How big is Facebook currently?

AS OF 2011, THERE ARE 500,000,000 ACTIVE FACEBOOK USERS.
APROX. 1 IN EVERY 13 PEOPLE ON EARTH.
HALF OF THEM ARE LOGGED IN ON ANY GIVEN DAY.

What are we doing here?

- I will be explaining how to check who is currently logged into your Facebook account, where they are, what kind of device they are using, and when they were last on your account.





Is this actually important?

- Yes, it really is. If you log on Facebook at different location, like at a friend's house, and don't log out, you will still be logged in. This could allow unauthorized people to look at your personal, private information.

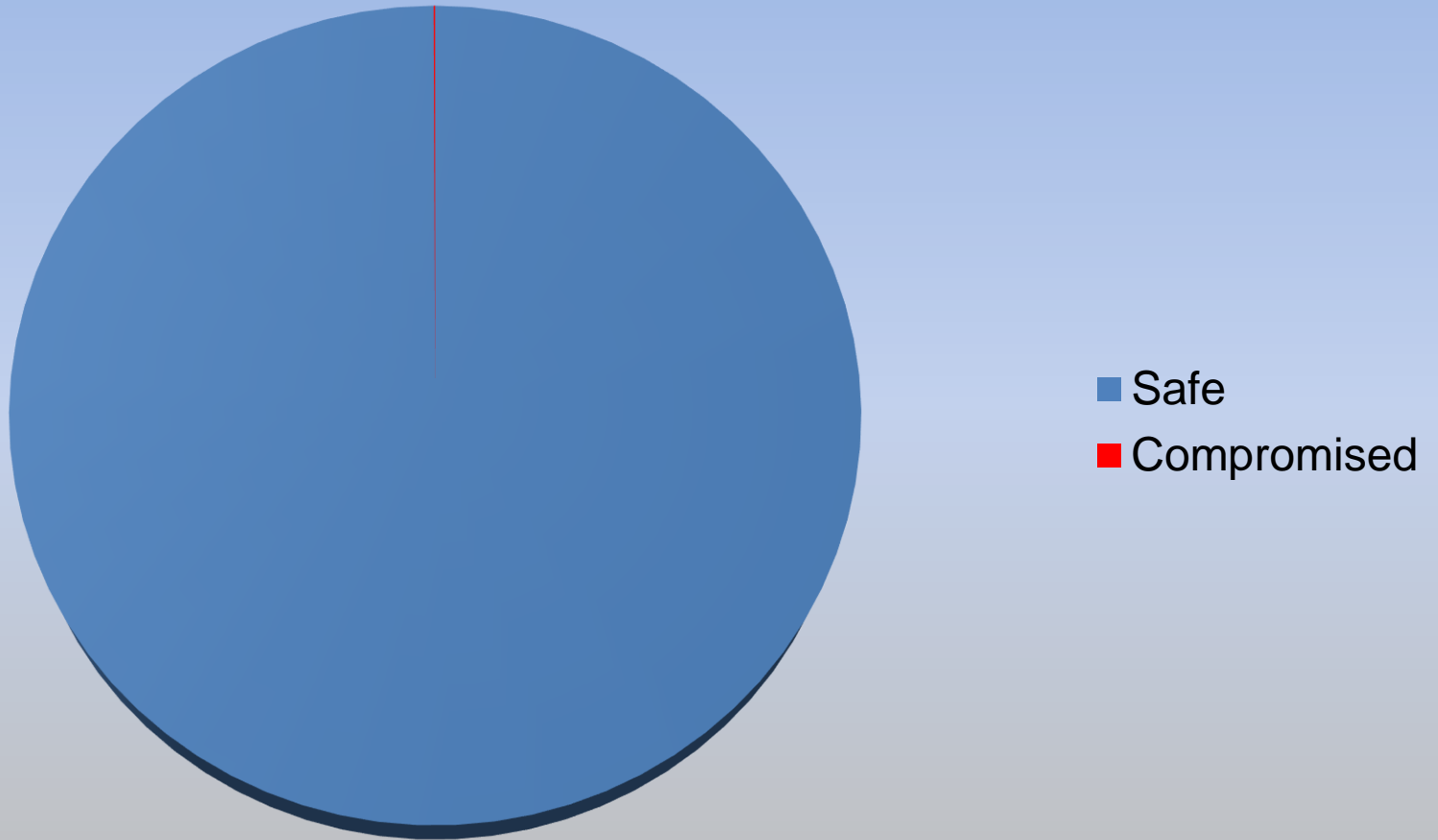
Statistics

- According to Facebook, “only .06%” of Facebook’s 1 billion logins are compromised.

