PERSONAL ATTENTION

DEMONSTRATIONS DURING THE FORTHCOMING POLITICAL CAMPAIGN

Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) activists John Froines and Rennie Davis and Youth International Party leader Jerry Rubin have recently made statements to the effect that massive demonstrations will be held in San Diego, California, to coincide with the Republican National Convention in 1972.

In addition, the Peace Action Council in Los Angeles has already planned a demonstration during a campaign "kick off" dinner to honor President Nixon scheduled in Beverly Hills, California, on 11/9/71.

The recently concluded "People's Panel" investigation which was carried out in Washington, D. C., as part of a series of demonstrations sponsored by PCPJ during the period 10/22-26/71 resulted in an "indictment" of the Administration by PCPJ. This series of demonstrations was publicized as Phase I of a program to "evict Nixon" from the White House. As described by PCPJ leaders, subsequent phases will include local "grand juries" which will consider evidence against the Administration and present it to campaigners during "confrontations" planned by the movement. Demonstrations will also occur during the various primaries.

A flyer captioned "Nixon Eviction Notice" was distributed at the Washington demonstration which stated in effect that during the coming primaries and electoral campaign it (the eviction notice) would be served upon the President wherever he made a public appearance.

It is apparent from the above that all possible pressure and embarrassment will be brought to bear on the President and other public officials during the forthcoming election campaign.

In view of these developments, all recipients are to take steps to be continuously aware of the plans of dissidents in this regard and are to alert sources to the expressed intent of PCPJ, their affiliates, and other protest groups to embarrass and confront the President and other officials.

Any information received indicating violence must be promptly furnished local authorities. Where the President or Vice President are involved Secret Service must be immediately notified. The possibility of the violation of Federal antiriot statutes should not be overlooked. Current Bureau instructions must be followed in this regard.

Where demonstrations are to take place at facilities under the jurisdiction of the U. S. Postal Service, particularly those which also house Federal court facilities, information is to be furnished locally to the U. S. Postal Service.

Any information developed must be promptly furnished the Bureau by teletype in a form suitable for dissemination. This is to include any demonstrations that might be planned during political rallies or other campaign activity.

It is particularly important that you assess your coverage of protest groups at this time to assure that you will be apprised of the plans of these groups in regard to the above matters. Where coverage is considered weak special efforts are to be made to remedy the situation.

With regard to these activities, the Bureau will not tolerate incomplete or delayed reporting. You are reminded that in order to be of value, information furnished by the Bureau must be timely and complete. Before it can be reported to high Government officials it must be assessed and collated with other material received and then prepared in a form suitable for high level dissemination. This cannot be done if incomplete, sketchy, or confusing communications are submitted. For this reason, dates, places, sponsors, anticipated activity, and any anticipated violence or civil disobedience must be specifically spelled out. Where ad hoc groups are involved this must be reported. It must be borne in mind that the President and his Administration will rely, to a large degree, on information that we furnish.

Make sure that all supervisory personnel and investigative Agents are thoroughly conversant with instructions set forth in Manual of Rules and Regulations, Part II, Section 4, pages 41 and 42, and Part II, Section 5, pages 4 and 4a, concerning dissemination by teletype. These instructions are to be followed explicitly.

In reporting this material the following instructions are to be rigidly adhered to with regard to captions. Where information relates to demonstrations against the President, the caption of teletypes and other communications should be "Demonstration Against the President (Place and Date) Sponsored by (Main Sponsor Only) - TROPUS." In this case cosponsors should be identified in the body of the communication. Where other Administration officers are the targets of demonstrations or other political campaign activity is involved such as campaign rallies, the caption should be "Demonstration Against (Identification of Public Official), (Place and Date), Sponsored by (Main Sponsor Only)" or "Demonstration at Republican Fund Rally (Place and Date) Sponsored by (Main Sponsor Only)." Where information relates to demonstrations at the Republican National Convention, teletypes and intra-Bureau communications should carry the code word "CALREP." All other communications should carry the caption "Demonstrations During the Republican National Convention, August, 1972." You will be expected to give this matter preferred attention.

ReBuairtel to Albany, 11/2/71, captioned "Demonstrations During the Forthcoming Political Campaign" and Buairtel to Albany, 1/19/72, captioned "Demonstrations During the Democratic National Convention."

Referenced communications instructed that information developed concerning demonstrations at the national conventions of the major political parties should be submitted using the code words "CALREP" and "MIDEM."

It appears that some field offices have misconstrued these instructions. On an increasing number of occasions, communications have been received at the Bureau under one or the other above captions (CALREP or MIDEM) which do not directly relate to demonstrations at the conventions. Such communications should have been carried under substantive case titles even though the organizations or individuals involved were in some way connected with demonstrations at the conventions.

