SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD (6)

Sir:

The following report is submitted for your information.

Memorandum to Captain W.P. Gannaway, dated December 2, 1963 pertaining to LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Quote "The undersigned received information from a confidential source that approximately two weeks prior to the assassination of President of the United States John F. Kennedy, SUBJECT made application for employment at the Allright Parking System, 1208 Commerce Street. Signed Bob K. Carroll, Detective, Administrative Section.

On January 23, 1964 the undersigned officer interviewed Mr. Hubert A. Morrow, W/M, who is one of the managers at the Allright Parking System, 1208 Commerce Street, RI-8-4348. Mr. Morrow's residence address is 2334 McAdams, FE-1-1346.

Mr. Morrow stated that approximately six or seven days prior to the assassination of the President of the United States John Fitzgerald Kennedy SUBJECT came to the parking lot asking for a job. Mr. Morrow stated that while talking to him about the job, SUBJECT asked him how high the parking lot building was and if it afforded a good view of Dallas. Mr. Morrow stated that at the time SUBJECT was applying for employment he was dressed in a dirty white T shirt and blue jeans, and was carrying a newspaper, and that it was during the early morning hours. Mr. Morrow stated that the last time he saw SUBJECT he was waiting to talk with Mr. Claude Hallmark another one of the managers. Mr. Morrow states that the reason he remembers SUBJECT so well is that he wrote SUBJECT'S name down, and that he thought the name was Osburn, but that when he called SUBJECT Mr. Osburn, SUBJECT corrected him and told him that the name was Oswald. Mr. Morrow related that two of the employees also observed SUBJECT while he was at the parking lot. These employees are: Emmett Montgomery, C/M and Charlie Dabbs, C/M. Emmett Montgomery is still employed at the parking lot, but Charlie Dabbs is no longer there. Mr. Morrow did not know the residence addresses of these two employees and the personnel files were not available at the time of this interview.

Subject: Arrest of Lee Harvey  
Oswald, 11/24

Sir:

On November 22, 1963, Officer R. E. Lyon and myself were in the 500 block of East Jefferson assisting in the search for the person who shot and killed Officer J. D. Tippit.

(We heard the police radio report that a suspect had entered the Texas Theater. We went to this location Code 3. When we entered the theater, we were told by a white female that the suspect was in the balcony.)

We went to the balcony and searched it. While in the balcony, I heard someone shout that he was on the lower floor. We started down. Lyon slipped and sprained his ankle; I continued on down. When I arrived at the lower floor, Lee Harvey Oswald was resisting vigorously. Sergeant Jerry Hill, Officer R. E. McDonald, C. T. Walker, and Ray Hawkins, and myself converged on Oswald. At this time I observed a pistol with the muzzle pointed in my direction. I grabbed the pistol and stuck it in my belt and then continued to assist in the subduing of Oswald. After Oswald was handcuffed we were instructed by Captain W. R. Westbrook to take him directly to the City Hall.

We removed Oswald from the theater. When we were removing Oswald from the theater, he was hollering that he had not resisted arrest and that he wanted to complain of police brutality. There was a crowd in front of the theater yelling, "Kill the dirty 'Bob'." We put Oswald into police equipment #226 and drove directly to the City Hall. While enroute to the City Hall, I released the pistol to Sergeant Jerry Hill. The officers who brought Oswald to the City Hall were myself, Sergeant Jerry Hill, Detective Paul Bentley, R. E. Lyon, R. E. McDonald, and C. T. Walker. Enroute to the City Hall, Oswald was belligerent and said very little except that why was he being arrested other than for having a pistol.

Upon arrival at the City Hall, Oswald was taken to the Homicide and Robbery Bureau Office and there released to officers of that Bureau.

Sir:

SUBJECT was interviewed by the undersigned officers with the following results.

SUBJECT stated that on Friday November 22, 1963, at approxi-  
mately 2:15 A. M., a white male, five feet seven inches tall, 140 lbs,  
with dark hair, entered the LUC'S B & B CAFE, located at 3520 OAKLAWN,  
where SUBJECT is a waitress. SUBJECT stated that this man was positiv-  
ely LEE HARVEY OSWALD. SUBJECT said this man stated that he was waiting  
for JACK RUBY. SUBJECT stated that JACK RUBY entered the CAFE a short  
time later but did not sit in the booth with this man. The man believed  
to be OSWALD went over and sat with JACK RUBY. SUBJECT stated that  
RUBY and the man believed to be OSWALD left at approximately 2:45 A. M.  
At this point in the interview the SUBJECT stated that she could not  
be sure that this man was OSWALD but if he had a small deep scar on  
his left cheek, it was him.

SUBJECT stated that a few days after the assassination she  
received an anonymous telephone call telling her to get out of town  
or she would die.

Before the interview ended the SUBJECT stated that she could  
not be positive but she thought the man with RUBY was OSWALD.

After having been advised of my rights under the Constitution in that I do not have to make any statement at all, I do hereby make the following statement of my own free will and accord pertaining to information including conversations overheard which could possibly have some bearing on the assassination of President Kennedy on November 22, 1963 in Dallas, Texas.

I am 23 years of age and reside at Apartment No. 23, 66 Chimney Rock, Houston, Texas. I am presently employed at the Midnight Lounge, 404 Westheimer Street, Houston, Texas.

During the week ending November 23, 1963 I worked at the Midnight Lounge, 404 Westheimer Street as a bartender.

On Wednesday night or Friday night, November 22, I engaged in a conversation with a stripper who is known as Pixie Lynn, who was then entertaining at the Lounge. I recall making some statement to Pixie about a report that she had informed on another stripper by the name of Candy Bar, who was tried in Dallas on a narcotics case. Pixie became upset and said in substance that this was not true, that she had testified in the trial in Candy Bar's behalf. During this conversation she told me that she was Candy Bar's lover. She stated that Candy Kelly had also accused her of informing on Candy Bar.

She then asked me if I was "gay." I told her that I had been cruising with Rita Vanstrom, who was well known to Pixie. She then had the answer to her question.

On the evening of November 22 Pixie, myself and others were at the Midnight Lounge. The other clubs were closed that evening because of the President's assassination. Pixie did not want to perform that evening as she was an admirer of the President. I told her that I was formerly from Dallas and had attended some "gay" parties there. She asked me if I had ever been to one of Ruby's parties, meaning a "gay" party. I told her that I had never heard of the man. She inferred that she had attended some of Jack Ruby's "swinging parties."

I asked her what type of person she thought would have committed the assassination. She stated "dirt trade," meaning the type of person considered as the lowest type of perverts.

