLACZ; and MAGDOFF was a well known Communist. JAME asked if MARRY saw a copy of it. BEADIE said no, that this is a man who represents some Socialist magazine and Jewish newspaper and HARRY is not sure the release was not released because no one else called him about it. BEADIE said, "Then this new Secretary came he told his assistants that he did not want any Commys in the Department and 'I don't mean people who wrote things when they were students' and he obviously had been told about it". BRADID added "this had been prepared by the State Department when it was fighting with WALLACD . BEADIN and JARN then discussed the effect of such news if released to the public. BRADII said HAPRY knew it for some time and JAIN asked if it mentioned HARRY by name. BEADIE said, "Yes, it was about him". EEADIE added, "This guy claimed he got it when he went to the Senate Office Luilding for news". BEADIN reiterated that MARRY knew about it before Thanksgiving and did not tell BEADIE about it. She said it was given to somebody in the Department of Commerce who told MARRY about it and said "Ly, that was a well written article". They photostated the article MARRY had written. 

Every month JOHN IN S.LKA received a pamphlet from Prague entitled rague News Letter. This is written by the editorial staff of the Pulletin and Esechoslovakia Weekly and contains items on local, national and international developments as concerns Czechoslovakia both of a political and an economic nature. IMES.LKA also received the monthly unication of the Czechoslovakia National Council of America, 3917 lest 26th St., Chicago 23, Illinois, this publication was formerly called News Flashes from Czechoslovakia and is now entitled American Czechoslovak Flashes. It was learned that ITL-DA LARSALKA has a checking account at the Hamilton National Bank of Mashington, D.C.

As previously reported Prs. HILADA . A SALMA received a letter postmarked at New York City, October 22, 1946 which contained no return address. Through the cooperation of Informant it was learned that this letter was from a woman named MUDA whose family lives in Czechoslovakia. When HILDA was in that country she looked up the family of THUDA and learned that the latters mother had been classified as a German. THUDA was quite concerned about this and was writing HILADA to learn all the facts. Informant learned that in a letter JACK MANSALMA wrote to his wife, November 21, 1946, he asked her to bring "The Sov. Dmb. information bulletins" to him when she came to visit him Thanks; iving. JACK then wrote "if you have a chance to see both the HYSAVIS do so and find out all you can about the Art business. I have an idea for combining Art selling with politics here ie. financing political campaign that way — plus getting invitations to organizations to win popular following.





On December 3, 1946, HELEN SILVER ASTER contacted JEALIF HILLER and during their conversation EELER advised JEALIE that she and CREG were planning to go to New York for a couple weeks after Christmas. JEANIE also stated that she and BCB expected to go too. In their discussion of LUD ULLIAN, HELEN said that she thought he would soon become a professional photographer and that he already has three paying orders. On the same date PLARIELES contacted JEANIE LILLIER and asked JEANIE what the name of the pro-Soviet attorney in London was. JEANIE told her that she did not know. FEARL told JEANIE that she expected JEANIE next Sunday afternoon. PEARL also mentioned that RAYHOND has a job with the Columbia Eroadcasting System.

On December 3, 1946, subject contacted his wife, JETTE, but was advised by the maid that she was at Mrs. SIIVERIASTERS.

On December 5, 1946, FRANCES USSELL contacted BCB MILLED's residence from his room in the Pennsylvania Hotel in New York City. JEN'IE MILLED advised RUSSELL that BCB was not home and wanted to know if there was any message. BCB that the "twenties will be okay" and there is no use of BCB calling him unless MILLED wants to know something else.

On December 6, 1946, JERNIE MILL R contacted HELEW SHIVER LASTER and invited HELEM and LUD ULIMAN to dinner on December 6th. However, the invitation was declined.

ROWEWA said that she had talked to JACK/FEUFIFOY yesterday after she had handed in her statement to FRANCIS RUSSILL. She stated that



