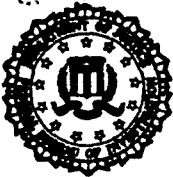

The following excerpts are from an article which appeared in the August 12-26, 1969 issue of the "Rat" entitled, "Gay Revolution Comes Out":

"Q: I'll begin with this question: What is the Gay Liberation Front?

"A: We are a revolutionary homosexual group of men and women formed with the realization that complete sexual liberation for all people cannot come about unless existing social institutions are abolished. We reject society's attempt to impose sexual roles and definitions of our nature. We are stepping outside these roles and simplistic myths. We are going to be who we are. At the same time, we are creating new social forms and relations, that is, relations based upon brotherhood, cooperation, human love, and uninhibited sexuality. Babylon has forced us to commit ourselves to one thing... revolution.

"Q: What does the GLF intend to do?

"A: We are relating the militancy generated by the bar bust and by increasing pig harassment to a program that allows homosexuals and sexually liberated persons to confront themselves and society through encounter groups, demonstrations, dances, a newspaper, and by just being ourselves on the street. The program will create revolution of mind and body as we all confront the opposition. At this time we have specific plans to open a coffee house, a working commune, and experimental living communes. We hope to extend the coffee house idea as an alternative to the exploitative over-priced syndicate run gay bar.

On August 9, 1969, Special Agents (SAs) of the FBI observed the GLF participating in a demonstration and rally sponsored by anti-Vietnam war organizations at Central Park and Times Square, New York City, at the conclusion of Hiroshima-Nagasaki Week in New York City.

#### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

[REDACTED] indicated that the assembly continues to function reasonably well in all areas except that of the World Peace Committee which has bogged down into bitter wrangling and appears to be primarily controlled by the radical left. The only universal agreement among these individuals is their condemnation of the US "Imperialism." [REDACTED] advised that on 7/15/70 a fist fight almost broke out between one of the Angolan delegates and an Algerian delegate.

World Youth Assembly

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 16, 1970 that on July 15, 1970 flyers were passed out at the United Nations (UN) to the delegates to the World Youth Assembly which is convening in New York City (NYC) from July 9 through July 18, 1970, in connection with the celebration of the 25th anniversary of the founding of the UN.

One of these flyers is captioned "American Revolutionaries Want to Meet You," and calls upon the delegates who "are being sheltered from the realities of the American political scene" to hear representatives of the American Revolutionary Movement. They indicate that this meeting would be held at 8:00 PM on Thursday, July 16, 1970 at the Hotel Diplomat, 108 West 43rd Street, NYC, and listed among the speakers were the follows:

- Abbie Hoffman (Youth International Party)
- William Kunstler (Attorney for the Chicago Conspiracy 7)
- Representatives of the Black Panther Party
- Gerald Lefcourt (Attorney for the Panther 21)
- Representatives of the Young Lords Party (Puerto Rican Liberation Front)
- Women's Liberation Movement
- Gay Liberation Front
- Committee of Returned Volunteers and others.

A second flyer which bears the letterhead of the Black Science Students Organization, City College of New York (NY) and signed by Paul B. Simms, the President, and James D. Fleshman, President-Elect, invites the participants of the World Youth Assembly, particularly Third World Delegates, to a seminar on Third World Problems which was to be held at the City College of NY, Finley Student Center on July 16,

## World Youth Assembly

1970 commencing at 12:30 PM and ending at approximately 12:30 AM on July 17, 1970. Included in the itinerary was a discussion scheduled at 6:30 PM which would include the Black Panther Party (BPP), and this flyer goes on to state that this meeting will also establish some international communication with the BPP. There was also a flyer signed by the Agrupacion Estudiantia Abdala of Cuba, post office box 595, Corona-Elmhurst Station, Queens, New York 11367, requesting that the delegates meet with representatives of that group at 9:00 PM in the Brittany Hotel on July 15, 1970.

A documentation of the BPP appears in the appendix attached hereto.

## Saigon's Delegation Quits Meeting And Assails Leftists

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., July 15—The five South Vietnamese delegates to the World Youth Assembly, who have been prevented from speaking by leftist-led hecklers, withdrew from the conference today and charged that they were victims of "fascist maneuvers."

The South Vietnamese also accused United Nations employees of manhandling their interpreter, saying that he had been seized, collared and nearly strangled by five security officers.

A United Nations spokesman disputed their version of the incident and said that the interpreter, Tran Khanh Van, had shouted during the meeting but that a preliminary inquiry tonight indicated he had left the hall of his own accord.

The South Vietnamese, South Koreans and Nationalist Chinese have been targets of attacks from the Soviet participants and leftist organizations, which tried unsuccessfully to have them excluded from the assembly when it opened last Thursday.

Since then, the delegates have thwarted their attempts to speak in what is called the "peace commission" by table-pounding, booing and shouting.

### Chairman's Efforts Countered

In each such incident, the communist chairman, Faza Najla, a Kazakhman, tried to control the hecklers, but his rulings were countered by delegates brought in from other meetings to supply extra votes and to add to the heckling.

The South Vietnamese said they were withdrawing because the "World Youth Assembly has been allowed to turn into a disorderly and dictatorial forum" for delegates from the Soviet Union and its supporters.

The statement alluded to a pre-conference declaration by the Soviet group that they would fight to get the "puppet regimes" excluded. The assembly has been boycotted by youth groups from mainland China, North Korea and North Vietnam.

The South Vietnamese said their interpreter had been manhandled and by United Nations guards on the instructions of Reginald Bruce, who is a member of the Office of Public Information. The statement said that the interpreter, Mr. Van, was seized by the five guards as he stepped out of the conference room. They said Mr. Van was dragged by the guards.

**BLACK PANTHER PARTY**  
Also Known As  
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

Kunstler is the lawyer for Communist and New Left defendants. On January 27, 1972, the Lawrence Gay Liberation Front of Lawrence, Kansas, had a matter in Federal District Court at Topeka, Kansas, at which Kunstler was to be their legal representative. Federal District Judge George Templar refused to allow Kunstler to participate, refusal based on derogatory remarks which Kunstler is said to have made against the United States, the judicial system, and so on. The Lawrence Gay Liberation Front then applied for a Writ of Mandamus in the United States Court of Appeals, 10th Circuit, to reverse the decision of District Judge Templar. The Court of Appeals denied the application for Writ of Mandamus, holding that any question of this kind is open to review on appeal and that the question can be decided at that time.