Where the communication relates mainly to an organization or individual but where there is also a collateral interest in CALREP or MIDEM, communications should carry dual captions; the substantive caption carried first and the CALREP or MIDEM caption carried secondly. Of course, this applies only to intra-Bureau communications. Letterhead memoranda and reports intended for dissemination should carry only the substantive title or in case of information relating only to CALREP or MIDEM, the caption should read "Demonstrations During the Republican National Convention, San Diego, California, August, 1972," or "Demonstrations During the Democratic National Convention, Miami, Florida, July, 1972."

ReBuairtel dated 11/2/71 captioned "Demonstrations During the Forthcoming Political Campaign," and Bureau airtel dated 1/19/72 captioned "Demonstrations During the Democratic National Convention."

Referenced communications promulgated instructions to all offices concerning the reporting of disruptive activity during the Democratic and Republican National Conventions this summer.

It is anticipated that these two events will draw extremists and other violence-prone activists to Miami Beach, Florida, and San Diego, California. The Miami Office and the San Diego Office will have a definite interest in the presence of such individuals in their territories. Secret Service in these cities will be charged with protecting the candidates, as well as other Government officials, and therefore, should be aware of their identities. The Miami Beach and San Diego Police Departments should also be aware of their presence and identities.

Effective immediately and continuing until the Conventions are completed, each office, on developing information that an extremist or other violence-prone individual is traveling to either Miami Beach or San Diego, will be expected to promptly alert the Miami or San Diego Office to the travel.

As a means of alerting these offices, the following procedure is to be followed:

Prepare a letterhead memorandum reporting the travel and containing a short, concise statement of the individual's organizational affiliation, if any, plus any history of violence.

A separate page is to be attached to this memorandum as an enclosure. The enclosure is to contain a photograph, a complete physical description, any information relating to the carrying of weapons, past convictions for acts of violence, FBI number, and any other data that can be used for identification purposes, such as a local arrest record or FBI identification record which may be appended to it. The enclosure should not contain any subversive information from Bureau sources.

On receipt, Miami or San Diego will furnish one copy of the complete memorandum with enclosure to Secret Service. The enclosure only will be removed from one copy of the letterhead memorandum and furnished to the police department having responsibility for policing the Convention.

The letterhead memoranda are to be prepared in accordance with existing instructions. Where photographs are not immediately available, reasonable efforts should be made to obtain them prior to submitting the memoranda.

The Miami and San Diego Offices should be furnished at least four copies of these communications. Five copies should be sent to the Bureau.

Those offices that are origin in the investigations of key activists, key black extremists, and subjects included in the Extremist Bureau Fugitive List should furnish the above material on these individuals promptly to the Bureau and both Miami and San Diego. In these cases, since no travel plans are known, a reference should be made in the memorandum to the effect that these individuals, because of their background, may travel to San Diego or Miami Beach.

Each office is to remain alert for information indicating that individuals of this nature will be traveling to the Convention sites and will be expected to continue to alert their sources for information regarding the activity of extremists during the Conventions.

During the build-up to these Conventions all offices should be alert to the possibility of criminal violations occurring within the Bureau's jurisdiction. Past experience indicates that activity prior to and during demonstrations

of this nature is conducive to violations of Federal anti-riot statutes. You should also be alert for possible violations of Federal criminal statutes within this Bureau's jurisdiction, particularly the Presidential and Congressional Assassination Statutes, Crime Aboard Aircraft, and bombing and gun law statutes, together with our responsibilities under threats to the President. You are reminded that information coming to your attention during the coverage of Convention activity, which concerns possible criminal violations, may subsequently be utilized as evidence in a prosecutive proceeding and should, therefore, be developed and preserved accordingly.

In view of our responsibilities concerning the President and Congressional figures, San Diego and Miami should set up separate control files or folders on the President and Vice President and the candidates for the Presidency under protective custody of the U. S. Secret Service. Upon receipt of instant communication, each office hereafter should furnish a copy of pertinent communications concerning threats to the President, Vice President, or the candidates for the Presidency to either San Diego or Miami, depending upon the political party involved.

Where information is developed of a possible criminal violation within the Bureau's jurisdiction, you should immediately institute an investigation in accordance with existing instructions and notify the Bureau under appropriate separate caption.

It is an established fact that the underground press acts as a communication tie between New Left groups and dissident elements across the Nation.

The forthcoming political Conventions in Miami Beach on July 9-13 and San Diego on August 21-24 will, increasingly, become the subject of comment in this press. Through articles and announcements, it can be anticipated that the sponsors of demonstrations and key leaders will attempt to draw large crowds to these cities. Through this means they will also outline specific actions which they hope will be taken during the Conventions.

The Bureau feels that a careful collation and analysis of this material will not only help to reveal the nature of plans being made by these groups but will show the extent of their efforts to advertise these plans and to draw support for their endeavors.

