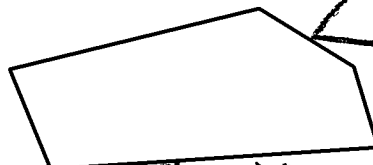

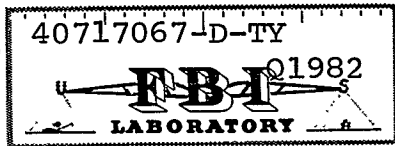

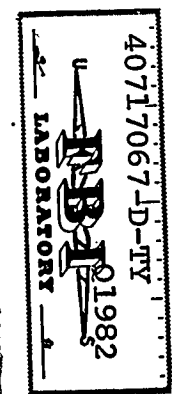

BRIEFING PAPER

This report is to synopsize the investigation and point out ATF involvement with regard to events prior to the confrontation and shooting in Greensboro, North Carolina on November 3, 1979.

This investigation was initiated on October 2, 1978, when ATF received information that an active member of the Ku Klux Klan in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, had an automatic rifle in his possession. It was known at that time that the member was considered a dangerous person by the local police department as a threat to public safety, who had freely shown his automatic rifle at the Klan rallies throughout the South.

ATF does not initiate or conduct investigations on groups or organizations in and of themselves. Individuals are investigated because of specific allegations about them or their propensity to violate laws that are enforced by the Bureau.

On February 10, 1979, the Klan displayed an exhibit in the Forsyth County Library, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Anti demonstrations by the Jewish Defense League (JDL) erupted into violence between the groups. The activity was closely monitored by the Winston-Salem police during the melee, although no arrests were made.

In June 1979, the Winston-Salem police reported that a group called the "White Power Club," a spinoff of the National Socialist Party of America (NSPA), had about 25 members, most of whom carried firearms at their meetings. They were reportedly displaying Nazi flags and armbands.

An ATF undercover operation was initiated on June 8, 1979. Contact between the Charlotte and Cleveland District Office Special Agents in Charge (SAC) coordinated efforts to establish an undercover special agent who would make contact with the NSPA. Information had been received which indicated that several members of the NSPA from North Carolina would be in attendance at a public meeting of NSPA in Parma, Ohio.

On June 23, 1979, ATF special agents met with the Parma, Ohio Police Department to discuss a forthcoming scheduled public demonstration by the NSPA. ATF advised that NSPA storm troopers from Winston-Salem would be present at the meeting and that they were advocates of violence. The Parma Police Department disclosed information that 100 JDL members were to be present to disrupt the meeting.

On June 24, 1979, at approximately 2:15 p.m. the public meeting took place at a wooded area in the vicinity of Parma, Ohio. At that time the undercover special agent

made contact with the NSPA. The rally was subsequently disrupted by fights between the NSPA and JDL members. At approximately 3:45 p.m. the Nazi members regrouped at the Howard Johnson Motel, Independence, Ohio, and were again attacked by the JDL. The undercover agent was instrumental in effecting the escape of the Nazis, thereby gaining their confidence.

On July 29, 1979, the undercover special agent met with a NSPA member who stated that he had as much fire power as would be needed for white supremacy. He said he would be willing to go to jail or die for the cause. He solicited the undercover special agent to join the party. Bombings and burnings of local bi-racial clubs were discussed.

During the interim of September 12-22, 1979, the undercover special agent had repeated contact and conversations with NSPA members in Winston-Salem. On Saturday, September 22, 1979, another rally was held in Raleigh, North Carolina. The undercover special agent was in attendance along with various other NSPA and Klan factions. At this meeting the undercover agent learned that their source of firearms and conversion kits was in Winston-Salem. Headquarters authority was granted to conduct an investigation of this source on November 1, 1979.

During the interim of October 27-31, 1979, the undercover special agent had repeated contact and conversations with the NSPA in Winston-Salem. A member of the NSPA stated that he wanted the undercover special agent to train all storm troopers on the use of explosives and the construction of bombs, and indicated that he would provide real explosives (dynamite and caps).

On November 1, 1979, at approximately 7:00 p.m., the undercover special agent attended a meeting of various Nazi and Klan members. Television station WXII, Winston-Salem, filmed interviews of NSPA officers.

