COLLECTOR'S CORNER

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GRENADA CELEBRATES NEW POSTAL UNION HO

GRENADA, B.W.I., recently issued a set of four stamps in honor of the inauguration of the new Headquarters Building of the Universal Postal Union (U.P.U.) in Bern, Switzerland. Many other countries are releasing one or more stamps for this event; however, this particular set is unique in the fact that it features not only the new building and U.P.U. emblem, but also significant themes and personalities connected with postal history.

The 15¢ value bears the emblem surrounded by historic postal conveyances. The first mail service by water occurred in 1633, the first mail coach was used in 1784 and the first by rail in 1833. The 25¢ value depicts modern postal conveyances — jet plane, modern steam ship and diesel train. The 50¢ value carries a portrait of Sir Rowland Hill (1795-1879), English administrator and teacher who originated the penny postage stamp.



The \$1.00 value shows Abraham Lincoln (1809-1865), the 16th American President who in one way was the father of the U.P.U. It was during his administration that the first step for postal reform was taken in the United States and for postal regulations throughout the world. In 1862 he suggested a conference for the purpose of improving and simplifying international postal regulations. After his death the conference was held in Bern, Switzerland resulting in the International Postal Conference but in 1878 the name was changed to the Universal Postal Union.

COINS and MEDALS

TEMPLARS OF JAFFA TOKENS

During the 19th century German Protestants broke away from their church and, led by Christoff Hoffmann, formed the "Templegesellschaft." They moved to the Holy Land to lead a way of life in the Biblical tradition. As of 1867, hundreds settled in Jerusalem, Jaffa, Haifa as well as settling their own farms. They were self-sufficient, created their own life but still kept close links with Germany. They were deported by the British in World War II.

Their coins were known as 'Templars'. Prior to 1888, only square tokens of one piaster denominations were minted. Later, ½, ¼ and ½ piaster were coined. These coins are extremely rare. Recently one sold for \$140, another for \$300.

MACARTHUR'S RETURN TO THE PHILIPPINES

With the announcement of a commemorative stamp to honor General Douglas MacArthur, comes the announcement by Presidential Art Medals, Inc., Englewood, Ohio, of a medal commemorating his landing on Luzon, the Philippines, January 9, 1945, during World War II. This is the 22nd in a series begun in 1965 by the Englewood firm.

A portrait of General MacArthur appears on the obverse of the Luzon medal. The reverse scene depicts part of the landing phase in the Philippines.

Luzon capped General MacArthur's threeyear campaign to return to the Philippines following the Japanese invasion of December, 1941.

This medal is produced in both bronze and silver editions, each measuring one and three-quarter inches in diameter. The unlimited bronze sells for \$4.00 each.








































YOUR FUTURE



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As a PHYSICIAN


You will enter the finest and most respected profession in the world, if you choose to be a physician! Working in your own office or in a hospital, you would diagnose diseases and treat people who are ill or injured. You would also be concerned with preventive medicine and with the mental and physical rehabilitation of patients.

Many physicians specialize in internal medicine, surgery, or other fields, while others are general practitioners. Some teach in medical schools or do research. Others combine teaching and private practice.

To be a physician you must have above-average intelligence, have an interest in science, possess good judgment, and be emotionally stable. Above all, you must be dedicated to helping others. Educational requirements are three or four years of college, followed by four years of study in medical school and one year of internship in a hospital. You must also pass a state examination. Specialists require from two to four additional years of study and training.

to four additional years of study and training.

Medical training is costly and arduous, but physicians reap great
personal compensation in their work. And although financial compensation is small at first, their incomes rise rapidly in a few years.





You will be a modern Florence Nightingale and lead a rewarding life filled with great personal satisfaction in caring for others, if you choose to be a nurse! Working in a hospital, you would perform all necessary duties in caring for the sick and injured; help the patients recover physically and emotionally; administer medications and treatments prescribed by physicians; observe, evaluate, and record symptoms and progress of patients; and give instructions to students.

Some nurses work in physicians' offices. Others work in public health, in clinics, or provide nursing care to patients in their homes. Their duties include teaching good health practices. Nurses also work in industry, treating minor injuries or sicknesses. Teaching the arts and skills of nursing and medical research attracts others.

To become a nurse, you must have a desire to help others, be dependable, have good judgment, patience, and be in very good physical and mental health. You must complete a two- or three-year course in an accredited school of nursing and pass a state test for a license.

Registered nurses find a great demand for their skills and services wherever they go, and they command good salaries.
