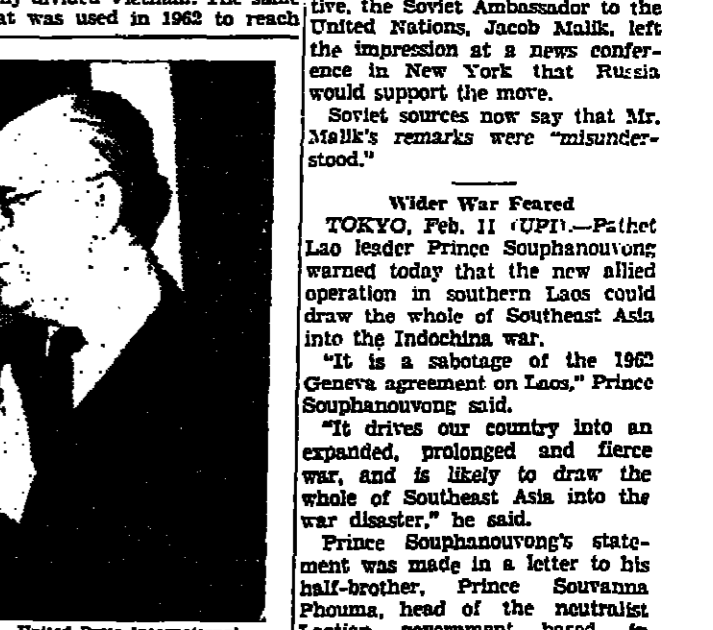

'The Perfectibility of Man Is All That We Have to Sustain Us...'

WHO'S got the revolution? When Christopher Jencks and David Riesman published the first of a projected two-volume study of American colleges and universities three years ago, they called it "The Academic Revolution."

of revolution were more liberating than a change of emphasis. They rediscovered Paul Goodman, calling for an end to formal education as such, and a return to the apprentice system.

Goodman even disapproved of the teaching of English: "Society is increasingly taken to be a kind of machine directed by a central will, and in this structure the teaching of English is turned into social engineering."

Along came Edgar Friedberg: "Public education is supported because it is believed—by now, indeed, assumed—to be essential to the maintenance of development of society and the induction of its younger members."

What Ivan Illich has called "consumer resistance... in the knowledge industry" is upon us. Education is being redefined. As another prophet like George Dennison puts it: "There is no such thing as learning except [as Dewey tells us] in the continuum of experience. But

this continuum cannot survive in the classroom unless there is reality of encounter between the adults and the children. The teachers must be themselves, and not play roles. They must teach the children, and not teach 'subjects'.

Credos Basically Romantic

Joseph I. Featherstone went to England for The New Republic, and returned with a superb series of articles on allowing children to teach themselves "subjects" or relationships the way they taught themselves their native language.

Save our souls. With the possible, but not probable, exception of Silberman, the new prophets are romantics. They believe in the perfectibility of man. They see the schools—or at least education—as an agency of moral uplift and social change, perhaps because schools on every level are more vulnerable to

pressure than any other institution in our society, but more likely because the notion of a child being perfected corresponds so closely to the romantic dream of man, the perfectible. For the generation of professors brought up on Durkheim and Matthew Arnold, resigned to institutions and wary of all but slow reform, the idea of salvation by education is preposterous.

And he had tried. Once upon a time, "they" had scared him, and his moment of fear had been therapeutic. In the emotional disillusions of confrontation, he had discovered things about himself—presumptions, indifferences—not altogether admirable. Consequently, he had gone about redesigning his course to render it more relevant. And now the students no longer seemed to care. And now the professor was cynical.

He is right and he is wrong. He is right, because students—aged 8 or 18—weren't born knowing everything, only gradually to forget it the older they grow. He is wrong because the romantic notion of the perfectibility of man is really all we have to sustain us, however illusory it may prove to be. Education is society's business, but society must decide what it wants, what it wants to be, where it wants to go, before it can devise a learning system appropriate to its own aspiration. That we haven't, of course, decided. Until we do so, the rest is rhetoric, and the romantics have the best rhetoric.

We have much to learn from the fox. It will take many ages to achieve the full taming of everyone but it is the most profound enterprise man has ever launched. It involves also the taming of nations, who are only enlarged men.

Man began his domestication unconsciously when he used words and spoke across the generations. This is what he fought when he kept his children about him and no longer drove them away into the forest. But the children, too, partook of the taming. They had to wish to stay. Therefore there were times when they learned the ritual of silence between the generations and the peace that sometimes comes unspoken into the heart.

Taming, which is true civilization, has nothing to do with the Now, or with Elevance. It has only to do with growing. If the taming fails, then so does man, and man will be responsible forever just as the fox advised the prince.

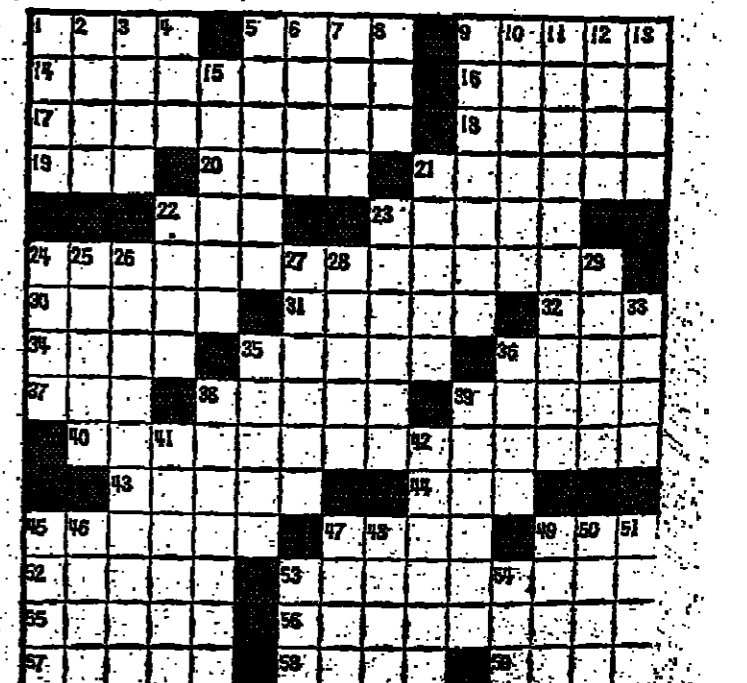
