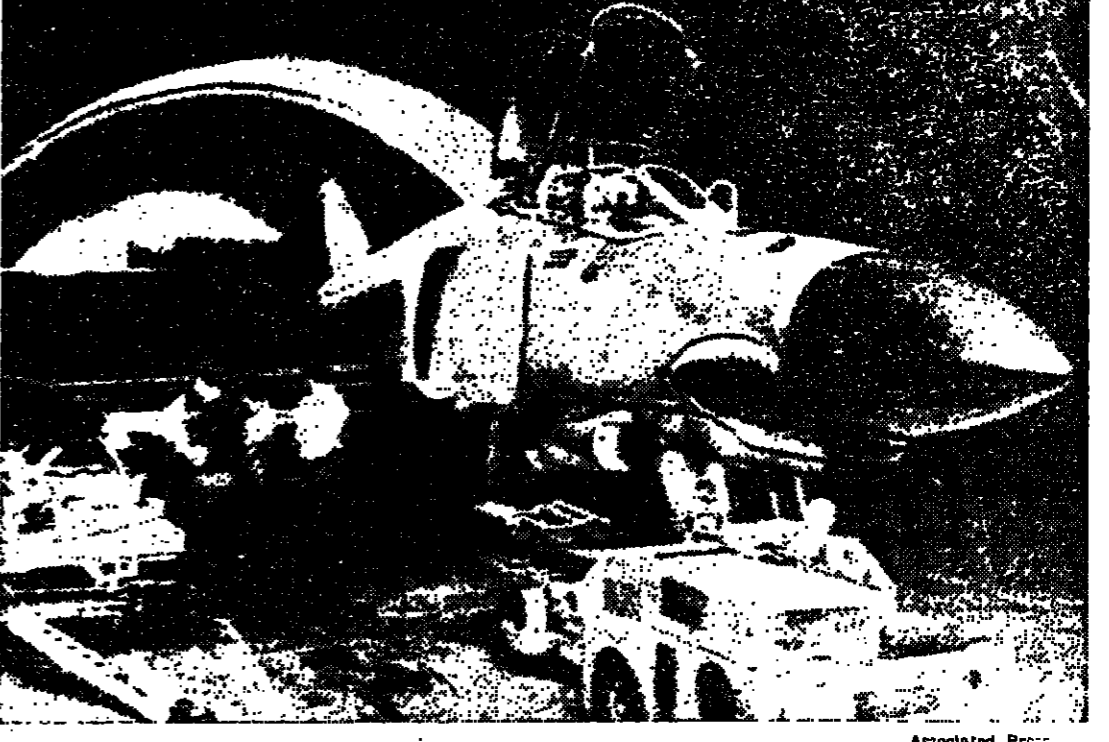

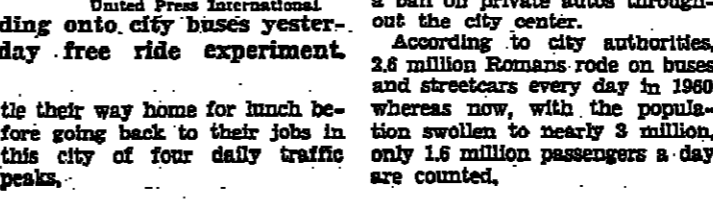

Insanity Cited In Acquittal of Jet Hijacker

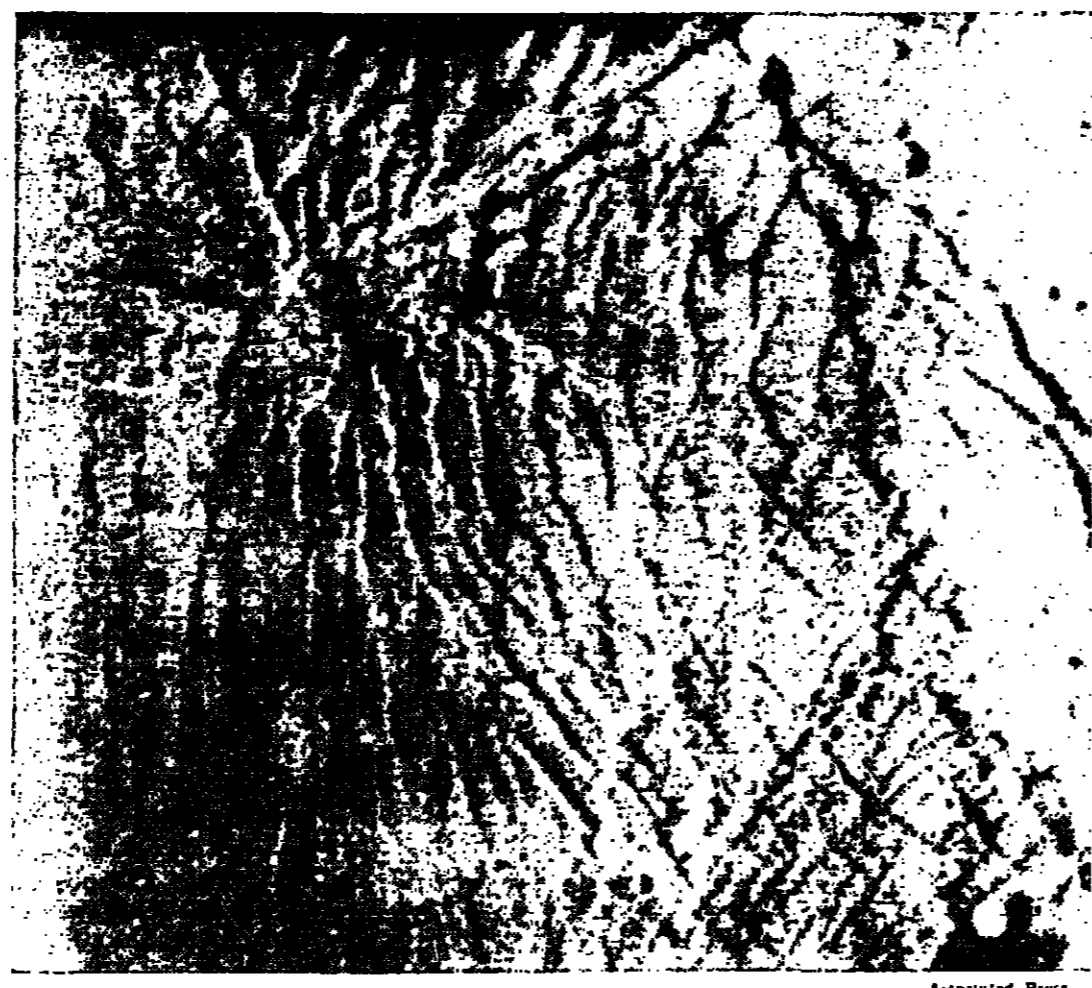

U.S. Scientist Revises View Of Universe

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 30 (Reuters).—The universe may be twice as old and twice as big as scientists first thought it was, a California astronomer reports. Democrats to Make an Issue Of Intelligence Gathering

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (UPI).—Democrats plan a major assault on the way the United States gathers and uses intelligence and handles internal security problems. Democratic presidential candidates will be armed with critical studies on such issues as the role and performance of FBI Director J. The studies, believed to be the first intensive look at security as a campaign issue, will also be considered for inclusion as a plank in the Democratic party platform.

955,519 Whites Deserted N.Y. City In 60s; Inward Flow Also Noted

NEW YORK, Dec. 30 (NYT).—There was a net outward migration of nearly one million white people from New York City during the decade of the 1960s, according to a breakdown of the 1970 census totals. The Bureau of the Census in Washington has figured that the net migration of whites out of the city during the decade was 955,519. While there was a trend of whites moving out of the city, the net inward migration of blacks and "other races" was 435,840 during the decade. The racial makeup of the city's population thus shifted as follows: 6,640,867 whites and 1,141,322 blacks and other races in 1960 to 6,023,535 and 1,844,225 respectively in 1970. It can be seen that the white decline was 617,127, which is considerably short of the net outward migration figure of 955,519. The explanation is that, although a net of 955,519 left the city, those who remained registered an excess of births over deaths amounting to 338,382, thereby trimming the white loss to 617,127.

