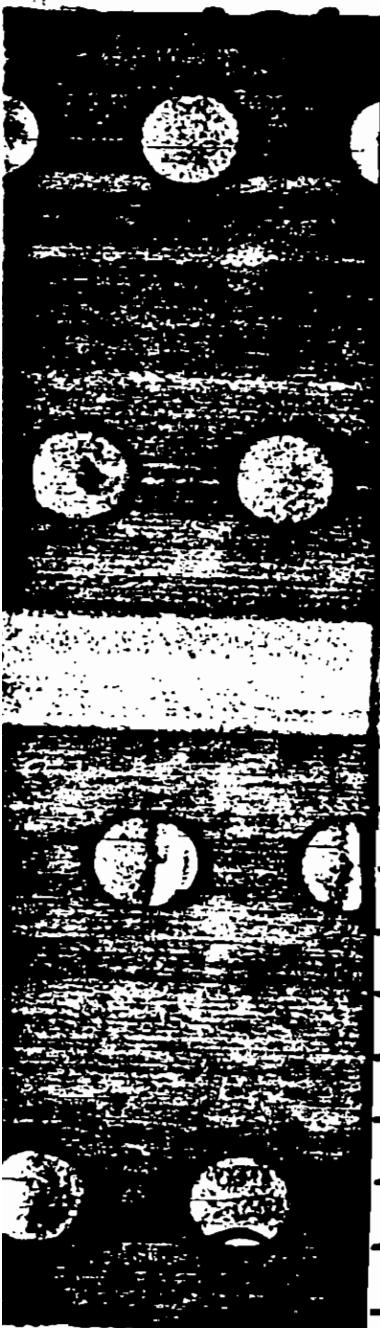

E. T. McRER, Head, Chemistry Department, Purdue University, advised that BENKESER was an outstanding young man, both as a teacher and as an individual. He was above average as to character and intelligence, is honest and trustworthy, and has never given any indication of being other than intensely loyal to this country. He has been on the staff for four years, and is very highly considered in every respect.

ROBERT ANTHONY BENKESER, Building 21, Apartment 11, Rosa-Ade Drive, West Lafayette, Indiana, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

He met subject in 1938 or 1939, when both were attending Xavier University, Cincinnati, and both majoring in Chemistry. BENKESER lived in town, with his parents, and subject was rooming at a boarding house, the address of which BENKESER was ignorant, inasmuch as he stated he had never been there. BENKESER stated that he would usually get to school anywhere from one half to an hour early, and go to the Chemistry Department to study. Subject also always came early, and they would study together, and subject would assist BENKESER with his work. BENKESER stated that subject was exceptionally intelligent and a hard worker, and was universally liked by the students and professors. In the mornings before class, subject and BENKESER would study, or else would just talk for a while. Subject never, in any of his discussions, gave any indication of any outside activity, and gave no indication that he was other than a loyal and patriotic citizen of the U.S. Their discussions were mainly concerned with Chemistry, the professors and other students, and BENKESER was unable to remember any time the discussion concerned politics or ideologies.

BENKESER wondered why, subject, an older man, and a resident of the East would have come to a school like Xavier, especially inasmuch as it is Catholic, rather than completing his education in the East. He asked subject one time, and subject stated he had stopped over in Cincinnati sometime before, liked the town, and had tried to get into the University of Cincinnati. He was not accepted because too great a length of time had passed since his last schooling. He then learned of Xavier, and applied there, and was accepted.

BENKESER went on to say that subject left school before he did, and he heard nothing of him, or from him, until this year. While in Cincinnati, BENKESER was only with subject once on a social occasion, at which time BENKESER

took subject to his home for dinner. He only did this on one occasion, and never had any contact with him, outside of school, except for that one occasion. While attending Xavier, subject was supposedly engaged to a girl back east, and received quite a few letters from her. BENKESER said subject never mentioned her by name, or, if he did, BENKESER has forgotten it.

While at Xavier, subject was very friendly with a ROBERT KASKE, an English major. BENKESER did not know KASKE's present whereabouts, but believes he is taking a doctorate at some eastern university at the present time. Subject, while at Xavier, was very hard working and industrious, and put in long hours. Thus, as far as BENKESER can remember, he had very few friends other than those he met at school. INASMUCH as BENKESER had no contact with him outside of school, he was unable to furnish any information concerning subject's outside activities, and whether or not he had any.

BENKESER attended a convention of the American Chemical Society in Philadelphia on April 10 - 12, 1950, and, on the latter date, some time in the afternoon, he saw subject in the lobby of the hotel, which was the convention headquarters, believed by BENKESER to have been the Bellview Stratford. Inasmuch as he had seen or heard nothing from subject since he left Xavier, BENKESER went up to subject and talked to him. Subject did not recognize him at first, but when BENKESER mentioned his name, subject recognized him instantly. They talked, in the lobby of the hotel, for about half an hour, discussing Xavier, former students and professors. BENKESER asked subject if he were married, and subject stated he was not. When he had returned from Cincinnati, his mother had told him that the girl had married someone else, and he had never married.

BENKESER asked him if he had gotten his same job back when he returned east from Cincinnati, and subject said yes, but that later, due to a reorganization, he had lost the job. He then said he had worked for some chemical company in New York, but that failed, and he was at the present time working at a hospital in Philadelphia. After about half an hour of talk, BENKESER said he had to leave, to go to another hotel, where the Purdue delegates to the convention were having a cocktail party. Subject volunteered to show him the way, inasmuch as subject was going that way, on his way back to work. They exchanged addresses, but BENKESER could not remember whether he wrote his out for GOLD, or whether subject wrote it down at BENKESER's direction. Subject walked with BENKESER to the other hotel, and left him at the door. BENKESER has not seen or heard from subject since that time. BENKESER remembers the date he saw subject, because he left Philadelphia that evening and returned to Lafayette. BENKESER indicated a willingness to assist in any way possible, but stated that the half hour in Philadelphia was the only contact he has had with subject in the last ten years.

On the afternoon of June 7, Mr. Ray Whearty of the Department, advised that the Grand Jury proceedings against Gold had been discussed with Mr. Frank Parker of the Eastern District of New York and that preparations are going ahead to present the matter to the Grand Jury on Friday, June 9. Mr. Whearty requested that Special Agents T. Scott Miller and Richard Brennan, the two agents who interviewed Gold, be present in the office of U. S. Attorney Keogh, EDNY, at 9:30 a.m. on June 8, for the purpose of going over his testimony with Mr. Parker. I advised him they would be there and instructions have been given to the Philadelphia Office for these two agents to report as above indicated. Mr. Whearty advised that it would be desirable also for Special Agent Robert Lamphere, who interviewed Fuchs, to report for the Grand Jury on the morning of June 9. The purpose of his testimony would be to fill out the picture and to reflect the interview with Fuchs and the fact that Fuchs admits turning over information to Gold and that Fuchs identified Gold as his contact. Lamphere will not be requested to testify to any restricted data, that is he will not be required to explain, except in a very general manner, what information Fuchs turned over to Gold.