The name Barbara Vols, an attorney of Dallas, Texas, has been mentioned to me. Since she is a popular Lesbian in Dallas, I assumed that she might have attended some of the parties Pixie mentioned that Jack Ruby had given.

To the best of my recollection the name of Lee Harvey Oswald was not mentioned in connection with Jack Ruby or with the assassination at that time.

The following information was received from  
confidential informant T-1 .

T-1 states that SUBJECT is a homosexual and has  
attended HOMOSEXUAL parties in DALLAS recently with  
LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Source further states that LEE  
HARVEY OSWALD was considered to be "trade" by other  
homosexuals. The term "trade" indicates that OSWALD  
only takes the passive part in homosexual acts and  
attends parties for that purpose.

Source further states that DIXIE LYNN w-f, a  
stripper, formerly of DALLAS but now living in HOUSTON,  
TEXAS has attended some of these parties and has seen  
SUBJECT in company with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. DIXIE LYNN  
is now employed as a stripper at the MIDNIGHT LOUNGE  
401 WESTHEIMER ST. in HOUSTON, TEXAS. DIXIE LYNN makes  
frequent trips to DALLAS to see SUBJECT. The MIDNIGHT  
LOUNGE is owned by L.C. PATTERSON, an employee of the  
DALLAS TIMES HERALD and is managed by DEANE ARTHUR. The  
license for this lounge is listed in MRS. PATTERSON'S  
name. MR. PATTERSON also owns a part interest in the  
PLAYMATE LOUNGE located on SMITH ST. in HOUSTON. T-1  
does not know of any business dealings between SUBJECT  
and L.C. PATTERSON.

Sir:

On November 22, 1963 I was assigned to the Trade Mart as part of a security force under the supervision of Captain O. A. Jones. After hearing of the president's assassination I, along with Lt. J. L. Cunningham, J. B. Tony, and E. A. Sahk, was instructed by Captain Jones to proceed to the scene of the assassination.

Enroute we heard on the police radio that Officer J. D. Tippit had been shot in Oak Cliff and a suspect had been seen going into the library at E. Jefferson and Marsalis. We proceeded to this location and upon arriving found it to be false.

We left the library and heard a report that a suspect fitting the description was seen in the Texas Theatre, 231 W. Jefferson, and was hiding in the balcony. We proceeded to this location and I began searching the balcony. I started down the stairs and heard someone shout, "I've got him down here". I went downstairs and assisted in arresting Lee Harvey Oswald. At this time, Officer M. G. McDonald had this subject and was attempting to take a pistol out of his hand. I along with numerous other officers grabbed Oswald and someone took the pistol out of his hand. Handcuffs were then placed on the subject. At this time the prisoner began shouting "I'm not resisting and I'm protesting police brutality". We were instructed by Captain Westbrook to get the prisoner in a car and take him to the City Hall. At this time Detective E. K. Carroll and other officers took the prisoner out the front door of the Theatre where there was a large crowd of people gathered outside. The people were shouting "kill him" and "let us kill him". The prisoner was placed in a squad car and immediately taken away.

I along with Lt. Cunningham and J. B. Tony remained at the Theatre and took the names and addresses of the occupants of the Theatre. We brought a witness to the City Hall who saw Oswald in the Theatre and who also heard the pistol click when it clicked as Officer McDonald attempted to arrest Oswald.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. GANNAWAY, SUBJECT was interviewed by the undersigned officers and the following report submitted.

SUBJECT, who was born in Poland, resides at 5930 $\frac{1}{2}$  La Vista Drive with his wife, ANNA, who is Russian born. Their telephone number is TA3-2219. He is employed as a packer at SANGER-HARRIS DEPARTMENT STORE and she, as a draftsman at the DALLAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY.

MRS. MELLER stated that she and GEORGE BOUHE went to a small party at the residence of PETER GREGORY in Fort Worth during the summer of 1962, where they met LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD. She and BOUHE visited the OSWALDS at 2703 Mercedes in Fort Worth two or three times after that to take them food and clothing. OSWALD became very belligerent on these occasions, saying that he didn't need or want help from anyone. MRS. MELLER also said that she saw the book, "CAPITAL", which was written by KARL MARX, during one of these visits at OSWALD'S house and became very worried about it. SUBJECT said he checked with the FBI and they told him that OSWALD was all right.

SUBJECT stated that a friend of his, MRS. CUNNINGHAM with the TEXAS EMPLOYMENT COMMISSION, helped OSWALD get a job with a photo engraving company in Dallas in October of 1962. When SUBJECT told OSWALD that he should thank her for getting him the job, he said, "Why should I thank anyone for getting me a job where I only make \$1.25 an hour."

On or about November 5, 1962, MARINA telephoned MRS. MELLER and told her that LEE HARVEY had beat her up and she had left him. MRS.

MELLER invited her to stay at her home for a few days. On November 11, 1962, MARINA left the MELLERS and went to stay at the residence of DECLAN FORD.

SUBJECT stated that the last time he and his wife saw the OSWALDS was at a party on December 28, 1962, at the DECLAN FORD residence. GEORGE de MOHRENSCHILDT had brought the OSWALDS to the party.

MR. and MRS. MELLER both felt that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had a serious psychological problem. They did not know JACK RUBY.

Also, in two men by the name of George - last names she did not remember and Warry Brock. She was hustled out of town for prostitution and they were picked up, but she was not booked and was turned free. Also helped case on Larry Brown, and met sister Virginia Strom. This involved \$500 stolen from, or having to do with the Sands in Ft. Worth, Texas. Also, helped in the Keller case. Lynn says she was always kept clear in these cases. Lynn also stated she knew Corkey Graves and several other under-cover agents for the State Narcotics, could not remember names. Says she always remembers faces.

Questioned by FBI: Yes, 4 - 5 times, Myers was one man's name. Two times by Secret service men and one detective from Ft. Worth came and questioned her. The FBI asked about Jack and the girls that worked for him. If any of them went out for dates. She said no or she didn't know.

Questions by RED:

- Q. Have you ever been to bed with Jack Ruby?  
A. No.  
Q. Do you know of any of the girls at the club that have?  
A. Well yes, or that's what I have heard in the dressing room.