In order to do this each office is instructed to begin promptly to review the underground press in its territory for articles relating to protest activities prior to or during the Conventions. This review is to continue until the Conventions are concluded.

Copies of articles relating to these Conventions should be forwarded to the Bureau by airtel Attention: Domestic Intelligence Division; Research Section and captioned either Calrep - Underground Press or Midem - Underground Press.

ReBuairtel to SAC, Albany, dated 11/2/71 captioned "Demonstrations During the Forthcoming Political Campaign," copies to all offices.

Reairtel called attention to the possibility of the occurrence of violations of the Federal antiriot statutes in connection with demonstrations held during the current election year. The following instructions have been furnished to you in connection with previous demonstrations and are being restated for emphasis in view of the importance of captioned matters.

During the intelligence-gathering phase as well as during actual demonstrations which may be held, Agents must be particularly alert to identify witnesses present during planning sessions who will be qualified and available to testify to the nature of pertinent plans and overt acts, and who can identify individual subjects and attribute specific statements to each subject involved. At the outset, explore all available avenues for obtaining testimony from individuals willing to testify if prosecutive action should follow. Bear in mind that if the only available testimony is in the possession of informants, consideration must be given to disclosing their identities as witnesses before a grand jury or at a trial, if such testimony is considered vital to successful prosecution by the Department.

When information is received indicating a substantive violation, a separate case should be opened and the Bureau immediately advised by teletype summarizing complete details. Appropriate FD-302's (interview report forms) are to be prepared in all instances where it appears the information received may subsequently become testimony. Investigations opened are to be given close supervision and aggressive daily attention until brought to a logical conclusion. Use criminal rules of

reporting and limit the content of such reporting to establishing the substantive violation involved. Submit informant information by LHM.

In addition to antiriot violations, the following criminal violations appear to be most prominent among those likely to occur: Assaulting or Killing a Federal Officer; Desecration of the Flag; Destruction of Government Property; Federal Gun Laws; Sabotage; and Sedition.

Agents handling captioned matters should familiarize themselves with pertinent statutes and should be alert for possible violations.

The need for prompt and thorough handling of criminal violations arising out of captioned matters is obvious and the above instructions should be brought to the attention of all supervisory and investigative personnel of your office immediately.

Due to [REDACTED] history of violence as set forth below, it is to be noted that [REDACTED] may travel to San Diego, California, in August, 1972, and/or Miami Beach, Florida, in July, 1972, for the purpose of disrupting the Republican National Convention and Democratic National Convention, respectively.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy", SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. Internal factionalism produced a split during the SDS National Convention in June, 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth

Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

WEATHERMAN

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS, controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage", with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

WORKER STUDENT ALLIANCE

Worker Student Alliance (WSA), a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its

objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tes-tung thought.

By Bureau airtel dated November 2, 1971, captioned
"DEMONSTRATIONS DURING THE FORTHCOMING POLITICAL CAMPAIGN",
the Bureau advised as follows:

"People's Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ)
activists JOHN FRGINES and RENNIE DAVIS and Youth International
Party leader JERRY RUBIN have recently made statements to the
effect that massive demonstrations will be held in San Diego,
California, to coincide with the Republican National Convention
in 1972.

"The recently concluded 'People's Panel' investigation
which was carried out in Washington, D.C., as part of a series
of demonstrations sponsored by PCPJ during the period of
October 22 - 26, 1971, resulted in an 'indictment' of the
Administration by PCPJ. This series of demonstrations was
publicized as Phase I of a program to 'evict NIXON' from the
White House. As described by PCPJ leaders, subsequent phases
will include local 'grand juries' which will consider evidence
against the Administration and present it to campaigners during
'confrontations' planned by the movement. Demonstrations will
also occur during the various primaries.

"In view of these developments, all recipients are to

take steps to be continuously aware of the plans of dissidents in this regard and are to alert sources to the expressed intent of PCPJ, their affiliates, and other protest groups to embarrass and confront the President and other officials.

"ANY INFORMATION RECEIVED INDICATING VIOLENCE MUST BE PROMPTLY FURNISHED LOCAL AUTHORITIES. WHERE THE PRESIDENT OR VICE PRESIDENT ARE INVOLVED SECRET SERVICE MUST BE IMMEDIATELY NOTIFIED. THE POSSIBILITY OF THE VIOLATION OF FEDERAL ANTIRIOT STATUTES SHOULD NOT BE OVERLOOKED. CURRENT BUREAU INSTRUCTIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED IN THIS REGARD.

