

RAYMOND CUMMINGS -- INTERVIEW WITH

Pending the tape transcription of the interview with RAYMOND C. CUMMINGS in Dallas by James Alcock and William Gurvich, the following report is respectfully submitted based on notes made at the time of the interview.

RAYMOND CUMMINGS was contacted at a VFW Club on Saturday, 25 February 1967 at 9:05 P.M. where he was playing music and was interviewed outside this club. CUMMINGS works for the Power & Light Company in Dallas and is a former wrestler.

in Dallas between Ganuary and May of 1963 during which time he According to CUMMINGS he was driving a Yellow Cab recalls picking up LEE HARVEY OSWALD at the Continental Bus Station and driving him to Irving, Texas. OSWALD did not have enough money to pay the fare and told CUMMINGS this enroute to Irving. OSWALD apparently saw the tattoo on CUMMINGS' arm and said that he, too, was an ex-Marine adding that he only had \$1.50. CUMMINGS agreed to carry him to Irving and shut the meter off when it reached \$1.50. He actually shut it off at \$1.45.

CUMMINGS recalls that OSWALD was dressed rather shabbily and was carrying a canvass type handbag similar to those that servicemen carry. OSWALD was wearing a white shirt with sleeves rolled up and was hatless. CUMMINGS conveyed him to a house, the exact address of which he does not remember. OSWALD told CUMMINGS he was "down on his luck". CUMMINGS offered to go with Alcock and me to Irving in an attempt to locate this house.

We met CUMMINGS on Sunday, 26 February 1967 at 12:01 P.M. and drove him to Irving, Texas, 5 miles west of Following CUMMINGS' direction we crisscrossed numerous streets in the section of Irving that looked familiar to CUMMINGS. Without making a positive identification CUMMINGS selected (1107 Oakdale Street) and said this was more familiar than any other house he had seen with us. The name on the mail box in front of this house was L. L. BARGER. This was a small The name on the mail single residence of wooden construction in a low income, semirural neighborhood.

CUMMINGS also informed us that about one week after taking OSWALD to Irving, he picked up three men at the intersection of Marsalis and the Expressway in Dallas and conveyed them in his cab to JACK RUBY's Carousel Club. According to CUMMINGS one of these men was LEE HARVEY OSWALD, another

DAVID WILLIAM FERRIE and he cannot identify the third man.

He recalls that FERRIE was unusual looking.

CUMMINGS identified photographs of OSWALD and FERRIE from a
variety of photographs shown to him and admits having seen
pictures of both OSWALD and FERRIE in the newspapers. The
third man was about 6' in height and looked as if he might have
been talian.

CUMMINGS stated that trip sheets at the Yellow
Cab Company would assist in corroborating his stories. He has
never given this information to anyone nor has he ever been
approached by anyone for information.

En route to the Carousel Club, OSWALD rememberd CUMMINGS and told him he appreciated the favor he did in taking him to Irving. The three men. as CUMMINGS recalls, were talking about Louisiana. Arriving at the Carousel Club, FERRIE paid the fare and the three passengers went upstairs into the Club. CUMMINGS described FERRIE as "a spook in the night" and felt sorry for him. CUMMINGS then went upstairs into the Club himself and received \$1.50 tip from the man at the door as a gratuity for bringing customers. CUMMINGS added that this gratuity-system was not new.

In this interview CUMMINGS stated that he disliked the Dallas Police Department. He admitted having been arrested once and that was in Belton, Texas. Explaining this arrest, CUMMINGS stated his Mother was hospitalized and needed surgery and he had gone to the bank and withdrawn a large sum of money and was arrested for having a pistol in the front seat of his car which he claims he had for his own protection. CUMMINGS also remarked that he would not object to helping the FBI. CUMMINGS added he has a brother WESLEY CUMMINGS, 38 years of age, residing in Los Angeles, who might have met FERRIE in Dallas. This brother according to CUMMINGS is an alcoholic.

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

He said that COL. ALVIN ROUSE who is Wing Commander of the Civil Air Patrol may be able to furnish us a list of the students who were in FERRIE'S C.A.P. outfit O'CONNER said that we should check with O.K. HALEY of the F.A.A. for a list of pilots who logged time while they were being taught to fly by DAVID FERRIE. (FERRIE had a log book on every student.)

On Tuesday, February 13, 1968, MARTIN MC AULIFFE came into the District Attorney's Office and was interviewed by Loisel and Bethell.

MR. MC AULIFFE was asked if he knew KERRY THORNLEY, and how well did he know him. MC AULIFFE said that he had seen KERRY THORNLEY at the Bourbon House on two occasions sometime in (1963.) MC AULIFFE said that on both occasions he was either with one of his students from L.S.U.N.O. whose name is TOYCE TALLEY, or he could have been with his secretary, (JUANITA ABBOTT. MC AULIFFE said that he was introduced on both occasions to THORNLEY by either of the women he was with at which time THORNLEY had requested MC AULIFFE to read copies of manuscripts of books he was writing. MC AULIFFE said that one manuscript was about a man on guard duty in Japan, and he was looking at his shadow in the puddles. MC AULIFFE said that after he read this and some other trash that THORNLEY had, he brushed him off and tried to avoid him. MC AULIFFE also said that actually THORNLEY had short stories which contained mostly sketches. Loisel showed several pictures of THORNLEY to MC AULIFFE, but MC AULIFFE said he could not recognize THORNLEY. MC AULIFFE said that all he remembers about THORNLEY is that he was real skinny. MC AULIFFE was asked if he had ever had any political discussions with THORNLEY in regard to OSWALD. MC AULIFFE said THORNLEY had asked him if he knew OSWALD or had come in contact with him because of their two opposing groups, and MC AULIFFE said that he did not know OSWALD.

MC AULIFFE was then asked if he knew CARLOS BRINGUIER and was shown a picture of BRINGUIER. MC AULIFFE said that he did not recognize BRINGUIER but might of heard of him on television or in the newspapers. MC AULIFFE was then asked if he had ever been to BRINGUIER's clothing store in the 100 block of Decatur Street. MC AULIFFE replied that he hadn't but had been to a barroom in the 100 block to collect money for the Cuban organization but doesn't remember of seeing BRINGUIER at that

MC AULIFFE then told Loisel that the District Attorney's Office should get a 1962 copy of L.S.U.N.O.'s newspaper, "The Beachcomber", which contains an article that THORNLEY had written.

DAVIS was interviewed and he advised that he retired temporarily from the MNHMMMM United States Army in 1960. He stated that he went to work for DEAN ANDREWS in 1961 when ANDREWS had his office in the Maison Blanche Building. HAMMANIMMM

He stated that his duties for DEAN ANDREWS was "sort of bull dogging". He stated that he investigated automobile accidents, criminal investigations, and traced down GENEALOGE. He stated that he did all types of investigating for NM ANDREWS. He stated further that MM EVE SPRINGER who resides on Henry Clay Avenue was the secretary at the time that he immy became employed with ANDREWS.

DAVIS stated in when questioned about the identities of homo-sexuals that N ANDREWS in represented advised that " HEMMAN "he could say that he did conduct an investigation on homo-num sexuals for ANDREWS but at this time he will say no."

He stated further that you would have to know ANDREWS and realize that DEAN ANDREWS ran a sort of DAVID Names operation that his clients were mostly persons who were either homo-sexuals, PIMPS, prostitutes, or huslers from Burbon Street.

DAVIS stated that he saw LEE HARVEY OSWALD in DEAN ANDREWS office in the Maison

Blanche Building. He stated that OSWALD was in company with four or five other immends
individuals and that two or three of these individuals were of Cuban or Maria and extraction.

He stated that OSWALD was merely one of the grown group of characters that came in together.

He stated that he did not know any of the other persons. DAVIS stated when that shortly
thereafter DEAN ANDREWS asked him, DAVIS, about m procedures in handling a court (marshall)

as he would know because he was retired as m a First Segt. of the United States Army.

