SUMMARY OF TOTAL LOSSES DURING 1967

Summary. The total tonnage lost by the world fleet during 1967, 832,803 tons gross, was 10,265 tons more than during 1966 and was the highest peacetime figure ever recorded. It was almost three times the tonnage lost during 1959 whilst the number of ships was almost double. Nearly every category of casualty has shown a decrease compared with the previous year except for ships which were wrecked.

Foundered and Missing. A record number of ships (87) foundered during 1967 although the tonnage lost was 35,393 tons less than the record figure of 1966. The largest ship lost was the Italian oil tanker "GIORGIO FASSIO" of 12,618 tons gross.

Tonnage under the heading "Missing" increased by 21,931 tons during the year. (When making comparisons in this category it should be borne in mind that many of these ships probably foundered.)

Burnt. Tonnage totally lost through fire during 1967 showed a considerable decrease of 109,508 tons compared with the previous year's record figure and is the lowest figure since 1964. The number of ships lost was also less than in 1966.

The largest ship lost was the Dutch bulk carrier "JACOB VEROLME" of 18,734 tons gross which capsized after an explosion and was deliberately sunk after floating upside down for six weeks.

Total losses through fire during 1967 included only four oil tankers.

Collision. Tonnage lost through collision was 42,763 tons less than the previous year's record peacetime figure. The number of ships lost was also less than in 1966.

The largest ship lost was the Italian general cargo ship "GIACINTO MOTTA" of 11,267 tons gross.

Wrecked. Tonnage lost through stranding, or striking rocks, sunken wrecks, etc., during 1967 was a record, being 188,469 tons more than during 1966 and 97,981 tons more than the previous highest in 1965. The number of ships wrecked (146) was the highest since 1940.

The largest ship wrecked was the Liberian oil tanker "TORREY CANYON" of 61,263 tons gross. An interesting loss in this category was the Swedish oil tanker "CADDY" of 213 tons gross. Built of iron in 1855, the "CADDY" must have been one of the oldest ships in service.

Lost. Under this heading are included total losses which for want of sufficient information, or for other reasons, cannot be classified. The 1967 figure comprises six small ships of 2,016 tons.

Types. The total number of 337 ships lost during 1967 included 16 oil tankers and 65 fishing craft. Twenty-six of the ships lost were known to be carrying ore and 19 were transporting cement. Fifteen of these ships foundered.

Thirty-eight ships were known to be in ballast.

Size. Exactly half of the ships lost were under 500 tons gross. The second largest group was that between 6,000 and 8,000 tons in which 34 of the 42 ships were built between 1940 and 1945 inclusive.

Broken Up, etc. Tonnage scrapped during 1967 was the highest figure ever recorded. At 3,865,393 tons the total was 1,286,936 tons more than that broken up during 1966 and 138,775 tons more than the previous highest in 1961.

Countries sending most tonnage to the breakers were the United States of America (939,194 tons), Liberia (536,647 tons), Greece (514,747 tons), Panama (419,387 tons), Great Britain & Northern Ireland (380,046 tons) and Lebanon (131,636 tons). Twenty-two per cent of the Lebanese fleet was broken up whilst other high proportions were recorded for Hong Kong (9.7 per cent), Panama (8.8 per cent), Greece (6.9 per cent), Yugoslavia (5.6 per cent), Turkey (4.8 per cent) and the United States of America (4.6 per cent).

Countries which constituted the main centres of disposal for scrap were the United States of America (843,501 tons), Japan (795,720 tons), China (Taiwan) (739,462 tons), Spain (413,383 tons), Italy (264,668 tons), the People's Republic of China (201,718 tons) and Hong Kong (150,023 tons).

The 6,000-8,000 ton ship, and almost exclusively the standard type of cargo ship built during the Second World War, continued to provide the major share of scrap whilst notable ships which found their way to the breakers or were withdrawn from service permanently included "CAPETOWN CASTLE" (27,002 tons), "ARKADIA" (16,700 tons), "LEJEUNE" (16,662 tons), and "DUNERA" (12,620 tons). The oldest ship scrapped was the Spanish iron steamship "ARNAO" (221 tons) which was built in 1873.