"WITH REGARD TO THESE ACTIVITIES, THE BUREAU WILL NOT TOLERATE INCOMPLETE OR DELAYED REPORTING. YOU ARE REMINDED THAT IN ORDER TO BE OF VALUE, INFORMATION FURNISHED BY THE BUREAU MUST BE TIMELY AND COMPLETE. BEFORE IT CAN BE REPORTED TO HIGH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IT MUST BE ASSESSED AND COLLATED WITH OTHER MATERIAL RECEIVED AND THEN PREPARED IN A FORM SUITABLE FOR HIGH LEVEL DISSEMINATION. For this reason dates, places, sponsors, anticipated activity, and any anticipated violence or civil disobedience must be specifically spelled out. Where ad hoc groups are involved this must be reported. It must be borne in mind that the President and his Administration will rely, to a large degree, on information that the Bureau furnishes."

In reporting this material the following instructions are to be rigidly adhered to with regard to captions. Where information relates to demonstrations at the Republican National Convention, teletypes and intra-Bureau communications should carry the code word "CALREP". All other communications should carry the caption "Demonstrations During the Republican National Convention, August, 1972".

The Bureau advised where information relates solely to demonstrations at the Democratic National Convention,

teletypes and intra-Bureau communications should carry the code word "MIDEM." LHMs and other communications which may be disseminated should carry the caption, "Demonstrations During the Democratic National Convention, July, 1972."

The Bureau further advised where the communication relates mainly to an organization or individual, but where there is also a collateral interest in CALREP or MIDEM, communications should carry dual captions; the substantive caption carried first and the CALREP or MIDEM caption carried secondly. This applies only to intra-Bureau communications. LHMs and reports intended for dissemination should carry only the substantive title.

With regards to the possibility of violations of Federal antiriot statutes in connection with demonstrations held during the political conventions the Bureau stated in part as follows:

"During the intelligence-gathering phase as well as during the actual demonstrations which may be held, Agents must be particularly alert to identify witnesses present during planning sessions who will be qualified and available to testify to the nature of pertinent plans and overt acts, and who can identify individual subjects and attribute specific statements to each subject involved. At the outset, explore all available avenues for obtaining testimony from individuals willing to testify if prosecutive action should follow.

"WHEN INFORMATION IS RECEIVED INDICATING A SUBSTANTIVE VIOLATION, A SEPARATE CASE SHOULD BE OPENED AND THE BUREAU IMMEDIATELY ADVISED BY TELETYPE SUMMARIZING COMPLETE DETAILS. APPROPRIATE FD-302S ARE TO BE PREPARED IN ALL INSTANCES WHERE IT APPEARS THE INFORMATION RECEIVED MAY SUBSEQUENTLY BECOME TESTIMONY. INVESTIGATIONS OPENED ARE TO BE GIVEN CLOSE SUPERVISION AND AGGRESSIVE DAILY ATTENTION UNTIL BROUGHT TO A LOGICAL CONCLUSION."

In addition to antiriot violations, the following criminal violations appear to be most prominent among those likely to occur: Assaulting or Killing a Federal Officer; Desecration of the Flag; Destruction of Government Property; Federal gun laws; Sabotage; and Sedition.

Agents handling captioned matters should familiarize themselves with pertinent statutes and should be alert for possible violations.

Regarding the reporting of disruptive activity during the Democratic and Republican National Conventions, the Bureau advised:

"EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND CONTINUING UNTIL THE CONVENTIONS ARE COMPLETED, EACH OFFICE, ON DEVELOPING INFORMATION THAT AN EXTREMIST OR OTHER VIOLENCE-PRONE INDIVIDUAL IS TRAVELING TO EITHER MIAMI BEACH OR SAN DIEGO, WILL BE EXPECTED TO PROMPTLY ALERT THE MIAMI OR SAN DIEGO OFFICE TO THE TRAVEL.

"AS A MEANS OF ALERTING THESE OFFICES, THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE IS TO BE FOLLOWED:

"PREPARE A LETTERHEAD MEMORANDUM REPORTING THE TRAVEL AND CONTAINING A SHORT, CONCISE STATEMENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S ORGANIZATIONAL AFFILIATION, IF ANY, PLUS ANY HISTORY OF VIOLENCE. A SEPARATE PAGE IS TO BE ATTACHED TO THIS MEMORANDUM AS AN ENCLOSURE. THE ENCLOSURE (AN EXAMPLE OF WHICH IS SHOWN ON THE LAST PAGE OF THIS MEMO) IS TO CONTAIN A PHOTOGRAPH, A COMPLETE PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION, ANY INFORMATION RELATING TO THE CARRYING OF WEAPONS, PAST CONVICTIONS FOR ACTS OF VIOLENCE, FBI NUMBER, AND ANY OTHER DATA THAT CAN BE USED FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES, SUCH AS LOCAL ARREST RECORD OR FBI IDENTIFICATION RECORD WHICH MAY BE APPENDED TO IT. THE ENCLOSURE SHOULD NOT CONTAIN ANY SUBVERSIVE INFORMATION FROM BUREAU SOURCES.