He stated that ANDREWS wanted to correct a dishonorable discharge for OSWALD.

DAVIS further stated that DEAN ANDREWS had so many homo-sexuals, prostitutes, p_____
coming into the office that h it was hard to keep track of them. He stated you have
to remember ANDREWS was making his living off h these people.

When w questioned if he knew CLAY DURTRAN, DAVIS some stated no. He stated that he had heard the name CLAY BURTRAN. When asked specifically if he knew MAMM CLAY BURTRAN as CLAY SHAW, he became nervous and stated that he did not. When asked if he had seen CLAY BURTRAN he stated that he did not remember if he did or did not see him.

EMM DAVIS stated that ANDREWS was under some kind of sedation at the time he was in the hospital. He also advised that he has been gen giving this CLAY BURTRAN a lot of thought and that he was wondering if EMN DEAN could have meant something like "ROBERT TRAHAN or EMN" BERT TRAHAN." However, when asked specifically if he had ever heard men the name of CLAY BURTRAN, he advised that the name is very familiar to him.

DAVIS stated that when ANDREWS in got back from the hospital, he found that some one had broken into his office and had gone tanh through his files, however, nothing of value was taken. He stated that he believes that ANDREWS opened a file on the OSWALD case however, he does not know the file number or if the file is available. He stated that the secretary only knew about 20% of what DEAN was doing.

He stated that he does not believe that he would remember any of the homo-sexuals that went to ANDREWS's office. (At this time he was very fund evasive when it came to identify persons that we he was more worked cases on while he was associated with ANDREWS). DEVIS stated you have to remember I was doing work for ANDREWS who represented these people. He was asked specifically if he had ever accompanied ANDREWS to any place in the French Quarter. DAVIS stated that he had gone with brimm ANDREWS to have a bunch of contracts signed up by a number of musicians. He stated that he believes that DEAN represented all thinman must he musicians on Bourdon Street and that he remain remembers going to a place he believes is the Dixie Land Hall which he believes is located acress from a new hotel in the Quarter. stated that he believes DEAN ANDREWS had incorporated the Dixie Land Hall and that he, ANDREWS had some connection with this. He stated that DEAN had very good connections in the Quarters and that he also remembered transform going to a Go-Go girl's apartment in the Quarter with ANDREWS.

DEAN ANDREWS - INTERVIEW 3/2/67

On 5:56 P.M., 2 March 1967, DEAN ANDREWS, accompanied by his attorney Sam Zelden, was interviewed in the Office of the District Attorney, Parish of Orleans, by Assistant District Attorneys James Alcock, Richard Burnes, Adnrew Sciambra and Special Aide William Gurvich. This interview was taperecorded with the knowledge and consent of Mr. ANDREWS. While awaiting the transcription of that tape, this memorandum is respectfully submitted.

ANDREWS stated he is an Assistant District Attorney in the Twenty-Fourth Judicial District of Louisiana.

He further stated he had appeared before the Warren Commission in their investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy and furnished testimony relative to his knowledge of the accused assassin, LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

ANDREWS said OSWALD came to his office in May or June 1963 for legal assistance. From memory, ANDREWS said he probably saw OSWALD three or four times. ANDREWS' office was in 627 Maison Blanche Building, New Orleans, when OSWALD came with three young men who were obvious homosexuals. The latter were in some minor trouble with the local police but it was not necessary for him to actually represent them. ANDREWS stated he was well known in the French Quarter and had represented homosexuals on several occasions.

When questioned about his testimony on 21 July 1964 before the Warren Commission, wherein he said there were one or two homosexuals, ANDREWS studied the Commission Report for five minutes (6:03-6:08 P.M) and the interview resumed.

ANDREWS said his figures to us were accurate and added that one of these "gay kids" (homosexuals) was a Mexican. He said the Mexican was quiet and did not talk. ANDREWS recalls having made a file on this but did not retain it.

According to ANDREWS, OSWALD identified himself and sat on ANDREWS' left during their first meeting. He doesn't remember if the others were identified.

The last time ANDREWS saw OSWALD was in front of the Maison Blanche Building when OSWALD was distributing proCastro leaflets. ANDREWS approached OSWALD to attempt to collect a delinquent fee but OSWALD had no money to pay him. ANDREWS recalls a Mexican being with OSWALD at this time. This Mexican was about 5'10", had a short, flattop haircut that tapered in back, and had an athletic-type build. ANDREWS said a Mexican was always with OSWALD. Although the Mexican was not identified or introduced and never spoke, ANDREWS said he could recognize him.

Some photographs were shown to ANDREWS for possible recognition or identification but to no avail. ANDREWS said he could not see the necks of the subjects in the photographs which would be necessary as the Mexican with OSWALD had an unusually strong-looking neck.

ANDREWS added that he also knew DAVID FERRIE and had recently been contacted by him to settle a brake tag violation.

Referring back to OSWALD, ANDREWS stated it was about 5:30 P.M. when OSWALD and the three others came to see him. There were no introductions other than by OSWALD. When asked why they came to him ANDREWS said someone had recommended him.

ANDREWS was asked if he recalled the Warren Commission asking him about CLAY BERTRAND and ANDREWS replied, "Where is that?" A copy of the Report was shown to him and the interview resumed after a two-minute pause at 6:21 P.M.

Stating he was now ready to discuss CLAY BERTRAND, he referred to the Rendevous Bar which he described as a "swinging place" and was located in the French Quarter where the Red Garter is now. ANDREWS explained he lived in the Pontalba Apartments when in school and met many homosexuals.

ANDREWS said the young men with OSWALD used his phone to call someone and when contact was made, handed the phone to him. As ANDREWS listened, a voice said, "Whatever they owe, I'll pay." ANDREWS said he had heard this voice and name before under similar circumstances. When asked if he knew who CLAY BERTRAND was ANDREWS said he didn't know for sure. Asked if he ever had any financial dealings with CLAY BERTRAND, ANDREWS replied he had not because the "kids" always came back and paid. He said BERTRAND never owed him any money.

Asked if he had ever seen or met BERTRAND, ANDREWS said he had twice and then corrected it to once. ANDREWS said he saw him in a bar on Dauphine Street near Esplanade Avenue. He said BERTRAND got up and left the bar when ANDREWS came in.

ANDREWS was asked what made him think that man was CLAY BERTRAND and he said he could not recall.

At 6:26 P.M. ANDREWS was shown the Report where he is questioned about BERTRAND owing him money. ANDREWS replied that he was vague then because he was being pushed in the same manner as we were pushing in our interview.

He said he recognized CLAY BERTRAND's voice on the phone as he had heard it before and the voice was deep, intelligent and educated. ANDREWS said BERTRAND had "command of the King's English" and didn't sound homosexual or effeminate.

When asked to describe the person he saw on Dauphine Street and concluded it was BERTRAND, ANDREWS asked for a short break to refresh his memory at 6:29 P.M.

Resuming, ANDREWS said he "didn't carry a tape measure" with him. Finally he said this man had grey hair and ruddy complexion. ANDREWS added that he though BERTRAND was bi-sexual. At this point he recalled the bar was Cosmos's.

ANDREWS said he had actually seen this man twice. The first time was at a "gay bar" (homosexual hangout) - "maybe" Dixie's or "maybe on Chartres". ANDREWS said he only "assumed" it was CLAY BERTRAND on this first meeting.

ANDREWS said he was confined to Hotel Dieu Hospital in New Orleans on the day of the assassination. While there he received a phone call from CLAY BERTRAND who asked him to go to Dallas, Texas and defend LEE HARVEY OSWALD who had been arrested and accused of murder.

At this point ANDREWS recalled that on OSWALD's visit to his office CLAY BERTRAND told ANDREWS on the phone that he would pay the expenses. ANDREWS said the exact words were, "I'll personally handle fee."