The Lawrence Gay Liberation Front, et al, petitioned the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals in regard to the refusal of U. S. District Court Judge GEORGE TEMPLAR, District of Kansas, to permit WILLIAM M. KUNSTLER to represent that organization at a hearing at Topeka, Kansas, on 1/27/72. The petition asked for a Writ of Mandamus demanding Judge TEMPLAR to vacate his order denying their attorney-in-chief, WILLIAM M. KUNSTLER, to participate on their behalf in the hearing at Topeka, Kansas, on 1/27/72; to vacate all rulings made by the court during the hearing; to reschedule another hearing for a preliminary injunction; and to permit WILLIAM M. KUNSTLER to participate in the hearing and all future proceedings in the case.

The order of the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals denied the application for a Writ of Mandamus for the reasons the petitioners have had a hearing on the merits and rulings on the case including the validity of the court's ruling with respect to admission of Mr. KUNSTLER. A panel of three judges further noted the case could be appealed and on that occasion all questions including the order denying admission of KUNSTLER can be reviewed on appeal.

This matter is being brought to the attention of the Legal Division in view of the fact that KUNSTLER during a hearing at Topeka, Kansas, on 1/27/72 claimed he had never previously been denied admission to practice in any court in the land. It is also noted the petition alleges the judge based his decision on public expressed views critical of both the court and the administration of justice in the United States by KUNSTLER. KUNSTLER further claimed the views of the judge were not supported by evidence at the hearing. As a result of the decision of Judge TEMPLAR at the hearing on 1/27/72, the matter received nationwide attention through the news media.

Judge Templar thereupon indicated - and I do not purport to quote Judge Templar's words verbatim but rather to present my understanding of their substance - that he was of the opinion that Mr. Kunstler had only contempt for the courts and that, to avoid embarrassment on my part should it be my plan to present Mr. Kunstler to his court as co-counsel for plaintiff's, he was not inclined to allow Mr. Kunstler to appear and argue the case. Judge Templar then indicated that if Mr. Kunstler should wish to "make record" as to this, then he should do so forthwith. I replied to the effect that it was not certain whether Mr. Kunstler would be planning to so appear and argue the case for plaintiffs but that I would pass along Judge Templar's sentiments to Mr. Kunstler if and when I was in communication with him. This ended the conversation.
3. On January 24th, 1972, Mr. Kunstler called me to confirm the hearing date of January 26th and to say that he might be able to get away from a jury trial in New York long enough to help argue the case.

3 (contd.)

I informed Mr. Kunstler of my conversation with Judge Templar, above, and he indicated that he would try to come anyway in the hope that, having presented himself and his credentials to the Judge personally, the Judge might well reconsider his apparent position. I concurred.

4. On the morning of January 27th, the hearing having been re-set from the 26th, Mr. Kunstler and I appeared at the Federal District Court in Topeka, Kansas. Mr. Kunstler had arrived in Lawrence, Kansas on the afternoon of the 26th and the afternoon and evening were spent by Mr. Kunstler and myself in preparation of written and oral arguments for the next day's hearing. Neither of us knew of any reason why Judge Templar would expect contemptuous or abrasive behavior on the part of Mr. Kunstler, this being Mr. Kunstler's first appearance before the Judge. We therefore proceeded with reasonable and good-faith confidence that the Judge would allow Mr. Kunstler's appearance on behalf of his clients in the absence of any basis in reason for refusal, so far as any basis in reason was known to us. It was decided that the burden of argument would be divided between us based on the logic of the situation as follows:

I, as local counsel, was most familiar with the factual and chronological development of the case and would, therefore, carry the factual presentation during the hearing.

Mr. Kunstler, sought by plaintiff's for his expertise in the area of constitutional law forming the basis for plaintiff's case, and also for his acumen and abilities as a trial lawyer, would direct his presentation to the arguments of law at the hearing.

We proceeded on that basis, Mr. Kunstler devoting himself to preparation of the Memorandum In Support of Plaintiff's Motion for Injunctive Relief, filed the following morning before hearing.

5. At the commencement of the Hearing on the 27th, I rose and introduced myself to the Court, it being my first appearance before Judge Templar as well. I informed the Court that I had been admitted to the Kansas Bar and to the instant Court in February of 1970. I then introduced Mr. Kunstler to the Court reciting that Mr. Kunstler was a member in good standing of the Bars of New York state and of the District of Columbia; that he had been admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court and before the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and

containing  
Circuit Courts of Appeal; that, further, Mr. Kunstler had appeared  
and practiced before Federal District Courts in New York, Maryland,  
Virginia and Kentucky, among others, and before the United States Court  
Military Appeals; that in addition, Mr. Kunstler had appeared and  
practiced in state and federal courts in Texas, Alabama, Mississippi,  
North Dakota, Georgia, Louisiana, Virginia and many other states; and,  
further, that Mr. Kunstler had been Professor of Law at New York Law  
School from 1949 to 1961.

Judge Templar thereupon indicated that he did not intend to permit  
Mr. Kunstler to appear for purposes of arguing on behalf of the in-  
stant plaintiffs.

Mr. Kunstler then rose, came forward, and proceeded to present  
himself and his credentials to the Court, explaining that he had  
left a jury trial and traveled halfway across the country for no  
other purpose than to present legal argument in support of the  
aforementioned Memorandum which he had alone prepared, and to repre-  
sent to the best of his abilities as a lawyer, the clients who had  
sought him for his services. Mr. Kunstler attempted to assure the Court  
that his purpose in appearing was in no respect intended or calculated  
to disrupt or offend the sensibilities of the Court or of the legal  
profession. For specifics of the exchange between Mr. Kunstler and  
Judge Templar at this occasion, I defer to the transcript of the  
record made thereat.

Immediately after a short recess of the Court, one Mr. Charles Old-  
father approached the bench and presented himself as a member of the  
administration of the University of Kansas, a member of the staff of  
the faculty of the Law School thereat, and a prospective witness for  
defendants at the hearing. Pointing out that his remarks were meant  
to be construed in his capacity as, and only as, a member of the Kansas  
Bar, Mr. Oldfather said that he was speaking to the Court as a matter  
of personal conscience and then prayed the Court to reconsider its  
decision to deny recognition to Mr. Kunstler as counsel for plaintiffs  
and suggested that a short conversation in chambers between the Judge  
and Mr. Kunstler would be appropriate and not an unreasonable approach  
to a resolution of the Court's apprehensions regarding the appearance  
of Mr. Kunstler. The Court then declined to reconsider.

7. The hearing then resumed with myself remaining as sole counsel and spokesman for plaintiff's cause. I attempted to argue the legal issues in Mr. Kunstler's absence and broke into this facet long enough to enter into the record that, in view of the morning's developments, I felt it necessary to advise that I proceeded under protest. At this point the Judge offered the suggestion that, if such were my feeling, the proceedings might well be continued to a later time. I then asked for a moment to confer with my clients. This granted, a brief conference was had and the decision reached that it was of paramount importance to avoid further delay in the effort to secure to plaintiffs the constitutional rights for which they had petitioned the Court. The Court reconvened, was informed of this decision, and the hearing continued to conclusion.