"On receipt, Miami or San Diego will furnish one copy of the complete memorandum with enclosure to Secret Service. The enclosure only will be removed from one copy of the letterhead memorandum and furnished to the police department having responsibility for policing the convention.

"The letterhead memoranda are to be prepared in accordance with existing instructions. Where photographs are not immediately available, reasonable efforts should be made to obtain them prior to submitting the memoranda.

"THE MIAMI AND SAN DIEGO OFFICES SHOULD BE FURNISHED AT LEAST FOUR COPIES OF THESE COMMUNICATIONS. FIVE COPIES SHOULD BE SENT TO THE BUREAU.

"THOSE OFFICES THAT ARE ORIGIN IN THE INVESTIGATION OF KEY ACTIVISTS, KEY BLACK EXTREMISTS, AND SUBJECTS INCLUDED IN THE EXTREMIST BUREAU FUGITIVE LIST SHOULD FURNISH THE ABOVE MATERIAL ON THESE INDIVIDUALS PROMPTLY TO THE BUREAU AND BOTH MIAMI AND SAN DIEGO. IN THESE CASES, SINCE NO TRAVEL PLANS ARE KNOWN, A REFERENCE SHOULD BE MADE IN THE MEMORANDUM TO THE EFFECT THAT THESE INDIVIDUALS, BECAUSE OF BACKGROUND, MAY TRAVEL TO SAN DIEGO OR MIAMI BEACH."

By letter dated April 6, 1972, the Bureau advised as follows:

"It is an established fact that the underground press acts as a communication tie between New Left groups and dissident elements across the nation.

"The forthcoming political conventions in Miami Beach on July 9 - 13 and San Diego on August 21 - 24 will, increasingly, become the subject of comment in this press. Through articles and announcements, it can be anticipated that the sponsors of demonstrations and key leaders will attempt to draw large crowds to these cities. Through this means they will also

outline specific actions which they hope will be taken during the conventions.

"The Bureau feels that a careful collation and analysis of this material will not only help to reveal the nature of plans being made by these groups, but will show the extent of their efforts to advertise these plans and to draw support for their endeavors.

"IN ORDER TO DO THIS EACH OFFICE IS INSTRUCTED TO BEGIN PROMPTLY TO REVIEW THE UNDERGROUND PRESS IN ITS TERRITORY FOR ARTICLES RELATING TO PROTEST ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO OR DURING THE CONVENTIONS. THIS REVIEW IS TO CONTINUE UNTIL THE CONVENTIONS ARE CONCLUDED.

"COPIES OF ARTICLES RELATING TO THESE CONVENTIONS SHOULD BE FORWARDED TO THE BUREAU BY AIRTEL ATTENTION: DOMESTIC INTELLIGENCE DIVISION; RESEARCH SECTION AND CAPTIONED EITHER CALREP - UNDERGROUND PRESS OR MIDEM - UNDERGROUND PRESS."

Any local demonstrations which develop in connection with captioned conventions will be opened and assigned as separate cases and reported per current Bureau instructions relating to dissemination of information regarding demonstrations. In reporting this material the instructions outlined above under Bureau airtel, dated November 2, 1971, should be followed. Designate one copy of outgoing communications to file 100-32539 (CALREP) and/or 100-32540 (MIDEM), as appropriate.

LEADS

1. All Agents are requested to immediately alert informants and sources to the possibility of local groups traveling to San Diego or Miami this summer for the purpose of disruption through civil disobedience or other means. Informants should also remain alert for information concerning

Although information in informant's report appears to be sensationalized and in the realm of fantasy, due to the gravity of the allegations, Cleveland should immediately recontact the source and thoroughly question him for additional particulars through which [redacted] and his associates can be identified.

[redacted] furnish specific statements of these persons along with complete descriptions and any other available identifying data. Determine if they are currently known to be affiliated with any organization. Specifically determine if this so-called "convention strategy" was, as it appears, just idle talk by the youth culture, OR IF THERE IS A DEFINITE POSSIBILITY OR THREAT OF ACTION.

Positive information should be appropriately reported in LHM form per above-mentioned Bureau instructions.

Cleveland note the thrust of your inquiry should be insofar as possible to determine at the outset the seriousness of this situation through penetrative questioning and evaluation of the source in order that valuable investigative time will not be wasted in persuing fantasy leads.

If this information is more than idle talk, Cleveland specifically advise if source would be jeopardized if [redacted] is located and questioned as to his alleged plans.

Ft. Lauderdale telephone directories contain no listings under above names and Miami indices contain no information identifiable with these individuals based upon the limited information furnished.

Miami will await recontact with source prior to taking further action in this matter.

