Result of examination:

This report supplements the FBI Laboratory report relating to this case dated December 19, 1979. For a detailed listing of the previously submitted weapons, please refer to that report.

No microscopic marks of value for comparison purposes were noted in the following specimens: Q411 through Q422, Q451, Q452, Q485 through Q490, Q492, Q494, Q495, Q498 through Q1035, Q1039, Q1040, Q1045, Q1048 through Q1054, Q1058, Q1061 through Q1077, Q1079, Q1081 through Q1374, Q1376 through Q1417, Q1419 through Q1537 and Q1546 through Q1949. The absence of microscopic marks in the above-listed specimens precludes their association with any of the previously submitted weapons.

The firing pin impression in the Q423 cartridge was identified as having been produced by the K6 derringer. The Q424 cartridge case was identified as having been fired in K6.

Specimens Q425 through Q450 are 5.56mm (.223 Remington caliber) cartridges of both commercial and military manufacture. These cartridges bear extractor and ejector marks. However, the microscopic characteristics present in these marks could not be associated with either of the previously submitted K46 and K15 weapons.

The following specimens bear limited microscopic marks of value for comparison purposes; however, they could not be asso-

ciated with each other or with any of the previously submitted weapons: Q453, Q496, Q497, Q1041, Q1042, Q1055, Q1375, Q1418 and Q1545. The Q454 through Q457 shotshell and the previously submitted Q251 shotshell casing were identified as having been loaded into, extracted and ejected from the same shotgun. It is noted that the previously submitted Q251 shotshell casing was identified as having been fired in the K7 shotgun.

The Q458, Q483 and Q484 metal fragments are too mutilated to determine their source(s) and bear no microscopic marks of value for comparison purposes.

Based on weight, specimen Q459 appears to be a mutilated 00 Buck shot pellet fragment.

The FBI Laboratory maintains no data or records which would identify the source of the Q469 tag.

Twenty-two lead shot pellet fragments were removed from the Q475 through Q481 fence posts. These fragments are too mutilated to determine their original size(s).

Specimen Q482 is a .25 Auto caliber cartridge case of Remington-Peters manufacture. Based on differences in breechface marks and firing pin impressions, it was determined that Q482 could not have been fired in the previously submitted K22 pistol.

The Q491 and Q493 shotshells were identified as having been loaded into, extracted and ejected from a single weapon. However, the microscopic marks utilized in identifying specimens Q491 and Q493 with each other could not be identified with any of the previously submitted shotguns.

The Q1036 through Q1038, Q1043, Q1044, Q1046, Q1047, Q1056, Q1057, Q1059 and Q1060 shotshells were identified as having been loaded into, extracted and ejected from the K8 shotgun.

Specimens Q1078 and Q1080 are .30-30 Winchester caliber cartridges which were identified as having been loaded into, extracted and ejected from a single weapon. It is noted that no .30-30 Winchester caliber weapons have been submitted to the FBI Laboratory in this case.

Specimens Q1541 through Q1544 are .30-30 Winchester caliber cartridge cases which were identified as having been fired in a single weapon. The extractor marks present in the Q1541

through Q1544 cartridge cases are different from the extractor marks in the Q1078 and Q1080 cartridges.

No microscopic marks were noted in any of the submitted ammunition or ammunition components which could be associated with the Q1538 through Q1540 magazines.

No conclusion could be reached when comparing the individual, or jacket, depicted in the Q472 through Q474 photographs with the suspect wearing a denim style jacket depicted in the Qc475 through Qc477 photographs. Insufficient views and the lack of visible identifying characteristics prevented any determination.

It was determined that the Q460 leather jacket is the same style as the jacket worn by the suspect depicted in the Qc475 through Qc477 photographs who is holding a club and shown standing at the rear of a vehicle. One significant characteristic was noted which indicates that Q460 may be the same jacket.

Due to the lack of visible individual identifying characteristics, no conclusion could be reached as to whether Q471 is or is not identical with a similar looking item depicted in the Qc475 through Qc477 photographs.

While the general visible characteristics of the sawed-off shotgun depicted in the Qc475 through Qc477 photographs are similar to those of the K13 shotgun, a positive conclusion could not be reached due to the lack of visible identifying marks.

Nothing else of significance was noted. A photomontage is being furnished for your assistance.

The remaining requested examinations are continuing and you will be subsequently advised of the results and as to the disposition of the submitted items.