8. Let it be clarified that at no time prior to the said hearing did I truly believe that Judge Templar's statements to me by telephone as to his feelings toward Mr. Kunstler would solidify into a firm refusal to grant the good graces of the Court to his appearance for purposes of representation of plaintiffs. And, further, to my personal knowledge, every word and deed on the part of Mr. Kunstler strongly suggests to me that he shared my beliefs.

POINTS AND AUTHORITIES  
IN SUPPORT OF PETITION  
FOR MANDAMUS

There can be no doubt from a reading of the transcript (Exhibit E) that respondent refused to permit William M. Kunstler to practice before him solely and exclusively because of the latter's exercise of his First Amendment rights. In denying local counsel's motion to admit Mr. Kunstler for the purposes of the case below, respondent stated:

"And the Court feels that, under the circumstances, the notoriety of Mr. Kunstler, his persistent denunciation of the courts and his advocacy that these are no places to get justice, the Court believes that he ought not to recognize him under these circumstances." (Emphasis added) (Exhibit E, 3-4)

Subsequently, respondent incorporated these sentiments in a finding, wholly unsupported by any evidence whatsoever, that "the demonstrated and expressed attitudes of Mr. Kunstler for the courts and the judicial system of the country to be

that of utter disdain and contempt for judicial process,...."

(Emphasis added) (Ibid, at 18) Accordingly, he reiterated his decision that "I will not authorize him to act as an attorney representing the plaintiffs before this Court in defending his case." (Id.) In so doing, he stressed that "I can't close my eyes to what is well known by the judiciary throughout the country. I am advised that he has, even perhaps in the last thirty days in Washington, D.C., accused the court of being 'vile creatures.'" (Emphasis added) (Id.)

#### POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

There can be no doubt that a federal or state statute closing the courts to attorneys whose public statements are not approved by the judges thereof would be invalidated as wholly unconstitutional. How much more invidious in a free society is a judicial fiat which accomplishes the same purpose! Understandably, there are no cases on all fours since such action had undoubtedly never been taken by an American court.

However, counsel would like to call this Court's attention to cases which may assist it in its deliberations and hopes that, in view of the extraordinary and dangerous implications of respondent's incredible action, this matter will be set for oral argument so that the analogies of these authorities can be fully and thoroughly explored.

CONCLUSION

Unless this Court meets its "basic responsibility for protecting individuals against unconstitutional invasions of their rights by all branches of the Government," (emphasis added), Stanler v. Willis, 415 F.2d 1365 (7th Cir., 1969), respondent will have succeeded in abridging not only the First Amendment rights of Mr. Kunstler, but the Fifth, Sixth and

PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

Petitioners, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. 1651 and Rule 21 of the Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure, hereby petition this Court for the issuance of a writ of mandamus to the United States District Court for the District of Kansas, and the Honorable George Templar, commanding respondent (1) to vacate his verbal order denying petitioners' application for leave for their attorney-in-chief, William M. Kunstler, to participate in the hearing on their motion for preliminary injunctive relief held at Topeka, Kansas, on January 27, 1972, (2) to vacate all other rulings made by respondent during the course of said hearing, (3) to reschedule forthwith another hearing on said motion for a preliminary injunction, (4) to permit said William M. Kunstler to participate thereat and at all future proceedings below in this case.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A. Summary

On or about December 15, 1971, petitioners filed a verified complaint in the court below, seeking, among other things injunctive relief against a denial by the University of Kansas, and the appropriate officials thereof, of recognition to petition Lawrence Gay Liberation Front as a student organization. A copy of said complaint is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Subsequently, petitioners moved for a preliminary injunction, a copy of which motion is attached hereto as Exhibit B. A hearing on said motion was originally set for January 14, 1972, at Topeka, Kansas before respondent. See Exhibit C, p.5. This motion was eventually rescheduled for 9:00 a.m. on January 27, 1972, at Topeka, Kansas. Immediately prior to the commencement of said hearing, local counsel for petitioners routinely moved the admission of William M. Kunstler, a member in good standing of the bars of the state of New York and the District of Columbia, as well as those of the Supreme Court of the United States and many Courts of Appeal and United States District Courts, for this proceeding only. This motion was denied on the ground that said William M. Kunstler had, in the past, according to respondent, publicly expressed views critical of both courts and the administration of justice in the United States.

B. Pertinent Facts

Shortly before the hearing of January 27, 1972, respondent suggested telephonically to Jack Klinknett, petitioners' local counsel, that said Kunstler lacked respect for his court and that he was disposed not to let him practice before him. Mr. Klinknett immediately informed Mr. Kunstler by telephone of respondent's statements, but both attorneys were convinced that the likelihood of such an unprecedented act was so remote as to

was present Mr. Kunstler's appearance at the scheduled hearing.

Accordingly, Mr. Kunstler arrived in Lawrence, Kansas on the afternoon of January 20, 1972, completed preparation of petitioners' brief in support of their motion/preliminary injunctive relief, and worked with Mr. Klinknett on the division and preparation of necessary legal argument and the presentation and rebuttal of evidentiary material.

At the commencement of the hearing on January 27, 1972, Mr. Klinknett introduced Mr. Kunstler to respondent and made a routine motion for his admission pro haec vice\* for the purposes of the said case only.\*\* Thereupon respondent denied said motion claiming that Mr. Kunstler had, in the past said disrespectful things about American courts and justice. Without referring to specific assertions by Mr. Kunstler, respondent indicated that he had read and/or heard comments by Mr. Kunstler which he con-

\* Local Rule 3, Section f, Rules of Practice of the United States District Court for the District of Kansas reads as follows:

Any attorney duly and regularly admitted to practice in the courts of record in another state of territory and not residing in the State of Kansas having professional business in this Court may upon motion be admitted for the purpose of said business only when it is made to appear that he has associated and personally appearing with him in the action an attorney who is a resident of and who maintains his law office within the State of Kansas and who has been duly and regularly admitted to practice in this court....

considered to be derogatory of American legal institutions. #/

Respondent permitted Mr. Kunstler to address the court in order "to make your record." In so doing, Mr. Kunstler pointed out that, with the exception of United States v. Dellinger et al, 69 Cr. 180 (N.D.Ill. 1969), <sup>\*/</sup> he had never been reprimanded, censured or otherwise disciplined by any court in a quarter of a century of active practice. He also stated that the judgment of contempt against him in Dellinger was sub judice in the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and was scheduled for oral argument on February 9, 1972, in Chicago, Illinois. Moreover, Mr. Kunstler emphasized that there were no disbarment or other disciplinary proceedings commenced against him and that all of respondent's expressed understandings as to alleged statements made by him were, in fact, either misconceptions, distortions or totally without foundation. <sup>\*/</sup>

\*/ The Court stressed that Mr. Kunstler had been guilty of "persistent enunciation that these courts are not the place to get justice." New York Times, January 28, 1972, p. 69.