Mr. Whearty also requested that Mr. Dahlgren of the Laboratory, be present on Friday morning June 9, to testify to the handwriting of Gold on the hotel registration cards in Albuquerque and Chicago. The above Bureau representatives have all been advised to appear as indicated.

Mr. Whearty further requested that we ascertain the identity of the individual from the Atomic Energy Commission who can testify to the confidential nature of the information turned over to Gold by Fuchs as described in Gold's signed statement. The name of the appropriate individual is being secured from the Atomic Energy Commission and will be furnished to Mr. Whearty.

Mr. Whearty further advised that John D. Hamilton, the attorney for Gold, communicated with U. S. Attorney Gleason at Philadelphia today and wanted to explore the possibility of having Gold plead guilty in Philadelphia under Rule 20. Mr. Hamilton pointed out that Gold's friends and family are in Philadelphia and indicated that he would prefer to plead in that district. According to Mr. Whearty, Gleason told Hamilton that he could not assure that this procedure would be followed inasmuch as the permission of U. S. Attorney Keogh would be necessary. Mr. Gleason suggested that Hamilton talk to McInerney of the Department. Mr. Whearty advised that he told Gleason that the Department would have no objection to such a transfer. Mr. Whearty further advised that

he had discussed this with Mr. Frank Parker, EDNY, during the conference today and that Mr. Parker stated that while the U. S. Attorney's Office in the Eastern District of New York would be sorry not to have the case handled there, they would not object to the transfer under these circumstances. Mr. Whearty advised that he would inform the Bureau of any developments in this matter.

Mr. Whearty advised that the removal hearing is set for June 12, in Philadelphia and that the U. S. Attorney's Office will see that certified copies of the indictment are sent to Mr. Gleason in time for the hearing. Mr. Whearty advised that in order that there will be no possible question of identity, it would be desirable for Special Agents T. Scott Miller and Richard Brennan to appear at the hearing in Philadelphia on Monday, June 12, in order that they may state, if the question arises, that Gold is the individual concerning whom they testified before the Grand Jury. Mr. Whearty was advised that these agents would be present. Instructions have been given to the agents.

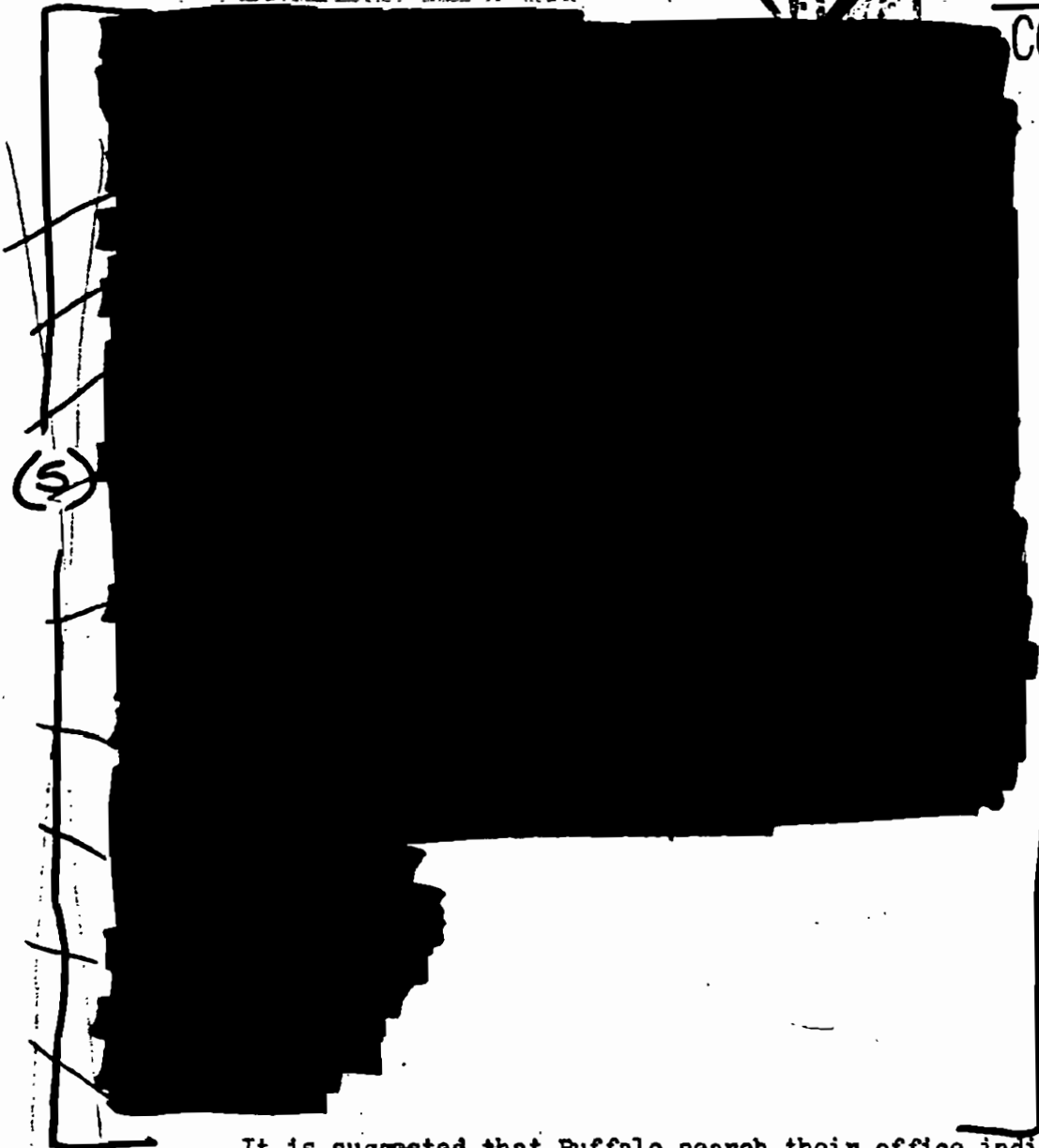

Miss **NAN SERPICO**, 529 Humboldt Street, was interviewed by SA **JOSEPH C. LEARNED** and reporting Agent at which time she revealed the following information. Miss SERPICO became acquainted with **HARRY GOLD** on May 2, 1949, when she began working at the Philadelphia General Hospital, being employed by the United States Public Health Service on the Heart Project. Miss SERPICO was a secretary, having the professional title of Medical Research Statistician, and **HARRY GOLD** was a chemist working on this Heart Project. She was a business associate of GOLD until March 15, 1950, when she resigned and came to Denver, Colorado.