WEATHERMAN

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary

Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

WORKER STUDENT ALLIANCE

Worker Student Alliance (WSA), a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

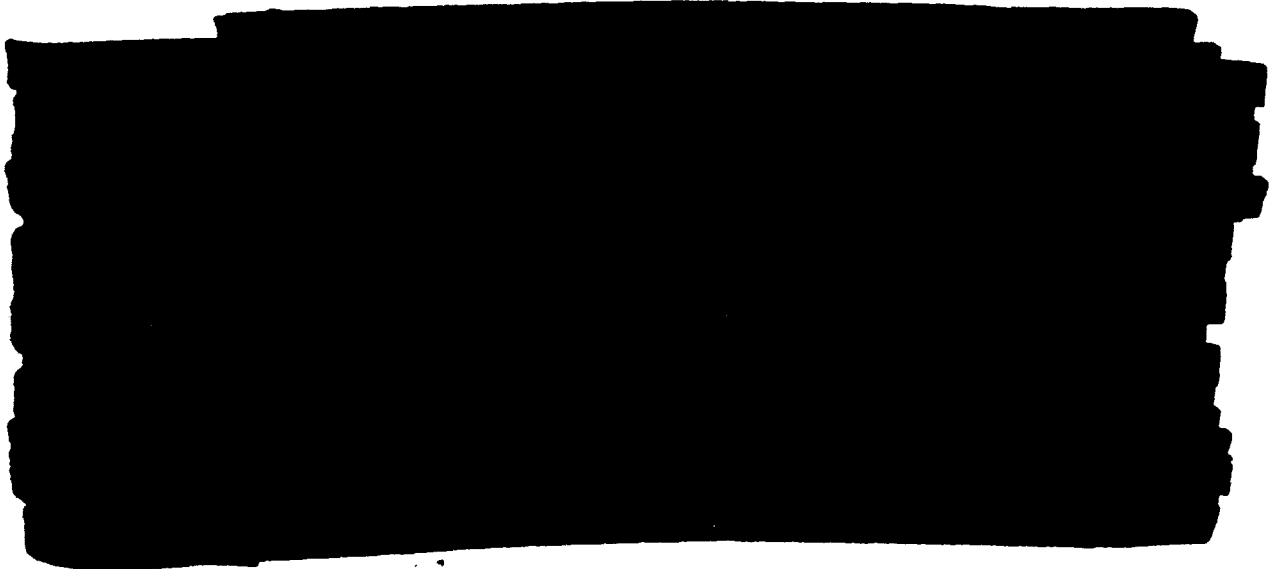

As you know, the site of the Republican National Convention has been changed from San Diego, California, to Miami Beach, Florida. The date of the convention remains August 21-24, 1972.

Referenced communications set out instructions for the development and handling of information concerning demonstrations during these conventions. These instructions remain in effect with the exception that communications concerning demonstrations at Republican National Convention should now be sent to Miami. "MIREP" will be used as the code word for demonstrations during the Republican National Convention replacing "CALREP."

Bureau letter of 4/4/72 instructed that LHM on certain individuals were to be sent to the Miami and San Diego Offices. In view of the change in the convention site, San Diego will have no need for these memoranda.

Information concerning groups that will sponsor or participate in demonstrations during the conventions should be furnished promptly and on a continuing basis to the Bureau and Miami.

In addition, informants should be targeted against those organizations or groups which (1) have demonstrated a propensity for violence in the past, (2) have engaged in acts of civil disobedience in the past which could possibly lead to violence at the conventions, (3) have planned actions to disrupt the conventions, or (4) are known

To insure that adequate informant coverage exists and sources are available to travel with such organizations or groups, the Bureau and Miami should be furnished with the size of the contingent expected to travel, mode of travel, informant coverage available, as well as the identity of the sources who will be traveling with the group. Once it is determined that the group is actually going to Miami Beach an immediate request of the Bureau for authority for such travel by the informant should be made.

It is the Bureau's responsibility to collect and promptly disseminate information on any planned disruptions. For this reason each office should be continuously alert to activity in its territory relating to the conventions. Information developed is to be promptly reported by teletype or airtel, whichever is deemed appropriate, consistent with the nature of the information and should thereafter be followed by LHM. Miami Office should, of course, receive copies of these communications. Memoranda are to be prepared in a concise and professional manner. Where rumor is reported, it should be clearly labeled as such. However, every effort should be made in such cases to verify unsupported allegations.

You will be expected to furnish this matter continuous and preferred attention to assure that the Bureau's responsibilities are met.

SDS was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From a stance of "participatory democracy," the SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). The Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS, controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

RYM, a pro-communist revolutionary youth organization, was organized in 1969, first as a faction with the SDS, then as a separate group with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. RYM was unsuccessful in attracting support and by mid 1970, it was practically defunct.

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), and in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

The PLP was founded in 1962, by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and Mao Tse-tung thought.