All positive results of examination are set forth above. Any other grouping tests which may have been conducted on these specimens were inconclusive.

Group "B" human blood was identified on specimens Q104, Q105, Q107 and Q305. Group "A" human blood was identified on specimens Q107 and Q109. Group "O" human blood was identified on specimen Q305. Grouping tests conducted on the human blood identified on specimens Q18 and Q108 were inconclusive. No blood was found on specimens Q3 through Q15, Q19 through Q22, Q24 through Q47, Q49 through Q85, Q87 through Q103 or Q112.

The Instrumental examinations are continuing and you will be subsequently advised of the results and as to the disposition of the submitted items.

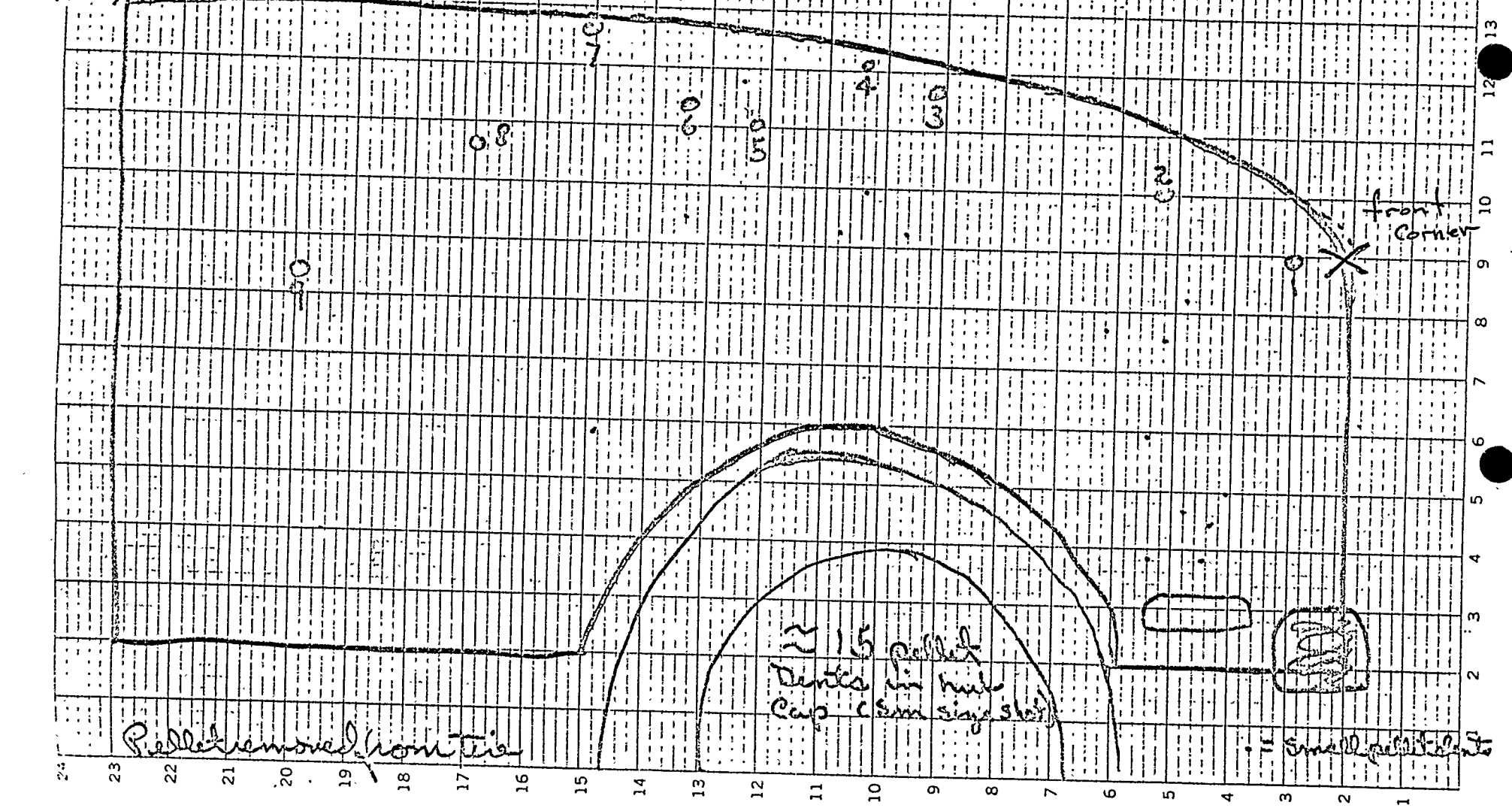

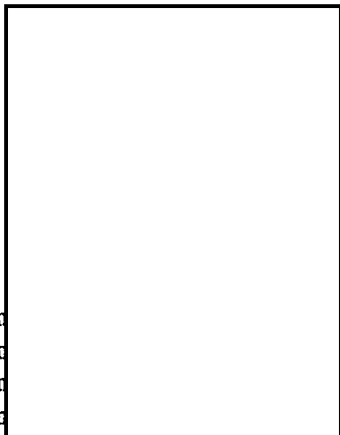

On November 3, 1979 Reporting Agent received a telephone call from Special Agent [REDACTED] requesting that the Firearms Unit assist in a crime scene investigation in Greensboro, North Carolina.

Reporting Agent and Special Agent [REDACTED] traveled to Greensboro, N. C., on November 4, 1979 and met with Special Agent [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of the Greensboro Police Department's Lab.

The crime scene consisted of three (3) vehicles that were involved in a shooting.

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Vehicle #1 was a gold colored Ford van, N.C. license # [REDACTED]

On the passenger side of the cargo door was a graze mark caused by a small caliber bullet or possibly a buckshot pellet. This graze mark had a small amount of metal deposited in it. This metal deposit is similar in appearance to lead. No other bullet holes, dents or other firearms related evidence was recovered.

Vehicle #2 was a Ford Sport Custom pickup truck, green and white in color with N.C. license [REDACTED], and a black and white cab high camper shell.