Miss SERPICO advised that she only knew GOLD in a professional way, and she regarded him as a sincere, efficient, capable,

humble and cooperative individuals. As far as she knows, GOLD had no real close associates at Philadelphia General Hospital, and she believes he associated with herself during working hours as much as any other employee, although they were not in the same laboratory. GOLD, on many occasions, helped her in the selection of materials and equipment for use on the Heart Project and never at any time did she ever suspect he was engaged in espionage activities. Miss SERPICO stated that when she learned through the local newspaper that GOLD had been arrested, she was amazed and dumfounded.

Miss SERPICO stated when she left the Philadelphia General Hospital, a going away party was given for her by Dr. and Mrs. B. D. POLIS at their home. Those attending this party beside the POLIS were Dr. and Mrs. VANDENBOORT; CAROLYN DOERNBACH; LILLIAN JEIDEKIN; HARRY GOLD; Miss SERPICO; and two friends of the POLIS, names unknown. Miss SERPICO stated this was a social affair and politics were not discussed.

Miss SERPICO stated that the people at Philadelphia General who would know GOLD best were Dr. M. D. PHELPS; Dr. LEWIS; Dr. ERHBACK; DOROTHY BELL, who was GOLD's technician; and MARY RUFFIN, who worked in GOLD's laboratory. She stated that after GOLD's arrest, KATHERINE TORCHIANO, who was the head bookkeeper at the Philadelphia General Hospital, sent her many newspaper clippings regarding the arrest of GOLD. She related she knows of no outside associates of HARRY GOLD, other than those working at the hospital, and she never observed any mail, other than mail pertaining to the Heart Project, which came to HARRY GOLD. However, Miss SERPICO added he would be able to receive telephone calls while at work, which she would have no knowledge of in view of the fact that he could receive these calls in his laboratory. She stated during the period of time she was acquainted with GOLD, he never discussed politics with her in any way.

She related that HARRY GOLD was a very retiring person and was regarded by the hospital employees as a girl hater. However, on several occasions, when the Heart Project pay checks were delayed, he was very quick in lending small sums of money to various employees at the hospital to tide them over until the pay checks arrived. Miss SERPICO stated it was her observation GOLD always seemed to have adequate financial means but never displayed any large amounts of money. She stated that GOLD, upon being elevated to Chief Chemist in August 1948, received a salary of approximately \$4600, which she considered sufficient for a bachelor. Also in her conversations with GOLD regarding his family, which consisted of his father and a brother, she obtained the impression that they were financially well off. Also at various times when supplies were needed at the Project, she noted that GOLD would buy small items which were needed out of his own pocket.

Miss SERPICO advised that the only time she recalls he was away from the hospital was in February 1950 when he was supposed to attend a meeting or Medical Convention in New York City, which meeting was held at Grand Central Palace. GOLD was gone two or three days on this occasion and was paid per diem. She stated that the records of the Heart Project would reflect this per diem payment, and in case he was ever gone from the hospital on other occasions, the records would indicate this.

Miss SERPICO stated she knows of nothing pertaining to HARRY GOLD which would aid in instant investigation.

Gold believes he can identify the soldier's residence in Albuquerque if shown maps or motion pictures.

Special Agent Scott Miller suggested that Theodore Hall, subject of an espionage case, who was at one time at Los Alamos, might be identical with this individual.

#### Observations

1. The type of investigation which will be conducted with regard to these additional persons named by Gold will necessarily have to depend upon the results of further interview with Gold, the results of Bufile checks, and a careful evaluation of the available information concerning these individuals.

2. Interviews with the two persons already identified is not believed advisable because they may still be engaged in espionage activities, and because it is believed practical to obtain complete information from Gold concerning these persons. On the other hand, it appears that Gold definitely has been withholding information, and consideration will be given to possible early interviews with these persons, with the thought in mind of using Gold's information against them and information they furnish against Gold in further interrogations.

#### Action being taken

##### Thomas L. Black

The Field has been instructed to

1. Place Black under physical surveillance;
2. Initiate an investigation to develop complete background information concerning him. It is noted that investigation has been conducted and Black previously has been interviewed concerning Gold, but has denied being involved in espionage activity.
3. The Field has been instructed to obtain photographs of Black and display them to Whittaker Chambers, and to interrogate Chambers in detail concerning his knowledge of Black.
4. The files at the Bureau are being reviewed to determine if we have any information which can be identified with Black.



Alfred Dean Slack

1. The Bufiles are being reviewed on Slack. It is noted that he is the subject of a 117 file.
2. Bufiles are being reviewed on Howard Gochenaur.
3. The Field has been instructed to conduct discreet investigation to locate Slack, and to immediately advise the Bureau. When he is located he is to be placed under physical surveillance, and investigation is to be conducted to obtain all possible background information concerning him. Photographs are to be obtained and displayed to Gold.
4. The Field also has been instructed to identify and locate Howard Gochenaur, and to immediately advise the Bureau.

Unsub; Soldier at Los Alamos

1. Bufiles are being reviewed on Theodore Hall to determine if he may possibly be identical with this Unsub.
2. The Field has been instructed to display a map of Albuquerque to Gold immediately in order that he may mark the location of the soldier's residence, and thereafter motion pictures are to be taken of the vicinity for display to Gold, unless the actual residence can be identified from Gold's description.
3. The Field has been instructed to conduct investigation as soon as the residence of the soldier has been identified by Gold in order to identify all of the persons who resided therein during the pertinent period.
4. The Field was instructed to immediately place the unknown soldier under physical surveillance as soon as he has been identified, and conduct investigation to develop his background and activities. Photographs of him are to be displayed to Gold.

None. The above is for your information. You will be kept advised of further developments in this case and the results of the Bufile reviews.

In connection with above captioned cases, it is desired that photographs of JOSEPH KATZ be exhibited to HARRY GOLD. Two photos of KATZ are enclosed for the Philadelphia Office.