- Q. Who?
- A. Joyce Dalr or Joy Dale, 4204 $\frac{1}{2}$  West 10th, Apt. 3, Ft. Worth, Texas. Joy is or has said she is four months PG.
- Q. Could this be Jack's baby?
- A. I have heard it is from dressing room gossip. Joy is 19 years old.
- Q. But you don't know for sure?
- A. No.
- Q. Who else?
- A. Tammy True, 24 years old. I believe Tammy is in Okla. City (could be some other place).
- Q. Are either one of them married?
- A. Joy Dale first told me she was, but later said she was not and she just says she is because she has one other child out of marriage.
- Q. Have you ever seen Jack lose his temper or get rough with anyone?
- A. No, well he got mad at Tammy True one time because he said she was taking advantage of him by trying to get out of her shows. They had a few words over this.
- Q. Have you had any fights with Jack.
- A. No.
- Q. Was the Club open the night before the President was shot and the night after?
- A. Yes before, no afterwards.
- Q. Did you talk to Jack Saturday night after the shooting.
- A. Yes, I came to work and the Club was closed and Larry had said it would be open so I called Jack and he got sore and said "Don't you have any respect for the President?" I needed some money to get home on so he was going to come to the Club and give me some. I had called him from the Colony Club to his home. One hour later he hadn't shown, so I then called back from the parking lot beside the Club. This time he said he could not make it and he told the man at the parking lot to give me \$5.00 to get home on. Jack sounded deeply upset, very upset and I could hear voices in the back ground. He did not seem to be drunk or drinking, but very low and far-away sounding. I never saw Jack drink anyway, and I don't think he ever drank at the club.



- Q. Did you talk to Jack the day of the shooting?
- A. Yes, maybe around 10:00 or 10:30. I needed \$25.00 to pay my rent and he said he had to go downtown anyway, so he would send it to Western Union in Ft. Worth. Jack seemed upset. I picked the money up at Western Union ten minutes after we heard he had shot Oswald. I was afraid they would keep the money or something, since Jack had sent it, but ~~it~~ they gave it to me without question. When I talked to him that morning, he sounded like his ~~knives~~ <sup>voice</sup> was going to crack any minute and he did sound like he had been crying and was very upset. I had to keep saying Jack, Jack are you there ~~ix~~ and he would just say yes.
- Q. Have you talked to Jack since the shooting?
- A. No, I have not. I don't want any pictures taken. That's why I haven't been up to see him. Joy Dale got a letter today, he said to tell everyone hello for him.
- Q. Did Jack seem to worry a lot?
- A. Yes, he was always concerned about someone's welfare. He was worried about me and the baby. He had deep emotions and always tried to help everyone.
- Q. Did he ever have headaches?
- A. Yes, a few times I had to go pick up his pills at the store.
- Q. Do you feel Jack felt worse (bad) more times than good?
- A. Yes. He went to some doctor three weeks ago.
- Q. Did Jack ever cry around the Club?
- A. No.
- Q. Did Jack have the reputation for going to bed with every girl in the Club?
- A. No.
- Q. Did he ever attempt it with you.
- A. One time in a joking way after I told him I was going to leave my husband he said something like "let me have first choice or if the baby needs a name".
- Q. Do you think the average stripper would say he tried to take them to bed?
- A. Yes, I do.

Q. Did Jack ever mention the trip to Cuba or any friends in Cuba, or did he talk to any Spanish talking or looking people at the Club?

A. No, he didn't say anything about Cuba. No, no friends either. One night maybe a month ago, I was on my way to the restroom and Jack was talking to a man that looked Spanish or colored. He had a mustache and dark curly hair. Jack turned and walked away from him.

Q. Did you ever see Oswald in the Club?

A. No.

Q. Did Jack ever introduce you to any of his friends in Chicago?

A. Only by phone one time. Two men, one's name I can remember and the other was Bill Demar.

Q. Have you ever been out of the Club with Jack? To breakfast or coffee?

A. No, the only time I have seen him was at the Vegas Club when the girls & I went there to help the Club out.

Q. Is there any other things you can think of right now?

A. Well, I used to work for Arthur Murray's Dance Studio and one time, one of the instructors was in here and Jack told me that he was trying to get half-ownership of the Club and he told me to keep it to myself.

Later, Chief Lumpkin put me in charge of a search team and instructed me to start on the roof and work down to the basement making a thorough and complete search of all floors. When this assignment was completed, I was relieved by Chief Lumpkin and told to report to my office.

I received no further instructions and ended my tour of duty at the regular time.

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W.P. Gannaway, a background investigation was conducted on SUBJECT and the following is submitted.

The indices of the Identification Bureau of the DALLAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE revealed that SUBJECT was born 20 July 1944 in CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE, the daughter of LINDELL and ROBERTA DAVIDSON. These indices revealed that SUBJECT does not know the whereabouts of either of her parents. The only arrest recorded on SUBJECT was in JUDGE JOE B. BROWN'S court for C.C.W.. The F.B.I. return sheet indicated no previous arrests.

Confidential informant T-1 states that SUBJECT formerly resided at 2005 PALESTINE ST. and 1305 TEXAS ST. in FORT WORTH, TEXAS. SUBJECT'S last known address was 3809 MEADOWBROOK, FORT WORTH, TEXAS. SUBJECT was living at that address with BRUCE CARLIN w-m, common law husband. T-1 was unable to give any address for SUBJECT in DALLAS even though SUBJECT has been employed in DALLAS at the CAROUSEL CLUB. T-1 has had no inquiries on SUBJECT. T-1 further stated that SUBJECT has several charge accounts in FORT WORTH that are past due and considered uncollectable. T-1 also stated that SUBJECT has been employed at the SKYLINER CLUB and the 500 CLUB and the CELLAR CLUB in FORT WORTH, TEXAS.

The indices of the Records Bureau of the FORT WORTH POLICE DEPARTMENT revealed that SUBJECT was reported missing by her grandmother, MRS. RUTH WELCHER of 4228 W. VICKERY. SUBJECT is a native born RUSSIAN. He came to the UNITED STATES in 1924. He became a resident of DALLAS, TEXAS in 1939. SUBJECT is an accountant and he works from his home.

SUBJECT stated that he first met LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD August 25, 1962, at the home of DECLAN and KATHERINE AKA KATYA FORD, located at 14097 BROOKCREST, DALLAS, TEXAS. PETER P. GREGORY, who is a Petroleum Engineer in the CONTINENTAL LIFE BUILDING in FORT WORTH, TEXAS, brought the OSWALDS to the FORD'S home and introduced them to the Russian speaking group in DALLAS. SUBJECT stated he saw OSWALD approximately eight times and that he did not know very much about him due to the fact he was withdrawn.

SUBJECT stated that GEORGE de MORNESCHILDT, whose mailing address is the AMERICAN EMBASSY, PONT AU PRINCE, TAHITI, brought the OSWALDS to the last party they attended at the FORDS on December 28, 1962. SUBJECT also stated that MARINA OSWALD spent some time during November 1962, at the homes of DECLAN and KATYA FORD, FRANK and ANNA RAY and TEGPIL and ANNA MELLER, due to some domestic problems she and LEE HARVEY were having. SUBJECT does not believe OSWALD had any relationship with JACK RUBY.

