AGREEMENT OF MERGER

BETWEEN

INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART AND THP PLIMSOLL CLUB

This Agreement of Merger made as of this 11th day of October, 1973 by and between International Trade Mart (hereinafter referred to as "ITM"), a Louisiana Nonprofit Corporation, and The Plimsoll Club (hereinafter referred to as "Plimsoll"), a Louisiana Nonprofit Corporation.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, The Plimsoll Club and International Trade Mart are separate corporations operating under separate charters and governed by independent bylaws, and their objects and purposes are designed to implement the concept of world peace, trade and understanding, and to act as instrumentalities to develop and promote business, commercial, cultural, governmental, agricultural, educational and social ties between New Orleans and the world in the field of international relations, and particularly the other American Republics; and

WHEREAS, ITM and Plimsoll (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Constituent Corporations") are organized for purposes which are complimentary to each other and can be operated more efficiently if serged into a single corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Boards of Directors of ITM and Plimsoll have deemed it advisable, to the end that greater efficiency and economy of management may be accomplished, and otherwise and generally to the advantage and welfare of said corporations, and their several and respective members, to marge Plimsoil into ITM under and pursuant to the provisions of the Monprofit Corporation Law of the State of

Tourstand, and have approved this Agreement of Merger; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement of Merger was approved by the respective members of ITM and Plimsoll in the manner preacribed by the Nonprofit Corporation Law of Louisiana;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual agreements, provisions, covenants and grants, herein contained, it is hereby agreed by and between ITM and Plimsoll that Plimsoll shall be merged into ITM, and that ITM shall be the surviving corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation"), and that the terms and conditions of said merger, and the mode of carrying the same into effect, (which terms and conditions and mode of carrying the same into effect the said parties hereto do mutually and severally agree and covenant to observe, keep and perform,) are as follows:

ARTICLE FIRST: Name. The name of the surviving Corporation shall be International Trade Mart.

ARTICLE SECOND: Principal office. The place in the State of Louisiana where its principal office is to be located is New Orleans, Parish of Orleans, Louisiana.

ARTICLE THIRD: Purposes. The purposes of the Corporation are as set forth in Article II of the Articles of Incorporation of International Trade Mart, dated November 21, 1945.

ARTICLE FOURTH: Plimsoll Club. The Plimsoll Club, shall be operated by International Trade Mart as a division of the "Corporation" pursuant to such rules and regulations as may be established by the Board of Directors of International Trade Mart, and also pursuant to the following:

A. - ITM shall be responsible for all of the liabilities past, present, and future of Plimsoll;

C. - The Plimsoll Club shall be governed by the Board of Directors of ITM;

D. - Rules and regulations governing future membership in the Plimsoil Club shall be determined by the said Board of Directors.

applied for membership to the Executive Committee, and been approved by a majority vote thereof. The Executive Committee, acting as the Hembership Committee of International Trade Mart, shall exercise sole discretion in voting on membership applications.

 Non-voting members: Such members shall be those persons, firms or corporations who were members in good standing of the Plimsoll Club at the time of its merger with International Trade Mart.

ARTICLE SEVENTH: Voting Rights of Members: Article IV of the Charter of ITM is hereby amended so that the last paragraph thereof shall hereafter read as follows:

Said Board shall serve until the first annual meeting of the members are fixed by the bylaws, or until their successors are elected and qualified. Thereafter the members of the Board shall be elected by the contributing members.

ARTICLE EIGHTH: Bylaws: The Bylaws of ITM shall be those previously adopted by ITM which are currently in effect. except to the extent and insofar as said bylaws may be deemed amended by this Agreement, or as may be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE NINTH:

This Agreement of Merger shall take effect as of the opening of business on November 1, 1973 provided this Agreement of Merger shall have been filed on or prior to said date in the office of the Secretary of State of Louisiana, or, if filed after November 1, 1973, then as of such later date on which this Agreement of Merger is filed, provided that at the separate meetings of Plimsoll and ITM called for the purpose of considering this Merger pursuant to the provisions of the Nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of Louisiana two-thirds (2/3) of the voting members present of Plimsoll, and two-thirds (2/3) of each class of the voting members of ITM present approve this Agreement. Dear Jon:

As you know, in our recent conversations we happened to concentrate on other interesting individuals and never got around to talking about Clay Shaw. For my part, I didn't think there was much question about his involvement having been clearly established at his trial (in spite of the national media discreditation of his trial as having been a farce). Several weeks ago you called and indicated an interest in having futher clarified more details connecting Shaw with such individuals as David Ferrie. As I recall, I suggested that you read the Shaw trial transcript and you would find your question answered. (The case as presented, was effective enough that most of the non-media majority of the jurors, subsequently questioned by an interested critic of the Warren Commission, indicated that they had been satisfied by the evidence of a conspiracy and by the evidence of Shaw's involvement in it but they were not clear about what Shaw's motive could have been for his participation. Hell, if we had tried to talk to an American jury back in the late 1960's about the involvement of a domestic intelligence operation -- or, to be more accurate, a part of it -- in the assassination, we might as well have tried talking to the jury about flying saucers). In any case, by now I trust that you have had a chance to review the Shaw trial and to see that, with regard to the assassination, he was hardly Joe Smith, American. (As for the witness, Charles Spiesel, a pleasant mannered bomb unloaded on us for the trial by the Company, I think you'll agree that -- in hindsight -- he simply helps illuminate what we were up against, how naive we were in the over-all strategic game we were caught up in and -- in the final analysis -- how very naive we probably were to enter the game in the first place.

Anyway, since we talked on the phone it occurred to me that I still had (from what I had photostated before we had to abandon the D.A.'s office to the government sponsored invaders) various leads, here and there, with regard to interesting relationships of Dhaw -- especially with re-

gard to David Ferrie, Lee Oswald's mentor from C.A.P. days in spite of the soft-shoe dancing of the Warren Commission in this area. Much of our better material, as you know by now, departed from our files along with the departure of "William Boxley" -- the alumnus of Langly Field who so smoothly swiped what was left of our chastity. Nevertheless, stripping from a file here and a file there, I have put together some additional leads -- over, above and beyond the material you have in the trial transcript -- relative to interesting associations of Clay Shaw's.

At the outset, in view of an investigative weakness which should at once become apparent, you will observe that we were unable to follow out many worth-while leads. That is primarily because of something we never could afford to advertise — the fact that the actual size of the staff we had on the "great investigation" never was more than three or four, counting myself. Consequently, in sum, we have — even with the raided remnants of our files — more leads stil-to-be-checked-out than we were ever able to follow up. Quaere: do you have any extra man on your hands? If so, I'll send you up some more leads.

Having made that modest point, let me make another one -- at the risk of appearing patronizing. It is now apparent to me that -- back in 1966, 1967 and 1968 -- I aristocratically pushed aside a number of good sources of information because they were too raffish, they were drifters or they had "records". Now, a good deal older and a little bit wiser, I can look back, with hindsight, and see that some of these sources were giving us the best damned leads we had. Of course, now I know what I hadn't yet discerned then: the intelligence concept of "deniability" -- as a consequence of which the professional agent (a Shaw, a Crisman) will employ as his extension for leg work someone who, while reasonably competent, has accumulated a "record" suggesting that he is an outright bum. A record of arrests -- bad checks, vagrancy, theft, et cetera -- is made particularly attractive by a short spell at a mental institution. in the early 1960's you find such persons as David Ferrie, Thomas Beckham and William Dalzell not merely acceptable -- but particularly useful to the apparatus operating out of 531 Lafayette Street and its extensions.

What they have, in consequence, is a virtual guaranty that -- at the slightest hint of intelligence involvement in a given operation potential prosecutors will smile and shake their heads and the media -- totally invulnerable to contemporary history -- can be counted on, if any prosecution somehow does occur, to marvel at the low level of quality of witnesses selected by the politically ambitious prosecutor.

The bottom line here is that some of the material and leads I include with regard to possible associations of Clay Shaw do not come from

various clones of Jack Armstrong, the All American Boy. The point is: that's not bad -- it's good. Part of the whole Standard Operating Procedure pattern. So don't let the bad records here and there stampede you. That's what the Company had in mind when it taught its operatives how to select competent characters with incompetence written in their records. That's why Shaw and Ferrie are talking to James Whalen, an ex-con -- rather than a bank president or stock broker -- about removing the D.A. of New Orleans because they've learned he's about to dig into the New Orleans aspect of Jack Kennedy's assassination.

In any case, here are a few additional leads and bits of material — over and above the trial itself — which, I suggest, tend to disqualify Clay Shaw, the Sweetheart of the New Orleans Establishment (which went over me like a steam-roller for suggesting he was something less than Albert Schweitzer) for the Nobel Peace Prize. I can send you some more leads on Mr. Spic & Span whenever you feel you have enough investigative hands to follow them up.

MEMORANDUM

A: Statement of <u>Jules Ricco Kimble</u> meeting <u>Ferrie</u> at the Golden Lantern and re subsequent flight to Canada with <u>Shaw</u> and <u>Ferrie</u> in late 1961 or early 1962.

B: Information sheet about ownership of the Golden Lantern.

C: U.S. District Court pleadings in which certain witnesses are referred to as well as the circumstances under which they saw Shaw and Ferrie together: Betty Rubio who saw them together at Lakefront Airport; Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Tadin, who saw them to-gether at Lakefront Airport; Herbert Wagner, who apparently saw them together at Ferrie's service station; Jim Louviere, who saw them together at Ferrie's service station and at Ferrie's house and James Laurent who saw them together at Ferrie's service station in 1964 (also mentioned in the pleadings are William Dunn, who saw Shaw and Ferrie with Lee Oswald at Clinton, Town Marshal John Manchester who identified Shaw and Ferrie as the occupants of the International Trade Mart's limousine at Clinton, Henry Earl Palmer who saw Lee Oswald at the Clinton registration office and who identified Shaw and Ferrie as similar to the two men in the black I.T.M. Cadillac parked there and Corey Collins who saw Shaw. Ferrie and Oswald drive up together in the car. The latter group are among others whose testimony about seeing Shaw and Ferrie together is a matter of record at the Sha₩ trial).

<u>D</u>: Statement by <u>Nicholas Tadin</u> regarding seeing <u>Shaw</u> and <u>Ferrie</u> coming out of a hangar together at New Orleans Airport in the summer of 1964.

E: Statement by Mrs. <u>Nicholas Tadin</u> concerning seeing <u>Ferrie</u> and <u>Shaw</u> together at New Orleans Airport in the summer of 1964.

F, G, H and I: Statements and memos re Shaw being flown with White or Wight of Freeport Nickel Company (a subsidiary of Freeport Sulphur) to Cuba at an unspecified time. The lead indicates that the plane, owned by Freeport Sulphur, was flown by Dave Ferrie. The purpose of the flight, allegedly, was to set up import of Cuba sickle ore to a Canadian front which would in turn ship it to a plant to be constructed at Braithewaite (in Louisiana, near New Orleans).

J: Statement of <u>Barbara Messina</u>, Monroe, Louisiana, re having met <u>Jack Ruby</u> several times in 1963, in which she describes having been picked up on those occasions by "an elderly gray haired man in a Cadillac." (Obviously a lead in need of a thorough followup before being accepted or rejected).

K: Edward Girnius told of being involved in 1963 with individuals in Dallas (including Jack Ruby) who were engaged in buying guns. According to his statement, his activity in buying and selling guns and ammunition led him into Louisiana where, in May or June of 1963, he was introduced to Clay Shaw. Shaw. Girnius stated, informed him that he knew some men who wanted

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to buy guns. Afterwards he introduced him to a young man whom he called "Lee" and a man in a business suit. Girnius identified the young man as Lee Harvey Oswald. Girnius spoke of attending several parties where Shaw was present, at least one of which took place in Hammond (Shaw's home town) where Oswald also was present. Curiously, Girmius describes driving Oswald to "Catulla, Texas", in September, 1963, and then on into Mexico through Laredo.

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L: Typewritten item in Shaw's address book (obtained by court order from his apartment on his arrest) concerning Layten

M: Police report concerning the November 24, 1963 arrest of Layten Martens and Alvin Beaubouef in connection with the investigation of <u>David Ferrie</u> by police investigators of the New Orleans District Attorney's office. This arrest was made in connection with the inquiry into Ferrie's strange trip into Texas on November 22, 1963 (to Houston, then down to Galveston). Martens and Beaubouef were found in Ferrie's apartment, waiting for his return from Texas. Martens and Beaubouef subsequently were released and the D.A.'s office arrested Ferrie on his return from Texas and

ordered him held for the F.B.I. for questioning.