During the meeting, plans were discussed to attend a communist demonstration by the Workers Viewpoint Organization in Greensboro, North Carolina, on Saturday, November 3, 1979. The NSPA and KKK members were to meet in Greensboro at 10:00 a.m., to disrupt the communists who had made threats against the NSPA and the KKK. The undercover special agent did not arrive at the Winston-Salem meeting place until after the group had departed for Greensboro. He did not attend the rally. It was at the demonstration that violence erupted, resulting in the death of five (5) members of the Communist Workers Party.

The Special Agent in Charge, Firearms Branch, began to monitor

the investigation at a point just prior to the undercover special agent's infiltration into the Parma, Ohio NSPA meeting in June 1979. Permission for the undercover special agent's attendance at KKK and NSPA rallies and meetings was granted by the Assistant Director, Criminal Enforcement (ADCE) on a case by case basis after conferences with the Firearms and Charlotte SAC's.

ATF has specific prohibitions against undercover special agents committing violations of the law which are illegal from the very nature of the transaction (malum in se). Undercover operations are closely monitored, and prior authorization must be obtained by the agent to act in a manner which could be in violation of the law. In order for the agent to be effective in his undercover role, he did act out a part, and participate in conversations relative to violations of law (malum prohibitum), however he did not actively participate in the illegal acts themselves.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) was kept apprised of the significant investigation developments as they occurred.

Subsequent to the shooting on November 3, 1979, ATF participated in the investigation to assist the Greensboro Police Department by continued contact of the undercover special agent with the perpetrators in order to identify and locate individuals who had escaped, and conduct traces on the firearms located at the scene.

