

Re: Gay Liberation Movement

Sources referred to herein have furnished reliable information in the past.

A source advised April 30, 1970, that the <u>Gay</u> <u>Liberation Movement</u> (<u>GLM</u>), also known as the <u>Gay Liberation</u> <u>Front</u> (<u>GLF</u>), on April 30, 1970, announced intention to hold a demonstration at the residence of the President of the University of Michigan (UM), Ann Arbor, Michigan, on the afternoon of May 1, 1970, during the time scheduled for a UM "President's Tea", at that address.

This source advised that GLM or GLF was a newly formed UM campus organization which was self-described as politically oriented towards the "new left". Source advised that this group worked in its formation with the UM campus chapter of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), the Women's Liberation Front (WLF), and other campus "new left" associated groups in spring, 1970, campus disorders at UM. In this connection, source advised that the GLM or GLF had associated with mad hoc "Radical Coalition" made up of a variety of "new left" groups in support of a violent, sustained student strike held at UM, March, 1970, in connection with demands of the Black Action Movement (BAM).

A characterization of the SDS appears in the appendix attached hereto.

Source described the WLF as a "new left" women's rights organization made up principally of female activists of the UM campus chapter of SDS.

Source described BAM as a black students group at UM which presented UM with a series of demands including the demand for a 10,000 black enrollment at UM by 1971.

A second source advised, April 30, 1970, that the GLM at UM claims membership of some 100 individuals whom they described as being made up of both "gay" and "straight" persons working toward the legalization of homosexuality.

This second source advised that the GLM group claimed to be engaged in demonstrations against the UM Administration, charging the UM President with bad faith in past negotiations with this group. Source stated that GLM claims the UM President earlier authorized the holding of a National Convention for the GLM on the UM campus during December, 1970, but subsequently cancelled his approval for such a convention out of fear of embarrassment to the UM. Source advised that GLM threatened to conduct demonstrations against the UM Administration until the UM President meets the group's original agreement with the university.

Second source above advised May 1, 1970, that a demonstration sponsored by the GLM was held at the residence of the UM President that date which was comprised of some 30 individuals both male and female who carried placards critical of the UM President and the UM's alleged duplicity in negotiations with the group, and some placards were obscene in matter. Source advised that the demonstrating group chanted vulgar and obscene-slogans. He stated that during the demonstration, several representatives of the group entered the home of the UM President disrupting a social event underway in the President's home at that time. Source advised that no violence ensued nor was there any request for police intervention.

Source advised that the demonstrating group was clearly using the GLM banner and slogan as a political weapon of the "new left" in general agitation against the UM Administration. Source said he is certain of this by virtue of the fact that persons participating in the demonstration



were known to him to have been actively involved in past demonstrations at UM with SDS, International Socialists, New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, Women's Liberation Movement and other efforts.

Source advised further that he identified a former chairman of the UN campus chapter of SDS and his girlfriend with the GLM demonstration. Source stated that he is certain that this individual and his girlfriend are heterosexual and consequently use the GLM as a device to further "new left" agitation.

This source advised that following the demonstration, representatives of GLM, who met with the President of UM during the demonstration, cheerfully announced to the demonstrators "We have gotten our way--he's given in". Source advised that this comment referred to the fact that UM President had authorized the GLM as a recognized campus group at UM to use UM facilities for scheduling of GLM dance.

Second source advised May 9, 1970, that in the period of May 6-9, 1970, the SDS campus group sponsored and propagandized student strike actions against the UM in sympathy for the shooting of four students at Kent State—University, Ohio, and in sympathy for BPP leader Bobby Seale. Source advised that as a consequence of the SDS sponsored activity, a SDS leader led a group of some 80 students on May 7, 1970, in the occupation of the North Hall on the UM campus which houses offices of the ROTC at UM. Source advised that varying group from 80 to 300-individuals occupied this building totally during the period May 7 through the early hours of May 9, 1970, completely vandalizing it internally. The occupation entailed, according to the source, widespread destruction and theft of property both belonging to the UM and to the ROTC which is housed there.

Source advised that one of the permanent campus organizations associated with SDS in the occupation of the building was the GLM. He advised that the GLM or GLF occupied the offices of the Navy ROTC in that building and announced

it as their campus headquarters inasmuch as the UM Administration had not allowed them other space as a recognized campus group. Source advised that the National Liberation Front flag flew from the flagpole at North Hall during this period and handed out material prepared by the UM campus SDS chapter largely featured the presence of the GLF Offices in the ROTC Building.

