Budenz on Friday, November 2, 1952, at his home, 26 Manhattan avenue, Crestwood, Yonkers, New York (Telephone Spencer 9-4794). Professor Budenz again gave considerable information in response to specific questions regarding the foundations, their officers and grantees.

Mary Mary Control of the Control of He was asked about a number of the names mentioned by Henrietta Buckmaster. She had stated that in obtaining a Guggenheim Fellowship, her sponsors were Carl Sandburg, Oswald Garrison Villard and Lousi Bromfield. Bundenz stated that none of these three was a Communist but each of them was very She had admitted belonging to the People's Institute of Applied Religion (cited by Attorney General Clark as subversive and Communist). She had listed as head of the organization Claude Williams. Professor Budonz stated that Williams was known to him as a Communist through official communications. She had admitted belonging to the Southern Conference for Human Welfare (cited by HULC and the California Committee). Clark Foreman was the president when she joined. Budenz stated that Clark Foreman was known to him as a Communist through official communications. Henrietta Buckmaster had stated that she didn't believe that she was a member of the National Negro Congress although she had many contacts with it and with John Davis, its secretary. Prof. Budens knew John Davis as a Communist from official communications. Another contact of Buckmaster among negroes was a Philip Randolph, first president of the National Negro Congress. Prof. Budenz stated that he was definitely not a member of the Communist Party. 😌 Henrietta Buckmaster stated that she spoke to a negro canteen in World War II at the invitation of Dr. L. R. Reddick, curator of the Schomburg Collection, New York Public Library. Prof. Budenz stated that Reddick was known to him as a Communist through official communications and he may also have met him personally. but he is not sure of that.

Under questioning, Henrietta Buckmaster had stated that she belonger to the Congress of imerican Women which resulted from the International Women's Conference in Paris. Thirteen imerican delegates had gond to this Congress, and their group automatically became the Congress of imerican Women (cited by the ittorney General as subversive and Communist). Buckmaster had stated that she had got into this group through the invitation of Eleanor Gimbel of the department store family. Prof. Budenz stated that Eleanor Gimbel was a concealed Communist and that he had personally met her as such. Mr. Gifford Pinchot was active in this group. Prof. Budenz stated that Mrs. Pinchot was cooperative with the Communist Party.

Mrs. Buckmaster stated that about six years ago she addressed a meeting of the Writer's Club which she later discovered was Communist. She had addressed this meeting almost surely at the invitation of Howard Fast. Prof. Budenz pointed out the t Fast was a Communist according to the D.ILY WORKER and Budenz had met Fast as a Communist.

Prof. Budenz was asked about the names of certain men connected with the Ford Foundation or with grants received by the Ford Foundation. .mong these was Reinhold Niebuhr. stated that Niebuhr's case is a peculiar one. Niebuhr was not known by Budon, as a Communist: however Budonz knew him personally and knew that he was in at least forty Communist fronts. Budenz added that in his experience he has never found anyone who was in as many as forty Communist fronts without being an open or a concealed member of the Communist Perty. Harold Isaacs, who is supposed to be a Far Eastern correspondent connected with the Ford Foundation, was called by Prof. Budenz a "very mysterious figure". He was supposedly a member of the Trotskyites. and much of public activities appear to be anti-Stalin. However, Earl Browder indicated to Budenz that Isaacs was a Stalinito plant among the Trotskyites. It is Budenz's belief that in the IPR testimony Isaacs was identified as being enti-Communist. Prof. Budenz had no positive knowledge concerning the following individuals listed as having connections with the Ford Foundations: Mortimer adlor, Granville Clark, Prof. Robert Redfield, Karl 🥽 Spaeth, Robert C. North, ... rthur and Mary Wright, Mr. and Mrs. ámos C. Landman, Milton Katz (Prof. Budenz is unsure about Katz and stated that he would have to see a picture of him before knowing whom the writer was referring to).

THE RESERVE Professor Budenz gave the following information regarding individuals listed as being connected with the Rockefeller Foundation or receiving grants from it directly or indirectly: Prof. Ernest J. Simpons is not definitely known as a Communist to Budenz. However, the Communists have a very high opinion of him and Simmons has worked for them. J.B.S. Hardman - he is not a Communist now. He was a Communist one in the old Worker's Party. Presently Hardman is anti-Communist in a social Democratic way. His brother, Al Steele, is a Communist. Hardman, according to Budenz, is a cynic who gives a false view of the Communist Party. Robert J. Havighurst is believed by Budenz to have been a member of Communist fronts. Louis Hacker is not a Communist although he may be a Marxist in a loose way. Lionel Berman (employee of Association of Documentary Film Producers) was known personally by Budenz as a Communist Perty member. He is the husband of Louise Bransten. He was the section organizer of the Cultural Section of the Communist Party in New York (this  $\cdot$ section concentrates on the foundations). He was on the Communist Party Committee on Foundations, set up by the Cultural Commission to work on getting money from the Foundations for Communist pur- 🔠 poses. Lem Harris was also on this committee. Dr. Cscar Lange, a member of the American Soviet Science Society, was known to Budenz as a Communist through official communications before he retired behind the Iron Curtain. Prof. Budenz is d never heard that Harold C. Urey was a Communist. Although he has been mentioned very favorably by the Communists, Prof. Budenz feels that Urey has taken an inconsistent position on Communism and is John M. Hazard should be regarded with suspicion, although Budenz does not know that he was a Communist. Corliss Lamont, professor of the Russian Institute at Cornell, was known personally to Budenz as a Communist. Harriet Lucy Moore was 💝 🦈 known personally to Rudenz as a Communist and refused to answer the McCarran Committee on that point. Prof. Eudenz stated that we would have to check to determine whether Harriet L. Moore when was the same Harriot Moore listed as a professor of the Russian Institute at Cornell. Budonz stated that Harriet L. Moore has new marriage name which sounds like Golfin (phonetic). The state of the s