ANDREWS was asked if he knew CLAY SHAW and he said he had seen pictures of him but they had never met. Asked if BERTRAND and SHAW were similar in physical description, ANDREWS said he wouldn't know. He said he had no file on BERTRAND. ANDREWS then said we could call Regis ennedy of the F.B.I. and John Rice adding that he "could care less".

He said all the homosexual young men he represented knew BERTRAND's number and would call him from ANDREWS' office.

ANDREWS added that he "handled" so many homosexuals because his "reputation preceded him". ANDREWS said he probably met fifteen or twenty homosexuals who knew CLAY BERTRAND. He cannot remember any of their names.

During this interview, several photographs of various persons, including CLAY SHAW, were shown to ANDREWS. Several names were also mentioned for recognition. This was to no avail.

The interview concluded at 7:23 P.M, 2 March 1967.

During my recent interview with MR. JAMES J. PLAINE of Houston, Texas, MR. PLAINE informed me that he had been contacted by a MR. WHITE of Freeport Sulphur in regards to a possible assassination plan for Fidel Castro.

MR. PLAINE said that MR. WHITE was only one of the many oil and import people that he had occasion to talk to from New Orleans regarding Castro.

MR. PLAINE also informed me that he thought that the picture of CLAY SHAW was very familiar, and that he may have met him in Houston, either at his apartment or at the Normandy Club which the oil people of Texas frequent.

A memo in the GUY BANISTER file indicates that there is information which reports that DICK WHITE, a high official of Freeport Sulphur, and CLAY SHAW were flown to Cuba probably taking off from the Harvey Canal area in a Freeport Sulphur plane piloted by DAVE FERRIE. The purpose of this trip was to set up import of Cuba's nickle ore to a Canadian front Corporation which would in turn shipt to the Braithwaite nickle plant. The plant was built by the U. S. Government at a cost of about one million dollars.

The report is that the combine of Freeport Sulphur, WHITE, and SHAW purchased the plant for a million dollars and intended to get ore through Canadian corporation they had formed. There is also a report that GUY BANISTER hired FERRIE and JACK MARTIN as investigators to check out the nickle plant deal.

He says he does not remember exactly the gist of the conversation, but he distinctly remembers that it was regarding these nickel mines. He said he cannot positively say that FERRIE knew WHITE or vice versa, but he somehow feels that they must have known each other.

Alcock and I will call in MR. WHITE of Freeport Sulphur and ask him about our previous memorandum from KIMBALL which mentions SHAW, FERRIE and WHITE being together.

Thank you for your reply to my recent letter regarding a possible future appearance here in Omaha, and I do realize that the presure of the Shaw trial will prevent any consideration of such an appearance soon.

In my letter I mentioned my curious thinking toward Omaha, in light of the McMeines and Backham figures moving here. Your note about the SAC efficer, and the SAC headquarters, seems very legical for many reasons. The day that your office issued the original warrent for Backham I went looking for him and found him in Believus, in the company of a Larry Davis. Davis was, and is a newspaperman out there but has only been in the area a short time, originally from the West Coast I understand. Davis and the SAC officer are also very close. Backham engaged a Bellevus attorney in his fight, which also was, I suppose, suggested through his friends out there. Actually I know this area like the back of my hand and Backham had no reason to even go into the Bellevus area in the first plees, if he were living in Omaha. The majority of the residents out there are Air Force.

I have a very close and personal friend in the service out there and am keeping tab on anything there that might "smell".

As I also mentioned in my letter I have been concerned for over a year about the DELILAH MURDER case here, and over the fact that she was a dancer in Ruby's club, and had met death here in, what could be, an unusual manner.

Mr.A.O. Wolf, the Public Defender, is also a personal friend of mine, and we have discussed the case. Leonard Walle, Delilah's husband of a short time first defended himself and than called in Wolf. In chacking with the prisen in Lincoln, the Warden tells me (and he could be KBON PEOPLE KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON!

After putting what I have sent to use in determining your decision you might give me some information on a confidential basis, if you feel it would be useful...Did Mr.Shaw ever have contact of any kind(business or otherwise) with anyone here in Omaha, or anyone in Omaha that had business affiliations in New Orleans?

Thank you for your kindness and continued good health and success. If I can be of service please do not hesitate to call on me. I only wish I could get the McMaines across that State Line for you!

In answer to a subpoena I interviewed AL CLARK who gave his correct name as ALFORD GRAYSON CLARK. He appeared to be relaxed and inferred that he would like to be cooperative. He stated that the WEISBURG Report is correct except that CLINT BOLTON was never the owner but an employee of AL CLARK. CLARK stated that BOLTON is no longer affiliated with Preservation Hall but is employed by The Vieux Carre Carrier, a French Quarter weekly publication.

Another point of error is that AL CLARK was not certain that DEAN ANDREWS introduced him to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that this could have happened, but he is not certain because he knows DEAN ANDREWS well and did meet LEE HARVEY OSWALD at Preservation Hall. Elaborating further on this point he stated that he sometimes confused OSWALD with GORDON NOVELL who DEAN ANDREWS introduced to him in regard to having a segment of Preservation Hall displayed at the New York Worlds Fair.

CLARK verified the fact that he told WEISBERG that BOOTSIE GAY was conducting some business at G. WRAY GILL's office and she saw a chart, that had belonged to DAVE FERRIE that indicated an assassination plot.

ALFORD G. CLARK stated he would gladly cooperate and stated his business address is Dixieland Hall, 522 Bourbon Street, phone number 523-8887.

He indicated that BOOTSIE GAY's correct name is CLARA FLOURNOY GAY who is a white female about 60 and that she is employed at Max Hill Painting Suppliers located 621 St. Peter Street, phone number 523-3132.

With reference to the telephone conversation I had yesterday with Mr. Harold Weisberg, among the things that we discussed was the fact that MR. BILL GAUDET, Editor and Publisher of Latin American Reports, with offices in the International Trade Mart, was, according to Mr. Weisberg, investigated by the FBI prior to LEE HARVEY OSWALD'S trip to Mexico. Mr. Weisberg maintains that Mr. GAUDET was an ex-CIA agent, and I mentioned to Mr. Weisberg that among the Cuban Colonies it had been often reported to me that MR. GAUDET had been either an FBI or a CIA agent. Mr. Weisberg told me that he has copies of the FBI report and, what I thought was most interesting was the fact that neither his office address nor his home address in New Orleans appear in the report, but an out-of-town address in Louisiana with only a postal box number which of course seemed to have been omitted intentionally not to bring out the International Trade Mart address. Mr. Weisberg also claims that in the old International Trade Mart Building MR. GAUDET'S offices were always adjacent to vacant rooms and that now in the new Trade Mart Building this is also so. I told Mr. Weisberg that I did not know this, but that it would be quite easy to check since I had been in that office numerous times but did not notice if they were adjacent to vacant rooms or not. Mr. Weisberg also pointed out that it was interesting that MR. GAUDET'S partner, BILL ANGERS of Lafayette, Louisiana, a well-known right-wing extremist, was now his new partner. I mentioned to Mr. Weisberg that I had met MR. ANGERS years before in Guatemala and at the time I was quite convinced that he was an FBI agent - undercover of some sort. At the time MR. ANGERS was very involved in the anti-Castro movement as he still is, as most of his publications (he writes a column in the Lafayette paper) indicate.

RAY B. HIATT, 1411 Marigny, was interviewed in my office by myself and Louis Ivon. He stated that he bought a 1960 black Cadillac sedan from JEFFERSON BIDDISON a little over a year ago. (Official records reflect that the sale was made on January 18, 1967). The car was in good condition when he bought it. It had approximately 32,000 miles on it at the time. HIATT feels, but does not know positively, that BIDDISON had bought the car new. (Official records reflect that BIDDISON bought the car on September 27, 1961). The only other person HIATT has seen driving the car besides BIDDISON is JACK SAWYER. SAWYER and BIDDISON both work for the Marilyn Tate Real Estate Co. located at 922 Royal Street. HIATT stated the he had seen BIDDISON talking to CLAY SHAW on at least two occasions. HIATT does not recall BIDDISON taking any extended trips from New Orleans in the past four or five years. It should be added here that HIATT is now, and has been for some time, working for BIDDISON. HIATT will readily testify to the above facts.