The following background information concerning KATZ is being set out for the benefit of the interviewing agents:

During 1937 and 1938, JOSEPH KATZ was believed to be residing at 19 E. 16th St., and 415 W. 24th St., NYC. He was unemployed part of the time and was on W.P.A. at other times. In 1939, KATZ was reportedly engaged in the surveillance of WALTER IWITSKY by the Russians. Later, in 1941, KATZ opened a parking lot on 601-13 W. 130th St., NYC with AMADEO SABATINI, another Soviet agent. KATZ was the espionage principal to ELIZABETH BENTLEY in 1944 and 1945. He has been in Paris for the past few years and his stay there is indefinite either because of orders from his Russian superiors or perhaps because of fear of returning to the U. S. jurisdiction. As far as is known, he does not know of the Bureau's awareness of him.

4. 2 views of 128 West 77th Street, New York City, wherein FUCHS resided in 1944 and which was visited by GOLD in search of FUCHS.
5. 4 views of the vicinity of Grand Concourse and Fordham Road, Bronx, New York, which site was formerly Rosenhain's Restaurant, which place was the site of the fourth meeting between GOLD and FUCHS.
6. <sup>3</sup> 4 views of Manny Wolf's Chop House, 49th Street & 3rd Avenue, New York City, where GOLD and FUCHS proceeded on the occasion of their first meeting.
7. Photograph of the 34th Street cafeteria located directly opposite the Greyhound Bus Terminal.
8. Greyhound Bus Terminal, opposite 34th Street cafeteria. Between the first and second contacts with FUCHS, GOLD was instructed by SAM to proceed to a spot on 34th Street across the street from the Greyhound Bus Terminal where he was to meet SAM'S successor.

PURPOSE

To advise you of the dissemination made to the Department to date in this case.

DETAILS

The following items have been furnished to the Department:

1. Memorandum for the Attorney General, Dated May 23, 1950.

This memorandum announced the confession of Harry Gold that he was the person who received the information from Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs and delivered it to an unknown Soviet superior. This memorandum recommended that in view of the premature disclosure of the information authority be granted to institute prosecutive action against Gold in the Eastern District of New York.

2. Letter to the Attorney General dated May 24, 1950

This letter was identical with the letters disseminated to the various interested agencies. It contained the known personal history of Harry Gold and set forth the details of how Harry Gold first came to the attention of the Bureau. You will recall that this came about as a result of information furnished by Elizabeth T. Bentley to the effect that she had received blueprints from Abraham Brothman for Jacob Golos, following which Golos assigned some other individual to this job. After investigation of Brothman he was interviewed and then disclosed that the person who received blueprints from him for Jacob Golos after Bentley ceased this operation was Harry Gold. Harry Gold was interviewed on May 29, 1947, and at that time admitted that he had received blueprints from Brothman for Golos. He alleged that Golos was receiving these blueprints from Brothman because Golos was in a position to obtain contracts from the Russian Government for Brothman. It was also set forth in this letter that Gold had appeared before the Grand Jury in the Southern District of New York on July 31, 1947, testifying in substance to what he furnished to Bureau Agents on interview. This Grand Jury, which heard the Bentley charges, returned a "no bill."

This letter contained the substance of Gold's confession in which he admitted beginning the procurement of industrial information for the Soviet Union in the Fall of 1936, continuing this activity until 1945, except for the period from 1938 to 1940 while he attended school in Cincinnati, Ohio. The confession enumerates Gold's meetings with Fuchs in New York City, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and Santa Fe, New Mexico. The prosecutive action, consisting of the filing of a complaint in the Eastern District of New York and the arrest of Gold in Philadelphia, following which he was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal in default of the \$100,000 bail, is set out.

3. Memorandum for the Attorney General dated May 29, 1950, enclosing a preliminary summary of evidence

The preliminary summary of evidence implicating Harry Gold, "John" Doe, and "Sam" Doe in espionage activities in the United States sets forth a brief statement of the offense, statutes which may be applicable, a section on witnesses, and a section on possible venue.

The section on witnesses contains the information received from Fuchs concerning his various meetings with Harry Gold in the United States. Details as to date and place of meeting and information passed, are set forth insofar as Fuchs was able to recall it. Following this, the details of the meetings with Fuchs as Gold related them, are set forth, again with all available detail as to date and place of meeting and information passed.

The section on witnesses also contains information concerning Kristel Fuchs Heineman, Robert Block Heineman, and Konstantin Lafazanos reflecting what these persons knew about Gold's appearances at the Heineman home in Cambridge, Massachusetts, in about February, 1945. The mental condition of Kristel Heineman and the fact that Robert Block Heineman could not or would not identify Harry Gold is set forth.

The section on witnesses also contains the information that hotel registration cards reflecting that Harry Gold stayed at the Hilton Hotel, Albuquerque, New Mexico, on September 19, 1945, and the Palmer House, Chicago, Illinois, on September 17, 1945, have been located; and further, that an FBI Laboratory examination has determined that the handwriting of Harry Gold is identical with the handwriting on these registration cards.

The section on venue recapitulates the various meeting places of Gold and Fuchs, and of Gold and "John" under the various judicial districts involved, namely, the Southern District of New York, the Eastern District of New York, the District of Massachusetts, and the District of New Mexico.

4. Letter to Mr. James M. McInerney, dated June 1, 1950, enclosing New York Report dated May 29, 1950, and Philadelphia Report dated May 31, 1950

The report of Special Agent Joseph G. Walsh, Jr., New York, dated May 29, 1950, in this matter sets forth the information received from Fuchs concerning his activities in the United States, together with a resume of the information furnished by Kristel and Robert Heineman concerning the person who visited their home in February, 1945, in an effort to locate Fuchs. The report also sets out in detail the allegations of Elizabeth T. Bentley and subsequent interviews of Abraham Brothman and Harry Gold on May 29, 1947, as mentioned above.

The recent interview with Abraham Brothman on May 22, 1950, is also set forth. At this time Brothman advised that in about 1939 or 1940 he had completed work on two types of mixers and held patents on them. The Hendrick Manufacturing Company, 114 East 32nd Street, New York City, held the license on these patents and was trying to market the mixers for Brothman. The company set up a demonstration in their office and maintained a mailing list of individuals and firms. They sent blueprints and data on these mixers to the individuals and firms on this mailing list and extended invitations to witness a demonstration. In response to this invitation, Jacob Golos came to the office, representing himself as an official with the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission. Golos claimed he would be able to obtain orders from the Commission for this equipment. In accordance with the practice in the chemical business at the time, the seller in such a case would draw blueprints and printed directions concerning the equipment in question and send them to the prospective purchaser. Brothman stated that in accordance with this practice he gave the prints to Golos. He said he met Golos a number of times thereafter, somewhere between five and fifteen times.