A Black Police Chief in U.S. Hits Courts for Leniency to Blacks

GARY, Ind., Dec. 30 (UPI).—Charles Boone, Gary's first black police chief, said yesterday that courts are too lenient in their treatment of blacks in his city. Chief Boone, who was appointed by Mayor Richard Hatcher, who also is black, said that there had been an increase during the last year in the number of blacks arrested. He said, however, that less than 10 percent of his department's felony arrests result in convictions. "You can't put a black burglar in jail in Lake County, and that makes it impossible to protect the black community here," Chief Boone said. Chief Boone's comments came after the release of a man arrested 24 times on such charges as narcotics violations, burglary, armed robbery and auto theft. The chief said that court officials complain that there aren't enough prisons to house convicts. "If that's the case, then we'd better build some more if we're going to protect society," Mr. Boone said.

U.S. Study Estimates The Cost of Being a Parent: \$150,000 for Two Children

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (NYT).—It costs the typical American family between \$80,000 and \$150,000 to raise two children and put them through college, according to a federal research study. The study, one of a series for the Commission on Population Growth and the American Future, is thought to be the first to make complete long-term estimates of the dollar cost of being a parent. The \$80,000 figure is the estimated total of the direct costs of two children. The report also calculated the wages a typical woman who had children, and stayed home till the youngest was 14, would have earned if she had worked instead of having children. The study's authors said they were being conservative. They acknowledged the difficulty of encompassing costs like music les-

Loss of Earnings

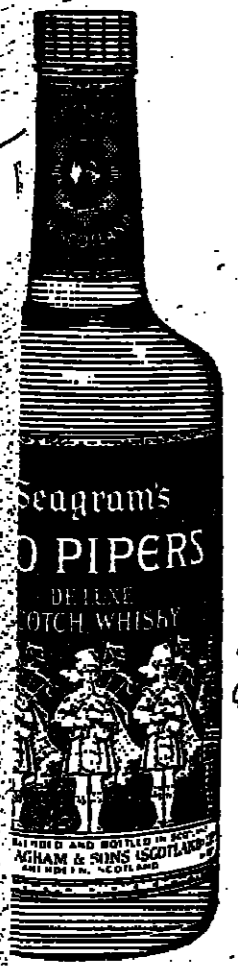
The estimate for the typical mother's lost wages for 14 years was \$58,437, bringing the total cost for the first child to \$98,361. Additional children, assuming they were spaced two years apart, would, typically, cost \$48,793, the study said. The direct costs would be about the same as for the first child, but only two rather than 14 years of lost wages would be added. The analysis of these "opportunity costs" was a unique aspect of the study. Discussing their inclusion, the authors said: "To some, the pleasure of parenthood far outweighs the money forgone due to having children. For other women, however, the loss of earnings is a relevant consideration. Having a child will not only mean giving up one life style for another, but also potentially giving up one standard of living for another." The authors of the study were two commission economists, the late Ritchie H. Reed and Susan McIntosh. While the study found wide variations in child costs according to the mother's education level, it found almost no variation according to residence: "It costs slightly less to raise a child on a farm, but the costs in a rural non-farm place or an urban place are practically equal." Regional variations were somewhat greater, the study found. Direct costs up to age 18 were about \$3,350 higher in the West than in the North-Central region. The figure for the Northeast was about the same as the typical national amount.