An article appeared in the June 3, 1970, issue of the "Michigan Daily", UM daily student publication, Ann Arbor, captioned "GLF SGC To Demand 'U' Permit Gay Meeting".

This article notes that members of the GLF and the Student Government Council (SGC), June 2, 1970, agreed to co-sponsor a letter to the President of UN demanding that he allow the GLF to hold a convention on homosexuality at UM.


This article notes that a SGC spokesman assured that the SGC would prepare a resolution demanding that GLF, as a recognized student group, be allowed use of UM facilities for their convention.

The article quotes a spokesman from the GLP, Jim Toy, as stating that the President of UM is afraid of publicity in connection with the GLF and that publicity is where the efforts of GLF should be directed.

The article states that the proposed convention of the GLF at UM was described as a midwest conference to "offer workshops on homosexuality, public lectures and panel discussions by such outside specialists as jurists, doctors and religious leaders who would speak to the public at large, on the legal, medical and religious aspects of homosexuality".

The article states other demonstrations by GLF are planned for the future including sponsorship for a dance to be held on the UM campus June 12, 1970.

APPENDIX

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Democratic Society (SDS), as presently regarded, came into being at a founding convention held June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy" the line of the national leadership has revealed a growing Marxist-Leninist adherence which currently calls for the building of a revolutionary youth movement. Concurrently, the program of SDS has evolved from civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war stance to an advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist position. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as the leaders of worldwide struggles against United States imperialism whereas the Soviet Union is held to be revisionist and also imperialist.

At the June, 1969, SDS National Convention, Progressive Labor Party (PLP) forces in the organization were expelled. As a result, the National Office (NO) group maintained its National Headquarters at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, and the PLP faction set up headquarters in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This headquarters subsequently moved to Boston. Each group elected its own national officers, which include three national secretaries and a National Interim Committee of eight. Both the NO forces and the PLP forces claim to be the true SDS. Both groups also print their versions of "New Left Notes" which sets forth the line and the program of the particular faction. The NO version of "New Left Notes" was recently printed under the title "The Pire Next Time" to achieve a broader mass appeal.

Two major factions have developed internally within the NO group, namely, the Weatherman or Revolutionary Youth Novement (RYM) I faction, and the RYM II faction. Weatherman is action-oriented upholding CASTRO's position that the duty of revolutionaries is to make revolution. Weatherman is regarded by RYM II as an adventuristic, clitist faction which denies the historical role of the working class as the base

for revolution. RYM II maintains that revolution, although desired, is not possible under present conditions, hence emphasizes organizing and raising the political consciousness of the working class upon whom they feel successful revolution depends. Although disclaiming control and domination by the Communist Party, USA, leaders in these two factions have in the past proclaimed themselves to be communists and to follow the precepts of a Marxist-Leninist philosophy, along pro-Chinese communist lines.

A second source has advised that the PLP faction which is more commonly known as the Worker Student Alliance is dominated and controlled by members of the PLP, who are required to identify themselves with the pro-Chinese Harxist-Lénisist philosophy of the PLP. They advocate that an alliance between workers and students is vital to the bringing about of a revolution in the United States.

SDS regions and university and college chapters, although operating under the outlines of the SDS National Constitution, are autonomous in nature and free to carry out independent policy reflective of local conditions. Because of this autonomy internal struggles reflecting the major factional interests of SDS have occurred at the chapter level since the beginning of the 1969-70 school year.

A characterization of the PLP is attached.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP which had been known as the Progressive Labor Novement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962, by MILTON ROSEN and MORTILER SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

A source advised on June 3, 1988, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the FLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class novement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's over-all revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention NILTON ROSEN was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and LEVI LAUB, FRED JEROME, JARED ISRAEL. WILLIAM EPTON, JACOB ROSEN, JETFTEY CORDON, and WALTER LINDER were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "World Revolution," a quarterly periodical; and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

The April, 1989, issue of "Challenge-Desafio" sets forth that "Challenge is dedicated to the peoples fight for a-new way of life--where the working man and vonen control their own hexas and factories; where they themselves make up the entire government on every level and control the

schools, courts, police and all institutions which are now used to control them."

Source advised on May 8, 1969, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

Molbas furnished reliable information in the past, advised on 9/8/70 that subject organization continues to exist as a campus approved student organization at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan. He advised that spokesmen for this group continue efforts through harassment tactics against University of Michigan authorities, principally the University of Michigan President, to arrange a national conference of the homosexual left on the campus of the University of Michigan during the fall of 1970. Source advised that this group has been frustrated in their efforts to obtain use of University facilities due to the University of Michigan President's insistence that such an event would predictably draw extremely unfavorable reaction for the University. (*)(u)

Source advised that because of an unusually quiet summer at the University of Michigan, free of the usual New Left agitation and disruption, the Gay Liberation Movement has engaged in little public activity.