FEURIFCY was quite annoyed and startled and asked about MILLER. (Evidently RUGARIA had told FEURIFOY about LILLER being asked to resign from the State Department and was surprised when advised of thees facts by ROM EL. FranCIS EUSSELL, mentioned above, is chief of the Public Liaison Section of the State Department and is the immediate supervisor of ROM ELL.) In further conversation ROW ELL told MILLER that one of the things that is worrying PENICH (J. ANTHONY PAUCH, Office of Secretary of State) is that he is presenting the budget on the Hill this year and that he probably wants to wipe his hands and smirk and say, "Well, I've done just that you asked." MILLER replied that he was quite surprised to hear that because from what FRANCIS (probably FRANCIS. RUSSELL) had told him they knew all about it and figured there was nothing they could do. ROWENA said that FRANCIS had talked with ACHESON and that ACHESON indicated there was nothing he could do or would do at that point. MILLER replied, "Well, what could JACK (FEURIFOY) do if ACLESCH couldn't do anything?". ROWENA replied, "I don't want him to do anything at this point, that is the reason I went to see him." ROWENA said that she really did not trust FRANCIS RUSSELL's stamina in a situation like this. OFFICE WILLISON is Professor Emeritus, Princeton University, paleof raphy being his special field of interest. He received his adveation at the
Universities of Cincinnati and Yale, and later studied at the Universities of
Berlin, Freiburg, and Heidelburg. He was ampleyed at the University of Yale
as lecturer in history, 1902 to 1903; at Mount Molycke, 1903 to 1904, associtate professor of history at Smith University, 1905; associate professor at
turer in history, 1916 to 1914. He was visiting professor at Princeton, lecsor and lecturer in paleo, raphy, 1936 to 1943, and professor emeritus, 1943.

The records further rollbest that ROBINSON is a member of many

history clubs, both in this country and in England and France. He was at one time president of the New Jersey Society of Archeological Institute of America. Newspaper clippings, contained in the records, indicated that in 1931, while the FOBIMSCIS were in England, they were entertained by Ambassador and Mrs. CHARLES DATES, and by Mr. NATHAMIEL PERMISION DAVIS, who was American Consul in London. Thile in Rome, RCBIMSON was received by Pope Pius XI.

Chief EDWARD MAHAN, Princeton Bero Police Department, knew of the RCBINSON family as being a member of the upper society in Princeton, New Jersey. He knew nothing derogatory concerning them.

Detective HIMRY BOVIE, Princeton Boro Police Department, who had been at one time proctor at Princeton University, advised that he had known of the ROBINSONS for some twenty or twenty-five years. He has not known them intimately, stating that they are members of the upper society in Princeton and members of many clubs and societies. He has never heard anything of a derogatory nature concerning them. He stated that he knows that ROBINSON is definitely conservative in his political views, and that he was often heard talking against the policies of the late President ICCSIVELT.

KENNETH FAIRLAIT, Athletic Director, Frinceton University, who has a wide knowledge of affairs at Frinceton University, was interviewed with RCDINSONS.

The Newark Field Division indices were checked for information relative to the above persons, and it was ascertained that a Mr. CHAIFANI ROBINSON, 12 Boudinot Street, Princeton, New Jersey, had corresponded with the Eureau in 1939 concerning a speaker. This correspondence reflected that Mr. ROBINSON was connected with the Princeton Club in Princeton; New Jersey. No other information appears in the Newark indices with reference to the above persons.

In this correspondence was included numerous letters from various well known publishing companies, such as Putnam's, Charles Scribner's Sons, Robert M. Mc Bride and Company, Harper and Bros., the University of Chicago Press, the Tale University Press, Vanguard Press, etc.

In addition to the correspondence with the various publishing houses, PLEIN received three other pieces of correspondence, which are listed below:

On December 4, 1946 the subject, while talking to his wife, DORIS PLEMM, mentioned that he had just seen ANGUS HAIR DONALD, (of the "New Republic"). PLEMM mentioned that Mc DONALD is now the Foreign Editor of the "New Republic" and stated that he had had a nice conversation during which ANGUS told ABEL that the "New Republic" was looking for "fresh" people.

On December 5, 1946 FLEIM had a long conversation with DELITTATIONED of the George Mashington University. During the conversation ELDMIDGE mentioned that he and his wife HOPE had seen TALLULAH BARMHLAD in Jean Cocteau's "Eagle Rampant". ELDRIDGE then mentioned that he was quite incensed about the intolerancy and prejudice displayed by those in charge of administration at the National Theatre.

He pointed out that the night he and his wife attended the play there was a sign in the theatre lobby which he copied. He read the writing which he had copied to PLENK, which is as follows:

"Tickets sold by this theatre are not transferable and are sold subject to compliance with the known policy of the theatre as to persons entitled to admission."

ELDRIDGE mentioned that below the main inscription on the sign there was further comment indicating that anyone breaking the regulations would not have his money refunded, nor would the theatre exchange tickets.

PLEAN and DE TTT then discussed at length as to what action could be taken and how pressure could be brought against the persons responsible for the prejudice and intolerance which has consistently been displayed by the theatre. ELD-IDGE was at a loss to know just what action to take and PLEAN suggested that he try to exert pressure through the Theatre Guild.

