SUMMARY OF TOTAL LOSSES DURING 1968

Summary. The total tonnage lost by the world fleet during 1968, 760,447 tons gross, was 72,356 tons less than during 1967 and is the lowest figure since 1965; this is the first decrease since 1959. The number of ships lost (326) was less than the previous year and shows the first fall for four years.

Foundered and Missing. A record number of ships (91) foundered during 1968 and the tonnage increased by 13,126 tons. The largest ship lost was the Liberian oil tanker "WORLD GLORY" of 28,323 tons gross. Another notable loss in this category was that of the Russian cargo ship "VELIKIYE USTYUG" which was barely three years old.

Tonnage under the heading "Missing" decreased by 12,369 tons during the year, but included the Liberian cargo ship "ITHACA ISLAND" of 7,426 tons gross which was last heard of in the North Atlantic. (When making comparisons in this category it should be borne in mind that many of these ships probably foundered.)

Burnt. Tonnage totally lost through fire during 1968 showed an increase of 28,924 tons compared with the previous year. The number of ships lost was also more than in 1967, and the second highest figure on record.

The largest ship lost was the Norwegian oil tanker "SITAKUND" of 15,567 tons gross which was beached off Beachy Head following a series of violent explosions. Probably the most serious fire loss occurred when three Argentine oil tankers sank after fire had spread from one ship to the others whilst in port.

Total losses through fire during 1968 included only eight oil tankers.

Collision. Tonnage lost through collision was only 1,093 tons less than the previous year's figure. The number of ships lost, however, was the lowest since 1962.

The largest ship lost was the Liberian oil tanker "MANDOIL II" of 25,313 tons gross.

Wrecked. Tonnage lost through stranding, or striking rocks, sunken wrecks, etc., during 1968 was well down on the previous year's record figure, showing a decrease of 105,681 tons. The number of ships wrecked (142) was only four fewer than in 1967.

The largest ship wrecked was the Liberian oil tanker "OCEAN EAGLE" of 12,065 tons gross. Also in this category was the iron motorship "ISABELLA BALDWIN" of 292 tons gross, built in 1883 and the oldest ship lost during the year.

Lost. Under this heading are included total losses which for want of sufficient information, or for other reasons, cannot be classified. The 1968 figure comprises ten ships of 6,753 tons.

Types. The total number of 326 ships lost during 1968 included 24 oil tankers totalling 212,842 tons gross and 67 fishing craft. Nineteen of the ships lost were known to be carrying timber cargoes.

Thirty-one ships were known to be in ballast.

Size. Almost half of the ships lost were under 500 tons gross whilst there was a comparative fall in the number of ships between 6,000 and 8,000 tons compared with 1967.

Age. Eight per cent of all ships lost were less than five years old; 36 per cent were over twenty-five years of age.

Lebanon continues to head the list with Argentina closely behind. Considerable improvements are shown for Hong Kong and Italy.

Broken Up, etc. Tonnage scrapped during 1968 was the second highest figure ever recorded; at 3,747,052 tons the total was 118,341 tons less than the record figure broken up during 1967. The number of ships involved (866) was only sixteen ships less than the record figure scrapped in 1961.

Countries sending most tonnage to the breakers were the United States of America (712,791 tons), Liberia (570,600 tons), Panama (389,155 tons), Greece (386,624 tons) and Great Britain & Northern Ireland (382,721 tons). Twenty-nine per cent of the Lebanese fleet was broken up whilst other high proportions were recorded for Cyprus (17.4 per cent), China (Taiwan) (13.5 per cent), Panama (7.6 per cent), Greece (5.2 per cent), Turkey (5.1 per cent) and Canada (4.3 per cent).

The 6,000–8,000 ton ship, and almost exclusively the standard type of cargo ship built during the Second World War, continued to provide the major share of scrap; tanker tonnage amounted to 374,182 tons. Notable ships which found their way to the breakers or were withdrawn from service permanently included "QUEEN MARY" (81,237 tons), "RHODESIA CASTLE" (17,038 tons), "ROMA" (14,976 tons), "RUYS" (14,304 tons), "TEGELBERG" (14,300 tons), "BOISSEVAIN" (14,285 tons) and "DEVONIA" (12,795 tons). Also scrapped was the "VOLSELLA" (18,915 tons—built 1950) the largest post-war built oil tanker yet broken up. The oldest ship scrapped was the Spanish steamship "ENRIQUES MAYNES" (956 tons) which was built in 1875.