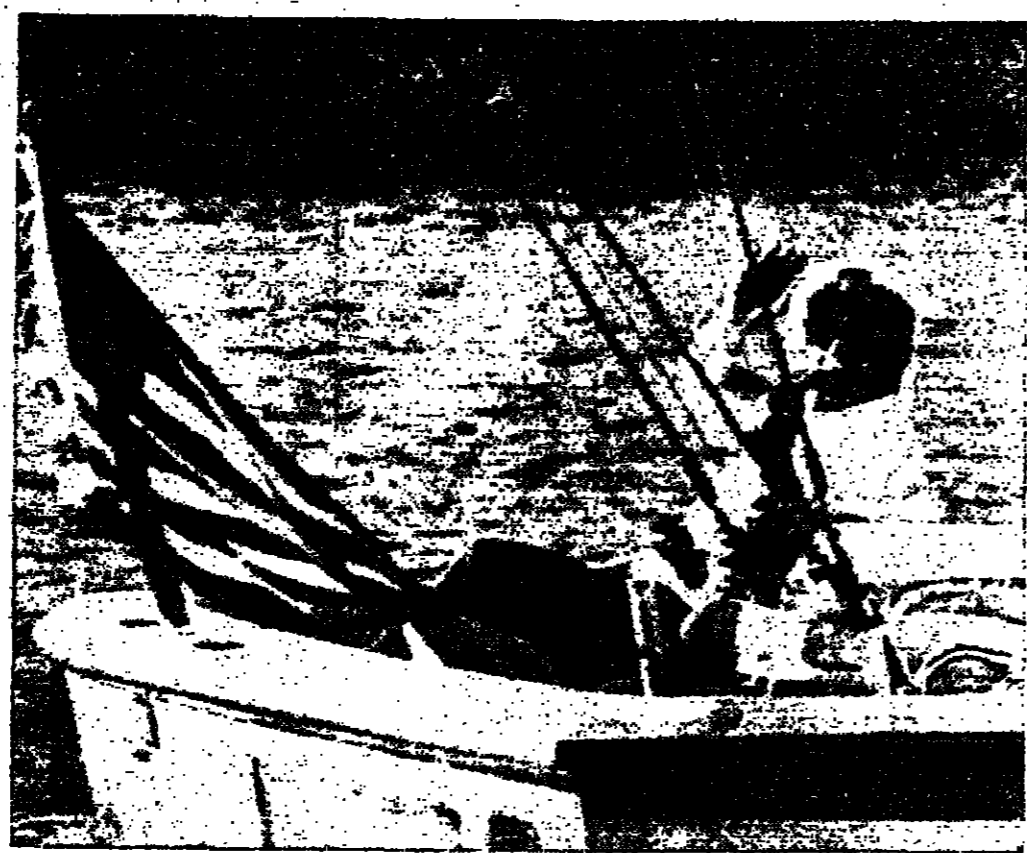

In Shift on Arab Guerrillas

Russia Said to Offer Aid to El-Fatah

By William Beecher WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (NYT)—The Soviet Union, which long kept Arab guerrilla organizations at arm's length, has recently shifted its strategy, according to analysts in the State and Defense departments.

War Minister Gen. Mohammed Ahmed Sadek, who supervised the offensive maneuvers, pronounced his satisfaction with the "high efficiency and high fighting spirit of the officers and men," the agency added.

The offer was reportedly made to Yasser Arafat, head of el-Fatah, during his visit to Moscow in late October. The principal stipulation was that the guerrillas make an effort to end their political feuding and concentrate on resuming terrorist and sabotage attacks on Israel.

Dayan Speaks

In a speech last night, Defense Minister Moshe Dayan said that only when Egypt makes an "active expression" toward peace will Israel be convinced that there will be no war.

Gen. Dayan's remarks on television were the first official reaction to Egypt's decision to pursue a peace settlement while maintaining that war is the only way to regain lost territory.

Mr. Allon said: "So far, Egypt has succeeded in losing three wars and in exchanging Western imperialism for Eastern imperialism."

Mr. Allon said: "If Egypt does not wish to become totally subservient to the Soviet Union, if she really desires peace before the Brezhnev Doctrine is imposed on her, she has little to lose and everything to gain from direct contacts, even secret ones, with Israel."

