Report of a meeting sponsored by the Bronx Committee for Civil Liberties and Civil Rights (BCLC) at the Meloff Center 868 East 180th Street, Bronx, New York, on Sunday evening, 11/26/61.

There were approximately 85-90 persons present.

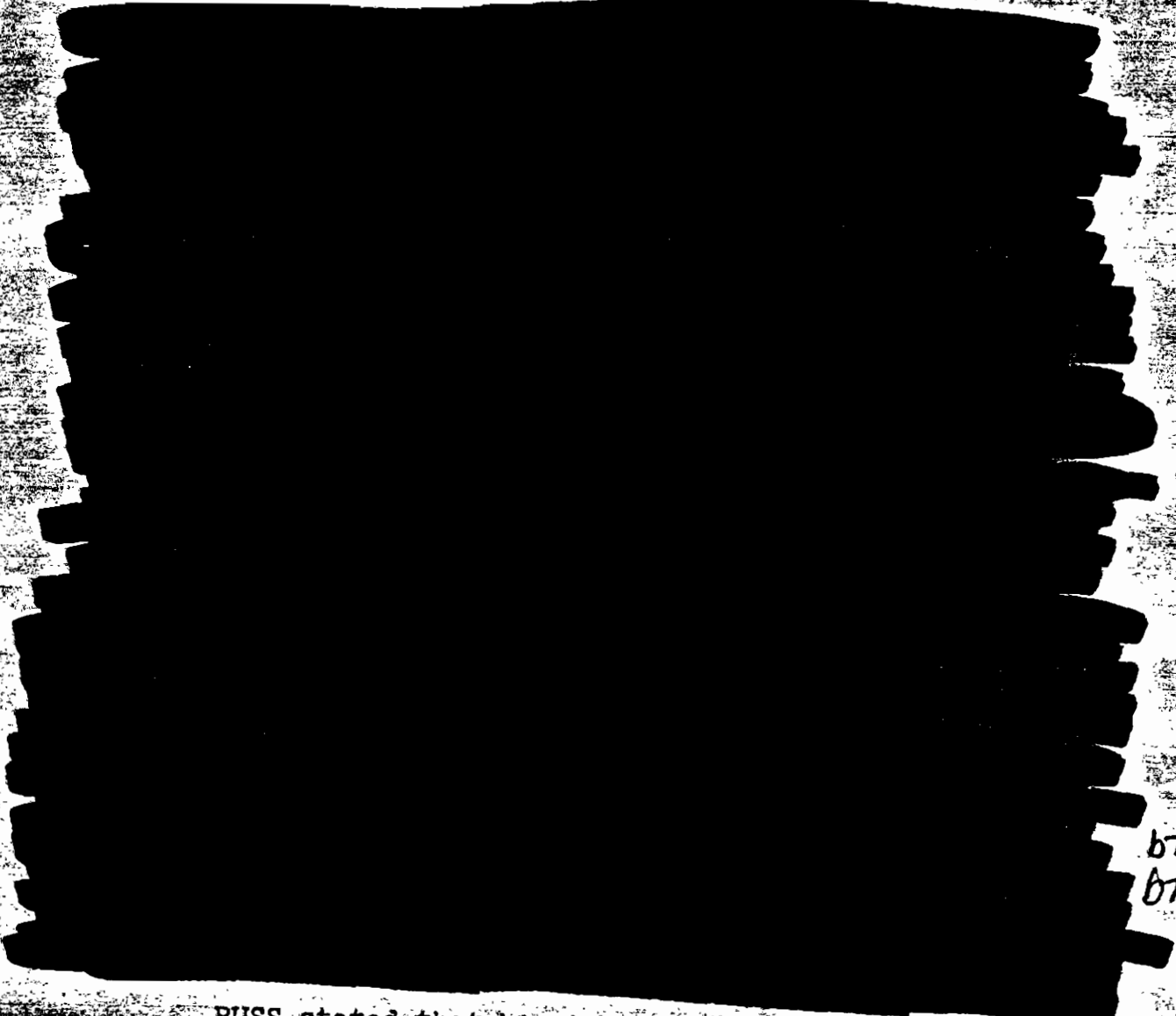
JOE POLICHETTI announced that the sum of \$35.25 was taken in the appeal. BELLA ALTSHULER made the appeal for funds.

A copy of HAROLD C. UREY's letter to President KENNEDY, of 11/10/61, re the Mc Carran Act decision, was read. Chairman RALPH SANTOS called for its approval and stated that the copy would be forwarded to the President stating that the audience unanimously endorsed its sentiments.

Some of those observed in attendance were:

1. RALPH SANTOS - chairman for the meeting.
2. MORTON SCHUTZ - gave the chronological background of the Mc Carran Act to the audience.
3. RUSS NIXON - principal speaker
4. JOSEPH POLICHETTI - chairman, BCLC
5. BELLA ALTSHULER - announced as Executive Secretary of BCLC - appealed for funds
6. JOANNE GRANT - reporter, National Guardian

RUSS stated that his topic was related to the present condition of "democracy" in the United States.

In Japan, RUSS said, he was thrilled by the way the Japanese regardless of political affiliation are permitted and do, speak their minds. While in the U.S., he said, little or no discussion is permitted on the vital topics of the day, namely he said, the peace question, disarmament, full equality for Negroes and other minority groups.

RUSS called for greater democracy in the United States; greater freedom for all voices regardless of political opinions or beliefs to discuss the issues and to resolve them. He cited the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HUAC) as a deterrent force to freedom in the United States. The Mc Carran, he said, has the same deleterious effect on the people. A significant voice in American life, he said, will be silenced if the Mc Carran Act provisions are executed.