At approximately 11.00 am Sunday , November 23 , 1963 I along with several other officers was assigned to the passage-way leading from the jail office to the street ramp . At approximately 11.30 am we observed Lee Harvey Oswald being led from the jail office.

As the officers and Oswald approached where I was standing I observed Jack Ruby push his way toward Oswald. I observed the gun in Ruby's hand and observed him shot Oswald in the side. Just before Ruby got to Oswald I recognized Jack and shouted " Jack you S .O. B. don't do it".

As Oswald fell to the floor I helped pick him up and carry him into the jail office , where we placed him on the floor. I used my key to take the hand-cuffs off of Oswald and the homicide detective. I asked and was told to also take the other set of hand-cuffs off of Oswald.

At this time I helped pull his shirt up and observed the place where Oswald was shot. At this time I asked Oswald if he had anything that he wanted to tell us. I also asked if he had anything that he wanted to have us tell anyone. Oswald did not make a statement that I heard.

I stayed in the jail office with Oswald until he was placed on the cot and taken to the hospital.

The subject of this letter is to inform you of an interview/interrogation conducted by two FBI agents involving my acquaintances with Jack Leon Ruby (Rubenstein). This interview took place in the Identification Bureau from about 3:50 pm until about 5:15 pm. It also involved the agents and myself going to the Records Bureau, and the Jail Office. The agents showed me their identification. I did not think to copy their names on paper, but I believe one was named "Canady" and the other "Carlton." I called the FBI office and tried to determine their names in full, later. I was told they were not in at that time, but would be back in the morning. I do remember that they said they were called in from the San Antonio Office. I can describe them as follows:

#1 About 5-9, Red-brown hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, medium build, about 45 years old. Said he was born in South Carolina.

#2 About 5-10, balding gray-brown hair, brown eyes, medium-heavy build, about 50 years old. Appeared to be the senior agent, by his conduct.

They began the interview by informing me that I did not have to answer any of their questions, and that my answers were subject to review for veracity.

We went to the I. D. dark room for the interview. They told me that they were investigating Jack Ruby, and were speaking to several officers about the man. Then they read me a statement alleged to have been taken from the Dallas County District Attorney's files pertaining to an arrest I made of Jack Ruby in December, 1954, for a liquor law violation. In the alleged statement, they stated the case was dismissed against Ruby by Mr. Lem Brotherton as the result of statements by the arresting officers, Blankenship and Carlson, because the officers were unable to state that they definitely saw a patron consuming from a partly consumed bottle of beer on her table in the case mentioned. The case involved permitting consumption on licensed premises after hours, that is at 1:30 am on a Sunday morning. They asked me if I recall making this statement to Mr. Brotherton. I stated I did not recall making the statement. They also alleged that the statement by Mr. Brotherton showed that the officers stated they did not even know a case had been filed. They asked me if this was true. I stated I could not recall having made this statement. I then advised them that we should look at the case report, wherein I should be able to tell them if I typed the report, because I believe I could recognize my own typing, because of certain peculiarities in the form and language, which I could possibly identify as my own. I left them in the dark room, and got the jacket. As I started back to the dark room, I asked Lt. Knight if he knew I was being interrogated by the F. B. I. I then told him they were asking me about Jack Ruby, and I asked him if I was authorized to make any statements. Lt. Knight informed me that I was to cooperate with them, but not to give them anything from our files, unless I got permission from the Chief's office.

I went back into the dark room and showed them the case report, and identified it tentatively as my typing, from certain peculiarities, which I pointed out. They asked me again if I was instrumental in any way in having the case dismissed along lines indicated by the alleged statements of Mr. Protherton. I again informed them that I did not recall any such conversation with Mr. Protherton in the manner outlined by them. They asked me then if there was any way a case could have been filed against my wishes. I told them, "No, not likely". I did inform them that on the face of the case report it indicated that the report was filed by a "Johnson" with an "Andrews." I elaborated on this and suggested this was probably Sgt. E. T. Johnson, who was working in the Vice Squad at this time as I recalled. I explained to them about the procedure of another officer frequently filing cases by appearing at the D. A.'s office to sign the Information and the Complaint for the officer who makes the case report; and that the authority to sign the Information was based on the officer's case report, in which he alleges the nature of the violation as he observed it, and made the arrest. They then asked me if Mr. Protherton's statement as they reported it to me as a "falschod." I stated again that I could not say Mr. Protherton's statement as they reported it was false, that Mr. Blankenship may have conversed with Mr. Protherton, or possibly I did, and when asked specifically if such or such was the case regarding the evidence, he or I, or both of us may have made a statement which made the case appear to him to be unsuitable for prosecution. I stated that in any case the decision whether or not to try a case was up to the D. A. and not the Police Department, and in no way would this officer or Mr. Blankenship recommend dismissal of any case for some point of evidence, or for any point without referring the matter to our superior for him to handle. I told them a more

detailed study of the whole case would have to be made by referring to the Records Bureau, to make a determination as to whether or not the alleged consumer was arrested or not. If the consumer was not arrested, which could have been the case, then a study of the SSB files would be necessary to determine if an affidavit was taken from the consumer in which it would be demonstrated she admitted consuming beer on the premises in violation of the law. I also pointed out that the charge alleged on the case report referred to the Criminal Code, which we would have to look up to be certain this was what Ruby was actually charged with, as it appeared on the surface.

We went to the Records Bureau and checked the files there on the names of the two alleged witnesses which appeared on the arrest report, which they showed me they had a copy of in their possession. A check of the Records Bureau files showed nothing on the two girls, named Schultz and O'Brien. I then took them to the Jail Office, where I obtained the Jail Copy of Vernon's Statutes. I looked up the specific code with which Ruby was charged, Section II article 667-19, paragraph 16. It is the "catch-all" code in the malt liquor section, in which it states the licensee can be charged for violating any section of the Liquor Law, including Liquor Board regulations. They copied the information from the book. They asked me if there was a possibility that this could have led to the dismissal of the case, because of insufficient information or evidence. I told them I would not presume to state the fine legal points involved, and that this was the proper duty of the D. A.'s office. I stated that it appeared to me that one or both of us (Blankenship and I) observed the beer on the table at 1:30 am on a Sunday morning, which as I understood the law, was a violation

of the Liquor law. I stated that it was possible Blankenship saw the girl consuming, or holding the glass to her lips, with beer in it, but in any case the act alleged to have been a violation appeared to me to be covered by the particular statute, or at least we must have thought so at the time, or we would have never made the arrest.