Following this, Elizabeth T. Bentley, whom he knew as "Helen," was introduced to him as Golos' secretary. He admitted turning over blueprints to both Golos and Miss Bentley at various meetings, and claimed that he only did this to assist himself in getting contracts from the Soviet Government Purchasing Commission. He stated he never gave the actual processes to be

used in conjunction with these blueprints, and that without the processes the blueprints were of no value. Brothman claimed that in one conversation with Golos he expressed a desire to use a laboratory for chemical experiments, or, in the alternative, to meet someone who worked in a laboratory and would be able to work on some of Brothman's processes. Golos told Brothman he thought he could get Brothman in touch with someone who owned a laboratory. Subsequently Harry Gold called Brothman. Brothman believes Gold said that Golos had spoken to him about Brothman. They made an appointment and met shortly after the telephone conversation, and therefore Brothman believed that Gold must have been in New York City at the time he called.

Brothman stated that from that time until 1946 Gold worked on various processes for him, and that they discussed many other processes, but did nothing about them insofar as he remembers. Brothman said that he and Gold met on numerous occasions during this time, but that he could not remember any specific dates. Brothman also related that Gold had told him that he had a wife and two children in Philadelphia and that the children were dissimilar twins named Essie and David. Gold also told Brothman about his wedding in South Philadelphia. Brothman said all of his associates in the laboratory knew these facts about Gold as Gold told everyone about his wife and two children. Brothman continued, however, saying that after the interview by Bureau agents in 1947 he told Gold that he had told the agents about Gold's wife and two children, and at that time Gold told Brothman that he was single and never had a wife and two children. Brothman said Gold offered no explanation for this fabrication, but just "broke down and cried." Brothman also stated that Gold told him about his brother who was killed in the Pacific during the last war. According to Brothman, this was also a fabrication.

Brothman advised that Gold was known among his associates as Frank Kessler. He stated this was done so that Gold's real identity would not inadvertently come to the attention of the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company and thus reveal the fact that Gold was doing work for Brothman at the same time that he was employed by that company. Brothman further related that in 1946 when Gold first came to work for Brothman, Gold told him that his wife had left him and that he was so despondent over it that he wanted to commit suicide. Brothman offered to attempt a reconciliation and to borrow money for Gold if that would help, but Gold rejected both offers. He also recalled that Gold was heavily in debt to various loan sharks in Philadelphia when Gold entered Brothman's employ. He felt that Gold had left the Pennsylvania Sugar Refining Company to obtain a slight respite from the constant demands of these loan sharks. Brothman said that according

to his records, Gold worked for him from May 18, 1946, until the first week in June, 1948. The records are not clear on the time of termination, but Brothman recalled that he released his entire staff consisting of Gold and two others immediately after his return from Switzerland on June 1, 1948. Brothman stated he only visited Gold in Philadelphia on one occasion and that was at the time of Gold's Mother's funeral in 1947.

This report also contains the result of interviews with Miriam Moskowitz, secretary to Abraham Brothman, Oscar Vago, former partner in A. Brothman Associates, Seymour Mandelkorn, former employee of A. Brothman Associates, and Mrs. Joseph Pereira, 152-05 84th Avenue, Jamaica, Long Island, at whose home Gold roomed for three or four months in 1946 or 1947 while Gold worked at Brothman's laboratory. Moskowitz and Vago furnished their knowledge of Gold's business association with A. Brothman and associates. Mandelkorn first met Gold in the Spring of 1946, at which time Brothman advised that Gold would be an outside consultant for A. Brothman Associates Laboratory. Subsequently, in about July of that year, Brothman brought Gold into the office and told Mandelkorn that Gold was going to work in the laboratory. Mandelkorn stated that inasmuch as he worked in the office and Gold worked in the laboratory he never had gotten to know Gold and he knew nothing of his personal life. After his employment with Brothman he never saw Gold again until February, 1950, when he met Gold at a chemical exposition being held in the Grand Central Palace, New York City. He said they recognized one another and merely exchanged a few casual remarks.

Mrs. Pereira advised that she had seen Gold only a few times as he had a private entrance to his room and came home late at night. She was unable to identify a photograph of Gold taken after his arrest, but believed it looked familiar.

This report sets forth a further interview with Elizabeth T. Bentley on May 22, 1950. At that time she recalled a trip to Philadelphia taken by Jacob Golos in the Fall of 1940. It was about this time that Golos told her that his superior had indicated that it would be necessary for him to turn Abraham Brothman over to a Russian contact. The reason for this was that Golos probably had indicated that neither he nor Miss Bentley knew anything about the technical aspect of the material that Brothman was handing over and in order to expedite things this material would be taken up by someone with a technical background. Miss Bentley further recalled that after Golos returned from Philadelphia in late 1940 he instructed her to tell Brothman on the occasion of their next meeting that Brothman was going to be turned over to a new contact. Bentley stated that Golos never turned over any of his contacts unless he had been specifically instructed to do so by his superior. Following this conversation with Golos, she met

Brothman at a prearranged meeting and took him to Paddy's Clam House on West 34th Street where she informed him of Golas' order. At this point Brothman became adamant and it was necessary for both Bentley and Golas to see Brothman at a subsequent time, after which Bentley ceased to see him any more. According to Miss Bentley, the changeover in contacts for Brothman was effected by obtaining the license number of Brothman's automobile and requesting him to park his car and remain in it on Eighth or Ninth Avenue in upper Manhattan. At a specified time the new contact was to come by, get into the car, talk to Brothman and accept any new material he had. Miss Bentley recalled that about a month or two after she ceased to see Brothman the latter called her and said he had lost touch with his new contact. She relayed this information to Golas and heard nothing more about it. It was her impression that Golas had been able to rehabilitate this contact.

Abraham Brothman was confronted with the above information recently received from Miss Bentley, and he specifically denied that Miss Bentley, Golas, or anyone else had ever given him any instructions similar to those set out above.

The report of Special Agent Robert G. Jensen, Philadelphia, dated May 31, 1950, in this matter, sets forth detailed background information concerning Gold, including his relatives, residences, education, employment, membership in professional societies, and Selective Service information.

This report also sets forth the result of interviews with Harry Gold prior to his confession and includes information obtained in the search of Gold's residence with Gold's consent. The information furnished by Gold at this time deals with his relationship with Abraham Brothman and also with his interest in thermal diffusion research.

