You Only Vote Once (in College)

uring the 2012 fall semester, TSO's Global Engagement Cabinet spearheaded an election awareness campaign on campus.

YOVO, as the campaign was commonly referred to (You Only Vote Once-in College), encouraged students to become informed about the presidential candidates and to vote.

The importance of the YOVO campaign was "to help engage students with politics so they could have educated discussions around the elections," said Global Engagement co-president, Anna Medearis.

Perhaps the most exciting part of the campaign took place on Wednesday, October 3, the night of the first presidential debate. Global Engagement partnered with Residence Life to show a live-stream of the televised debates in the atrium of the new Euler Science Center. Several hundred students poured into the atrium and watched the debate while enjoying election-themed snacks, such as "campaign trail mix" and red-and-blue "Oval Office" cookies.

Many Taylor students are from out of state, and there is a need for education on absentee voting. These students expressed a desire to vote in the election but struggled to find time to go through the process of registering and requesting their absentee ballots. In order to assist with this problem, students at the live debate were offered an opportunity to sign up to have their request forms delivered to their campus mailboxes. Members of the Global Engagement cabinet put many hours into finding, printing, and distributing the proper forms to students who had requested help with their absentee ballots.

Other YOVO events included Pursuit of Convicted Civility, an activity that Global Engagement partnered with Leadership Development to host. This panel's goal was to have an open and honest discussion about choosing who to vote for, while still respecting the political beliefs of others.

"They (the YOVO events) were a social experience, but I was also learning at the same time," said student Megan Adams.







Here are the stories of girls who experienced this candle-lit event this year.







The Profession of Restoration.

edemption, restoration, and revival are some of my favorite words. Taking a bad situation and making it better, giving it life, making it new again, "senior Danny Benson said. "I feel like Environmental Science has those words written all over it." Benson studies Environmental Science, with a concentration on Earth and Physical Science.

After going on a family trip to Ethiopia to work at an orphanage, he learned that people walked miles to access clean water. The trip opened his eyes to helping others while being outdoors and enjoying God's creation. He weighed different school options, and the Taylor program pulled him in.

Benson has many different dreams he would like to pursue. Now it is just a matter of choosing one. One of those would be teaching Earth Science in an urban setting to give the students a chance to experience the wonders of God's creation outside the city limits.

"I think it's a great way to disrupt the cycle of poverty by giving inner-city kids a chance to get soil under their fingertips," he said. Holistic and transformational development also has been one of his passions.

The Environmental Science department at Taylor University is conducive to hands-on experiences and provides trip opportunities for students.

"I get the chance to work with my hands in the great outdoors," said Benson, which he loves. Benson has had the opportunity to work with local missionaries on transformational development projects in Guatemala, to lay out Geospatial Analysis tools, and has even checked groundwater levels in the Taylor Arboretum's reconstructed wetland.

In whatever he ends up doing, Benson wants to use his degree to further God's Kingdom.

"Jesus was in the restoring business, too," he said. "The Scriptures give us numerous accounts of Him taking unhealthy, inadequate situations and making them whole again. He makes all things new! So, I want to be in His profession: restoration."



A Milestone

,000. It's not an easy number to reach in the world of college basketball, but there was no question when senior forward Erika Redweik made it:

"I knew exactly when it happened because our team and the crowd went crazy," she said.

Redweik saw her career point totals soar past 1,000 in the January 19 game against Goshen College. With 23 points in the game, she had 3 points to spare after breaking the 1,000-point barrier.

The cheers from the crowd were not a complete surprise. Redweik made 1,000 points one of her long-term college goals and discovered her junior year she had a strong chance to reach it.

"(I) knew that if I continued to work as hard as I was, I would reach this goal some (time) in the middle of my senior-year season," she said.

The team also kept her focused on the goal.

"I knew it was about to happen because Tess Rudolph and Erin Guarneri (as well as the rest of the team) were getting really excited and kept informing me of how many points I was away from reaching that 1,000th point," she said. "All I could think about was how blessed I was to have so many people who supported me and were so proud and happy for me to achieve this milestone."

Redweik finished her season with 391 points and built up 1,123 points in her overall college career. She is only the 20th Taylor women's basketball player to pass the 1,000-point mark, but two of her teammates share that honor with her.

The same day Redweik reached 1,000 points, senior Guarneri was honored during the game for achieving the same goal the week earlier against Indiana Wesleyan. Fellow senior Rudolph added her name last year to the short list of Trojans who have exceeded the 1,000-point milestone.

"It was a special feeling and in some way a moment of relief, that I finally reached that 1,000th point," Redweik said.
