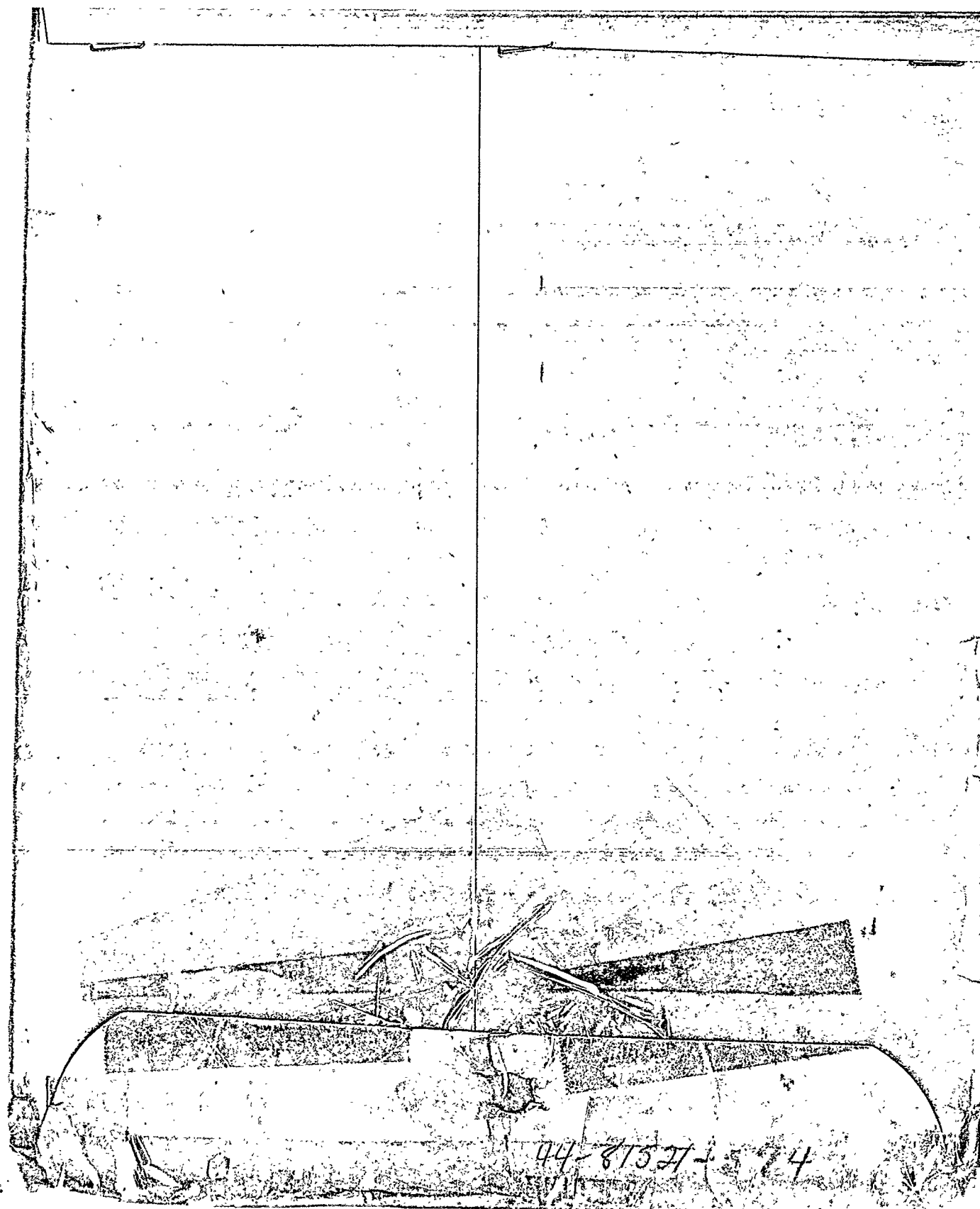

PURPOSE: To provide you with the background of the release of certain FBI documents in response to a subpoena in the captioned litigation, and the subsequent objection by the Civil Rights Division.

RECOMMENDATION: None, for information only.

DETAILS: The captioned suit, which was filed in 1980, arises out of the violent attack by members of the Ku Klux Klan and American Nazi Party against participants in an anti-Klan rally in Greensboro, N.C. on 11/3/79. The complaint charges that various local, state and Federal officials, informants and alleged members of the Klan and the Nazi Party conspired in the attack and in an ensuing cover-up of the alleged official involvement in the attack. At present, thirty-four individuals remain as defendants in the case, including one supervisory Special Agent and two SACs. As we previously advised, you were dismissed from the suit on 6/13/84.

Several Klan and Nazi Party members were the subjects of a lengthy Federal civil rights prosecution which resulted in acquittals on 4/15/84. On 4/17/84 U.S.D.J. ROBERT R. MERHIGE, JR., E.D. Va., sitting by designation, lifted a stay of discovery in

the civil suit which had been continued throughout the period of the criminal prosecution. In addition, he initiated extremely stringent controls over the discovery process designed to bring the case to trial by 10/8/84.

Although plaintiffs had submitted document requests, the dismissal of all Federal agencies and Federal officials in their official capacities by Judge MERHIGE on 4/17/84 forced the plaintiffs to seek FBI documents by subpoena rather than under the provisions of Rules 26 and 34 Fed. R. Civ. P. On 6/25/84, I accepted service as the designee of the Director of a subpoena duces tecum served by plaintiffs requiring the production of a wide range of FBI documents. A copy of that subpoena is attached.

Since that time, the Civil Division, with our assistance, has undertaken to satisfy the plaintiffs' need for relevant FBI documents and to limit their access to privileged or irrelevant materials. The Court has reviewed the parties respective positions and has ruled explicitly on many of the categories of documents sought. The Court has, however, imposed extremely stringent discovery and production deadlines upon us.

It has been the position of the Civil Division that the principal source of information relevant to plaintiffs' remaining allegations should be the Charlotte Field Office file relating to the civil rights investigation which followed the events of 11/3/79 and resulted in the recent criminal trial. Although the Court has indicated that a much larger body of documents must be produced, it agreed that this file, the "Greenkil" file, must be produced.

Attached is a copy of a memorandum from Assistant Attorney General WILLIAM BRADFORD REYNOLDS, Civil Rights Division, to the Associate Attorney General dated 8/20/84 in which it is related that, during the course of the discovery in this case, and without notice to the Civil Rights Division, attorneys in the Civil Division provided plaintiffs with portions of the Greenkil file that should have been objected to and withheld. Among the documents released were some materials subject to the grand jury secrecy provisions of Rule 6(e) Fed. R. Crim. P., one document identifying an individual who had provided information in confidence to the FBI (but who was not an FBI informant) and information referring to, describing or reporting the results of collateral and related investigations which was maintained in the Greenkil file and which the Civil Rights Division asserts are pending investigations.