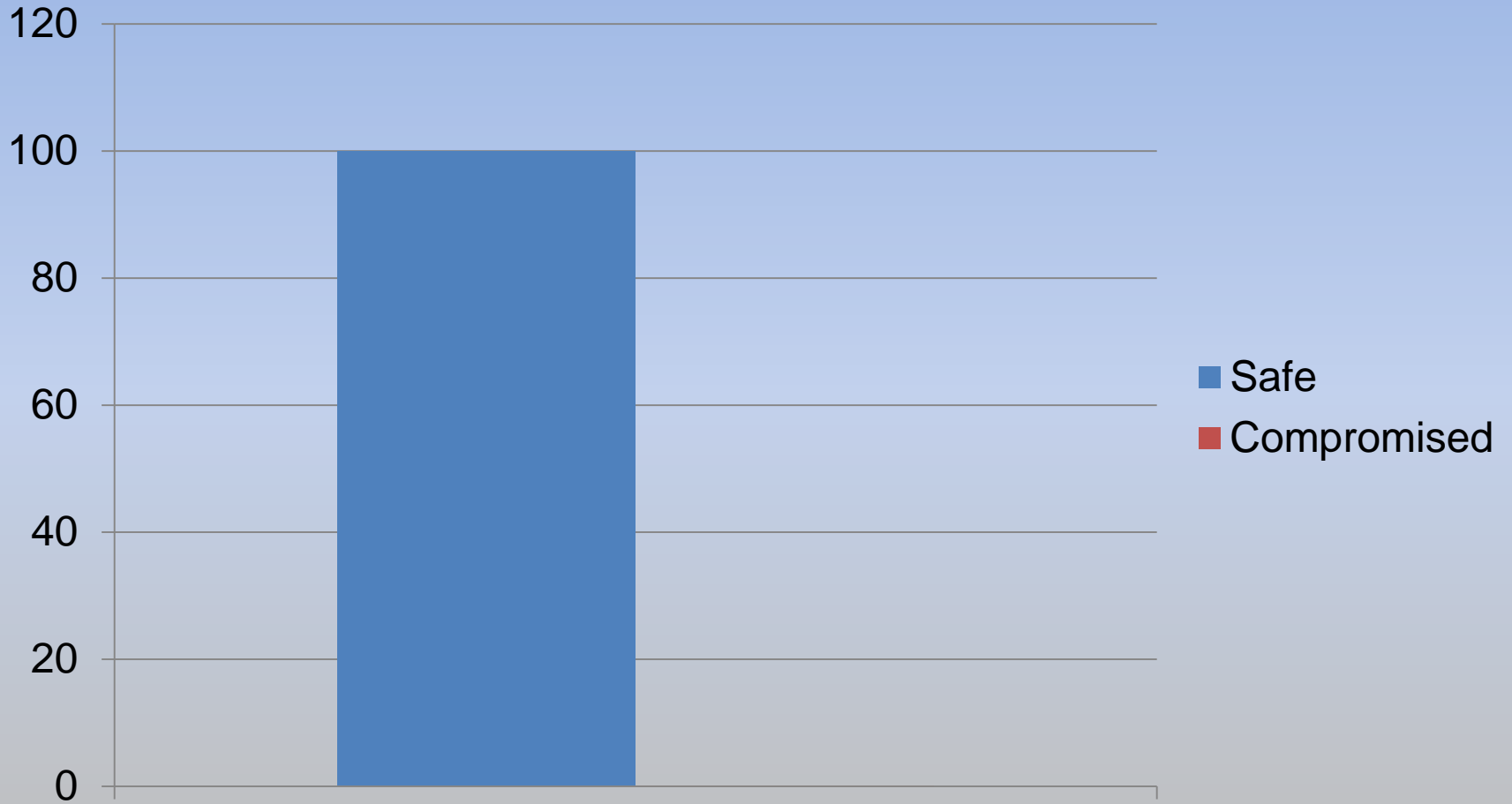


That's not too bad right?

