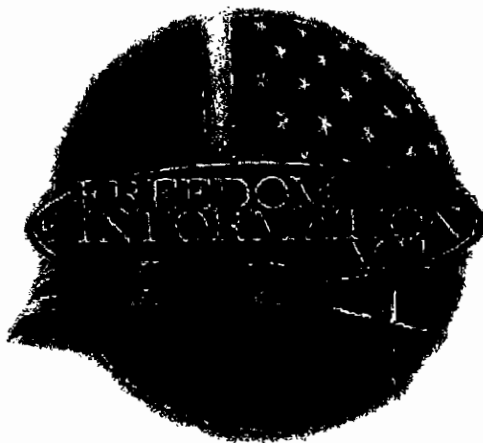

# Urey Slaps at McCarthy in Plea for World Peace

Dr. Harold C. Urey, University of Chicago Nobel prize winner, insists he actually has little regard for the Russians, in spite of the accusations of Sen. McCarthy.

McCarthy has named Urey as one of America's atomic scientists affiliated with Communist-front organizations.

Urey scornfully dismissed McCarthy's accusations Tuesday night during a talk at a meeting of the International Committee for Human Rights at the Covenant Club.

"That's a subject beneath contempt," he said.

INSTEAD HE renewed an oft-repeated plea for a "united community of Western nations" as

the only possible channel for peace.

"There is no solution for quarrels between individuals and groups except government," he said.

"We should start with the Atlantic governments where we have similarity of personality and tradition," he said in urging a first step toward "what must come eventually."

UREY EXPRESSED a hope that the destruction of Russia

will come from within the USSR itself.

He based that hope on the increasing fear of Russia that one finds the "nearer you get to the USSR."

"Perhaps the burden of overthrowing the tyranny of that country will be taken by the people most concerned—those behind the Iron Curtain," he said.

AS FOR THE atomic bomb, which he helped to develop, "If we could possibly get rid of the darn thing, I'd be glad of it," he said.

"I believe Russia has hesitated to take all of Western Europe only because of fear of the atom bomb.

"That is the only good thing I can say about it," Urey said.

But that illustrates the only way to peace, even if it is precarious, he said.

"We can have peace only by persuading the leaders of the Kremlin that one false move would end in disaster," he declared.

# Aid People Of Russia, Urey Urges

The Iron Curtain of Russia is diagnosed by Dr. Harold C. Urey as something less than a high grade of steel "through which there are many loop-holes."

This qualitative analysis was made by the Nobel prize-winning chemist Friday night in his talk before the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

The society is in its annual convention at the Stevens hotel.

Dr. Urey urged giving help in every way to the people of Russia behind that Iron Curtain.

"I distinguish completely between the totalitarian government of Russia and its people," he said.

"The oppressed people of Russia may do more with our help in the future to correct the situation than we could do from the outside," Urey declared.

UREY, a distinguished service professor in the Institute of Nuclear Studies at the University of Chicago, focused his attention on a favorite topic—union of the Atlantic community nations.

He urged that security and economy of defense would be gained by a "federal union of governments over and above the Atlantic democracies."

At the Friday night dinner Mrs. Alben Barkley, wife of the Vice-President, was awarded a certificate of appreciation for her work in behalf of crippled children.

# Urey Wins Phi Beta Kappa's Service Award

Dr. Harold C. Urey, the Nobel Prize winning atomic scientist, has won the Phi Beta Kappa distinguished service award for the year.

He was chosen 1950 winner by unanimous vote of the honorary fraternity's award board, Dr. Louis L. Mann, Chicago area chapter president, announced Tuesday.

The award will be presented at a dinner Dec. 8 at the Chicago Bar Assn.

Urey, University of Chicago professor, is credited with the discovery of "heavy water," a scientific contribution that led to the development of atomic energy.

The Phi Beta Kappa award is not being given for his scientific efforts, but for his work in "pointing out the political implications of atomic energy," in speeches and articles throughout 1950.

Dr. Mann, spiritual director of

Sinai Temple, cited Urey's tireless activities in hammering home "the tremendous need for a political awakening all over the world to the implications of atomic energy."

Nearly 1,000 Phi Beta Kappa members are expected to attend the award dinner.

# Put A-Bombing of China Up to UN, Urey Advises

Should the U.S. drop the atomic bomb on Red China?

The question hobbing around Congress because of the bad turn in the war news drew mostly negative answers here Wednesday from one atomic expert and five passersby picked at random.

The scientist was Dr. Harold C. Urey, Nobel Prize winner for his work on "heavy water." That led to development of atomic energy.

## HE URGES CAUTION

"I wouldn't think so," said Dr. Urey. "That question had better be thought over seriously. It brings up another question: Where are you going to drop it? The A-bomb is of no use if you have no real target.

"Then, there is the moral position of the United States to consider. We win wars by weapons and we also win wars by getting the support of the good people of the world. We must consider the possibilities of having the world turn against us or supporting us.