I then had made a copy of the case report in the Records Bureau for the agents. We returned to the N. D. Bureau. They had asked me before, and while conducting our tour, about how well I knew Jack Ruby. I told them he and I have known each other since I first met him while I first was assigned to the Vice Squad in early 1954. They asked me how I met him. I told them to the best of my recollection Mr. Blankenship introduced me to him during the course of a routine check of Jack Ruby's premises, either at the Silver Club or the Club Vegas. They questioned me about the degree of friendship I had with him, and whether or not I accepted anything from him. I suppose they were referring to whether or not I was "free-loading" on Ruby. I asked them if this is what they meant. They gave me the impression that this was exactly what they meant. I then told them I would have to tell them in detail about my relationship with Ruby, including my activities centered around him. I explained to them that I did not cultivate his friendship, and that the record clearly reflects I arrested him when I believed he had violated the law, and that I never led Ruby to assume that I would not do otherwise, if I caught him in violation. I pointed out to them that I liked Ruby for subjective reasons. I told them that I checked his record carefully after the reports from the FBI and DPS reached this department resulting from our arrest of him. I saw, and demonstrated, where Ruby had no prior criminal

record as of the time I arrested him. I explained this satisfied me that he was not a criminal as the record reflected. I told them that I dropped in on Ruby on official business, as part of routine Vice Squad checks of his premises, and I occasionally dropped by his place and drank a beer. I also stated that when I was not on duty, or there to talk to Jack on official business, I visited Ruby, and he would not allow me to pay for my beer, which amounted to one or two at most. I explained that I would have offered Jack Ruby the same courtesy if he were a guest in my home, which he never was, but which I would have not objected to if he was. I told them they could draw their own conclusions as to my relationship with Ruby. I cited that Ruby's subsequent arrests for a misdemeanor or two was not sufficient for me to break all association with the man, the same as it would be for any other of my friends or acquaintances. They asked me if I ever paid the cover charge while I was a guest of Jack Ruby in his establishment. I stated I did not pay a cover charge to visit with Jack Ruby, but as I indicated I considered it a social affair. I was not interested in the show as much as I was in visiting Ruby. I further amplified the situation by informing them that one night while Blankenship and I were making a routine check of the Silver Club on So. Ervay a fight broke out in the joint, which Jack helped us to quell, and which could have been serious to us because the participants attempted to attack us with beer bottles. I felt a sense of gratitude for Ruby's help.

They asked me how many times I had visited Ruby. I told them about two or three in all in the past five or more years. They asked me when the last time was. I told them about two weeks before the Oswald incident. They

requested I tell them what I did and observed. I told them I took a friend of mine to the Carousel on a Saturday night about 11:30 pm, after I got off duty, where I wanted to introduce him to Ruby, and for us to drink a beer. When I got there I asked for Jack, and identified myself as an old friend, and a police officer. The doorman told me to pass with my guest, and that Jack was in the back. We went to the back and found Jack talking to some of his employees. I introduced my friend to Jack. Jack, in his customary manner, was in a hurry to go out, and apologized for having to leave. He stated he hadn't eaten all day, and wanted to eat before it was too late. He took us out to the club area, and instructed a waitress to seat us at a table and get us what we wanted. "These guys are my guests." Jack apologized again and left. My friend and I sat down, drank two beers each, watched the show and left when Jack did not come back by this time. I wanted to introduce Jack to my friend because he is a professor of psychology, and I thought he would be interested in Jack's personality, which has always interested me. The agents told me it was necessary to identify the friend, which I did. He is Mr. Lewis Bonney, instructor of Psychology at North Texas State University, the son of the professor in charge of the department, Dr. Merle Bonney. We had been discussing certain personality types previously, and I invited him to Dallas to observe the workings of our department, and to meet certain people I knew who I felt illustrated a certain type of personality. Jack Ruby was one of these people. I had not seen Jack for a year prior to this night. We left the Carousel and went to other places until closing time. Then we went to the El Fenix on Mc Kinney and sat with Al Martinez until three in the morning (Sunday). We discussed the people we met, and the nature of their behavior. Lewis had to drive back to Denton, so I led him to the route back, then went home.

The agents asked some more questions about Ruby's personality. I told them I

considered him very interesting, and very unique. They asked me if I believed he was mentally ill. I told them I had made no observations which would lead me to this conclusion, but that I felt he was very aggressive, and not to become detailed, very interesting as a study. They asked me about his aggressiveness, and I told them the record of his fighting ability spoke for itself. They said something about or relating to Jack that led to a conversation in which I told them I investigated Jack Ruby from the aspect of whether or not he was a homosexual, and I had in fact discussed this subject directly with Jack Ruby, after I ran down all the leads on this subject I could get. I did this as a last resort to satisfy my mind, and to observe his reaction to my question. I came away reasonably certain that Jack Ruby was not a homosexual, as could be determined by my investigation, and in lieu of any other evidence.

The agents then changed the subject to the security measures around the department during Oswald's presence, and more specifically while he was being transferred. They asked me I believed an officer had passed Jack into the building. I told them it was not in my power to even speculate on this subject. They asked me where I was when the Oswald-Ruby incident took place. I told them I was at home, and heard it on the news. Later, at three o'clock, I reported on duty. They asked me more questions about security measures. I told them that this building is a public building, freely accessible to the public, and that I had no knowledge of what the orders to the officers assigned to secure the building were. They then asked me, "If the orders were to prevent entrance" or words to this effect, did I know of any officer who would allow Ruby to enter. I told them this was not in my power to answer, but that I believe no officer would knowingly violate this order. Then I expressed displeasure at this line of questioning. I felt it was out of order, and in any case beyond my knowledge to answer.

The agent described as number two, made an apology for having to ask this and certain other questions, but stated he was asking all the officers he interviewed the same questions, and considering the seriousness of the matter felt it was a necessary duty, etc. Then I was asked if I knew of any other officers friendly, or acquainted with Jack Ruby. I told them I refuse to answer this question. I told them I would answer any question they asked me pertaining to me, and to incidents involving people I was with, but that I would not tell them of any other officer I may have been talking to Ruby, in the light of the question as it was presented. I told them if in any case I had the remotest suspicion naming anyone would be vitally important to helping them, then I would not hesitate to name the individual. But, to infer a relationship based on a chance observation would be improper for me. I could state that Jack was known by many officers here, and to name some and not name others would be unfair, to say the least, not only to confounding the investigation, but to the officers concerned, whose duty is to come forward if they have any information to give to the FBI, but not to be named just because I happened to remember seeing them in Ruby's presence. They restated the question, but it was essentially in the same frame of reference. I told them I would tell them anything about myself and Jack Ruby, and would have to refer them elsewhere about others, but in any case declined to answer in any manner, since I feel it is the duty of the other officers to present themselves for questioning if a request is made by the FBI.