With the resumption of classes currently at the University of Michigan, Detroit through sources will remain alert regarding activities of this group and will promptly advise the Bureau of any pertinent developments.

Articles appearing in the student campus newspaper "The Michigan Daily" advises that the Gay Liberation Movement (GLM), also known as the Gay Liberation Front (GLF) continues their struggle with University of Michigan (U of M) Administration for the right to hold a midwest conference on homosexuality at the U of M, using University facilities.

These articles relate that on 9/24/70, that on or about 9/15/70, a group of approximately 15 persons representing the GLF met with the University Regents to again present their demands for University cooperation. This group was advised that in order to hold a conference, they must first present to the University an agenda and list of speakers to show that the conference would be "educational". During this same meeting, University President, ROBBIN FLEMING, re-emphasized the ban of the conference which he made in 6/70, stating, as did the Regents, "The conference must be judged educational", based upon information submitted by the GLF.

GLF leaders are opposed to submitting an agenda inasmuch as such is allegedly not required of other organizations. The GLF holds that to comply with the University requirements would set a precedent for all organizations in the future, and require them to prove educational value before being allowed University facilities for conferences.

associate themselves with the GLF participated in an SDSsponsored demonstration to support Quebec Liberation Front (QLF) at the U of M, Ann Arbor, 10/20/70. The number of QLF participants estimated at 15 to 20.

advised on 10/23/70, that approximately 15 to 20 persons known to associate with GLF participated in a demonstration in support of the "Kent State 25" at the U of M, 10/23/70, as part of the U of M homecoming parade,

It is to be noted that the above-captioned organization is small in number and ineffectual as an independent group. It appears to sources knowledgeable regarding their activity that this group is mainly interested in social and campus acceptance of homosexuals rather than being a politically-orientated organization of the New Left. This group, which seeks use of U of M facilities for its meetings and a national conference, appears to support activities of the SDS and the New Left in exchange for the support of these groups in pressing demands of the U of M Administration.

It is pointed out that their numbers are extremely small and their actions supportative in every instance of participation. They, as a group, have not taken any independent aggressive action on a New Left project or activity. They have no regular membership, dues, or meetings, and it is felt that their purpose remains social rather than political.

It is for the above reasons that Detroit does not feel this is a viable New Left-orientated group within the criteria set forth in the Manual of Instructions relating to investigation of organizations of secutity interest to this Bureau.

Detroit will follow this organization's activities through campus press and sources for any change in their organization which would bring it within the purview of the Manual of Instructions.

An article appearing in the 2/5/71, issue of the Michigan Daily, the student newspaper, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, carried an article announcing that the University's Senate Assembly Civil Liberities Board on 2/4/71, affirmed the right of the Gay Liberation Front to hold a mid-west conference on homosexuality at the university. However, no specific date for the conference set.

Source knowledgeable of New Left and related activities in Ann Arbor, Michigan, advised that the Gay Liberation Front has participated in no recent demonstrations. Source advised that the Gay Liberation Front is a relatively small organization with only 15 to 20 members in Ann Arbor.

Detroit will follow this matter closely.

Above sources reported captioned group at the University of Michigan (UM), Ann Arbor, Michigan, have discontinued plans to hold a midwest conference on homosexuality at the UM although they do have permission to do so from UM officials. Source reported further that the group remains small, ineffectual and more social than political in nature. Group has no regularly scheduled meetings, finances, or members.

In view of the above information, no further investigation regarding captioned group is being conducted by the Detroit Division at this time. This matter is being placed in a closed status to be re-opened at such time when the group again becomes active in New Left matters.

On June 14, 1971, advised captioned group were granted permission to hold a midwest conference on homosexuality at the University of Michigan (UM), Ann Arbor, Michigan, using UM facilities. Source advised captioned group is very small in number, numbering no more than 20 persons. Source advised further that captioned group has taken part in no New Left activities in the recent months and has not ever been, to his knowledge, initiator of any New Left activity.

On June 25, 1971, advised persons at UM, who called themselves members of the Gay Liberation Movement, have discontinued their plans to hold a midwest conference on homosexuality at the UM. Source advised this group probably abandoned their ideas for a midwest conference due to their small number of adherence and also due to a lack of organization, finances and/or support.