"I think the question of its use

## 'TOUGH QUESTION'

Here are their answers:

Melvin J. Slacks, 43, of 235 W. Crescent, Elmhurst, a U.S. Dept. of Labor investigator—"That's a tough question. No, I don't think we should. We'd lose more than we would gain by such an action."

W. Nelson Wilkins, 46, of Gloversville, N.Y., glove manufacturer—"Yes, I think we should drop the

bomb on the Manchurian border. We've got to give it to them or else."

Harold Newman, 48, of Danville, Ill., clothier—"I don't think so. I believe the whole thing could be settled by compromise in the councils of the United Nations."

Mrs. Ann Petros, 5345 Jackson, mother and housewife—"I don't know. I haven't given it a thought. I've been too busy."

Mrs. Florine Knauff, 7809 Merrill, secretary employed by a rubber firm—"I don't think we should use it now. The situation doesn't warrant our resorting to such a measure."

## Sharp and Urey probe Rosenberg trial; see injustice, unreliable testimony

Malcolm Sharp, professor of law, and Harold C. Urey, distinguished service professor of chemistry, speaking at a discussion sponsored by the Law Students' club, expressed the opinion that the verdict in the recent Rosenberg case was a miscarriage of justice. The discussion was held in Kent 106 on Wednesday before an estimated crowd of 300.

Urey, after diagramming the relationships of various people in the "espionage ring," went on to discuss difficulties in the evidence implicating Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. He expressed doubts about the testimony of David and Ruth Greenglass, which was the only evidence directly relating the Rosenbergs to an act of espionage.

He questioned the report by Ruth Greenglass that Julius Rosenberg spent \$50-\$75 a night entertaining friends connected with espionage. In light of the fact that the Rosenbergs spent only \$45 a month on rent and appeared to be rather poor. This

fact also tended to cast doubt on David Greenglass' statement that Julius Rosenberg gave him \$5,000 with which to flee the country.

### Outlines console table incident

In addition, the matter of the console table containing improvised microfilm equipment, supposedly given the Rosenbergs as payment for their espionage raised several difficulties, according to Urey. He declared that it was rather improbable that the Russians would pay the Rosenbergs with a console table rather than in money, especially since Klaus Fuchs and Harry Gold, admitted spies, were both paid in money.

Urey continued by discussing another part of the Greenglass testimony, concerning the Jello box, which would tend to implicate the Rosenbergs in the "spy ring." According to the Greenglasses, the Jello box was divided in the Rosenberg home, one half going to Ruth Greenglass, the other half remaining with the Rosenbergs.

**S** This second half was later brought to the Greenglass' home by Harry Gold who had received it from a Russian contact, of whom it is inferred had in turn received it from the Rosenbergs. Urey suggested that the Jello box had been divided in the Greenglasses, the Rosenbergs need not have been implicated at all. **CONTINUED - NEXT PAGE**

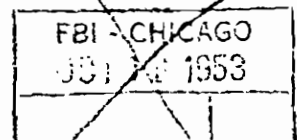

was served in this case."

Sharp following the talk by  
Urey, and discussed legal "logic  
and rhetoric" in the case. He  
stated that he had become con-  
vinced that Urey was correct in  
his analysis; only last May when  
new evidence was brought to light  
after the conclusion of the trial.

This evidence concerned a con-  
sole table which the Rosenbergs  
claimed they had bought in Macy's  
for \$21 and had not received it  
from the Russians. A table of this  
description was found in the  
apartment of Julius Rosenberg's  
mother. The defense stated that  
it had been saved when the rest  
of the Rosenbergs' furniture was  
sold and had been moved into the  
elder Mrs. Rosenberg's apartment  
without anyone realizing its sig-  
nificance.

The table had no microfilm  
compartment, but "for sale  
marks" indicating that it had  
been bought at Macy's the  
price and at the time claimed  
by the Rosenbergs. After its  
discovery, a maid who had  
worked for the Rosenbergs stated  
that she would identify this table  
as the only console table present  
in the Rosenberg's apartment.  
The trial, however, was concluded  
by them.

Sharp concluded that, consider-  
ing all the doubts involved in the  
trial testimony, he was convinced  
that the Rosenbergs had been con-  
victed unjustly.

2. RONALD GOLDBERG, 24, 5363 Roosevelt Pl., St. Louis, student at Washington U., graduate of Soldan High School, and son of Mr. and Mrs. SAM GOLDBERG.

3. THOMAS E. FINFGELD, 28, English instructor at Washington U., a former teacher at the University of Illinois and son of ED FINFGELD, mayor of Arcola, Illinois.

GOODMAN and GOLDBERG were members of the Washington University debating team, while FINFGELD was coach of the team. They had gone to the University of Illinois at Champaign, Illinois, for a debate.

On 12/21/53, informant advised he had no additional information re the Washington University group or its connection with Professor UREY.

For the information of Chicago, SOL DERMAN was former Executive Secretary of the Progressive Party of Missouri, and co-chairman with HAVEN PERKINS of the St. Louis Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.