DE ITT ELDRIDGE stated he and his wife have reached a point where they definitely felt that if at all possible some action should be taken.

Later on December 5, 1946 VINGIMIALLY IS, sister of BODY AND talked to DORIS PIERW. During the conversation VINGIMIA mentioned that BOB was the Informant advised that this was the only item of real interest in this conversation.

Informant advised that it is believed that this individual identified as MALLEN". been misunderstood and that ALLEN is actually identical with ALECAUEL (ph) of PH. Later on December 6, 1946 ANGUS H. Mc DONAID of the "New Republic" talked to DORIS PLEM. Mc DONAID mentioned that he had seen ABEL once or twice during the past week and indicated that "we" would like the PLEMS to come over Saturday night about 9:00 PM. Mc DONAID mentioned that his office

"Insurance Company offers two dollars and cettlement of case against ISADOLL WATZEL HTZ (PH)including charge of attorneys fees and disbursements. Advise whether to accept or resume trial."





On December 8, 1946, FACE, LOVE contacted BILL REMINGTON and inquired whether or not he, REMINGTON, had been able to do anything for CLYDE/IOBINSON who is presently connected with the CPA in Memphis, Tennessee. BILL advised PAUL that he had not been able to find a job for RCPIMSON and that this was a backs. The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent CHAPLES D.

It was ascertained at the Personnel Office of UNRRA that RUTH S. RIFKIN of 19 East 98th Street, New York City, made application for employment on Parch 14, 1943, with the Director of Foreign Relation and Rehabilitation Operations, Department of State. This application reflects that she was born February 1, 1912, at Milkes-Barre, Penns Ivania and that her legal, or voting, residence is New York. Her father was born in Hoscow, Russia and was brought to the United States at the age of five as a naturalized citizen. The subject stated that she attended the Coughlin Migh School in Milkes-Parre, Permsylvania from 1926 to 1928 and attended a private preparatory school and business school at Uyoming Seminary, Kingston, Pennsylvania from 1920 to 1931. From 1931 to 1932 she was enrolled at the University Extension of Columbia University, and from 1936 to 1930 she studied English composition and special feature writing at New York University. She further stated that she studied Trench 3 years and visited England on a vacation from Lay 23, 1936 to June 21, 1936. She listed the following previous employment: From February, 1935 to Povember, 1937, secretary and bookkeeper for the Planned Publicity Service, 103 Fark Avenue, New Fork Sity at a salary of \$15 to \$20 per week. From November, 1937 to August, 1938 she held temporary positions as a public stenographer for IEMA ROSIN, 1440 Proadway, New York City. From June, 1937 to August 25, 1938 she was employed by Employment Hews, 55 lest 45th Street, Hew York City. From August, 1930 to the time of her application she was employed at the Foreign Policy Association, 22 East 38th Street, New York City. At this place of employment she Was secretary to RAYLOND L. BUDLL, (MILLIAN T. STON) MARGAURITH AND STEMMENT, AMERICAN JOHNSTON, MILLIAN S. HANDON and CHIPMAN S. HANDON. She stated that her salary ran ed from 24 to 27 per week and that her duties consisted of acting in the capacity of an assistant rather than a secretary. She stated she wanted to leave this position because there was no opportunity for advancement and that she desired to enter Government service and make a contribution toward the war effort.

Assistant Postmaster SALUZL POLGIAZE, Fairlawm, New Jersey, advised that MCRRIS BLACKIAN and his wife, CERTRUDE DIACKIAN, presently reside at 9-05 3rd Street, Fairlawm, New Jersey. On June 21, 1943, Ir. and Mrs. BLACKIAN gave on August 2, 1945, the BLACKIAN family moved back to 9-05 3rd Street, Pairlawm, New Jersey.

It was reported that MORRIS BLACHIAN enlisted in the United States Army during 1943 and was discharged in 1945. It is believed that Ir. BLACHIAN was stationed out west and his wife GLMTRUDE probably moved to Colorado to be near him.

A check of the Local Draft Board covering Fairlawn and several other local draft boards covering that immediate vicinity, were checked but no record of MCRRIS BLACKMAN'S resignation for Selective Service was located.

Investigation disclosed that MORIS LIACITAN has resided in Tairlawn, New Jersey since about 1915 but that his business activities were centered in the textile industries in Paterson, New Jersey. Discreet inquiry in Tairlawn, New Jersey disclosed that LORRIS BIACKLAN was well known in that town and has a favorable reputation. He owns his own home at the above address which is located in the better residential area of Mairlawn. GERTRUDE BIACKLAN is not very well known in Fairlawn, New Jersey and nothing of value was learned concerning her background or associates.