\*/ Known colloquially as the Chicago Conspiracy Trial.

\*/ The transcript of the proceedings below has been ordered and it is hoped that it will be available upon the consideration of this petition. An affidavit by Mr. Klinknett is attached hereto as Exhibit D for the Court's information in the absence of such transcript. *See Exhibit E*

Respondent refused to rescind his oral order which prohibited Mr. Kunstler from participating in the hearing, and further directed him to leave the counsel table. After Mr. Kunstler had complied with the latter direction, the hearing proceeded with Mr. Klinknett representing petitioners "under protest." Although respondent offered petitioners additional time in which to secure other counsel or to permit Mr. Klinknett to prepare himself more fully, they declined because of their feeling that the nature of the First Amendment rights claimed to be violated by the University of Kansas was so vital, fundamental and compelling that further delay would only add to the irreparable injury suffered by them.

After Mr. Klinknett had announced that he was proceeding "under protest," Prof. Charles Oldfather, a twenty-year member of the faculty of the Law School of the University of Kansas, asked for permission to address the court. After reciting his affiliation with the University and his further position as its attorney, he stated that he was speaking only as an individual member of the bar. Among other things, he joined in Mr. Kunstler's plea to be admitted for the purpose of the instant case and suggested that respondent confer with Kunstler in chambers in order to clear up any misconceptions he may have had as to his public utterances. The court declined to do so.

The hearing then continued with further legal argument and the testimony of Prof. Oldfather as a witness for defendants below. Subsequently, the court found no irreparable injury to petitioners, retained jurisdiction, and directed all parties to submit suggested findings of fact and conclusions of law on or before February 7, 1972.

C. Appropriateness of Mandamus

1. Respondent's Order is Non-Appealable.

Admittedly, the extraordinary remedy of mandamus may not be resorted to as mode of review where a statutory method of appeal has been prescribed. Roche v. Evaporated Milk Assn., 319 U.S. 21, 27-28 (1943) and cases cited therein. However, there is here no statutory method of appeal available to petitioners either to insure the participation of Mr. Kunstler as their attorney-in-chief in any further proceeding below or to vacate any orders made by respondent during or following said proceedings and to permit petitioners' counsel of choice to conduct the presentation of their case as he would have wanted to had he been permitted to participate in the hearing of January 27, 1972. In this connection, see Chase v.

Robson, et al., 435 F.2d 1059 (1970), in which the Seventh Circuit issued its writ of mandamus in connection with the imposition by the trial court of a "gag rule" on defendants and their counsel during a criminal trial.

2. The Issue is Extraordinary

As the late Mr. Justice Black stated in Will v. United States, 389 U.S. 90, 108:

I agree that mandamus is an extraordinary remedy which should not be issued except in extraordinary circumstances. And I also realize that the granting of mandamus may bring about the review of a case as would an appeal. Yet this does not deprive a court of its power issue the writ. Where there are extraordinary circumstances, mandamus may be used to review an interlocutory order which is by no means 'final' and thus appealable under federal statutes.

In the instant case, respondent has in effect, disbarred a lawyer simply because he did not agree with what he considered to be the latter's publicly stated views on American legal institutions. Or, to put it another way, he had used his enormous

... of courtroom control to punish an attorney for the exercise of First Amendment Rights. If courts can be closed to members of the legal profession simply because they may have expressed views which are contrary to those held by judges, a grosser and more dangerous violation of the constitutional guarantee of freedom of speech can hardly be imagined.\*

Moreover, and of equal importance, is the fact that respondent's conduct has violated petitioners' Sixth Amendment rights to counsel of their choice. The latter retained Mr. Kunstler in November of 1971 because they felt confidence in both his legal expertise and his reliability. In addition, the trust and reliance implicit in the attorney-client relationship had developed, and petitioners felt that their interests would be fully and adequately represented by him.

Respondent's refusal to permit Mr. Kunstler to practice before him effectively destroyed petitioners' right to be represented by the attorney whose services they desired, sought and obtained. Like Mr. Kunstler, they, too, were being punished and deprived of a fundamental constitutional right because respondent disapproved of their lawyer's publicly expressed views.\*\*

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\* Even if this court concludes that a district court has discretion to exclude an attorney who has, as here, complied with its admission rules, it is beyond cavil that even the exercise of such discretion cannot be done for unconstitutional reasons. See Johnson v. Branch, 364 F.2d, 177 (1966), cert. den 385 U.S. 1003 (1967).

\*\* Petitioners' local counsel is a young and inexperienced attorney admitted to the bar in 1970, who, despite his courage and good intentions, was not thoroughly grounded in the intricacies of constitutional law involved in the instant case or the procedural aspects thereof, and who so stated at the hearing below.



To permit a client's choice of a legal representative to be dictated or controlled in this fashion would make a mockery of both the First and the Sixth Amendments as well as constitute a deprivation of due process of law under the Fifth Amendment and a denial of the equal protection of the law as guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment.

Petitioners believe that the above factors present "extraordinary circumstances" permitting the use of mandamus to review the order of the court below.

4. The Issue Is One Of First Impression

A Court of Appeals has the power to review, by way of a petition for mandamus, basic and undecided questions of first impression. Schiagenhauf v. Holder, 379 U.S. 104, 111-118 (1964). Petitioners have been unable to find any District Court or Court of Appeals rulings which affirm or deny the power of district judges to deny admission to their courts to out-of-district attorneys solely because they disagree with the latter's publicly expressed views on important issues. Because of the absence of appropriate precedent and the overriding importance of the issues herein presented, petitioners feel that this court should promptly schedule a hearing either en banc or before a panel thereof, relative to the issuance of the requested writ of mandamus.

5. Order Will Thwart Appellate Jurisdiction

The authority to issue writs of mandamus is restricted to those cases in which the writ is in aid of an appellate court's jurisdiction; it is to prevent a district court from obstructing an appeal or thwarting an appellate court's jurisdiction improperly whether or not an appeal has been perfected. Roche v. Evaporated Milk Association, 319 U.S. 21, 24 (1943).

Respondent's order, by definition, destroys any potential appeal of that order. If he decides in favor of petitioners on

of their prayer for relief, the issue may be considered  
by this court. If he decides against petitioners, the issue  
likewise be deemed moot. Either way, this Court's appellate  
jurisdiction as to the said issue will be thwarted.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, petitioner respectfully prays  
that a Writ of Mandamus issue as prayed herein.