N: Police report concerning the August, 1961, arrest of
Layten Martens. Report indicates that Martens showed I.D. card
identifying himself as the Number Two man in the Cuban Revolutionary
Front. (Sergio Archacha Smith was the Number One man and David Ferrie the Number Three man in that structure at this time).

O: Statement of Mrs. June A. Rolfe to the effect that in the early 1960's she observed Clay Shaw in a light colored Thunderbird convertible with the top down. There were two young men in the front seat with Shaw and David Ferrie -- whom she recalls because of his strange "make-up job" hair was in the back seat.

P: Louisiana auto registration record of 1959 showing that Shaw's car, at the time of this registration, was a Thunderbird convertible.

Q: Statement of Edward James Whalen concerning David Ferrie persuading him to come to New Orleans, where Ferrie introduced him to Clay Shaw. During the course of a number of meetings, he states that Ferrie and Shaw sought to hire him to kill the District Attorney of New Orleans. One of the meetings was at Shaw's apartment in the 1300 block of Dauphine Street, during which meeting Dean Andrews came into Shaw's apartment and spoke privately with him. Ferrie informed Whalen that they had received "inside" information from Dean Andrews to the effect that "Jim Garrison was about to start an investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy." Whalen says, in his statement, that he turned down to start an investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Whalen says, in his statement, that he turned down 1/2 the deal because he wanted nothing to do with killing a District Attorney.

NOTE: Initially, back in 1967 when we obtained this statement, I dismissed it and set it aside as too preposterous. More

recently, I have had to re-evaluate it as probably accurate because of the specificity of detail in the statement. For example, during my earlier reading of it, I apparently missed the detail which Whalen provided concerning Ferrie and Shaw's having learned from an "inside" source -- Dean Andrews -- that I was about to start an investigation of (the New Orleans aspect of) President Kennedy's murder. (As a matter of fact, Dean Andrews was -- by a number of months -- the first person I ever talked to at any length about the assassination and the fact that the Warren Commission conclusion was impossible. Having studied his patently evasive statement made before the Commission that one "Clay Bertrand" -- a man little known or unknown to him, depending upon which part of his testimony you read -- had called him and retained him to represent Lee Oswald in Dallas, I arranged a lunch with Andrews at Broussard's Restaurant. At that time, I informed him that it was apparent to me that he was concealing the true identity of the man who called him about representing Oswald and, when he demurred, I indicated -- in effect that I intended to find out what the true facts were. I doubt that, even now, any members of my former staff knew that our whole inquiry really started off with my questioning of Dean Andrews. But, as his statement indicates, Whalen learned that from Ferrie)

R: Police report of August 18, 1961, concerning an investigation of David Ferrie with regard to a run-away youth, who apparently lived with him for awhile, named Alexander Landry. Landry was seen in Ferrie's company at a time when they were picking up Layten Martens from work. Martens is described in the report as "working in the Balter Building for a Cuban Organization helping Cuban refugees in the current Cuban situation, which is headed by Mr. Arcacha Smith". In the report, Martens stated to the officers that he "sometimes stays with Capt. Ferrie and that his mother had just recently moved and he wasn't certain of her address". The report goes on to describe a telephone call, in <u>Ferrie's</u> behalf, made by <u>Arcacha</u> in which <u>Arcacha</u> stated that he could get the boy (Landry) back for them if they would get a signed statement from the parents indicating that they would not press charges against Ferrie. This is another bit of information helping to illuminate the relationship of Layten Martens, an apparent protege of Shaw's to David Ferrie, Sergio Arcacha and the anti-Castro Cuban organiza tion. (The paragraph should be included, for evaluation yourpous, with the Murins' paragraphs L, M and N above).

T: A memorandum based upon a phone call to the District Attorney's office from Charles Krop — employed by the Illinois Migrant Council in Chicago — who, shortly after the President's death, had been contacted by a Cuban organization in Chicago which was raising funds to assassinate Fidel Castro. In this connection, KAop stated that the Cubans informed him that the two men in charge of the project were named Shaw and Ferrie and were from New Orleans. After describing the details of his having informed the F.B.I. of the Cuban group's contacts with him, Krop describes in some detail one of the Cubans contacting him — one Carlos Rodriquez, apparently a disenchanged one—time Castro warrior.

U: Memorandum in 1967 based upon a phone call from the undercover agent (Jimmy Johnson) whom the N.O. District Attorney's office by now had working as a mechanic with <u>David Ferrie</u>. Johnson describes <u>Ferrie</u> as having been visited by a Cuban or Mexican named "<u>Carlos</u>". (See preceding note re Krop communication).

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V: A memo based upon a contact with the office by Martin Waldron, then of the Houston Bureau of the New York Times. According to Bethell, who received the call, the New York Times had received two memos from one of their local stringers concerning a possible Shaw-Ferrie connection -- however the Times was, thus far, taking no action in connection with the story. According to these memos, one Ray Sadler -- then a University of South Carolina professor -- had done a doctoral thesis on an abortive (anti-Batista) invasion from New Orleans back in 1947. An airport had b been leased near Venice, Florida, by a man named Shaw. One of the pilots for the anti-Cuban mission reportedly was David Ferrie. The name of Scott Wilson, then connected with the International Trade Mart and named as a participant in the intended operation, is a correct description of an individual then of some influence in New Orleans in political and civic affairs (Note: The memo explains why the invasion plan was aborted. It should be observed, however, that -- in spite of its later unanticipated problems with Castro in pre-Castro days, the American government, primarily through the C.I.A., was engaged in sponsoring attempts to accomplish Batista's removal. The information given the office in this call is supported by interesting detail, although the date given for the abortive invasion may be a bit early [perhaps a typographical error]. As with our office apparently lacked the time and so many leads we received, personnel to follow up on this one. It is apparently still a viable lead with regard to follow-up potential).

W: Letter from one <u>Griscom Morgan</u>, of Yellow Springs, Ohio, concerning a friend of his whose mother had been housekeeper to Clay Shaw. According to Morgan, the lady was terrified by her knowledge of <u>Shaw's</u> activities. According to Morgan, "this includes knowing of <u>Ferrie's</u> association with <u>Shaw.</u>" Another interesting lead apparently farmed out to someone on the staff but not followed through. By early 1967 we were in the center of the hurricane and shortage of leads connecting <u>Shaw</u> and <u>Ferrie</u> and the <u>anti-Castro Cuban</u> and <u>Banister</u> operation was no longer our main problem. However, following through on all of them <u>was</u> — and, in hindsight, our available staff did not handle all of the follow-ups effectively).

X: An unsigned letter providing the name and address of Woodrow H. Hardy of Tampa, Florida, as a source of information concerning Shaw's associations. The writer of the letter stated that Hardy remodeled Shaw's New Orleans home. He stated further that during that period, Hardy saw "many Cuban types" at Shaw's place. He described Hardy as saying that "one man in particular . . . who denied to you that he knew Shaw, but stood outside of the residence and couldn't help but know Shaw." (It is interesting to note that this letter, which describes Hardy as a Tampa resident, is dated May 20, 1968. By that time, Kerry Thornley had become a resident of Tampa). Another lead long over-due for a follow through.

Y: Statement of Thomas Clark, one of Ferrie's covey of youthful associates. Here he described how, in 1964 while working at Ferrie's service station he saw a "small, white compact car, foreign, Renault type, come there twice." He could not make out the occupant "but it was a big man" who never got out of the car. He would wind up, taling with Ferrie, "staying in the car for over an hour. The car never came and got gas." I do not find any material at hand telling us what kind of car Shaw had or had avail-

This statement of <u>Clark's</u> went on to state that <u>Ferrie</u> had spoken to him of having "taught" <u>Oswald</u>. Additionally, <u>Ferrie</u> was described by <u>Clark</u> as having said that <u>Dean Andrews</u> was "like a brother" to him. Later, when <u>Clark</u> was arrested for vagrancy Ferrie arranged for Dean Andrews to have him paroled.

Z: Captain Soule, of N.O.P.D. temporarily working with the D.A.'s office produced this May, 1967, memo. In it he stated that one <u>William Kloepfer</u> -- "allegedly related to <u>Ruth Kloepfer</u>, who visited the <u>Oswalds</u>"was living, in 1963, at <u>724 Governor Nichols</u>, property owned by Clay Shaw. (Separate investigation by the D.A.'s office developed that William Kloepfer was a cryogenics expert employed by Boeing at the N.A.S.A. space operation at Michoud. It was also ascertained that Ruth Kloepfer and her husband -- who visited Oswald -- lived on Louisiana Avenue Parkway, a few doors away from David Ferrie and Augustin Guitart Sylvio Odio's uncle who happened to be among the spectators at the Municipal Court trial of Oswald with regard to his "fight" with Carlos Bringiues of the D.R.E.] We did not succeed in learning whether William Kloepfer was related to the Oswald- visiting Kloepfers, although there were no other Kloepfers in the phone directory.

Soule's report goes on to say that David Chandler, a States Item reporter in 1963, later -- at the time of the memorandum -occupied the Shaw apartment house at 724 Governor Nichols. With regard to Chandler, see exhibit A2 described below.

A2: Telephone numbers from Dave Ferrie's notebook. Note that Ferrie has David Chandler listed at 724 Governor Nichols St., the house which Captain Soule ascertained was owned by Shaw. David Chandler is also quite apparently in Lee Oswald's notebook, although Oswald -- an abysmal speller -- butchered his last name a bit. (Apparently, Chandler was still a reporter for the States-Item, before he became a free lance" writer -- to put it euphemistically -- because right above his name Oswald had written the name of a States city editor, David Cowan).

Because Chandler was in both Ferrie and Oswald's notebooks, and because he had spoken openly to some persons about having had dinner at Clay Shaw's on several occasions, we thought he might be able to clarify some of Shaw's relationships for us. However, he refused to give us any statement. We then subpoenaed Chandler to appear before the Grand Jury and he went into the U.S. District Court and sought to block his appearance. After a hearing in federal court, the federal judge obliged Chandler and ordered his Grand Jury subpoena quashed.

Subsequently, as a "free lance" writer, Chandler was successful in getting various articles published which rather effectively discredited the New Orleans D.A.'s office and, as a by product, its investigation of the New Orleans aspect of the Kennedy assassination. The last I heard of <u>Chandler</u>, he had moved to Atlanta. (This, incidentally, is where <u>Kerry Thornley</u> is currently playing his "freaked-out, drop-out" role. I would estimate that

the chances of <u>Chandler</u> having met <u>Thornley</u> during his French Quarter days -- in addition to having met <u>Oswald</u>, <u>Ferrie</u>, and <u>Shaw</u> -- to be quite good).

B2: Statement of <u>David Logan</u>, made by phone on April 13, 1968, to Assistant D.A. James Alcock. <u>Logan</u> described having met <u>Dave Ferrie</u> in 1961 at a party where <u>Clay Shaw</u> also was present. <u>Logan</u> was quite candid in his statement and after recounting his second meeting with <u>Shaw</u> at Dixie's Bar, he tells about going over to <u>Clay Shaw's</u> apartment for dinner. He admits having gone to bed to have sex with <u>Shaw</u>, but having balked at the whipping part. He also met <u>Shaw</u> at other gay bars which he describes by name.

In addition to putting <u>Ferrie</u> and <u>Shaw</u> together at the same party, this statement is also interesting in underscoring the identical life styles of <u>Dave Ferrie</u> and <u>Clay Shaw</u>. Interestingly enough, he describes <u>Shaw</u> as having had only one nipple. If we had an autopsy report on <u>Shaw</u> that could serve to corroborate <u>Logan's</u> statement but, as you know, <u>Shaw's</u> body was removed from Orleans Parish before the Coroner's Office could locate it.

C2: Rev. Raymond Broshears, a friend and homosexual lover of David Ferrie's in 1965, (and also a "priest" in the "Church of God of Light"), describes in this statement how Ferrie introduced him to Clay Shaw. This initial meeting took place at Dixie's bar and subsequently the three of them went to a restaurant for dinner. On the second occasion, he was again with Ferrie when Shaw drove up in a "chauffered black car" (note: Shaw had a chauffeur for awhile named Daniels). Broshears cannot recall whether the black car was a Lincoln or a Cadillac. On the third occasion, Broshears was taken by Ferrie to a French Quarter street corner to wait for Shaw. Shaw drove up and handed Ferrie a large envelope.

