SUMMER CAMP FOR DEAF CHILDREN

Applications are still being accepted at the League for the Handicapped for its one-week session for deaf children at Camp Greentop, the resident facility, located in the Catoctin Mountains near Thurmont in Frederick County.

Any deaf child, seven to 14 years old, may attend Greentop from July 1 through July 8. Costs are minimal and the League provides financial assistance, known as "camperships," to needy families.