On February 7, 1970, [REDACTED] led a demonstration of some 100 homosexuals and transvestites who were protesting a sign placed by the management of Barney's Bar and Cafe, 8448 Santa Monica Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. Apparently the sign read "Fagots stay out". According to the February 12, 1970 edition of the "Los Angeles Free Press", the above demonstration was sponsored by the Gay Liberation Front - Los Angeles (GLFLA). [REDACTED]

The "Los Angeles Free Press" is an avant garde newspaper of general circulation throughout the Los Angeles area.

The January 15, 1970 edition of the "Los Angeles Free Press" stated that the GLFLA came into existence on approximately January 1, 1970, and has its headquarters at 3473 1/2 Cahuenga Boulevard West, Los Angeles, California. As its title suggests, the purpose of the Gay Liberation Front is to free homosexuals, transvestites, lesbians, and other sexual deviates from "oppression" long received from the "straight" population.

The January 2, 1970 "Free Press" also stated that the "GLFLA comes into existence as the reactionary anti-homosexual elements surface and attempt to destroy the existing Gay organizations in Southern California. The pyramiding of Gay movement by its very nature confronts all authoritarian, conformist regimes including communism as well as the juvenile American culture, and exposes the hypocrisy within these systems." It was further stated "that the GLF supports the rights of transvestites and trans-sexuals and encourages secret TV's (transvestites) to leave the closets and get into the streets."



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The GLF apparently does not advocate violence in the furtherance of its aims as the "Free Press", January 7, 1970 issue stated that "First time visitors to GLF attempted to promote violence as part of the demonstration (described above) and their views were entirely rejected by the GLF." This article also stated that the GLF has a membership of some 47 persons.

At the demonstration on February 7, 1970,  and other demonstrators carried placards with the words "To Each His Own Couch - Gore Vidal", "More Deviation - Less Population", "Gay is just as good as straight", and "Say it loud, We're Gay and proud", according to the February 13, 1970 edition of the "Free Press". This article also stated that the GLF has a new meeting place at 2259½ West Washington Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

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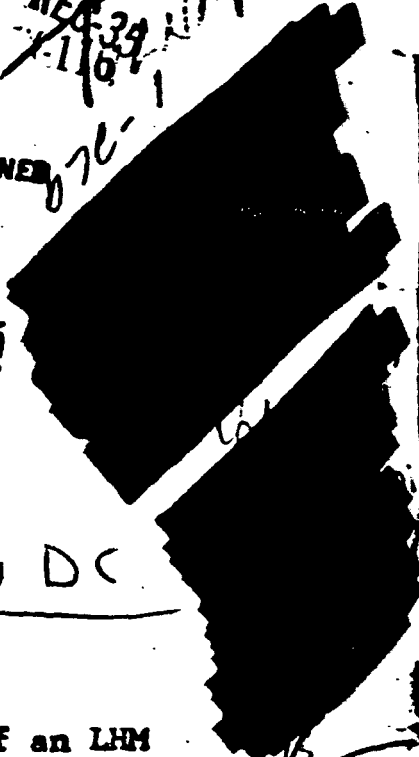

# 12 From Gay Lib Front Released After Brawl

Twelve members of the Gay Liberation Front were released on personal recognizance yesterday on charges stemming from a bottle-throwing, window smashing brawl which erupted at a Northwest Washington restaurant after four homosexuals were denied service.

General Sessions Court Judge Sylvania Bacon released the defendants, most of them out-of-towners attending the Peoples' Revolutionary Constitutional Convention, in custody of the Rev. Jon Higginbotham, a District minister.

The 12 face several misdemeanor charges of simple assault, vandalism, and unlawful entry after the free-for-all late Friday night at the Zephyr Restaurant, 4812 Wisconsin Ave. N.W.

The incident began when four

Gay Lib members, two of them arm-in-arm, entered and sat at a table. One of those arrested said the group waited several minutes without service before talking with the manager.

"The manager said he couldn't serve us," he said. "I asked him it was because one of us was black and he said no. I asked him if it was because we are homosexuals. I asked him three times and he wouldn't answer."

The four returned to American University where they are staying during the convention, he said, and decided to stage a sit-in. About 40 persons returned, he said.

The brawl occurred during the sit-in. The 12 were arrested later when their minibus was stopped by police several blocks away on Wisconsin Avenue.

Be it known that the American and Vietnamese people are not enemies. The war is carried out in the name of the people of the United States but without our consent. It drains America of her youth, her resources, and her honor.

We hereby agree to end the war on the following terms, so that both peoples can live under the joy of independence and can devote themselves to building a society based on human equality and respect for the earth.

### Principles

Americans agree to immediate and total withdrawal from Vietnam and to publicly set the date by which all US military forces will be removed.

Vietnamese agree to participate in an immediate cease fire, and will enter discussions on the procedures to guarantee the safety of all withdrawing troops, and to secure the release of all military prisoners.

Americans agree to end the imposition of Thieu, Ky, and Khiem on the people of South Vietnam in order to insure their right of self determination, and to insure that all political prisoners are released.

Vietnamese pledge to form a provisional coalition government to organize democratic elections in which all South Vietnamese can participate freely without the presence of any foreign troops, and to enter discussions of procedures to guarantee the safety and political freedom of persons who cooperated with either

side in the war.

Americans and Vietnamese agree to respect the independence, peace, and neutrality of Laos and Cambodia.

Upon these points of agreement, we pledge to end the war. We will resolve all other questions in mutual respect for the people of Vietnam and of the United States.



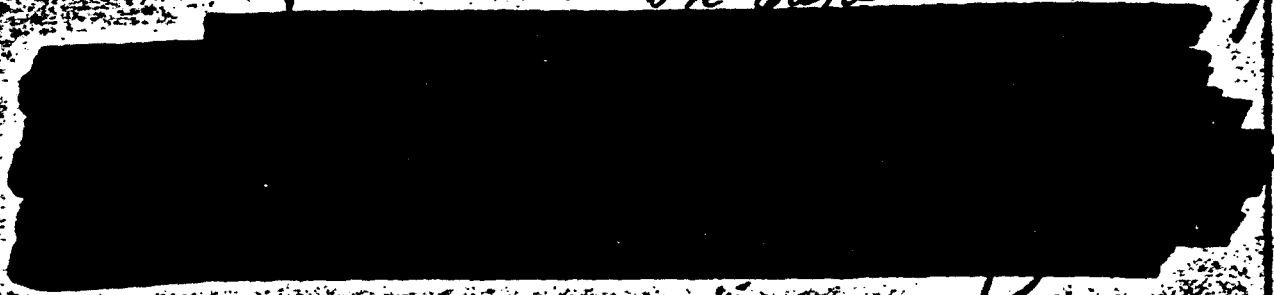

# Homosexuals Stage Hollywood Parade

## Event Evokes Boos and Catcalls but No Violence

A "gay power" parade by homosexuals on Hollywood Blvd. Sunday evening had many things—joyous demonstrators for sexual rights and dignity, some in casual attire, others in briefs, "queens" in drag, "fairies" with paper wings, clowns, leather-jacketed motorcyclists, a lesbian on horseback, a python, white huskies, American Flags, hilarious and pomber signs and chants, a float depicting a homosexual nailed to a cross.