Incidentally, en passant in his statement, <u>Broshears</u> described meeting also a man named "<u>Kerry</u>" at Dixie's Bar. From a photograph he identified the man as <u>Kerry Thornley</u>. He stated that <u>Ferrie</u> had commented on the similarity of appearance between <u>Thornley</u> and <u>Oswald</u> but had told him that the similarity stopped with the appearance. <u>Broshears</u> also stated that he knew <u>Fred Lee Crisman</u> because <u>Crisman</u> was "the representative of the Universal Life Church in the Northwest area. (Re: this last paragraph, see earlier material sent concerning <u>Thornley</u> and <u>Crisman</u>.)

SUMMARY:

There are other leads available with regard to Shaw's relationships, but I don't think it would accomplish much to simply keep piling them up. I thought, however, that I'd get the above described — and herein inclosed — material and leads to you in order to demonstrate that Clay Shaw's relationships were more interesting, and more relevant, than they may have appeared on the surface.

STATEMENT

I met DAVID FERRIE in early 1960 in a barroom named The Golden Lantern in the French Quarter. I would see DAVE from time to time in the same bar and I flew with him in his airplane on several occasions.

One night while drinking in the Golden Lantern, DAVE introduced me to CLAY SHAW. I was with CLAY SHAW and DAVE for several hours that night which was in Late 1960 or early 1960. From that time on I use to see CLAY SHAW on different occasions, you know drinking and so forth. One day in late '61 or early '62 I received a phone call from DAVE and he asked me if I would like to take an overnight plane trip with him. I said, all right, and then met FERRIE at the airport at which time I found out that CLAY SHAW was coming with us. At this time I also found out that we were going to Canada to pick someone up. No other explanation was given. While on the trip, CLAY SHAW sat in the back of the airplane reading books and slept. SHAW also had a brown brief case with him. On the flight we stopped at different places to gas up and stretch our legs. We stopped in Nashville, Tennessee, Louisville, Kentucky, and Toranado, Canada. Our final stop was in Montreal, Canada. FERRIE and myself stayed in a hotel overnight. I believe it might have been the Hilton Air or something like that. The hotel was located in Dovral which was right outside of Montreal. CLAY SHAW disappeared after we landed and I did not see him until the next morning which was about 8 o'clock when we were ready to leave and come back to New Orleans. When SHAW arrived at the plane, he had this Mexican or Cuban with him. This guy was kind of heavy set, dark complexion, balding in the front, in his early 30's or middle 30's. He sat in the back of the airplane with SHAW and spoke only to SHAW in broken English. The airplane that we used was a Cessna 172 which I believed belonged to a friend of FERRIE's. We bought our gas with a Gulf credit card which FERRIE had. When we got back to the Lakefront Airport, I got into my automobile and FERRIE and SHAW and the other guy got into another automobile and left.

About a month or two later I got another phone call from FERRIE asking me if I wanted to make the return trip withhim to Canada, but I told him no.

I have seen SHAW on different occasions in barrooms and at the International Trade Mart up until the time that the District Attorney's office started their investigation. I have heard other people introduce CLAY SHAW as CLAY BERTRAND, but he has never been introduced to

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me as CLAY BERTRAND.

I would also like to state that about two or three weeks after DAVE FERRIE died I got a phone call from JACK HELMS who was formerly with the Federal Government and later connected with the Klu Klux Klan asking me if I would take a ride with him by FERRIE's house to pick up some papers. I said, yes, and a short while later he picked me up at my house in a 1966 white chevrolet. We drove to FERRIE's house and parked a little way down the block. JACK got out of the automobile with a flashlight and it appeared that he went around the back of the house or into the back yard. A short while later he came back with a black briefcase and got into the automobile at which time we drove off. Later I believe that the contents of this briefcase were put into a safety deposit box in the Bank of Louisiana. Later I believe that these papers were removed from the Bank of Louisiana and put into a big black box in St. Bernard Parish which belonged to the Klan. The fellow who kept this box is called OTTO. I do not know him by any other name. I believe that these papers were then removed from this black box, but I don't know where they were removed to. I did manage to get some papers from this black box, but they pertained to the Klan, and I turned these papers to CLEMENT HOOD, an FBI Agent I was working for. I also had contact with CIA Agents. Their names being STEINMEYER, who has since been transferred to Texas, and NAT BROWN who is still in New Orleans and another guy by the name of RED, last name unknown. I used to have meetings with the Agents in different motel rooms where I would give them reports, pictures, recordings, etc., and would also receive my pay check or cash which I would sign a voucher for and would also receive further instructions. They would mail different things to me at my post office box number which is 701-30252, Lafayette Street Branch.

Shailon and (maly):

Several months ago RICK TOWNLEY with WDSU called me and told me that he had information that I had tape recordings that someone wanted to buy from me. I asked him how he had found out that I had them and he said that didn't matter. He asked me if I would meet him some place and I told him yes, to come over to my house. He said, no, he wouldn't do that, that it would have to be some public place. So I met him in the Kopper Kitchen on Tulane Avenue. After we talked for a while I went home and put on a suit and we went down to WDSU. When we got to WDSU, TOWNLEY called WALTER SHERIDAN in New York and I sat there while TOWNLEY talked to SHERIDAN. After TOWNLEY hund up he said that SHERIDAN would be in town the following morning. TOWNLEY asked me what I wanted for the tapes that I had, and I told him \$500. The next morning they gave me the \$500 for the tapes and asked me if I would do a film for WDSU consisting of what I know about the Cubans, FERRIE, SHAW, etc. The tape that I sold them contained some information about the Klan and other information about the papers that were picked up at FERRIE's house. WALTER SHERIDAN is the one who gave me the \$500 for the tapes. This \$500 was in a sealed envelope and was all one hundred dollar bills. This was given to me in an office in in WDSU which was located by their newsroom. We then went upstairs and they locked the doors and placed a guard on the door and started asking questions and taking pictures of me. I even remember that there was a man from Sweden who was talking to the cameramen and they asked him to leave. They asked me questions such as, Do I know CLAY SHAW: Did I ever fly with CLAY SHAW and DAVID FERRIE: If I knew GENE DAVIS, which I told them that I knew GENE DAVIS very well because he was a personal friend of mine; If I knew GORDON NOVEL: If I ever worked for the FBI, CIA, to which questions I said, yes of which

questions WAGTER SHERIDAN said he had already known that I would say yes to. I was then told to say that I didn't know anything that would help Garrison in his investigation and this was also put on film. I don't remember everything that he told me to say but he did tell me to go to Canada. He also said that he would edit and cut the films after I was gone. He also said that they would get me an attorney if I needed one. I told SHERIDAN And TOWNLEY not to release this film if they were going to cut any part of it. They said that when I got to Canada they would call me and ask if it could be released. They called my wife later and asked her if she would let them release it and she also told them no. I understand that this film has been cut and released.

MR. HOOD told me not to get involved with the District Attorney's Office and if the District Attorney's Office tried to subpoen me, that he would take care of it. MR. HOOD told me to give all the cooperation necessary that WALTER SHERIDAN required. SHERIDAN and TOWNLEY also told me not to talk with the District Attorney's Office' and to call them right away so they could get an attorney for me. That is about all I can remember at this time.

Ι.

This Honorable Court lacks jurisdiction to grant the relief sought in Plaintiff's complaint. Title 28, Section 2283, U.S.C. prohibits the Federal Court from issuing an injunction staying pending State criminal prosecution.

II,

The District Attorney's office of Orleans Parish has interviewed and intends to present a number of witnesses who have observed defendant Clay Shaw in the company of Davistonia and Lee Harvey Oswald. Other witnesses will testify to circumstances corroborative of these facts in that they present circumstances supporting the probability of Shaw's association on some occasions with Ferrie, on some occasions

Among the witnesses whom the District Attorney of Orleans Parish intends to present as witnesses to the alleged perjury by Shaw -- and the evidence to which they will testify -- are the following:

BETTY RUBIQ - Worked at Lakefront Airport and knew Ferrie. Shortly before April, 1964, while standing in the ramp office, she noticed a plane taxi up to the ramp office. Ferrie got out and talked to her and then went back to his plane where he was met by Clay Shaw. Shaw and Ferrie talked for a while and then Ferrie got in his plane and Shaw walked past her toward the terminal building.

4 MRS. NICHOLAS TADIN - Mr. and Mrs. Tadin's son was taking flying lessons at New Orleans International Airport from David Ferrie. The Tadins always took their son to the airport and waited for him to finish his lesson so they could drive him home. The Tadins had heard that David Ferrie had made indecent advances upon juveniles in Jefferson Parish, and for that reason they were very concerned about their son while he was in Ferrie's company. in one occasion while at the New Orleans airport Mr. and Mrs. Tadin saw Clay L. JOHN MANCHESTER - Town Marshal, Clinton, Louisiana, will testify that during the time of the civil rights demonstrations in 1963, his attention was called a Cadillac parked close to the Voter Registrar's Office. He established by talking to the occupant of the car that they were from the International

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Trade Mart in New Orleans. He identifies the occupants of the car as Clay Shaw and David Ferrie.

HENRY EARL PALMER - Registrar of Voters, Clinton, Louisiana, will testify that some time between September 1 and October 15, 1963, there was a voter registration drive in Clinton. He noticed two white men in line with the colored people, who later arrived in his office, and identified one of the men as Lee Harvey Oswald. On his way out to a cafe he also noticed a black Cadillac with two men inside. He identifies them as having similar characteristics to Clay Shaw and David Ferrie. He remember telling someone the Justice Department was there and telling them to run a 1028 (license registration check) on the car. The person whom he told this to returned and told him they were not Justice Department, but from the International Trade Mart in New Orleans.

COREY COLLINS - Mr. Collins while working for the Congress of Racial Equality was in Clinton, Louisiana, in the summer of 1963 at which time he saw Clay Shaw, David Ferrie and Lee Harvey Oswald drive up together in a black automobile and park near the Registrar of Voters office.

JAMES LAURENT - Was a one-time friend of David Ferrie. In 1964 James Laurent worked as a service station

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attendant at a station not far from the one owned by Ferrie. In the latter part of the summer of 1964 he had occasion to be at Ferrie's service station and saw Clay L. Shaw there talking with David Ferrie.

The District Attorney of Orleans Parish has additionally witnesses to present, showing Shaw at various times with David Ferrie and Lee Oswald, sometimes indvidually and sometimes altogether. However, the foregoing bit should suffice to indicate that there is no legitimate basis for restraining the District Attorney from trying Clay Shaw for perjury. Moreover, such an accumulation of evidence serves to indicate that failure to prosecute Clay Shaw for perjury would be an neglect of the District Attorney's duty.

III.

Shaw's defense counsel also have subpoenaed records relative to possible previous perjury trials conducted in Orleans Parish where an acquitted defendant subsequently was charged with perjury. Such records in Orleans Parish, by law are kept by the Office of the Clerk of the Criminal District Court and not by the District Attorney's office. The District Attorney has no independent recollection of the particular activumstances of individual perjury trials over the past eighty years in New Orleans because of the large volume of criminal trials conducted in a city of this size over such a period.

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STATEMENT OF MR. NICHOLAS TADIN

I was out at the New Orleans Airport on a Saturday or a Sunday afternoon sometime during the summer of 1964. I had brought my boy out there to take some flying lessons from Dave Ferrie. After I parked my car I noticed Dave Ferrie and Clay Shaw coming out of the hangar. Dave Ferrie was about three feet ahead of Clay Shaw. Clay Shaw turned to go to his car and Dave Ferrie was coming towards me. When Shaw turned Dave waved at him. Shaw just got into his automobile and left. I asked Dave Ferrie if this was a new student that he had because I knew of Clay Shaw and he said,—No, it was a personal friend and the Manager of the International Trade Mart, and that was the end of that. However, I did call it to the attention of my wife when I saw Clay Shaw and told my wife who he was at the time. I had seen Clay Shaw several times before around the French Quarter and know positively that this was him.

My husband and I had gone out to the New Orleans Airport one afternoon sometime in the summer of 1964. While waiting to see Dave Ferrie, we saw him come out of the hangar with another person. My husband turned to me and said "Look who's with Dave" and I said "Who's that"? My husband told me that the man was Clay Shaw, a notorious degenerate.

During my recent interview with MR. JAMES J. PLAINE of Houston, Texas, MR. PLAINE informed me that he had been contacted by a MR. WHITE of Freeport Sulphur in regards to a possible assassination plan for Fidel Castro.