(JEFFERSON BIDDISON was SHAW'S unwirsed legates, to whom he left all of his property.



DAVID GRAYDON relayed the following information to us. He was a very intimate friend of WILLIAM C. BRADY and for a time lived with him. He said he would regard BRADY as a definite right winger who was connected with Cuban organizations in the New Orleans area. He was a friend of ARNESTO RODRIGUEZ and for a while taught at the Berlitz Language School around 1962 and 1963. He said that BRADY also knew ROSS BUCKLEY and was very close to HELEN GLADSTONE. GLADSTONE supposedly has some of BRADY's written material and could be very helpful to us concerning BRADY. However, GLADSTONE is a personal friend and very sympathetic towards SHAW. GRAYDON said that BRADY speaks Spanish and French fluently and is a graduate of Harvard University. BRADY used to attend Cuban meetings at the International House with ARNESTO RODRIGUEZ and MARCEL GOMEZ.

GRAYDON said that he doesn't know KERRY THORNLEY and he does not know if BRADY knew THORNLEY. GRAYDON lived with BRADY from July of 1962 till August of 1962 and then from June 1963 till August of 1963 at 414 Burgundy Street. BRADY gave several parties at his apartment in 1963 and they were usually held on Saturday nights. GRAYDON said that he was told (possibly by LEE SENS) that OSWALD attended two of these parties in BRADY's apartment. He also said that BRADY knows SHAW but that he doesn't know SHAW and cannot say if SHAW had ever been to BRADY's parties.

He said EDDIE PORTER may be very helpful to us concerning LEE OSWALD. However, PORTER is in Sydney, Australia, at the present time. He said that KENNETH OWEN may be able to give us some information about EDDIE PORTER. He said he knows that the FBI has recently tried to contact PORTER. He said that BRADY has never mentioned BRINGUIER's name to his knowledge. He said he can remember BRADY pushing very hard for a politician in Texas in either a 1960 or a 1961 election. This politician had gray hair. He said that SETH HOLLEY who is EDDIE PORTER's half sister is in town living here. He said that he would try to get EDDIE PORTER's address from her.

He said that we should contact JIM SOHR who is currently a prisoner at Angola. SOHR ran an apadment house over Two Jays Bar on Decatur Street and catered to the kooky set. BRUCE OWENS lived there along with other people who frequented the Bourbon House scene. SOHR gave parties quite regularly on the top of the roof and it's quite possible that OSWALD may have attended these parties. GRAYDON said that SOHR is the type of person who would definitely have been interested in OSWALD and vice versa. STANGER IS TENTED TO TOWNY BAUMLER and is considered quite dangerous. He also spent quite a bit of time around the Bourbon House.

GRAYDON said we should also talk to GENE TRAHAN who at the present time is in the Baton Rouge Parish Prison. TRAHAN was a frequent visitor to the Ryder Club.

MARTY FLETTERMAN worked at Castillio's Restaurant and had a girlfriend named MORGE (they were part of the THORNLEY crowd and they are in California now).

GRAYDON said that BRADY's closest friends in town were HELEN GLADSTONE, LEKLA FREA and VERNON KELLOGG (these are all personal friends of CLAY SHAW).

NOTE: JIM SOHR, No. 195-443, Section "E", was charged with sale of Marijuana on February 5, 1966, at his residence at 506 Governor Nicholls Street. He was extradited from San Francisco, California, in the Summer of 1967.

Records indicate another address for JIM SOHR of 732 Burgundy Street.

ELMER RENFROE was interviewed in connection with the EDWARD GIRNUS memo of Dec. 7, 1967, in which GIRNUS is reported as saying he met CLAY SHAW in the Alpine Restaurant and BAr, 620 Chartres S. He stated that he was introduced to SHAW by a man who owned an apartment house on Exchange Place which had a courtyard. The man was a homosexual and was described as:

homosexual short fat bald

of GIRNIUS:

And every time GIRNUS saw this man he was walking a dog and wearing Bermuda shorts.

On January 23, 1968, I contacted EIMER RENFROE who is managing an apartment house with a courtyard on Exchange Place. RENFROE is a classic example of a homosexual, he expressed some comtempt at being questioned since he had been nabbed by the Vice Squad for an attempted crime against nature. This eventually cost him about \$1500.00.

RENFROE said he was originally from Mobile, Alabama and he had lived in New Orleans for over 20 years. A "boyfriend" of his, named EARL JOSEPH MUNTZ aka JACK MUNTZ bought the apartment house at 324 Exchange Place during World War II. MUNTZ and RENFROE lived together at the apartment house until MUNTZ died of a stroke in 1964.

RENFROE described MUNTZ as:

short
balding blond hair
homosexual
sometimes wore glasses

and said he had two dogs, (a collie and some small dog) which he would walk in the Quarter. RENTROE said MUNTZ also wore Bermuda shorts often.

RENFROE says he never heard of or met EDWARD GIRNUS, EDWARD STARK or anyone named RITTNER and since MUNTZ is dead it seems that it will be very difficult to prove or disprove GIRNUS' story. RENFROE

said he might have a picture of MUNTZ which we could use if we ever question GIRNUS again.

After I had finished talking with RENFROE in regards to GIRNUS, he launched the conversation into another area of the investigation, namely the EUGENE DAVIS - DEAN ANDREWS relationship. RENFROE said that he had known GENE DAVIS (or "MISS" DAVIS as RENFROE calls him) for about 20 years and he said he never heard the name CLAY BERTRAND associated with DAVIS.

RENFROE'S story, was that DAVIS was living with and taking care of an elderly Negro woman who lived on Dauphine Street. The Negro woman was willing all her money and possessions to DAVIS in return for DAVIS' care. DAVIS ran into financial problems so he approached RENFROE and RENFROE told DAVIS to go to the Negro woman and ask her to give him his inheritance then, instead of waiting until she died. She agreed to this and DAVIS went to a Savings and Loan Company (Homestead Savings & Loan, at 329 Barrone St.? Unsure) to withdraw some money. He could not get the money and informed RENFROE of this fact. RENFROE then suggested that DAVIS talk to DEAN ANDREWS about getting the money. To quote RENFROE he said, "If anybody can get that money, DEAN ANDREWS can."

ANDREWS worked out some plan to get the money (15-20thousand dollars). RENFROE did not remember any of the details of this maneuver but he said that ANDREWS wound up with the money and DAVIS had none. In fact DAVIS had to go to ANDREWS to get a couple of hundred dollars to fix the roof of the house on Dauphine Street after "Betsy" damaged it.

"CLAY BERTRAND" RENFROE was very surprised when ANDREWS said DAVIS was CLAY
BERTRAND. RENFROE said the only person he had ever heard of in
the gay world of the Quarter named CLAY, was CLAY SHAW.

RENFROE said the black robe and hood that SHAW had was worn by SHAW during the Mardi Gras celebrations and he thought the whops were a gift from someone in Mexico. RENFROE then elaborated on the fact that home homosexuals like to be beaten during the course of their "activities". He made the statement "you know, there's all kinds of sex".

NOTES:

RENFROE is waiting on the settlement of the ownership of the apartment house which was supposedly willed to RENFROE by MUNTZ.

RENFROE could be a good source of information on the "gay" crowd in the French Quarter.

The origin of SHAW'S whips (Mexico?) might be interesting, since it might lead to some of SHAW'S connections outside the U. S.