They asked me, or a conversation was started about the general picture as it stood with Ruby's act, and how it fouled the investigation of Oswald. I told them I agreed that Ruby's act was very detrimental to the proper investigation of Oswald, and for that I condemn Ruby. I also asked them if they suspected any connection, or conspiracy involving Ruby that would make it a much more

matter. They did not commit themselves to any answer, but restated that they had to investigate from all angles. They asked me if there was anything about the investigation that I observed and wished to comment about. I told them I was interested in the subject of how advisable a polygraph test on Ruby would be to determine whether or not he was part of a conspiracy, or acted on his own disordered impulses. I told them I was very much interested in making this determination for my own satisfaction, since I had never heard Jack Ruby discuss politics, or any subject of a deeper nature than something trivial, and if he was a part of some sinister background it was professionally interesting to me to learn, since I would have misjudged Ruby's character, and I needed to learn about these things.

As they finished up taking notes, and were preparing to leave, I apologized for not being able to recall more facts about the arrest I made of Ruby, and the outcome of the case we filed against him. I also apologized for not feeling it proper to answer the one question I refused to even comment on. They stated they were satisfied at this time. I told them I would not normally allow myself to be questioned this way, referring to my belief that a supervisor should be present to hear the interrogation. They misinterpreted my statement, and took it to mean that I would not be absolutely frank with them. I clarified myself to the extent that I stated I felt uneasy about this type of interview since a matter as grave as this made it important to me to respond carefully, but in any case truthfully. I meant as I stated above, that I feel in the future some Police Department supervisor should be present as a witness not only to what I say, but as to the questions and statements of the agents.

I respectfully request for an order to insist that in the future, if I am to be interviewed in this or any other matter by any outside agency I proceed with

the investigators to the Chief's office for a proper and respectful review of procedures to be used, and Police Department officials to be present during the interview. It was with this view in mind that I reported to Chief Lumpkin what had transpired. He ordered me to make this report immediately.

There were other things said, by the agents, which I cannot recall in detail at this time. There were other questions. She was to stay with him and his wife for a few days because of domestic troubles she was having with LEE HARVEY. On November 18, 1962, OSWALD telephoned MARINA and asked to see her, to which she agreed. A short time later, SUBJECT picked OSWALD up at a bus stop. Since this occurred quite some time ago, SUBJECT is not sure, but he feels as though there was some one with him when he went to get OSWALD. However, he could not remember who it might have been. OSWALD was able to effect a reconciliation with MARINA, so SUBJECT took them to 602 Elsbeth, where he felt they had been living.

T-1 states that their files list the following addresses for SUBJECT: 1956-917 Shadyside; 1959-4608 Columbia; 1960-4915 Live Oak.

After all investigative leads were exhausted it was determined that SUBJECT'S last known address in Dallas, Texas was 223 South Ewing, where he shared an apartment with Jack Ruby. SUBJECT no longer resides at this address. According to Assistant District Attorney Bill Alexander SUBJECT is now in the State of New York. SUBJECT'S exact location in New York is not known.

The indices of the District Clerks's offices were searched regarding SUBJECT with the following results: In August 1959 the Merchandise Mart filed suit against SUBJECT in County Court at Law number two on Docket Number 12132-B for the amount of Five Hundred and Fifteen dollars (\$515.00). At 12:00 noon this date we interviewed the SUBJECT who has been an employee of the Texas Schoolbook Depository for six months and works in the book keeping department for Joe Molina.

The SUBJECT states she does not know Lee Harvey Oswald, and has never seen him. She stated that when she saw Oswald on TV and pictures of him in the paper she did not recognize him as an employee of the building where she works.

During the interview we asked her if she had any suspicions of any of the employees she worked with. She stated, "no". After a few moments she stated, "it may sound silly and I shouldn't say anything at all, but my boss, Joe Molina, has had a number of strange telephone conversations. I never have listened to the conversations, but recently I heard him say something about he was going to help someone 'do it'. I shouldn't suspicion Joe because he is a very religious man and a very fine man."

November 22, 1963, at 12:00 noon, Joe Molina ate lunch with the SUBJECT and two other employees of their department. This was an unusual occurrence. He usually ate lunch by himself after 12:30 P.M. or 1:00 P.M. After lunch on the 22nd Molina went out side and stood on the steps to the entrance of the building with a Mr. Williams, Inu, of the department. After the shooting Joe Molina was not seen again by the SUBJECT. She stated that Mr. Williams and Molina are very close friends.

We asked the SUBJECT if someone tried to recruit her for some organization, what would she do. She stated, "I definitely would not join". We then asked her, if the Police asked her to go along what would she do. She stated, "I would do anything I could do to help".

The SUBJECT stated the only employee that she knew of who did not watch the parade was a Mrs. Hines, Inu. Mrs Hines volunteered to answer the telephone and was the only employee known to the SUBJECT to be in the building at the time of the shooting.

I talked to a confidential informant and obtained the following information:

This doctor has been interviewed by the FBI and a private investigator employed by Mr. Belli.

Upon recommendation of Isidore Miller, Jack Ruby called on October 28, 1963 and made an appointment for his sister, Eva Grant, for October 29, 1963. Jack Ruby accompanied Eva Grant and waited while the examination was conducted. This examination took about two hours.

The doctor has known Jack Ruby for a number of years and has seen him several times at the YMCA.

Jack Ruby was examined by Dr. Ulivitch on November 11, 1963, for a cold and cough. The doctor prescribed 12 capsules Tussornole, (An Antihistamine and decongestant cough syrup) and 12 tablets of Terrostation (Phonetic), an Antibiotic and a drug for nervousness.

These prescriptions were filled at Walgreen Drug Store, 1321 Commerce and refilled November 15, 1963.

During the examination, Jack Ruby told the doctor that he had just come from the sheriff's office. That a "Stripper" named "Jada" had accused Ruby of pandering for her. "Jada" is from New Orleans, Louisiana.

The doctor considers Ruby to be eccentric, boisterous, erotic, and impulsive. He seems very devoted to his sister, Eva Grant. The doctor stated that someone told him that Ruby usually carried several hundred dollars with him all of the time, but he did not

see a pistol on Ruby the day of the examination.

The doctor stated that he did not know Lee Harvey Oswald and does not feel bad towards Ruby for killing him. he does not believe Ruby would have to be insane to have committed this act.

The doctor stated that he had been on a hunting trip with Henry Wade shortly before the assassination of President Kennedy.

