ENDS:

- MARVIN STOSS, 21, Great Bend, senior, lettered for the Tigers in 1955 and 1956. Does a good job on defense. Should prove valuable at the end post this year.
- MAC THOMPSON, 20, Goodland, sophomore, lettered last year as a freshman at fullback. In high school was All-League in his junior year. For Fort Hays State this year he will bolster the end position.
- <u>NEIL DRETLING</u>, 20, Hays junior, big 6-2, 190-pounder should give strength to end slot. Played freshman ball at K-State two years ago. Was an allstater on Hays High team.
- DON FRALEY, Chester, Nebr., junior, lettered at Peru, Nebr., college and Fairbury, Nebr., junior college. A 6-5, 210-pound end, Fraley should give strength to that position.

TACKLES:

- DAN JOHNSON, 21, Hays senior, played on Hays high school's undefeated team of 1953 and has lettered three years at Fort Hays State. This should prove Johnson's finest year as one of the Tiger standouts.
- JEROME BOOR, 24, Odin sophomore, lettered last fall at center for the Tigers. Played football with the I Corps in Korea while in the Army. Was injured late in the season last year. Should be one of the Tigers' outstanding linemen this season.
- PAUL RIEDEL, 19, Ellis junior, lettered at center in 1955 and 1956 at Fort Hays State. Played outstanding ball last fall before being injured. Should develop into one of the conference's better tackles this year.
- LEROY BRUNGARDT, 19, Hays sophomore, was an outstanding tackle on the Hays St. Joseph's Cadet grid team. Won a provisional letter last fall at St. Benedict's. Transferred at semester last year to Fort Hays State. His aggressiveness won him a starting spot in last spring's practice.
- NORMAN PFEIFER, 23, Hays sophomore, was on Kansas-State freshman team last year. A 6-4, 240-pound tackle, Pfeifer will be fighting for a starting position this fall.

GUARDS:

- MERL ALTMAN, 21, Almena senior, lettered last fall at Fort Hays State. Earned two letters at Garden City junior college. A 5-7, 196-pounder and fast. Should be a standout in the conference. Altman is married.
- WARREN SIEK, 18, Ness City sophomore, was a freshman squad member last year. Ran 220, and 880 in high school track. Should be one of conference's fastest linemen.
- DENNIS STEGMAN, 21, Ness City junior, a service veteran, played freshman ball for Wichita university. Was out for spring training and was a starting guard.
- DICK KNIGHT, 21, from Chicago, Ill., now calls Dodge City his home. A secondsemester sophomore, he lettered two years at Dodge City junior college. Should be a valuable lineman.

CENTERS:

- HOWARD RUNFT, 23, Herington senior, back from service. Has seen lots of football at Fort Hays State. Is a stocky, 5-7, 190-pounder with drive. Should see plenty of action this season.
- PAT SHIFMAN, 21, McPherson sophomore, lettered four years at Plainville high school. Was a starting lineman in last spring's practice. Is fast and rugged. Should be as good a player as his brother, Bill, who won all-conference honors in 1955.

QUARTERBACKS:

- RONNIE IECNARD, 20, Quinter sophomore, played freshman ball at K-State last fall. Was a spark plug in spring training at Fort Hays State. Leonard bears watching as a potential CIC backfield great. Last spring he performed at quarterback, halfback and fullback.
- JIM HOOTEN, 19, Wellington sophomore, won All-League honors on Wellington high school team. Played for Hutchinson junior college last fall. A good ball handler and passer as well as a defensive man, Hocten should be an asset to the Tigers.

HALFBACKS :

- LESTER HERRMAN, 21, Antonino senior, has lettered twice at Fort Hays State after successful high school play with the St. Joseph's Cadets. Was injured near end of last season. Should be a big help defensively this year.
- DARREIL HILDEBRAND, 19, Hill City sophomore, lettered last year when a freshman. Was a regular starter. Played outstanding defense last season. His offense has improved and he'll be one to watch this fall
- JIM MASKA, 20, Hays junior, lettered at Fort Hays State in 1955 while a freshman. Spent a semester at K-State last fall. Also a track and basketball man, Maska will be a break-away threat.
- AL NORTON, 22, Cimarron junior, earned two letters at Dodge City Juco. A speedy ball handler, Norton is also a fine defensive player. Al is married and has two girls.

FULLBACK:

CHUCK VERNON, Norcatur sophomore, played freshman ball for Wichita university. A 5-10, 200-pounder, Vernon is tough both offensively and defensively. This aggressive fullback earned a starting spot in spring training.

- 1921-Dn Kansas conference championship team
- 1922-Coach, LaCrosse high school
- 1923-Coach, Howard high school
- 1924-Started six-year stay at Augusta high school where his championship teams gained state-wide fame
- 1930 Joined Fort Hays State faculty as head basketball coach and codirector of athletics. His basketball teams tied twice for Central conference title
- 1935--Became director of athletics
- 1939--Received Master's degree from University of Missouri
- 1946 Turned over basketball reigns to Cade Suran to devote full time as Director of Athletics
- 1957--Nominated to Helms Foundation Hall of Fame for "noteworthy achievement in NAIA basketball."

- WAYNE J. MCCONNELL, Head Football Coach and Tennis Coach
 - 1934--Received bachelor's degree from Washburn
 - 1943--Started coaching at Atchison Co. Community high school in Effingham
 - 1946 -- Coached at Gaylord high school
 - 1947--Coached at Downs high school. Was undefeated two seasons, winning 16 games and tying one
 - 1949--Coached at Manhattan high school. His team finished in the top ten in class AA and second in league
 - 1950--Joined College of Emporia staff as athletic director and head coach of all sports
 - 1951--McConnell's C of E team was undefeated taking the KCAC title
 - 1953--Named Little All-America Coach of the Year by the Rockne Foundation
 - 1954--Received Master's from Emporia State
 - 1955--Last year at C of E. In five years his teams won 39 games, lost 12, tied one. From 1953-1955 his teams were undefeated in 26 regular season contests.
 - 1956--Joined Fort Hays State faculty as head football coach and assistant professor of physical education

OTHER SPORTS

Besides football Fort Hays State competes in basketball, cross country, swimming, wrestling, gymnastics, golf, tennis and track.

Gymnastics, track, basketball and wrestling are discussed under the coaches in COACHING STAFF elsewhere in this brochure. Here's a little information on the others:

SWIMMING: Fort Hays State finished their first competitive year in this sport last spring with the CIC championship.

CROSS COUNTRY: Under track coach Alex Francis, Fort Hays State cross country trackmen took second in the CIC and runner-up spot in the NAIA.