Q. What we would like to know about first, if we could, BILL, are you called BILL or BILLIE? A. BILLIE. Q. Alright. This incident about your introduction to CLAY SHAW. Did you meet CLAY SHAW in New Orleans? A. Well, I met a man introduced to me as CLAY BERTRAND. You met a CLAY BERTRAND? 0. I met a CLAY BERTRAND. The name CLAY SHAW was never A. mentioned or used to me. Alright, can you tell me the circumstances of meeting MR. Q. BERTRAND? A. I certainly can. I met him at the Masquerade Bar. I was taken there by GENE DAVIS for the express reason to Available for follow up guestioning. Very shitted, low meet him. Alright, when was this? 0. It was some time in June of 1958. A June of '58 and what was the occasion of the Masquerade 00 ball? The Masquerade Bar. A. Bar, I beg your pardon. D. A. On St. Louis Street. It's a homosexual hangout. 0. Okay. It's now -- when I left -- called the Cove. It changed

Uh huh, it's on St. Louis Street. Between Bourbon and

- Q. What was he doing at the Court of Two Sisters?
- A. Some kind of maitre'd or something, he wasn't just any everyday bimmy you know. He offered to get me a job there and I'm sorry I didn't go to work, to be honest with you.
- Q. Okay, and he introduced you to CLAY BERTRAND Now, have you identified in your own mind CLAY BERTRAND from pictures that you've seen in the paper or did you ever...
- A. I never seen the picture in the paper, to be honest with you, but I seen him on T.V. once and I thought maybe...
 Oh, looks like, well, somebody I'd be...Well, I thought it was somebody I'd tricked with when I was in New Orleans, and then I kept thinking...
- Q. When did you see him on T.V.?
- A. Oh, it's been a long time ago, three or four months.
- Q. In what connection?
- A. Well just something about Jim Garrison's stuff. They had him coming out of the, oh, uh,he didn't say nothing he was just going in something, you know.
- Q. In a building or ...
- A. Yeah, in a building, you see, I just seen him.
- Q. Then what you say then is that you saw on television several months ago photographs of a man going in or out of the Court building and this was the man you knew as CLAY BERTRAND?
- A. It looked a lot like him, I'll say that. Seeing a man on television and seeing him in real might make a difference.
- Q. Yeah.

A. You understand what I mean? Q. Sure, sure. Was he on television as CLAY SHAW? Was a reference made to him on television as CLAY SHAW? A. Yes, yes. 0. This man was identified on television at that time as CLAY SHAW? A. As CLAY SHAW. 0. I see. A. They said he was a New Orleans businessman or something. He told me he worked for General Electric. I remember that. Alright, you met him at the Masquerade Bar. Q. Α. Yes. Where did you go with him from there? 0. We went to GENE DAVIS' apartment. Α. Okay. Was this at night or in the daytime? 0. This was at night. A. Do you remember where GENE DAVIS' apartment was? 0. I remember where it was but not the exact address. A was two or three doors down further from the Court of Two Sisters. On the even side of Bourbon, of course, 610 or 612 Bourbon, it could have been 608 or 614, you understand what I mean? Yeah. And did you go up there with CLAY BERTRAND? Q. CLAY BERTRAND, yes. We went in a little efficiency... it A. was a little efficiency apartment. I had been there before with GENE DAVIS, of course. Alright, now, did you ever see him after that? Q. A. Uh, I seen him, uh... Yes, I saw him two more times when we went to GENE DAVIS' apartment; I saw him on MR. BOONE'S boat; and then he entered my apartment one night by mistake. But that would take just a little explaining to explain that. Alright, you saw him twice more at DAVIS' apartment... 0. Now, sir, at the Masquerade and we went to DAVIS' Α. apartment. We always met at the Masquerade to have a drink -- I don't even think he drank -- I don't remember -- but then we went to GENE'S, GENE DAVIS' little apartment. 0. You think he did not drink? I can't remember whether he drank beer or what. I know A. GENE DAVIS was a lush, a lush. He drank some, you know what I mean.

- Q. You met him on BOONE'S boat, you said?
- A. On a guy named BILL BOONE'S boat. Matter of fact, GENE DAVIS is the one who introduced me to BILL BOONE.
- Q. What kind of boat was it? Do you recall?
- A. All I recall is it was a big boat. It was big, you know, for a boat, but I ... it was big to me ... it wasn't uh ... I think GENE said it was 80 feet.
- Q. It was a yacht then.
- A. Oh, it was a seagoing yacht, her. It could go, you know, it can go, it can go,
- Q. What did BILL BOONE do?
- A. I don't know, he just ...
- Q. Alright.
- A. He never did tell me. I never...
- Q. You knew BOONE, though.
- A. Why, yes, I know MR. BOONE.
- Alright, can you describe physically to me the man you knew as CLAY BERTRAND. How tall was he? You're 6'1"?

 How tall are you?

About 180 pounds, 185. Q. About 180 to 185 pounds? Unidentified - Here I've got a lighter. You can keep those matches, I have more here. What's the longest time you were with him, I mean in close relationship like we're sitting here now or as you might at a bar? Well, we never hung around the Masquerade much. We just A. had one drink or two and then split, you understand? I'll say about a period of about three hours. About three hours. Alright, you say you met him for 0. sexual purposes, did he pay you for this? \$20.00. A. He payed you \$20.00. 0. Each time, No prearranged agreement, he just... Gene A. told me it was a good score ... don't count on him for nothing. What did the sexual practices consist of, would you mind Q. describing them for me, to help in our effort to identify the man? Well, actually it makes no difference to me, cause it's A. no secret with me. I'm down here on an homosexual offense so it's no secret with me. To him maybe it might be. Well, I don't know the terms to use, legal terms, but he just, he f--ked me, you see. Q. Alright. It was anal intercourse then. Anal intercourse, yeah, that's the legal term. A. Now did it consist of anything else? 0. Well he, he alsways ... as I remember it ... that was just A. about it. Well, he wasn't exactly the butchest thing in the world, you know. He was, he was a homosexual, by that I mean, you know. What do you mean by the butchest thing in the world? Q.

- A. Well he gets up in it, you know. Do you understand what I mean?
- Q. Yeah. Okay, now then, in his conversations with you did he ever disclose anything that would lead you to believe what type of work he was engaged in?
- A. No.
- Q. Anything about his personal life?
- A. No, you mean where he lived? He told me he lived with his mother. That's why we went to GENE DAVIS' place. And that's a natural thing. People live with their mothers. Or maybe they're even married and have a wife.
- Q. What was the man's age?
- A. He was in his...he looked to me to be about his middle thirties.
- Q. He appeared in his mid-thirties in 1958?
- A. But he had a very nice physique for a man that age. If you understand what I mean. I don't remember if he had any tatoos or scars.
- Q. What kind of voice did he have? Was it like mine, or yours or Mr. Martin's, was he harsh in his speech?
- A. Oh well now, that's hard.
- Q. I know it's been a long time.
- A. Well, I mean, he never said "heard" or "Knowed" or "dis" and "dat".
- Q. He spoke good english?
- A. He spoke good english.
- Q. Maybe we can help, rather than say he had a voice like yours or mine, did he have a high voice or a low voice?
- A. He wasn't one of them "Hi, darling" (in feminine voice)
 type of homosexuals, if that's what you mean. This guy
 was a John. If you'd meet him on the street you'd never
 snap. You could go fishing with him, play poker with
 him (I don't know if he plays poker) or anything, you'd
 never snap in a million years. Don't get me wrong when I
 say he's a homosexual, he's not one of those, you know
 what I mean, limp wrists. He's a butch.
- Q. Was he a cultured man, was he a working man, this is the thing I mean about his voice. You can usually tell what type of economic life a man leads by the way he talks. That's what I'm after.
- A. Oh well, I'd make book he went to college. He didn't dress like one, he dressed nice. Now GENE DAVIS dressed like a slob. He may dress nice now that he has that bar and got a little money but back then he dressed like a slob. Actually, he was a slob. Not that I've got anything against him.