The document production proceeded in this case under the most stringent of deadlines imposed by the Court and under the direct guidance of the Civil Division attorney assigned to defend our agents. During the period of 6/15/84 to 7/10/84, the date on which we were advised that the complained of materials had been released, more than 10,000 pages of FBI documents were reviewed, redacted and released. The Civil Division attorney, who was generally familiar with the contents of this file, advised that, with the exception of clearly established privileges, the material in the file was relevant to the allegations in the complaint and responsive to the subpoena and subsequent Court orders. Members of the Civil Rights Division asserted at a meeting regarding this matter on 8/7/84 that they had advised the Civil Division attorney before the release that certain information in the file was the subject of ongoing investigative and prosecutive efforts and should be withheld from production. The Civil Division attorney denies that he was so advised and never advised the FBI of this fact.

The release of the material subject to 6(e) protection and the identity of the individual who provided information to us in confidence, both of which are privileged, should have been prevented by the review process, just as we prevented the release of thousands of other such pieces of information. The press of time and the volume of material being reviewed occasionally results in such inadvertent disclosures, but they are the result of human error. We have advised the individual whose identity was inadvertently released that his identity was released in the discovery. He responded that he no longer has any dealings with the individuals about whom he furnished the information and that he is not concerned about the disclosure of his identity.

The release of information pertaining to the other investigations which was contained in the Greenkil file apparently occurred because it was not clear from the files being reviewed that they were pending matters and because of the guidance provided by the Civil Division attorney. It is our practice to consult with the operational FBIHQ division prior to producing information relating to any ongoing investigation. That procedure did not appear necessary in this case because prosecution had been completed in the civil rights investigation (Greenkil) and because it did not appear that any of the materials in the file related to currently pending investigations.

Recently, Mr. REVELL proposed that LCD and CID review the procedures in effect to insure that ongoing investigations are protected from disclosure in civil discovery. Prior to that proposal and prior to the issue in this case, I had ordered a review of our procedures to improve our awareness and control over document releases. Because of the difficulties presented by the filing practice of intermingling references to and results of investigations which are related to one another, the full implications of single documents may not be apparent on their faces. That work is being expedited.

In addition, I have discussed with officials of the Civil Rights Division the need for constant and complete communication between us regarding such cases and have asked that they review all other materials being prepared for production to plaintiffs in this case prior to release. They have agreed to do so and have in fact already reviewed some of the documents presently awaiting production.

No additional FBI action is necessary in regard to the Department, and the discovery in the suit is continuing with Judge MERHIGE personally reviewing records in camera.

Information Memorandum

This Division recently completed an unsuccessful federal criminal civil rights prosecution of nine Ku Klux Klansmen and Nazis for the shootings of anti-Klan demonstrators in Greensboro, N.C., on November 3, 1979. Following the jury's acquittal of the defendants in that criminal prosecution, discovery resumed in a federal civil suit concerning the same matter filed by some of the anti-Klan demonstrators and their survivors, including members of the Communist Worker's Party (CWP). Inter alia, that lawsuit alleged state and federal complicity in the Klan-Nazi shootings, as well as an alleged effort to cover up. Some of the federal defendants, including the Attorney General and the Director of the FBI, were dismissed by order of the district court for the Middle District of North Carolina, but other individual FBI and ATF agents remain as defendants and are being defended by attorneys from the Civil Division.

Recently, the plaintiffs served a subpoena requesting production of the FBI files related to the Greensboro investigation. In response, and without notice to this Division, the Civil Division attorneys provided the plaintiffs with much of the voluminous FBI file, inadvertently including some grand jury or otherwise privileged and confidential materials some of which were arguably irrelevant to the federal civil suit. The materials provided the plaintiffs included information identifying a confidential informant as well as information on two unrelated and still-open criminal investigations. One of those open criminal investigations involved an unauthorized entry into the grand jury by one of the plaintiffs in the civil suit and his attorney. Some of the FBI documents furnished to the plaintiffs about this incident reflect FBI efforts to identify persons within both the Civil Rights Division and ATF who may have leaked a sensitive ATF report on the shooting investigation to the plaintiffs. The FBI documents also set forth leads and listed possible suspects. The other open criminal investigation disclosed to the plaintiffs

through discovery of the FBI files concerned an alleged illegal search by police officers of the residence of a Socialist Workers' Party member in Winston-Salem, N.C.

