LOOK OF SOUND EXHIBIT TO OPEN

A formal opening of THE LOOK OF SOUND, the exciting new exhibit on deafness located in Chapel Hall, will be held on January 15. Major financial contributors, Congressional representatives and HEW officials will be among the invited guests to the evening program and reception.

THE LOOK OF SOUND will acquaint visitors to the problems and consequences of deafness, the programs available at Gallaudet College and the potential and achievements of deaf people in our society. It is hoped that the College's efforts to interest the general public in visiting the campus will be greatly enhanced.

The new exhibit was planned and constructed largely through the efforts of Martin J. Gerra who spent 16 months on Kendall Green working on this project. Mr. Gerra came to Gallaudet through the faculty loan program of the IBM Corporation.

Major contributions for construction of THE LOOK OF SOUND have come, so far, from IBM, the Phillip L. Graham Fund, the Crown Zellerbach Foundation, the Container Corporation Foundation, the John Edward Fowler Memorial Foundation, the Texaco Foundation, the Sidney L. Hechinger Foundation, Cities Service Foundation, Western Electric Company, Inc., TRW Systems Group, Colonel Albert W. Atwood, Ms. Anna Fevold, Mr. Mario L. Santin,

and from many other donors among the College's alumni and friends.

Members of the faculty, staff and student body are welcome to view the exhibit on January 16, from 3-9 p.m., at which time an open house will be held.

COLLEGE EXTENDS LIFE OF MARKET

Occupants of the outside stands in the Farmers' Union Terminal Market at 6th and Penn Street, N.E., have been given an additional 30 days to relocate their businesses. The produce merchants are occupying a two acre site which was purchased by Gallaudet College some months ago.

The land, which was bought from the company that operates the Wax Museum, was leased to John C. Spivey, a former produce retailer. Spivey has sub-let the property to the various vendors who have sold their farm products on the site. The area has been an open air market since the early part of this century.

At the time of the sale, Historic Figures, Inc, was to inform Spivey and the merchants that the property would have to be vacated by January 1, 1976. The College intends to use the site to house our transportation vehicles and vehicle maintenance shop.

The College hopes that the extension of the January 1, deadline will permit the vendors to relocate their stalls with a minimum of disruption to their businesses.
