

A Look at Today's Game

Today marks the end of Fort Hays State's 1971 home football season and features a non-conference opponent, Panhandle State College of Goodwell, Okla. Revenge is probably in the minds of the Aggies today as they fell to FHS at

Goodwell last season by a 56-14 margin. In the series between the two schools, the Tigers hold a 2-1 edge.

The Aggies, who have compiled a 3-6 overall mark this season bettered a strong Central Oklahoma State squad in Panhandle's Homecoming contest last week, 20-14. Going into that game Central Oklahoma was ranked third in Division I of the NAIA.

Panhandle's defense held Central's running game to 129 yards rushing. Before the game, the Central offense was averaging 248 yards per game on the ground. Central won the battle of passing yardage by compiling 103 yards to Panhandle's 42.

The Aggies' big offensive threat is senior quarterback Gib Dolezal who last week carried the ball 19 times for 68 yards and passed for 42 yards. Prior to last week's game, Dolezal was ranked 16th in individual total offense and 27th in passing in NAIA statistics. This season he has connected on 93 of 223 passes for 1,272 yards and he needs only 116 more yards to set a new Oklahoma Collegiate Conference career passing record. In four years of competition at Panhandle he has gained 5,781 passing yards.

The Tigers will be hoping to pick up their second win in a row when they take the field against Panhandle today. Last Saturday FHS ended a three-game losing streak and gained its first conference victory against Southern Colorado State College, 10-7.

In that game, split end John Woodworth established another new FHS pass receiving record. He grabbed five passes against SCSC to raise his career pass catching total to 81 which is two receptions more than the old mark held by Dennis Spratt. Spratt competed at FHS from 1967 to 1970.

Woodworth, who is a junior, has gained 1,263 yards during two years as a Tiger and is only 153 yards away from breaking the career pass receiving yardage record of 1,415 which was established by Cliff Leiker (1959-60, 1962-63).



OSCAR WILLIAMS, Aggie head coach, has compiled a 104-92-6 record during 20 years of coaching at Panhandle State. He enjoyed his best years in 1953 and 1961 when his teams recorded marks of 8-1 and 9-2.







Twelve Tiger seniors will be making their final home appearance today against Panhandle State.

Mike Butler, a two-year starting center, is the Tigers' offensive captain this season. Last year he earned all-NAIA District 10 honors and he is an all-conference candidate this fall.

Butch Davis, starting offensive right guard, was a "pleasant surprise" for head coach Tom Stromgren this season and has proved his blocking ability.

Gary Dougherty is the Tigers' second leading rusher this year. The tailback has carried the ball 73 times for 420 yards and has scored three touchdowns.

Bob Givens, who has competed at the linebacker and noseguard positions this season, played his best defensive game last week. He was credited with 14 total tackles and a fumble recovery.

Joe Gresnick, starting offensive right tackle, also played one year of basketball at FHS. He has teamed with Davis to clear the way for Tiger running backs.

Jake Heck is the Tigers' leading tackler with a season total of 97. He also handles the punting chores and has an average of 32.7 this season.

Lionell Jenkins, Tiger tri-captain, was an all-RMAC selection last year and is the Tigers' starting cornerback this season. He has accounted for four pass deflections and 44 tackles this fall.

Dennis Kress, starting Tiger linebacker, is ranked fifth in FHS defensive statistics with 79 tackles. Kress is also a Tiger tri-captain this season.

Rick Lacey, two-year Tiger starter, has played at both defensive end and defensive tackle this season. He is third in defensive stats with 85 tackles.

Charlie Schirmer, performing for one year as a Tiger defensive end, has accounted for three fumble recoveries and 55 tackles.

Tom Spicer, Tiger middle linebacker, is completing his second year on the FHS squad. He has intercepted one pass and has been credited with 87 tackles this season.

Dave Wassenberg, one-year tailback performer, is the Tigers' third leading rusher this year with 70 carries and 333 yards. He has also caught five passes for 75 yards and has scored one touchdown.

- RMAC HISTORY -

The reorganized Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference began league competition in all sports for the first time in 1969.

Fifteen colleges and universities compose the league and cover five states. The conference is divided into two divisions—Mountain and Plains Divisions. On June 19, 1967, Harry B. (Doc) Kniseley, former information bureau director of the Western Athletic Conference, was named the league's first commissioner. RMAC headquarters are located in Denver, Colo.

The league is governed by the commissioner who works jointly with the schools' presidents. A grant-in-aid system has been set up to insure equal competition in all sports.

The RMFAC, upon which the new league was formed, is one of the nation's oldest athletic conferences, dating back to 1899 when the Colorado Football Association was formed.