- Q. I've never seen GENE DAVIS. Would you describe him to How tall would you say GENE DAVIS is? Well he's shorter than I am, definitely shorter. 0. How much shorter? A. Oh, not a great deal. He's not a short man but he's not a tall man either. He might be grey headed now but he had coal black hair then and he's a black headed person, with black eyebrows, and black eyes and he was kind of hairy, on his arms. Well, how tall would you say he is, is he 5'5" or 5'10"? 0. Well, he's about 5'82" or 9" or 10". Not no midget. How much would he weigh? Q. He had false teeth. (talking about ! GENE DAVIS) A. He had at that time false teeth. If he had them then, he 0. has got to have them now. You don't grow 'em again. I guess I just might as well go and get mine. Alright he had false teeth, he's about 5'85" or 5'9" and how much did he weigh? I'm not to good at guessing weights? I'll say as best A. I can, I'd say he weighed about 160 pounds. About 160? 0. He wasn't exactly fat. He had a little pouch. A. Now he introduced you to this man as CLAY BERTRAND in 0. the bar? In the Masquerade Bar. A. The Masquerade Bar. Did BERTRAND wear a hat? 0. A. No. never have I seen the man with a hat on. Never.

GENE DAVIS introduced you -

A. I know what I drank. If they were buying, I drank a stinger. If someone else is buying, I'm going to drink a mixed drink.

Now do you remeber what you drank? At the first meeting. I'm not talking about the subsequent meetings but the first time you met the guy in the Masquerade Bar when

Q. Now it's your memory we're trying and not your drinking habits. We're trying to see what you can definitely recall without any question in your mind.

- A. I can't recall what the name of the name of the drinks

 were but I know we had a drink everytime we went there.

 And I know that CLAY BERTRAND or whatever his name was
 paid for them. With a big time big score like that GENE

 DAVIS wasn't about to go to his pocket.
- Q. The first time you met him was BERTRAND wearing a suit, or was he wearing slacks or what?
- A. He was wearing a suit everytime I met him.
- Q. Everytime you met him he wore a suit.
- A. Well maybe sometimes he was wearing a sport coat but he always had on a jacket.
- Q. To get away from this a little bit, we'll come back to it later, would you tell me about the period of time you lived in Beaumont and Port Arthur in Jefferson County?
- A. Not a thing cause I was just there two days and I got busted.
- Q. Who were you with at the time?
- A. I was with a salesman from the company I was working for but he's strictly straight, don't know none of these people. Just as old wino. His name is WALTER S. SMITH. The police liked to have beat him to death when he told them that in Beaumont. They had me on an alias and they got him and they asked him what's your name and he said SMITH and they like to beat him to death but that was his name, Smith.
- Q. Where were you caught?
- A. I was apprehended in Beaumont, Texas.
- Q. No, I mean, where were you -- in a motel room, a car or where were you?
- A. No, I was out in the woods.
- Q. Alright. And you didn't know anyone around Beaumont?
- A. Not a soul. Well I went there to work for a company.
 Allied Continental Automobile Association, 1232 Baronne
 Street in New Orleans and 808 Orleans Street in Beaumont.
 But I believe they closed their Beaumont office down. I
 wouldn't know about their other.
- Q. Did someone in New Orleans recommend you to Beaumont for that job?
- A. I was sent out there purposely to go to work there. You know to run their sales up. I'm a pretty good salesman.
- Q. Who sent you there?
- A. Well, TROY HEIDELBERG, the manager of the New Orleans office, and LOUIS ROMANO, the owner in the Houston office at 1803 Pease Street in Houston.
- Q. Do you know if HEIDELBERG knew CLAY SHAW?

- A. Oh, no, no. Those two parts of my life were entirely separate. This was in 1960 I'm talking about; I was talking about 1959 just a minute ago. Those two parts of my life are entirely separate. TROY HEIDELBERG is married and has four children, is a Mason, one of those type of people. I worked for the man. Oh I might have gone next door with him and drank a bottle of beer at lunchtime. He knew I was homosexual.
- Q. How long did you work for that company?
- A. About eight months.
- Q. Had you known HEIDELBERG before?
- A. I never saw him before I walked in the office. I answered an ad in the paper. That's the reason I walked in.
- Q. Alright, can you tell us anyone else in New Orleans in 1958 who might have been introduced to CLAY BERTRAND as CLAY BERTRAND?
- A. Well, I could tell you a gang of people. I don't know where you'd hunt them up.
- Q. Well, I say who might have been. Do you know anybody who <u>did</u> know him as CLAY BERTRAND other than GENE DAVIS?
- A. BILL BOONE.
- Q. BILL BOONE, the owner of the yacht.
- A. Yeah.
- Q. Do you happen to remember the name of the yacht club or where the yacht was located?

 However, positive in the positive of the yacht club or the yacht was located?
- A. It was out by the My-O-My Club. I don't know the name of it but it was by the My-O-My.
- Q. It was the yacht club next to the My-O-My?
- A. Yes, it was right over from there.
- Q. Do you remember anything about the bartender at the Masquerade Bar? Do you know who he was?
- A. CHRIS GOODYEAR, if I remember right.
- Q. CHRIS GOODYEAR. Did he know BERTRAND?
- A. Now I found out later and this is getting ahead of myself and I'm going to confuse myself and confuse you, too, probably, but I found out later than BILL BOONE owned that bar, I didn't know it then. But he owned it. CHRIS GOODYEAR ran it for him. But he sold out. That's when they changed the name over from the Cove. You know in 1958, the summer of 1958, they got real rought on homosexuals in the New Orleans area, and dope people. I'm not a dope person but, well, most of them got their hatboxes and headed for Miami. About that time BILL BOONE ... when I got back, the way I understood when I got back he sold it. But at the time I met BILL BOONE I didn't know that. The time I met BILL BOONE I had been living in New Orleans for just a couple of months. I

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I lived in New Orleans for a total of about three months and by the time I got to living there, well BILL BOONE was kind of wellknown around... some homosexuals know him and the time I met him I didn't know him from Adam's housecat, the first time I was introduced to him, if you understand what I mean.

- Q. Alright, who else might have known BERTRAND that you can think of?
- A. Well, this guy I lived with, named WALTER WILSON.
- Q. WALTER WILSON?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. Well, what did he do, where can we find him?
- A. Well, I lived with him for quite a while. I know he knows BILL BOONE because he runs a bridge club in New Orleans.
- Q. What club?
- A. A bridge club.
- Q. The cardgame Bridge?
- A. Yes, at 117 University Place. BILL BOONE has been up there to play bridge and he knew him through bridge playing. And he might know GENE DAVIS just very casually, very casually. But I don't know if he's ever met this other guy.
- Q. Before we get too far off the subject of BILL BOONE, do you know, I want to make sure we're pronouncing and spelling that right, do you know how to spell it?
- A. Like Daniel Boone.
- O. Like Daniel Boone.
- A. B-O-O-N-E.
- Q. Right. Can you tell us some more names of any homosexuals that you knew in New Orleans?
- A. AMOS McFARLAN, CANDY LEE. I don't know where CANDY'S at right now. CANDY knew them all, CANDY knew GENE, GENE DAVIS, I don't know if she knew this other one.
- Q. What did she do, was she a stripper or what?
- A. She worked at the back bar at Tony Basina's, CANDY LEE.
- Q. Do you know if she knew CLAY BERTRAND?
- A. No, I'd have no way of knowing whether she knew him.
- Q. But she knew DAVIS?
- A. Oh, yeah. I'm sure. And there's that big fat gal that used to run around the bar, everybody called her WANDA.

 I've seen BILL BOONE in there talking to her. So I know she knows BILL.

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- Q. Where is Wanda's Bar?
- A. On Iberville between Royal and Bourbon, I don't know the exact address, right next door to that garage where you can park and the department store.
- Q. Exactly where?

A.

- A. On Iberville between Royal and Bourbon.
- Q. Okay, did you know DAVID FERRIE?
- A. I don't recognize the name.
- Q. Did you ever know LEE HARVEY OSWALD?