This report sets forth the complete confession of Harry Gold, followed with a statement of the prosecutive action taken and the corroborative evidence available. The corroborative evidence, of course, consists of the hotel registration cards of the Hilton Hotel, Albuquerque, and the Palmer House Hotel, Chicago, mentioned previously.

This report contains a section on other espionage activities of Harry Gold. This section enumerates and describes other espionage contacts admitted by Gold as follows:

Unknown American No. 1 -- Syracuse, New York; Summer, 1942, to possibly Winter, 1943.

Unknown American No. 2 -- wa. "Martin" -- Rochester and Buffalo, New York; late 1941 or early 1942.

Unknown American No. 3 -- Buffalo, New York; Summer of 1942.

Unknown American No. 4 -- Either Syracuse or Buffalo, New York in 1942.

None of these individuals is identified in this report, though at this time Unknown American No. 2 is known to be identical with Alfred Dean Slack.

This report also contains a list of Gold's espionage superiors, with their descriptions, as furnished by Gold. They are:

Paul Smith -- first contact 1936. Gold states this is a fictitious name.

Steve Swartz -- Gold is not certain of the first name.

Fred -- Date of contact, 1938.

Jacob Gales -- contact made in July, 1940.

"Sam" -- date of contact, late 1940 to late 1943 or early 1944.

"John" -- period of contact, 1944 and 1945.

The report reflects that Gold has tentatively identified "Sam" as Semen Semenov, and "John" as Anatoli A. Yakolev. It will be noted that both "Sam" and "John" are named in the complaint filed against Gold and will appear in the indictment.

5. Letter to the Attorney General  
dated June 2, 1950

This letter sets forth additional statements by Fuchs concerning the technical information he furnished to Gold. This is broken down as nearly as Fuchs is able to recall, as to meetings and as to whether it was passed orally or in writing.

6. Letter to the Attorney General,  
also dated June 2, 1950

This letter sets forth the analysis of the information furnished to the Russians as related by Fuchs to Dr. Michael W. Perrin. The analysis is that of the Committee of Senior Responsible Reviewers of the Atomic Energy Commission.

7. Conference with Mr. Raymond P. Whearty and  
Mr. George Kneip of the Department on June 2, 1950

On this occasion, in connection with the Department's concern over prosecution in the Eastern District of New York inasmuch as Fuchs did not recall a definite meeting with Gold in that district, Mr. Whearty and Mr. Kneip were advised that Fuchs now recalled a meeting in Queens which he believed was about twenty minutes ride after entering Queens, and, upon reference to a map, was believed to be in the general direction of the airport. Fuchs stated that Gold suggested this meeting place. Fuchs also recalled that the reports turned over on this occasion contained mathematical equations, but he stated he was sure he never saw Gold open any package, as to do so would have been hazardous.

ACTION

None. It will be noted from the foregoing that the tentative identification of "John" and "Sam" as Anatoli A. Yakovlev and Semen Semenov, respectively, has already been furnished to the Department. Inasmuch as they are both mentioned in the complaint we will continue to furnish the Department with pertinent information concerning them. A separate memorandum indicating what confidential information has not been sent to the Department is being prepared.

On the morning of June 12, 1950, SAC Cornelius called from Philadelphia and advised that no investigative reports in this case had been furnished to U. S. Attorney Gleason in Philadelphia and he did not contemplate furnishing them unless the Bureau thought to the contrary. I pointed out that all Mr. Gleason will need for the removal proceedings scheduled for today is a certified copy of the indictment and possibly the testimony of Special Agents Miller and Brennan from the standpoint of identity and probable cause. Inasmuch as Mr. Gleason has not asked for the reports and as Mr. Cornelius felt that Mr. Gleason's penchant for publicity might make it undesirable to give him reports at this time, I advised Mr. Cornelius that reports should not be given to Mr. Gleason. In the event Gold pleads guilty in Philadelphia under Rule 20 and it appears necessary for Gleason to have such reports, he will undoubtedly request them and we can consider the matter at that time. Of course, if at a later date Gleason needs these reports and his handling of the case in Philadelphia requires that they be given to him, we will make them available to him.

At 12:05 pm, Mr. Cornelius advised that the removal hearing of Gold had been held before Judge McGranery. U. S. Attorney Gleason put Special Agent T. Scott Miller on the stand. He testified briefly that he had testified before the Grand Jury about Gold and that the individual concerning whom he testified was the Gold in the courtroom. Attorney Hamilton stated that there was no question of identity. In other words, Gold admitted his identity. Hamilton requested more time in order that he could complete his examination of Gold and go over the case from the standpoint of motives, character and background of Gold. He advised that he did not desire to commit himself or his client regarding a possible plea of guilty, as he had not yet seen the indictment, but that his client might want to resort to a plea under Rule 20. Hamilton pointed out that character witnesses for Gold would be located in the area of Philadelphia. No date was set for an additional hearing; however, Attorney Hamilton advised the court that he would proceed on this as rapidly as possible.

In accordance with your request, on the basis of your consultation with Mr. Peyton Ford, of the Department, I consulted with Mr. Raymond P. Whearty and Mr. George Kneip, of the Department, this afternoon. Supervisor E. J. Van Loon accompanied me.

Mr. Whearty advised that the Department is drawing up a proposed indictment against Harry Gold and his co-conspirators, unknown subjects "Sam" and "John", and Dr. Emil Julius Klaus Fuchs, charging them with conspiracy to violate the Espionage Statutes of the United States, namely Section 32a of Title 50, USC. Mr. Whearty advised that he has no indication so far that a representative of the Department will present this matter to the Grand Jury and he supposes that the matter will be handled by U. S. Attorney Keough in the Eastern District of New York, although this is not conclusive. At my request, Mr. Whearty advised that he would make available to us a copy of the indictment when it has been prepared.

Mr. Whearty and Mr. Kneip advised that in considering the indictment they wondered whether it would be more desirable to consider some other district than the Eastern District of New York, inasmuch as there was no definite meet acknowledged between Fuchs and Gold in the Eastern District of New York. The matter of where prosecution will be held is entirely up to the Department. However, it was pointed out to Mr. Whearty that Dr. Fuchs has now identified the meeting with Gold in the latter part of July, 1944, at which time he passed mathematical equations to Gold, as being in Queens, which is within the Eastern District of New York; further, that two highly important meetings between Gold and "John" occurred in Queens and Brooklyn following Gold's meeting with Fuchs at Santa Fe in June and September, 1945. Mr. Whearty and Mr. Kneip were of the opinion that the prosecution should lie in the Eastern District of New York.