One thing the hour-long, mile-long procession lacked was violent reaction from spectators, which the Police Commission had predicted in requiring a \$1,500 cash bond for the parade permit.

A judge, citing the constitutional guarantee of freedom of expression, later ordered the permit issued without conditions.

Spectators greeted the marchers with nothing more than boos, catcalls and wolf whistles mixed with cheers and applause.

Police estimated there were 500 demonstrators and 4,000 bystanders, but other observers felt there were many times more.

The parade sponsors, an umbrella group known as Christopher Street West, used a mechanical counter and said there were 1,169 participants. It estimated that the crowds of onlookers lining the sidewalks five and 10 deep numbered 25,000 to 30,000.

The Rev. Troy Perry, pastor of the homosexually oriented Metropolitan Community Church in Hollywood, said the parade celebrated the show of strength made by rioting homosexuals of Christopher St. in Greenwich Village last year.

After the parade several hundred of the participants gathered at Las Palmas Ave. and Hollywood Blvd. to stage a sit-in on the sidewalk. They were dispersed by police, who took into custody seven persons for blocking a sidewalk. Those arrested included Mr. Perry.

The parade coincided with other demonstrations Sunday in Greenwich Village, San Francisco and San Diego.

Many organizations were represented, including the Gay Liberation Front, Daughters of Bilitis, ~~Peterosexuals for Homosexuals~~, Focus of Orange County and the Society of Anubis.

The demonstrators' sentiments — and humor — were expressed in several placards and chants:

"The Nazis burned Jews, the Church burned homosexuals"

"More deviation, less population"

"Stop entrapment"

"20% of you are us"

"Auntie Tom is dead"

# Nationwide peace march set

The National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) is sponsoring a nationwide march in sixteen major US cities against the war in Indochina on November 6, according to national NPAC representative Jeff Herman, and Mike McGraw, Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) organizer here. Participants in the demonstration will assemble at 9:00 a.m. in MacArthur Park and march to City Hall for a rally there at 1:30 p.m.

A city-wide SMC meeting will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, October 31, at the Los Angeles City College Student Center, 855 N. Vermont Ave. to finalize arrangements for the November 6 march and a nationwide student strike planned for November 3. On strike day, students are encouraged to forego their regular activities (classes included) and canvass residential areas, explaining the war and urging participation in the November 6 march.

A conglomerate of a wide variety of national organizations (ranging from Gay Liberation Front through women's liberation advocates to politicians and businessmen), the NPAC coordinates national conventions and demonstrations with the goal of achieving total withdrawal from Indochina. Some of their previous activities included the marches last April 24, and more recently, a rally of veterans against the war on October 23 in San Francisco.

"Our organization will continue to exist until our goal is met," Herman said. "We can't afford to get tired of the war now. Nixon will get reelected unless we expose the fraudulent policies of the American government."

"The peace movement is but the birth of a social revolution which must take place in the US," Herman continued. "Besides ending the war in Indochina, we have to change foreign policy." Herman added that he expects "this upcoming march to be the largest mass mobilization in American history."

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# Activist, Peace Groups Organize Peoples Party

DALLAS (AP)—Delegates from activist and peace groups voted Friday to set up a nationwide political party and christened it the Peoples Party.

The vote on the name was unanimous but other issues raised at the convention remained unresolved. Among the points still debated were:

—The desirability of nominating candidates for President and Vice President for next year's elections.

—Approval of a campaign platform.

—Appointment of a so-called shadow Cabinet whose members would keep tabs on the departments of government.

The vote to go ahead with a properly constituted party came from nearly all the 186 registered delegates at the four-day convention which opened Thanksgiving Day. But there were a few loud shouts of "No."

A dispute between those wanting a strong national organization and those who favored a loose-knit, grass-roots approach immediately became apparent.

Bay doctor Benjamin Spock, who with novelist

Gore Vidal is cochairman of the participating New Party, sat on the sidelines during the morning discussion.

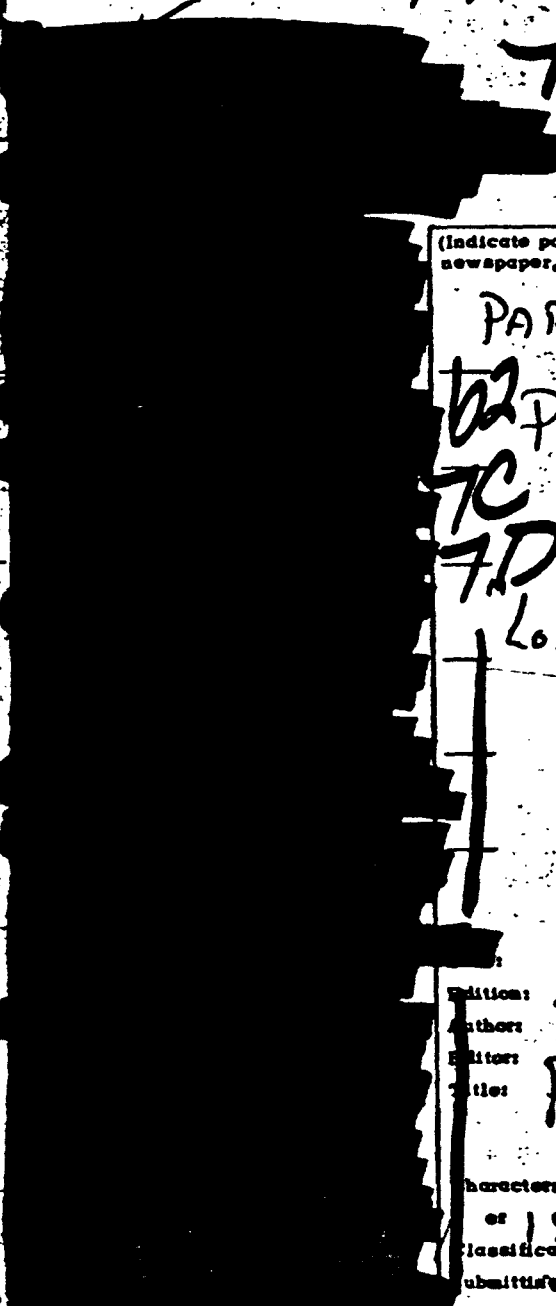
Spock said he would like to see consumer advocate Ralph Nader run for President, but added, "He (Nader) won't get into politics."

