SUMMARY OF TOTAL LOSSES DURING 1971

Summary. The total tonnage lost by the world fleet during 1971, 1,030,560 tons gross, was 417,941 tons more than during 1970 and is the highest figure since records were first kept in 1891. The number of ships lost (377) is the highest peacetime figure ever recorded. Seventy-eight ships, mostly small craft, were under the Japanese flag.

Foundered. The number of ships (129) which foundered during 1971 was only eleven short of 1970's record figure. Tonnage lost was 54,077 tons less and the second highest figure recorded.

The largest ship lost was the American tanker "TEXACO OKLAHOMA" of 20,084 tons gross, built in 1958 and which broke in two and sank in heavy weather.

Burnt. Tonnage totally lost through fire during 1971 showed an increase of 140,563 tons from the previous year. The number of ships lost (56) was marginally short of last year's record figure. Four tankers over 12,000 tons gross were lost including the Norwegian vessel "FERNCastle" of 52,510, the largest ship lost during the year.

Total losses through fire during 1971 included nine oil tankers; 14 ships were burnt out whilst in port.

Collision. Tonnage lost through collision showed an increase of 35,545 tons from the previous year's figure, to a total of 83,977 tons. Three more ships were lost than during 1970.

The largest ship lost was the Greek cargo ship "CASTOR" of 10,494 tons gross.

Wrecked. Tonnage lost through stranding or striking rocks, sunken wrecks, etc., during 1971 almost doubled as compared with 1970 to a figure of 433,215 tons, the highest since 1967. The number of ships lost was 121, twenty-eight more than during the previous year.

The largest ship wrecked was the Norwegian oil tanker "CERNO" of 48,267 tons gross. Also in this category was the suction dredger "UFFE" of 342 tons gross, built in 1895, and the oldest ship lost during the year.

Lost. Under this heading are included total losses which for want of sufficient information, or for other reasons, cannot be classified. The 1971 figure comprises 21 ships of 82,688 tons, thirteen of which were the victims of hostilities in Indo-Pakistani or Vietnam waters.

Distribution. The geographical distribution of the total losses during the year is shown in map form on pages 74 to 77.

Types. The total number of 377 ships lost during 1971 included 22 oil tankers totalling 328,336 tons gross (31·9 per cent) and 73 fishing craft. Thirty-nine ships were known to be in ballast. Two hundred and forty-nine general cargo ships were lost.

Size. Sixty-one per cent of the ships lost were under 500 tons gross whilst the number of ships lost over 10,000 tons gross increased from 15 in 1969 to 23 in 1971. A significant increase in losses occurred in the 6,000 — 10,000 tons range where 37 vessels were lost as compared with 13 the previous year.

Age. Thirteen per cent of all ships lost were less than five years old; 23 per cent were over twenty-five years of age.

Registration. The following principal maritime countries suffered the heaviest losses and are shown with the percentage of their tonnage owned compared with 1970.

Lebanon heads the list for the tenth time in the last thirteen years.

BROKEN UP, ETC.

The total tonnage broken up during 1971 (4,266,007 tons) is the second successive decrease from 1969's record figure; the war-built tonnage laid up in America continues to provide the bulk of scrap. As yet there has been no significant increase in tonnage scrapped under 20 years old.

Countries sending most tonnage to the breakers were the United States of America (1,758,577 tons), Great Britain & Northern Ireland (484,710 tons) and Panama (334,220 tons). Almost 20 per cent of the Lebanese fleet was broken up whilst other high proportions were recorded for Cyprus (16·6 per cent), the United States of America (10·8 per cent) and Panama (5·3 per cent).

Tanker tonnage disposed of amounted to 268,698 tons or 6·3 per cent of the total. The largest ship scrapped during the year was the passenger liner "ANDES" (25,895 tons); also broken up was "CONTAINER FORWARDER" (15,462 tons), which was converted in 1967 from an ore carrier for the specialized carriage of containers.

The oldest ship broken up during the year was the Italian iron motorship "ANGELO COSTANZO" (228 tons) which was built in 1885.