Compromised Facebook Accounts Bar Chart




✘ Wrong ✘

- ✘ Another way to put it, 600,000 logins per day are compromised.
- ✘ This means there is one compromised login every 140 milliseconds.



Log Into Facebook

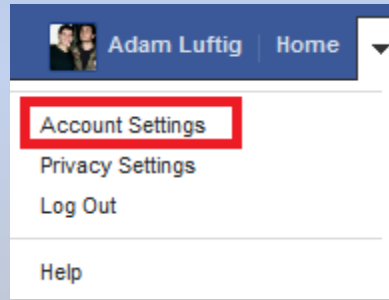
- Step one: Enter your email address and password and click login.

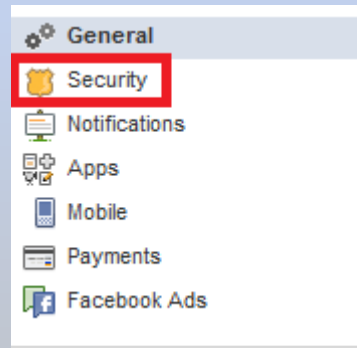
Account Settings

- Step Two: Click the arrow pointing downwards on the top right of your screen, and click on account settings.

- Step Three: Press the security button under general.

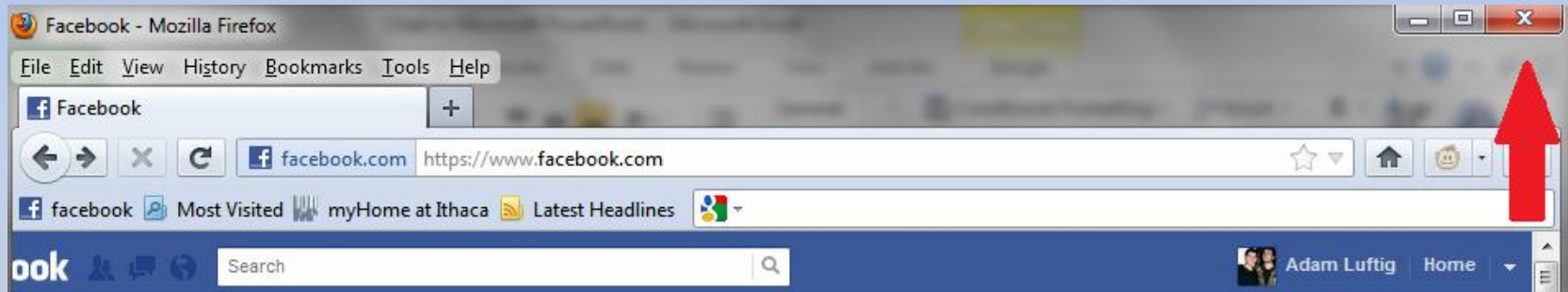

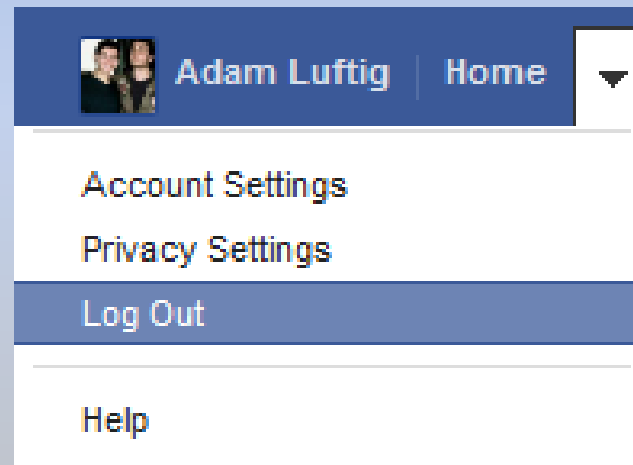
Clicking the X is **not** good enough