Mr. Allon said the "no war, no peace" situation in the Middle East is to the Soviets' liking and that Soviet and Egyptian interests do not always coincide.

"For instance, when the Egyptians desire a premature resumption of hostilities, the Soviets exert a restraining influence upon them," he said.

"The Egyptians are interested in Soviet intervention. The Soviets prefer involvement."

Mr. Rabin, returning home for religious services following his father's death, predicted that Moscow and Cairo would coordinate their policies to focus on the visit to Moscow of Mr. Nixon.

"This visit to Moscow will be the basis for political, and not only political, activity from the other side," he said, hinting at the possibility that the visit would mark another Egyptian deadline for a political settlement.

He said the resumption of war by Egypt "is a very real possibility. We shall only be able to tell that they will not open fire when we see an active expression of a move toward the alternative—a continuation of the struggle by political means."

In another opinion on Egypt's intentions, Israel's retiring armed forces chief told a farewell news conference today he does not think the Egyptians really mean it when they say their only chance to regain lost territory is by war.

Lt. Gen. Haim Bar-Lev, in a ceremony later in the day, was to hand over his command to Lt. Gen. David Elazar, a three-war veteran. Gen. Bar-Lev is to join the cabinet sometime next year.

"If Egypt says 'We have come to the end of the rope, the solution only is by war,' I don't believe that they really mean this is the only solution," he said, adding: "But we have got to be prepared for it, and we are."

Officials note that two of the biggest weaknesses in guerrilla performance in the past arose from the absence of really professional commando training and from a lack of boldness, in part stemming from the fear that any serious wound would, for want of proper treatment, result in death.

The Soviet offer to help with training and hospitalization is therefore considered significant.

Most Mideast specialists, however, are convinced that even if el-Fatah, the largest of the guerrilla organizations, accepts the Soviet offer, the chances of effective operations in Israeli-controlled territory will be negligible.

Before the successful Jordanian crackdown on the guerrillas in the summer of this year and the fall of 1970, officials say, it was very difficult for any Arab government to curb guerrilla activities.

Guerrillas could infiltrate into Israel from Jordan, Lebanon and, to a lesser extent, from Syria. The three governments were not happy about such operations because of occasional retaliation by the Israelis but they found them hard to control.

But with King Hussein's victory over the guerrillas, who he felt were trying to take over his country, Lebanon and Syria have imposed strict control over the guerrillas in their territory as well, American officials say.

In addition, Arabs on the West Bank of the Jordan River are enjoying unparalleled prosperity under Israeli rule and are not considered likely to help the guerrillas to any great extent.

Finally, Israeli security measures are considered very effective in combating infiltration.

5,000 Men Lost

The various guerrilla movements are believed to have lost about 5,000 men in combat, imprisonments and defections during the Jordanian crackdown.

Bygone government estimate, there are now about 10,000 guerrillas in Syria, 3,500 in Lebanon and 200 to 300 in Jordan.