Inquiry failed to disclose that either MCRRIS or GERTRUDE DIACKIAN were engaged in or associated with any subversive activities.

The Bergen and Passaic Credit Bureau, Church Street, Taterson, New Jersey had a credit report on MCRIS BLACK AT dated 1935. This report contained the following information:

MCRRIS BLACKTAN is Jewish. He was married in 1932, has one child and his wife's name is GERTRUDE BLACKTAN. No date or place of this marriage was listed. In 1942 MCRRIS BLACKTAN was listed as Vice-President of the Allied Textile Printers, Inc., 45 Marren Street, Faterson, New Jersey. His net worth is estimated at 10,000. He was formerly associated with the Printex Corporation, 43 East 26th Street, and the Lyons Piece Dye Morks, both Paterson, New Jersey.

Under date of Cotober 22, 1946, the Philadelphia Field Division was requested to identify the resident at 78 Mest Ross Street, Milkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, a correspondent of RIFKIM. The following information pertaining to the individuals residing at this address was supplied by the Philadelphia Field Division.



Confidential Informant furnished the following information concerning the activities of the subject and his wife during the pertinent period: u

On December 2, 1946 ROSENNERC talked to NILTCHTTE, who is the West Coast Representative for the Mollywood Broadcasting Company, Los Angeles, California. TYRE's telephone number is Vandike 7153, Los Angeles, California.

The Informant advised that the conversation between ROSENBURG and TYRE was purely of a business nature and they discussed the problems confronting them in securing the radio lines for the Company from the Federal Communication Commission. ROSENBERG requested that TYRE make sure that all the proper work in the case was completed and indicated that he had reservations for December 9, to take him to Los Angeles. ROSENBERG requested that TYRE make hotel reservations for him.







The list of the measurership of the Bookshop Association which was known to have been current through the year 1942, was made available by a confidential source while in the possession of one KANGTERN.

A search of the Baltimore City and telephone directories failed to reflect that N. BOJEN SIJTH had resided at 1425 Park Avenue in Baltimore. The records of the Baltimore Police Department and of the Retail Herchants' Credit Bureau were negative.

Informant advised that on December 2, 1946, HELEN SILVERMASTER contacted GREGORY SILVERMASTER's secretary Filda Frank at his office and advised her that SILVERMASTER possibly would not return to town for another week, that he was spending additional time at the beach and then would visit friends in New York for a few days. Cn the same date MARY JANE KEELEY was in contact with MELEV SIL-YERMASTER advising her they had just returned from a ten day stay in New York. HELEN SILVERIASTER in turn advised that this past week-end would probably be their last at the beach for the season. The informant furnished additional information regarding the activities of MARY JAME MERMEY which Will be reported in this report under the caption of MARY JAME and PHILIP OLIN MEENEY.

The informant further advised GPEGCRY SILVERIA TER had desired to write a book for some years and this opportunity may be just the one he is looking for. The informant further advised he was under the impression photography shop or engaging in commercial photography and using his basement laboratory for the mechanical work. It is apparent to the informant he has already received some orders for pictures and portrait work from photography and has expressed a desire to follow through on this inclination of his, and it is apparent KELEN SILVERIASTER is encouraging him in this venture.

Cn December 4, 1946, the informant advised MELEM SILVERMASTER was again in contact with MARGAPET/MATFIELD who is presently in Washington visiting her daughter, and plans to stay approximately a month.

Con the same date informant advised RCBERT MILLER was at the SILVER-MASTER residence during which time he was apparently in contact with LUD/NG ULLIAM: and made an arrangement to meet ULLIAM: at his office in order that WILLER might discuss some of his problems with ULLIAM.





Informant further advised to substantiate this he overheard HELEN converse with LUDWIG ULLIANN indicating to him that ROBERT MILLER had called upon her for some advice so she suggested he call ULLIANN instead as she was under the impression she was not in a position to advise him satisfactorily. ULLIANN inferred, with reference to ROBERT MILLER, that a fellow in his position just had to talk with somebody and was inclined to discount the importance of MILLER's problems which, as the informant subsequently advised, were undoubtedly in reference to ROBERT MILLER's enforced termination of employment from the State Department:

On the same date HETHAN KLCTZ was in contact with HILEN SILVER-MASTER and LUDWIG ULLIANN, and he specifically inquired of LUDWIG ULLIANN as to the potential value of some hydro-electric mortgage bonds on a company in Italy. ULLMANN informed him he did not know but the State Department should be in a position to advise him. HETMAN KLCTZ further indicated to HELEN that he had seen GREGORY while in New York and on this day GREGORY had had lunch with HENRY CRGENTHAU.