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Professor Budenz had no information regarding John Murra, Lee Hurwitz, Jay Leyda, Alico Koliher, Mary Loser, Dr. Vladimir Zworyhin, Solman Waksman, Prof. G. Pegram, David H. Stevens, John DeFrancis, John Marshall or C. F. H. Fahs.

The writer ran down with Prof. Budenz the list of names of recipionts of Rockefeller grants who had been checked off by Mr. MacFarland as having had some card in the files of Walter Steele. Most of these were completely unknown to Budenz. The following were exceptions: Granville Hicks (was a Guggenheim fellow) was known personally to Budenz as a Communist. He later left the party. Prof. Budenz does not know William L. Holland personally but he knows that Holland worked with the Communist Farty. Budenz feels certain that Saul K. Padover was a member of the Party and he believes that he has personally identified Padover as a Communist in prior testimony. Dr. Harold Rugg was not a Communist but was one of the Communist Party's favorites. V. Stofanson, the famous explorer, was known to Budenz as a Communist through many official communications. Stefanson was a great friend of Owen Lattimore. Budenz believes that he met Stefanson personally but is not absolutely certain.

Regarding the General Education Board, Prof. Budenz had some specific information as set out below: Ira De 🔠 😁 Reid (listed by the General Education Board in its questionnaire) was known to Budenz as a Communist from official communications. He was on many fronts. Doxey L. Wilkenson (also listed by the General Education Board) was an open Communist, known personally to Budonz as a Communist. Budenz and Wilkonson were together at a national committee meeting. Prof. Budenz has previously identified John. K. Fairbank as a Communist. He had no information about Rufus E. Clement, Eugen C. Holmes, William A. Hunter, Jr., Robert W. Barnett. Regarding recipionts of Carnegio Corporation funds, Prof. Budenz had the following information, Lawrence Duggan, who was connected with IIE, and who died mysteriously in the lest year or two, was known to Budenz personally as a concealed member of the Communist Party. (Prof. Budenz stated that nobody had ev asked him a question about Duggen's membership previously. This is completely new informa-Prof. Budenz had no knowledge of Dr. Clyde K. H. 442 Kluckhohn, head of the Russian Research Center at Harvard University.

The Now School for Social Roscarch, with which the Carnegic Endowment for International Feace has cooperated in the presentation of loctures, is not a Communist organized or Communist controlled institution, according to Budenz, but is is Communist penetrated.

Evens Clark of the Twentieth Century Fund was not a Communist, according to Budenz. He was formerly a Socialist and was the husband of Freda Kerchway, editor and owner of "The Nation". She is very pro-Communist but is not known to Budenz as a Communist.

In connection with the Russell Sage Foundation, Profit Budenz has previously given information regarding Mary Van Kleeck. He has no positive information regarding Morris Hedley, Robert MacIver, Harold T. White or Lindsay Bradford. He is not sure about Esther T. Brown. He believes he met her but does not remember her distinctly.

Alfred Kohlberg had stated that Edwin A. Smith, a trustee of the Hobert Marshall Civil Liberties Trust, was a Communist. Smith was with the National Labor Relations Board and later taught in New England colleges. This Smith was known to him personally as a Communist and Budenz met him as a Communist in Washington. (Prof. Budenz suggested that the identity of the Smith connected with the Robert Marshall Trust be checked).

Prof. Budenz had no information regarding the Sloan Foundation except that previously given about Maxwell Stewert, editor of the Public affairs pamphlets, supported by the Sloan Foundations.

Regarding the Rosenberg Foundation, Prof. Dudenz stated that Louise Bransten was known to him as a member of the Communist Party but engaged in secret work for the Party. She was trying to get control of the Rosenberg Foundation funds in order to use it for Communist Party purposes. She has refused to answer the questions as to whether she was a Communist. Prof. Sudenz had no positive knowledge about Dr. Deutsch, president of the Rosenberg Foundation.