The driver's side bottom window of the camper shell was partially missing. The remaining portion of window contained a bullet hole that corresponded to holes in the camper screen and window. Examination of the line formed by these three holes and the window glass reveals that the projectile causing these holes traveled from the rear of the camper, through the open door of the camper, through the curtain and screen, and exited out of the window.

Removed from the camper was a Martin and Company guitar that contained two (2) small pellet type holes and two (2) pellet type impressions in the upper side and two (2) holes in the lower side with a damaged area on the top. Two (2) small lead pellets were recovered from the inside of the guitar and blood stains are being preserved in the event blood typing is necessary. The two (2) pellets from the guitar are consistent in weight to number six (6) shot pellets.

Vehicle #3 was a Ford Fairmont white station wagon, N.C. license # [redacted]

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The driver's side exterior of the station wagon had no signs of damage except for the rear door window. The passenger's side front fender, wheel and hubcap were damaged. The passenger side front fender had nine (9) areas that appeared to have been struck by buckshot and numerous areas that appeared to have been struck by birdshot size pellets. The passenger side front tire was flat and the hubcap had approximately fifteen (15) dents that appear to have been caused by birdshot size pellets. Five (5) pellets were removed from the passenger side front tire. These pellets are consistent in weight to known number six (6) shot pellets. The rear passenger door and quarter panel on the passenger side had twenty-three (23) holes or dents that appeared to have been caused by buckshot pellets.