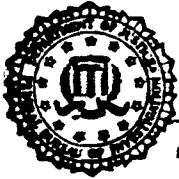

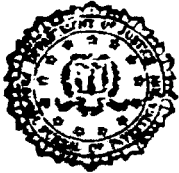

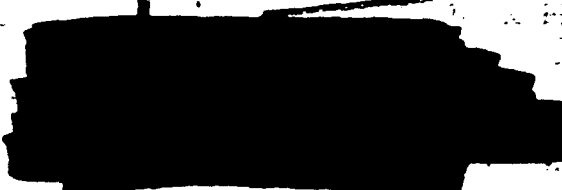

Backlash at Miami Beach

Hardhats Demand Protester Sites

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Hundreds of hardhats, Boy Scouts and high school pupils have demanded the right to camp on public facilities that officials say will be needed to house 100,000 protesters expected for the national political conventions.

"We plan to get there the first with the most and keep these people from usurping our parks and city," said Ellis Rubin, an attorney who heads an anti-protesters group called Operation Backbone.

While Dade County officials have not yet announced what facilities will be provided for the protesters during the Democratic convention July 10-14 and the Republican convention Aug. 21-23, they are expected to establish tent cities on beach areas and in parks well away from the convention site.

RUBIN HAS collected some 2,000 signatures of local residents who say no tax monies should be used to provide support for the demonstrators and they should be denied the campsites.

Some local labor unions, Boy Scout troops and 500 high school pupils have signed petitions saying they want to participate in the camp-in. Rubin has organized rallies which have drawn as many as 10,000 persons.

He sent a letter to Miami Beach City Attorney Joseph Wanick demanding that Operation Backbone members to be allowed to camp in the public areas from the first week of July until the last week of August.

"If we are refused permission to camp, then we will have established legal precedent and will be able to go into court and get an injunction to keep the protesters from camping," Rubin said.

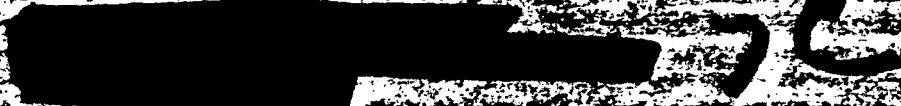

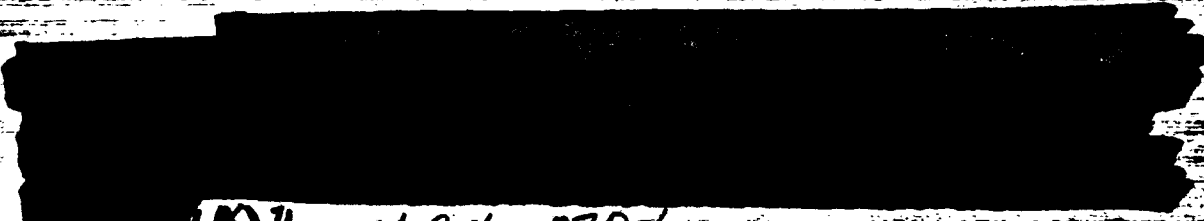

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. Internal factionalism produced a split during the SDS National Convention in June, 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Boston, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois. 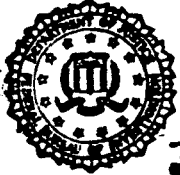

Nixon's role is questioned

MIAMI BEACH — Anti-war activist Rennie Davis said today there were indications the Nixon Administration wants "to create another Chicago" at Miami Beach next month to embarrass the Democrats and justify banning demonstrations during the GOP convention in August.

Davis is one of the Chicago Seven accused of causing trouble at the 1968 Democratic National Convention and he is an organizer of protest plans for both party meetings at Miami Beach this year. He said disruption was not the goal of the demonstrators.

"The Miami Beach City Council has made "a couple of decisions with respect to permits that have all the trappings of another Chicago," Davis said.

"THEY'RE GETTING a lot of advice from the Justice Department and the Nixon Administration and one has to really wonder whether or not Richard Nixon's strategy is to try to create another Chicago at the Democratic convention to humiliate the candidate of that convention and perhaps on the basis of denying all permits at the Republican convention," Davis said.

Meanwhile, the American Civil Liberties Union said it would sue in Federal Court challenging a city ordinance giving Police Chief Rocky Pomerance "vague" and sweeping authority to grant or deny parade permits during the conventions.

The Miami Beach Council added two measures to the police chief's authority at a meeting yesterday, giving Pomerance power to clamp a 72-hour curfew on the city if trouble starts, and authorizing him to use police lines to control unruly demonstrators.

The Council delayed until July 5 a decision on the request of Ralph Abernathy, head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), for permission to set up a "Poor People's City" at a public park about two miles from the convention hall.

Miami Beach allows a Resurrection City

MIAMI BEACH — Representatives of poor blacks, of antiwar protestors, of the Yippie organization, of the Gay Liberation front and of militantly anti-Castro Cuban groups today sat down with top officials of this convention city to try to figure out how to divide a city park in order to build a new Resurrection City.