Regarding the Field Foundation, Prof. Budenz gave the following information: Louis S. Weiss (deceased) (trustee from 1940-50) was known to Budenz as a Communist Party member through official communications. He was either a brother or cousin of Carol Weiss King, known Communist. Channing Tobias, trustee, has had a checkered career, according to budenz. He worked with the Communists but apparently has broken with them. Justine Wiso Polier was known to be pro-Communist. Lloyd K. Garrison was not known as a Communist but was just a "sap"

Prof. Budenz gave the following information regarding the William C. Whitney Foundation, its trustees, grantees, etc: Michael W. Straight (president of the Foundation) was not known to Budenz as a party member because he is a late comer. However, Straight has been pro-Communist. In connection with him, Prof. Budenz recommended that we see Frank Meyer, en ex-Communist from the Chicago erea, who taught at the Jefferson School. He is at the Artists Colony in Woodstock, A New York, near Kingston, New York. We could use Frof. Budenz's name in approaching Meyer. Budenz does not know Max Lerner es a Communist although ho believes that Lorner was a member of the Party at one time. Commonwealth College was controlled by the Communist Party although it was originally a Socialist school. Prof. Budenz believes that Claudo Williams, known as a Communist through official communications, was connected with Commonwealth College. The .merican Russian Institute was a Communist creation and was Communist controlled. So, too, was the Southern Conference for Human Welfare. James M. Dombroski executive secretary of the Soutern Conference for Human Wolfare, was a Communist. Prof. Budenz knows this at least through official communications, and he feels he probably knew Dombroski personally at one time. Adelaide Schulkind, executive secretary of the League for Mutual Aid, was known to Budenz personally though he is not sure whether she was actually a Communist. She was very close to the Communist Party. Elizabeth Gurley Flynn, Clarina Michaelson and William Albertson, all on the Executive Committee of the League for Mutual Aid, were known personally to Budenz as Communists. The Highlander Folk School was pro-Communist. Kylo Crichton (real name is Robert Forsythe) was known to Budenz as a Communist from official communications "over and over". John Howard Lewson of Frontier Films was known personally as a Com unist. So, too, was Lionel Berman as pointed out above.

Beatrice Straight Dolivet was listed by alfred Kohlborg as a director of the Whitney Foundation. Prof. Budenz stated that Beatrice Straight Dolivet was the wife of Louis Dolivet who was a concealed Communist. Prof. Budenz is not cortain a bout her, however. It should be noted that in the William C. Whitney Foundation completed questionnaire there is listed among the trustees Mrs. Beatrice S. Cookson. Insuer ..-10 lists the name

of B. S. Cookston, daughter of the creator of the trust (nemely, Straight). Thus it is obvious that the Mrs. Beatrice S. Cookson is the same person who was proviously known as Beatrice Straight Dolivet.

Professor Budenz had no definite information regarding the following additional people connected with the Whitney Foundation or with recipients of its grants: Dr. Hermm C. Nixon, Lawrence Knobel, Joseph N. Deblinger, Frederick Bordon, Arnold P. Johnson, Philip Stevenson.

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

2. "On Tuesday, March 16th at 9:30 A.M., the Communist Party U.S.A. is haled into the U.S. District Court, Constitution Avenue, Washington, D.C., for a second trial under a 3-year old indictment on the charge of refusing to register under the incriminating terms of the McCarran Act. A previous conviction was reversed by the higher courts. Your attendance can be an expression for political freedom.

3. "On February 25th, the Attorney General and a Federal Grand Jury in Washington, D. C., brought a second indictment against the Communist Party for refusing to register for eleven days in February, 1965. This is part of the process of endless indictments, prosecutions and political harasement in an effort to substitute the McCarran Act for the Bill of Rights. Your voice of protest can help protect constitutional liberties.

"On that same February 25, 1965, a Federal Judge dismissed the murder indictments which had been brought against 17 hoodlums and public officials who had been charged with the brutal killing of three civil rights workers in Mississippi. And at the same time, the JOHNSON Administration was escalating the undeclared and criminal war against the people of South and North Vietnam.

"The bankruptcy and futile failure of U. S. policy in Vietnam and in the Congo, and the shameful refusal to meet federal responsibility for application of the U. S. Constitutior in the struggle for freedom and civil rights of Negro citizens provide the real reason for this widened attack on civil liberties. That is the basis for the new indictment and pending trial and for the second trial on the old indictment. This is an obvious effort to intimidate and suppress the voices for peace and freedom.

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"These issues are indivisible. All of this adds to the reasons for action NOW -- and for your attendance at the Assembly and Press Conference on March 15th and at the trial on March 16th.

"The Assembly and Press Conference will provide an opportunity for representatives of those accused under the McCarran Act and of those who have defended the Bill of Rights to reach the American public. This will be an expression for civil liberty by Americans of diverse political views and from all walks of life. This can be am important event for political freedom and peace at a crucial time in our history.