Mr. Whearty inquired whether there was any possibility of Fuchs appearing as a witness against Gold. He was advised that from past circumstances surrounding this case, it appeared doubtful whether the British Government would accede to a request for Fuchs' appearance; however, that this was a matter which could only be answered by making a formal request of the British Government. It was pointed out that in the event the Department felt Fuchs' presence was necessary to the trial, that any request for Fuchs' appearance should be initiated by the Department. Mr. Whearty was of the opinion that Fuchs' presence was not necessary for the Grand Jury proceedings, and in the event the matter goes to trial, the question of a formal request would be considered by the Department at a later date. Mr. Whearty was of the opinion that if the case did go to trial, Fuchs would be an essential witness in view of the lack of corroborating evidence and the lack of other witnesses who could appear against Gold.

Mr. Whearty was asked what witnesses the Department would require before the Grand Jury. He advised that it was his opinion that the sole witnesses necessary would be the Agent who took the statement from Gold and perhaps a representative of

the Atomic Energy Commission who could state that the type of information passed by Fuchs to Gold and thence to "John" was of a restricted nature. He was not of the opinion that it would be necessary to bring in any statements from Fuchs, inasmuch as any material brought in before the Grand Jury on which an indictment might be based, which material might later prove inadmissible, might vitiate the indictment. I requested Mr. Whearty to furnish us with the exact material concerning which an Atomic Energy Commission representative would be required to testify before the Grand Jury in order that we could take up this material in advance with the Atomic Energy Commission. He advised that in all probability the material would be restricted to oral information passed by Fuchs to Gold, inasmuch as it would then be possible to keep away from Fuchs' statements and deal more in generalities, rather than in technical data. He advised that he would furnish his memorandum containing the specific items which would be brought up in the Grand Jury in order that we could take them up with the Atomic Energy Commission.

Mr. Whearty brought up the question of whether it would be desirable to have Gold waive removal in Philadelphia. He was advised this was entirely up to the Department. He came to the conclusion that it would be best to have an indictment returned prior to June 12, and to hold the hearing which then would be merely a formality. As an indictment would be outstanding, it would not be necessary to go into any details of Gold's confession at the hearing.

Mr. Whearty was advised that copies of the New York and Philadelphia reports had just been transmitted to the Department; that we are making up a prosecutive summary, but in order to make the summary complete, several days will be required to secure the results of the details of interviews with Fuchs in London and other investigation presently pending. He advised us that he had sufficient information at this time to prepare the indictment and for the Grand Jury proceedings and, therefore, the prosecutive summary would not be required immediately.

Mr. Whearty advised that he did not know just when the Grand Jury proceedings would be held; that this would be up to U. S. Attorney Keough in the Eastern District of New York, but that as soon as the indictment was returned, undoubtedly Gold would be removed at once to the Eastern District of New York and would be arraigned there.

Mr. Whearty was advised that we are continuing to interview Gold, with the consent of his attorney, for the purpose of getting all possible information to corroborate his story and to secure additional details concerning his associates and other possible contacts, but that we did not want such interviews to stand in the way of any removal proceedings or an indictment and that the time, place and form of the removal proceedings and Grand Jury proceedings were entirely up to the Department.

In discussing the merits of the case against Gold, Mr. Whearty and Mr. Kneip pointed out that without the physical presence of Fuchs, if the case went to trial, it would be very difficult to convict Gold, as the case would rest almost entirely on his confession. They pointed out that if he pleads guilty, of course, this question will not arise. They were advised that we understood that Gold had told Judge McGranery he contemplated pleading guilty and that Gold is very cooperative during the interviews with him, but in spite of this, there

could be no assurance whatsoever that he would not change his mind prior to the trial date. They wondered whether it might not be desirable to hold off trial for a month or two to permit a complete interview with Gold. They were advised that they should not set the trial date, or any other proceedings in this matter, on the basis of our interviews with Gold; that by holding off, it might be that Gold would change his mind and prove uncooperative and that our interviews with him should not be a factor to be considered.

ACTION:

There have been indications that Mr. Ford and Mr. McInerney are attempting to persuade Judge McGranery to have Gold brought to the Eastern District of New York without a removal proceeding. Further, from our discussion with Mr. Whearty and Mr. Knisp, it is questionable whether they are in possession of the full policy of the Department in this matter. Instructions have been given to the New York Office to maintain close liaison with U. S. Attorney Keough in the Eastern District in order that we may be advised of any developments concerning Grand Jury proceedings and removal of Gold from Philadelphia.

Upon the receipt of the memorandum from the Department, we will immediately take up with the Atomic Energy Commission the identity of the representative who will testify before the Grand Jury concerning the confidential nature of the information passed between Fuchs and Gold, the evaluation of the information being considered by the Department, and whether the Atomic Energy Commission is in a position to comment on these matters before the Grand Jury.

BACKGROUND

By teletype dated June 2, 1950, the Philadelphia Office advised that Gold had positively identified Anatoli A. Yakovlev as the unknown subject "John" after viewing motion pictures of Yakovlev.

During the interview with Walter Carl Neunson on May 14, 1949, he admitted contacting Yakovlev at the Russian Consulate in New York City in 1944 or 1945.

Neunson is the subject of a closed Internal Security - R case.



Subsequent investigation in this case, which included several interviews with the subject, revealed that he was born in the United States of Russian parents and returned with them to the Soviet Union at an early age. Subsequent to the death of his parents, he eventually was enabled to return to the United States in 1940, and for a period of several years sought unsuccessfully to obtain permission for his wife and children to join him. Neunson denied having engaged in any espionage activities or any other activities in behalf of the Soviet Union in the United States, although he admitted that he was contacted on two occasions by Soviet representatives who desired his assistance. On one occasion he drove such a visitor in his automobile to the Baldwin Locomotive Works in Eddystone, Pennsylvania, parking outside of the fence and giving the Soviet representative an opportunity to visually observe the general area. He admitted also discussing with that individual something about the operations of the Baldwin Locomotive Works.

The names of HARRY GOLD, 604 Sutter Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and HARRY GOLD, 110 Herzl Street, Brooklyn, New York, are noted as signers of the above petition, according to the same source.

The name HARRY GOLD, 141 Jefferson Street, Passaic, New Jersey, is noted as a signer of Communist Party petition to place candidates on the ballot in New Jersey in 1940 according to the same source.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to submit for your approval a memorandum to Mr. McInerney in reply to his memorandum of June 6, 1950, outlining to Mr. McInerney the results of a conference held on June 6, 1950, with Atomic Energy Commission representatives.

