PIETRO LAZZARI, SCULPTOR, DIES

Pietro Lazzari, 80, a sculptor, painter, muralist and teacher died on May 1, 1979. His works included a bronze bust of Eleanor Roosevelt, Pope Paul VI, Adlai Stevenson and a full length bronze sculpture of Edward Miner Gallaudet, which stands on the Gallaudet campus.

Mr. Lazzari's daughter, Nina, was a graduate of KDES and Gallaudet and now attends graduate school at the Oregon College of Education.

MIMA BRAVO COLLECTION

The Edward Miner Gallaudet Library is collecting materials to be on display in the library as part of a new collection in memory of Mima Bravo. The collection will include a recently published book entitled "Hacia Una Nueva Forma De Comunicacion Con el Sordo," the first book in Costa Rica and Central America illustrating the Costa Rican sign language.