I have received a request from Mr. J. Lee Rankin, General Counsel for the President's Commission on the assassination of President Kennedy, who makes a request in behalf of the Commission for information from Texas as follows:

"It would be helpful to the work of this Commission if you would obtain from the Cities of Fort Worth and Dallas, for the Commission's review, copies of any documents it has in its files relating to Lee Harvey Oswald. We are particularly interested in obtaining Oswald's educational files. In this connection, we are informed that Oswald attended the following Texas schools: Riglio Elementary School, Fort Worth, 1947 to 1952; Ridge West Elementary School, Fort Worth; Arlington Heights Elementary School, Fort Worth; Arlington Heights High School, Fort Worth, September 5, 1956 to September 28, 1956; and Crozier Tech High School, Dallas, January 14, 1963 to April 8, 1963.

In addition, the Commission would like to review any related psychiatric reports, any records maintained by the Fort Worth or Dallas Police Departments and any other information in any State or local agency's possession which would assist the Commission in learning as much as possible about the background of Oswald.

# Pan American

It all began with a dream. A dream shared by two children in foreign lands half-a-world apart.

If it is carried through to its furthest goal, a Dallas couple will have added a new chapter to stranger-than-fiction adventure lore.

For no one has ever done what Mr. and Mrs. George de Mohrenschildt have set out to do — a 7,000-mile, two-year "hike" from North Central Mexico through Central America to Chile.

George de Mohrenschildt, an exploration geologist and petroleum engineer, was stricken with "jungle fever" when he was still a small boy in Baku, Russia, where he was born of Swedish parents. The idea persisted through his growing-up years, as his father's affiliation with the Nobel oil interests took the family all over Europe and while he was "attending school in five languages" — Russian, German, Polish, French and English.

Since coming to this country 22 years ago, taking his American citizenship and attaining stature as an expert in his field. Mr. de Mohrenschildt has traveled the globe. On assignment by the State Department, he was the first U.S.A. oil specialist to penetrate Yugoslavia after the war. His work has carried him all over the Mid-East, Europe, South America, Mexico, the Caribbean area, and to Africa where his extensive studies brought enough jungle experience to rekindle the boyhood spark.

Jeanne LeGon de Mohrenschildt as a child, too, spent her imaginative dream-life in an exotic jungleland. Her mother was Russian, her father a French engineer who was building the Far Eastern railroad when she was born in China. There she lived until she boarded the last boat to offer escape to America when war's devastation and turmoil isolated her native land.

In New York, she began a successful career in fashion designing which eventually brought her to Dallas.

Two years ago she and Mr. de Mohrenschildt were married and one day, soon after, they discovered they were also wedded to a shared dream. So they started making plans for that indefinite time when they could take a leave of absence from their respective work — "and from routine, television and telephones" — to make the dream come true.

Then, rather suddenly, they determined not long ago that the time had become definite. Vague planning changed into the realistic preparations of typhoid, yellow fever, tetanus and smallpox inoculations, of visas, of assembling the lightweight but adequate fishing and hunting gear to augment the meager food supplies that can be added to the bed rolls, tent and other essentials in their burro's pack.

A third member of the family-party was readied for the trip. Nero, a 5-month-old Toy Manchester, took his shots without flinching and developed an appetite for fruits and melons. He accompanied the active sports-loving de Mohrenschildts on outings where he mastered the art of swimming and of balancing on the back of an accommodating donkey "stand-in" for the forth-

coming burro-companion. Nero even obtained his own passport, a certificate from the Live Stock Sanitation Commission of Texas.

Mrs. de Mohrenschildt assumed the role of wardrobe-mistress for the expedition.

"We're traveling light," she explained before their take-off in October, "but we must be prepared for both hot and cold weather.

"Except for a pair of wool slacks, socks and helmet and a couple of sweaters, the few things I'm taking are in easy-care Dacron — shorts, slacks and two blouses from the 'Music Man' group I've just finished designing for Justin McCarty's fall collection.

"George's assortment is as limited and Nero's even more so — just a little wool coat. We'll add native Indian clothes as we need them."

Partly business, mostly pleasure — that's the way Mr. de Mohrenschildt describes the adventure.

He'll make archeological studies in the State of Oaxaca, explore oil possibilities in Guatemala, Nicaragua and Panama, investigate mines, prolific in gold and other precious metals, in inaccessible regions of Costa Rica.

Life Magazine and National Geographic have requested a running account in reports and photographs that will chronicle the journey.

Mrs. de Mohrenschildt has promised the McCarty Mfg. firm, Women's Wear and The Times Herald sketches and color notes that transform the picturesque Indian costumes into fresh fashion ideas.

As this story appears in print, the Dallas gypsies are due to be "toughening up" with a preliminary trek through the highlands of Mexico from Torreon. That, they figure, should re-enlist their youthful experiences as Boy and Girl Scouts (and subsequently as adult Scout leaders) so they'll be prepared for the stretches of wilderness and unexplored jungles ahead.

"In this walking trip, you face a glorious experience and one which is not impossible," wrote Gordon Wasson, widely known New York banker and author currently planning to be a member of a professional archeological party which has invited the de Mohrenschildts to join up for some Guatemalan delvings in November. "But it cannot be planned too exactly. At each point you will have to decide what route to take next."

Tentatively, then, the de Mohrenschildt itinerary takes a 3,000-mile meander through Guatemala, San Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama. Then they'll make up their minds whether to add 4,000 miles — and another year — through Peru, Bolivia and Chile.

Closest exploit to the one begun by the Dallas couple was the renowned "Tehsefely's Ride" on which a transplanted English colonel in the '20s proved the stamina of Argentine ponies by riding when he could, and taking to the waterways when his two mounts couldn't penetrate the jungles, from Buenos Aires to Washington.

But he didn't walk it.