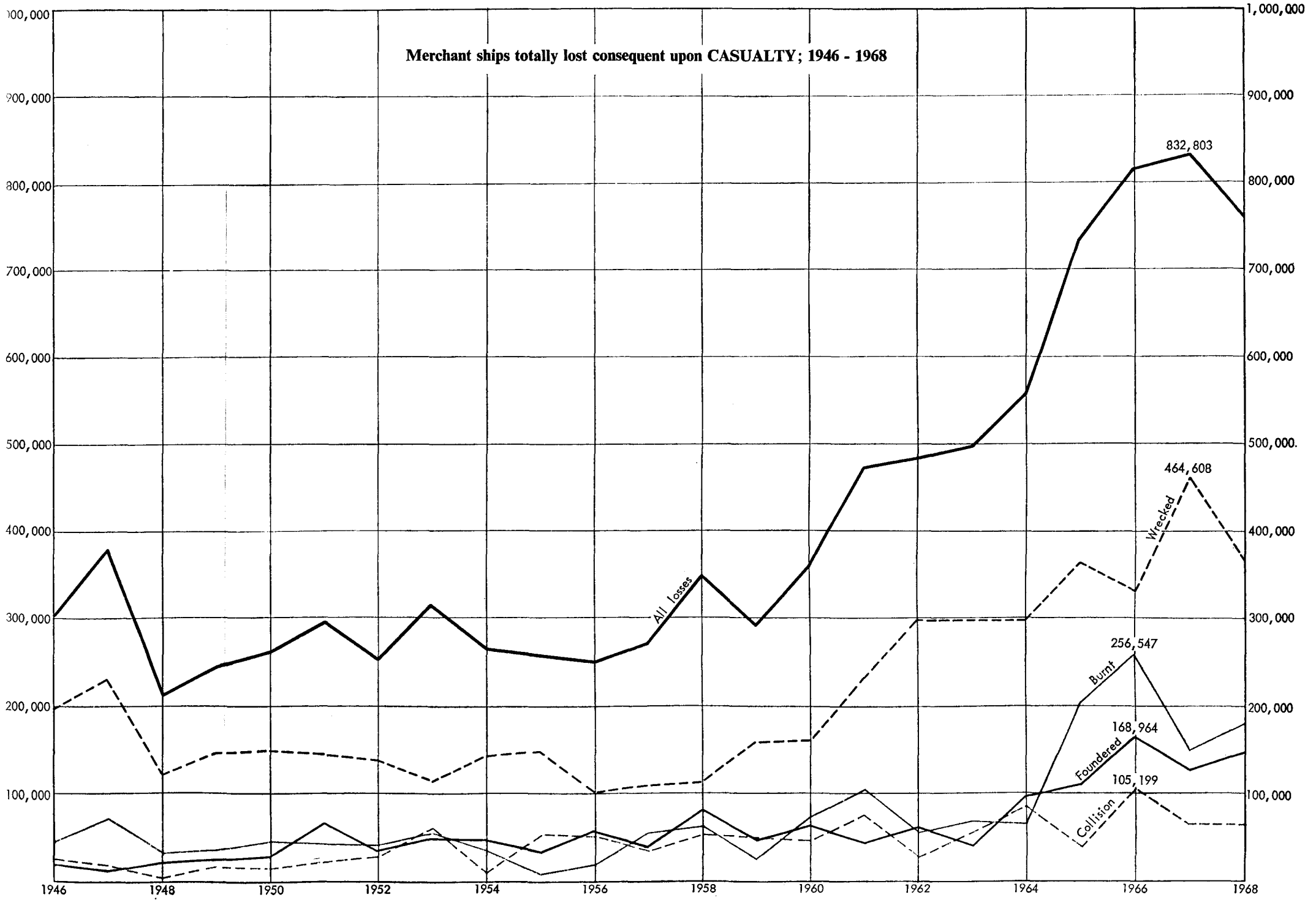