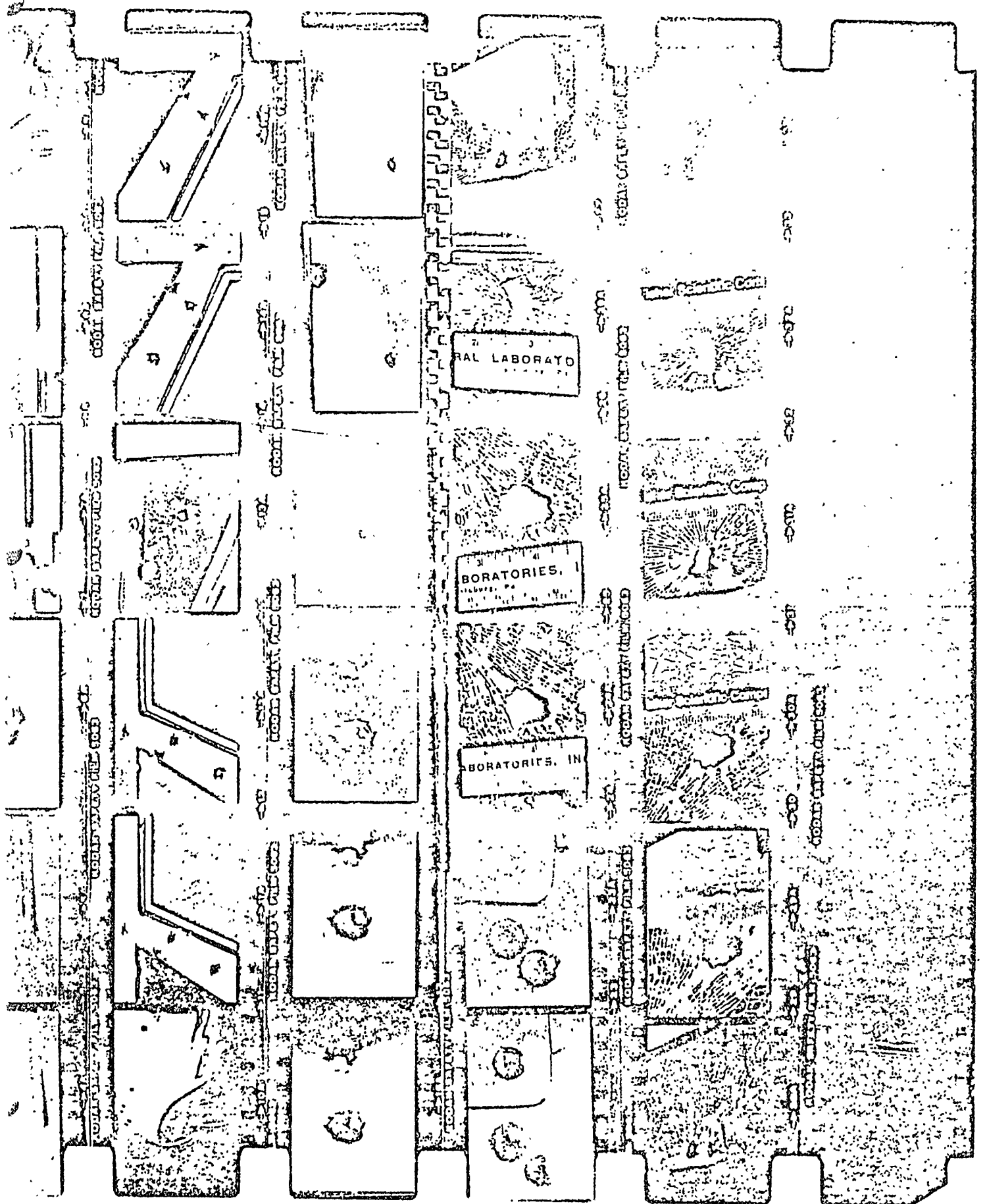
The small vent window on the rear passenger side door had three (3) holes in it. These holes were caused by pellets moving from the outside to the inside. Six (6) lead pellets or lead fragments were recovered from the rear portion of the station wagon. Two (2) of the pellets are consistent in weight to known OO Buck shot pellets. The remaining fragments are too deformed to determine their shot size.

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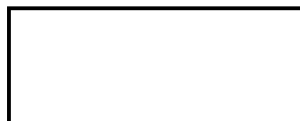

At that time, the vehicle was known to contain the suspects which participated in the shooting and several weapons.

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Detective [redacted] advised Reporting Agent that he had in his possession a Search Warrant for this vehicle, and for the residence of [redacted] the owner of the vehicle.

The applicant swears to the following facts to establish probable cause for the issuance of a search warrant: Shortly after 11:00 a.m. on November 3, 1979, several persons were fatally wounded by firearms near the intersection of Everitte Street and Carver Street Greensboro, North Carolina. The Greensboro Police Department has identified some of the victims as James Michael Waller, Cesar V. Cauce and Sandy Smith. This homicide is being investigated by the Greensboro Police Department, noted as Case No. 790145368.

This affiant has determined that persons from the news media were present at the scene of the fatal shootings and photographed and filmed several vehicles present and the affiant obtained these photographs which also have appeared in several editions of the Greensboro News and the videofilm which has been presented on the Channel 2 television news coverage, Monday, November 3, 1979. Photostat copies of some of these photographs are attached to this application and numbered G.P.D. #1 through #3.