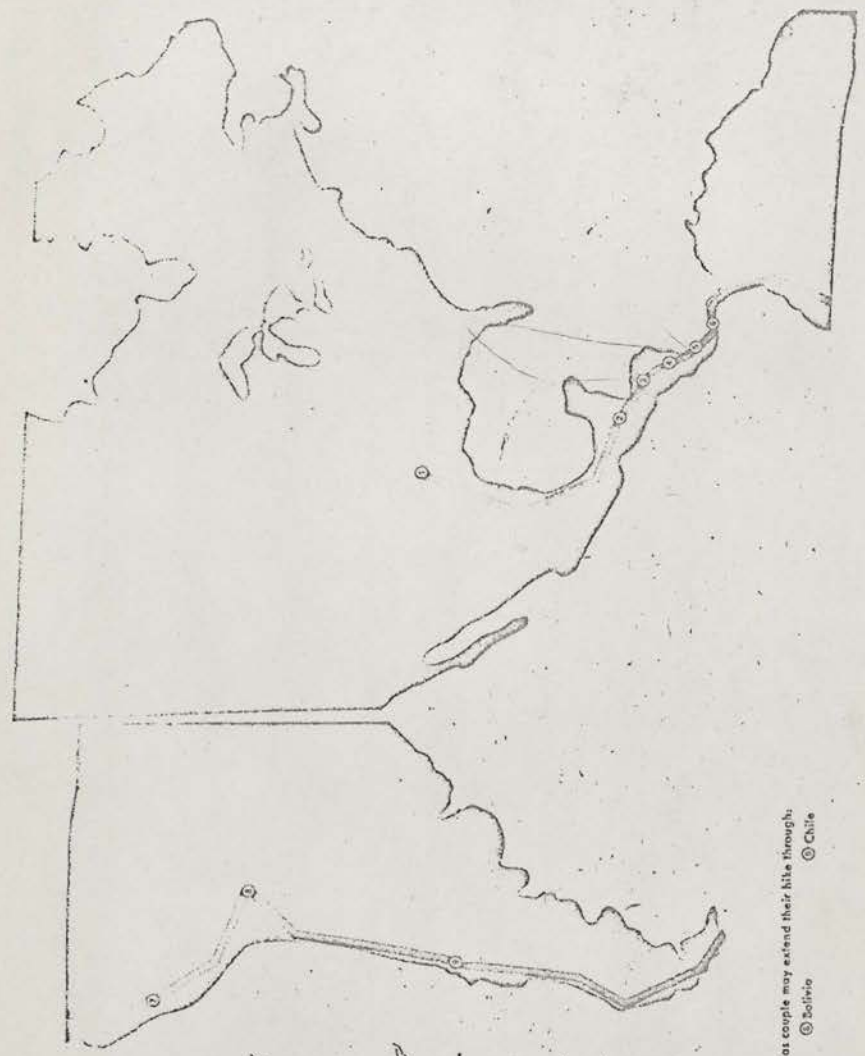

Captain W. P. GANNAWAY received information that the SUBJECT had made a statement that JACK RUBY was in the Allright Parking Garage at 1208 Commerce on the afternoon of November 23, 1963. That JACK RUBY had made a telephone call and had asked for WES WISE at the KRFD T V Station. RUBY was reportedly told that WES WISE was not in and that RUBY had then talked to a person named KEN (fmu). RUBY was reported to have asked this person when LEE HARVEY OSWALD was to be transferred from the City jail to the County jail and had stated to this person, KEN, (fmu), that he wanted to be there when the transfer was made.

A KEN SCOTT, an artist at KRFD T V Station was interviewed and he stated that he had never received a telephone call from JACK Ruby and that he did not talk to Jack Ruby on November 23, 1964.

One KEN SMART, who works the City Desk in the Dallas Times Herald news room was interviewed and stated that he had only talked to Jack Ruby one time in his life, that he could remember, and this was several months prior to November, 1963.

Mr. EDDIE BARKER, News Director at the KRFD T V Station was interviewed and stated that the above two persons are the only ones with the name 'KEN' that he knew and if there were others, they would not be in position to receive telephone calls or dispense any information regarding current events. Eddie Barker and Wes Wise both stated that JACK RUBY had appeared at the scene of the assassination on the afternoon of November 23, 1964. Wes Wise was at this location in one of the KRFD T V Mobil News Units and Jack Ruby came to the side of the unit and engaged Wes Wise in conversation for more than one half hour, discussing the assassination and Lee Harvey Oswald. This was around 1:00 PM in the afternoon.

Mr. CLAUDE HALLMARK, the manager of Allright Parking Garages was interviewed and first stated that he did not remember any thing about the afternoon of November 23, 1963, except that JACK RUEY did come in the the parking station and that he did use the telephone. He did remember that Jack Ruby had made a telephone call and thought that he had asked for WES WISE and he thought that the name of the person Ruby talked to sounded like 'KEN'. Hallmark stated that he was not sure of just what was said. ←

Mr. Hallmark was interviewed a second time, by telephone and upon direct questioning, stated that he did not remember RUEY making a statement about the time of Oswald's transfer or on the point that he wanted to be present at the time of the transfer. Mr. Hallmark then changed this and stated that this was referring to Ruby asking questions on the telephone. That as far as he could remember, RUEY did not ask any questions about the Oswald case, his transfer from the city jail to the county jail or the time of the transfer. Mr. Hallmark stated that as he remembered the events of the afternoon, Jack Ruby came into the office of the parking lot and made a remark to the persons present that he was going to make like a reporter. Mr. Hallmark stated that during the time Ruby was on the telephone, he did most of the talking and appeared to be giving information to the other person, the one he was calling, rather than asking questions and receiving information. Hallmark stated that most of the telephone conversation did appear to be dominated by the subject of the Presidents assassination and Lee harvey Oswald but that he did not remember any specific remarks or statements nor did he hear a specific question regarding Lee Harvey's transfer nor the time of the transfer.

MARINA moved in with ELAINA and stayed at her house for three weeks in October, 1962, while LEE HARVEY OSWALD was in Dallas looking for a job. On October 20, 1962, ELAINA had a serious automobile accident and was hospitalized. SUBJECT returned to Fort Worth and met OSWALD at this time. This meeting took place at 2703 Mercedes in Fort Worth, which was OSWALD'S residence at that time.

On December 25, 1962, SUBJECT and his wife visited the OSWALDS at 602 Elsiebeth in Dallas and at this same address on Easter Sunday in 1963. This was the last time that either one of the HALLS saw the OSWALDS. SUBJECT stated that LEE HARVEY became highly agitated whenever the subjects of religion or the free enterprise system in this country were mentioned. Sir:

Pursuant to the instructions of Captain W. P. Gannaway, Subject was interviewed this date, regarding his knowledge of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Subject gave the following information: " I have been working here at the Texas School Book Depository for five years as a porter. I come to work at 10:00 A. M. and get off at 8:00 PM. On the day Kennedy was shot I came to work at my usual time and saw Oswald who comes to work at 8:00 AM. going about his usual routine as an order filler. I noticed nothing unusual about Oswald's actions. At 12:00 noon, I told Oswald that I was going to eat my sandwich. Oswald mumbled something that he was going up to eat. This was the last time I saw Oswald."

"During the Presidential parade, I was standing by a window on the lower floor at the front of the building watching the cars pass when I heard this shot. It shook the window and I moved away from the window and looked at the clock. It was exactly 12:25 P. M. Some more shots were fired. I distinctly heard three shots in all. Some one said they were coming from the railroad tracks, I said no they are coming from the top of the building".

"I did not see Oswald leave the building. Oswald was very quiet and had nothing to say much to the other employees. During the lunch breaks, Oswald usually made several phone calls, which were usually short in length."
