Clues and hints of what is to come are scat-

tered across today's lessons. In Malachi we learn that it is going to be a bummer for "the arrogant and every evildoer." (There is burning involved.) But we also learn that for those that revere His name, "the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings." That's good to know. However, in our gospel reading, we find that there will be all kinds of trouble before the end comes. The disciples, showing their very human need to know, asked Jesus, "When will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?" In Luke 21, Jesus says, "Watch out that you are not deceived...." and "...They will lay hands on you and persecute you." and even: "All men will hate you because of me." Yikes!

In our New Testament lesson, Paul knows that we can get all worked up over what will happen and when. He advises the Thessalonians not to stop working in order to wait for Christ's return. I think his point is that we should be ready, but not obsess about it. Live your life.

Of course, the best advice comes from Jesus directly: "Make up your mind to not worry beforehand how you will defend yourselves. I will give you words and wisdom..."