MR. PLAINE said that MR. WHITE was only one of the many oil and import people that he had occasion to talk to from New Orleans regarding Castro.

MR. PLAINE also informed me that he thought that the picture of CLAY SHAW was very familiar, and that he may have met him in Houston, either at his apartment or at the Normandy Club which the oil people of Texas frequent.

A memo in the GUY BANISTER file indicates that there is information which reports that RICK WHITE/ a high official of Freeport Sulphur, and CLAY SHAW were flown to Cuba probably taking off from the Harvey Canal area in a Freeport Sulphur plane piloted by DAVE FERRIE. The purpose of this trip was to set up import of Cuba's nickle ore to a Canadian from corporation which would in turn ships to the Braithwaite nickle plant. The plant was built by the U. S. Government at a cost of about one million dollars.

The report is that the combine of Freeport Sulphur, WHITE, and SHAW purchased the plant for a million dollars and intended to get one through a Canadian corporation they had cormed. There is also a report that GUY BANISTER hired FERRIE and JACK MARTIN as investigators to check out the nickle plant deal.

Steve Bordelon and I traveled to Monroe, Louisiana, in an effort to locate our deaf mute and GAIL HALL and talk to BARBARA MESSINA. Because of certain complications, our travel was not an overwhelming success, however, some substantial contacts were made for future reference.

BARBARA MESSINA who resides at 1507 Spencer Street, Monroe, Louisiana, phone number 387-6410, had previously told AUBREY YOUNG that she did have occasion to meet JACK RUBY in (1963) She said that RUBY called her several times. She said that she had occasion to have dinner with JACK RUBY several times. She also said that on these occasions she was picked up by an elderly gray-haired man in a Cadillac and taken to meet RUBY.

She does not know the name of the driver and AUBREY did not have any pictures to show her. She also said that RUBY had a nice looking young man with him on these occasions. She also said that she happened to meet a person whose picture she saw on television after the assassination. She does not know any of people's names. She said that RUBY offered to get her a job in Dallas with a doctor.

We tried to locate BARBARA MESSINA for two days but no one answered her phone and AUBREY said that he thought that she had left town because she was terribly frightened and knew that we were on our way up to see her.

We contacted SHERIFF BILL CAUSEY in regard to GAIL HALL and he said that the name was not familiar to him. He did refer us to ROY LEA LINER who runs a shoe repair shop-at 1208 Cypress Street in W. Monroe, Louisiana, phone number 323-2970. LINER's parents are deaf mutes and he holds classes for the deaf mutes in the Monroe area. I gave him all the information that we had on our deaf mute and he said that he would make an effort to locate him for us.

SHORTY BELL who runs the Red Ball Pool Hall at 5709 Desaird Street is another person who has some contact with the deaf community, and who is attempting to help us.

We talked with JACK HESNI who runs the Majestic Hotel on Sixth and Desaird Street in Monroe and he said that to his knowledge he knows of no deaf mute who has stayed at the hotel. He said that he has a big turnover in night clerks and perhaps they may have seen or heard of the deaf mute, but that he hasn't.

EDWARD JULIUS GIRNUS was interviewed at the United State Penitentiary in Atlanta, Georgia, on December 5, 1967. He was in that institution for a violation of the Dyer Act (interstate transportation of stolen vehicles). GIRNUS stated he owed the State of Virginia 28 years for various unspecified criminal violations.

As GIRNUS recalls, he was released from the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas, on January 11, 1963 -- his rap sheet indicates he was released on February 14, 1963. He was in that institution for interstate transportation of a forged instrument. Immediately upon his release, GIRNUS moved to Pasadena, Texas, which is just outside of Houston. Being on 21 month conditional release, he had to report to a federal parole officer every thirty days. While in Pasadena he used the name of EDWARD STARK.

Sometime in February or early March, 1963, GIRNUS made a trip to New Orleans. He was down here looking for some old friends. He stayed at a hotel one block off of Canal Street, on or near North Rampart Street. He did not find the persons he was looking for so he returned to Pasadena, Texas. While he stayed in Pasadena, he lived on South Randal Street. He couldn't recall the street number.

In March, 1963, GIRNUS moved to Waco, Taxas. While there he lived with a woman, not his wife, at 1806 Independence Avenue.

Sometime in March or April, 1963, GIRNUS moved to Dallas, Texas. He was still with the woman he met in Waco, and he stayed at the St. George Hotel. The St. George is on Elm Street two blocks from the Records building. At this time he was using the name EDWARD STARK almost exclusively. During this period GIRNUS was charged with embezzlement from a gunsmith who owned two gun shops in Dallas. (GIRNUS' rap sheet shows an embezzlement charge was nolle prossed in Dallas on May 18, 1964). Also during this stay in Dallas, GIRNUS, using the name of STARK, frequented the Theatre lounge, Circus lounge and the Diamond Horsesnoe lounge. JACK RUBY allegedly owned one of these lounges.

GIRNUS associated with some of the strippers from these clubs... Most of these girls stayed at the Blue Bonnet Hotel on Commerce Street. Through his association with these people and these clubs, GIRNUS met a friend of JACK RUBY's who was interested in buying guns. This man, who GIRNUS would not identify, was associated with a rabid right-wing group who had access to large amounts of money. GIRNUS also met a man from New Orleans through this group who was interested in purchasing guns. As a result of a conversation with the man from New Orleans, GIRNUS moved to Leasville, Louisiana. GIRNUS would not identify this man from K

New Orleans. 3 12

On the French Strand

GIRNUS went to Leesville in a pickup truck he had purchased in Oak Cliff using the name of RITTNER. RITTNER is supposed to be an engineer from New Orleans. GIRNUS had somehow gotten his identification papers.

GIRNUS arrived in Leesville sometime in early April, 1963. He moved in with a woman who owned a bar and gambling joint by the name of Marte's Hideaway. The woman's first name was MARTE. While in Leesville, GIRNUS became associated with an organization known as the Democratic Club. The membership of the club consisted of both military and civilian personnel. The organization used a private club named the Ponderosa for their functions.

At this time, GIRNUS was buying and selling guns. He bought most of his guns from some military men he had met at the club. During this time he shot a sergeant, but paid \$800 and no charges were pressed. The sergeant's name was FOWLER and after the shooting he was transferred to Fort Sam Houston in Texas. GIRNUS made several trips to New Orleans with the guns and ammunition. He thought the guns were ending up ultimately in Central America.

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On one of these trips to New Orleans in May or June, 1963. GIRNUS met CLAY SEAM. On this particular trip GIRNUS, using the name of EDWARD STARK, stayed at a big hotel which had a street-level garage facing Chartres Street. The garage was at the back of the hotel and it was near the Alpine Restaurant and Bar. GIRNUS met SHAW in the Alpine Restaurant and Bar. He was introduced to SHAW by a man who owns an apartment house on Exchange Alley or Place. This apartment building has a courtyard. The man who owns it is a homosexual. He is short, fat, wears glasses, hald and everytime GIRNUS saw him he was wearing bermuda shorts and sometimes he would be walking a dog.

When GIRNUS met SHAW on this occasion, he was with a group of people. A man who owned a bar in the Quarter by the name of MAXIE WOOD or WOODS was in the group. Also, there was a woman who was either presently WOOD(S) wife or ex-wife. She also owned a bar. A New Orleans Police Sergeant who owned a cafe or bar was also present. The police officer was heavy set with brown hair. He did not wear glasses. O Clentfy police sergest the contract of the police of the contract of the police of the contract of the co

SHAW spoke to GIRNUS a little while, and during the conversation invited GIRNUS (STARK) to his home in (Hammond, Louisiana) GIRNUS felt that everyone in the group knew of his mun running activities

About 8 or 9 days after this initial meeting with SHAW, GIRNUS returned to New Orleans from Leesville. He stayed at a motel on the Airline Highway, but he cannot remember its name. He went to a bar in the Quarter — the one the woman at the Alpine bar owned — and met a man who he deemed to be the manager. He and this man (name and description unknown) went by car to an office in a building in the central business district near Sears Roebuck.

SHAW: OSWALD:

SHAW was in the office and they started talking about guns. SHAW allegedly knew some people who wanted to buy some guns. SHAW made a Eclephone call, and sometime thereafter two men came to the office. One of the men was LEE HARVEY OSWALD. OSWALD was introduced by SHAW to GIRNUS as LEE. GIRNUS cannot remember the name of the man who came in with OSWALD. He was well dressed in a business suit, 5'll" tall, 210 pounds, and he had dark black hair. OSWALD was wearing khaki pants and a white shirt. This meeting took place sometime before noon, however, GIRNUS cannot remember the day of the web;

The start

This conversation centered principally on Central and South America -- the best way to get there and the general living conditions. GIRNUS, who said he had traveled quite a bit in Central Austica, told OSWALD what he knew about these countries. Suddenly, at this point in the interview, GIRNUS told me he did not want to give me any more details. He said the institution (panitentiary) bugged him, and he did not want to talk any further lest he get himself into a storm. (He was obviously committing crimes in this area, and was fearfulof prosecution). He said he did not realize I would be taking down everything he said. He told me he would have someone in Atlanta send me a picture of two people. One of the persons in the picture was LEE OSWALD. He said the picture was taken in Mexico. Additionally, he was sending me an FAA flight plan which would be self explanatory and helpful in our investigation. FERRIE allegedly had something to do with the flight recorded on the flight plan.

I assured him we were only interested in facts that aided us in our investigation, but he still refused to go on with a fact-detailing interview. So I put my pad away, and engaged him in general conversation about the prison. During this conversation I was able to elicit a few more facts.

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The last time GIRNUS saw OSWALD was when he drove him to Catulla, Texas. This trip took place sometime in September, 1963) While in Catulla, GIRNUS introduced OSWALD to a friend of his who was an ex-Mexican army man. OSWALD and GIRNUS' friend went into Mexico through Laredo, Texas. Their trip had something to do with getting OSWALD'a passport.

SMAW !

OTRNUS attended several parties where SHAW was present. At least one of these took place in Hammond, Louisiana) GTRNUS thought it was SHAW's home, but he was not sure of this. OSWALD was at this particular party which took place in a large colonial brick house which had a big yard all around it.

Though GIRNUS terminated this particular interview abruptly and at a crucial time, I feel he will talk to me further.

met Assistant District Attorney, Frank Klein, in the office
of the District Attorney. At that time Mr. Klein began an
investigation as to the possibility of David Ferrie being
involved in the assasination of President John P. Hennedy,
which had occurred in Dallas, Texas, On November 22, 1963 by
the bands of Lee Harvey Oswald. Information had been brought
to the attention of Mr. Klein that David Ferrie and Lee Harvey
Oswald had been friends and associates in the past.

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With this information at about shortly after midnight these officers went to 3330 Louisiana Avenue Parkway, knocked on the door and same was opened by a subject who identified hisself as Alvin Beaubouef. The officers requested the present whereabouts of David Ferrie and Beaubouef said he did not know. It was obvious that he was trying to conceal the facts. He was placed under arrest and the officers went up to the second . . story apartment where they found Layton Martens seated in a chair. This subject was questioned and he stated that he was presently living with Ferrie. However, he did not know the present whereabouts of Ferrie. Martens too was placed under arrest and the officers instituted a search. In this residence was found a Smith & Wesson 38 cal. 5 inch barrell 6 shot revolver, butt No. 85392, cylinder No. 96585; a holster for this revolver; a 22 cal. Hamilton rifle; a large bore English Army type rifle, Serial No. 7/47AB5633; a bayonet having a holster; a flare gun; and a large quantity of ammunition. Martens denied the ownership of these items stating they belonged to Ferrie.

Martens and Beaubouef were conveyed to the district police station and a continuous stakeout was placed on 3330 Louisiana Avenue Parkway. Numerous locations in the city were checked on an attempt to locate Ferrie. All were negative. At about 4:30 P.M. on this date of 11/25/63, David Ferrie appeared in the office of the District Attorney with his attorney, Mr. G. Wray Gill. At this time he was questioned by Mr. Kicin and Officer Comstock. He was allowed to see a photograph of Lea Harvey Oswald and he denied ever deeing this man before. He related a story of having left New Orleans at about 9:00 P.M., Friday, November 22, 1963, going to Houston, Texas

His office conducted a preliminary investigation; however, they were unable to implicate this subject in the assessination of President Kennedy. On 11/26/63 Captain Priest of the Houston Police Department Detective Bureau was contacted by telephone and asked to verify the movements which Ferrie described relative to him being in the State of Texas. After several hours Captain Priest notified this office the results of his investigation which corroborated the story related by Ferrie in that Ferrie arrived in Houston on 11/23/63 and made a visit to a skating rink owned by an individual named Roland. Captain Priest was also able to corroborate Ferrie's story as to him being in Galveston, Texas the following day.