On December 5, 1946, informant advised that an individual, subsequently identified as CARL REDECKIER of the Division of International Labor, Social, and Health Affairs, State Department, contacted HELEN SHLVER ASTER, and they discussed at some length BORIS AITTE, the brother of MILIN.

BECKNET indicated to HELEN he was leaving for Berlin the following week and would be there for two years. His wife and son FRED would join him in Berlin later. He offered the additional information that up until now he had been in the Labor Division of the State Department and is living there with the option to return to his position.

On the same date, informant advised LECK-TSH AN, an associate of GPEGORY SILVEMASTER in the War Assets Administration, was in contact with HELEN SILVEMASTER and LUTWIG ULITARN both. It was apparent to the informant that LEO ATSHMAN is attempting to obtain a position at the Treasury Department, undoubtedly in the Monetary Research Division, because he had solicited the support of both LUDWIG ULIMANN and GREGORY SILVERMASTER in contacting WILLIAM TAYLOR who is presently acting head of that division. ULLMANN indicated to LEO FISHMAN that both he and SILVE MASTER would add their recommendations.

Informant advised on December 7, 1946, PHILIP HER EY was in contact with HELEN, and he indicated he was very anxious to see GREGORY SILVERMASTER. Arrangements were made for them to dine at the SILVER ASTERS' at an early date.

On December 8, 1946, JCSEPH GILLIAN, an associate of GREGORY SILVERMAN at the War assets, was in contact with him at his residence at which time they discussed at some length the results of SILVERMASTER's recent trip to New York City. SILVERMASTER indicated to had tabled to some of his

friends, particularly those who were interested in his project and of a mind similar to those individuals DAVE WAPL had told them about. However, they all anticipate making quick prefits. It is apparent to the informant that SILVER-MASTER, together with JOE GILLMAN and other interested individuals, is engaged in the disposition of surplus properties in the foreign market.

On December 9, 1946, an individual identified only as SAMAROTENT and apparently a former associate of GREGORY SILVERIASTER at the War Assets Administration contacted SILVERIASTER. He indicated that they were preparing some reports within the next week in which they planned to issue some very strong statements about incompetence in the administration. A substantial portion of this report would deal with loss of men by resignation or dismissal who have demonstrated their competence. Silveriaster suggested some emphasis to placed upon these individuals and that their dismissal or resignation was the result viduals so affected.

On December 10, 1946, DELEY ADERSON was in contact with GREGORY SILVERIASTED and they further discussed the publication of a report making issue on the War Assets Administration and its problems.

Informant advised on December 11, 1946, REBA LETIS, wife of ROGER LETIS, who is living in Ellicott City, Maryland, teaching at Johns Hopkins University, was in contact with MEMEN SILVER ASTER. She advised she is presently working on a book for CLARK FORE AN. It will be recalled CLARK FOREIAN is president of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare.

On the same date HELEN SILVERMASTER was in contact with Mrs. CLIFFORT MacAVCY and advised her her husband GREGORY left for New York, that she aboun't exactly know what he is about but he presently has some very grandiose ideas. She mentioned ROBERT MILLER had terminated his employment at the State Department and is under the impression his position presently is not a pleasant one. She will go into more detail on the MILLER situation with Mrs. MacAVCY upon the occasion of her next visit.

On December 14, 1946, MELEN SILVERIASTER was in contact with Mrs. BERNARD FARMEROFF and discussed her husband GREGORY's resignation from the War Assets Administration. She advised Mrs. FARMEROFF GREG had been offered large sums of money in private industry and had been offered teaching jobs both at Yale and Princeton but she is under the impression he will do something on his own now or write a book.

On the same date HELEN SILVERNASTER invited Mr. and Mrs. CLIFFORD FacaVCY and EDITH and NURVAY LATIMER to dinner at the SILVEPHABTER home on New Year's Eve. She advised the LEE PRESSNAIS and other old friends would be present.

On the same date JCSEPH GILLMAN was in contact with GREGORY SILVER-NASTER, and SILVERNASTER advised him he had had breakfast with has WOVICH, the Yugoslav Ambassador, and he was apparently very much interested and SILVER-MASTER was also making arrangements to meet the top people in the Polich group. 