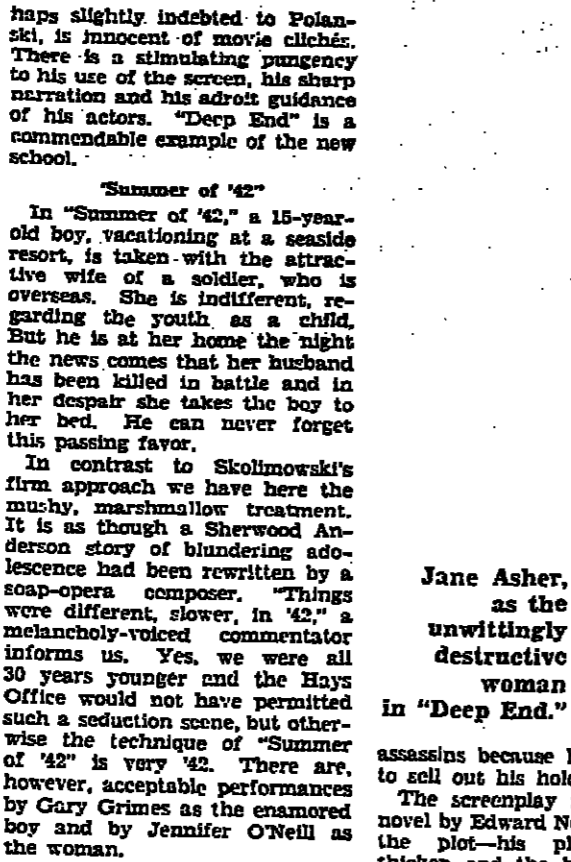

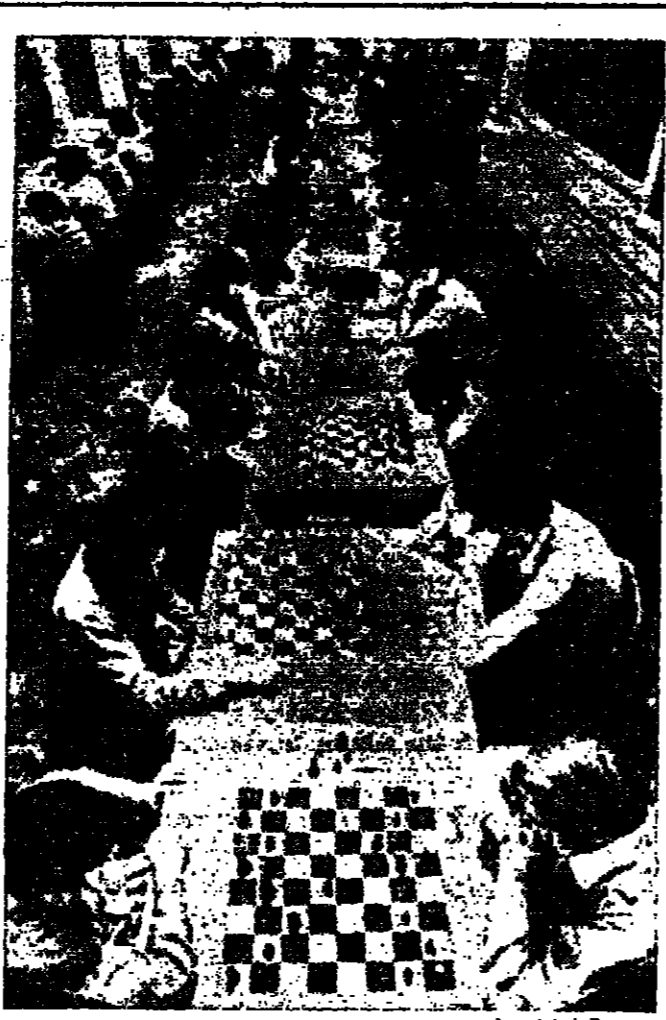

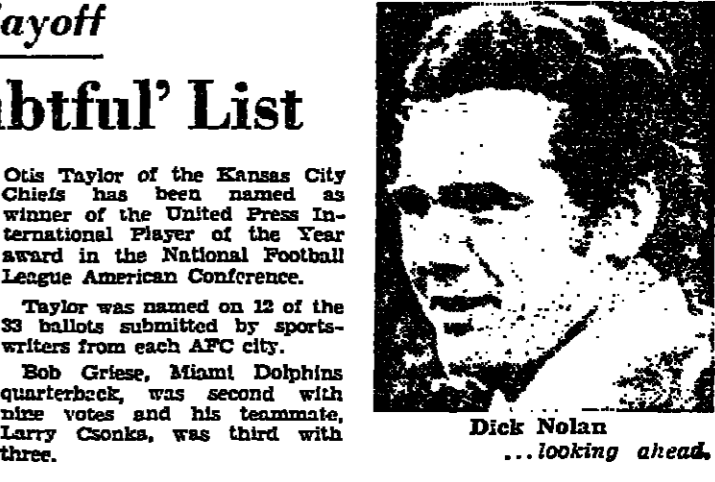