The officers have been unable to uncover any evidence which would link Perrie to the assasination of President Konnedy.

All of the above described items seized from the home of Ferrie were returned to him after they had been photographed and social numbers taken wherever possible.

(What Officers were unaware of at the time was that Captain David Ferris was being sought by Jefferson Parish Authorities for Investigation of Intimidation of a witness in a criminal proceeding against him (Perris) for Indecent Behavior with a Juvenile.

At the Third District Station, the gan, make-up kit, the handbeg and serial maps were all entered on the Third Dist. Property book under the name of Captain Dave Ferrie, with the notation that they were to be held until Sgt. Heft of the Tactical Unit was notified of person who came to claim them. (An investigation made by members of the day platoon of the Edgtrs. Tactical Unit, revealed that the .38 cal. Smith and Wesson is the property of Captain Dave Ferrie and is registered to him.)

At this point of the investigation, the purposes of the three arrested subjects were not alear. Their reasons for being in the area were not satisfactory. As of the time this report is written, Saturday, Sept. 2, 1961 10:30 P.M., attempts to connect them with the commission of recent burglaries committed in New Orleans are unsuccessful.

On August 31, 1961 at 8:15 P.M., Agent Debruys of the local P.B.I. Office lifted the PBI hold on all three one. All three are free on parole at this time.

Edward James Whalen was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on December 10, 1923. He left school after the 9th grade to help support his family. From that time on he has consistently been in trouble with the law, and has spent most of his adult life in prison. His specialty seems to be armed robbery and burglary. He has served time in the state penitentiary in Pennsylvania three times and has been semtenced to the Federal penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia once. Since March, 1965, he has twice been declared incompetent to stand trial in the Federal Courts by members of the staff at the United States Medical Center for federal prisoners at Springfield, Missouri. Whalen also stated that he had received some psychiatric treatment at the state penitentiary in Pennsylvania. He is presently awaiting a competency hearing on a federal charge of assaulting a United States Marshal and escape.

After being paroled on December 10, 1964 from the Pennsylvania state penitentiary at Huntington, Pennsylvania, Edward Whalen went to Philadelphia to spend some time with his family. While there he became involved in some very serious criminal activity, and had to leave town immediately. He stole a car in upstate Pennsylvania and drove to Columbus, Ohio where he met a friend of his who told him he could make some big money. His friend, whose name he would not give me, placed a call to DAVID FERRIE in New Orleans. WHALEN spoke to FERRIE and FERRIE asked him to come to New Orleans. Before leaving Columbus, WHALEN was told that the big money was to be made by hitting the Jung Hotel and a small lewelry store at the intersection of Baronne and Gravier Streets. WHALEN definitely recalls being in Columbus on February 21, 1965.

EDWARD WHALEN drove to New Orleans in the car he stole in Pennsylvania. It was a 1964 Chevrolet Impala hardtop. This car was abandoned in New Orleans immediately upon WHALEN's arrival. Shortly after his arrival in New Orleans, WHALEN met DAVE FERRIE at the Absinthe House on Bourbon Street. FERRIE, who was shabbily dressed, appeared intoxicated to WHALEN. At this first meeting, FERRIE spoke of his flying ability. WHALEN told FERRIE he needed money since he was on the run from the police. FERRIE assured him he could earn a large sum of money, and, if need be, he, FERRIE, would fly him out of the country. This first

meeting lasted about 30 minutes without FERRIE actually telling ...

After this meeting, WHALEN spent the night at an apartment provided by FERRIE. The apartment, as WHALEN recells, was located near or on Carrollton Avenue hear its intersection with Tulane Avenue. FERRIE also plovided WHALEN with a 1953 black Galaxie Ford for his use while he was in town. WHALEN was to meet FERRIE and someone else at the Absinthe House the next night at about 11:45 P.M.

might. Shortly thereafter, FERRIE and Chay SHAW arrived and FERRIE introduced SHAW to WHALEN. At this time, SHAW was introduced as CLAY SHAW. At this meeting FERRIE did most of the talking. WHALEN felt SHAW was sizing him up. During the course of the conversation, FERRIE referred to SHAW as CLAY BERTRAND. SHAW became obviously irritated but said nothing directly to FERRIE? Upon leaving the bar, all three drove to FERRIE's apartment in the car being used by WHALEN.

As WHALEN now recalls, FERRIE's apartment was on Louisiana Boulevard and it was a two-story structure with a screened front porch. They entered the rear of the first floor apartment and remained in that apartment the entire time. However, WHALEN recalls FERRIE going upstairs occasionally by the use of a stairway in the room next to the one they were using. WHALEN also remembers PERRY RUSSO walking through the room on one occasion. However, he did not say anything to anyone in the room. WHALEN stated that the furniture in the apartment was old and inexpensive. Also, that the apartment was in a generally shabby condition.

WHALEN to do for his money - they wanted someone killed. SHAW was to pay WHALEN ten thousand dollars before the job was done and another fifteen thousand dollars after its completion. Upon completion of the job, SHAW was to provide WHALEN with a phony passport and (FERRIE) was to fly him to Mexico. The intended victim's name was not mentioned at this time. WHALEN wanted no part of the deal, but he pretended to string along. Before leaving, SHAW gave: WHALEN three hundred dollars spending money.

WHALEN spent that night at a motel on Tulane Avenue near the Fontainebleau. He did not use his real name to register and cannot remember the one he used.

The next day, FERRIE met WHALEN at Moran's Restaurant at 10:30 in the morning. FERRIE suggested they take a ride and talk. While in the car FERRIE asked WHALEN if he had ever heard of Jim Garrison. WHALEN said he had not. FERRIE then told WHALEN that Garrison was the District Attorney, and that this was the man SHAW and he wanted killed. WHALEN at this time told FERRIE he wanted absolutely nothing to do with the deal. FERRIE attempted to talk WHALEN into going throught with the plan, but WHALEN persisted that he would not have anything to do with it. They then

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parted with the agreement to meet the next night at the Absinthe House. WHALEN spent that night at a motel on the Airline Highway. He does not remember the name of the motel or the name he registered under.

whalen and FERRIE met at the Absinthe House the next night as planned. From there they went directly to SHAW's apartment in the 1300 block of Pauphing Street. WHALEN remembered the apartment was on the first flow but not the color of the front door. He did not remember the courtyard until specifically asked about it. He does not recall any of the interior of the apartment except that it was very lavish.

Af first only SHAW, FERRIE and WHALEN were in the apartment, and SHAW and FERRIE were trying to persuade WHALEN to go through with the plan. About one half hour after WHALEN's and FERRIE's arrival, a short fat man Wearing dark glasses arrived. This man was introduced to WHALEN by SHAW as DEAN AMDREWS, AMDREWS, and SHAW had some conversation away from FERRIE and WHALEN, and shortly thereafter AMDREWS left the apartment. SHAW then returned to WHALEN and continued to try to persuade him. SHAW said that he had done some checking on WHALEN and that he knew of WHALEN's crippled daughter — she suffered from polio. SHAW said that If WHALEN would go through with the plan he would get WHALEN's daughter the finest medical treatment money could buy, and also see to it that she was sent to college. However, WHALEN insisted that he would not kill a District Attorney, and he and FERRIE left.

Once outside, FERRIE told WHALEN that CLAY BERTRAND could do a lot for him and that he was making a mistake. Also at this time FERRIE spoke of LEE OSWALD He said that SHAW (BERTRAND) had done a lot for OSWALD, and that it was only because OSWALD fouled up that he was killed. He intimated that SHAW had given OSWALD some financial support and had contacted some people in Cuba and Mexico for him.

At this time he also mentioned the name of SENATOR
JOHN TOWER of Texas and DAWTE MAROCHINI) FERRIE boasted that he
had set up the assassination of John Kennedy. WHALEN stated that

boasting and name-dropping in an attempt to get him to change his
mind. FERRIE also mentioned the meeting between SHAW, JACK RUBY,
and LEE HARVEY OSWALD in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. FERRIE stated

Pata Roland Fouraior and Charles Jossu report of having been assigned to a case involving a runsway on Fednesday August 16, 1961, after being so directed by Lt. August C. Lang, acting commander of the juvenile Bureau. Investigating Officers met with Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Landry at 5221 Arts St., who are the persons of runsway juvenile Alexander Landry Jr. WM Age 16 of the seme address. From Mr. and Mrs. Landry the following information was obsained. On August 2, 1961 Alexander Landry ran eway from home and 24 hours later, was found at the home of Capt.Dave Ferrie, a pilot with Eastern Air Lines, who resides at 331 Atherton Drive in Metairie, La., and who supposedely is landry's unit commander with the Civil Air Fetrol. Mr. and Mrs. Landry explained that they called Dave Ferrie's residence to see if their boy was there, and was told by some unidentified voice that their boy was not at Ferrie's residence. Mr. and Mrs. Landry stated that they sade this know to Lawrence March VM Age 18 of 4404 Majestic Caka St., who stated that he would return their son home. March went to Ferrie's residence and later returned with Alexander Landry Jr.

On August 5, 1961 Al Landry ron away from home again, at which time his parents again suspected that Capt Ferrie was assisting the boy in his efforts to stay away from home. As of the 17th of August 1961, Landry has not returned home.

Mr. and Mrs. Lendry expressed a lack of confidence in Capt Dave Ferrie. They stated that since their son joined the C.A.P. squadron of Capt Ferrie, that he has never been the sense. According to Mr. and Er. Landry it was learned that they had thus far, been unable to determine if Ferrie's Civil Air Patrol Squadrou's charter is legimate. Civil Air Patrol Edg., in Hew Orleans is conducting an investigation and as of this date, it has been found that there is no record of Capt Ferrie's unit in New Orleans, and further that Air Force Edg., is 'ashington D. C. had no record. Hr. and Mrs. Landry further stated that all of the parents of the boys in the squadron are concerned about the velidity of the unit and all fold that their boys are not getting the prescribed training. The F.B.I. was notified about this matter. Mr. and Mrs. Lendry stated that Dave Ferrie has taken their non on flights, and has leased the boy his car, while away on a flight. Mr. Landry stated that he personally saw Dave Ferrie take several of the juvenile boys into a bar and lounge on Homedele Avenue in this city. Mr. Landry stated that he has perconally observed several boys at the home of Ferrie on several occasions. Mr. and Mrs. Lendry state that since their boy met Capt Ferrie, that he has, on many occasions, stayed out until 2 or 3 o'clock in the morning. The Landrys showed investigating officers a publication on the Falcon Janadron, put out by Capt Ferrie. A short article mentioned Alexander Landry, indicating that he was doing extremely well at school, however Mr. and Mrs. Landry told officers that this was untrae, because the fact is that their son is almost folling.

Er. Landry furnished officers with the names of two of their son's friends in Biloxi cut Corpus Christi, Texas, Radiograms were sent to both locations on 6-15-61.

Mr. Lendry furnished officers with the following nesse of boys who were in the Squadron with their son: <u>Michard Domes</u> VM Age 16 of 2338 Madrid. Richard stated that on about 2 occasions he slept at Capt Ferrie'd house,, and that on one occasion, when Layton Martens and Al Landry were there, he (Dumas) elept in the same bed with Capt Ferrie, and that Capt Ferrie assturbated him and at the same time Capt Ferrie mesturbated himself. Dumas did not know if Landry and Martens witnessed the act. Dumas stated that Capt Ferrie did this to him on a Saturday in the first or second week of July of this year. Dumas stated that Capt Ferrie was a hypnotist and that he once saw Ferrie put James Landry under hyponosis and tall him (Landry) that he should forget his girl. Capt Ferrie told Dumas that he heted woman.

Richard Dumas also told officers that after the renewy of Al Lendry, on August 5, 1961, Al was seen in the company of Capt Ferrie on Monday August 7, 1981 at 5:007M entside of the Balter Bullding in Capt Ferrie's car and that they were picking up Levton Eartens from work. Bichard stated that Al Landry was also seen by the Balter Building on Tuesday August 8, 1981. A statement will be taken from Dumas as to the indecent behavior matter and will be turned over to Jeffercon Tarish authorities. It. Henry Sardenge has already been notified of the statement made by Dumas.