We are considering, in consultation with the Civil Division and the U.S. Attorney, an application to the U.S. District Court handling the civil suit for an order prohibiting the plaintiffs from disclosing the privileged materials contained in the FBI files furnished them. However, our previous experience with these plaintiffs indicates that they may disclose some of these materials to the press, even if we succeed in obtaining a protective order from the court. In view of this, I am submitting this memorandum to apprise you of the situation.

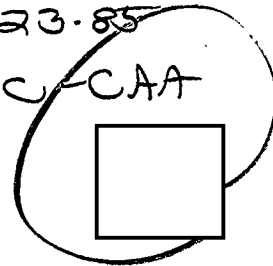

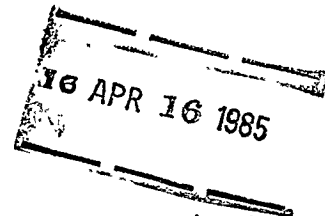

In November, 1979, the Charlotte Office became involved in the GREENKILL investigation of the shootings in Greensboro, North Carolina, which occurred between the Ku Klux Klan and persons associated with the Communist Party. As a result of the investigation, numerous innovative court exhibits were produced by FBIHQ and the private sector.

SA Greensboro, North Carolina, Resident Agency, contacted the Laboratory Division in June, 1986, and advised that the legal proceedings in the case had been completed. The judge subsequently ordered the trial exhibits disposed of or destroyed. SA noted that Charlotte could make these exhibits available to the Laboratory for training purposes.

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A member of Forensic Science Training Unit (FSIU), FBI Academy, met with SA in Greensboro, North Carolina, on 7/28-29/86 to discuss the case and review the exhibits. Due to SA efforts and recommendations, it was determined that the exhibits represent excellent potential for training at the Academy. A majority of these materials were transported to the Academy and will be used on a regular basis.

The members of the FSIU would like to express appreciation for SA assistance in this matter. The materials obtained from the GREENKILL case constitute a valuable and pertinent addition to the FSIU's training program.

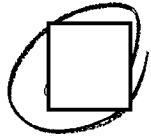

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Reference is made to my memorandum dated May 19, 1982, and previous memoranda in this matter.

In my referenced memorandum, this Division requested that several items of evidence be prepared by the Bureau. To date we have not received two of the three items of evidence, to wit: the still photographs from the video tape and the enhanced audio tapes obtained from BATF. These items are necessary for use in the grand jury and we request that they be completed as soon as practical.

Secondly, reference is made to your report dated July 6, 1982, regarding the submission of 44 audio tapes for duplication.

Those 44 tapes were assigned "Q" numbers 473-516. Previously, other items of evidence submitted in this matter were assigned those same "Q" numbers. (According to our files "Q" numbers 1-1978 have been assigned to items of evidence not including the 44 audio tapes). To avoid confusion we have extensively used the assigned "Q" numbers to identify items of evidence presented to the grand jury. Since the 44 audio tapes as well as the other items of evidence with the same "Q" numbers will be exhibits before the grand jury and may be exhibits in any subsequent legal proceedings, we would like to avoid the potential for confusion occasioned by having two different items assigned the same "Q" number. Accordingly, we request that the 44 audio tapes be reassigned "Q" numbers consistent with previously assigned "Q" numbers. In preparation for the trial in this case, please make the following arrangements to facilitate modifications to wound charts and photographic identification boards which are to be used as demonstrative exhibits in the Government's case-in-chief.

1. Arrange for Special Projects Division, during the week of November 21, 1983, to modify or recreate twelve wound charts to more accurately depict the gunshot wounds received by victims and to create a photographic identification board.

2. Arrange for Engineering Division, during the week of November 21, 1983, to produce approximately twenty still photographs from video tapes.

3. Arrange for Special Agent [Redacted] to travel to Washington, D.C. from November 21 through 23, 1983 to consult with Department attorneys and assist in finalization of demonstrative exhibits.