WILSON are back in New Orleans and we rent an apartment from MR. BOONE, the Chinese lady, but it is MR. BOONE'S apartment. Gave the Chinese lady the rent. After we were living there for about... this guy EDDIE who works for MR. BOONE came by there and said hello, you know. He wanted to borrow some bedsheets from me. And I said sure and I loaned him a bedspread, some sheets and pillowslips and he brought them back a couple of days later; they were laundered real nice and he said thank you and I said thank you. But there were a lot of comings and goings in the other apartment but I didn't know what was going on, I didn't pay it no mind. But I thought they were going in there tricking, having sex. I seen EDDIE going in their with the kids hustling I figured that one time. But there was all kinds of people going in that place. So I lived in that one apartment for one month. Well I happened to be going past there and I saw EDDIE in there cleaning up and doing things and I looked in there and it was a much nicer apartment and I said why don't you let me rent this apartment. EDDIE said I don't see why not. It's not so much it was nicer, I just liked it there. It was one big room. My rent was up in two or three days so I asked WT about it and he said it's only \$10.00 more so go ahead.

I hadn't been there over a night or two when here comes this guy BERTRAND just walk in, he had a key. He said well what are you doing over here. And I said well how are you, what are you doing here? And I was surprised to see him because I hadn't seen him in a long time but I still knew him because I tricked with him. And he said what are you doing here, you waiting to meet BILL? And I said no I live here. He said you live with BILL? And I said no I moved in here. He walked out. He had a man withhim.
- Q. Who do you mean by BILL?
- A. BILL BOONE. When he said do you live with BILL well he thought I had, well... you all work with the D.A.'s office, you know how it is with homosexuals. - Q. Alright, how was BERTRAND dressed?
- A. Suit.
- Q. Was it a light or dark suit BERTRAND was wearing?
- A. It's funny. I can remember what suit this other guy had on but can't remember that, but I'll be honest with you, I just don't know what this man was wearing. Everytime I ever seen CLAY BERTRAND he's been pretty nicely fixed up, dressed up in a suit. Everytime I ever saw GENE DAVIS, he was dressed like a bum.
- Q. Did you ever spend any time around Dallas?
- A. Never been to Dallas.
- Q. You've never been to Dallas?
- A. That's right.
- Q. You'll can stay around here and talk for a while and I'm going to go out and get some pictures.

(Martin to Boxley) Very good. You've got the whole set that I sent you plus some others?

Q. (Boxley) Yes. Are you going to make notes for me?

A. (Morris) You're not used to this heat?

Q. Uh?

- A. You're not used to this heat. I haven't been in an air conditioned room going on seven years. It don't phase me.
- Q. Is that right.
- A. Yeh, it's bothering you.
- Q. Have you stated here in this interview when you came here, what date it was when you were first arrested?

The three times I met him at the Masquerade Bar it was, GENE DAVIS took me all three times, it was kind of a thing between us, and then we went straight from there to MR. DAVIS' apartment, GENE DAVIS, well actually, it was kind of...very private, you know what I mean. It wasn't like going to a big party with 100 people there and CLAY BERTRAND was there. Now this guy EDDIE who worked for BILL BOONE...

- A. Now, I wrote you all a litter...ah, evidently you all got, cause ... but there was a Cuban person on that boat in September, in late September when I went out there and I wrote you about that...
- Q. Yes.

- A. I know a Cuban cause I lived in Miami...Somehow I can just tell the differnce between a Cuban and a Mexican.
- Q. Can you tell the difference between a Cuban and a Venezuelan or a Cuban and a ...
- A. Aw, no. You might have me there.
- Q. Well, I just wanted to get that clear. Can you describe this Latin American for me? Primarily, what was his age, approximately?
- A. He was approximately 22. He was young. He wasn't...
 uh, I just figured it was somebody BILL was...you know.
- O. Uh huh.
- A. You understand what I mean?
- Q. I understand. Are you any relation to a young man in Baton Rouge by the name of PERRY RUSSO?
- A. Who?
- O. RUSSO.
- A. Any relation? Any kin? Why, no.
- Q. The reason I ask is that you look so damn much like him.

 you might be a relation to him and I didn't know anything
 about it.
- A. Oh, no. The only kinfolk I got in my mama. My daddy is still alive, but he disappeared years ago. My mama, two aunts and my grandpa. I haven't even got any brothers, or sisters. I'm the only child and my mother's the only child.
- Q. Any cousins?
- A. Well, I've got some real distant ones but they certainly wouldn't be named RUSSO. I'm the only disrespectful one in my family.
- Q. I didn't mean to imply or relate the name RUSSO with disrespect.
- A. Oh, no. There's nothing wrongwith the name RUSSO but I'm from Tennessee, and people up there, you know, ... it's a common name down there in Louisiana, but in Tennessee, I can't even say that I've even heard the name.
- Q. I see...
- A. Of course, it might...I think I read the name in the paper in the New Orleans bit. You see when I get a paper its two or three days old and it's all cut up and all.
- Q. Can you remember anyone else in the New Orleans area, aside from TENNESSEE WILLIAMS who used to know BOONE?

- A. CHRIS GOODYEAR worked for him but CHRIS GOODYEAR left town when BILL BOONE sold the Masquerade Bar.
- Q. Do you know if BILL BOONE ever sold the apartment you were living in?
- A. I have no idea. He might have sold it in 1960.
- Q. Do you know if he was a mative New Orleanian or ...?
- A. He was from the West Coast. He lived on the West Coast.

 BILL BOONE ad lived on the West Coast.
- Q. What kind of work had he done, investments had he made or something?
- A. It just never was discussed. He was just one of those kind of guys, I suppose. Always wore a little white sailor hat, a little white cap, you know, I'll tell you something else about him. He wears a toupee. He's been badly burned at one time or another.
- Q. Where? On what part of the body?
- A. I never seen him undressed. But he's got some on his head, on his arms.
- Q. How can you tell?
- A. You just have to look.
- Q. Scars?
- A. Scars, he's got plenty scars.
- Q. Are they obvious?
- A. If he's at a distance, he could get by. But if you shake him down pretty good, you can see them.
- Q. What age man is he?
- A. Well at the time I knew him he was pretty close to 60 years old.
- Q. About 60.
- A. He wasn't no young man then.
- Q. Burned on his face and ...?
- A. Well, his forehead. It looks like he might have had a little plastic surgery done on his face due to the burn and his head, he wears a toupee though.
- Q. A complete toupee?
- A. No, no, he might wear a complete one now. He wore one like that (indicating top of head). In other words, he's got a bald crown.
- Q. In other words, a bald crown with a fringe.
- A. And he's brown headed and he wears a brown toupee. He's tall...

- Q. Is he burnt on the arms?
- A. He's just burnt, on his arms, his hands...
- Q. His hands. And he'd be about 60 now, you say?
- A. About 60.
- Q. You started to give a physical description of him.
- A. Well, I can give you a pretty good one of him because he is so tall. He's taller than I am, while most people aren't. So he's 6'3" or 6'4". He's skinny... thin.
- Q. Alright, I've got some pictures here and I'd like you to look at them and without turning them over just look and tell me if you know any of these men.
- A. Well, now. I'd be a smooth fool if I didn't tell you that's JACK RUBY. You can see the Dallas Police thing, 11/24/63, After all...
- Q. Can you make out any of the others?
- A. I don't know anybody else here...but this one...(long pause) Boy, if that's him, he's aged) He has. He looks like he's on dope habit, more 'n likely.
- Q. If its who?
- A. CLAY BERTRAND. He has aged. Course that could be.s.
 He's aged a lot. Course thats...It's been seven years.
 This one, this one, this one, this one I'd say definitely
 I've never seen them but this one, now that could be
 CLAY BERTRAND, the man GENE DAVIS introduced me to as
 CLAY BERTRAND.
- Q. Would you read into the microphone the number of this and the date of the man you identified as maybe being CLAY BERTRAND?
- A. 125-388 and then the date is the third months, the first day of 1967.
- Q. What does it say about it?
- A. New Orleans, Louisiana.
- Q. Is it a mug shot?
- A. I've been mugged myself, and it looks like one to me.
- Q. Thanks. Let the record show that the photograph just identified was that taken of CLAY SHAW on the date of his arrest in this investigation.
 - Now this man here, does he look to you like the man that BERTRAND brought to your apartment by mistake?
- A. As I stated he had a hat on.
- Q. Alright, he had a hat on, let's cover up the top of his head. And he was dressed in a suit you recall, so let's cover up his open collar.

