Mr. Wilcox:

This statement refers to a portion of Mr. Hamblen's written statement dated Dec. 2 in which Mr. Hamblen stated that he recalls I had trouble paying a money order to a man named Oswald several weeks ago because the payee did not have proper identification; that Oswald was informed to get some identification and return and he would be paid; that he did return about an hour later with a Navy identification card and a library card and was paid a small sum of money.

I do recall relieving Mr. Archie Rowell on Tuesday, Oct. 29, on the early night money order position, while Mr. Rowell was relieving Mrs. Bedwell during the last week of her vacation. As I recall, I did have difficulty paying a small money order to a man, who struck me as being a "feminine type" person, however, I cannot remember his name. The reason I happen to recall the incident out of the great number of money orders paid by me at the front counter is because he gave me so much trouble regarding such a small money order. While I do not remember the name of the payee, I do recall it was delivered to some one at the Y.M.C.A. on North Ervay Street. I also recall the payee of the money order in question was accompanied by another man of Spanish descent.

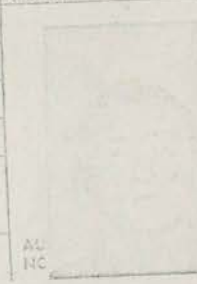

I was standing in front of the Sheriff's Office at 505 Main Street, Dallas, Texas, watching President Kennedy pass in the motorcade. I was watching the rest of the motorcade a few seconds after President Kennedy passed where I was standing when I heard a rifle shot and a few seconds later a second and then a third shot. At the report of the first shot, I started running around the corner and Officer Buddy Withers and I ran across Houston Street and ran up the terrace on Elm Street and into the railroad yards. We made a round through the railroad yards and I returned to Elm Street by the T-shaped sign at which time Officer Withers told me that a bullet had struck the curb on the south side of Elm Street. I crossed to Elm with Deputy C. L. Lummie Lewis to search for a spot where a shell might have hit. About this time I heard a shrill whistle and I turned around and saw a white male running down the hill from the direction of the Texas School Book Depository Building and I saw what I think was a light colored Rambler Station wagon with luggage rack on top pull over to the curb and the subject who had come running down the hill get into this car. The man driving this station wagon was a dark complected white male. I tried to get across Elm street to stop the car and talk with subjects, but the traffic was so heavy I could not make it. I reported this incident at once to a secret service officer, whose name I do not know, then I left this area and went at once to the building and assisted in the search of the building.

Later that afternoon, I heard that the City had a suspect in custody and I called and reported the information about the suspect running down the hill and getting into a car to Captain Fritz and was requested to come at once to City Hall. I went to the City Hall and identified the subject they had in custody as being the same person I saw running down this hill and get into the station wagon and leave the scene.

I advised him that for the past few months at a house at 1126 Harlandale some Cubans have been having meetings on the week ends and were possibly connected with the "Freedom For Cuba Party" of which Oswald was a member.

This day at about 1235 PM I was on the roof of the Terminal Annex Bldg on the NE Corner when the presidential motorcade came down Main to Houston, North on Houston and then West on Elm. The cars had proceeded West on Elm and was just a short distance from the Tripple underpass, when I saw Gove Connolly slump over. I did not see the president as his car had gotten out of my view under the underpass. There was a volley of shots, I think five and then much later, maybe as much as five minutes later another one. I saw one man run towards the passenger cars on the railroad siding after the volley of shots. This man had a white dress shirt, no tie and dark colored trousers. His hair appeared to be long and dark and his agility running could be about 25 years of age. He had something in his hand. I couldn't be sure but it may have been a head piece. I received your instructions from John Volz that I attempt to obtain a copy of the succession of Hugh S. Ward and report as follows:

On January 31, 1967, I went to the Clerk of Court's Office at Covington, Louisiana, St. Tammany Parish, to check the Index for successions. I found no succession listed under the name of Ward. I checked from the years 1959 through the present.

As a second method of checking, I checked the Index for tutorships with the thought that the deceased might have had minor children. I found two tutorships for Wards. One had no relation to this investigation. The other tutorship bore Docket No. 4024 and is the tutorship of Gina Lynn Ward and Cynthia Louann Ward. Upon checking, I found that these were the minor children of Hugh S. Ward.

I obtained a complete copy of the records of this tutorship proceeding which consists of five pages. From Article 3 of the Petition of Appointment of Tutor it is apparent that no succession will be opened as Hugh Ward left only insurance policies. As you know, it is not necessary for succession to be opened for the beneficiary to be paid under an insurance policy.

To further check whether or not Hugh Ward had property which could or should have been included in the succession, I checked the Vendee Index back to the year, 1917, and found no record of property being transferred to Hugh S. Ward or his wife, Donna C. Ward.

I am attaching a copy of the tutorship proceedings. This completes this assignment on this particular phase of the investigation.

MEMORANDUM

January 17, 1967

TO: JIM GARRISON, DISTRICT ATTORNEY

RE: SPECIAL INVESTIGATION

Pursuant to our recent investigative assignment, I make this interim report:

Succession of Banister - enclosed with this memorandum you will find one copy of the succession of William Guy Banister. I have made a second copy which I am studying for leads which might assist me in completing the balance of this investigative assignment.

