





GARDEN PEAS.

CULTIVATION.—Peas do well in any good garden soil, but thrive best in ground deeply trenched and manured or a previous crop. Sow about an inch and a half deep in double rows 6 or 8 inches apart. It is also a good plan to sow in trenches wide apart, with some other crop between; by this means both sides of the rows get the full advantage of light and air, while the trenches are convenient for watering in dry seasons. They should be kept clean from weeds and earthed up twice in their growth. The height to which peas will grow in a great measure depends on the richness of the soil and the wetness of the season. The large wrinkled varieties are the sweetest and most delicately flavoured, but are not so hardy as the dwarf sorts, and therefore not so well adapted for small gardens. Those growing 3 feet high should not be nearer each other than 3 or 4 feet, and have stakes or bush for support. For an early crop a sowing of the Earliest varieties may be made in November, December, and January—they are hardy, and frost will not harm them. Sowings of Second Early varieties may be made in February, and the main crops in succession from March to the end of May. Late sowings for Autumn crops may be made, according to the season, until the early part of July. Peas should be gathered as fast as they become fit for use.







ASPARAGUS.

CULTIVATION.—The seed should be sown in March and April, in rows two feet apart; when one or two years old transplant into beds. In selecting a spot for an Asparagus Bed choose an open and sunny situation; as this is a crop which will occupy the same spot for several years a little trouble expended upon it in the first place will well repay itself. The soil should be trenched at least to the depth of two feet, and plenty of good rotten manure mixed with it from top to bottom. The beds may be four feet wide, with two feet alleys between; three rows should be planted in each bed, one in the centre and one on each side at the distance of a foot; the roots about nine inches apart in the rows. A dressing of salt or asparagus manure in autumn or early spring at the rate of about four pounds to every six square yards is very beneficial.

CRASS SEEDS can never be sown too thickly, as it is found that the thicker the seed is sown the finer will be the turf. March and April are the best months for sowing, and the quantity of seed usually sown is 80 lbs. to 100 lbs. per acre. If the ground is to be clothed thickly the larger quantity is recommended. The land should be rolled before and after sowing the seed. As many kinds of small birds are very fond of Grass Seeds, it may be well to give some protection for a short time till the plants are up. Carefully remove all weeds as soon as they make their appearance, and when the grass has grown a few inches high it should be mown with a scythe, and cut afterwards every ten days till October. A mowing machine should not be used the first season. Frequent Mowing and Rolling are necessary to keep the turf in good order, as a thick bottom grass cannot be procured and maintained without compression by frequent rolling.