He added that the names of former Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy of Minnesota, Rep. Shirley Chisholm of New York, Sen. Fred B. Harris of Oklahoma, all Democrats, had been mentioned at the convention.

The Peace and Freedom Party and the New Party claimed the biggest groups represented at the convention. But there were also delegates from Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Mayday 1968, Barrios Unidos, Gay Liberation Front, Women's Lib, and Free Church.

Sen. Mike Gravel (D-Alaska) told the convention that the new party had no chance of electing a President or a U.S. senator.

"But the dialog and issues you raise can render a service to the country and the political structure of society," he said.

On 1/14/70, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] made the following observations:

At 12:40 P. M., six individuals, three white males and three white females, appeared on the Chase Manhattan Plaza. Two of the females were carrying signs. They proceeded to the northwest corner of Williams and Pine Streets where they at various times walked, chanted, stood around in the intense cold and occasionally chatted with passers-by. One of the males tried to hand out leaflets. Few spectators accepted them. The six dispersed at 1:00. P. M. No incidents or arrests were noted.

The signs carried read, "Don't Pay The Double Fare" and "Support The Subway Fare Strike". The six occasionally chanted without conviction, "Don't pay the fare".

## WHAT WE WANT

We call on the people of New York to demonstrate against the increasing attack on our right to support our families and make a decent living.

### 1. ABOLISH THE FARE —

The 30¢ fare amounts to a 2-3% increase in the cost of living of the average wage earner. Subways are an essential service; they should be free in the same way as schools, parks and the fire department.

### 2. CLEAN, SAFE PLATFORMS AND CARS —

New York Times, Jan. 9: "Equipment failures, late trains, overcrowding and dirty subways have been products of neglect for at least 15 years."

### 3. ABOLISH THE MTA —

The present MTA is a select fraternity of politicians, bankers and corporate executives, none of whom have to ride the subways and busses: Eben Pyne, senior V.P. of First National City Bank, director of U.S. Life Insurance Co.; William Shea, Financier and Trustee of East Brooklyn Savings Bank; William Butcher, Chairman of Board of County Trust of White Plains; Bruce Gimbel, President of Gimbel Brothers; Walter Thayer, Director, Bankers Trust; William J. Ronan, \$70,000,000 Chairman of MTA, former Secretary and campaign manager to Gov. Rockefeller; Donald H. Elliot, Chairman of the City Planning Commission; Leonard Braun, President of Newport Petroleum Co.; Harold L. Fisher, lawyer and politician.

### 4. SUSPENSION OF THE \$137 MILLION YEARLY TRANSIT DEBT PAYMENTS TO THE BANKS —

We have already paid many times the value of the entire transit system over the decades in which this debt has grown to \$1.8 billion. Cancelling the yearly debt service payment would provide ample funds for paying a living wage to transit employees.

### 5. TAX THE BANKS TO PAY FOR TRANSIT —

Poor and middle class people have had it up to here with taxes. Financial and real estate interests should pay their fair share of city costs. In 1945 they were contributing 76% of the city budget. Today they get away with paying 29% of it. Isn't it time we stop this robbery?

### 6. RE-ORDERING NATIONAL PRIORITIES—RESOURCES TO THE CITIES NOT THE MILITARY —

Our government can spend \$80 billion a year for war and destruction and millions for highway construction, but can't afford decent public transportation.

### 7. A LIVING WAGE FOR TRANSIT WORKERS —

The actual wage increase granted to transit workers was 1%. In less than six months, their real take home pay will fall behind what it was two years ago. Lindsay will try to use this inadequate contract to set a precedent for other city employees' contracts. Let's not be fooled by the politicians' attempts to cover for their friends in real estate and high finance by shifting the blame for the fare increase to the wage demands of the transit workers.

\*\*\* We therefore support a 30% wage increase for transit workers. \*\*\*

OF HARRISBURG. MARCH INCLUDED APPROXIMATELY FOUR THOUSAND DEMON-  
STRATORS WHO PROCEEDED ACROSS STATE STREET BRIDGE TO PARKING LOT  
BEHIND PENNSYLVANIA STATE CAPITOL. DEMONSTRATORS CARRIED SIGNS  
READING "LIFE VERSUS DEATH," "300 DIE IN AIR WAR EACH DAY IN VIETNAM"  
AND "WOULD YOU WANT BOYD DOUGLAS AS A MAIL MAN?" SOME WERE DRESSED

EDGAR HOOVER. SHE WENT ON TO SPEAK ON CIVIL RIGHTS, AMNESTY FOR ALL POLITICAL PRISONERS AND LEFT IMMEDIATELY AFTER HER TALK TO CATCH AN OUTGOING FLIGHT.

RUBY DEE THEN INTRODUCED FANIA JORDAN, SISTER OF

ANGELA DAVIS, WHO SPOKE BRIEFLY ON THE GRANDEUR OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY, DISMISSING THE ANGELA DAVIS INDICTMENT AND EMPHASIZED ANTI-CORPORATION ACTIVITIES.

DANIEL ELLSBERG SPOKE IN SUPPORT OF THE BERRIGANS AND RIDICULED THE FBI FOR THEIR CONDUCT DURING THE PERIOD OF TIME THAT BERRIGAN WAS IN A FUGITIVE STATUS. HE STATED THE FIRST AMENDMENT WAS ON TRIAL, NOT THE BERRIGANS.

REV. RALPH DAVID ABERNATHY, SOUTHERN CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE, SPOKE BRIEFLY, STATING THAT THE COUNTRY MUST GET RID OF NIXON AND AGNEW AND HAVE A COMPLETE CHANGE OF GOVERNMENT THIS ELECTION. HE ALSO RIDICULED THE FBI FOR NOT CAPTURING THE KILLER CONSPIRATORS OF MARTIN LUTHER KING. HE STATED THAT THE COUNTRY SHOULD REMOVE J. EDGAR HOOVER BECAUSE HE IS NOT FINDING THE BIG DRUG PUSHERS BUT ONLY GOING AFTER THE LITTLE MEN.

DANIEL BERRIGAN THEN READ A LETTER FROM HIS BROTHER, PHILIP, IN REGARD TO PEACE, TURNING THE TRIAL AROUND AND URGING THE GOVERNMENT TO "UNINDICT" THE HARRISBURG 7. HE COMPARED BOYD DOUGLAS TO JUDAS AND THE HARRISBURG SEVEN TO JESUS CHRIST. THE MODERATOR THEN ASKED FOR A COLLECTION TO BE TAKEN TO COVER THE COST OF THE DEMONSTRATION AND STATED THAT ANY MONEY LEFT OVER

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WOULD BE TURNED OVER TO ANGELA DAVIS AND THE HARRISBURG SEVEN.  
AT THIS TIME APPROXIMATELY 400 PEOPLE LEFT.