Banister's Detective Agency - pursuant to the assignment to obtain information about Banister's Detective Agency, I obtained the following two names as possible identification of his Detective Agency: Southern Research and Guy Banister Private Detective Agency. I found no recordation under the name of Southern Research. I found no recordation under the name of Guy Banister Private Detective Agency. Upon checking further with the name of Southern Research, I found a recordation of a charter in Book 2031 at page 618 for Southern Research Company of New Orleans, Inc. I find further that this corporation has not been dissolved. This corporation was formed on August 26, 1963. The charter was executed before Attorney Nicklas J. Gagliano and witnessed by John Maht and Goldr Stoltz. Listed in the charter as directors and agents for service of process as well as officers of the company were the following names: Charles R. Carson whose address is 4769 Overton Drive, New Orleans, Edward E. Parent whose address is 4525 Duplisses Street in the City of New Orleans, A. Harry Roberts, no address listed, Shirley Riggs whose address is 2003 Metairie Road, Metairie, Louisiana. I find nothing in the charter to indicate that this corporation was associated with Guy Banister other than the fact that I had been given the name that Guy Banister

was associated with a detective agency called Southern Research.

From the succession of William Guy Banister, it appears that some of the assets (papers and documents which had been filed in a safety deposit box) were disposed of by placing them in the possession of his adopted daughter, Mary Jane Banister, wife of Donald Duvio. I therefore obtained the name of the detective agency to be Guy Banister Associates, Inc. I obtained a copy for the charter of Guy Banister Associates, Inc., a private detective agency organized on January 21, 1958. 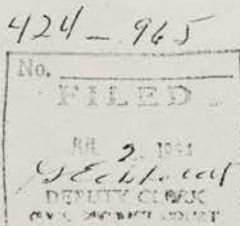

Establishing and selecting means and routes of escape from the assassination scene to a point outside the continental United States.

Determining of procedures and the places to be used for some of the principals to the conspiracy to establish alibies on the date of the assassination.

- C. Clay L. Shaw traveling from New Orleans to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in the Fall of 1963 and there meeting Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby at the Capitol House Hotel and delivering to Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby a sum of money.
- D. A trip to the West Coast of the United States by Clay L. Shaw during the month of November, 1963.
- E. A trip by David W. Ferrie from New Orleans, Louisiana, to Houston, Texas, on the day of November 22, 1963.
- F. Lee Harvey Oswald taking his rifle from the home of Mrs. Ruth Paine in Irving, Texas, to the Texas School Book Depository in Dallas, Texas, on or before November 22, 1963.

Shaw in the possession of the District Attorney as said books, if any exist, are evidence, privileged from disclosure, and part of the proof to be adduced on the trial of this case. Further, any books which were seized from Clay L. Shaw pursuant to the search warrant are known to the defendant because he has a copy of the inventory on the return of the search warrant. All such items seized pursuant to the warrant are in the possession of the clerk of Court and accessible to the defense under the supervision of the Court.

Shaw in the possession of the District Attorney as said securities, if any exist, are evidence, privileged from disclosure, and part of the proof to be adduced on the trial of this case. Further, any securities which were seized from Clay L. Shaw pursuant to the search warrant are known to the defendant because he has a copy

of the inventory on the return of the search warrant. All such items seized pursuant to the warrant are in the possession of the Clerk of Court and accessible to the defense under the supervision of the Court.

LXI.

The State denies that it is required to give a description of the address books belonging to Clay L. Shaw in the possession of the District Attorney as said address books, if any exist, are evidence, privileged from disclosure, and part of the proof to be adduced on the trial of this case. Further, any address books which were seized from Clay L. Shaw pursuant to the search warrant are known to the defendant because he has a copy of the inventory on the return of the search warrant. All such items seized pursuant to the warrant are in the possession of the Clerk of Court and accessible to the defense under the supervision of the Court.

LXII.

The State denies that it is required to give a description of the phone books belonging to Clay L. Shaw in the possession of the District Attorney as said phone books, if any exist, are evidence, privileged from disclosure, and part of the proof to be adduced on the trial of this case. Further, any phone books which were seized from Clay L. Shaw pursuant to the search warrant are known to the defendant because he has a copy of the inventory on the return of the search warrant. All such items seized pursuant to the warrant are in the possession of the Clerk of Court and accessible to the defense under the supervision of the Court.

LXIII.

The State denies that it is required to give a description of any objects belonging to Clay L. Shaw in the

possession of the District Attorney as said objects, if any artist, are evidence, privileged from disclosure, and part of the proof to be adduced on the trial of this case. Further, any objects which were seized from Clay L. Shaw pursuant to the search warrant are known to the defendant because he has a copy of the inventory on the return of the search warrant. All such items seized pursuant to the warrant are in the possession of the Clerk of Court and accessible to the defense under the supervision of the Court.

LXIV. thru LXXXVIII.

The State denies that it is required to give the information requested in Articles LXIV thru LXXXVIII of the Application for Bill of Particulars as such information is a matter of proof to be adduced at the time of the trial and is privileged from pre-trial disclosure.