There is in the U.S. a tremendous growth of ultra-rightist forces. These ultra-rightist forces have, he said, the support of the HUAC. The sole purpose, he said, is to create a fascist system in the country. There are, he told the audience, apparent similarities in the U.S. today and of pre-HITLER Germany.

President KENNEDY, he said, recently called for a plague on both the ultra right and the left. There is, RUSS said, a very serious flaw in the President's equating the right with the left. The flaw, he said, is that it is an historical lie to equate them. The left forces, he stated, have made a valuable contribution in the U.S. whereas, he said, the ultra-right forces strive only to destroy democracy in the U.S.

RUSS was very critical of former speaker of the House of Representatives SAM RAYBURN and his role in American political life. SAM RAYBURN, he said, supported every repressive piece of legislation in the Congress. Not only, RUSS stated did SAM RAYBURN support those repressive measures, but he gave leadership to them.

In the U.S., RUSS told the audience there are rigged elections. In the South, he said, once an individual is elected to office, he remains in office for a lifetime. There is no other party but the Democratic party in the South. In the North, he said, the politicians gerrymander the liberal progressive Congressmen out of existence.

There is, he stated, in the U.S. an atmosphere of "non-democracy." This "non-democracy" is due, he said, to the limitations on "democracy" and the build-up for war or, he said, it could be the build-up for war that places limitations on democracy.

The repressive measures (laws) and the HUAC were first directed at the labor movement, RUSS said. This is due, he said, because the powers that be, want to stifle the popular will of the people. Next, he said, the repressive measures (laws) are directed against the foreign born.

This, he told those present, is exactly what happened in Germany.

RUSS urged that the people take a more active role in seeing to it that there is more "democracy" in the U.S. This can be done, he said, by letting Congressmen and other elected officials know their feelings on matters. Write then, he said, about the HUAC and the Mc Carran Act. Let them know, he said, of their opposition to both. The letter, he said, does not have to be lengthy. As a matter of fact, he said, the paper does not have to be clean. If it has a little grease or dirt on it, he said, it is that much better, because the reader will know that it is coming from the working people.

There are some promising signs, RUSS said, on the horizon in the struggles.

The Negro movement he said, has recognized that the fight for full equality also means a fight for civil liberties. Therefore, he said, Reverends MARTIN LUTHER KING, ABERNATHY, and SHUTTLESWORTH have come out in favor of abolition of the HUAC.

However, RUSS stated, there will be little chance of complete success in the civil rights and civil liberties struggles until the trade union movement and its leaders recognize that it must play a leading role in these struggles.

RALPH SANTOS announced the New York Council to Abolish HUAC rally of Wednesday, 12/6/61 at Manhattan Center, New York City. He urged all present to attend the rally.

RALPH announced that HERBERT APTHEKER will speak on Tuesday evening, 11/28/61, at the Allerton Community Center, 683 Allerton Ave., Bronx, N.Y.

Also, that JAMES JACKSON, will shortly speak at the Meloff Center, Bronx, New York. His topic, he said, will be a report on the recent CP Congress in Moscow.

Increase Efforts to Secure Freedom of Morton Sobell

NEW YORK — Albert S. Isaacs, D. C. Urey, who 10 years ago branded testimony of Ethel Rosenberg as perjured and helped lead the fight to save their lives, will address a meeting at Carnegie Hall, June 19, 1953, on the 10th anniversary of their conviction despite their pleas of innocence and world-wide appeals for clemency.

Dr. Urey, and other participants, will urge the release of Morton Sobell, who throughout these years has maintained his innocence despite offers of leniency if he would make a confession to a crime he did not commit. Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment and is at Atlanta Federal Penitentiary.

The anniversary of the case, which has in the past decade been the subject of books, articles, reviews in law journals, confessions, protest meetings, White House picketing, and a congressional hearing, will include the following actions:

- Circulation of a "Save Sobell" petition.
- Appeal of Court decision, 11/1/52.
- Under present interpretation of the law, the Rosenbergs and Sobell would have been sentenced to a new trial.
- A gathering at the graves of the Rosenbergs in Woodlawn Cemetery, Pine Lawn, Long Island, on Sunday, June 14.
- A youth appeal at the White House on Saturday, June 13, under the theme "Another Communist Act."
- Meetings in other United States cities.
- Protests by 3,000 people abroad who have continued to feel that the execution of Joe Rosenberg was a gross injustice and who are appealing for Morton Sobell's release.

The meeting at Carnegie Hall, exactly 10 years from the death of the Rosenbergs on June 19, 1953, will also include a special filmed interview with Lord Bertrand Russell, who has publicly stated his belief in the innocence of the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell.

Members of the audience will include: Rabbi Malphie Brodner, Rev. John E. Dyball, Rev. G. Santner, Sr., Prof. Edwin Goodenough, Dean Donald K. J. MacGinnis, Mrs. James Jackson Fiel and Prof. Cole Pentecost.

In the years since the Rosenbergs were put to death, opinion has been divided on many aspects of the case. At the time, Judge Irving Kaufman condemned them to die on the basis of his belief that the Rosenbergs were responsible for Russia developing the atomic bomb. In the years following, Russian scientists proved in the open that they had an increasing number of people to work the nation's atomic research, obtained this information through espionage.

A review of the Rosenberg-Sobell trial record recalls that there was no documentary evidence against the Rosenbergs. The jury found them guilty on the word of witnesses who stood to gain by their testimony. Ethel Rosenberg's brother, David Greenglass, who admitted to have placed together atomic secrets by eavesdropping on scientists, has since been freed. He saved his life by accusing his sister.

Whether or not people were moved by the Rosenbergs' plea of innocence, the fact was sunny who believed his death penalty was a result of the hysteria of the McCarthy period and the Korean \$600,000,000. Please, representing many shades of opinion asking their lives be spared, came from many persons, including Pope Pius XII and the President of France.