Investigating officers learned that Layton Martons) was working in an office in the Salvar Bullating for a cuban organization halping Guesa Foregoes in the current Cuban situation, which is headed by Mr. Arcache Cmith, who resides at 118 foreb St. Officers work to this office on the effer hoom of August 16, 1961, but were unable to logate Mr. Smith or Layten Martons. Miss Mancy Falker, sucretary to Mr. Smith was shown a picture of Al Landry, the runaway boy, and she immediately identified him. She stated that Al had been to the office on two successive days, which she thought were a Monday and a Tuesday. She did not know the dates that she saw Landry but stated thatit was definately after August 5, 1981. She stated that Landry was in the company of Dave Forrie on the two occasions. Note: This was after the runaway date of Al Landry. It was also learned that Capt Ferrie had volunteered his services to Mr. Smith after the Cuban situation broke, as did Leyton Martons. Al Lurdry cut the conversation short with his mother, and she was unable to get may information except that she heard the operator say that the cell was coming from Huston, Toxas. Investigating officers want to the telephone company and they will attempt to learn the location of the cell in Houston. They will also check cells made from Capt Ferris's house to Houston, if any.

On the efternoon of August 17, 1961, Mr. Anith celled officers and requested that we come to his office, which was ismediately done. Mr. Emith excluded that Cept Ferrie had come to see him and that he, Mr. Emith had informed Cept Ferrie of the investigation being conducted. Investigating officers attempted to interview James Landry at 3006 Dumain Ste, who was out of town on vacation, and it was not known when he would return.

Officers spoke with Lee Bevon WM Age 16 of 10 Azalea Brive, Cretna, La., who stated that he had spent several nights at Dave Ferrie house along with many of the other boys in the squadron. He stated that many of them to sleep on the floor. He denied having any knowledge of Ferrie's sex activity.

Officers spoke with John Espanan M4 Age 14 of 2338 Dreaux St., and he too admitted sleeping a Dave Ferrie House but denied having knowledge of Dave nex activity. Firs. Espanan told officers that on one occasion, she had to adminish John for coming back from Ferrie's house at 12:30AM, when he should have been home at 13:00PM.

Investigating officers presently attempting to question <u>Rutch Margel</u> MA Age 19 of 1404 Majestic St. Officers learned from Mrs. Landry that this boy was deadly involved with Capt Ferrie at one time and that he finally broke away from Ferrie. Butch Marsch was responsible for finding her son at Ferrie's house when he ran away from home on August 2, 1961. Butch is presently working with his father in the constriction business and has gotten away from Ferrie. Marsch told Mrs. Landry that the only way her son will leave Ferrie, is when Ferrie finds someone else and drops her son Mrs. Landry explained that Marsch is growing up and finally realizing that he was wrong.

Mrs. Landry explained further that Copt Forrie went to far as to go to her son's school and try to get his schedule changed and that school authorities called she and Mr. Landry down to the school. The school authorities felt that the boy could not handle the schedule, proposed by Ferrie. Mrs. Landry pointed out that this was one of the many ways, in which Ferrie has interferred with the raising of her son.

Investigating officers contacted Dave Forrie. He denied having done any thing wrong. He questioned Officers in an effort to learn what information officers had against him. He wanted to know if anything would be done to him after the boy was returned. He harped on the idea that he was interested in the boy's welfare and felt that things ers too tough for the boy at home, and wasted to know what would be done to the boy after his return. Ferrie insisted that he didn't know where the boy was staying in Houston but stated that he was flying to Houston tonight, to see if I can find him and return him to Hew Orleans".

Investigating officers contacted Lawrence Marsch WM Age 18 of 4404 Majestic Ocks. The report previously refers to him as Butch Marsch. Marsch stated that he assisted Mrs. Landry to get her boy back, Marsch when he ran evay on August 2, 1961, because he knew quote "that all boys go to Ferrie when they ran away from home. He denied having any knowledge of Dave Ferrie behavior in regard to sex. Marsch has know Ferrie for 4 years.

At approximately 3:30FM August 18, 1961, Investigating officer Fournier, received a telephone call from Mr. Arcacha from the Balter Building. Mr. Arcacha Smith stated that he could get the boy back for us, if we could get a signed statement from the parents indicating that they would not press charges against David Forrie. Er. The boy was questioned about t is and he could not give an explanation. The boy flately refused to make a statement against KKX Pavid Ferric, however he id did admit that Capt Ferria took as many as 50 boys to Graci's Lounce on Housdale Avenue, and bought them beer, while they were sitting on the resturgant side of the establishment. The boy told his father in the presence of officers, that he was going to make a charge against his father for giving beer to a juvenile one time, while painting the family home. The boy was extramely cold to his parents, and yet it is the opinion of investigating officers that Al Landry comes from as find an home as any boy could ask for. The boy was questioned further about his trip to Houston, and he asswered that he did not remember.

After the interregation on Friday August 18th, 1961, Al Landry was taken to the Youth Study Center. On Monday August 21, 1961, Investigating office questioned him further, while at the Center. He refused to make a statement. He stated that he had been to Cuba on several occasions since the revolution and stated that America should wake up because the Russians are 90 miles away. He would not say how he got to Cuba, when he went, or who he went with. He again showed his unconcern for his parents.

Investigating office's, while at the Youth Study Center, discussed Al Landry's case with the assistant superlatendent of the institution. We recalled an incident similar to this case involving a runeway boy. The visitor's Record Book was checked and on Page-82, the Following entry was made:

Investigating officers observed in the book, a notation written in red pencil FOT AN COPICIAL VISIT, indicating that Dr. D. Forrie had come to see Albert Thermie, juvenile boy, without authority, acting as aprofessional can seeing his patient. This book, according to the Youth Study Center policy, can only be signed by parents of a boy, or by professional people who come regularly to see juveniles, are who first obtain permission to see a juvenile in a professional capacity. Page-83 of the Visitor's Record Book of the Youth Study Center was photostated by the B of I, zmmiskikam technitism Lloyd Essatri, and will be entered in evidence.

Investigating officers checked Juvenile Eureau records and found that on duguet L, 1900, Albert Chernsie was handled for runing away from home, and was found at the home of David Ferrie, who was then living at 704 Airline Park Blvd. It. A. J. Scardine, then Juvenile Officer for Jafferson parish, investigated the case. Attempts are being made to locate the offical record at the Juvenile Eureau in Jefferson Parish.

The above case is a similar one to the Al Landry Fatter.

Investigating officers called Pavid Ferrio on August 21, 1961. He was asked by Officer Jonau, whether he had a Doctor's degree and was he treating eny patients. He stated that he had a degree in psychology and that he didn't treat anyone but he gave advise. When confronted with the fact that he visited the Youth Study Center on 8-4-60 to visit Albert Cheramie, he

admitted he had, and stated that he realized he made a mistake after going.

On Fonday August 21, 1961, Investigating officers acquired, from Fr. Alexander Landry, the name Eric Fichael Crouchet LM Age 16 of 5505 Largis St., another member of the Civil Air Patrol. Officers went to speak with Iris at his job and he agreed to make a statemen of his knowledge of Dave Ferrie. Arrangements were made to pick up Eric at his home on the morning of August 22, 1961, which was accomplished. Frick was taken to the East Bank Javenile Bureau headquar of Jefferson Parish, were he made a full typewrittem statement in t presence of investigating officers and Sgt. Richard Thompson, of th Jefferson Farish juvenile bureau. Frick stated in his statement th Daye Ferria committed acts of crime against nature on him on two se occasions. The Jefferson parish authorities have the original copy Crouchet's statement and are investigating the crime against nature matter.

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Grouchet additionally told investigating officers that Capt Ferrie masturbated him on 1, or 5 occasions, all of which occurred in Jeffe Parish. Grouchet told of having been given alcoholic beverages whi at Capt Ferrie's house.

Crouchet made a statement which corroborates the matter involving runaway Albert Cheramie, which has been referred to repeatedly in t report. Grouchet said that when Cheramie ran away from home, that Ferrie instructed him (Chouchet) to watch Cheramie's house to see i Cheramie would come home. Crouchet was instructed by Capt Ferrie put Cheramie in a cab and send him to Ferrie's house. According to Crouchet, Ferrie told him (Crouchet) that he was going to send Cher to Corpus Christi, Texas.

In Crouchet's statement he referrs to numerous pieces of resurring obscene literature and pictures, which was shown him by Ferrie, whi at Ferrie's house.

On Thesday August 22, 1961 Sgt. Thompson had a search warrant prepa for the residence of Capt Lave Ferris. At approximately 10:30AM, 8 61, Sgt. Richard Thompson, Duputy Roth, and investigating officers Fournier and Jonau, drove to 331 Atherton Drive and presented Ferri with the search warrant. The entere house was searched, but no obspictures were found. Officer Fournier found an official United Stapassport in the bedroom of Lave Ferrie. The passport, number 21839 was taken out in the name of Eures Albert Faul Cheracle on August 2 1960, showing his birth date to be Sept 6, 1923. The picture in the passport was that of Albert Cheramie, the boy referred to in this report, who ran away from home on July 9, 1960 and was reported to Juvenile Barcau. Note: The vassport date of issuance 6-2-60, was two dates before Ferrie's unauthorized visit to the Youth Study Cen to see Obstanie in the capacity of a Bootor visiting his patient. Ferrie was questioned about this passport and he stated that he had made for Albert Cheramie, because he and several other people were ing to go to Honduras to do some mining. Investigating officers co acted Ir. Nughes Cheramie, father of Albert, who stated that he kne of the passport, but did not approve of it. Er. Cheramie said that has been trying to get the pastport back for a long time.

On March 16, 1967 Sgt. Duffy received a telephone call from a person who identified himself as CHARLES KROP of Chicago, Illinois. Mr. KROP stated that shortly after the death of the president he-was, contacted by a Cuban organization in Chicago that was trying to raise funds to assassinate FIDEL As a result of this, Mr. KROP contaced the FBI and asked them if they would be interested. They told Mr. KROP they would be interested and to obtain as much information as he could Mr. KROP set no a recording device to record any future conversations with these two Cohere. We said he had a recording in his possession at this time in which the Cubans described what they were trying to do and how they were trying to raise funds through donations. During this conversation the Cubins mentioned that two man in New Orleans also were in charge of handling finances for this organization. The two men named were SUAN and FERRIE. As a result of this Mr. KROP advised the FBI of what had transpired and works let them listen to the tabe. Mr. KROP at that time forget about the instance until he read of Mr. Garrison's probe and again heard the name of SHAW and FERRIE connected in the probe.

On March 16, 1967he again contacted the FBI and · they said they would be very much interested in listening to the tape again. Mr. KROP then contacted Sgt. Duffy of the New Orleans District Attorney's Office. Sgt. Duffy advised Mr. KROP he would call him back. Sgt. Duffy advised Mr. Garrison of the conversation and called CHARLES KROP at his number in Chicago from Mr. Garrison's office. Mr. KROP said he would be out of town for a few days and when he returned on the 21st of March, 1967 he would send Sgt. Duffy a copy of the tape. The tape was never received by Sgt. Deffy. As a result Officer Duffy tried to contact Er. KROP on March 27th, 28th and again on the 29th, 1957. On the 29th of Earch Sqt. Buffy finally got in contact with Mr. KKOP - It was learned that at the present time MR. KROP is employed by the Illinois Migraat Consul, address 1307 S. Wabne Chicago, Illinois - 60000. Ar. Martin Waldron, Houston Bureau of the N. Y. Times, gave me the following information today. Recently the New York Times were sent two memos by one of their local stringers regarding a possible SHAW-FERRIE connection. However, the New York Times has so far taken no action to verify the truth of this story.

According to these memos, RAY SADLER, a University of South Carolina professor did a doctoral thesis on an abortive invaskion of Cuba from New Orleans in February 1947. The purpose of this invasion was to fly bombing missions over Cuba to get rid of Batista. An airport was leased near Venice, Florida, and the man who leased the airport was named SHAW. The man providing this information, when pressed for the first name of SHAW, became nervous and refused to give it because he was involved in the invasion plan. This man lives in Monroe. Two others, SCOTT WILSON and a Latin named RALPH J. URRUEIA, both connected with the Trade Mart were in on the plot. (Note: Calling Worms of the mileta the product of the mileta the man are supplied to the mileta the man was a form Morroe.

One of the pilots who was to have engaged in the mission was allegedly DAVID FERRIE. When the invasion plan was discovered, the cover was used that their intention had been to fly the planes over Brazil as reconnaisance flights for making maps.