DETAILS

Special Agents Charles W. Bates and Robert J. Lamphere conferred on the afternoon of June 6, 1950, with the following AEC representatives with reference to the matters mentioned in Mr. McInerney's memorandum of June 6th: Colonel William K. Shaer, Division of Military Applications; Bennett Boskey, Deputy General Counsel; William D. Denson, Legal Division; Dr. James Beckerley, Chief, Classification Office; Francis Hamack, Acting Director of Security; C. Arthur Rolander, Jr., Division of Security.

Answers were obtained to the five enumerated points in Mr. McInerney's memorandum, and it might be noted that the AEC representatives indicated they would like to see a strong indictment in this case as far as the revealing of the importance of the information furnished by Fuchs to Gold, as they believe this to be in the public interest. They expressed themselves as being anxious to be helpful in any way possible. You may recall, however, that difficulty previously has been experienced with the AEC representatives in matters of this kind in view of the fact that when it comes down to trial, as in the Coplon case they are apt to somewhat reverse their position.

RECOMMENDATION

There is attached for your approval a memorandum to Mr. McInerney.

PURPOSE

To advise you of additional information furnished by Harry Gold on June 1, 1950, concerning his espionage associates.

BACKGROUND

You will recall that SAC Cornelius called from Philadelphia at 5:20 PM on June 1, 1950, and advised that at a conference in the chambers of Judge McGranery, Gold indicated to an agent that he would like to talk to him briefly. Special Agent Scott Miller was able to talk to Gold for approximately four minutes, at which time Gold gave information concerning three of his Soviet espionage associates. He identified one of these as Al Black, another as Thomas L. Black, and the third as a non-commissioned soldier who resided in Albuquerque, New Mexico, in 1945 and was attached to Santa Fe.

Inasmuch as Thomas L. Black previously had come into this investigation and had been interviewed, the Philadelphia Office was instructed to immediately initiate a physical surveillance. They also were instructed to attempt to conduct further interviews with Gold on the night of June 1, 1950.

DETAILS

On further interview Gold furnished agents with the following information:

Thomas L. Black

Gold first met Black in Jersey City, New Jersey, in 1933. Black was a chemist and had radical leanings. Black obtained a job for Gold at the Halbrook Company in Jersey City and introduced Gold to Paul Smith in late 1935 in New York City. Smith was the Soviet agent who started Gold's espionage activities. About 1937 or 1938 Black told Gold that he was engaged in "intelligence against the Trotskyites." Gold does not know what else Black did for the Russians.

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Black frequently lost contact with the Russians and used Gold to get in touch with them again. Early in 1946, when Gold had lost contact with the Russians, he went to Black only to learn that Black had not been in touch with them for a long time.

About 1938 Black indicated that he knew Whittaker Chambers in connection with espionage. He also indicated to Gold that Chambers had given information "on his own activities to Army Intelligence." Several times between 1938 and 1946 Black, in talking with Gold, wondered if Chambers would remember him.

Gold believed that "Sam" (Semen Semenov) was Black's Russian contact, based upon Black's description. Semenov has been identified by Gold as one of his (Gold's) Russian superiors.

There is no main file in the Bureau which can be identified to date with Thomas L. Black.

#### Al Slack

This individual is identical with Alfred Dean Slack, subject of Bufile 117-243, which is an Atomic Energy Act investigation. This file is now being reviewed for pertinent data.

Gold stated he first met Slack in late 1940 or the fall of 1941 at Rochester, New York, after having been sent to Rochester by his superior, "Sam," to contact Slack. Slack resided on a farm in Webster or West Webster, New York, and worked as a chemist at the Eastman Kodak Chemical Plant in Rochester. He saw Slack six or seven times up to the Fall of 1942, both in Rochester and at the farm. He was known to Slack as "Martin." On several occasions he gave Slack \$200 and Slack furnished him information concerning the formula for color-photography. On two or three occasions Slack gave him samples of chemicals.

In the Fall of 1942 Slack transferred to the Eastman Kodak Plant at Kingsport, Tennessee, where he worked for Holston Ordnance. In early 1943 Gold went to Kingsport and "looked up" Slack. On several occasions Slack tried to "break away" from Gold, but the latter gave him pep talks on his service to the Soviet Union.

Gold made several trips to Kingsport. Possibly on the second trip he got material from Slack which was (1) information on the preparation of very pure nitric acid used in connection with the making of a powerful explosive, and, (2) samples of this explosive in two rubber containers. Gold, several days later, passed the material to "Sam" in New York.



On the third trip to Kingsport he learned Slack was to be transferred to a very highly secret project, and Slack thought he would work on some type of special poison gas.

Gold missed Slack on the fourth trip, and later guessed that Slack had been transferred to Oak Ridge. He passed this information to "Sam" about Christmas, 1943. Shortly thereafter "Sam" told Gold to drop all of his work for the important assignment of contacting Fuchs.

On one or two occasions Slack went to the Dupont Plant in Belle, West Virginia, with \$500 or \$1,000 supplied by Gold (who got it from "Sam"), where Slack purchased the nylon process from Howard Gochenaur, a Dupont employee. Gold is "pretty sure" that Gochenaur thought he was selling the process to another commercial company in the United States.

Gold learned from Slack that Slack was brought into contact with the Russians by one Dick, last name unknown, who was dead at the time Gold first met Slack. Gold also believed that Slack might have had previous direct contacts with the Russians, but that Slack gave his first information for the benefit of the Russians to Gold.

#### Unsub; Soldier at Los Alamos

Gold had only one meeting with this individual who was a corporal or sergeant, probably assigned to Los Alamos. This was in June, 1945, when Gold went to Santa Fe to contact Fuchs. Prior to the departure from New York his espionage superior, "John," gave him an address and the name of an individual and an envelope containing \$500. Gold was to deliver the \$500 to the individual. This person resided in Albuquerque, and when Gold contacted him learned for the first time that he was a United States soldier. He believes he met this soldier in the morning and again in the afternoon, collecting information which he believes pertained to the physical setup of the installation at Los Alamos. The soldier expected the money.

Gold passed the information received from the soldier to "John" on his return to New York.

Gold cannot recall the name of the soldier. He furnished a fairly detailed description of him indicating that he possibly was a machinist or draftsman with some training in physics. He had a Bronx or Brooklyn accent and was believed to be Jewish. He had married just recently and Gold saw his wife at the time he contacted the soldier.
