### WRECK STATISTICS FOR 1898.

---

The statistical summary of vessels totally lost, condemned, &c., now published by Lloyd's Register, shows that, during 1898, the gross reduction in the effective mercantile marine of the world amounted to 1,141 vessels of 820,725 tons, excluding all vessels of less than 100 tons. Of this total, 322 vessels of 463,241 tons were steamers, and 819 of 357,484 tons were sailing vessels. As regards steamers, the present return exceeds the average of the preceding seven years by 56 vessels and 135,257 tons; as regards sailing vessels it is below the average by 31 vessels and 28,551 tons. Similarly, the figures relating to steam tonnage owned in the United Kingdom are above the average, while those relating to sailing vessels are below. The excess in the case of steamers follows upon the great increase during recent years in the amount of steam tonnage afloat, and is partly attributable also to the amount of tonnage broken up, condemned, &c. Apart from cases which come within this latter category, the United Kingdom steam tonnage lost during 1898 exceeds the average of the preceding seven years by about 25,000 tons, while the tonnage owned has increased since 1891 by nearly 2½ million tons.

The summary exhibits interesting data as to the relative frequency of the different kinds of casualty, &c., which conclude the existence of vessels. Strandings and kindred casualties which are comprised under the term "wrecked," are much the most prolific cause of disaster. To such casualties are attributable 42 per cent. of the losses of steamers and 47 per cent. of the losses of sailing vessels. The next most frequent termination of a vessel's career is by condemnation, dismantling, &c.; about 20 per cent. of the vessels removed from the merchant fleets of the world are accounted for in this manner. Of the remaining causes of loss, collision is the most general for steamers (15 per cent.), and abandonment at sea for sailing vessels (10 per cent.). The percentages just given are based on the present return alone, but the order of frequency of the several classes of casualty appears to be normal. Cases of abandoned, foundered, and missing vessels may perhaps be regarded as frequently more or less similar in the circumstances of loss. If these be taken collectively, they comprehend 16 per cent. of the losses of steamers and 24 per cent. of the losses of sailing vessels.

The return has been compiled by Lloyd's Register in such a manner as to enable a comparison to be made between the percentages of loss suffered by each of the principal merchant navies in the world. Great as the absolute annual loss of vessels belonging to the United Kingdom appears to be, it is seen to form a very moderate percentage of the mercantile marine of the country, and to compare favourably with the losses sustained by other leading maritime countries. The merchant navies which exceed a total of 1,000,000 tons are those of the United Kingdom, the British Colonies, the United States of America, France, Germany, and Norway. Of these countries, the United Kingdom shows the smallest percentage of loss, viz.: 2·4 per cent. of the vessels owned; the Colonies follow with 3·95 per cent.; and Norway is the highest with 7·36 per cent. As regards steamers, while the percentage for the United Kingdom stands at 2·05, the average of the percentages of loss for the other five countries is 2·58. For sailing vessels, the other five countries show an average percentage of 7·24 as compared with 3·45 per cent. for the United Kingdom.

NOTE:—This Summary is based upon the quarterly returns of total losses, &c., which have been published by Lloyd's Register. It includes, however, vessels which had not been given up as total losses, or of the loss of which information had not been received, when the returns for the quarters in which they respectively occurred were compiled. On the other hand, a few vessels which, being definitely considered as total losses at the respective dates of compilation, were included in the quarterly returns, have since been floated, repaired, &c., and are accordingly now excluded from the statistics given herein. Particulars of all such additions to, and deductions from, the quarterly returns are given on pages 5 to 8.

A distinguishing feature of the Wreck Returns published by Lloyd's Register is that, except as stated in the footnotes to Table No. 1, they are compiled strictly according to the dates at which the casualties resulting in total loss actually *occurred*, and not according to the dates at which *reports* of casualties were *received*.