- Q. For the record you've been talking about a photograph of DALLAS GRIFFIN GUTHRIE.

- Q. DALLAS GRIFFIN GUTHRIE. Photograph made in the Dallas Police Department No. 40547 in 1966.
- A. Well, when I knew this guy, I knew him as DAVE.
- Q. Alright. Did you ever hear the name of a man called GORDON NOVEL?
- A. No, I say that ... I'm almost certain ...

Do you want to take a look at one last group of pictures. Do you know any of these people?

- A. No, never. I'm just not that type of, you know ... I've just never done it. Besides, I'm slightly too hairy.
- Q. Let's get a physical description one more time of the man you met as CLAY BERTRAND. How tall do you estimate he was?

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- A. About my height.
- Q. Which is what?
- A. Well, I'm approximately 6'. He might be just a little bit shorter than me...someshorter.
- Q. A little shorter than you. Okay, and how much would you say he weighs?
- A. He was stocky and well built, about 180. He had a nice built for a man his age. And I'd say he was about 35 or 40 years old and he was build nice for his age. At least I thought so.
- Q. Okay, he was 35 to 40, a little bit shorter than you, and did he have a full head of hair, thinning hair or what?
- A. He had a head of hair.
- Q. Alright, what color?
- A. Kind of reddish-brownich-grey, you know what I mean.
- Yeah, and did he carry his weight... How much would you say he weighed?
- A. About 180.
- Q. 100 and what?
- A. About 180.
- Q. Okay. One thing that I wanted to ask you... Do you know if any of these men that we talked about so far who knew CLAY BERTMAND, do you know if any of these people had a police record of any kind?
- A. I wouldn't know whether they did or whether they didn't.
- Q. You don't know.
- A. I have no idea.
- Q. Now before we conclude this interview, I'd like to ask you if you have any objections at all to the way this interview was conducted and whether or not it was given of your own free will?
- A. It was given of my own free will, and uh, it turned out pretty fair, I thought.
- Q. Thank you.
- Q. Thank you, Mr. Morris.

Dear Mr. Bethell:

For what it is worth I am passing on a bit of reporting from a friend and admirer of Jim Garrison that I heard tonight.

Augura Angura My friend is acquainted with a man, whose name I will not include here, who told my friend that his mother in Nec Orleans had been housekeeper to Clay Shaw. This lady is reported as terrified about the hazard to her from what she knows. This includes knowing of Ferrie's what she knows. This includes knowing in retrieve association with Shaw, knowledge of the sadistic stuff (whips, etc) in the closet, and the mystericus death or killing of somebody in the house, whether an associate or not is not known. There had been no police investigation, but a coroner had come and picked up the body. Two men lived in the house of which the lady was housekeeper. My friend is not sure of all the details, but this is the general picture he got .

My friend is a businessman whose motives are sound. He saw no reason to discount this report, but cannot vouch for it beyond what he told me.

I was particulary pleased to read of Garrison's evidence that Lee Oswald had informed the FBI of the assassination plot. I have had an increasingly strong conviction that this must have taken place from my reading of Oswald's character. I do doubt that it was Lee Oswald that was Ruby's bedmate. That sounds to me more like the Leon Oswald who was an assassin.

INFORMATION ON THE N.S.R.P. AND THE

AMERICAN NAZI PARTY

JOSEPH COOPER of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, gave us the following information pertaining to the above named groups.

COMRADE RANDOLPH BROWN, Box 4725, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, was the American Nazi Party's representative in Baton Rouge. DR. VIRGIL FORD, a veterinarian on North 19th Street in Baton Rouge is a member of the N.S.R.P. and a good friend of DR. CARL McINTYRE. He has stated to COOPER that McINTYRE is our only hope. Also HERB PRICE and a TV personality from WBRZ, who used the name COUNT McCOBB are members of the N.S.R.P. in Baton Rouge.

COOPER said that there was a meeting at the Capitol House Hotel in Baton Rouge in 1963 which featured DR. CARL McINTYRE. COOPER said that GUY BANISTER met DR. McINTYRE at this meeting. This meeting followed approximately one month a similar meeting at the Capitol House which featured GENERAL WALKER as the main speaker and BILLY JOE HARGIS. COOPER said that GEORGE RATLIFF moved from Jackson, Mississippi, to Baton Rouge, Louisiana in 1963 and bought into radio station WYNK. He believes that DR. McINTYRE had something to do with RATLIFF's move. RATLIFF and McINTYRE are the same kind and RATLIFF's radio station sponsored McINTYRE's fees to Baton Rouge. Later on RATLIFF and VAN BUSKIRK tried to take over a Klan in Clinton, Louisiana. RATLIFF has told COOPER that when the take-over comes, the FBI will be on his side. RATLIFF now lives in Ruston, Louisiana.

CHESTER BENNETT of Baton Rouge is a close friend of RATLIFF's and ALVIN BRUMFIELD is COMRADE BROWN's attorney.

In New Orleans N.S.R.P. members are JAMES LEAHART who now lives on Dante Street and who COOPER describes as a person who will do anything for ROCKWELL. Also JAMES R. BROWN whose wife, COLLEEN, worked for the Government for fourteen years in rockets, is a member of the N.S.R.P. in New Orleans. COOPER also said that MRS. A. B. McSEE, 4360 Clayton Drive, Baton Rouge, said that LEE HARVEY OSWALD came to her house with his wife and baby between October 23 and October 28, 1963, trying to rent an apartment. She said that he told her that he had experience from working at the Standard Coffee Company in New Orleans and she said that she did not have a vacant apartment and she recommended that he try to get work at the Community Coffee Company in Baton Rouge.

Steve Bordelon and I traveled to Monroe, Louisiana, in an effort to locate our deaf mute and GAIL HALL and talk to BARBARA MESSINA. Because of certain complications, our travel was not an overwhelming success, however, some substantial contacts were made for future reference.

BARBARA MESSINA who resides at 1507 Spencer Street,
Monroe, Louisiana, phone number 387-6410, had previously told
AUBREY YOUNG that she did have occasion to meet JACK RUBY in

[1963] She said that RUBY called her several times. She said that
she had occasion to have dinner with JACK RUBY several times.

She also said that on these occasions she was picked up by an

[elderly gray-haired man in a Cadillac) and taken to meet RUBY.

She does not know the name of the driver and AUBREY did not have
any pictures to show her. She also said that RUBY had a nice
looking young man with him on these occasions. She also said
that she happened to meet a person whose picture she saw on
television after the assassination. She does not know any of the
people's names. She said that RUBY offered to get her a job in
Dallas with a doctor.

We tried to locate BARBARA MESSINA for two days but no one answered her phone and AUBREY said that he thought that she had left town because she was terribly frightened and knew that we were on our way up to see her.

We contacted SHERIFF BILL CAUSEY in regard to GAIL HALL and he said that the name was not familiar to him. He did refer us to ROY LEA LINER who runs a shoe repair shop at 1208 Cypress Street in W. Monroe, Louisiana, phone number 323-2970. LINER's parents are deaf mutes and he holds classes for the deaf mutes in the Monroe area. I gave him all the information that we had on our deaf mute and he said that he would make an effort to locate him for us.

SHORTY BELL who runs the Red Ball Pool Hall at 5709 Desaird Street is another person who has some contact with the deaf community, and who is attempting to help us.

We talked with JACK HESNI who runs the Majestic Hotel on Sixth and Desaird Street in Monroe and he said that to his knowledge he knows of no deaf mute who has stayed at the hotel. He said that he has a big turnover in night clerks and perhaps they may have seen or heard of the deaf mute, but that he hasn't.