On or about November 5, 1979, one [redacted] of [redacted] Street, Greensboro came to the Greensboro Police Department on his own initiative and advised the affiant that [redacted] had been near the laundromat near the intersection of Everitte Street and Carver Drive before 11:00 a.m. November 3rd and that he observed three or four cars near that intersection. He stated that of these vehicles, one was an older model Ford Fairlane, model early 1960's, containing several white males. [redacted] further stated that he observed white males exit from the vehicle and begin firing weapons, at least one being an automatic toward a vehicle which appeared to be owned by a television station. 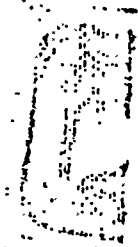

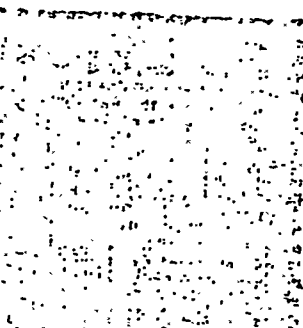


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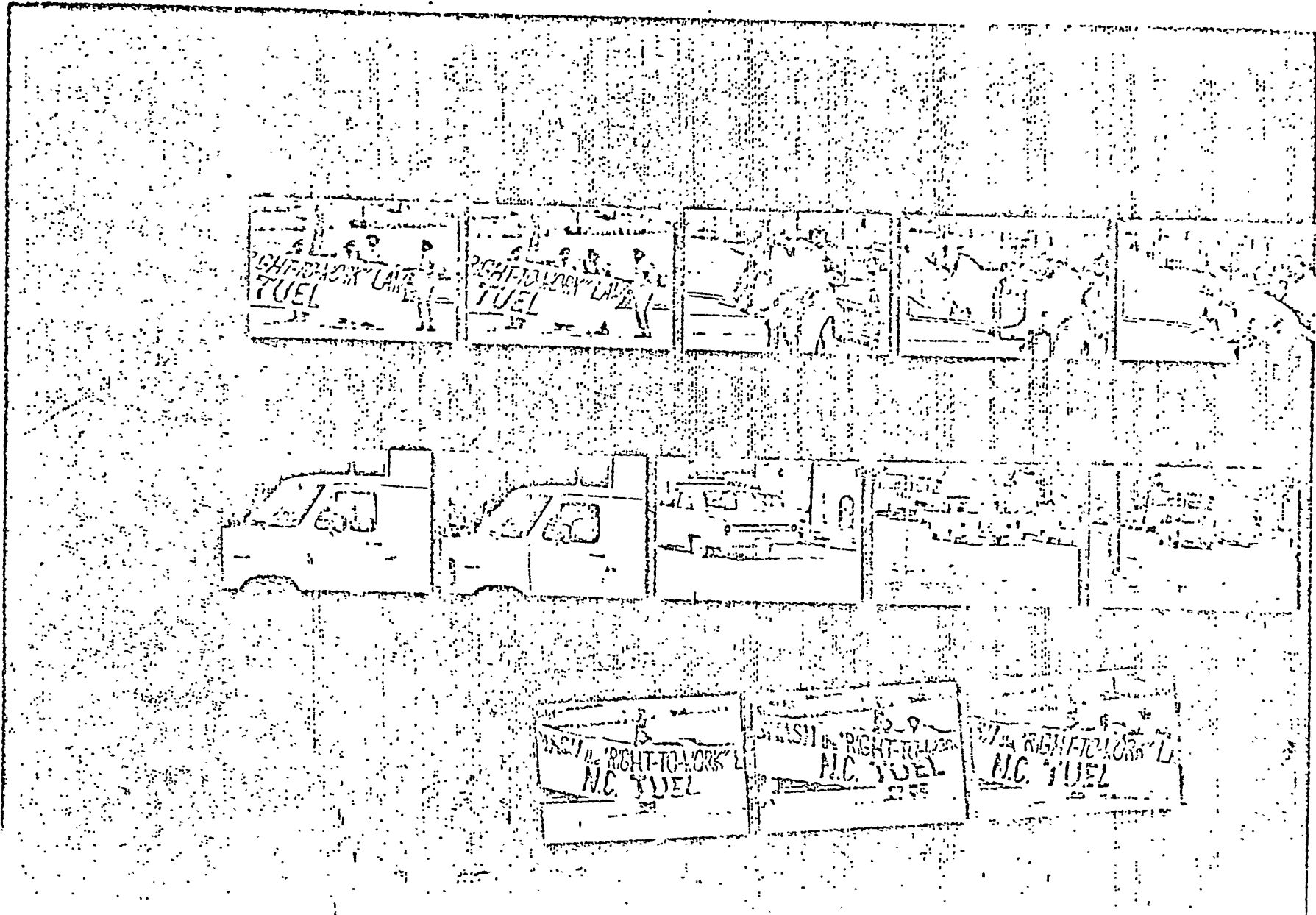