The conferences began after the city council voted 4 to 2 to reverse its previous stand and permit the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) to build a tent city similar to the one it built opposite the Lincoln Memorial in Washington in the spring of 1968.

THE VOTE FOLLOWED seven hours of hearings at which more than 40 witnesses and two police experts offered a wide variety of views.

The police experts were Miami Beach Police Chief Rocky Pomerance and the Washington, D. C., deputy chief Ted Zanders. Both urged that the council grant a permit to Rev. Ralph Abernathy, head of the SCLC, for the tent city in a park just seven blocks south of the convention hall.

Abernathy's entrance into the packed council chamber with about 50 followers set off the singing of one of the hymns of the protest movement, "We Shall Not Be Moved." Voices throughout the hall joined the singing or hummed along, and some of the 200 younger protesters ignorant of the words clapped in time to the tune.

The Youth International Party (Yippies) had a large contingent present, mingling with the National Coalition of Gay Organization leaders but snappily dressed local residents. A surprising number of the older set in bright sports shirts and white shoes spoke in favor of granting the campsite to protesters.

THE COUNCIL'S decision was hailed by Jeff Nightbyrd, a member of the Yippies' collective leadership. He said it was the lack of such provision for a place for protesters to spend the night that led to violent confrontations between police and demonstrators at the 1968 Democratic National Convention in Chicago.

"The fearmongers lost today," Nightbyrd said. "It's a big victory over scare tactics and rumors that have created an atmosphere that would have led to disorder. It should provide a basis for a peaceful Democratic convention."

Abernathy said the three predominantly black groups wanted the city park for use in all meetings and as a staging area for demonstrations. He said 500 persons would move into the park, and said food would be trucked in.

But Miami Beach Mayor Chuck Hall, pressured from right and left, let representatives of dozens of other groups take the microphone in the hot, crowded council chamber at the convention hall. Most said that they, too, wanted a place to camp because of Miami Beach's high prices and their desire to take part in the political process.

"WHEN YOU INVITED the convention delegates," said Rennie Davis, a prominent antiwar militant, "you also issued an invitation to those affected by what goes on inside the convention hall."

Many representatives of the elderly, retired Jewish colony in this city of 80,000 voiced misgivings about having people camp near the convention hall, in an area where many people live. But others, like Rabbi Mayer Abramowitz, said: "I shared with you the fear of these young people... But I had 100 of them sleeping in our synagogue social hall the last two nights. They are thoughtful, rational young people who can be disciplined."

Davis estimated 5000 to 10,000 would come here for the Democratic convention opening next Monday. He suggested the demonstrators were saving their fire for the Republicans convening here in August.

Abbie Hoffman Calls Off All Yippie Demonstrations

MIAMI BEACH — Abbie Hoffman said yesterday that all Yippie demonstrations during the Democratic National Convention have been canceled and the group will concentrate its activities in support of senior citizens, delegates and non-delegates.



"We're concerned about old people because they've been left out of our society," said Hoffman after a heated session among Yippies, Zippies, and a black representative of the National Unity Committee to Free All American Peoples in Flamingo Park.

The park is the area set aside by City Council for the Poor People's Resurrection City II, sponsored by the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, and other non-delegate groups.

"WE HAVE CANCELED plans to bring down massive numbers of people and rock groups," said Hoffman. "We're holding out for the Republican Convention."

Hoffman has personally endorsed Sen. George McGovern's nomination, but his Youth International Party has not endorsed a candidate.

He denounced a Zippie-sponsored marijuana "smoke-in" scheduled tomorrow as "a form of exhibitionism, not a politically oriented maneuver," and as an act that would alienate the local citizenry and jeopardize campsites for groups next month.

Hoffman also said that there has been an "arrogant change in the youth culture." The rock music, he said, "has become amoral. When you see 13-year-olds freaking out over the blood-letting antics of groups like Alice Cooper it really turns me off." He was referring to the rock band that dismembers dolls on stage.

HE ALSO DENIED that he, Jerry Rubin and Ed Sanders were writing a book on the convention as a "rip off" on the demonstrations.

"The money is going back to the Youth International Party for massive political action," he said.

The Yippies clashed with Zippies at an earlier rally over the "smoke-in." Zippie spokesman Dana Beele also announced an "antismack" (heroin) parade that same night. He accuses the Central Intelligence Agency of spreading the drug around.

MICKEY McGUIRE, a black representative of the NUCFAAP, suggested that the smoke-in be moved to the Miami Beach jail where he said "our brothers and sisters are serving time."

"The SCLC has gone on record against dope," he said and accused the Zippies of putting Resurrection City in a compromising position. "If this goes through, we just can't coexist," he said.