RALPH J. URRUELA resigned August 13, 1947 as City Director of International Relations. This post was created by CHEP MORRISON. URRUELA did aged 70 in Miami on February 24, 1952. He was consul general for Guatemala in Miami at the time of his death. URRUELA's appointment to the International Relations job was sponsored by RUDOLPH HECHT. URRUELA was succeeded in his job by MARIO BERMUDEZ.

Waldron added that the New York Times investigation of the assassination was killed without warning or explanation in February 1967.

For what it is worth I am passing on a bit of reporting from a friend and admirer of Jim Garrison that I heard tonight.

Hy friend is occupiated with a man, whose name I will not include here, who told my friend that his mother in Nec Orleans had been houseleaper to Clay Show. This lady is reported as terrified about the hazard to her from what she knows. This includes knowing of Farrie's association with Show, knowledge of the sadistic stuff (whips, etc) in the closet, and the mystericus death or killing of somebody in the house, whether an associate or not is not known. There had been no police investigation, but a coroner had come and picked up the body. Two men lived in the house of which the lady was housekeeper. My friend is not sure of all the details, but this is the general picture he got.

My friend is a businessman whose motives are sound. He saw no reason to discount this report, but cannot vouch for it beyond what he told me.

I was particulary pleased to read of Garrison's evidence that Lee Oswald had informed the FBI of the assassination plot. I have had an increasingly strong conviction that this must have taken place from my reading of Oswald's character. I do doubt that it was Lee Oswald that was Ruby's bedwate. That sounds to one more like the Leon Oswald who was an assassin.

In June, 1964, I met DAVE FERRIE through my brother, STEPHEN RANDOLPH CLARK, who met FERRIE approximately two days before I did, for a job at a filling station he owned, (Daval's Service Station) on Vets Highway. So I went over there and I noticed that there was something about him that was weird, but he seemed smart and talented. seemed to be all right. I got to know him by working there and that is where I met JIMMY JOHNSON. Then my brother was mostly with DAVE more than I was. I really didn't get to know DAVE until five months later and from them on we seemed to be friends. When I was working at the filling station, I know I saw a small, white compact car, foreign, Renault type, come there twice. I couldn't make out who it was, but it was a big man. DAVE told me both times that he wanted me to watch the station while he talked with him for a few minutes. He would wind up staying in the car for over an hour. The car never came and got gas. He just always pulled up on the side and DAVE would walk over there and get in the car. They would be there about an hour or so.

DAVE sold the filling station, and he asked me if I wanted to work with him as a flight instructor at the airport. He was working for Saturn Aviation at that time. I agreed and more or less hung around out there and there wasn't much to do. He guit and opened his own flight school. He asked me to work with him there. This was 1966.

I lived with DAVE at one time for about two months. This was right before he died. I have been to his apartment quite a few times.

Q. Did DAVE ever talk to you about his activities? Like flying down to Cuba, the Bahamas?

A. He told me once he went to the Bahamas.

, . Q. Did he do much talking about the investigation? (Kennedy assassination)

 $$\rm A$$ He said something about you all didn't know what you were doing. He was in bed - sick.

1969:

Q. Did he say what was wrong with him?

A. He said he had cancer of the neek. He did his own doctoring - he had all kinds of pills from the drugstore but I never saw a doctor.

Q This was about three weeks before

he died?

A About a month.

I would like to also state that at one time DAVE had told me that he had taught OSWALD.

Additionally, DAVE had told me that DEAN ANDREWS was like a brother to him. Also, when I was arrested in February, 1967, I called DAVE ERRIE and told him that I was in jail. DAVE told me to sit tight and that he would get me out and for me not to worry. He asked me what I was charged with and I told him vagrancy. A short while later I was paroled. I spoke with DAVE later on in the day and he told me that DEAN ANDREWS had paroled me and that I should go to DEAN ANDREWS' office and thank him. I didn't get a chance to do this because I was arrested again that same night.

Pulfilling the purpose of our investigative report, we have but one alternative. Inasmuch as, we must start somewhere, we turn back the pages of time to the early evening of that fateful date of November 22nd... The day President Kennedy-was killed in 1983.

Late that afternoon we visited the Katz 'n Jammer Tavern located at 540 Camp Street, New Orleans, looking for an "old-colleague-and-partner-in-crime", William Guy Banister, Eis mysterious absence that day had upset most of our business routine. Apparently, he hadn't been available to anyone, nor to the office all that particular day.

Failing to see him in this aforementioned establishment, we questioned Villiam A. (BILL) Leibfritz, its proprietor if he'd seen the Chief (Banister), as he was often called. Bill claimed to know nothing of his whereabouts.

although it was late in the afternoon, it should be but a short period of time until the Chief either came in to Bill's place, or at least pass by on his way to our office, just around the corner at 53T Lafayette Street. This was his usual habit pattern. So ordering a beer, we sat down at the bar and awaited his arrival or passing, one way or another.

Within a short time both the Chief and his secretary Mrs. Dauphine Roberts entered Bill's bar, sat down and ordered their usual Maneatten Cocktails. We noticed at that time, both seemed in exceedingly high spirit and good humor. They seemed elmost effervescent by their actions and in conversation. That is, everly joyous on this particular occasion, and the subject material was most apparently the death of President Kennedy. In fact, one quip the Chief made at that moment was something about why "Bobby wasn't included", or words to this effect.

Upon looking around the Chief spotted us at the bar after he had made these and other caustic verbal observations regarding the general trend of their very apparent celebration. On seeing us, the Chief laughingly ordered us another drink. This exuberant act itself was completely out of context for him, and at that moment we made some crack (remark) in reply to it, to say nothing of what extra attention it may have received at the time.

A few drinks later they (Banister and Mrs. Roberts) left the bar going to the office. Within a very short period of time we followed, leaving our last drink untouched there on the bar, because we had to see Mr. Roberts about some papers she was to photocopy for Banister's files. We had left these in our desk at the office, but needed them at once for business purposes.

Furthermore, after the episode in the bar we had made various: silent mental observations in review of these current events in total; which we fully intended to take up with Banister as an additional issue. Under the circumstances we were quite shocked over this turn of affairs, and for the minute we considered how to approach these items as conversational topic with him.

Upon entering the outer office we took our papers from the desk, gave them to kirs. Roberts with our instructions, and proceeded into the Chief's private office for a chat with him. We felt more than compelled to say just what was on our mind. Above all, we intended to demand the entire truth about certain matters from him.

His former gracious mood seemed somewhat changed after we had closed his door. Be that as it may, we outlined the fact in detail, how during our years in associate tenure, we had compiled and kept records of all events we had either been involved in, exposed to, or heard about, bar nothing.

Apparently he started to grasp the full weight of our meaning, and the fact that sundry events were all recorded somewhere... All down in "black-and-white" where it might come out publicly. In short, that he was caught, in a "round-about" way, without actually saying so. Needless to say, this little item chilled the air. However, as things later turned out, perhaps it may have been this point-in-question alone which saved our life.

It was about then that Banister blurted out that we had "cut a case out from under" him, and had doublecrossed one of his so-called "clients" in doing so.

We readily admitted that this was all to true, and attempted to give him our reasons for doing so... Namely, at that time, we thought that we were protecting him. After all, that client had been none other than George Lincolin Rockwell, Fuhrer of the American Nazi

This case had originally been solicited in our name, by our partner, another Banister associate, Joseph S. Newbrough, at that time. This had occured behind our back, without our knowledge beforehand, and while we had been out of town in New York. Therefore, we had tipped off one James David McNeill the Executive Assistant District Attorney about this matter in total.

Afterwards we had interviewed Rockwell's Nazi Liaison Officer, Micheal Slatter (or Slater) with Newbrough. Slatter was a British subject holding the rank of Major in Rockwell's Nazi group. Furthermore, our follow-up on Slatter had been a report to Senator Russell B. Long asking him to so inform the State Department and the Immigration and Naturalization Service in this regard.

Upon this, we reminded Banister of the additional fact that our particular action had brought the house down, so to speak. Inasmuch as, this had caused Leander Perez's man George Singlemann, Banister, and others to decend upon us in rath, protesting our action concerning the matter.

Moreover, until then, there had been no secret as far as anyone was concerned in regard to the fact that Banister, David Villiam Ferrie, and Lee Harvey Oswald may have known, or been acquainted with one another. We reminded him of this, together with the fact that he often mentioned, "Someday, somebody is going to poke a rifle out of a window", when speaking of unpopular politicians at times.

After mentioning these acquaintanceships to Banister, their related

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cubject material, together with his connections with the Nazis, and Citizens Council tie-up, we spioled out other matters on our mind at the moment, coupled with the fact that Banister and Mrs. Roberts had just been celebrating President Kennedy's death. In essence, this included "dropping a nickel to blow the whistle" on both he and Porrie, concerning the assassination.

Banister warned us that this might place our family in grave danger as well as ourself, regardless of our records on this subject, that they ment little difference anyway... That we had better think it ever, that we couldn't fight him without involving our past association together, et cetera. Our reply was that we would mostlikely have to remain silent regarding him (Banister), but not Ferrie under any conditions.

Ye kept yelling, shouting out that our records would still stand...

That he'd never get away with this, and just as suddenly the blows stopped. He shoved some bills in our pocket telling us to get to a hospital or a doctor, and we ran from the office. Banister was

just standing there with a sort of "dumbfounded" look on his face, and with that pistol still in his hand,

Bunning around the corner to the bar, Bill, or someone else asked us what had happened. Our immediate reply to this was, "The dirty Nexi bastards did it to him in Texas, and tried to, to me here !"

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This event was witnessed by at least two newsmen then standing at the bar, as well as others. These were Erby Aucion of W-V-U-E tele-vision station; and Jim Pitts of the Times-Picayune newspaper. Although, there were other people present, and more witness may be available to this statement.

From that day, we never saw Banister in person again until just a few days prior to his death in 1984. If our memory serves us correctly enough we met him on a Tuesday or perhaps a Wednesday of the week he died. However, we did hear from him from-time-to-time, both directly and indirectly.

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On the above occasion, we spoke to him after he greeted us on the street in front of Jack Mancuso's Cafe at the corner of Camp and Lafayotte Streets. He asked us to join him in his office. Our immediate reply was, "That might be rather dangerous." He laughed at that saying, "You haven't been circulating anything about me that you shouldn't, have you?" Our reply was negative, that his old F.B.I. buddy Regis Kennedy had pretty well taken care of things to protect him and his intrests on that score. He warned us that we should continue our good behavior, or else. Upon this comment, we

It was about that same day, or week sometime, that we had seen

Dr. Sergio areacha Smith on the steps of the Lafayette Post Office and Pederal Building on 600-601 South Street. At the time he had given us a cilver "Day-of-Pigs" medallion to go with the certificate he had once given us. He mentioned waiting for a friend of his to return to his office upstairs (motioning towards the lobby of the building). He grunted something with an accent, sounding like the letter "A".

Arcacha could have ment C.I.A., or Ray (Agent Lloyd Ray commanded the C.I.A. Field Office, and was a former associate of Arcacha), so not desiring attention from either faction, we made the move to go.

Morcover, Arcacha seemed nervous and fidgety for some unknown reason, so we bid him farewell, and departed.

We are by no means political scientists. All that we can do is tell what we have seen or heard as witnesses pursuant these matters. However, Banister claimed to be a "right-wing-conservate". At the same time he voiced his total hatred for all extreme-anti-American-elements such as the Communists. But above all others the most, Liberal factions in politics, and the Jews.

In some ways he refelected a sort-of-off-brand Nazi philosophy. Not true Nazism as we've read about, nor even Communism, but a kind-of-in-between, lunatic-fringe "multi-monomenia" (to coin a word), for it involved radical hatred in essence, but covered a multitude of subjectivity in socio-politics, as it were. It is hard to explain, but we'll try to the best of our ability.

Banister was so "super-right-wing" in his conservation that he supported Rockwell, and was an arcent subscriber of the right-wing extremist publication The Thunderbolt of Augusta, Georgia.

The Thunderbolt claims to be the official organ of the National States Rights Party headquartered in Augusta. However, there seems to be a dual split in command and opinion to this, according to some right-wing authorities.

Although, it will be found that many of Louisiana's right-wing loaders hold an intrest in both groups...Here and in atlanta...Not all do. However, some Atlanta members carry membership here. Although, out of the ultra-extreme factions, their primary functions serve those intrests and ideals in Augusta. Many of these are so rightwing in nature, to the extent, that they are sometimes referred to as Noo-Nazis. Furthermore, it is very interesting to note that a modified Neo-Nazi S.S. ensign does appear upon the mast-head of this Thunderbolt publication which serves as the general voice of these people, and their group.

