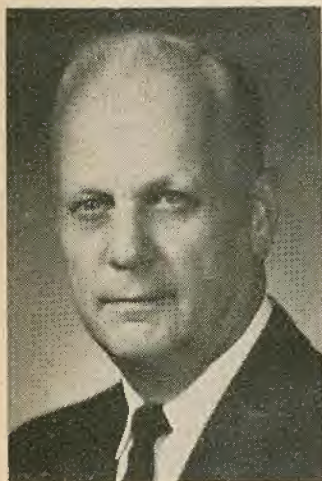

Fort Hays State Athletic Director, Coaches

Athletic Director Paul B. Gross



Paul "Busch" Gross, one of the best-known figures in Kansas college athletics, is beginning his 32nd year on the faculty at Fort Hays State. He has served the school as an athlete (1917-1921), a coach (1930-1946) and athletic director (1930-present).

An all-state college choice as a quarterback in his career as a Tiger gridder, Busch contributed to the school's first two athletic championships as a member of the 1917 and 1921 title-winning teams in the old Kansas Conference.

After graduating, he coached at LaCrosse, Howard and Augusta for eight years before returning to his Alma Mater as head basketball coach in 1930. He served as co-director of athletics until 1935, when he assumed full responsibility for the job.

Gross has his B.S. degree from Fort Hays State (1922), his master's from the University of Missouri and has done additional graduate work at the University of Illinois, the State University of Iowa and Northwestern University.

Head Coach Wayne McConnell

Coach Wayne McConnell, a veteran of 18 years of coaching, is beginning his sixth season as head grid coach at Fort Hays State. He came to Hays after six successful years at College of Emporia, during which time he was named Little All-American Coach of the Year. This honor came in 1953, after the second of three undefeated years at C of E. His six-year record at Emporia showed 39 wins, 12 losses and one tie.

Before the Emporia stint, Mc-

Connell coached seven years in Kansas high schools at Effingham, Gaylord, Downs and Manhattan. His 18-year record in coaching includes 83 wins, 53 losses and four ties, including a 14-29-1 mark at Fort Hays State. His best seasons at FHS were 1957 (4-4-0) and 1958 (4-4-1).

He earned his bachelor's degree at Washburn University in 1934 and holds an M.S. degree from Kansas State Teachers College at Emporia.



Student Assistant Jim Casper

Jim Casper, a three-time letterman at quarterback for the Tigers, will help McConnell and McNeil as a student assistant coach. Casper's playing career ended during the 1959 season when he suffered a knee injury. He lettered in 1954, 1955 and 1959 and was the starting signal-caller during the latter two seasons.



Assistant Coach Ed McNeil

Ed McNeil, Bengal assistant coach, has worked with McConnell for nine years—five at College of Emporia and four at Hays—prior to this season. He also coached two years at the University of North Dakota, where Baltimore Colt star Steve Myrha was one of his gridgers.

Ed was a third-team All-America selection as a tackle at Kansas State, where he earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees. He also spent more than three years in the Air Force before beginning his coaching career at College of Emporia.



Tiger Hopes High as 1961 Season Begins

Fort Hays State opens its 1961 football season tonight with high hopes of improving last year's record of two wins and seven losses. The Tigers' guests for the opener are the Antelopes of Kearney (Neb.) State.

The visitors boast a letterman-packed roster with some 30 monogram winners on the traveling squad. Three of the Antelopes who started against FHS last fall are back—tackle LeRoy Erpelding, center Larry Dieckman and end Gary Myers. None of the Nebraskans who did any offensive damage to the Tigers last fall return except quarterback Harry Boss, who punted and did signal-calling late in the game.

Fort Hays State won, 20-12, at Kearney last September after trailing, 12-7, at halftime.

Cliff Leiker and Wayne Schumacher, who went on to all-conference honors, did considerable damage to the Nebraska squad last year, as Leiker caught two touchdown passes (and two other passes) and Schumacher was the game's leading ground-gainer.

Fort Hays State starters who also opened the Kearney game last fall include Clayton Williams, an end last year and a defensive halfback this time; linemen Jim Baird, Ron Gardner and Jerry Strecker; end Leiker and halfback Schumacher. Jim Lee was a defensive starter in the 1960 game, as was halfback Ken Belisle.

Kearney has veterans at all positions, but may lack a star offensive performer. Steve Kraus

blossomed late last season as a ground-gaining halfback and Boss has had spurts of quarterbacking success. Jerry Dunlap and Ken Kuhn, the other starters, could also take over as top offensive performers.

Kearney Coach Al Zikmund lost 28 members from last year's squad due to graduation, transfer and dropout. He gained a number of top-notch prospects, however, including brothers Francis and Charles Hircock. Francis, a star shotputter in the spring, is a 272-pound tackle who lettered in 1959, while Charles is an end transfer from Nebraska U. Another new prospect is end Larry McCord, who was voted the outstanding lineman in Nebraska's Shrine high school all-star game last summer.

Fort Hays State coaches are optimistic when talking about their 1961 squad. While they admit to a lack of depth in the line, freshman prospects and transfers have come along well in pre-season practice and give the Bengal mentors hopes of a brighter fall campaign.

In the history of the series between FHS and Kearney, the Tigers have won nine and lost four. The records:

Cross Country Runners Begin Workouts

Cross country runners began practice this week, with six of last year's seven lettermen back in the fold. The Tiger harriers open their 1961 schedule Sept. 30 when they compete in the Wichita University Invitational at Wichita.

Coach Alex Francis, who originated cross country here six years ago, will bolster his group of experienced runners with a promising crop of newcomers. Alex has never finished lower than third in the CIC cross country meet and has copped second place four of the five times the league has had the race.