VARIOUS FOLK SINGERS ENTERTAINED WHILE COLLECTION  
WAS BEING TAKEN.

PAUL MAYER ALSO ADVISED THAT MADAME BINH, NORTH  
VIETNAMESE DELEGATION AT PARIS, WOULD CALL BY PHONE AND SPEAK  
TO THE GROUP.

MAYER READ A STATEMENT FROM THE PEOPLE'S COMMISSION  
TO DEMILITARIZE INDUSTRY WHICH CLAIMED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE  
SABOTAGE TO BOMBS AT THE YORK, PA., AMERICAN MACHINE AND  
FOUNDRY CO. PLANT. HE READ A LIST OF NAMES VERY QUICKLY AND  
INCLUDED HIMSELF AT THE END AS AMONG THOSE RESPONSIBLE. HE THEN  
REQUESTED AS MANY INDIVIDUALS AS POSSIBLE TO SIGN THIS STATEMENT  
CLAIMING RESPONSIBILITY AND MOVED THROUGH THE CROWD OBTAINING  
SIGNATURES. MAYER THEN ANNOUNCED THAT ALL WHO COULD SHOULD GO  
TO PROTEST A SPEECH BY MELVIN LAIRD, SECRETARY OF DEFENSE, ON  
APR. 7, LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED. HE URGED PROTESTORS TO GO TO  
YALE UNIVERSITY ON APR. 4 TO PROTEST A SPEECH BY GEN. WILLIAM

THE NEXT SPEAKER WAS NGO VINH LONG, VIETNAMESE STUDENT HARVARD, UNIVERSITY. HE SPOKE ON THE ATROCITIES AND TORTURES IN THE VIETNAM WAR. HE STATED THAT HE AND A GROUP OF INDIVIDUALS WOULD TAKE OVER A HALL AT SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY ON APR. 27, 1972, IN PROTEST AGAINST THE WAR.

AT APPROXIMATELY 4:15 PM THE TRANSATLANTIC PHONE CALL CAME IN FROM PARIS AND WAS PATCHED THROUGH TO THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM. MADAME BINH AND AN UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPOKE IN BROKEN ENGLISH ON THE EXCHANGE OF PRISONERS OF WAR AND NIXON'S POLICIES.

ANNOUNCEMENTS WERE THEN MADE TO THE PROTESTORS THAT THEY SHOULD ATTEND THE ITT STOCKHOLDERS MEETING IN BOSTON, DATE NOT GIVEN.

ALSO ANNOUNCED AS SCHEDULED WAS A PROTEST AT THE ARMY RESEARCH CENTER, MADISON, WISCONSIN, MAY 15, 1972, AND PLANNED DEMONSTRATIONS BY PERSONNEL OF THE ARMED FORCES ON ARMED FORCES DAY MAY 20, 1972.

NEXT SPEAKER WAS BEULAH SANDERS, NATIONAL WELFARE RIGHTS ORGANIZATION LEADER WHO SPOKE ON RACISM, POVERTY AND ENDING THE WAR.

DANIEL BANGOR, VVAW OF PENNSYLVANIA, SPOKE IN REGARD

TO ANGELA DAVIS, PURCHASING WEAPONS TO KILL PEOPLE AND THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT PURCHASING WEAPONS TO KILL PEOPLE IN VIETNAM.

ELIZABETH MC ALISTER, HARRISBURG 7 DEFENDANT, SPOKE VERY BRIEFLY ON RELIGION, PEACE AND LOVE AND MENTIONED VERY LITTLE ABOUT THE TRIAL.

RICHARD HAYDEN, AFL-CIO OFFICIAL, FARM WORKERS UNION, READ A MESSAGE FROM CAESAR CHAVEZ REPRESENTING A STATEMENT IN REGARD TO THE UNION'S OPPOSITION TO THE REPUBLICAN PARTY'S STAND ON FARM WORKERS AND OTHER UNION POLICIES.

AN UNKNOWN MALE THEN SPOKE, REPRESENTING THE GAY LIBERATION FRONT OF WASHINGTON, D.C. THIS INDIVIDUAL WAS VERY UPSET BECAUSE HIS ORGANIZATION WAS LAST AND STATED THAT THE GAY PEOPLE SHOULD BECOME MORE BOLD AND AGGRESSIVE AND THAT WE SHOULD HAVE MORE PEOPLE LIKE THE BERRIGANS.

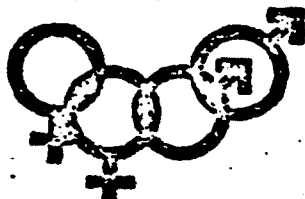

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# GAY NOTES



Education has suddenly become "too controversial" in some classrooms. At least, that's the impression Gay Action gets from our most recent attempt to climb the ivory towers of educational institutions in Hayward. We were invited to speak at Sunset High on April 12, thanks to the help of an interested student and a student teacher. From what we hear, the principal, Dr. Nels Nelson, doesn't really go for us too much. The instructor who wanted us to speak took the matter before the Board of Trustees to get their approval. Our sources tell us that Nelson went to the Superintendent to get agreement for his side.

While the battle raged, an article appeared in the Daily Review telling that some parents of students at Logan High in Union City complained about the terrible actions of two people who spoke there on March 15. Of course, the two people who spoke at Logan are the two who wanted to speak at Sunset.

The actions--those horrible deeds the two speakers performed in public: they held hands. Two guys holding hands. Big deal. Not really worthy of a single line of news print, but the Daily Review gave us four columns.

On that basis, Hayward Unified decided we weren't worthy of the audience of their students. Instead, Nelson says he wants to invite a "qualified" doctor to speak. Asking a doctor to speak about homosexuality is like asking a doctor to speak about baseball. Just because a doctor has a credential, he is in no way an expert on homosexuality unless he is a Gay doctor.

In fact, quite the opposite happened. We got along well with all the students we talked with, both in the classroom and during lunch out in the patio area--there was none of the uptightness that some of the parents showed. It could be just that we who spoke have given our honest gut-level feelings. We haven't wrapped ourselves in Plastic, or tried to make things look pretty. We've said what we felt about ourselves, our families, lovers, friends, society.

Honesty comes through to students. Anything less is a rip-off.



Christopher Street Liberation Day is coming June 25 to Hayward. This is an annual celebration of the coming of Gay liberation to this country.

The name comes from a street in New York where a Gay bar was raided by the police in June 1969. The Gay people were tired of being trashed, so they fought back and the riot which arose became the bloodiest ever to be fought for Gay liberation.