We do not mean that these people are directly, or indirectly connected with the Rockwell organization, in any way. However, they appear to be Nee-Nazi in pseudo-philosophy and by social conduct.

One of this group is a "Doctor" Frederick Doughty-Bock (a chiropractor) residing at \$32 Jackson Avenue, who knew Bapister, Rockwell, Slatter, and above all, one Kent Courtney, the publisher of The Independent American, an extreme-right-wing organ. Courtney and his followers do business with the known Neo-Nezi-right-wing-conservatives

of Rhodosic, and the Union of South Africa, the Nec-Nazi-Afrikan-ders, his newspaper carries the Afrikander's advertising and is circulated in their countries.

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It seems that most of the members of the various conservative groups; be they either semi-militant-conservative organizations, or of the numerous independents who have gone over to the "super-extreme-right-wing-degree" of what we call Nec-Nazism...All, may be found either serving, or being in communication with the body in Augusta which claims to be the States Right Party. This also hold true with Rockwell's unit.

One interesting item about Rockwell which disturbed Banister to no end was something about Rockwell's bail bond, that was posted. here on he and his men when they were in trouble. The surities for these imerican Nazis were negotiated by Banister and others at that time. However, these bonds were made by insurance-agents william Hardy Davis and his wife Doris Davis. Moreover, the point that bothered everyone was the closely guarded secret of just who the persons were that signed attesting indemnification in lieu of loss on these appearance pledges. When this was mentioned it used to drive Banister to a froth, so the actual identity of these may be a very important facet of this case.

Louis Penington Davis, Jr. This Mr. Davis gave Rockwell and his bunch the sanctuary of his own home during this period. He has also offered to advise us concerning anything we might wish to

find out, or know, in regard to "right-wing" activity. Ye told him e appreciated his volunteer offer, and would certainly keep him in mind. However, a day or so later we found his phone number had boon changed, after his pseudo-gestops-advisor telephoned us inquiring about our business. This subject's name is Thomas Jude Baumler, an attorney, who's been working with Davis and these groups for many years as a participant, but most always behind the scenes. Further investigation leeds us to believe that there is a very apparent, but vague, gray point in organizational area, where even 'those of the so-called extreme-LEFT-wing definitely dove-tail into this very same "super-extremist-right-wing shadow finge category of Pseudo-Nec-Nazism. In the final analysis both of these right and left wing extremists follow the same pattern of communistic tendency. Poetically, they all fall into the same classification, if properly exposed to the right catalytic agent, or media.

Inasmuch as, it seems to be the same obsessive-compulsive-multimonomenia infecting both when they apparently yerge into this socalled Pseudo-Communism and Neo-Nazism, our definition of the partfcular brand of insanity would be, Neo-Nazism, or Neo-Nazi. This is just our name for it, whether an expert would agree with us or not we have no idea, but this is the best we can do for the moment.

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This brand of Neo-Nazism is the very dangerous extreme portions of all groups who have banded into one solo-loose-nit-faction of individual, or of single identity, rather than any actual party. Thus, it remains an extensively unorganized (as to the linking of groups). the production of the production but

All soom to function as an outlet to execute their petit-vendettas, or personal vengeance, as it were, of the single member, acting as a group to do so. That is, providing those moves, or ideas, are not totally objectionable to the entire body.

In short, they are oft times an unrecognizable sort of a clique, rather than an actual part of any group, or a true party proper.

We've found that these people themselves more than often, fail to identify themselves, for they do not know just what they are, nor in what direction they are actually headed. This in general is only known to the catalytic-media, or stimulative-agent; i.e., to whatever might be their leadership:

Therefore, even the most qualified expert or authority might not be prone to recognize or identify such an operation for what it was, or truly be, under any circumstances without extended and continuous observation. Hence, these people are difficult to spot, and more than often evade immediate surface detection of what they really are. Our only reason for being able to do so is because we were emposed to it for so many years without realizing it, or becoming an actual part of it. Frankly, we ignored its existence and most of its operation at the time, and failed to make note of these until years later.

Earlister's extreme-right-wing operations generally stemmed from the far more obscure in motivation. His was a very composit abnar-

mal group of erratically fanatic individuals, all of whom had so traveled the "whole" route of extranism in their own particular little brand of conservation, so-to-speak! He joined these in one Pseudo-Neo-Nazi type of faction, one-way-or-another, under his own individual supreme direction and rule.

That is, they operated as individuals with one another, upon one particular thing, or even on many separate assignment issues on which they all might be in agreement, as a sort of a loose but well organized clique, but my no means an integral portion of any party faction, or political group. They most always seemed to remain as an independent unit, separately aside, and totally divided from any known political organization by actual identification, with minor exception as a general rule.

One might even say that they were sort of a "secret" but an openly operated "gestope" unit. Most of them had become so right-wing in thought and by conduct as an end result, that they were no longer members or parts of their original inceptive organizations, if such a membership had been the case. Some of these participants were so mentally distressed that they needed no former membership, nor orientation for that matter, to condition their desires, for this was their proper climate and natural environment level.

These personalities held sort of "Moot-Court-Judgement", dispening their own little brand of "Summary-Execution", over everyone,
or over anything arising at issue. Thus, they attempted to control all herd, or mass, and individual activity movement within

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their grasp, in an effort to make it conform with their own ideas of whatever they thought it should be... Which they actually did, in effect, one way or another, to a great extent by direct or indirect techniques.

Operational penetration of these groups is in all practical likelihood, nearly an impossible situation. In fact, a person could,
well be innocently a part of such a group as this by business or
other affiliation, and be totally unaware of what was really going
on about them, as it was in our case. This is especially true if
such an organization operated under the same guise and function as
Benister's group was...That is, using a legitimate front, such as
an intelligence unit for its cover.



Furthermore, Persons claimed that the Cubansinvolved suddenly opened up fine and expensive business within a very short period of time after this visit. In short, Persons said that R.P.K. backed these Cubans and rewarded Haynes for their lies concerning the Bay-of-Pigs operation.

On August 2, 1968, I conducted a re-interview with REV. RAYMOND BROSHEARS. He told me that he had been informed by a reporter named MURRY, who works with the Long Beach Police Department, that intelligence officers had given information to the local newspaper. The Long Beach Press Telegram, and that a forthcoming unfavorable article would be written about him.

MURRY told BROSHEARS this article would appear probably Sunday, August 11th. I told BROSHEARS that I would write an article for the Los Angeles Free Press which would appear on Thursday, August 8th, which would explain the possibility of an article in the Long Beach Press Telegram, and therefore cancel any disparaging effect which the article might have on his reputation. (See attached article)

I showed a photograph of the man possibly known as RALPH SHLATTER or "SKINNY RALPH" to REV. BROSHEARS. He said that he was not sure, but he felt that he might have met this man in New Orleans in one of the "gay bars". BROSHEARS said that he felt that if this was the man, he was going by the name of "RED" and was operating as a "hustler" in the gay or homosexual underground.

I showed BROSHEARS the photograph of CLAY SHAW. He recognized him immediately stating that he had known this man in New Orleans, and had met him in the compnay of DAVID FERRIE in late August or early September of 1965. BROSHEARS said that he was with DAVID FERRIE when he met CLAY SHAW. He said that FERRIE introduce SHAW as either "CLARA" or on another occasion, "BURT", or "CLAY".

BROSHEARS said that the first time he met this man (CLAY SHAW) was in a bar called "Dixie's". At that time he said the man was dressed in sport clothes, but later changed into a coat and tic and the three of them went in a cab from Dixie's to a restaurant which he said he would be able to locate in New Orleans, but that he could not remember the name of the restaurant at this time. BROSHEARS said that the first meeting at Dixie's had taken place because FERRIE had told him he had to go there to get some money.

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After FERRIE Introduced BROSHEARS to "CLARA" or "BURT" he told him that BROSHEARS had been in Civil Rights work up North. SHAW said at that time, "Oh, a Commie." BROSHEARS and FERRIE both denied that. FERRIE said that he would like to go to a restaurant with the man who BROSHEARS has now identified as SHAW, and invited BROSHEARS to come with them.

During the ride in the taxi cab, SHAW told BROSHEARS that he liked "little boys", and BROSHEARS told him, "Go find one." At this time, BROSHEARS said SHAW patted him on the rear. BROSHEARS sternly rebuked this action, and told SHAW not to repeat it. Later, at the restaurant, SHAW did repeat the gesture and was slapped by BROSHEARS. This took place at the dinner table.

The second meeting between BROSHEARS and SHAW took place at a small sidewalk cafe, the tables outside on the sidewalk, somewhere on Bourbon Street. BROSHEARS said he would be able to locate this restaurant in person as he would the other one. DAVID told him, "I have got to meet your 'blank' bandit.'" DAVID FERRIE had just returned from taking the St. Charles streetcar to get some money. They both went to the restaurant where SHAW drove up in a chauffered black car. BROSHEARS could not remember whether the car was a Cadillac or a Lincoln Continental. FERRIE said to BROSHEARS, "You remember CLAY." SHAW then apologized for his actions on the previous meeting. He said to BROSHEARS, "I had a couple of drinks, and I'm sorry."

The third meeting between BROSHEARS and SHAW took place when BROSHEARS went to wait on a street corner with DAVID FERRIE somewhere on a street known as Dauphine (BROSHEARS was not sure about this name, but that it began with the letter "D"). At that time, SHAW drove up and handed DAVID FERRIE a large envelope. SHAW informed FERRIE that BROSHEARS was in trouble because of what he had been saying about President Johnson. He told FERRIE of the danger of BROSHEARS being arrested by the FBI. FERRIE said to BROSHEARS, "A lot of people have threatened the life of President Johnson, but you are in trouble with the government. You threatened the life of the President. Why don't you come with me? I'm flying South and we can stay there together." BROSHEARS said that he could not go with him, and FERRIE took some money out of the bulky envelope and gave it to him. SHAW had already driven off.

FERRIE and BROSHEARS went to "LaFitte's In Exile"
until 11:00 p.m. when DAVID FERRIE left. The next day two men
came to the owner of the hotel where BROSHEARS was staying.
BROSHEARS was later told by the owner that, "Two men were here
looking for you."

BROSHEARS state that SHAW had referred to himself as a "butch queen".

I further questioned BROSHEARS on some of the information which had been related to him by DAVID FERRIE concerning the actual shooting of President Kennedy on November 22, 1963. BROSHEARS said that OSWALD had not shot the President, but that

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according to DAVID FERRIE, it had been two assassins who were behind the fence. One of the assassins, according to DAVID FERRIE, was named CARLOS. FERRIE also told BROSHEARS about a boy named "BILL" who worked in the Book Depository. BROSHEARS felt that this might have been one of the assassins who fired at the President from the rear.

PERRIE had told BROSHEARS that H. L. HUNT of Dallas, Texas, but entertained HALE BOGGS after the Warren Commission Hearings. FERRIE had pointed out a connection between H. L. HUNT and HALE BOGGS previously. FERRIE had had a deep hatred for HALE BOGGS, and had linked HALE BOGGS with CLAY SHAW. FERRIE had told BROSHEARS that SHAW had some ownership in Dallas and had met HUNT through his financial dealings, possibly with Hunt Foods, or possibly through the Trade Mart in Dallas.

BROSHEARS said that DAVID FERRIE had a "beautiful machete", a BarrettiItalian pistol, in addition to the possessions of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

BROSHEARS stated that he did not know GORDON NOVEL, and could not remember that name, but requested that he see a picture of the man.

Once again asking BROSHEAR about "RALPH" (the walking man photo), BROSHEARS said that he might have been the man who chauffered CLAY SHAW's car in 1965. He said that a man had hustled him and taken \$10 from him at his hotel. BROSHEARS said that he would have met this man, if this were indeed the person, at either one of the two bars previously mentioned.

BROSHEARS said that he met a man named "KERRY" and from a picture he identified KERRY THORNLEY at the bar called Dixie's. FERRIE had commented on the similarity of appearance between THORNLEY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD, but had told BROSHEARS that the similarity stopped with the appearance.

BROSHEARS stated that he did know FRED LEE CHRISMAN of Oregon because he was the representative of the "Universal Life Church" in that Northwest area. (AF SUBSCOURT MEMO ON CHRISMAN AND THIS CHURCH)
